COLUMBIA, S.C.— Quick offensive strikes from Connor Shaw and Mike Davis helped No. 6/7 South Carolina (1-0) dispatch of North Carolina (0-1) 27-10 in the college football season opener at Williams-Brice Stadium.

On the third play from scrimmage, the senior quarterback Shaw found sophomore wide receiver Shaq Roland over the middle for a 65-yard touchdown strike, putting the Gamecocks in the lead 7-0. The 82-yard drive marked the quickest score for South Carolina in a season in the SEC era (since 1992). Shaw ended the contest going 11-for-20 for 149 yards and the one TD pass while adding 43 yards on the ground.

Davis, the sophomore running back who won the starting job in fall camp, capped South Carolina's scoring with his third-quarter, 75-yard run over the right side to make it 27-10. Davis ended the day with a career-high 115 yards on 12 carries.

South Carolina held a 17-0 lead before the first quarter ended, with freshman Elliott Fry's first collegiate field goal, a 39-yarder, making it 10-0. Junior quarterback Dylan Thompson, on his first play of the game, made it 17-0 with a 29-yard touchdown throw to sophomore wide receiver Kane Whitehurst.


In the second quarter, North Carolina got on the board on Bryn Renner's four-yard pass to Quinshad Davis, but Fry's second field goal, this one from 26 yards, handed South Carolina a 20-7 lead that stood at the half. The Gamecocks doubled the Tar Heels in first downs in the first half, 12-6, and tallied more yards, 260-121. Seventy of UNC's yards came on its scoring drive.

The Tar Heels opened the second half with a 17-play, 67-yard drive capped by a Thomas Moore 20-yard field goal before Davis' 75-yard dash.

The game was halted at 8:46 p.m. due to lightning in the area, delaying the game for 1:44. After the break, North Carolina threatened to score with two minutes to go, but a dive toward the end zone by Renner fell a yard short on fourth-and-goal, turning the ball back over downs to the Gamecocks with 58 seconds remaining.

Sophomore running back Brandon Wilds ran for 64 yards on 12 carries, while junior Nick Jones and Roland both matched career bests in receptions with four and two, respectively. Four of the Gamecocks' returning defenders (Sharrod Golightly, T.J. Gurley, Chaz Sutton & Ahmad Christian) matched or bettered their previous career high in tackles, and sophomore Gerald Dixon Jr. posted his first career tackle and quarterback hurry.

Gamecock head coach Steve Spurrier improved to 23-1 as a collegiate head coach in the lid-lifter, including 9-0 at South Carolina. He also owns a 5-0 record over the Tar Heels, with two of those wins coming in the Garnet and Black. South Carolina's home winning streak stands at 12 games now, one shy of tying the second-best stretch in Williams-Brice Stadium (1986-88).

ATHENS, Ga. — A back and forth affair went to the No. 11/12 Georgia Bulldogs as the No. 6/6 South Carolina Gamecocks fell 41-30 in front of sellout crowd of 92,746 fans at Sanford Stadium. It was a day for the offense as the Gamecocks and Bulldogs combined for 990 total yards. South Carolina rushed for 226 with 228 in the air while Georgia rushed for 227 and passed for 309 in the contest.

South Carolina took the opening drive 57 yards to set up for a 36-yard field goal by Elliot Fry to take an early 3-0 lead.

Georgia answered on its opening drive that was capped by a three-yard touchdown pass by Aaron Murray to tight end Arthur Lynch. The Bulldogs drove deep into South Carolina territory on a 32-yard pass completion from Murray to Michael Bennett and a 19-yard rush by Gurley. With 2nd & goal on the 3, Murray play faked and found Lynch in the end zone to give the Bulldogs a 7-3 lead.

The Bulldogs showed some trickery following the touchdown as they went with an onside kick that was recovered by cornerback Blake Sailors to give Georgia another possession on their own 48-yard line. The Bulldogs made their way into Carolina territory for a second consecutive possession and went into the red zone after a 4th & 13 completion from Murray to Scott-Wesley. UGA settled for a Patrick Beless 22-yard field goal to extend the advantage to 10-3.

The Bulldogs went seven plays and 69 yards to increase the lead to 17-3 on a six-yard touchdown pass from Murray to Keith Marshall. After Jadeveon Clowney netted his first sack of the season, the Bulldogs made up for the 10-yard loss with a 16-yard rush by Marshall followed by a 15-yard face mask penalty on the Gamecock defense.

South Carolina responded with a 12-play, 84-yard drive to answer the Bulldogs and cut the deficit to seven points. Davis was key for the Gamecocks as he had a 23-yard rush to begin the drive and a three-yard carry on 4th & 2 at the UGA 11 to keep the drive going. The Gamecocks would punch it in the end zone on a seven-yard carry by Brandon Wilds.

The Gamecock defense forced a three-and-out for the Bulldogs on the next possession. South Carolina then caught a break as punter Collin Barber mishandled the snap allowing the Gamecocks to recover on the UGA 18-yard line. South Carolina rode the momentum of the punt mishap and responded quickly to tie it up at 17 as Shaw found Jones in the corner of the end zone on the first play for an 18-yard touchdown.

The Bulldogs went 11 plays in 70 yards in the ensuing drive to reclaim a 24-17 lead. Gurley again was a focal point for Georgia with seven carries for 46 yards including a 2-yard touchdown run with 1:42 remaining in the half.

South Carolina answered one more time to tie the game at 24 going into halftime. With three timeouts and 1:38 remaining on the Carolina 29-yard line, Shaw manufactured an 11-play, 70-yard drive capped by a 30-yard touchdown pass to Nick Jones.

The Bulldogs capitalized on Carolina's first turnover of the season to go ahead 27-24 on Beless' second field goal of the game, this one from 37 yards. The Gamecocks were driving and appeared to convert a fourth down but quarterback Connor Shaw fumbled, allowing the Bulldogs to take over on the Georgia 25-yard line.

Georgia extended the lead to 34-24 near the end of the quarter on an eight-yard touchdown pass from Murray to Gurley.

South Carolina dug deep and responded again as Davis tallied a 75-yard run from scrimmage to end the third quarter and move the Gamecocks into scoring position at the Georgia five-yard line. Three plays later, Davis scored on a three-yard touchdown. A missed extra point attempt kept Georgia ahead 34-30 with 13:55 left in the game.

With Georgia 3rd & 13 on their own 15-yard line, Murray eluded a sack and found Scott-Wesley behind the Gamecock secondary. Scott-Wesley took it down the sideline and into the end zone to give Georgia a 41-30 lead with 13 minutes to go.

The Bulldogs remained in possession the final 8:28 of the game with 13 plays to secure the victory including a 4th & 2 conversion with 2:42 in the game.

COLUMBIA, S.C.— Behind senior quarterback Connor Shaw's 368 yards of total offense, South Carolina (2-1, 1-1 SEC) held on to defeat Vanderbilt 35-25 on Saturday night at Williams-Brice Stadium.

Shaw threw for 284 yards and three touchdowns on 21-for-29 passing while also leading the Gamecocks in rushing with 84 yards on 19 carries. Junior wide receiver Bruce Ellington made a career-best eight catches for 111 yards and a score, while sophomore running back Mike Davis added 144 all-purpose yards (77 rushing, 67 receiving) in the victory. Sophomore running back Brandon Wilds caught his first career TD pass, while junior Nick Jones also had a TD catch.

South Carolina scored on its first four possessions of the game. The first, set up by Ellington's 12-yard punt return to the Vandy 42, needed just six plays, with all the yards (27 passing, 15 rushing) coming from Shaw. Shaw hit Jones with a bullet toward the back of the end zone for a 12-yard touchdown pass. The second Gamecock drive went much longer, as it took 11 plays to cover 93 yards. Davis capped the drive with a four-yard run. The biggest play came on Davis' 38-yard catch-and-run from Shaw that put South Carolina on the Vandy 24.


Junior quarterback Dylan Thompson piloted the third drive, an eight-play, 76-yard one that ended with his three-yard draw for the score. He went 5-for-5 for 67 yards, with all five passes going for first downs. The second quarter saw the Gamecocks keep rolling, scoring an eight-yard, 92-yard drive. Shaw hit Ellington in traffic from 26 yards out for the score, the third catch of the drive for the junior. He also had a three-yard grab and a 39-yard catch as well in the sequence.

Vanderbilt (1-2, 0-2 SEC) scored late in the first half on Jerron Seymour's one-yard run. Steven Clarke's 69-yard interception of Thompson's pass set up the one-play, one-yard score. It was the first interception given up by the Gamecocks in 72 pass attempts in 2013. The Commodores added a 54-yard field goal from Carey Spear as the half ended. South Carolina outgained Vanderbilt 381-95 in the first half and ran 52 plays to Vandy's 24.

The Gamecocks put up another touchdown on their first possession of the second half when Wilds caught a 33-yard TD pass from Shaw, finishing the 10-play, 75-yard drive in 4:38. On the ensuing Vandy possession, the Commodores drove deep into Gamecock territory before junior defensive end Jadeveon Clowney sacked VU's Austyn Carta-Samuels and forced a fumble, which senior defensive tackle Kelsey Quarles recovered, ending that Vandy threat.

But the Commodores kept coming, scoring early in the fourth quarter on Carta-Samuels' one-yard run, which ended a 10-play, 45-yard drive. The ensuing kickoff was fumbled by the Gamecocks, setting up Wesley Tate's 19-yard reception from Carta-Samuels for the score. The two-point pass to tight end Steven Schue was good, making it 35-25 in favor of South Carolina. After a stalled Vanderbilt drive, the punt hit a Gamecock defender, and VU's Darrius Sims recovered, giving the Commodores another life. But senior cornerback Jimmy Legree picked off the Carta-Samuel pass on the goal line, the first interception by a Gamecock in 2013.

The Gamecocks, taking over at the one-yard line, ran the clock down to a minute before turning the ball over on downs at the Vanderbilt 36. The Commodores' final possession was unfruitful, giving the Gamecocks the win.

ORLANDO, Fla. — Behind a huge second half from sophomore running back Mike Davis, South Carolina (3-1) picked up a hard-fought 28-25 road win at UCF (3-1) at Bright House Networks Stadium on Saturday afternoon.

In front of a broadcast TV audience on ABC, Davis ran for a career-best 167 yards on 26 carries, scoring three times to lead South Carolina's comeback effort after being down 10-0 at half. Junior quarterback Dylan Thompson came in after an injury to senior Connor Shaw and threw for 261 yards while also running for a score in the victory.

Davis put the Gamecocks on the board just four plays into the second half with his 53-yard dash to the end zone. Davis had three of the four carries in the quick scoring drive. After the Gamecock defense forced a three-and-out, South Carolina drove again until another fumble, this by sophomore running back Brandon Wilds, ended the chance. But South Carolina's defense stepped up again and stopped the Knights from getting a first down.

The Gamecocks took the lead on the next drive when Thompson ran for two-yard score after rolling out right and seeing the opening. Freshman Elliott Fry's PAT capped an 11-play, 97-yard drive, the longest drive of the year by yards for South Carolina. Senior cornerback Jimmy Legree intercepted a Blake Bortles pass and returned it 21 yard, setting up the next Gamecock score, as Davis carried a defender for the last bit of his 13-yard score that after the Fry kick became 21-10 for the visitors.


Davis put his third ball in the end zone with another 13-yard score, giving South Carolina a 28-10 lead early in the fourth quarter. UCF kept fighting, getting big throws from its senior quarterback Bortles in scoring the final 15 points of the contest. Bortles twice found Rannell Hall for scores, first a 73-yard catch-and-run before a seven-yard strike with 1:54 remaining in the game. The ensuing onside attempt by the Knights was gathered by Gamecock junior wide receiver Bruce Ellington, who returned it 31 yards. The Gamecocks took a knee three times to run out the clock to take the win.

The Knights held a 10-0 lead at halftime, scoring on the first drive of the game in 4:55 after Storm Johnson's one-yard run and a second-quarter Shawn Moffitt 27-yard field goal. UCF had fortunes on their side, recovering both of their own fumbles while getting the lone Gamecock fumble of the first half, which came on the play that knocked South Carolina's starting quarterback Shaw from the contest with a strained right shoulder.

The Gamecocks had a chance toward the end of the second quarter after junior cornerback Victor Hampton intercepted the Bortles pass with 1:17 left. Thompson drove the Gamecocks to the UCF 28 before a penalty ended the momentum and took the Gamecocks out of field goal range. The final play of the half saw Thompson get hit as he threw, altering the flight of the ball to allow Sean Maag to intercept it at the UCF 20. The Knights only had 32 more yards of offense (196-164) than the Gamecocks in the first 30 minutes of play but held the 10-0 lead.

South Carolina picked off three passes in the contest, one each for Hampton, Legree and redshirt freshman T.J. Holloman, the most by a Gamecock team since last season's East Carolina contest. Sophomore Gerald Dixon also picked up a fumble recovery. Both teams forced three fumbles, but the Knights kept two of theirs.

Offensively, Ellington's 88 receiving yards put him over 1,000 for his career, while junior Damiere Byrd had a career-best five receptions.

COLUMBIA, S.C.— Another strong first half offensive performance by No. 13/12 South Carolina (4-1, 2-1 SEC) led the Gamecocks to a 35-28 victory over Kentucky (1-4, 0-2 SEC) in front of 82,313 fans at Williams-Brice Stadium on Saturday.

Sophomore tailback Mike Davis posted his fourth 100-yard game of the season, gaining 106 on 21 carries to go with two touchdowns to top the Gamecocks. He also had 54 receiving yards on three catches. Senior quarterback Connor Shaw added 312 yards of total offense in his 21st career win as the starting quarterback. Junior wide receiver Damiere Byrd posted career bests in catches (5) and yards (94) in the win.

The Gamecocks posted a strong first half, holding a 24-7 lead at the break. On the fourth play of the game, Shaw hit Byrd for a 62-yard touchdown, putting South Carolina ahead 7-0. Davis scored on two different runs, first from 22 yards out before diving in for his second from a yard away, which handed the Gamecocks a 21-0 lead. Both of the Davis' touchdowns capped four-plus minute drives of 10 and nine plays, respectively. Fifty-six of the 80 yards on the first drive came from Davis, as he had three carries and two catches.

Kentucky got on the board after the second Davis run with a 14-play, 75-yard drive. Raymond Sanders darted in from two yards out to make it 21-7. Just before the half ended, Gamecock freshman Elliott Fry kicked his then-career longest field goal of 40 yards. South Carolina set up that Fry kick in part by a catch and lateral from Rory Anderson to Davis to get to the Kentucky 30. With the 24-7 lead at the break, South Carolina's offense dominated in the stats, doubling the Wildcats in first downs (14-7) and nearly tripling them in yards (297-100).

To start the third quarter, Kentucky drove to its own 49 after a fourth-down conversion. The next two plays, Gamecock junior defensive tackle Kelcy Quarles came up big, hitting Raymond Sanders behind the line for a four-yard loss before sacking Kentucky quarterback Jalen Whitlow for a 10-yard setback. The Wildcats were forced to punt, and the Gamecocks responded with an 11-play, 53-yard drive that almost took six minutes off the clock. Fry added another field goal, a 41-yarder that just cleared the crossbar, to make it a 20-point Gamecock lead with just under 20 minutes to play.


Kentucky followed the Fry field goal with a 12-play drive, capped by Demarco Robinson's stretch of the ball across the goal line on replay on a four-yard reception from Whitlow. The quarterback accounted for all but five of the team's 75 yards on the drive, going 7-for-8 for 58 yards in the air to go with his 11 yards rushing. The Wildcats capitalized on a fourth-quarter Gamecock miscue, fumbling the kickoff after a nice return. Whitlow found Ryan Timmons in the end zone for a 14-yard scoring pass, drawing the visitors within a score, 27-21.

South Carolina responded with a seven-play, 89-yard drive to push the lead back to two scores. Shaw ran for a 31-yard gain before hitting Davis to advance 18 yards to the Kentucky 33. After a Shaw seven-yard gain, freshman Pharoh Cooper took the direct snap and gained 23 yards to get to the UK 3. Two plays later, Shaw ran it in from two yards out. He found junior Nick Jones on the two-point conversion to make it a 14-point Gamecock lead at 35-21.

The Wildcats answered back with an eight-play, 81-yard drive with Whitlow succeeding on his second sneak try from a yard out to bring Kentucky within seven points again. Shamier Jeffery recovered the onside kick try by the Wildcats with 3:59 to go. Two Davis first-down runs let South Carolina kneel three times for the victory.

The win for the Gamecocks marked the 20th triumph for Gamecock head coach Steve Spurrier over Kentucky, the only active Division I coach to hold 20 wins over any one opponent.

Three Gamecocks had six tackles, with Quarles joining redshirt freshman T.J. Holloman and junior defensive tackle J.T. Surratt in leading the team. Both Holloman and Surratt set career bests. South Carolina played without Jadeveon Clowney, who sat out the game with bruised ribs.

FAYETTEVILLE, Ark. — South Carolina (5-1, 3-1 SEC) posted its most complete game of the season with an astounding offensive performance to defeat Arkansas (3-4, 0-3 SEC) on Saturday afternoon at Donald W. Reynolds Razorback Stadium.

The Gamecock offense held the ball for 43:25 of the contest, posting 537 yards on 89 plays, compared to Arkansas' 248 on 37 plays. Senior quarterback Connor Shaw threw for three touchdown and 219 yards in 19-for-28 passing and added a rushing TD as well. Sophomore running back Mike Davis ran for 128 yards and a score on 19 carries, and junior wide receiver Bruce Ellington caught six passes for 96 yards and two TDs.

Arkansas opened the game with a 7-play, 65-yard, capped by Alex Collins' 6-yard run. South Carolina had a drive stall deep in Arkansas territory, but freshman Elliott Fry salvaged it with a 33-yard field goal. The Gamecock defense took over, holding Arkansas to one first down after that opening drive. Two plays after that last first down, Gamecock junior Victor Hampton intercepted Brandon Allen's pass and returned it to the Arkansas 6-yard line. Davis scored on the next play to give South Carolina the 10-7 advantage. Davis dominated play in the first quarter, gaining 63 yards on just eight carries.

The Gamecocks stretched the lead to 17-7 when Shaw found Ellington wide open in the end zone from 9 yards out early in the second quarter. South Carolina drove deep into Razorback territory before a Shaw fumble gave Arkansas the ball back. A three-and-out forced another Hog punt, when Sam Irwin-Hill boomed one 79 yards that resulted in a touchback.

After the long punt, Arkansas forced the only Gamecock punt of the half before getting the ball back near midfield. Two running plays got Arkansas to their own 49, but an incomplete pass put Arkansas at fourth down again. The pass on the fake punt fell incomplete, giving the Gamecocks the short field. It took 12 plays to cover the ground, and Shaw hit Ellington from four yards out to give the Gamecocks the 24-7 lead just before the half. Shaw threw for 149 yards while Ellington had 96 receiving yards, both getting two scores.

The Gamecocks added two more touchdowns in the third quarter, first on the initial drive of the second half, ended by junior Damiere Byrd's 45-yard catch from Shaw. Then the Gamecocks, after senior cornerback Jimmy Legree stripped Keon Hatcher after a long run, embarked on the second-longest drive time-wise of head coach Steve Spurrier's tenure. South Carolina ran 9:29 off the clock, and Shaw ended it on the 15th play by scrambling in from 10 yards out.

Kane Whitehurst scored in his return to Arkansas, reeling in a 15-yard pass from junior Dylan Thompson for the sixth South Carolina touchdown. Redshirt freshman Brendan Nosovitch scored the final Gamecock touchdown with his 7-yard run with 1:07 left in the contest.

South Carolina's defense limited the Arkansas offense to seven first downs in the contest. Allen struggled all game, going 4-for-12 for 30 yards passing with one interception. The Gamecocks also forced two Razorback fumbles, recovering them both. The 248 yards of offense for Arkansas ranks as the lowest allowed by South Carolina this season. Freshman Skai Moore led the Gamecocks with six tackles.

Gamecock redshirt sophomore Shamier Jeffery caught his first career pass, taking in five for 32 yards. The 45-point victory stands as the largest margin in a road win in Spurrier's tenure at South Carolina, while the 52 points are the most by a Gamecock team under Spurrier on the road. With 32 first downs, the Gamecocks tied the high in the Spurrier era at South Carolina.

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. — After No. 11/9 South Carolina (5-2, 3-2 SEC) fought back to take a lead in the third quarter, Tennessee's Michael Palardy hit one from 19 yards out as time expired to give the Volunteers the 23-21 victory. Palardy went 3-for-4 in field goals on the day.

After making a 33-yard field goal with a little over 10 minutes to go in the contest, Tennessee's Michael Palardy hit one from 19 yards out as time expired to give the Volunteers the 23-21 victory. Palardy went 3-for-4 in field goals on the day.

The first half went Tennessee's way. The Volunteers scored on their second drive in the first quarter on Palardy's 37-yard field goal, the first of three Tennessee scores in the first half.

Late in the first quarter, the Gamecocks got the ball back at their five-yard line. Two runs by sophomore running back Mike Davis moved South Carolina to their own 24 to end the quarter. The first play of the second quarter saw junior wide receiver Damiere Byrd take in the Connor Shaw pass and sprint to the end zone for the 76-yard score.

Tennessee responded, scoring twice in the second quarter to hold a 17-7 lead at halftime. Quarterback Justin Worley hit Pig Howard for a six-yard TD pass to give UT the 10-7 lead. On the next Big Orange possession, Rajion Neal capped a seven-play, 61-yard drive with a five-yard run to make it 17-7 at half.

The ball didn't seem to bounce South Carolina's way much in the contest. The Gamecocks lost a fumble in the first quarter and had a field goal miss late in the second quarter. Also in the first quarter, junior free safety Kadetrix Marcus was disqualified after being called for targeting.


The Gamecocks came back in the second half under their senior quarterback Shaw. On their second possession of the half, Shaw and company drove 66 yards in 11 plays to move within three. Davis took a pitch from Shaw and ran for the 21-yard score to end the drive, but Shaw had big plays to keep it going. First he hit Byrd for an 18-yard pass for the initial first down of the drive. Then on 4th-and-8 at the Tennessee 45, Shaw scrambled and dashed for a 9-yard pickup, moving the chains.

Tennessee drove into Gamecock territory on the next drive, but the Vols' 46-yard field goal try missed wide left. South Carolina marched 70 yards in six plays, and Shaw ended it with a sneak from a yard out with 2:50 to go in the third quarter. The senior ran for 29 yards on one play and hit junior tight end Rory Anderson for a 25-yard gain as well on the drive. But in the fourth quarter, Shaw left the game after being sacked on South Carolina's 10-yard line.

South Carolina had more yardage than Tennessee, 384-325, but the Gamecocks turned the ball over twice, while the Vols did not commit one. South Carolina also gave up four first downs via penalty and were flagged nine times for 84 yards, compared to Tennessee's five penalties for 40 yards.

Davis ran for 137 yards on 21 carries to lead the Gamecocks, while Byrd had a career-best 121 yards receiving on four catches. Shaw threw for 161 yards on a 7-for-21 day, connecting for one score but throwing the one INT. Those passing yards moved him past two Gamecocks on the all-time list, making him seventh on the career charts. Shaw also rushed for 78 yards on 19 carries. Gamecock junior defensive end Jadeveon Clowney had 2.5 tackles for loss among his five tackles in the game.

Tennessee's Marquez North had three catches for 102 yards, and Worley went 19-for-34 with one TD pass. Marlon Walls had 2.5 sacks to lead the Volunteer defense.

COLUMBIA, Mo. — Behind a big performance off the bench from senior quarterback Connor Shaw, No. 20/20 South Carolina (6-2, 4-2 SEC) came back to take a 27-24 overtime win at No. 5/7 Missouri at Faurot Field/Memorial Stadium.

Shaw, who entered the game after the Tigers made it 17-0 on a third-quarter, 27-yard Andrew Baggett field goal, went 20-for-29 for 201 yards and three TDs. Junior wide receiver Bruce Ellington caught a career-high 10 passes for 136 yards, while sophomore running back Mike Davis tallied 150 all-purpose yards, including catching 10 passes for 99 yards.

On Shaw's second drive, he led the Gamecocks to pay dirt, hitting Ellington in the front of the end zone for a six-yard touchdown. An 11-play, 69-yard drive followed, where freshman Elliott Fry hit a 20-yard field goal to make it 17-10. Getting the ball back with 3:08 remaining, Shaw marched the Gamecocks 63 yards in eight plays, hitting junior Nick Jones for the two-yard score. Shaw, in regulation, went 17-for-22 with two TDs while also getting a big 11-yard run that moved the Gamecocks into Missouri territory on the second scoring drive.

In overtime, the Tigers scored on their first possession in five plays, with Marcus Murphy getting a one-yard score to cap it. The Gamecocks gained a first down on its first offensive play of overtime when Shaw hit Ellington for a 16-yard pass. A sack moved South Carolina back to the 15, and two incomplete passes put the game down to one play. Shaw found Ellington again in the end zone to knot the game at 24-24. On the second possession, Fry hit a 40-yard field goal to put the Gamecocks ahead 27-24, and Missouri missed its FG shot from 24 yards away, hitting the left upright to hand South Carolina the win.

Overall, Carolina posted 28 first downs compared to 17 for Missouri and threw for 423 yards total, more than the Tigers' 249. The Gamecocks also ran 91 plays to the Tigers' 66. South Carolina tallied 498 yards of total offense, while Missouri had 404.


South Carolina fell behind 14-0 in the first half, hurt by two lost fumbles and an interception. The first Missouri score, however, came after the Gamecocks missed a 40-yard field goal. The Tigers promptly covered 77 yards in nine plays, with Murphy ending the drive with an 11-yard touchdown run with 1:23 to go in the first quarter. The second Gamecock fumble, coming on the Missouri 2, swung the momentum fully toward the Tigers. On third-and-8, Missouri quarterback Maty Mauk hit L'Damian Washington for a 96-yard score, making it 14-0.

The Gamecocks tried to get back some points on the next possession, but Missouri's Josh Gibson intercepted the pass at the Tiger 10. Missouri moved back toward mid-field quickly before having to punt. South Carolina gained nine yards on first down but could not get another in the next three plays, turning the ball back over to the Tigers at the 34-yard line. The Gamecock defense stepped up and held Missouri there, all but ending the first half.

Sophomore linebacker Kaiwan Lewis had one of South Carolina's highlights of the first half, picking off Mauk's second pass of the game for his first career interception. Junior quarterback Dylan Thompson went 12-for-20 for 171 yards before half, with Ellington grabbing five of them for 69 yards. While the Gamecocks held the ball for 16:43 of the first half, South Carolina struggled on third down, converting just one out of seven chances.

Junior defensive tackle Kelcy Quarles led the Gamecock defense with six tackles, three for loss and two of those sacks. Junior Victor Hampton tied a career high with tow pass breakups to go with five tackles, matching junior defensive end Jadeveon Clowney's output in stops.

Mauk went 10-for-25 with one touchdown and one interception in the contest, while Henry Josey posted 79 yards on 15 carries. Marcus Lucas had three catches for 89 yards.

COLUMBIA, S.C. — The Gamecock defense posted five turnovers to help South Carolina (7-2, 5-2 SEC) claim a 34-16 victory over Mississippi State (4-4, 1-3 SEC).

With three interceptions and two fumble recoveries, South Carolina's defense topped its four turnovers from the UCF game earlier this year. It helped the Gamecock offense to score 18 of its points on the day. The group also tallied six pass breakups and four quarterback hurries while making seven tackles for loss.

Sophomore tailback Mike Davis posted another 154 all-purpose yards, including 128 rushing yards, in the win. It's his seventh 100-yard rushing game of the year, the third most by a Gamecock in history. He also has over 1,000 rushing yards this season, compiling the 10th season at South Carolina with that total.

Senior quarterback Connor Shaw tied a career high with four touchdowns, throwing for 147 yards in a 10-for-20 outing. He's now second in passing touchdowns and in wins for a starting quarterback at South Carolina. He also ties the South Carolina career record for touchdowns responsible, evening Steve Taneyhill's 64. Sophomore wide receiver Shaq Roland hauled in two of those TD passes and led the Gamecocks with 57 receiving yards.

The Gamecocks took advantage of two interceptions in the first half en route to a 17-7 lead. After Mississippi State scored on its first drive, with sophomore quarterback Dak Prescott capping the drive with a 1-yard run, the Gamecocks answered. A surgical five-play, 71-yard drive ended when Shaw found Roland for a 14-yard score, tying the game at 7-7.

After freshman linebacker Skai Moore made a diving interception of a tipped MSU pass, the Gamecocks used just three plays to take the lead. Sophomore tailback Shon Carson set up the score with his 24-yard scamper on a screen pass, while Shaw hit Roland again for the 43-yard scoring strike. The Gamecocks made another interception on a tipped ball in the second quarter when redshirt freshman linebacker T.J. Holloman corralled the ball that hit the Bulldog offensive tackle and returned it 12 yards to the MSU 25. The Gamecocks settled for a 44-yard field goal from freshman Elliott Fry, the longest of his career.

Mississippi State drew within a touchdown on Evan Sobiesk's first career field goal, a 38-yarder, late in the second quarter. The Bulldogs held small advantages in total offense during the first half.


The Gamecock defense started the second half by producing its third turnover of the game. On the second play of the half, senior defensive end Chaz Sutton forced the Bulldog quarterback to fumble, and junior spur Sharrod Golightly returned it 24 yards to the Mississippi State 23. Four plays later, Shaw hit junior wide receiver Damiere Byrd from six yards out for the score. The Gamecocks made it 31-10 when Shaw hit tight end Jerrell Adams with the fade from the four. Davis had the big play on the drive, breaking away for a 43-yard run before catching a 30-yard pass to set up Adams' score.

The Bulldogs tallied a touchdown in the fourth when Prescott ran in his second score, this one an 11-yard carry. The pass on the two-point try failed, keeping the Gamecocks ahead 34-16. The next-to-last Mississippi State possession ended when junior cornerback Victor Hampton stripped the ball from the Bulldog receiver with 2:44 to go.

Mississippi State's Prescott went 25-for-40 for 209 yards but tossed the three interceptions. He also led the Bulldogs in rushing with 78 yards and two touchdowns.

Roland had his first two-TD catch day at South Carolina, while Adams caught his first score of the year. Hampton led the Gamecocks with eight tackles, forced and recovered a fumble and set a new personal best with three pass breakups. Moore and Elder both made their first interceptions of their career.

The win, the 15th-consecutive victory at home, tied the best streak in history, set from 1978-80.

COLUMBIA, S.C. — Behind four field goals from freshman Elliott Fry and a stifling second-half defense, No. 11/12 South Carolina (8-2, 6-2 SEC) downed Florida (4-6, 3-5 SEC) 19-14 in front of 83,853 fans at Williams-Brice Stadium on Saturday night.

Fry hit field goals of 25, 45, 22 and 43 yards in the win, becoming the first Gamecock to have a four field-goal game since Spencer Lanning hit five in 2009 at Georgia. Sophomore running back Shon Carson led the offense, rushing for 102 yards on 13 carries, his first career game to pass the century mark in yards. Senior quarterback Connor Shaw tossed the lone Gamecock touchdown and threw for 213 yards in a 14-for-28 outing.

The Gamecocks started on the comeback trail on their first possession of the second half, driving 64 yards in seven plays. Shaw, rolling out to his right, hit junior wide receiver Bruce Ellington with the pass at the goal line from 32 yards away, and Fry's PAT drew South Carolina to within one, 14-13. Carson had 17 yards on three carries in the drive, including a 13-yard dash.

In the fourth quarter, the Gamecocks got a boost from Carson's career-best 58-yard run, getting South Carolina from its own five into Gator territory. A circus catch by junior tight end Rory Anderson went for 34 yards to the Florida 2, but the Gamecocks could not punch it in from there. Instead, Fry came on for a 22-yard field goal, giving South Carolina its second lead of the evening with 6:43 remaining.


On Florida's next possession, the Gators, with the ball on their own 35, could not get a first down and were hurt by a third-down holding call that moved them back to the 32. Gamecock senior Jimmy Legree broke up the second third-down try by the Gators. On fourth, the Gators went for it, but a trio of Gamecocks rushed back to cover the Gators' Leon Orr and keep the pass from being completed, giving the ball back to South Carolina. Four plays later, Fry hit his fourth field goal of the night, a 43-yarder, to put the Gamecocks up five, 19-14.

Florida got the ball back with 2:16 remaining and made two first downs, but on the next play, Gator quarterback Skyler Mornhinweg floated a pass that Legree picked off, stopping the Gators' drive. The Gamecock defense held Florida to 130 offensive yards in the second half.

The Gamecocks trailed 14-6 at half despite being nearly even with Florida in total yards (UF 177-165). The Gators had two touchdown drives both capped by runs from Kelvin Taylor on direct snaps. The first, a 20-yard run, capped an 11-play drive that took 7:18 off the clock in the first quarter, while his second came from 29 yards out early in the second quarter.

South Carolina's first-half points all came from Fry's leg. The freshman hit a 25-yard field goal on the first South Carolina possession before putting through a career-long 45-yard effort on the team's second drive. He missed a 38-yarder that would have drawn the Gamecocks to within five with 1:31 remaining.

The victory pushed the Gamecocks' home winning streak to 16 games, breaking the school record set from 1978-80. The win marked the 39th for the Gamecock seniors, setting a new program record posted by last year's group, while Shaw ties the school mark for wins by a starting quarterback, matching Todd Ellis' 24 in his career.

COLUMBIA, S.C. — Scoring 10 touchdowns and posting 639 yards on offense, No. 12/11 South Carolina (9-2) cruised to a 70-10 victory over Coastal Carolina (10-2) in front of 81,411 fans on Saturday afternoon at Williams-Brice Stadium.

For only the fifth time in program history, South Carolina compiled 70 or more points. The last time the Gamecocks did that was 1995 against Kent State, a 77-14 win on Oct. 7. The 60-point margin of victory tied for ninth in the annals with a 1902 contest against N.C.M.A. South Carolina fell 27 yards shy of matching the program record for total offense and two first downs from matching a mark set twice. Both the 639 yards of total offense and 32 first downs tied the most for the Gamecocks under head coach Steve Spurrier as well as the 70 yards and 352 rushing yards.

The Gamecocks posted 28 points in the first quarter for the first time since 2010 and held a 42-7 lead at the half. Jamari Smith, Connor Shaw and Brandon Wilds all scored rushing touchdowns, while Shaq Roland, Nick Jones and Pharoh Cooper all caught TD passes, the last two from Dylan Thompson. For Cooper and Smith, it ranks as their first career touchdowns. South Carolina compiled 348 yards and 19 first downs in the first half, compared to 202 and nine for the Chanticleers.

Coastal scored its only touchdown in the first half when Alex Ross scrambled and found Lorenzo Taliaferro for a one-yard touchdown pass. The Chanticleers fumbled in the first quarter to set up Shaw's score and threw an interception that Gamecock junior cornerback Victor Hampton grabbed in the end zone on the penultimate play of the first half. A failed fourth-down try by Coastal in the first quarter led to the first of Thompson's two TD passes, as he hit Jones for the 34-yard score.


South Carolina did more of the same in the second half, getting touchdown runs from Thompson, Cooper, Shon Carson and Wilds. Cooper's was a 71-yard dash from the Wildcat, while Carson's ranked as his first collegiate touchdown.

Smith, a freshman who rejoined the offense during the season after a shift to defense in the first week of fall practice, posted 103 yards on 10 carries to lead the Gamecocks' 335 rushing-yard attack. Wilds scored twice for the second time in his career. Both Shaw and Thompson went 8-for-11 on the day, with Thompson holding advantages in both yards (140-115) and scores (2-1). Shaw broke the school record for wins by a starting quarterback with 25, surpassing Todd Ellis's record.

Cooper had 168 all-purpose yards, rushing for 81, returning kicks for 47 and receiving for 42. He scored one touchdown rushing and one receiving. Roland's four catches set a new career high, while his 72 yards came three yards shy of his best.

Defensively, freshman T.J. Holloman tied his career high with seven tackles and added his first career sack. In addition to his interception, Hampton broke up three passes, tying his career best. Freshman Darius English had a personal-best six tackles, tied with Hampton for second on the team. Freshman Kelsey Griffin also set a career high with five tackles. Sophomore T.J. Gurley had an interception, his first at South Carolina.

Ross went 15-for-25 with a touchdown pass and one interception for Coastal, while Matt Hazel caught six passes for 83 yards.

COLUMBIA, S.C. — Turning three of Clemson turnovers into touchdowns, No. 10/9 South Carolina (10-2) used 14 unanswered fourth-quarter points to claim a 31-17 win over the No. 6/4 Tigers (10-2) on Saturday evening in front of 84,174 fans at Williams-Brice Stadium, the Gamecocks' fifth straight in the series against their archrivals.

Gamecock senior quarterback Connor Shaw posted 246 yards of total offense in the win, running for one touchdown and passing for another, his 26th as a starter for South Carolina and his 17th at home, never losing a start at Williams-Brice Stadium.

Junior defensive tackle Kelcy Quarles tallied a career-high 2.5 sacks and tied for the team lead with six tackles. Interceptions by junior Brison Williams, sophomore T.J. Holloman and freshman Skai Moore along with fumbles forced by senior Chaz Sutton and sophomore Kaiwan Lewis accounted for five of the six Clemson turnovers. Moore also recovered the first Tiger fumble.

The Gamecocks capitalized on two Clemson turnovers in the first quarter to take a 14-7 lead. Williams ended Clemson's opening drive with a leaping interception in the end zone, and South Carolina drove 80 yards in 17 plays, to take a 7-0 lead. Shaw capped the drive with a 3-yard run.

After the Tigers answered less than two minutes later on Tajh Boyd's 8-yard run, South Carolina received a gift back. The Tigers forced the Gamecocks to punt, but Clemson's return man had the ball hit off his pads, and Moore recovered, giving the Gamecocks new life. Five plays later on the first of the second quarter, Shaw hit sophomore wide receiver Shaq Roland with the fade pass from 9 yards out to put South Carolina on top 14-7.

The Gamecocks' advantage grew to 10 when freshman Elliott Fry hit a 21-yard field goal with 8:25 left in the first half. The Tigers drew within a touchdown when Chandler Catanzaro's 38-yard field goal connected from 38 yards out as time expired. South Carolina held the ball for 19:42 of the first half, compared to 10:18 for Clemson, and converted eight of its 11 third-down tries.

Clemson posted a drive more reminiscent of South Carolina's offense to tie the game in the third quarter. Roderick McDowell capped a 15-play, 88-yard drive with a 4-yard touchdown run, and the point after evened the score at 17-17 with 3:01 left. But South Carolina responded with an drive that covered 75 yards in 11 plays, with sophomore running back Mike Davis wrapping it with a 2-yard run, the first touchdown for Davis since the Tennessee game.

With Clemson driving early in the fourth quarter, Sutton stripped the Tiger quarterback of the football at the Gamecock 30-yard line, giving South Carolina the ball back with 8:38 to play. The Tigers forced a Gamecock punt, but Lewis forced a fumble from the returner, and redshirt freshman Kwinton Smith recovered it to give the Gamecocks new life with 5:18 to play. Three plays after the second fumble of the quarter, Gamecock freshman Pharoh Cooper, on the option pass, floated one to sophomore Brandon Wilds, who took it to the end zone for the 26-yard score. Fry's kick put the Gamecocks up 31-17 with 3:44 to play.

Interceptions by Moore and Holloman with less than four minutes to play helped to seal the game for South Carolina, who captured its fifth game in the series. That is the longest winning streak in the series against Clemson, topping a four-game winning streak from 1951-54.

Davis' score in the fourth quarter marked his 11th of the year, tied for the sixth most in a single season in Gamecock history. Shaw, who went 14-for-26 for 152 yards and a touchdown, passed Phil Petty in career pass completions and now stands fifth in program annals. Shaw also led the Gamecocks with 94 yards rushing. Junior wide receiver Bruce Ellington became the fourth South Carolina student-athlete to catch 100 passes in his career, hauling in four on the night for 51 yards to lead the team.

ORLANDO, Fla. — Behind five touchdowns from quarterback Connor Shaw, No. 8/8 South Carolina (11-2) claimed a 34-24 victory over No. 19/19 Wisconsin (9-4) in the 2014 Capital One Bowl.

The Capital One Bowl MVP, Shaw accounted for 369 yards of offense, going 22-for-25 in the air for 312 yards and 3 TDs while also running for 48 yards on 16 carries and a score. Shaw also caught a TD pass for 9 yards. Junior Bruce Ellington caught six passes for a career-best 139 yards and two touchdowns and threw for another, while sophomore Shaq Roland pulled in six passes for 112 yards, both career bests.

The Gamecocks took the lead late in the third quarter behind the senior quarterback in his final game. Shaw found Ellington from 22 yards away to hand South Carolina a 20-17 advantage, but the duo had a much more pivotal play to keep the drive going. On 4th and 7, Ellington tipped the Shaw pass to himself before pulling it down and going out of bounds for a 22-yard gain and conversion. Shaw's arm accounted for all but three yards of the series, completing six of seven pass attempts on the drive.

South Carolina's defense stepped up to start the fourth quarter to snuff out a Wisconsin drive. With 1 yard to gain, the Gamecocks twice stopped Melvin Gordon, who rushed for 143 yards in the contest, for no gain to turn the ball over on downs. The Gamecocks proceeded to drive 74 yards in six plays to take a 10-point lead. Shaw twice found Roland on the drive, the second time a 49-yard catch that saw Roland's concentration as he brought in the catch among two defenders. It was tight end Jerell Adams who scored from 3 yards out for the Gamecocks, pulling down Shaw's third TD pass.

Wisconsin made it a one-score game again when Kenzel Doe found a seam and dashed 91 yards on the kickoff return, making it 27-24 in favor of the Gamecocks.

On the next possession, however, Shaw drove South Carolina 88 yards for another score, wrapping the drive with Shaw's 1-yard sneak. Another big pass from Shaw to Roland, a 33-yard reception, helped keep the drive alive.

The Badgers, behind backup quarterback Curt Phillips, tried to answer on the next drive, but on 4th and 1 in the Gamecocks' territory, the pass hit Jadeveon Clowney's helmet and sophomore linebacker Kaiwan Lewis corralled it to end that drive. South Carolina gave the Badgers back the ball two plays later when Ethan Armstrong recovered the Gamecocks' fumble.

After the fumble recovery, Wisconsin drove inside the 20, but Gamecock freshman linebacker Skai Moore came up with his second interception of the day in the end zone to stop the Badger threat. After the Gamecocks punted the ball back to Wisconsin, the Badgers drove again deep into South Carolina territory, but Lewis picked up the fumble on the catch-and-pitch attempt.

South Carolina took the initial lead after a Wisconsin turnover toward the end of the first quarter, when Moore picked off the pass from Badger starting quarterback Joel Stave. On the next play, Shaw hit Ellington for a 39-yard score. Wisconsin answered when Sam Arneson brought in the 1-yard pass from Stave on the tight end out, leveling the score at 7-7.

The offensive duo of Shaw and Ellington handed South Carolina the lead again but in reverse from their normal. To cap the 12-play, 86-yard drive, Carolina called up a double-reverse, halfback pass, as Ellington took the second handoff before firing a strike to Shaw from 9 yards out to hand the Gamecocks a 13-7 lead after the PAT attempt failed.

Wisconsin claimed the halftime lead when Stave found Jeff Duckworth for a 3-yard score and its PAT kick went through the uprights. The Badgers made it a 17-13 lead when Jack Russell hit a 35-yard field goal to end the Badgers' first second-half drive.

Shaw finished his Gamecock career in fourth on the career passing charts with 6,074 yards, while he holds the South Carolina record with 27 wins as a starting quarterback. The 312 passing yards ranks as the most during a single game in his senior season.
