INTRODUCTION

ABOUT THE FACILITIES

The outdoor track, named in honor of legendary Gamecock coach Weems Baskin, features a 400-meter, eight-lane track with multi-directional sprint straightaways. The Erotan "S" Synthetic track surface is made by Southwest Recreational Industries, Inc.

Inside the track are two multi-directional long and triple jump runways that include four pits. There also is a multi-directional vault area, and the high jump apron was expanded during the 1997 surfacing project.

The world-class Lynx timing system, used indoors and outdoors, allows for rapid and accurate computerized fully automatic times.

The outdoor track also features world-class throwing facilities. The hammer and discus circles are surrounded by a 20-foot high cage that meets NCAA and international standards. There also are two shot put rings, a javelin runway and an additional ring with a cage.

The outdoor track has seating to accommodate 2,200 spectators. This season, the Gamecocks will host one indoor meet and two outdoor meets. The outdoor track also plays host to a number of youth and high school competitions, including the state high school championships and the Coaches Classic High School meet.

The indoor track features a 250m, three-lane track and separate vault facility. The infield is carpeted with artificial turf. The throws area features separate shot put and weight-throw circles. The landing area is artificial turf, and there is ample space in the facility for practicing either indoor or outdoor events.

The Gamecocks' cross country courses are Owens Field and Hilton Field at Fort Jackson, the site of the 1997 and 2005 SEC Cross Country Championships, the 1999 South Carolina Collegiate Championship and the annual Gamecock Invitational. The all-grass course has rolling hilly terrain and a grandstand that seats 3,000 fans.

ABOUT WEEMS BASKIN



The outdoor track is dedicated in honor of former coach Weems O. Baskin, Jr. After his death in 1993, the All-Comers Meet was renamed in his honor, the Weems Baskin Memorial Meet.

During his brilliant coaching career at South Carolina from 1949 to 1969, Baskin won 90 dual meets and lost 47. He later held the position of administrative assistant to the athletic director before retiring in 1972.

The only breaks in his coaching career that began in 1930 were during World War II when Baskin served as a Naval officer, in 1946 and 1947 as a businessman in Athens, Ga., and 1951 when South Carolina did not field a team due to the Korean War.

Originally from Carrollton, Ga., Baskin was a four-sport athlete at Carrollton High School. He enrolled at Auburn in 1923 and by his senior year was playing tight end on the football team and winning the national championship in the 110-meter high hurdles. Baskin also ran the low hurdles and competed in the shot put, discus, javelin and high jump. He won the Southern Conference title three straight years in the high hurdles and was a national AAU indoor champion in 1928.

WEEMS BASKIN TRACK

After receiving a degree in education, Baskin ran for the New York Athletic Club for two winters and wrote for various publications. He began his coaching career as an assistant football coach at Auburn in 1930 and assisted with the track team. He went to Georgia in 1931 to become the head track coach while serving as an assistant to football. Baskin served in the same capacity at Mississippi from 1938 to 1943 before joining the Naval Reserve during WWII.

Baskin, a former president of the National Track and Field Coaches Association and chairman of the NCAA Track and Field Rules Committee, is a member of the Helms Foundation Track and Field Hall of Fame. He also was elected to the South Carolina and Georgia Track and Field Halls of Fame.

15th Season // East Carolina '74

Entering the 2011 track season in his 15th year as head track & field and cross country coach at South Carolina, Curtis Frye has established a program that is regarded as one of the nation's elite. Frye has coached or overseen over 60 NCAA champions, 114 SEC champions and more than 415 NCAA All Americans.

In October 2008, Frye was bestowed the Order of Ikko Medallion, presented by the United States Olympic Committee. A special order reserved for the coach of an Olympic or Paralympic medalist, Frye received the honor after coaching Jerome Singleton Jr. to a silver medal in the men's 100-meter dash at the 2008 Paralympic Games in Beijing. He also currently serves as President of the United States Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association.

Frye has coached an NCAA champion in all but one year since taking over the program in 1996, including coaching Johnny Dutch to the 400m hurdle title last season. In addition, Frye has coached an SEC champion every year he has been at South Carolina.

One of the most well-respected coaches in the country, Frye brought South Carolina its first team NCAA championship in any sport when his women's team captured the 2002 NCAA Outdoor Championship crown. Frye is a three-time United States Track Coaches Association (USTCA) National Coach of the Year, taking home the 1999 and 2002 women's outdoor honors and the 1999 men's indoor honors. In taking home the men's indoor and women's outdoor coach of the year honors in 1999, he became the first person in the history of the USTCA to win the award indoors and outdoors in the same year. In 2001, he earned the prestigious Nike Coach of the Year award and was also named the 1997 USOC Track & Field Coach of the Year. Frye is also a three-time SEC Coach of the Year with the honor coinciding with his three women's outdoor conference championships in 1999, 2002 and 2005.

During his tenure at South Carolina, Frye has coached 11 SEC Athletes of the Year, the most recent being Nadonna Rodrigues, who was named the 2009 SEC Freshman Runner of the Year (indoor). He has also coached five national athletes of the year in Hastings (2007-overall), Demetria Washington (2002-indoor), Lashinda Demus (2002-overall), Terrence Trammell (2000-outdoor) and Miki Barber (2000-outdoor). Demus was acknowledged by Track & Field News while the United States Track & Field & Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCA) honored the other four recipients.

On the women's side, Frye's teams have placed in the top 10 nationally outdoors in all but three of his seasons at Carolina. In addition to the team title in 2002, his teams earned the silver medal in 2005 and took home the bronze in 2003 and 2006. On the men's side, Frye's team placed in the top 25 nationally indoors in all but three of his seasons.

Along with continued success on the track, Frye has produced winners in the classroom on a consistent basis. Frye's athletes have earned four USTFCCA National Scholar-Athlete of the Year honors in addition to an SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year award. Richardson swept the indoor and outdoor national honors in 2008, following awards earned by 2006 National Indoor Scholar Athlete of the Year Shalonda Solomon and 2002 National Scholar Athlete of the Year Otukile Lekote. In 2009, the men's team was named Scholar Team of the Year.

In his career, Frye has coached 25 Olympians who have won 11 medals at the Olympic Games. Nine of his former student-athletes competed at the 2008 Olympic Games in Beijing, six of them as first-time Olympians. At the Games, Natasha Hastings earned a gold medal as

a member of the USA 4x400m relay team. Frye served as an assistant coach for the 2004 USA Olympic women's track team with responsibilities that included working with the sprinters and the relays. He also accompanied his former athletes to the 2000 Sydney Olympics. Frye's athletes won three gold medals in 2004 by Tonique Williams-Darling (Bahamas-400m), Otis Harris (USA-4x400m relay) and Aleen Bailey (Jamaica-4x100m relay).

Hired at South Carolina on July 29, 1996, Frye came to Columbia after serving as assistant head coach at North Carolina for four years. During his tenure at UNC, he was a part of 13 ACC championship teams.

Prior to his stint with the Tar Heels, Frye was an assistant coach at Florida from 1988 to 1992. While with the Gator program, he coached three NCAA individual champions and one relay champion team. In total, 29 All-America certificates were earned while Frye was in Gainesville.

From 1984 to 1988, Frye was an assistant coach for N.C. State, aiding the Wolfpack to four conference championships. He was instrumental in leading State to 27 All-America honors, four individual NCAA second-place finishes and 37 conference champions.

Frye began his coaching career as an assistant at his alma mater, East Carolina, in 1974. He also served as head coach for the men's soccer team and was director of facilities. Frye took a break from the collegiate ranks from 1979 to 1984 when he was head track and field coach for Douglas Byrd High School in Fayetteville, N.C.

Frye and his wife, Wilma, have three children: Crystal, C.J. and Curtrell.

South Carolina Assistant Head Coach 14th Season // Liberty '89

Delethea Quarles is in her 14th year with the South Carolina program and her 22nd year as a collegiate coach entering the 2011 season. Promoted to assistant head coach in 2005, her primary responsibilities include coaching the multi-event performers and jumps. Quarles also oversees eligibility and is the team's academic liaison.

Quarles has extensive international experience and worked with USA international teams for two consecutive summers. In 2007 Quarles was the head coach of the USA Pan American Junior Championship women's team that competed in Brazil in July. While the head coach she was responsible for all jumps and multi events. The men's and women's teams combined to win 48 medals at the meet. Quarles worked as an assistant coach on the all-star squad of coaches for the 2006 USA World Cup team in Athens, Greece, with the responsibility of coaching all the jumps. Quarles ended the 2005 season as an assistant coach for Team USA at the Pan American Championships held in Windsor, Ontario, Canada. With her assistance, the USA team earned 57 medals, the second-highest of all time.

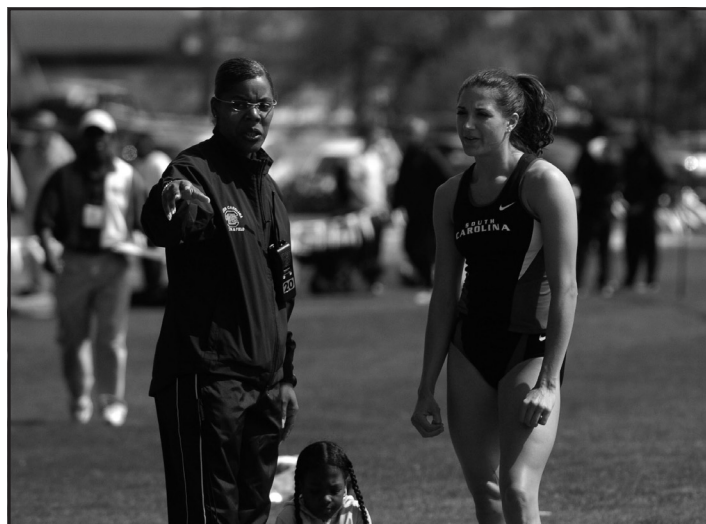
Academically, Quarles has guided three student-athletes to national Scholar Athlete of the Year honors. Jason Richardson became the first Gamecock to sweep indoor and outdoor honors as he was awarded by the USTFCCA for both seasons in 2008 as the male Scholar Athlete of the Year. Shalonda Solomon was named 2006 Indoor Scholar Athlete of the Year, and Otukile Lekote picked up the accolade in 2002. The South Carolina women's team was honored by the organization as the 2006 Academic National Champion, and the men's team was named the 2009 Academic National Champion. In addition, Natasha Hastings was named the 2006 SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year.

Quarles has coached her student-athletes to 21 All-America honors and five SEC championships. In addition, former Gamecock Chelsea Hammond became the first multi-event student-athlete in South Carolina history to qualify for the Olympic Games. Coached by Quarles from 2002 to 2005, Hammond competed for Jamaica at the 2008 Olympic Games in the long jump.

Quarles has coached 10 of the 14 school record holders in the events for which she is responsible at South Carolina. Most recently, Greig Cryer finished a career-high third in the long jump at the 2006 NCAA Indoor Championships after setting the indoor school record in the triple jump, crossing the board at 52-5 1/4. The mark was a foot longer than the record that had stood for 12 years. Derek Pressley, a 2008 graduate, jumped a career-best 51-10 1/2 as runner-up in the triple jump at the 2007 SEC Outdoor Championships.

Leading the women's team, Quarles coached Kettiany Clarke, Kemesha Whitmire, Tacita Bass and Erin Narzinski to SEC titles. Clarke became Carolina's first pentathlon winner with the title at the 2010 SEC Indoor Championships. Whitmire jumped a 43-7 in 2005 to take the long jump title while Bass and Narzinski combined for three heptathlon titles. In her first year, Quarles saw Narzinski shatter the school record in the heptathlon, finishing fifth at the NCAA Championships, second at the SEC Championships and eighth at the USATF Junior Nationals. Narzinski earned her second heptathlon title in 1999.

Prior to coming to South Carolina, Quarles was an assistant coach at her alma mater, Liberty, for eight years. A three-time All-American, Quarles has a bachelor's degree in psychology and is a native of Covington, Va.

Kevin Brown enters the second year of his second stint with the Gamecocks in the 2011 season. His primary responsibility is assisting with the sprinters and jumpers in addition to working with South Carolina's well-respected relay teams.

While in his first stint at Carolina, Brown was named to the Team USA coaching staff for the 2003 Junior Pan American Games and served as an assistant coach during the competition in Barbados. In December 2002, he was voted to the Team USA staff by the USATF Coaches Championship Selection Committee, a group that selects national coaching staffs for International competition including the Pan American Games and Goodwill Games. Brown became the second USC assistant coach to serve as a part of a Team USA staff.

Under Brown's tutelage as pole vault coach in his first stint at South Carolina, pole vaulter Chris Steddum earned three first-place finishes during the 2003 outdoor season, including a meet record 17-0 3/4" to win the Orange and Purple Classic at Clemson, a vault that earned him SEC Athlete of the Week honors. Steddum finished second at the SEC Indoor Championships. In 2002, Steddum finished fourth at the NCAA Outdoor Championships in 2002 and was named All-American. He also finished fourth at the SEC Indoor Championships, second at the SEC Outdoor Championships and eighth in the NCAA Indoor Championships in the pole vault, garnering All-American honors.

In 2001, Brown coached Jared Farabee and Steddum to a one-two finish at the SEC Outdoor Championships. Steddum also qualified for the NCAA Indoor Championships and set a school record with a height of 17'-8. Farabee posted a first place finish in the pole vault at the Penn Relays.

Prior to coming to South Carolina in 2000, Brown spent two years as assistant coach at the University of Akron. While at Akron, Brown assisted with the sprints on the track and field team and specialized as the team's field events and jumps coach.

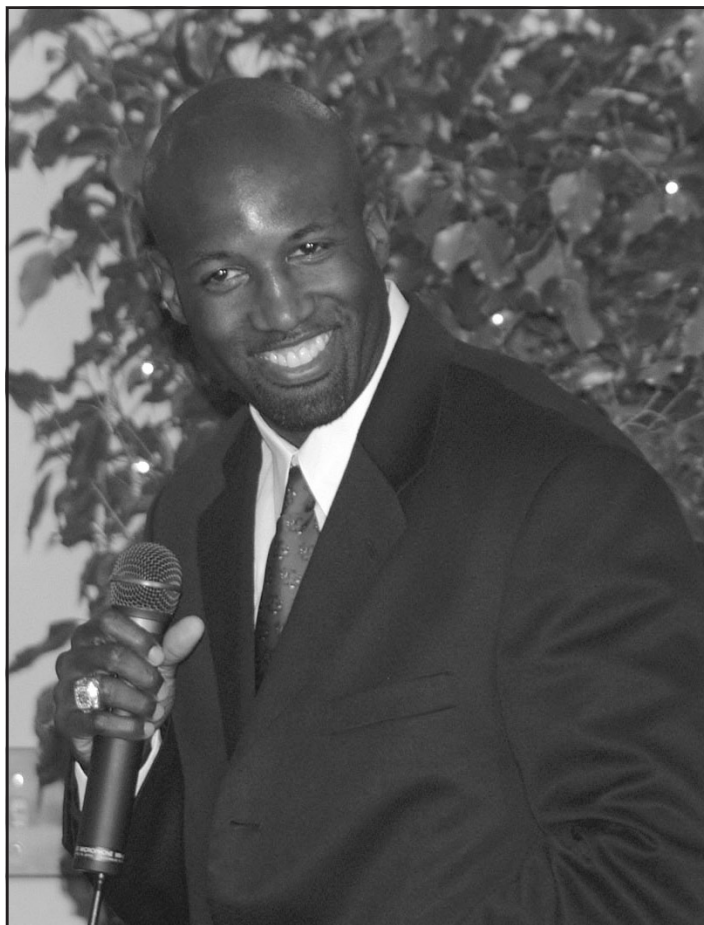
Brown began his coaching career in 1995 as an assistant coach at his alma mater, the University of North Carolina, where he left as the most decorated vaulter in school history.

A pole vault All-American in 1994, Brown placed fourth for the Tar Heels at the NCAA meet, clearing 18-0 1/2. Brown was the only college vaulter in the state of North Carolina to clear 18-0 in 1994. He was an Atlantic Coast Conference scorer in five different events including the pole vault, long jump, triple jump, 4x400 and the 4x100. He still holds the UNC indoor and outdoor records in the pole vault.

A native of Richmond, Va., Brown attended Henrico High School where he was the 1989 Virginia state high school champion in the pole vault. Brown also was a Junior Olympic Regional Champion while he lettered in football, wrestling and track and field.

A 2000 and 1996 Olympic Trials qualifier, his personal best in the pole vault is 18-6.

Brown graduated from North Carolina with a Bachelor of Arts degree in recreational administration. He and his wife Ebonic have four children, Dymonic, Daija, Dorian and Daila, and reside in Columbia.

Lawrence Johnson

Assistant Coach // Pole Vault 4th Season // Tennessee '96

Lawrence Johnson is in his fourth season as a member of the Gamecocks' coaching staff with primary responsibilities that include coaching the pole-vaulters and coordinating recruiting efforts. Johnson came to South Carolina as one of the most decorated pole-vaulters in American history, having competed professionally from 1996 to 2004 as a representative of the United States, adidas and Oakley.

In three years at South Carolina, Johnson has coached his athletes to two SEC titles, three All-America honors, 15 NCAA qualifiers, an NCAA East Region silver medalist, an SEC Championship silver medalist and three SEC Championship bronze medalists.

Johnson's transformation of the pole vault program continued to yield results in 2010 with two SEC champions and two All-America honors. Elliott Haynie became the first double-crown winner in Gamecock history with the indoor and outdoor titles. Johnson's men's pole vaulters earned a record 21 points at the SEC Indoor Championships with a 1-3-3 finish. On the women's side, Vica Shobe set the new school record and earned All-America honors to give the Gamecocks four NCAA qualifiers and two All-Americans on the year.

In his second season at South Carolina in 2009, Johnson coached his men's and women's pole vaulters to seven NCAA Regional bids and a program-best three NCAA Outdoor Championship bids. His vaulters earned two medals at the SEC Championships, and freshman Marvin Reitze became the first Gamecock to earn All-America honors in seven seasons after claiming fourth at outdoor nationals. Haynie finished the season ranked No. 5 in the nation with a school-record jump of 17-10 1/2, and Reitze was the NCAA East Region silver medalist.

A two-time Olympian, Johnson's strongest year came in 2001 when he brought home a gold medal at the IAAF World Indoor Championships in Portugal at 5.95m (19-6.25). The same year he also took first place at the U.S. Indoor and Outdoor Championships. He ended the year ranked second in the United States and fourth in the world, his highest spot in both rankings.

In 2000, Johnson earned the silver medal with a clearance of 5.90m (19-4.25) at the Olympic Games in Sydney, Australia. He also placed first at the U.S. Trials and the U.S. Indoor Championships. In 1997, Johnson earned his first U.S. championships, taking gold at both the indoor and outdoor championships in addition to being a silver medalist at the World Indoor Championships in his first full year as a professional. Turning professional after a stellar collegiate career at the University of Tennessee, Johnson finished eighth at the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta, Ga., after taking first at the U.S. Olympic trials. Earlier that same year, Johnson set an American and NCAA record at 5.98m (19-7.50) at Tom Black Track in Knoxville on May 25, 1996. He went on to become the 1996 SEC Indoor and Outdoor champion, the SEC and NCAA record holder, an NCAA All-American and Athlete of the Year as well as NCAA outdoor champion.

Throughout his career, Johnson is a seven-time U.S. national champion, four-time NCAA champion, six-time conference champion, six-time All-American and seven-time All-SEC selection. He was a three-time SEC All-Academic team member and a Student Athlete Advisory Committee member.

Johnson holds a bachelor's degree in sport management from the University of Tennessee. He has a wife, Christina, and five children.

Stan Rosenthal

Assistant Coach // Distances

10th Season // Indiana University (Pa.) '75

As head cross country coach, Stan Rosenthal is in his tenth year at South Carolina. Rosenthal also coaches the distance runners during track and field season and was instrumental in coaching the South Carolina women's team during its 13th consecutive NCAA indoor top-20 finish in 2010.

At South Carolina, Rosenthal has coached his athletes to 11 All-America honors and three NCAA championships. In 2002, he coached Otukile Lekote to two NCAA titles (800m indoors & outdoors) and on the second leg of USC's NCAA champion 4x400m relay team. Additionally, Rosenthal's men's sprint medley relay team was ranked No. 1 in the United States and the NCAA that year. His 2005 women's squad accomplished the same feat.

Rosenthal has also coached nine SEC champions between Lekote, Shay Shelton and Beatrice Biwott. Lekote earned seven titles from 1998 to 1999, and in 2006 Shelton added to Rosenthal's total by claiming the indoor league crown in the 800m. Biwott won the 2010 SEC Steeplechase title, the first in Gamecock history. Johnny Baez and Shawn Cunningham found success in the 800m as well. Baez qualified for the NCAA East Regional meet, and Cunningham was an SEC finalist and scorer. William Emase was a three time SEC scorer and a two time NCAA qualifier. On the women's side, Biwott has qualified for the NCAA East Region meet in the 3,000m steeplechase each of the past two seasons.

In 2005, Rosenthal coached Jenny Lake to a record-breaking 3000m performance at the SEC Indoor Championship. Lake, who ran 9:41, broke her own school indoor record, originally set in 2003, with a fourth-place finish. Rosenthal also coached the distance medley relay team to a second-place finish at the SEC Championships.

With Rosenthal's assistance, the women's team finished fifth indoors at the NCAA Championships, while capturing the SEC outdoor and NCAA East Regional titles and finishing runner-up at the NCAA Outdoor Championships in 2005. Rosenthal also coached the 2002 South Carolina team that finished fourth at the NCAA Indoor Championships and won the SEC and NCAA Outdoor Championships for Carolina's first national team title in any sport.

Rosenthal's runners have achieved success from the conference level to the world championship level. Two of his freshman runners earned spots on the USA Junior Team and competed in the IAAF World Cross Country Championships, where they placed 40th and 43rd. Three other runners competed in the USA Olympic trials. Many of his runners have qualified for the NCAA Track and Field Championships, while numerous student-athletes won individual conference championships. During his seven years as a high school coach in Virginia, two runners qualified for the Kinney/Foot Locker National Cross Country Championships.

Rosenthal has served on several USA international coaching staffs. He coached on three USA staffs for the IAAF World Cross Country Championships and was a coach at the USA Olympic Festival. In 2001, he was appointed to the NCAA Track and Field Committee. As a member of the Executive Committee for the Women's Cross Country Coaches Association, Rosenthal acted as the Southeast Region representative. He earned USA Track and Field Level I and II certifications for the endurance events.

Academic success is very important to Rosenthal. His student-athletes have achieved individually and as a team. In 2008, Rosenthal's cross country team had the nation's top team GPA at 3.767, earning the team USTFCCA All-Academic Team honors. Also in 2005, Lake was named the university's Scholar Athlete of the Year, a McWhorter Scholar and the recipient of an NCAA Post-Graduate Scholarship as a first-team Academic All-American who graduated with a 4.0 GPA from the Honor College.

Seven of the women's cross country teams coached by Rosenthal were ranked in the NCAA Division I top 20, and seven student-athletes were selected as conference Scholar-Athletes of the Year. During his coaching career, over 95 percent of the student-athletes he has recruited and coached have graduated. Many later earned graduate level degrees, including five who are currently in medical school or doctors.

Prior to joining the South Carolina staff, Rosenthal was the head men's and women's cross country and track and field coach at UNC Asheville. During his seven-year tenure, the women won four Big South Conference championships. In the three years the women did not win, UNC Asheville finished as runner-up. The men's cross country team was Big South Conference runner-up in three of his last four years.

In addition to UNC Asheville, Rosenthal coached at Long Beach State, Georgia, South Alabama and was a graduate assistant coach at Tennessee. He also coached at Albemarle High School in Charlottesville, Va., and in Spotylvania, Va., where he started his coaching career in 1976.

Rosenthal earned his master's degree in education from Tennessee in 1983 and his undergraduate degree from Indiana University of Pennsylvania in 1975. At IUP, Rosenthal competed in the six-mile run at NAIA and was a member of two national-qualifying cross country teams for IUP.

Mike Sergent

Assistant Coach // Throws 14th Season // Virginia Tech '92

Mike Sergent enters his 14th season with the Gamecock track and field program in 2010. His primary responsibilities are coaching the throwers and coordinating the strength and conditioning program.

Sergent has coached 20 All-Americans, 23 NCAA qualifiers, 14 SEC champions and five NCAA champions at South Carolina.

Sergent had a memorable first season as he coached Lisa Misipeka and Brad Snyder to a total of four NCAA individual championships. Misipeka took home titles in the 20-pound weight and the hammer, while Snyder swept the indoor and outdoor titles in the shot put. Snyder repeated in 1999 when Sergent coached him to the indoor shot put title for the second-consecutive year.

In 2010, Michael Zajac brought home All-America honors in the weight throw and hammer throw. Four throwers qualified for NCAA Regionals, and his athletes earned 29 points at SEC Championship events.

On the men's side, Zajac was the SEC silver medalist in the weight throw and earned All-America honors by taking eighth in the weight throw at the NCAA Indoor Championships and 15th in the hammer throw at the NCAA Outdoor Championships.

On the women's side, Aimee Kodat finished seventh at the SEC Outdoor Championships in the discus to continue Sergent's streak of having a thrower score at the meet every season since he has been at Carolina. Sophomore Stacey Roberts qualified for Regionals along with Kodat.

Sergent has also seen success in coaching his student-athletes on the international stage. In 2003, former Gamecock and NCAA champion Dawn Ellerbe reached the World Championships in Paris under Sergent's tutelage. He also worked with Ellerbe in 2002 to help her become the USATF national runner-up in both the weight and hammer throws. She finished the year ranked seventh in the world in the hammer and ranked eighth nationally in the discus throw.

In 2001, two of Sergent's former student-athletes, Snyder and Misipeka, along with Ellerbe, traveled to Edmonton, Canada, for the 2001 World Championships. In his third year at South Carolina, Sergent coached Candy Mitchell, Bert Sorin and Ryan Harrison through the U.S. Olympic trials. At the 2000 Olympic Games, Snyder, Misipeka and Michelle Fournier all competed.

In 1999, Sergent's student-athletes won four SEC titles. Fournier, an academic All-American and NCAA runnerup, was awarded an NCAA Post-Graduate Scholarship. Misipeka also won a bronze medal at the 1999 World Championships - the school's first in a major international meet.

Prior to coaching at Carolina, Sergent was an assistant coach at his alma mater, Virginia Tech, for five years. At Tech, he assisted in one Metro and four Atlantic 10 Conference championship teams from 1993 to 1997.

Sergent holds a bachelor's degree in exercise physiology and a master's degree in sports management from Virginia Tech. He was a 1992 All-American and Olympic trials qualifier in the hammer.

GAMECOCKS A STRONG PRESENCE AT 2000 OLYMPICS

South Carolina sent a combined 19 athletes/coaches to the 2000 Olympics in Sydney, Australia, 12 of whom came from the track and field program. Graduates Charmaine Howell and Terrence Trammell both won silver medals, with Howell's coming in the 4x400-meter relay for Jamaica and Trammell's in the 110-meter hurdles for the USA. Former volunteer coach Monique Hennagan scored a gold medal as a member of the USA's 4x400m relay squad. Another former volunteer, Melissa Morrison, received a bronze medal competing for the USA in the 100-meter hurdles. Former Gamecocks Miki Barber, Dawn Ellerbe, Michelle Fournier, Tonique Williams-Darling and Marvin Watts competed in the Sydney Olympics, as well as former volunteer coach Allen Johnson. Former student-athletes Lisa Barber, Jimmie Hackley, Jackie Madison, Candy Mitchell, Demetria Washington, Antoinette Wilks and Ellakisha Williamson were Olympic trials participants.

TEN GAMECOCKS COMPETE AT 2004 OLYMPICS

Ten Gamecocks, currently and formerly coached by Curtis Frye (who served as an assistant coach for the USA Women's Track and Field Team), were among the 2004 Olympians in Athens, Greece. Of those 10, four brought home a total of five medals, including the USC track and field program's first three gold medals won by former athletes Tonique Williams-Darling (Bahamas) in the 400m, Otis Harris (USA) in the 4x400m relay and Aleen Bailey (Jamaica) in the 4x100m relay. Harris also won a silver medal in the 400m, while Terrence Trammell claimed his second consecutive silver medal in the 110m hurdles. Former volunteer coach Melissa Morrison also added to her medal count with a bronze in the 100m hurdles. Other USC Olympians included Lisa Misipeka, Michelle Fournier, Brad Snyder, Lashinda Demus, Adrian Durant and Shevon Stoddart, as well as former volunteer coaches Allen Johnson and Monique Hennagan.

'09 INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION

NINE GAMECOCKS REPRESENT AT 2008 OLYMPICS

South Carolina sent a combined 13 athletes/coaches to the 2008 Olympics in Beijing, China, nine of whom came from the track and field program. An unfortunate string of events left Team USA hurting on the medal stand, but Natasha Hastings helped bring home a gold medal in the 4x100-meter relay, marking the second consecutive Games that a Gamecock took gold in the event. Chelsea Hammond narrowly missed medaling in her first Olympic Games, taking fourth in the long jump, while Tiffany Ross-Williams led the field through the preliminary rounds before taking eighth in the 100-meter hurdles. For a large contingent of Gamecocks favored to medal in their events, the scoreboards showed multiple "Did Not Finish" results, including for relay members Aleen Bailey, Leroy Dixon, Mechelle Lewis and Rodney Martin. Terrence Trammell, a favorite to medal in the 110-meter hurdles for his third consecutive Games, suffered a hamstring injury in the preliminary round to end his quest.

GAMECOCKS ON THE 2009 INTERNATIONAL SCENE

Seven athletes with University of South Carolina ties earned a total of five medals in nine days of competition at the 12th IAAF World Championships held at Olympic Stadium in Berlin, Germany from August 15-23, 2009.

Competing were Gamecock alums Aleen Bailey, Lashinda Demus, Natasha Hastings, Jussi Heikkila, Tiffany Ross-Williams and Terrence Trammell. In addition, current Gamecock Johnny Dutch was selected as a member of Team USA. Of the seven athletes, all competed for Team USA except for Bailey (Jamaica) and Heikkila (Finland).

In the final two days of competition, all three former Gamecocks that competed in relays for their teams earned gold medals, beginning with the Jamaican 4x100-meter relay team. Aleen Bailey ran the third leg of the relay that crossed at 42.06. Lashinda Demus ran the third leg of the American 4x400-meter relay team that took gold at a new world leading time of 3:17.93. Demus also earned silver in the 400-meter hurdles during the championships. Natasha Hastings also ran on the American 4x400-meter relay team, earning gold medal honors along with Demus.

Ross-Williams competed in the 400-meter hurdles along with Demus and finished fifth overall with a time of 53.83.

On the men's side, Terrence Trammell took silver in the men's 110-meter hurdles with a time of 13.15. It was his third silver medal at the World Championships after also placing second in 2003 and 2007.

Johnny Dutch and Jussi Heikkila competed in the 400-meter hurdles where Dutch, a rising junior at South Carolina, claimed 12th overall with a time of 49.28. Heikkila finished 24th overall with a time of 51.42. Dutch qualified for the World Championships after finishing as runner-up at the USA Outdoor Track & Field Championships.

A slew of Gamecocks competed at the USA Championships as well. In addition to World Championship competitors Demus, Ross-Williams, Hastings and Trammell, seven other Gamecocks competed at the USA's.

Graduated senior Jason Richardson took fifth in the 110-meter hurdles in his first competition after exhausting his collegiate eligibility. Leroy Dixon and Shalonda Solomon both took sixth in their respective 100-meter dash events, with Dixon running a 10.10 in the men's event and Solomon running a 11.3 in the women's event. In addition, four current Gamecocks competed in LaKya Brookins (100-meter dash), Johnathan Hancock (100-meter dash), Antonio Sales (200-meter dash) and Jason Cook (shot put).

Three Gamecocks competed at the U.S. Junior Nationals, highlighted by Booker Nunley's silver medal finish in the 110-meter hurdles at 13.36. Nunley also took second at the Pam Am Junior Championships held in Port of Spain, Trinidad.

The other two Gamecocks competing at the U.S. Junior Nationals were Radiance Basden and Stacey Roberts. Basden placed 12th in the 400-meter hurdles at 1:02.97, and Roberts placed 17th in the shot put at 13.30 meters.

2002 NCAA WOMEN'S OUTDOOR NATIONAL CHAMPIONS

BATON ROUGE, La. (June 1, 2002) — Winning the 4x400m relay with an NCAA meet and collegiate record, the University of South Carolina women's track and field team won the NCAA Outdoor Track and Field title in Baton Rouge, La. It is the school's first-ever NCAA team title in any sport.

USC's women scored 82 points to win the title with UCLA scoring 72 points. Southern California, the defending champions, finished third and LSU, the 2002 indoor champions, was fourth.

On the men's side, South Carolina's men finished sixth with 30 points. LSU won the title with 64 points and Tennessee, favored all year, finished second with 57 points.

"I've learned a lot from a lot of great people," Carolina head coach Curtis Frye said. "I stand on the shoulders of incredible giants in the sport. I think our kids understand what it means to be a class act and win a championship. I knew some things had to happen for UCLA. We didn't have a lot of things go wrong and we wanted to control our own destiny. We wanted to run our best race of the year in the 4x400m relay and we did. I am just thrilled; I have waited 27 years for this.

"I'm just as thrilled with the men's finish," Frye continued. "We came here hoping to finish in the top 10 — maybe top five. I am proud of our efforts. I knew after we won the SEC title in the 4x400m relay, our men would win the race here. All four put it on the line and did an incredible job."

The women ran a time of 3:26.46 to break its own collegiate and NCAA Championship records in the 4x400m relay. The team of Tiffany Ross, Demetria Washington, Tacita Bass and Lashinda Demus helped USC to a first-place finish over Texas. It last won the NCAA title in 2000.

"I can't put into words how I feel right now," Lisa Barber said. "Winning the school's first NCAA title — ever — wow! I am so proud of our entire team. We knew we had a chance if we just worked hard. We are thrilled. I am so proud of the men's and women's teams."

On the men's side, USC won the final event of the meet, the men's 4x400m relay with a school-record time of 3:02.16. The relay included James Law, Otukile Lekote, Otis Harris and Jon Fortenberry. Fortenberry, hoping to reverse his luck after dropping the stick in the prelims, wore his uniform backward and beat LSU and Baylor at the tape.

"I didn't want to drop the stick again tonight, so I wore my uniform backward. It worked," Fortenberry said.

In the final day of the NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championships, USC's quarter-mile runners went 2-3-4 to collect 19 points in the event alone. Barber ran



a personal-best at 50.87 to finish as the runner-up in the 400m. Demus was third, finishing at 51.30, also a personal best. Demus won the 400m hurdles Friday. Washington was fourth, finishing at 51.38. Washington was the runner-up in 2001 and at the indoor meet in 2002.

One hour later, Aleen Bailey stepped on the track with Barber and picked up 12 points in the 200m, finishing second and fifth, respectively. Bailey ran a 22.99 to finish as the runner-up and Barber finished fifth at 23.29.

"Coach Frye told us before the 200m race that we had to score six points to help the team," Bailey said. "We scored 12! I am so happy to finish second. I know the points helped the team."

On the men's side, Harris was eighth in the 400m at 45.99. It was the first time Harris has scored at the outdoor meet and his first outdoor All-America honor. Fortenberry was ninth and also collected All-America honors.

Ross was eighth in the 100m hurdles at 13.57. It was a first-time appearance for Ross in the event, as she was the NCAA runner-up Friday in the 400m hurdles with a time of 55.22.
