

NCAA WOMEN'S SOCCER FIRST ROUND POSTGAME NOTES Duke vs. Rutgers – November 13, 2009

Duke

Duke made its 16th NCAA Tournament in appearance in women's soccer including its seventh straight trip (2003-present).

Freshman goalkeeper Tara Campbell set a single-season record for saves in the match. Campbell finished with two against Rutgers and 94 on the year. The previous record of 93 was held by Thora Helgadottir and Melissa Carr.

Rutgers

This is Rutgers sixth NCAA Tournament appearance in women's soccer. The Scarlet Knights are 3-4-3 all-time in NCAA history after today's result.

Rutgers win over Duke is the first in school history against the Blue Devils. Rutgers is now 1-3 in all-time history vs. Duke.

Of 11 Rutgers starters on the afternoon, just four played in last year's NCAA Tournament: Erin Guthrie, Ashley Metcalf, Jen Anzivino and Becky Wise. The Scarlet Knights reached the Sweet 16 in last year's tournament.

Junior defender Rheanne Sleiman saw her first action in a match since Sept. 18, 2009 vs. Seton Hall. Sleiman missed 12 straight matches due to an ankle sprain.

Redshirt freshman midfielder Maija Savics made her first career appearance for the Scarlet Knights.

Senior goalkeeper Erin Guthrie registered her 11th shutout of the season and the 44th of her career. She is Rutgers all-time shutout leaders.

Kelsey Dumont's goal in the first half was her third of the season. April Price's goal in the second half was her fourth of the season.
