
First Gamecock Grand Slam

- The latest in a long line of facility upgrades for South Carolina came online, as Carolina Softball Stadium at Beckham Field hosted its first games in the spring of 2013.
- The Gamecocks opened their brand-new facility on March 15, 2013, against defending national champion Alabama.
- All three games during opening weekend had a maximum capacity of 830 fans.
- Throwing out the first pitch on Friday night was Mitzi Beckham, who along with her husband David, continue to be honored by having the field named after them.
- Head women's basketball coach Dawn Staley and head football coach Steve Spurrier also helped out on opening weekend, throwing out first pitches on Saturday and Sunday, respectively.
- South Carolina got its first win in Carolina Softball Stadium history with a 5-0 shutout of Appalachian State on April 3, 2013.
- Carolina Softball Stadium at Beckham Field has a seating capacity near 1,300.
- The stadium sits on the same site that the Gamecock Softball team has called home since 1983.
- Home plate has been in the same spot since the beginning of the 1997 season, when the former structure was built to usher in Southeastern Conference play.
- All time, South Carolina is 545-209-2 (.722) on the site. Since being renamed Beckham Field in 1998, the Gamecocks own a 265-155 (.631) mark on the field.

In Honor of "Mac" Rumph

One of the most ardent Gamecock Softball followers, Wilber McPerry "Mac" Rumph passed away on Friday, Jan. 31 at the age of 69. A retired teacher and administrator in Orangeburg and Spartanburg District 6 schools, Rumph tought history at two North Carolina higher education institutes. A second lieutenant in the U.S. Army, Rumph served his country in Vietnam. After watching the 2011 team face Alabama, Rumph started following the Gamecocks, with his passion causing him to drive and even fly to almost every road game. His seat will have a yellow ribbon on it throughout 2014 in honor of his support of Gamecock Softball.



SOUTH CAROLINA TEAM NOTES

- The Gamecocks are 7-6 in one-run games this season, two wins better than last year's 5-5. They went 5-9 during those contests in 2012 and 7-11 in Smith's first year of 2011.
- After posting only eight hits combined in the first two games, South Carolina tallied at least eight
 in each the next seven. Overall, the Gamecocks have five or more hits in 36 of 44 games.
- As a team, the Gamecocks have scored 57.1 percent of runners from third with less than two outs, standing fourth in the SEC.
- The college veterans have come through with runners on third and less than two outs, as Ansley
 Ard, Dana Hathorn, Chelsea Hawkins, Olivia Lawrence, Ashlyn Masters, Sarah Mooney, Kristen
 Struett and Codee Yeske have posted 36 RBI in 56 chances. The rest of the team is 20-for-42.
- The Gamecocks have left the second-least runners on base in the SEC this season at 254.
- Sarah Mooney, a junior transfer from James Madison, has nine home runs on the season, tying for fourth in Gamecock history.
- And freshman Kaylea Snaer is one in back of Mooney with eight round-trippers, tying for seventh
 on the single-season charts.
- All but one of South Carolina's losses have come when they've given up four or more earned runs.
 In fact, of the 123 team earned runs allowed, 87 have come in the 14 losses.
- The one loss without four earned runs allowed for the Gamecocks came in the first game at Arkansas, where five errors led to 10 unearned Arkansas runs in the 11-10 setback.
- In the first 30 games, South Carolina scored five runs combined in the second inning. Over the last 14, the team has plated 21, including five in the second game of the Furman doubleheader.

NOTABLES FROM **E**ARLIER

- For the second-consecutive season, South Carolina claimed at least one SEC road series, taking two
 of three at Arkansas over April 11-13.
- The Gamecocks won their first game at Georgia since March 28, 2001 in the first game of the April 5 doubleheader.
- It's the team's second win at the home of a ranked team in 2014, joining the 3-2 victory at No. 3/3 Arizona State.
- South Carolina's 3-2 win at No. 3/3 Arizona State marked the first win (and second all-time) at a top-five team's park since March 13, 2004, a 6-4 win in nine innings at LSU.
- South Carolina swept Mississippi at home over March 29-30, the first SEC home series sweep since the Rebels' last visit in 2011.
- The Sunday win over Ole Miss, which came by scoring two runs in its final at bat, ranks as the first
 this season for SC when it enters the seventh trailing.
- In the Ball State loss, South Carolina snapped a streak of 11 games with one or no errors, a stretch that included a 10-game winning streak.
- The Gamecocks' win in game one against Western Carolina came when they were down after five innings, the first South Carolina triumph coming back that late in a game this season.
- The four double plays in the Florida Atlantic win (2/16) is believed to be a school record, as it matches what was once listed but could not be verified.
- This year's 14-2 start is bettered only by a 12-1 mark by the 2009 team in the last six years of Gamecock Softball. The 2007 Gamecocks went 24-3, the best start since the first year of SEC play.

PIVOTAL WEEKEND FOR SOUTH CAROLINA'S POSTSEASON HOPES

- The Gamecocks enter the LSU weekend at 8-10 in the SEC standings, eighth out of 13 teams.
- The Gamecocks last had eight or more wins at the 18-game mark in league play in 2007, a season when the team got to 10-10 and won 12 games in the SEC overall.
- South Carolina's final two series come against teams below them in the standings in LSU and Auburn, both at 6-9 currently.
- Winning one of the series would help cement that the Gamecocks would play in the 2014 SEC Tournament that they host at Carolina Softball Stadium.
- One of three teams with 18 games played entering this weekend, the Gamecocks will get to 21 along with Texas A&M before getting April's final weekend off from SEC play.
- The Aggies are one game ahead of the Gamecocks in the standings, but SC holds the tiebreaker by virtue of winning the series in Columbia.
- To avoid Wednesday of the 2014 SEC Tournament, hosted at Carolina Softball Stadium at Beckham Field, South Carolina would have to pass both Texas A&M and one other team.

Bring on (or Back) the Doubleheaders in SEC Play

- Three times already in 2014 have the Gamecocks had to play Saturday doubleheaders to ensure completing all three games of a series.
- South Carolina is 5-1 in those games, sweeping twinbills from Texas A&M and Mississippi at home before splitting the double dip at No. 15/17 Georgia.
- Friday nights have been unkind, with the Gamecocks dropping all five of the games played on the final day of the work week in SEC play.

THE ROAD IS ROUGH, ESPECIALLY AGAINST THESE SEC FOES

- South Carolina dropped eight of its first nine road contests in SEC play in 2014.
- Those eight losses have come against the No. 1, 3 and 4 ranked pitching staffs in ERA and 1, 2 and 4 offenses by batting average in the SEC stat rankings for league games only.
- In SEC play, Alabama holds the league's best mark with a 2.08 ERA, while Tennessee ranks 3rd at 3.07 and Georgia 4th at 3.41.
- In SEC action, the Lady Vols tops the league with a .343 batting average (as well as a .462 on-base percentage and .563 slugging percentage), while Alabama is 2nd at .328 and Georgia 4th at .275.

A New Tradition: Masters Leading the Offense

- Senior Ashlyn Masters leads the Gamecocks in 10 offensive categories.
- She took over the leadoff spot in the middle of February. And she's blossomed in those 36 games, scoring 31 runs, more than any player's total this year, and tallying 22 of her 23 extra-base hits.
- She earned South Carolina's first SEC Player of the Week nod (on March 31) since 2005 with her performances against Furman and Mississippi.
- Her 17 doubles, second in the SEC, already is tied for fourth at South Carolina in a season, and her slash stats all rank in the top 10 as well.
- She's now in the Gamecocks' career top-15 in batting average, on-base percentage and slugging percentage, which can be found on page 10.
- She currently sits atop the career doubles-per-game list (0.25) and needs two RBI and 11 hits to qualify for those per-game top 15s.
- With multiple hits in 14 games, she leads the team.
- She's hitting .444 when playing a defensive position compared to .161 in 14 games as a designated/ offensive player.

THE JOYS OF PLAYING AT HOME

- After playing only 17 games at its home facility last season, tying the second-lowest mark in the SEC era (since 1997), South Carolina has scheduled 34 games for Carolina Softball Stadium at Beckham Field before hosting the 2014 SEC Softball Tournament.
- Barring any rainouts, it would take two postseason games at home to tie the 2002 team's record with 36 home games.
- The Gamecocks have already tripled their 2013 home win total, going 21-3 this year compared to 7-10 in Carolina Softball Stadium a year ago.
- Out of those 24 home games, South Carolina has posted a shutout in 11 of them. One loss even saw the Gamecocks throw a one-hitter (vs. No. 16/19 Minnesota, 3/19)
- In the 17 home dates, the Gamecocks have posted paid crowds over 1,000 in 13 of them.

SOME PEOPLE LOVE HOME COOKING; OTHERS SHINE ON THE ROAD

- Ashlyn Masters tends to like playing at home, posting a .463 batting average and a .806 slugging
 percentage in Carolina Softball Stadium at Beckham Field against .286 and .444, respectively,
 away from home.
- Ansley Ard also hits better at home (.415 BA vs. .207).
- Dana Hathorn has done much better on the road than at home (.286 BA vs. .167), and so has Victoria Williams (.481 OBP vs. .364).
- Brooke Barnhill has scored nine runs in 17 appearances away from Columbia, while she's scored only four times in 16 home playing chances.
- Both of South Carolina's primary pitchers have ERAs under 1.65 at home and over 4.25 outside
 of the SEC's newest stadium.
- Helping those ERAs are the 138:47 K:BB ratio at Beckham Field compared to a 79:88 mark away.

THE SCHEDULE HAS BEEN TOUGH

- The Gamecocks have 24 of their 55 games against teams who made the 2013 NCAA Tournament.
- South Carolina downed No. 3/3 Arizona State and is 5-13 against those teams so far in 2014.
- A total of 35 of the Gamecocks' scheduled games come against teams that finished in the top 100 of the NCAA's Ratings Percentage Index last year. Of those, 21 are against RPI top-50 teams.
- Entering the LSU weekend, South Carolina is 4-11 against RPI top-50 squads. Both the Tigers of LSU and Auburn are in the top 25 in the RPI.
- After facing nothing but NCAA Tournament participants in SEC play last year, South Carolina has two conference weekends against non-tourney teams this year (home vs. Mississippi & Auburn).
- Two of the Gamecocks' SEC contests will be on national television, including the opening game to ESPN's national coverage.
- The Gamecocks' Saturday game against LSU will also be on ESPNU.
- All nine games of the SEC Softball Tournament will be on the ESPN family of networks.

THE PITCHERS REIGN SUPREME

- Both redshirt junior Julie Sarratt and freshman Nickie Blue have won weekly awards from the Southeastern Conference, Sarratt most recently being named pitcher of the week on March 17.
- Blue has five saves, tied for third in a single season at South Carolina and Sarratt four, tied for fifth.
- Both are better in relief (Sarratt 1.12 ERA, Blue 1.26) than starting (Sarratt 3.04, Blue 3.86).
- The group posted a 29-inning scoreless streak from the final game at Florida Atlantic till the final game of the Gamecock Invitational. UNC Wilmington posted an unearned first-inning run to snap it.
- Longer than that stretch was the Gamecock pitchers' no-homer stand, from the 4th against Ohio
 through the end of the UNC Wilmington game, lasting 72 innings.
- As a team, the Gamecock pitchers have allowed 0.50 homers, 0.05 triples and 0.76 doubles per game, which stand third, third and sixth in the league, respectively.
- The staff has given up only 15 runs in the fifth inning all year (42.1 innings). Six of those came in the series at No. 15/17 Georgia.

BLUE'S BEEN BEST IN BIG GAMES

- Nickie Blue earned her first SEC Freshman of the Week honor on Feb. 24 after picking up a win and two saves in relief as well as her first career shutout vs. Michigan State.
- Blue has two marquee wins on the season, both complete-game victories at ranked opponents in the 3-2 victory at No. 3/3 Arizona State and the 1-0 triumph at No. 15/17 Georgia.
- Against the Bulldogs, Blue struck out a career-best seven and held UGA to its lowest hit total of
 the season to date, allowing only three.
- When Blue pitches, she's produced nearly double the ground-ball outs (181) versus fly outs (96).

SAVVY VETERAN SARRATT STRIKING DOWN FOES

- Julie Sarratt picked up SEC Pitcher of the Week honors on March 17 after going 2-0 with a save the week prior, which included a complete-game, nine strikeout win over No. 13/15 Texas A&M.
- Sarratt's fanned 120 batters in 131 innings, a rate (6.41 K/7IP) almost two K's better her career standard (4.56 K/7IP) entering the year.
- Sarratt struck out a career-high 10 in the win over Maryland, while she sat down nine in her complete-game victory over No. 13/15 Texas A&M, her best in an SEC game.
- She is at her best with two strikes against right-handed hitters, holding them to a .152 batting average (24-of-158) with 78 of her K's in those circumstances.

SNAER DRIVES THE MIDDLE OF THE ORDER

- Freshman Kaylea Snaer ranks as the only Gamecock to start all 44 games.
- She already has eight homers (T-7th) and 28 walks (T-7th), both in SC's top 10 in a season.
- Her 35 RBI are four shy of a spot on the single-season charts.
- She's five doubles away from a listing as well.
- In SEC play, she's been stellar. Of her 13 hits, nine have gone for extra bases (4 2B, 5 HR). Those
 nine extra-base hits are 1/5 of the team's output in SEC play this season.
- Snaer's posted two or more hits 11 times and multiple RBI in 12 games, the latter tops on the team.
- Eighteen of Snaer's 35 RBI have come with two outs.

SCOUTING LSU

- The Tigers split a doubleheader on Wednesday at Hofstra to put their record at 25-19 entering this
 weekend's series.
- At 6-9 in SEC play, the Tigers are tied for ninth in the SEC standings with Auburn, one game ahead of 11th-place Mississippi State.
- LSU has a team batting average of .301, eighth in the league. Four players boast of averages over .300.
- Four also have slugging percentages over .525, all with seven or more home runs.
- Speed is a bigger part of the Tigers' game, led by junior A.J. Andrews' 25 stolen bases. She tops the team with a .359 batting average and four triples. Andrews reaches base at a .464 clip in SEC play.
- Redshirt senior Allison Falcon also has four triples to go with 7 home runs and a team-best .590 slugging percentage.
- Freshman Sahvanna Jaquish tops LSU with 9 homers and 31 RBI, with four of those blast coming in SEC play.
- Sophomore Bianka Bell has eight doubles and seven homers while posting a team-high .444 onbase percentage.
- In the circle, the Tigers have allowed 188 walks and 37 HBPs in 286 innings while also giving up 28 homers, 19 of those in 15 SEC games.
- Freshman Baylee Corbello holds foes to a .206 batting average and has a 12-7 mark in 132.2 innings of work. She's struck out 137 but walked 98 and hit 17.
- Against the SEC, Corbello has walked 46 and fanned 42 in 46.1 innings.
- Senior Ashley Czechner holds a 3.53 ERA in 113 innings, striking out 78 while walking 57. Opponents are hitting .275 against her.

LSU and South Carolina Against Common Foes

- The two teams have played four common foes, all ranked in the top 25 this week.
- Both were swept in a three-game series at Alabama and lost home games to Minnesota.
- LSU took two-of-three in series at home against both Georgia and Tennessee, while South Carolina went 1-5 in meetings at those top-20 teams.

TIES BETWEEN SOUTH CAROLINA AND LSU

- LSU's Hailey Smith and SC's Mackenzie Moler both played for the NJ Intensity travel-ball team.
- Gamecock senior Dana Hathorn's father and grandfather played sports at LSU. Her dad Jim played baseball in the late 70s, while her grandfather Conley Hathorn played basketball from 1935-38, earning All-SEC honors in 1938.

SERIES **H**ISTORY VS. THE **T**IGERS

- LSU owns a 39-15 advantage in the series which improves to 36-15 when only counting the SEC
 era. The two teams played three times in 1982, with the Gamecocks winning all three.
- In Columbia, the Tigers are 15-6 all-time, winning their last seven games on Beckham Field.

CURRENT GAMECOCK STATS VS. LSU

- Senior Dana Hathorn has a .300 batting average and .400 on-base percentage in nine games alltime against the Tigers with one double (in 2012).
- Junior Kristen Struett is 4-for-10 with a double against LSU in six games, with her three starts coming in 2013. Her on-base percentage vs. the Tigers is .500.
- Ansley Ard, Olivia Lawrence, Ashlyn Masters and Codee Yeske are all looking for their first hit against LSU.

THE LAST SERIES - SOUTH CAROLINA AT LSU - MARCH 22-24, 2013

- LSU claimed the series with wins on Friday (4-0) and Saturday (6-0), but the Gamecocks came back to capture the final game against the 13th-ranked Tigers (4-1).
- In game one, LSU's Rachele Fico scattered three hits and two walks in the shutout win, striking out seven, and Gamecock second baseman Dana Hathorn went 2-for-3.
- Two two-run homers from LSU's Tammy Wray led the No. 13/12 Tigers to a 6-0 win over South Carolina on Saturday afternoon. Hathorn reached base in all three trips to the plate.
- Kristen Struett's 3-for-3 day that included two RBI singles and a double led the Gamecocks to the 4-1 win on Sunday at LSU. Right fielder Chelsea Hawkins went 1-for-3 with a two-RBI single. Left fielder Alaynie Page scored twice, going 1-for-3.

FAMILY TIES

- The Masters sisters Ashlyn and Lauren are the first siblings to play on the same Gamecock team
 and the second set ever in the program's recorded history, after the Troesh sisters, Leanna (1997-99)
 and Debralee (2000-03).
- While both Williams, freshmen Taylor and Victoria are not sisters.
- Chelsea Hawkins is the niece of Tia Rogers (2002-04 letter-winner).

IN WINS AND LOSSES, WHO (AND WHAT) STANDS OUT?

- When the Gamecocks hit a homer, they are 22-6.
- If they amass more hits than the foe, they are 25-1.
- When holding opponents without a homer, South Carolina is 20-6.
- In 11 of the 15 losses, the Gamecocks have given up eight hits or more. Only on four occasions
 have they won when allowing that many hits.
- As a team, the Gamecocks slug .514 in wins and .367 in losses and reach base at a .417 clip in wins and just .320 in losses.
- Gamecock pitching has a near 3:1 K:BB ratio in wins while it's 0.73:1 in losses.
- Julie Sarratt has a 93:30 K:BB ratio in 87.1 innings in wins and a 27:33 ratio in 43.2 innings in losses. Nickie Blue is in the same vicinity, 67:32 in wins (93.1 IP) and 18:21 in losses.
- The Gamecocks have drawn 118 walks and been hit 26 times in 29 wins and garnered 40 free passes and 11 HBPs in 15 losses.
- Catalysts in wins include Ashlyn Masters (.443 BA, 20 XBH in W's, .238 BA, 2 2B in L's), Ansley
 Ard (.404 BA in W's, .174 in L's), Codee Yeske (.469 OBP in W's, .304 in L's) and Kristen Struett

MILESTONE WINS FOR GAMECOCKS, COACH SMITH ALREADY PASSED IN '14

- South Carolina has played 2,038 games in its softball history, going 1328-704-6 (.653) in its 41st season of sponsorship.
- With the season-opening 1-0 win over Iowa, the Gamecocks gained their 1,300th program victory.
- Head coach Beverly Smith claimed second alone on SC's coaching wins list with a 9-1 (5) win in the first game of the doubleheader against Furman.
- She earlier took third with the 13-0 (5) victory vs. UNC Greensboro.
- She is the third Gamecock head coach to coach a fourth season at South Carolina, joining Piel and NFCA Hall-of-Fame coach Joyce Compton.

MONUMENTAL WEEKEND FOR GAMECOCKS AND COACH SMITH VS. TEXAS A&M

- South Carolina won its first series over a ranked SEC opponent since 2009 with a doubleheader sweep of No. 13/15 Texas A&M on March 15.
- It also stands as the first SEC series win in Carolina Softball Stadium for the Gamecocks in five tries in the new facility.
- The second win on March 15 marked Beverly Smith's 100th at South Carolina.
- The come-from-behind win in game one in the bottom of the seventh is the first since March 11, 2012 vs. Arkansas.
- Both games featured two-run, walk-off homers, Evan Childs with the one over the Hogs in 2012 and Ashlyn Masters with the shot against the Aggies.
- Entering the seventh tied, the Gamecocks won their first game in that scenario in 2014. Five times, South Carolina did that in 2013, with three in SEC play (at Mississippi State and at Auburn twice).
- Julie Sarratt earned SEC Pitcher of the Week honors for getting the win and the save during the doubleheader along with her win over Eastern Kentucky on March 11.

GAMECOCKS ADDED TO THEIR RICH HISTORY IN NCAA TOURNAMENT

- South Carolina made its 16th appearance in the 2013 NCAA Tournament and the first since 2007.
- The Gamecocks are 31-29 in those trips, making three Women's College World Series in their history (1983, 1989 and 1997).
- The program has five AIAW World Series trips in its history as well prior to 1982.
- Four times, South Carolina has won a regional.
- The Gamecocks made their seventh regional final (in multi-team regionals) in 14 appearances. The regionals in 1982-83 were best-of-three series against one opponent.

ROSTER NOTES

- South Carolina returns six position starters from last year's team, including at second base (Dana Hathorn), in left (Alaynie Page) and in right field (Chelsea Hawkins). All 59 starts in center field and at designated player return as well as the majority of starts at first and third bases.
- In the loss of Samie Garcia, the Gamecocks lose their leader in batting average, runs, hits, doubles, triples, total bases, slugging percentage, sacrifice hits and stolen bases and the only person who started at shortstop.
- The greatest losses come in triples (7 of 10) and sacrifice hits (9 of 19).
- In the rest of the offensive categories, the Gamecocks bring back from 70.7 percent (doubles) to 80 percent (home runs) of their production from 2013, a season where the Gamecocks set six team offensive records.
- Back is the 2013 team leader in on-base percentage (Dana Hathorn, .463), home runs (Chelsea Hawkins, 8), walks (Alaynie Page, 26) and hit by pitches (Dana Hathorn, 25).
- In the circle, the team loses almost 60 percent of the innings and strikeouts from a year ago but returns team ERA, IP, K and win leader Julie Sarratt.
- Nine newcomers join the roster, including eight freshmen and the transferring Sarah Mooney, who
 earned Colonial Athletic Association Player of the Year honors at James Madison.
- The team is again dominated by South Carolina natives, with 36.4 percent of the roster (eight players) hailing from the Palmetto State. Georgia is second with three players.
- The Gamecocks hail from 10 states this year, adding players from North Carolina, Colorado, Illinois, California, Texas and Virginia.

More on the Newest Gamecocks

- With nine new student-athletes, South Carolina retooled after losing seven players, four to graduation and three to transfers.
- Three of the incoming eight freshmen have been honored by MaxPreps.com on their High School All-America teams, including two on its small school listings.
- Kaylea Snaer earned second-team accolades in the country, while, on the small school lists were Taylor Williams (first team) and Victoria Williams (second team).
- The Williams and Snaer join Alaynie Page as Gamecocks who earned those honors. Page made the Junior All-America list earlier at Boiling Springs High School.
- The eight freshmen all represent different states: California (Snaer), Colorado (Nickie Blue), Georgia (Effie Manahan), Illinois (Kate Shereyk), North Carolina (Macey Webb), South Carolina (V. Williams), Texas (T. Williams), and Virginia (Mackenzie Moler).
- Nickie Blue is the first Gamecock to be listed over 6-0 since Melanie Henkes (6-3) in 2006.
- The lone transfer this year, Sarah Mooney, earned 2013 Colonial Athletic Association Player of the Year accolades.
- Leading the Dukes in eight offensive categories, Mooney won the CAA triple crown and set new program records with 17 homers and 67 RBI in 59 games.
- Mooney moves closer to home in two aspects, hailing from the greater Charlotte area and also likely to serve as the Gamecocks' starting catcher.

2013 STANDS ALONE IN OFFENSIVE RECORDS

- South Carolina set six cumulative team offensive records in 2013 and five in the per-game categories.
- Overall, the 338 runs, 45 homers, 295 RBI, 60 hit by pitches, .384 on-base percentage and .450 slugging percentage all topped previous marks.
- In per-game comparisons, the 5.73 runs, 5.00 RBI, 12.17 total bases, 2.78 walks and 1.02 hit by pitches broke records.
- Dana Hathorn got hit 25 times, more than tripling the previous season record.

THE SINGLE-SEASON CHARTS SAW MANY CHANGES

- Dana Hathorn more than tripled the single-season hit-by-pitch mark, getting plunked 25 times in 59 games. She also posted the fifth-best on-base percentage in a year (.463).
- Chelsea Hawkins made it a five-way tie for sixth place with eight homers and tied Danielle Quinones for sixth in homers per game (0.14). She also tied for 13th with three sacrifice flies.
- Kristen Struett tied for fifth with 43 RBI in a season and stood fifth with 0.78 RBI per game.
- Alaynie Page finished 10th in runs per game (0.78), 11th in homers (7), 13th in walks (26) and walks per game (0.44) and tied for third in hit by pitches (7).
- Ashlyn Masters had four sacrifice flies, tying for seventh with six others.
- Pitcher Julie Sarratt made the single-season relief appearances chart (13, T-13th), and tied for seventh with 12 hit batters.

How the Gamecocks Made the 2013 SEC Tournament and About the Win

- The Gamecocks won their first SEC Tournament game since 2003 with a 6-3 win over seventh-seeded and host Kentucky in the first round.
- It was South Carolina's first SEC Tourney win since May 9, 2003 over Mississippi State.
- It took a win over No. 2/3 Florida, the first win over the Gators since 2003, ending a 28-game losing streak in the series, to secure the berth, the first in Beverly Smith's head coaching career.
- South Carolina swept its first SEC series of the year at Mississippi State, marking the first road three-game SEC sweep for the Gamecocks since doing it at Kentucky over March 29-30, 2008.
- It was the first three-game sweep in Starkville in history for South Carolina.
- The Gamecocks won their first SEC series of 2013 at Auburn, the first winning weekend in any SEC road series since the 2011 Arkansas win (4/16-17).

ROLLER COASTER RIDE IN TEMPE

- South Carolina picked up its second win in history in the home park of a top-five team when it downed No. 3/3 Arizona State 3-2 to open its stay in the ASU Louisville Slugger Invitational.
- Senior Chelsea Hawkins accounted for every Gamecock run, hitting a two-run homer for the initial lead and scoring the insurance run in the seventh after leading off the inning with a double.
- Hawkins went 3-for-3 in the win with a homer, double, two RBI and two runs scored. The seven total bases is the most for a Gamecock this year.
- Freshman Nickie Blue tossed 101 pitches, the most at that time in her budding college career, in the complete-game win. It's her second complete game as a Gamecock.
- Blue matched her then-career high by striking out five Sun Devils in the win.
- Over night, however, the team was swept by a virus that kept two players from the field on Friday and weakened many others. Ten student-athletes were treated for similar symptons during the trip.
- It still took allowing 11 and 10 runs to fall to No. 19/20 Minnesota and Ball State, respectively.
