NASHVILLE, TENN.—Junior running back Marcus Lattimore rushed for 110 yards and two touchdowns to lead ninth-ranked South Carolina to a 17-13 victory over Vanderbilt on Thursday night in the season opener for both teams at Vanderbilt Stadium.

With the Gamecocks trailing 13-10 early in the fourth quarter, Lattimore scored the game-winning touchdown on a 1-yard run with 11:25 remaining. The Gamecock defense then buckled down and allowed just 17 yards the rest of the way to seal the win.

South Carolina (1-0, 1-0 SEC) has now won 13 straight season openers and nine straight games against SEC Eastern Division opponents, while Gamecock head coach Steve Spurrier

improves to 22-1 all-time in season openers. The Commodores (0-1, 0-1) have dropped four straight games to South Carolina.

In his first game back after suffering a knee injury at Mississippi State last season, Lattimore averaged 4.8 yards on 23 carries and led the Gamecocks with three receptions for 21 yards.

Despite missing several series with a shoulder injury, junior guarterback Connor Shaw helped guide the Gamecocks back into the game, connecting on 7-of-11 passes for 67 yards and rushing 14 times for 92 yards.

The Gamecock defense came up big early after two turnovers by the offense. With Vanderbilt facing a third and goal at the Carolina 5, linebacker Shaq Wilson stepped in front of a Jordan Rogers pass and returned the interception 37 yards to the Commodore 49.

Wilson's interception provided a spark for the offense, as Shaw ran for a 20-yard gain on Carolina's first play after the turnover. Lattimore then took care of the rest as he busted loose for a 29-yard touchdown run, breaking a tackle on his way to the end zone. The touchdown moved Lattimore into sole possession of third place in career rushing touchdown at Carolina with 28. Adam Yates tacked on the extra point to give the Gamecocks a 7-0 lead at the 4:55 mark of the

Yates drilled his first career field goal attempt from 20 yards out with 11:44 left in the half to push South Carolina's lead to 10-0.

Vanderbilt fought back to tie the game before halftime, as Rogers connected with Jordan Matthews for a 78-yard scoring strike to make it a 10-7 ballgame with 10:37 remaining.

After holding the Gamecocks to a three-and-out on the ensuing possession, the Commodores drove deep into Carolina territory before Carey Spear made a 25-yard field goal to knot the game at 10-10.

Shaw left the game late in the second guarter with a shoulder injury after rushing for a 2-yard gain on first down, as the teams ran out the clock and headed into the locker room tied at 10.

Vanderbilt took its first lead of the contest in the third quarter on a 44-yard field goal by Spear that gave the Commodores a 13-10 advantage with 6:02 on the clock.

But Shaw re-entered the game to help lead the Gamecocks to victory. After the offense stalled in his first series back, he guided Carolina on a nine-play, 66-yard scoring drive in his second series, with Lattimore scoring from 1 yard out to give the Gamecocks the lead for good.

Wilson and sophomore defensive tackle Kelcy Quarles led the Carolina defense with eight tackles apiece, as the Gamecocks surrendered 276 yards. Carolina also had five sacks on the

IT'S GREAT TO BE A GAMECOCK

COLUMBIA, S.C.—In his first career start, sophomore quarterback Dylan Thompson threw for 330 yards and three touchdowns to lead ninthranked South Carolina to a 48-10 victory over East Carolina in its home opener at Williams-Brice Stadium.

Thompson, who completed 21-of-37 pass attempts, helped South Carolina amass 528 yards of total offense, including 397 through the air.

The Gamecocks (2-0) have won six consecutive contests dating back to last season. The win also gives head coach Steve Spurrier the 199th of his collegiate career.

Junior running back Marcus Lattimore led the Gamecock rushing attack with 40 yards and a touchdown on 13 carries. He is now tied for the school record for career touchdowns with 33.

South Carolina had 11 different players with at least one or more receptions. Sophomore Rory Anderson led the way with career highs in receptions (four), receiving yards (90) and touchdowns (two). Sophomores Damiere Byrd and Bruce Ellington added 81 and 63 yards, respectively, while senior D.L. Moore had two receptions for 45 yards and two touchdowns. Junior DeAngelo Smith also had a 30-yard touchdown reception, the first of his career.

Defensively, the Gamecocks surrendered 403 yards but they made big plays for the second consecutive week, forcing five turnovers (four interceptions, one fumble).

Quin Smith, T.J. Gurley and Jimmy Legree led the defensive effort with five tackles apiece. Legree also recorded his first career interception and returned it 34 yards for a touchdown. Seniors D.J. Swearinger and Shaq Wilson and sophomore Brison Williams also came up with

ECU starting quarterback Rio Johnson threw for 193 yards but had three interceptions. Backup Shane Carden completed 12-of-18 passes for 140 yards with one touchdown and one interception, while sophomore receiver Justin Hardy hauled in eight passes for 111 yards and a touchdown to lead the Pirates (1-1).

The Gamecocks wasted little time putting points on the scoreboard as they found the end zone less than two minutes into the game. On the fourth play of the contest, Thompson connected with Byrd for a 53-yard pass play to the ECU 6. Lattimore took the handoff on the ensuing play and plowed his way up the middle for a 6-yard touchdown run to give Carolina the early 7-0 lead.

South Carolina pushed its lead to 14-0 late in the first quarter with a five-play, 71-yard scoring drive capped off by a 7-yard touchdown pass from Thompson to Anderson. Ellington and Anderson did a majority of damage on the drive, tallying 40 and 24 receiving yards, respectively.

Thompson delivered his second touchdown strike of the contest early in the second quarter, connecting with Smith in the corner of the end zone from 30 yards out to give the Gamecocks a 21-0 cushion heading into the locker room.

The Carolina defense came up big at the end of the half, forcing turnovers on three of ECU's final four possessions of the second quarter.

The defense kept its momentum going to start the second half, as Wilson stepped in front of a Carden pass at the ECU 29 for his second interception of the season. Three plays later Thompson completed a pass to Moore, who dodged defenders on his way into the end zone for a 29yard TD to give the Gamecocks a 28-0 lead. On the ensuing possession, Carolina scored again when Legree intercepted a Johnson pass at the ECU 34 and raced into the end zone untouched.

A 23-yard field goal by ECU's Warren Harvey at the 1:44 mark of the third made it 35-3.

The Gamecocks added another touchdown with the help of some trickery, as receiver Ace Sanders caught a lateral and found Moore wide open for a 16-yard touchdown pass early in the fourth quarter, giving South Carolina a 41-3 lead.

After ECU scored its first touchdown on a 34-yard pass from Carden to Hardy, USC capped the scoring with a 51-yard scoring strike from Seth Strickland to Anderson late in the contest.



COLUMBIA, S.C.—No. 8/9 South Carolina amassed 501 yards of total offense en route to a 49-6 victory over UAB on Saturday night at Williams-Brice Stadium, giving head coach Steve Spurrier his 200th career victory as a collegiate head coach.

With the win, the Gamecocks improve to 3-0 and extend their winning streak to seven games dating back to last season, which ties for the second longest streak in school history.

For the second straight week, South Carolina gained more than 500 yards of offense, passing for 322 and rushing for 179. The Gamecocks had to mix up quarterbacks after junior Connor Shaw left the game late in the second quarter with an injury. Shaw completed 8-of-14 passes for 107 yards and a touchdown before leaving



the game. Sophomore Dylan Thompson came in after Shaw's injury and had plenty of success directing the offense, throwing for 177 yards and two scores.

Junior running back Marcus Lattimore rushed for 85 yards on just 12 carries and had one score as he became South Carolina's career leader in touchdowns with 34. He also moved into a tie with George Rogers and Harold Green for first in school history in rushing touchdowns with 31. Freshman Mike Davis contributed 84 yards and a touchdown on just four carries.

Bruce Ellington led the receiving corps with five catches for 98 yards, and Damiere Byrd had a 94-yard touchdown reception. Ace Sanders hauled in four passes for 55 yards and a score, and freshman Shaq Roland added a 30-yard touchdown reception.

Defensively, the Gamecocks were just as impressive as they allowed 267 yards of offense, including just 89 in the second half. Senior linebacker Shaq Wilson tallied a game-high eight tackles. Sophomore Jadeveon Clowney was in the UAB backfield disrupting plays for most of the night, recording seven tackles (3.5 for a loss) and two sacks. Senior D.J. Swearinger added three stops and a 65-yard fumble return for a touchdown.

UAB quarterback Jonathan Perry accounted for most of the Blazers' offense, completing 17of-34 passes for 219 yards.

The Blazers (0-2) came out strong as Jackie Williams returned the opening kickoff 53 yards to the South Carolina 35. UAB settled for a 33-yard field goal by Ty Long to take a 3-0 lead at the 12:41 mark of the first guarter.

After the Gamecock offense stalled on its first two drives of the game, the Carolina defense provided a spark. On a third and 12 for UAB at the Gamecock 35, Swearinger recovered a Perry fumble in mid-air and raced 65 yards for a touchdown, giving South Carolina a 7-3 lead with 2:17 left in the quarter.

The Gamecock defense came up big again on the ensuing possession, stopping UAB on fourth and 12 from the South Carolina 36. The Gamecocks then went on a nine-play, 64-yard scoring drive capped by a 16-yard touchdown pass from Shaw to Sanders. Adam Yates' extra point gave Carolina a 14-3 lead with 11:15 remaining in the half.

UAB pulled to within 14-6 with a 46-yard field goal by Long with 4:34 on the clock, but South Carolina pushed its lead to 21-6 heading into the locker room, as Lattimore ended a five-play, 37-yard drive with a 2-yard touchdown run with 1:37 left.

South Carolina put the game out of reach early in the third quarter, as Thompson guided the offense down the field on the opening possession of the half. He connected on passes of 11 and 43 yards to Ellington to set the Gamecocks up at the UAB 6 before finishing off the drive himself with a 6-yard touchdown run to push Carolina's lead to 28-6.

After the defense shut down the Blazers on the next two possessions, Thompson completed a 94-yard touchdown pass to Byrd – the fourth longest pass play in school history – at the 7:03 mark of the third quarter to give South Carolina a 35-6 cushion.

The Gamecocks added two more scores in the fourth guarter - a 30-yard touchdown pass from Thompson to Roland and a 3-yard touchdown run by Davis – to build the final margin.

COLUMBIA, S.C.—Junior quarterback Connor Shaw threw for 249 yards and two touchdowns and completed a school-record 20 consecutive passes to finish the game as he led No. 7/8 South Carolina to a 31-10 victory over Missouri on Saturday at Williams-Brice Stadium.

Shaw's 20 consecutive completions are tied for the second most in SEC history with Ole Miss' Kent Austin, who had 20 straight against Tennessee in 1982. Shaw's completion percentage of 95.2 is also a school record and ranks second in SEC history behind Tee Martin's (Tennessee) record of 95.8 (23-of-24), which came against South Carolina in 1998.

The Gamecocks (4-0, 2-0 SEC) amassed 396 yards of total offense on

Saturday, with 252 coming through the air and 144 on the ground. Junior running back Marcus Lattimore rushed for 85 yards and two touchdowns, averaging four yards per carry to lead the rushing attack. His first touchdown of the afternoon, a 2-yard run early in the second quarter, moved him past George Rogers (1977-80) and Harold Green (1986-1989) for first all-time in career rushing touchdowns at South Carolina with 32. Shaw added 41 yards on 12 carries.

Lattimore also had a stellar day catching passes out of the backfield, tallying seven receptions for 60 yards. Senior tight end Justice Cunningham added four receptions for 41 yards, and junior receiver Ace Sanders had a 23-yard touchdown reception.

Contributing to the Gamecocks' dominant performance was their play on special teams. Sanders returned six punts for 106 yards, including a long of 49. Sophomore Bruce Ellington also had one kickoff return, Carolina's first of the season, for 50 yards.

Defensively, South Carolina held the Tigers to 255 yards of offense (109 rushing, 146 passing). Quin Smith led the way with a season-high 10 tackles, and Devonte Holloman and Shaq Wilson contributed seven stops each. Jadeveon Clowney added four tackles and 1.5 sacks.

Missouri quarterback James Franklin led the Tigers with 92 yards passing, and running back Kendial Lawrence contributed 67 yards on the ground. Linebacker Will Ebner tallied a gamehigh 14 tackles to carry the Missouri defense.

Special teams played a key role in South Carolina's strong finish to the first half. After a scoreless first quarter, Sanders gave Carolina a much-needed spark early in the second quarter with a lengthy punt return as he weaved his way down the field and broke several tackles for a 49-yard gain to the Missouri 4. Two plays later, Lattimore burst into the end zone from 2 yards out, giving the Gamecocks a 7-0 lead with 11:08 left in the half.

The Gamecock defense then forced a Missouri fumble on the ensuing series, and senior defensive end Devin Taylor fell on the ball at the Tiger 37. Shaw took advantage of the excellent field position as he connected with Nick Jones for a 36-yard pass to the Missouri 1, setting up a 1-yard touchdown run by Lattimore. Adam Yates knocked through the extra point to give the Gamecocks a 14-0 advantage at the 10:14 mark of the second quarter.

The Tigers (2-2, 0-2 SEC) put together their best possession of the half late in the second quarter, driving 76 yards on 12 plays to the Carolina 4. However, the Gamecock defense did not break as it held the Tigers to a 22-yard field goal by Andrew Baggett with 1:20 remaining.

Special teams came through once again for the Gamecocks on the ensuing kickoff, as Ellington fielded the ball in the end zone and broke loose for a 50-yard return, giving the offense a chance to score before the half. Four plays later. Shaw found Sanders open down the sideline for a 23-yard touchdown pass, giving the Gamecocks a 21-3 lead heading into the locker room.

The Gamecocks put the game out of reach late in the third quarter, going on a 10-play, 47yard scoring drive. Shaw capped the drive with a 13-yard touchdown pass to Rory Anderson, giving Carolina a 28-3 cushion.

Shaw remained in the game early in the fourth quarter and completed a 10-yard pass to Damiere Byrd on his final pass attempt of the day.

Game 5 #6/6 South Carolina 38, Kentucky 17



September 29, 2012 Commonwealth Stadium Lexington, Ky. 49,810



LEXINGTON, KY— Sixth-ranked South Carolina erased a 10-point halftime deficit, scoring 31 second half points, on the way to a 38-17 victory over Kentucky on Saturday night at Commonwealth Stadium. The Gamecocks are 5-0 on the year and 3-0 in the SEC while the loss drops Kentucky to 1-4 overall and 0-2 in the league. It was the Gamecocks' ninth-straight win, tying the school record set in 1984.

Junior running back Marcus Lattimore carried 23 times for 120 rushing yards and tallied two touchdowns with junior quarterback Connor Shaw going 15-for-18 in the air for 148 yards and two touchdowns as well as 19 carries for 76 yards on the ground.

The Gamecocks appeared to be going in for the first score of the game midway through the first quarter on their second drive of the game. With 3rd and goal from the Kentucky 1, the Kentucky defense stood tall and stopped South

Carolina on a pair of guarterback sneaks to take over on downs near the goalline.

The Wildcats rode the momentum of their defense putting together a 16-play 94-yard drive before settling for a 22-yard field goal by Craig McIntosh that gave Kentucky a 3-0 lead. Twice, the Wildcats converted a pair of 3rd-and-long conversions on 12-yard rush by Jalen Whitlow and a 24-yard rush from Sanders. A key 20-yard pass completion as well as a 15-vard face mask penalty gave Kentucky the ball deep in Carolina territory. However, the Gamecock defense responded on its own with a goal line stand, forcing McIntosh to kick a first field goal.

South Carolina broke on top in the second quarter going 64 yards to paydirt. Shaw rushed for 11 yards and completed a pair of passes to Marcus Lattimore as well as a 37-yard completion to Rory Anderson that put the Gamecocks into scoring position. Deep into Kentucky territory, Shaw found Ace Sanders for a three-yard touchdown reception giving the Gamecocks a 7-3 lead.

Kentucky answered on its next possession though with a touchdown of its own to regain the lead. Whitlow had a steady dose of rushes and passes before capping the drive with an eightyard touchdown run. The Wildcats were also aided on the drive by a 15-yard face mask penalty by the Gamecocks that moved Kentucky deep into South Carolina territory.

With a three-point lead, Kentucky held the Gamecock offense to a three and out and blocked Tyler Hull's punt giving the Wildcats the ball on the South Carolina 34-yard line. As Kentucky threatened, the Gamecocks suffered a bad break as a tipped pass by Gamecock defensive back Jimmy Legree landed in the hands of UK wide receiver Daryl Collins as Kentucky made its way into the red zone. Raymond Sanders capped the drive with a 10-yard touchdown run that increased Kentucky's lead to 17-7.

Trailing 17-7 at halftime, the Gamecocks scored on their opening possession of the second half to cut the deficit to three. A 14-yard rush to convert a third down followed by an 11-yard rush by Shaw set up a 30-yard touchdown pass to Damiere Byrd.

After the defense forced a three-and-out, the Gamecock offense drove 57 yards on the next drive to regain the lead. Carolina mixed the run and the pass on an eight-play drive that was capped by a 17-yard touchdown run by Kenny Miles, putting Carolina ahead for good at 21-17.

With a four-point advantage heading into the fourth quarter, South Carolina put the game away with two more touchdowns and a field goal. The Gamecocks' longest drive of the season in time of possession, 7:12, was capped by a three-yard touchdown run by Lattimore. It was a 14-play, 81-yard drive that featured 63 rushing yards by Lattimore.

The Gamecocks held a 28-17 lead with the defense continuing its steady play. DeVonte Holloman intercepted the Kentucky quarterback on the next possession with freshman defensive tackle Gerald Dixon Jr. coming up with another interception on the Wildcats' next possession. Dixon Jr.'s interception set up Lattimore's second touchdown of the game, this one from four yards out. Carolina would add a 31-yard field goal by Adam Yates to complete the scoring. After allowing 173 total yards in the first half, the defense delivered in the second half, shutting out the Wildcats on just 70 yards in the final 30 minutes. Carolina's offense was stellar in the second half scoring 31 points and gaining 240 yards, including 184 yards on the ground.



COLUMBIA, S.C.—Sixth-ranked South Carolina put together one of its most complete efforts of the season on Saturday night against No. 5 Georgia en route to a 35-7 victory in front of a record crowd of 85.199 at Williams-Brice Stadium.

The Gamecocks rolled up 392 yards of offense and held Georgia to a season-low 224 yards of offense. The Bulldogs entered the contest averaging 48.2 points per game and 536 yards per contest

With the win, South Carolina improves to 6-0 overall and 4-0 in the SEC. The victory is the Gamecocks' 10th straight, which is the longest winning streak in school history, and it's their 12th consecutive over SEC Eastern Division opponents. The win is also head



coach Steve Spurrier's 250th career coaching victory (collegiate and pro combined).

Junior quarterback Connor Shaw and junior running back Marcus Lattimore combined for 349 yards of South Carolina's total offense. Shaw completed 6-of-10 passes for 162 yards and two touchdowns through the air and added 78 yards and a score on the ground. Lattimore carried the ball 24 times for 109 yards and a score, giving him his 11th career 100-yard game and

Defensively, South Carolina limited Georgia quarterback Aaron Murray, as he completed just 11-of-31 passes for 109 yards and threw one interception. The Gamecocks also held Bulldog freshman running back standouts Todd Gurley and Keith Marshall to 39 and 37 yards, respectively. The duo entered the contest averaging a combined 192.8 yards per game.

Sophomore safety Brison Williams led South Carolina's defensive effort with seven tackles and two pass breakups. Sophomore Jadeveon Clowney added four stops, including a sack and two tackles for a loss, and DeVonte Holloman recorded an interception for the only turnover of the game and tallied three tackles.

The Gamecocks fed off of the energy from the record crowd from the start and took the opening possession for a five-play, 76-yard scoring drive. A 42-yard pass from Shaw to Damiere Byrd on the second play of the game set South Carolina up at the Georgia 30-yard line. Three plays later Shaw threw a strike to Bruce Ellington for a 20-yard touchdown pass, giving the Gamecocks a 7-0 lead less than three minutes into the game.

The South Carolina defense kept the momentum going on the ensuing possession, as Kelcy Quarles deflected a Murray pass into the air and Holloman dove under the ball for an interception at the Gamecock 31. The Gamecocks took advantage of the Bulldog miscue, marching 69 yards in 11 plays for a touchdown. Shaw connected with Rory Anderson for a 14-yard scoring strike, giving South Carolina a 14-0 lead at the 6:29 mark of the first quarter.

After the defense forced a three-and-out on the next possession, the Gamecock special teams got involved in the early outburst. On fourth and 8 from the Georgia 30, junior punt returner Ace Sanders fielded a Collin Barber punt at the South Carolina 30 and weaved his way through the punt coverage 70 yards for a touchdown and a 21-0 first guarter lead.

The Bulldogs (5-1, 3-1 SEC) threatened to score late in the second quarter as they went on a 15-play, 80-yard drive to the South Carolina 2. However, the Gamecock defense buckled down at the goal line and stuffed the Bulldogs on fourth and goal to preserve a 21-0 halftime lead.

After stalling on its first drive of the second half, the Gamecocks put the game out of reach with a four-play, 63-yard scoring drive on their second possession, D.L. Moore hauled in a 62yard pass from Shaw over a Georgia defender to set South Carolina up at the Georgia 1 on the third play of the drive. Lattimore then burst up the middle for a 1-yard touchdown run to give the Gamecocks a 28-0 lead with 10:32 left in the third guarter.

South Carolina added one more score with a 14-play, 89-yard scoring drive that ate up 9 minutes and 28 seconds off the clock. Shaw finished off the drive with a 7-yard touchdown run to push the Gamecocks' lead to 35-0.

Georgia avoided the shutout with a 3-yard touchdown run by Ken Malcome with 1:55 left.

BATON ROUGE, LA — Thirdranked South Carolina was unable to overcome a late nine-point deficit at LSU on Saturday night, as the No. 9/8 Tigers held on to claim a 23-21 victory over the Gamecocks at Tiger Stadium.

The loss snaps a school-record 10-game winning streak for the Gamecocks, who fall to 6-1 overall and 4-1 in the SEC. LSU improves to 6-1 on the season and 2-1 in conference play.

South Carolina held a 14-10 lead heading into the fourth quarter. However, the Tigers made a pair of field goals in the final stanza to take the lead for good, and a 50-yard touchdown run by Jeremy Hill pushed LSU's lead to 23-14 with 5:03 remaining.

The Gamecocks refused to go down, as junior quarterback Connor Shaw guided the offense on a 12-play,

91-yard scoring drive capped by a 1-yard touchdown pass to Bruce Ellington to trim LSU's lead to 23-21 with 1:41 remaining. The South Carolina defense then forced a three-and-out, but LSU's Craig Loston came up with an interception on the ensuing possession to seal the win.

South Carolina finished the night with 211 yards of offense, while LSU accumulated 407 yards. Shaw completed 19-of-34 passes for 177 yards and two scores and had two interceptions. Junior Ace Sanders tied a career high with five receptions for 49 yards and a touchdown to lead the receiving corps.

Junior Marcus Lattimore led Carolina on the ground with 35 yards and a TD on 13 carries. Defensively, senior linebacker Shaq Wilson recorded a career-high 14 tackles and a sack to lead the way. Safety D.J. Swearinger and cornerback Victory Hampton added 10 tackles apiece. Hill led the Tigers' attack with 17 carries for 124 yards and two touchdowns.

The Gamecock defense came up big on LSU's first drive of the game, as the Tigers drove down to the South Carolina 2-yard line. On third-and-goal, Gamecock linebackers Wilson and Reginald Bowens stood up Tiger running back Kenny Hilliard at the 1-yard line. After a false start penalty on fourth down moved the ball back to the 6-yard line, the Tigers were forced to settle for a 23-yard field goal by Drew Alleman to take a 3-0 lead with 5:32 left in the first quarter.

South Carolina's offense stalled on its second drive of the contest, but the defense provided one of the biggest plays of the night on the ensuing possession. On second-and-seven from the South Carolina 34, junior cornerback Jimmy Legree stepped in front of a Zach Mettenberger pass at the 29 and returned the interception 70 yards to the LSU 1.

Shaw and the offense took advantage of the momentum-changing play. On second-and-goal from the 2, Shaw rolled right and connected with Sanders for a 2-yard touchdown pass, giving the Gamecocks a 7-3 lead with 14:54 left in the half.

LSU went on another lengthy drive following the Gamecocks' score, but once again the South Carolina defense stood tall in the red zone and forced a fourth-and-10 from the South Carolina 15. Alleman entered to attempt a 32-yard field goal but he missed it wide left, as the Gamecocks held on to their 7-3 lead the remainder of the half.

The teams battled back and forth in the second half. LSU opened the half with a nine-play, 69-yard scoring drive capped by a 7-yard touchdown run by Hill, giving the Tigers a 10-7 lead at the 11:13 mark of the third quarter.

The Gamecocks answered late in the third quarter with a five-play, 39-yard scoring drive. A 30-vard pass from Shaw to tight end Justice Cunningham set South Carolina up at the LSU 2. From there, Lattimore burst into the end zone for a 2-yard touchdown run, as the Gamecocks took a 14-10 lead with 5:11 left in the quarter.

The Tigers pulled to within 14-13 early in the fourth quarter, as a 20-yard field goal by Alleman capped a 16-play, 75-yard drive.

LSU's Eric Reid intercepted Shaw on the ensuing possession and returned it 29 yards to the Gamecock 22, setting up a 22-yard field goal by Alleman that gave LSU the lead for good with 6:37 left in the contest.

GAINESVILLE, FLA. — No. 9/8 South Carolina was unable to overcome three costly first-half turnovers as it fell to No. 3/4 Florida, 44-11, on Saturday afternoon at Ben Hill Griffin Stadium.

The Gamecocks turned the ball over three times in the first half deep in their own territory, which led to 21 points for the Gators.

With the loss, South Carolina falls to 6-2 on the season and 4-2 in SEC play. It is the Gamecocks' first lost against a SEC Eastern Division opponent since 2010 at Kentucky. The Gators move to 7-0 overall and 6-0 in the conference.

South Carolina outgained the Gators 191-183 in total offense, but four turnovers allowed Florida to finish the contest with an average starting field position of the 50-yard line.

Senior placekicker Adam Yates made field goals of 35, 51 and 30 yards to score the majority of South Carolina's points, while sophomore defensive back Victor Hampton returned a blocked extra point attempt for two points on Florida's first score of the second half.

Sophomore quarterback Dylan Thompson led South Carolina with 83 yards passing, while junior Connor Shaw had 72 yards through the air.

Florida quarterback Jeff Driskel completed 11-of-16 passes for 93 yards and four touchdowns to lead the Gators.

Defensively, senior linebacker Reginald Bowens tied a career high with 11 tackles to lead the Gamecocks, while senior spur DeVonte Holloman added eight tackles and a sack. Defensive ends Devin Taylor and Jadeveon Clowney also had a sack apiece for South Carolina.

The Gamecock defense dominated the first half, holding Florida to just 29 yards of offense. However, three turnovers by the offense led to 21 points for the Gators.

On the first play of the game, Florida defensive back Loucheiz Purifoy stripped Shaw at the Gamecock 5-yard line, and the Gators recovered the fumble at the 2.

The turnover set up a 3-yard touchdown pass from Driskel to Jordan Reed that gave Florida a 7-0 lead less than a minute into the game.

South Carolina shook off the early miscue and went on a 15-play, 61-yard scoring drive. Yates capped the drive with a 35-yard field goal to trim Florida's lead to 7-3.

The Gamecock defense then forced four straight three-and-outs, but after the fourth Ace Sanders fumbled the punt, and the Gators recovered at the South Carolina 29. Six plays later, Driskel connected with Quinton Dunbar for a 13-yard scoring strike to give Florida a 14-3 lead with three minutes left in the second quarter.

On the ensuing kickoff, Damiere Byrd fumbled on the return, and it was recovered by Florida's Chris Johnson at the South Carolina 13 and returned to the 1-yard line. Driskel then gave the Gators a 21-3 lead with a 1-yard touchdown pass to Reed with 2:02 left in the half.

South Carolina gained some momentum heading into the locker room, as Yates drilled a career-long 51-yard field as time expired to cut Florida's lead to 21-6. However, the Gamecocks were outscored 23-5 in the second half.

IT'S GREAT TO BE A GAMECOCK

COLUMBIA, S.C.—No. 17/16 South Carolina came up with a pair of crucial defensive plays down the stretch to hold off Tennessee for a 38-35 victory at Williams-Brice Stadium.

The Volunteers (3-5, 0-5 SEC) drove inside the Gamecock 20-yard line with less than two minutes remaining in the contest. However, Jadeveon Clowney sacked quarterback Tyler Bray on first and 10, forcing a fumble that was recovered by Shaq Wilson to end the threat. After the Tennessee defense forced a three-and-out on the next possession, cornerback Victor Hampton intercepted a deep pass by Bray with 23 seconds left to seal the win.

The game was an offensive showcase with the teams combining for 982 yards of total offense. The Gamecocks

(7-2, 5-2 SEC) rolled up 510 yards of offense which was their second highest total of the season, while the Volunteers finished the day with 472 yards, including 381 passing

Connor Shaw put together one of his best performances as a Gamecock as he threw for a career-high 356 yards (22-of-32) and three TDs. He also added 33 yards and a score rushing.

A trio of Gamecocks posted career highs in receiving yards. Junior Justice Cunningham hauled in six passes for 108 yards. Bruce Ellington also caught six passes for 101 yards and a touchdown, and Ace Sanders snagged five passes for 79 yards and a score.

Marcus Lattimore led the ground attack as he rushed for 65 yards and a touchdown on 11 carries before being carted off the field in the second quarter with a right knee injury.

Bray led the Tennessee offense, completing 27-of-43 passes for 368 yards and four touchdowns. Three of those scores went to Zach Rogers, who caught six passes for 107 yards.

The Gamecocks came out strong. After the Carolina defense forced Tennessee into a threeand-out on the first possession of the game, Shaw guided the offense on a nine-play, 81-yard scoring drive on the ensuing possession. He went 4-for-4 on the drive and connected with Ellington for a 33-yard touchdown pass to give the Gamecocks a 7-0 lead.

The Volunteers provided an answer on the next possession, as Bray completed an 8-yard touchdown pass to Rogers to cap a 10-play, 75-yard drive to tie the game at seven.

Shaw helped the Gamecocks regain the lead early in the second guarter as he led the offense on an eight-play, 53-yard scoring drive. He connected with Anderson for a 26-yard scoring strike to give South Carolina a 14-7 lead with 11:27 left in the half.

The Gamecocks needed just four plays on their next possession to push their lead to 21-7. Lattimore broke free for a 28-yard touchdown run to finish off the drive.

Tennessee wouldn't go away, however, as Bray found Rogers for a 37-yard touchdown pass on the ensuing possession to pull the Volunteers to with in 21-14.

South Carolina regained its two-touchdown advantage just before the half with a 10-play, 67yard touchdown drive. With 14 seconds remaining, Shaw took the snap from the shotgun at the 1-yard line and strolled into the end zone off the left edge for a touchdown, giving the Gamecocks a 28-14 lead heading into the locker room.

Tennessee battled back on its first possession of the third quarter. Bray completed a 61-yard touchdown pass to Vincent Dallas to trim the lead to 28-21.

The Gamecocks seemed to take control of the contest with an 11-play, 80-yard touchdown drive late in the guarter that ate up five minutes and 42 seconds. Shaw found Sanders for a 24yard scoring strike to cap the drive, giving South Carolina a 35-21 lead.

Tennessee responded once again with another lengthy drive. With the ball at the Gamecock 13, Alton Howard lined up at guarterback for the Volunteers, rolled right and found Mychal Rivera in the end zone to pull Tennessee to within 35-28 at the 14:55 mark of the fourth quarter.

After South Carolina pushed its lead to 38-28 with a 36-yard field goal by Yates, the Volunteers cut it to 38-35 on the ensuing possession. Rogers hauled in his third touchdown reception of the day, this time a 22-yarder, but that's as close as it would get.

Game 10 #12/11 South Carolina 38, Arkansas 20

COLUMBIA, S.C.—No. 12/11 South Carolina amassed 383 yards of offense and forced three turnovers en route to a dominant 38-20 win over Arkansas on Saturday afternoon at Williams-Brice Stadium.

With the victory, the Gamecocks improve to 8-2 overall and 6-2 in the SEC. The win snaps a three-game losing streak to the Razorbacks and extends South Carolina's home winning streak to 10 games, which is the third longest streak in school history. Arkansas drops to 4-6 on the season and 2-4 in conference play.

The Gamecocks racked up more than 300 yards of offense for the seventh time this season and fell just short of reaching 400 for the fourth time. Junior quarterback Connor Shaw

led the way, completing 14-of-22 passes for 272 yards and two touchdowns while rushing for a score as well. Five of his completions went to sophomore receiver Bruce Ellington, who finished the contest with a career-high 104 receiving yards and a touchdown. Freshman tight end Jerell Adams added a 29-yard touchdown reception, the first of his career. Freshman running back Mike Davis led the ground attack, rushing for 57 yards and a touchdown on 13 carries.

Defensively, the Gamecocks surrendered 360 yards of offense but they forced three turnovers, including a 69-yard interception return for a touchdown by senior D.J. Swearinger. A native of Greenwood, S.C., Swearinger recorded a career-high 13 tackles on the day.

Senior cornerback Akeem Auguste also had an interception, while senior linebacker Reginald Bowens recovered a fumble. Sophomore defensive end Jadeveon Clowney added two tackles and a sack. He now has 9.5 on the season, which ranks third all-time at South Carolina for sacks in a single season.

The Gamecocks came out strong early offensively as they marched 77 yards in 10 plays on their opening possession. Shaw connected with Adams across the middle for a 29-yard scoring strike to give South Carolina a 7-0 lead at the 5:47 mark of the first quarter.

Arkansas knotted the game at 7-7 midway through the second quarter, as quarterback Tyler Wilson capped a six-play, 50-yard scoring drive with a 6-yard touchdown pass to Keon Hatcher. For the contest, Wilson completed 26-of-41 passes for 277 yards and two touchdowns. He also threw a pair of interceptions.

South Carolina answered to regain the lead for good on the ensuing possession. A 36-yard pass from Shaw to Ellington and a personal foul penalty on the Razorbacks on the third play of the drive set the Gamecocks up at the Arkansas 14-yard line. Three plays later, Shaw rolled around the right side and sprinted to the pylon for a 10-yard touchdown run, giving the Gamecocks a 14-7 advantage with 5:28 left in the half.

A 20-yard field goal by Zach Hocker at the 3:28 mark of the second quarter pulled Arkansas to within 14-10, but South Carolina extended its lead to double digits just before the half. On fourth and 5 from the Arkansas 42, Shaw connected with a wide-open Ellington near the sideline, and Ellington made a defender miss as he darted into the end zone for a touchdown, giving the Gamecocks a 21-10 lead with 1:30 remaining in the half.

The Razorbacks moved the ball to the Gamecock 45 on their last possession of the half, but Aldrick Fordham and Chaz Sutton each came up with a sack to end the threat and send the teams into the locker room with South Carolina leading 21-10.

South Carolina put the game out of reach early in the second half. After Adam Yates drilled a 41-yard field goal to give the Gamecocks a 24-10 lead on the opening possession of the third quarter, the defense provided the game-sealing play on the ensuing possession. On first and 10 from the South Carolina 36, Swearinger stepped in front of a Wilson pass and returned the interception 69 yards to the end zone, giving the Gamecocks a 31-10 cushion.

After Hocker made it a 31-13 game with a 21-yard field goal at the 5:48 mark of the third quarter, the Gamecocks added one more touchdown, a 2-yard run by Davis, on the ensuing possession to push their lead to 38-13.

COLUMBIA, S.C.—Senior running back Kenny Miles rushed for a career-high 127 yards and one touchdown to help lead No. 12/11 South Carolina to a 24-7 victory over Wofford on Senior Day Saturday afternoon at Williams-Brice Stadium.

With the win, the Gamecocks (9-2) finish the year a perfect 7-0 at home for the first time since 1987. The victory also gives head coach Steve Spurrier his 64th career victory at South Carolina, tying Rex Enright's school record. Wofford drops to 8-3 on the season.

Miles, who was one of 29 seniors honored prior to the game, carried the ball a career-high 27 times, averaging 4.7 yards per touch. It was his fourth career 100-yard rushing game. Miles also pulled down four passes for 27



South Carolina junior quarterback Connor Shaw completed 16-of-20 passes for 122 yards and had one touchdown and one interception. Junior Ace Sanders caught five of those passes for a team-high 35 yards and a score to lead the receiving corps.

The Gamecock defense gave up 330 yards of offense to the Terriers but came up with several big stops and forced three turnovers to help pull away for the victory. Senior D.J. Swearinger led the way with 12 tackles, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery. Seniors Shaq Wilson and Byron Jerideau tallied 10 tackles apiece, while senior Akeem Auguste recovered a fumble and returned it 31 yards for a touchdown.

The game got off to a slow start as the teams battled through a scoreless first quarter. The Gamecocks eventually struck first with a 13-play, 51-yard scoring drive that ate up more than five minutes of clock. Miles did most of the damage on the drive as he rushed for 43 yards, including a 2-yard touchdown run that that gave South Carolina a 7-0 lead at the 14:56 mark of the second quarter.

The Carolina defense clamped down on the Wofford rushing attack early on as it forced threeand-outs on the Terriers' first three possessions, surrendering just 17 yards.

The Gamecocks seemed to be on the way to extending their lead to 14-0 midway through the second quarter with a drive that went deep into Wofford territory. However, freshman running back Mike Davis fumbled at the end of a 16-yard run at the Terrier 6-yard line, and Wofford's Blake Wylie recovered at the 1.

The Terriers found a groove offensively right before the half and engineered a 12-play, 85yard scoring drive. Eric Breitenstein rushed for 46 yards on the drive, including a 2-yard touchdown run with 32 seconds left in the half that tied the game at 7-7. Breitenstein finished the contest with 125 yards on 28 carries to lead Wofford.

Wofford gave the Gamecocks a scare on its opening possession of the second half as it drove to the Gamecock 27. However, on first and 10 Swearinger knocked the ball loose from Octavius Harden, and Carolina's Brison Williams recovered to end the threat.

South Carolina took advantage by going on a 15-play, 68-yard scoring drive capped by a 23-yard field goal by senior Adam Yates that gave the Gamecocks a 10-7 advantage with 11:57 left in the fourth quarter.

The defensive unit then came up with a huge fourth down stop for the Gamecocks on the ensuing possession. On fourth and 1 from the Wofford 34, Carolina seniors Devin Taylor and Quin Smith stuffed Breitenstein for no gain, setting the offense up with excellent field position. Five plays later, Shaw connected with Sanders for an 8-yard touchdown pass at the 8:10 mark, giving South Carolina a 17-7 lead.

The Gamecocks then put the game out of reach on the next possession with another big defensive play. Auguste scooped up a forced fumble by Reginald Bowens on Wofford's second play of the drive at the Terrier 31 and returned it for a touchdown to extend South Carolina's lead to 24-7.

Game 12 #13/12 South Carolina 27, #12/9 Clemson 17

CLEMSON, S.C. —Head coach Steve Spurrier became the winningest coach in South Carolina history with 65 wins as the Gamecocks (10-2) defeated Clemson (10-2) 27-17 on Saturday evening for Carolina's fourth straight victory in the series vs. the Tigers. Sophomore quarterback Dylan Thompson went 23-for-41 for 310 yards in the air with three touchdown passes and sophomore defensive end Jadeveon Clowney tallied 4.5 sacks to set the single-season record at Carolina with 13 on the year.

The Gamecocks had a complete performance in all three phases. The Carolina offense totaled 444 yards on the day. Thompson connected six times to Ace Sanders for 119 yards, the most receiving yards by a Gamecock player this year as well as a



touchdown. Bruce Ellington also had seven catches for 72 yards with two touchdowns. Carolina's defense limited the Tigers to just three points and 91 total yards in the second half. Adam Yates went 2-for-2 for field goals with Sanders tallying a 30-yard punt return to set the school's single-season record at 363 punt return yards.

With a 20-17 lead in the fourth quarter, the Gamecocks put together a 13-play 65-yard drive that was capped by a 6-yard touchdown pass from Ellington to Thompson that gave Carolina a commanding 10-point lead. That was enough for the defense as they stopped Clemson two more times with Clowney tallying a pair of sacks in the Tigers' final two possessions.

The Tigers struck first on their second possession of the game with a 16-play, 85-yard scoring drive that ate up more than six minutes of clock. Quarterback Tajh Boyd capped the drive with a 3-yard touchdown run on an option keeper to give Clemson a 7-0 lead with 5:27 left in the first quarter.

South Carolina responded on the ensuing possession to tie the game. Dylan Thompson completed passes of 9, 19, and 15 yards, and Kenny Miles added runs of 1 and 11 yards to set the Gamecocks up at the Clemson 13-yard line. Thompson then connected with Ellington for a 13-yard scoring strike to cap the seven-play, 63-yard scoring drive and knot the game at 7-7.

Clemson fired back with a quick scoring drive to regain the lead. Roderick McDowell broke free for a 32-yard run down the sideline. On the next play, Boyd lofted the ball to DeAndre Hopkins for a 43-yard touchdown pass, giving the Tigers a 14-7 advantage at the 1:22 mark of the first quarter.

The Gamecocks cut Clemson's lead to 14-10 late in the second quarter, as Yates drilled a 27-yard field goal to cap a 12-play, 79-yard drive at the 2:40 mark. On the drive, Thompson was 5-for-6 for 53 yards and had 27 yards on the ground.

Thompson took control on the opening possession of the second half and guided South Carolina on a 10-play, 85-yard scoring drive. On third and 16 from the Clemson 34, Thompson found Sanders across the middle, and Sanders shed a tackle and raced to the end zone for a 34-yard touchdown reception to give the Gamecocks a 17-14 lead with 11:48 remaining in the third stanza. Thompson completed four passes for 79 yards on the drive.

The teams then exchanged field goals. Yates extended South Carolina's lead on its next possession with a 43-yard field goal to give the Gamecocks a 20-14 lead at the 6:56 mark of the third quarter. Clemson's Chandler Catanzaro answered on the ensuing possession with a 37-yard field goal to trim South Carolina's lead to 20-17 with 5:07 left in the quarter.



TAMPA, Fla. -- Dylan Thompson's 32-yard touchdown pass to Bruce Ellington with 11 seconds remaining lifted South Carolina (11-2) to a 33-28 victory over Michigan (8-5) to win the 2013 Outback Bowl.

Trailing 28-27 with 3:29 remaining in the game, Carolina made one final drive. Connor Shaw converted a 4th & 3 on the South Carolina 37 with a 6-yard slant pass to Ace Sanders and followed that up with completions of 6, 8 and 6, all to Sanders to earn two more first downs. Shaw left the game after the fourth completion to Sanders as he was nicked up, resulting in Thompson entering the contest. Thompson moved



the Gamecocks down to the Michigan 32-yardline with 20 seconds remaining. After spiking the ball to stop the clock, Thompson took the next snap and unleashed a perfect strike to Ellington near the goal line. The Gamecock wide receiver made his way into the end zone to give the Gamecocks a 5-point lead with just seconds remaining.

The back and forth affair saw the duo of Shaw and Thompson deliver for Carolina. Shaw finished 18-for-26 for 224 yards in the air and a pair of touchdowns and added 96 yards rushing. Thompson was 7-for-10 for 117 yards and two scores.

Sanders caught 9 passes for 92 vards with two touchdown receptions as well as a 63-yard punt return for a touchdown en route to MVP honors.

The Gamecocks needed just three plays to find the end zone. Damiere Byrd got behind the Wolverine secondary and Shaw connected with him for a 56-yard scoring strike to give the Gamecocks a 7-0 lead less than two minutes into the game.

Michigan trimmed the lead to 7-3 with a 39-yard field goal by Brendan Gibbons.

After the Carolina defense pushed the Wolverines back to their own 9-yard line with a sack by Aldrick Fordham, Michigan punted to All-SEC return man Sanders, who weaved his way 63 yards to the end zone, giving the Gamecocks a 14-3 advantage.

The Wolverines answered with an 11-play, 75-yard scoring drive capped by a 5-yard pass from Devin Gardner to Drew Dileo, cutting South Carolina's lead to 14-10.

The Gamecocks regained their 11-point lead quickly with a four-play, 75-yard touchdown drive. Thompson found Nick Jones across the middle for a 70-yard pass to set Carolina up at the Michigan 4. From there Thompson rolled right and found Sanders open in the end zone to give the Gamecocks a 21-10 lead with 10:54 left in the half.

A 40-yard field goal by Gibbons closed the gap to 21-13 heading into intermission. Michigan got a 52-yard field goal from Matt Wile, then went on a 10-play, 65-yard scoring drive capped by a 10-yard touchdown pass from Gardner to Jeremy Gallon to take a 22-21 heading into the final stanza.

After a very questionable first down was awarded to the Wolverines, Jadeveon Clowney made a big defensive play. Clowney forced and recovered a fumble by tailback Vincent Smith giving the Gamecocks the ball on the Michigan 31-yardline. South Carolina quickly struck then as Shaw completed a 31-yard touchdown pass to Sanders as the Gamecocks reclaimed a 27-22 lead.

Michigan answered on its ensuing drive to take a 28-27 lead. An 11-play 64-yard drive took up over four minutes on the clock and was capped by a 17-yard pass from Gardner to Gallon, his second touchdown reception of the game.
