COMPLIANCE INFORMATION

Dear Alumni, Fans and Friends,

As a University of South Carolina season ticket holder, alumnus, Gamecock Club member or fan, you are, by NCAA definition, a representative of the University of South Carolina's athletics interests. Those who actively support Gamecock Athletics are an integral part of our program. Your support enables our student-athletes to train and prepare in quality facilities, compete for championships in the nation's top conference and pursue a college degree. Your level of support is vital to their overall success.

We value your interest and support, but we must remind you that an inappropriate action on your part can jeopardize the eligibility of a student-athlete, prospect and/or the compliance of the University with Southeastern Conference and NCAA regulations.

The NCAA has strictly limited the role you, as a Gamecock fan, may assume with regard to prospects and student-athletes. The following information is intended to provide you with a basic understanding of NCAA rules and regulations that you should know as someone who cares about intercollegiate athletics.

PROSPECTIVE STUDENT-ATHLETES

A prospective student-athlete (prospect) is a student who has:

- Started classes for the ninth grade, or
- Ever received any financial assistance or other benefit prospective students do not generally receive.

An individual remains a prospect until one of the following occurs (whichever is earlier):

- The individual officially registers and enrolls in a minimum full-time program of studies and attends classes in any term (including summer) of a four-year collegiate institution's regular academic year.
- The individual participates in a regular squad practice or competition at a four-year collegiate institution that occurs before the beginning of any term.

Please remember, a prospect remains a prospect even after signing a National Letter of Intent with South Carolina.

EXTRA BENEFITS

The NCAA defines an extra benefit as any special arrangement by an institutional employee or a representative of the institution's athletics interests to provide a student-athlete or the student-athlete's relative or friend a benefit not expressly authorized by NCAA legislation.

Specifically prohibited financial aid, benefits and arrangements include, but are not limited to, the following:

- An employment arrangement for a prospect's relatives
- A gift of clothing or equipment
- The cosigning of loans
- Providing loans to a prospect's relatives or friends
- Cash or like items
- Any tangible items, including merchandise

EMPLOYMENT

Boosters may contact a prospect to discuss a summer job **ONLY** after the prospect has signed a National Letter of Intent to attend the University of South Carolina. In addition, boost-

ers **MAY NOT** employ or arrange employment of a high school prospective student-athlete until the prospect has completed all classes and graduated from high school.

Enrolled student-athletes are permitted to be employed during the regular academic year as well as during official vacation periods. **PRIOR TO** the student-athlete's employment, they must receive written approval from the Compliance Office and complete the required paperwork.

Student-athletes and/or employers may be asked to provide records related to employment. This information may include, but is not limited to, payroll records, tax documents and benefits statements.

Please note all employers are subject to NCAA regulations and penalties for any violations.

Compliance with NCAA rules is of the highest priority for our athletics program and institution. As a member of the NCAA, University of South Carolina is responsible for the actions of its alumni, supporters and fans. Even the best-intentioned action on your part may be a violation of NCAA rules.

The University of South Carolina appreciates its alumni and friends who strive for the highest level of ethical conduct while supporting the student-athletes' goals for both academic and athletics success.

MEDIA SERVICES

The 2009-10 edition of the University of South Carolina basketball media guide is a source of information for the news media. Additional information is available upon request. News releases, action and still photographs, video tapes and digital images are also available to accredited members of the news media upon request.

MEDIA CREDENTIALS

Credentials are limited to working daily print and electronic media and to others whose duties make necessary access to press row. Photo credentials are issued only to working photographers and cinematographers. Photographers are restricted to the baselines and may use natural light only. Flash units are not allowed.

South Carolina will use the online credentials system. Please go to www.sportssystem.com/uschoops to register for credentials (photo, press row).

Beginning with the 2009-10 season, **ALL** credentials will be distributed on game day at the press pass gate on the College Street side of the Colonial Life Arena. A limited number of media parking spaces are available. Media parking passes must be requested at the time of credential requests.

INTERVIEW POLICIES

All interview requests must be made in advance to SID Emily Feeney in the South Carolina Media Relations Office. Beginning with the start of practice in October, Feeney will release a weekly coach and player availability schedule to media no later than 9 a.m. each Monday morning during the season.

Post-Game Interview Policy: After each home game, the visiting coach will address the media first, followed by South Carolina head coach Darrin Horn and then South Carolina players. (Depending on deadline, this may be altered on a game-by-game basis)

Road Interview Policy: Interviews with Coach Horn while on the road will be scheduled according to the home post-game media procedure. No player interviews are allowed until after the game once the team leaves Columbia.

HOME GAME SERVICES

Press Room: The South Carolina basketball media room is located behind the visitor bench near the locker room cluster at Colonial Life Arena. This room is open only to accredited media with proper credentials.

Telephones and Fax Machines: The Media Relations Office furnishes eight telephones in the press room and on press row. There is wireless and high speed data lines in the press room as well. Those phones and data lines are available on a first come, first served basis.

FOOD SERVICES

There will no longer be a buffet in the media room for men's basketball games. New for the 2009-10 season, each credentialed media member will be issued a food coupon that can be used at the concession stands inside Colonial Life Arena.

STATISTICAL SERVICES

Complete play-by-play, full halftime and final boxscores and post-game coaches' quotes are provided to the media. Computer monitors are on press row for broadcast and print media locations for immediate updates throughout the game.

BROADCASTS

Announce positions for radio and TV broadcasts are at courtside. Under contracted reciprocal agreements, the official designated originating station or network of the visiting team is allowed to originate radio broadcasts without charge. All others will be charged an origination fee.

PRESS ROW PASSES

- **DAILY NEWSPAPERS** will be issued a maximum of four (4) season approved press box credentials.
- **WEBSITES** with a national affiliation will be issued a maximum of two (2) season approved press credentials.
- **TELEVISION** stations based in the Columbia area will be issued a maximum of two (2) season approved press box credentials. Television stations based outside of the Columbia area will be issued a maximum of one (1) season approved press box credential.
- **RADIO** stations will be granted one (1) season approved credential per daily radio show. In addition, one (1) credential will be distributed per station for the sports director.

• Non-affiliated bloggers will not be credentialed.

All other credential requests, including non-daily newspapers, magazines, out-of-market radio stations, etc. will be issued on a game-by-game, case-by-case and space available basis at the discretion of the media relations director.

Please note: Due to the high number of applications, it is not possible to accommodate all requests. No one under 18 years of age will be issued a credential without prior approval of the SID.

INTERNET SITES

The University of South Carolina adheres to the SEC policies regarding representatives of websites. The official website of the home and visiting schools will be credentialed. Also, the official online service of the national over-the-air or cable television network that owns broadcast rights to the game will receive credentials. Other websites will not be credentialed unless they meet specifications outlined below:

1. Must be a legal corporate entity that has been in business for at least one full calendar year and has provided coverage of South Carolina or the visiting team for at least one year.
2. Must provide daily coverage of all athletic teams of South Carolina or the visiting team with its own staff of fulltime reporters, photographers and equipment.
3. Must travel to and cover all football away games and all major post-season events.
4. Must provide coverage of all press conferences of all athletic teams at South Carolina or the visiting team.

SEC INTERNET REAL TIME POLICY

By acceptance and use of an SEC media credential, the holder agrees to the following conditions for any and all athletic events hosted by the SEC and its member institutions:

1. The SEC and its member institutions grant a media organization a limited license to use certain gathered information on the media organization's own Internet or online site beginning at the start of an athletic event and up

to the conclusion of such event, all subject to the following limitations and conditions:

(a) No more than 10 still photographs may be used for news coverage of the game and other editorial purposes during the event. Such still photographs must be used on a time-delayed basis that is at least five (5) minutes after the happening of the event depicted by the still photograph.

(b) Video tape may only be shown as part of a single, non archived, online "simulcast" of a television station's regularly scheduled news program.

(c) While a game is in progress, the use of textual statistical information is time-delayed and limited in amount (e.g., updates pertaining to score, injuries and national, conference or institutional record-breaking performances, a condensed half-time story) so that an organization's Internet or online game coverage does not undercut the authorized and rights-paying fee organization's rights to play-by-play accounts of the game and/or exclusivity as to such rights.

2. Any proposed media use on an Internet or online sight of the game information that is more detailed and/or more than described above will require separate written authorization by the SEC and/or its member institutions. However, such written authorization will not permit the use of game information in entertainment contexts and will not authorize game coverage that, due to immediacy or detail, constitutes or approaches a play-by-play account of a game.

3. Should any of these conditions be breached, the SEC and/or its member institutions will issue a written warning for the first violation. If this violation occurs during the last game of the institutions' regularly-scheduled season, the media organization may not be credentialed for the SEC Football Championship Game. A second violation of this policy will result in revocation of credentials to cover future football games hosted by the SEC and/or its member institutions.

SPOTTERS AND STATISTICIANS

The Media Relations Department can supply radio and television broadcasters with spotters and stat personnel if notified of their needs in advance.

SOUTH CAROLINA STUDENT-ATHLETE MEDIA INTERVIEW POLICY

All interviews are to be coordinated through the Media Relations Office. This allows the staff to arrange the interview when it best suits the student-athlete's and the reporter's schedules. Please contact the Media Relations Office in advance to make your interview requests. Media are not permitted to contact student-athletes on their own at any time.

All interviews will take place at the designated media interview site for that day as listed in the weekly availability schedule or in the Media Relations Office.

Dormitory, apartment and cell phone numbers for student-athletes will not be provided to the media. Should you need to conduct a telephone interview with a student-athlete, a call will be placed to you from the student-athlete at a mutually agreeable time.

GAMECOCK RADIO NETWORK

Gamecock Sports Properties, a partnership between the University of South Carolina Athletics Department and two of the country's leaders in the collegiate sports marketing industry, ISP Sports and Learfield Communications, Inc., is the originating medium for radio coverage of the 2009-10 South Carolina basketball games.

Gamecock Sports Properties is responsible for the overall management of the athletic program's corporate partnership effort, which includes producing, selling and distributing the Gamecock Radio Network (live play-by-play and call-in shows) and television programming (pay per view opportunities and coaches shows), print advertising in various athletic department publications, and selected signage in University athletic facilities.

Joining the Gamecock broadcast team for the 2009-10 season is the new voice of South Carolina basketball and baseball, Andy Demetra. Demetra is a familiar name to those who follow Gamecock Athletics closely, as he served as the play-by-play voice for Carolina women's basketball and selected men's basketball games from 2003-06.

Since his time in Columbia, Demetra has worked for ISP Sports in Winston-Salem, N.C. He has done basketball play-by-play for the Big East National Game of the Week, football play-by-play for the ACC National Game of the Week and baseball play-by-play for the 2008 and 2009 ACC Tournaments for XM Radio. In addition, he has provided play-by-play work in basketball for the University of Pittsburgh, Vanderbilt, Virginia Tech, Villanova, UCF and Furman. He has also done play-by-play broadcasting for the Syracuse Chiefs, the Triple-A baseball affiliate of the Toronto Blue Jays.

Demetra, who graduated summa cum laude from Syracuse University, was the 2005 and 2006 South Carolina Broadcasters Association Radio Sportscaster of the Year. He was the youngest recipient of the award in the organization's 60-year history.

Casey Manning, the color analyst for the Gamecock Radio Network, earned a varsity letter for the legendary coach Frank McGuire from 1971-1973 (freshmen were not eligible to play varsity basketball) and attended South Carolina from 1969-1973. He won the Freshman Academic Award. He was selected to Who's Who in Colleges and Universities and chosen as a South Carolina outstanding senior. He was a member of Carolina's ACC Tournament Championship team in 1970-1971, while he was player of the year in South Carolina in 1969 and a high school All-American.

Manning is currently a Circuit Court Judge for the state of South Carolina, having served in that capacity since April 1994. He served as the Assistant Attorney General for the state of South Carolina for five years (1983-88), and was the Chief of Prosecutions from 1988-89. Manning is a member of the American Bar Association and is a past president of the South Carolina Athletic Hall of Fame.

Carroll Senn has served as engineer/producer for the Gamecock Basketball Radio Network since 1981.

Liz McMillan has been General Manager for the Network since 1993 and is the first woman in the SEC to serve in this capacity.

SENIOR LEADERSHIP TO PROPEL GAMECOCKS IN 2009-10

■ HORN ENTERS SECOND SEASON AT CAROLINA

South Carolina head basketball coach Darrin Horn enters his second season at the helm of the Gamecock program for the 2009-10 season. Horn led Carolina to one of the most celebrated seasons during its 18-year participation in the Southeastern Conference during the 2008-09 campaign, as the squad captured the 2009 SEC Eastern Division Co-Championship and won double-digit league games for the first time since the 1998 campaign.

■ NON-CONFERENCE SCHEDULE

Contests against six teams that participated in postseason play, including three that competed in the NCAA Tournament, highlight the 2009-10 South Carolina men's basketball non-conference schedule. The slate features contests against at least seven teams that won 18 or more games last season. Three of those teams - Clemson, Boston College and Western Kentucky - competed in the NCAA Tournament last March. South Carolina has the opportunity to play five BCS schools, compared to playing just two last season.

■ GAMECOCKS TO COMPETE IN SECOND ANNUAL CHARLESTON CLASSIC

South Carolina will stay in its home state to compete in the second annual Charleston Classic this November. The Classic, a bracket-format tournament, will feature 12 games over the course of four days, Nov. 19-22. Each team will compete in one game per day, with the two teams that remain undefeated facing off in a championship contest on Sunday, Nov. 22. The Gamecocks join a highly-competitive field at the event, which features (2008-09 record) La Salle (18-13), South Florida (9-22), Tulane (14-17), Miami (Fla.) (19-13), UNC-Wilmington (7-25), Davidson (27-8) and Penn State (27-11). South Carolina, Davidson, Miami and Penn State each made an appearance in the Postseason NIT last March. Carolina will face La Salle in the tournament's opening round.

■ CAROLINA SET FOR UNPRECEDENTED NATIONAL TV COVERAGE

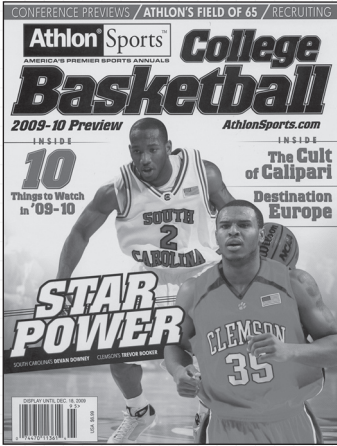
With the Southeastern Conference's historic television deals with CBS and ESPN that begin this season, the Gamecocks will be featured in at least 28 live television broadcasts during the upcoming regular season. Each of South Carolina's conference contests will be televised, with seven games to be broadcast on the ESPN family of networks, five on the SEC Network, three on CSS and one on FSN. The Gamecocks will host eight conference matchups, including home games versus NCAA Tournament participants LSU, Mississippi State and Tennessee, and additional home dates against Alabama, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky and Vanderbilt.

■ RECORD WATCH

Several Gamecocks currently rank in the career record chart in various categories. Senior guard Devan Downey needs just 81 steals to surpass Chuck Eidson (272) for the most all time, while senior forward Dominique Archie will climb the career blocks chart during the 2009-10 campaign, as he is currently tied for 10th all time with 86 career blocks. Keep an eye on senior forward Evka Baniulis, who currently ranks second in 3-point career percentage (.430), and senior guard Brandis Raley-Ross who is sixth on the chart with a .377 career 3-point percentage.

■ GARNET AND BLACK WELCOME FIVE NEWCOMERS

South Carolina signed freshmen Ramon Galloway, Lakeem Jackson and Stephen Spinella, while also adding junior college transfer Johndre Jefferson and walk-on Malik Cooke to its 2009-10 roster. Due to NCAA transfer rules, Cooke will not be eligible to play, however Horn and his staff have high expectations for the rest of the bunch.



■ DOWNEY AMONG ATHLON SPORTS

ALL-AMERICANS FOR 2009-10

South Carolina senior point guard Devan Downey has been listed as one of *Athlon Sports'* First-Team All-Americans for the upcoming 2009-10 season in the publication's annual preseason edition. Joining Downey on the projected First-Team All-American squad is Kansas center Cole Aldrich, Notre Dame forward Luke Harangody, Kentucky forward Patrick Patterson and Duke forward Kyle Singler. Downey was also listed as the projected 2009-10 SEC Player of the Year and a First Team All-SEC pick, while senior forward Dominique Archie was projected as an All-SEC second-team selection in the preseason edition.

■ PRESEASON RANKINGS

South Carolina made an appearance in several preseason top-25 lists during the summer months. The Gamecocks were ranked No. 23 in ESPN's Andy Katz's June top 25 list, while *FoxSport's.com* senior writer Jeff Goodman also listed South Carolina as one of his "Teams To Watch."

■ GAMECOCKS LOOK TO REPEAT CONFERENCE SUCCESS

Tennessee and South Carolina shared the SEC's 2009 Eastern Division crown with 10-6 league records. It marked the first time that South Carolina posted double-digit SEC wins since the 1998 campaign, while Carolina earned a share of the division title for just the second time in school history (1996-97).

■ 2010 SEC TOURNAMENT

The 2010 Southeastern Conference Men's Basketball Tournament returns to the Sommet Center in Nashville. It will be the third time that the arena has served as the host of the SEC Tournament, having also hosted in 2001 and 2006. The Sommet Center, which also is the home of the NHL's Nashville Predators, opened in December 1996 and has hosted more than 12 million guests.

■ POSITION BREAKDOWN - GUARDS

South Carolina returns All-SEC point guard Devan Downey, the top returning scorer in the SEC after averaging 19.8 points per contest in 2008-09, senior guard Brandis Raley-Ross and reserve Robert Wilder to the bench this season.

Joining the backcourt is freshman point guard Ramon Galloway and sharp shooter Stephen Spinella, who will both see playing time in 2009-10. Galloway, who averaged 17.7 points and 4.5 assists per contest during his senior season at William T. Dwyer in Palm Beach Gardens, Fla., will provide depth at the point guard position. Spinella, who spent last season at Apex Academy, where he averaged 32 points per outing, will provide another threat from beyond the arc for opposing defenses this season.

■ POSITION BREAKDOWN - FORWARDS

Senior forward Dominique Archie will anchor the Gamecock frontcourt during the 2009-10 campaign. The All-SEC Second Team honoree from a year ago, Archie is a major factor on both ends of the court, after also receiving All-SEC Defensive Team honors in 2008-09. Junior forward Mike Holmes, the team's leading rebounder last season at 7.7 boards per contest, also returns for the 2009-10 campaign.

Entering his senior season is forward Evka Baniulis, the team's top 3-point shooter from last season. Baniulis provides a solid scoring threat for Carolina and will be looked upon to help fill the 15.5 points per game lost to guard Zam Fredrick's graduation last May.

Juniors big man Austin Steed provided 3.9 points and 3.6 rebounds off the bench last season for Carolina. He gathered at least two rebounds in 28 of 31 appearances, including a career-high 11 versus Gardner-Webb early in the year.

Newcomer Lakeem Jackson received the most preseason buzz for his outstanding athletic ability. Jackson, the No. 24 ranked small forward in the 2009 class by *Rivals.com*, helped lead Christ School to three consecutive NCISAA state championships, while garnering numerous all-state and all-conference awards during his prep career.

■ POSITION BREAKDOWN - CENTERS

Junior center Sam Muldrow played an important defensive role for South Carolina last season, posting 1.8 blocks and collecting 5.3 rebounds per game. Muldrow will be joined in the lane during the 2009-10 campaign by junior college transfer Johndre Jefferson, a 6-9 junior from Santee, S.C.

Jefferson averaged 9.2 points and 3.7 blocks per game at Northwest Florida State College last season and will provide depth at the center position for South Carolina.



■ HORN AMONG NCAA'S BEST

South Carolina head coach Darrin Horn ranks as one of the NCAA's elite coaches. Entering the 2009-10 campaign, Horn ranks as the No. 22 winningest coach (by percentage) in NCAA Division I men's basketball.

■ GAMECOCKS RETURN TRIO OF ALL-SEC PERFORMERS

The Gamecocks return three All-SEC performers from last season in Devan Downey (First Team, coaches/AP), Dominique Archie (Second Team, coaches/Honorable Mention, AP) and Brandis Raley-Ross (SEC Sixth Man of the Year, coaches) to the court this season. The trio combined for nearly 36.1 points, 6.6 assists and 4.8 steals per game last year for Carolina.

■ ARCHIE AIMS FOR 1,000TH CAREER POINT.

DOWNNEY LOOKS TO CLIMB LIST

South Carolina senior forward Dominique Archie needs just 59 points to become the 41st member of the Gamecocks' 1,000 point club. Classmate Devan Downey reached the mark last season, and looks to climb the list during his senior campaign. Downey currently ranks 27th on the all-time scoring list with 1,202 career points at South Carolina.

■ CHANGES ON THE BENCH

With the hiring of Scott Cherry as the head basketball coach at High Point University last April, former director of player development Neill Berry was promoted to assistant coach by Horn for the 2009-10 season. Also joining the Gamecocks staff is graduate assistant Jordan Mincy and director of basketball operations L.J. Hepp.
