

But we felt pretty fortunate to give him a four-run lead and he is a master of minimizing negative situations – him and (Kevin) Mooney both. I thought they both were really at their absolute best tonight, and (Bobby) Ruse, too. I thought Bobby came in the game and minimized.



Obviously we're really happy to be sitting where we're sitting at this point in this regional, but it is just a second win, and we are not here to just get two wins. We are here to finish this thing off and that is our mindset going into tomorrow.

On getting his team ready to play...

I didn't really do anything or say anything different than any other day we've played. Baseball is not football, and you can't put shoulder pads on and have a guy try and run through a brick wall and beat somebody up. Over the years I've learned it's a game that you have to get your guys to relax as much as possible. An effective baseball player can pitch and play the game when they're relaxed, when they can reset themselves and slow themselves down in a hostile environment. So, you don't have to get guys pumped up to play here against these guys. If your players cannot get pumped up to play here you got the wrong guys, and we clearly do not have the wrong guys. It was just a matter of trying to get them to be easy and relaxed, and I think we were able to do that.

On the atmosphere...

The fans are great, even though we are the opposing school. This is the type of atmosphere that you dream of playing in, in these types of situations. One of the big things is to embrace it, but to also put it out of your mind. I think a big part of what happened was calming down, slowing the game down, and going pitch by pitch. Our pitching coach (Jim) Belanger always says, 'Reset, get back on the mound and just focus. The target doesn't change. It's still 60 feet, six inches.'

On getting a big lead and settling in...

I thought it really helped me settle in, any time you get a four-run lead it's very nice, and it's pretty good work for your offense. But I go into every game just as any other game. If you get caught up thinking that it's a regional start, you let the game take over you. So when I go out there, I just try and throw strike one and see what happens.

On making the lead stand up...

I just try and go out and throw zeros on the board to put us in a good position to win. For a couple of those innings I wasn't able to put up a zero, but Coach (John) Szfec and the whole coaching staff always tell you about being mentally tough, and I knew I had to be in that one inning that they had the two runs because it easily could have gotten out of hand. I just try and do my best and make the best pitches.
