## South Carolina Notables

- South Carolina is in its 44th season of women's basketball and its 10 th under the tutelage of head coach Dawn Staley. The reigning national champion Gamecocks have won four straight SEC regular-season titles, three consecutive SEC Tournament crowns and played in five of the last six NCAA Sweet 16 s .
- The Gamecocks have faced the nation's No. 1 team 14 times in program history, including four times during the Dawn Staley era. South Carolina has yet to win vs. the No. 1 team in the nation, and the closest margin of defeat was a 53-49 loss to then-No. 1 Stanford at Colonial Life Arena on Dec. 19, 2012.
- Senior forward A'ja Wilson has been considered among the best players in the nation for the last two seasons, and the 6-foot-5 All-American has taken the next step in her development this season, expanding her shooting range and confirming her ability to handle the ball the full length of the court. Her usual benchmark numbers - 23.1 points, 11.2 rebounds and 3.6 blocks per game - rank among the top 15 in the nation, making her the only player in the country to hold that high a position in all three. She is shooting 50.0 percent from 3-point range ( 5 -of-10), hands out 1.7 assists per game and picking up 1.1 steals per game.
- The floor general of the uber-efficient Gamecock offense - ranked sixth in the nation in field goal percentage - is sophomore Tyasha Harris. Challenged by her head coach to find more balance in her game to keep defenders honest, she has six double-doubles, including three in SEC action. She is 10th in the nation with 6.7 assists per game -7.1 per SEC game - and averages 11.6 points on the season.
- Junior forward Alexis Jennings has been the interior anchor the Gamecocks thought they lost with the graduation of Alaina Coates last season. The 6-foot-2 Jennings is fourth in the nation with a .641 field goal percentage and is among the SEC's top 25 in scoring (13.0) and rebounding (7.5). In the last five games, she has put up 17.0 points and 8.6 rebounds per game, shooting 74.4 percent from the field.

## UConn Series Notes

The Huskies have won all five games of the series with the Gamecocks narrowing the gap each season since the home-and-home series was renewed. Two of the last three games have seen the teams square off as the Nos. 1 and 2 teams in the nation, including the Gamecocks toting the nation's top spot in the 2015 meeting at Gampel Pavilion.

In last season's matchup, the Huskies used a poorshooting third quarter to double their six-point halftime lead, narrowly edging the Gamecocks in points in the paint, 34-26.

South Carolina senior forward has faced the Huskies each season of her Gamecock career, scoring in double figures in each of the previous three games, including last season's 17 -point outing in Storrs. She averages 13.3 points, 5.7 rebounds and 1.7 blocks per game and shoots 50.0 percent from the field against the Huskies.

## Holding Home Court

The Gamecocks are 432-156 all-time on their home court, including a 189-62 mark in Colonial Life Arena. South Carolina is 125-28 at home during the Dawn Staley era and has lost just three times in its last 78 home games, including undefeated home seasons in 2013-14
and 2014-15. The Gamecocks have won 37 of their last 39 SEC regular-season home games dating back to the 2012-13 season.

## Ranked Readings

With a 4-3 mark this season, South Carolina is 54-48 against nationally ranked opponents under head coach Dawn Staley, although that record is skewed by the early seasons of her tenure as the Gamecocks are 39-9 versus ranked foes since the start of the 2014-15 campaign. South Carolina is 17-6 against top-10 opponents during that time.

Senior forward A'ja Wilson leads the Gamecocks against ranked foes, averaging 22.0 points and 11.3 rebounds. Sophomore Tyasha Harris' offense has been especially potent against the nation's best teams as she is second on the team with 15.3 points to game while still averaging 6.3 assists. Both of her 20-point games have come against ranked teams, including her season-high 28 against \#6/6 Tennessee (Jan. 14).

## SEC Stories

Head coach Dawn Staley has built the Gamecocks into a consistent SEC contender with four straight regular-season titles, shirking decades of difficulty in the nation's best women's basketball conference.

In her 10th SEC season at the helm, Staley boasts a 104-47 (.689) conference regular-season record and has finished outside the league's top five just twice an unprecedented achievement for a program that had finished INSIDE the top five only two times in the previous 17 seasons. Staley's 104 wins include six seasons of double-digit league victories - 10 in 2012; 11 in 2013; an SEC-best 14 in 2014, 15 in 2015 and 16 in 2016; and 14 in 2017 - and account for 61.9 percent of the program's all-time 168 league wins.

Staley's SEC regular-season record includes a 56-20 (.737) mark at home and a 48-27 (.640) slate on the road.

## Drive for Five

The Gamecocks enter the 2017-18 season as the fourtime reigning SEC regular-season champion, becoming just the second program to win four straight titles. South Carolina joined Tennessee, which claimed its fourth straight in 2001 en route to the league-record seven consecutive titles (1999-2004).

I don't think there's another player in the country like her from a collegiate or pro standpoint. Her ability to dribble the basketball, consistently make outside shots, rebound the basketball

## Staying Power

South Carolina head coach Dawn Staley is in her 10th season at the helm after guiding the Gamecocks into the postseason seven times in her first nine seasons in Columbia, including the 2017 National Championship and five other Sweet 16 berths.

With a .716 (411-163) winning percentage over her 18 seasons as a head coach, Staley is 23 rd among active NCAA Div. I head coaches with at least 10 years of experience and is the best among SEC head coaches.

Staley is the third-longest tenured coach currently in the SEC, and her 10.8 league wins per season is best among the group. During the Gamecocks' current fouryear run as SEC champion, the program averaged 14.8 conference wins per season.

With her 100th SEC regular-season victory coming against Auburn on Jan. 11, 2018, Staley became the eighth head coach all-time to record at least 100 such wins with one school.

## Rankings Review

South Carolina is ranked seventh in this week's Associated Press Poll, making it 105 th consecutive entry for the Gamecocks in the poll - the fifth-longest active streak in the nation.

The Gamecocks have spent 81 straight weeks in the nation's top 10 and are one of just three teams to have stayed among the nation's top 10 every week since the start of the 2014-15 season. In the 70 polls since the start of the 2014-15 season, South Carolina has spent 59 in the top five, trailing UConn's 70 such weeks and leading Notre Dame's 58 top-five entries.

## Tough Road Ahead

South Carolina's 2017-18 schedule includes 11 games against teams ranked in this week's Associated Press and/or USA Today Coaches Poll. Seven of those games are already behind the Gamecocks, who went 4-3 in the outings.

Still up for the Gamecocks are \#1/1 UConn, at \#2/2 Mississippi State, at \#17/18 Georgia and a rematch at \#12/13 Tennessee.

## Missing Persons Report

Beginning the season with a roster that returned just two starters and two other significant contributors to last season's national championship, South Carolina
has played through a series of injuries to some of its primary players. At least one Gamecock has been out of the lineup with injury in 10 of the South Carolina's 21 games this season. Leading scorer A'ja Wilson accounts for two of those 10 games with her ankle injury, and primary outside shooter Lindsey Spann has missed a combined eight games so far with separate knee injuries. Mikiah Herbert Harrigan missed three games earlier this month with a bone bruise.

## RPI Rating

The SEC is once again among the best women's basketball conferences in the nation, boasting six teams among the nation's top 20 in RPI. All six are also ranked in both the AP and USA Today Coaches Poll this week.

With an RPI of 17, South Carolina leads the SEC with eight games against top-25 RPI teams this season. The Gamecocks' five wins against those teams matches Mississippi State's total in such games.

Mississippi State has the top RPI in the league at three with Tennessee coming in at 10 . Missouri (23), Texas A\&M (14) and Georgia (16) are also in the RPI top 20.

## All-Around A'ja

Few players in the country are as versatile as South Carolina senior forward A'ja Wilson. Averaging 23.1 points, 11.2 rebounds and 3.58 blocks, she ranks seventh, 15 th and fifth in the nation in those categories, respectively, making her the only player in the nation to ranked that highly in all three of those categories.

Only eight players in the nation are among the top 50 in both scoring and rebounding with only Megan Gustafson, Iowa ( $24.0 \mathrm{ppg}, 4 \mathrm{th} / 12.3 \mathrm{rpg}, 7 \mathrm{th}$ ) out ranking Wilson in both categories.

Reading defenses more quickly than before, Wilson has also responded to her head coach's challenge to expand her skill set, improving her ball-handling to allow her to rebound and immediately start the fast break and even run the offense from the point guard position at times and developing consistency on her outside shot, of which she has hit 5 -of-10 from 3-point range. The growth in her game helps both the Gamecocks, as opponents will have a more difficult time locating her for double-teaming, and Wilson's preparedness for the next step in her basketball career.

## January Juice

Sophomore point guard Tyasha Harris has had a brilliant 2018 so far, amassing three of her six doubledoubles in the first month of the New Year while averaging 14.0 points per game on 45.5 percent field goal shooting along with 7.1 assists per game.

Looking around the county at other guards tallying points-assists double-doubles, Harris rises to the top of the group. On the season, her six such double-doubles are fourth-most in the nation. Since the turn of the New Year, she ties Ball State's Carmen Grande with three points-assists double-doubles so far. Grande's four such games in MAC play are one better than Harris' three in SEC action. No other player in the nation has multiple points-assists double-doubles in league games.

## Heart of a Champion

Among A'ja Wilson's 19 games played this season are eight in which the margin was under 10 in the fourth quarter - at \#15/13 Maryland (Nov. 13), vs. Rutgers (Nov. 24), vs. \#6/6 Notre Dame (Nov. 26), \#22/21 Texas A\&M (Dec. 31), at Ole Miss (Jan. 4), at \#15/15 Missouri (Jan. 8), Auburn (Jan. 11) and \#11/1 Missouri (Jan. 28). In those games, fans saw the senior forward step up to show why she impacts the game more than any player in the nation.

In the fourth quarter of those eight games, Wilson averaged 8.9 points on 61.9 percent shooting to go with 3.0 rebounding, 1.1 block and 0.9 assist averages.

As Texas A\&M head coach Gary Blair said after the Gamecocks rallied to defeat the Aggies, "Give Miss Wilson a little bit of credit for wanting the ball at the end ... You just saw the best player in the country."

## Quarter Breakdown

Through 21 games this season, South Carolina has out-scored its opponent in all but 20 quarters and has out-paced its opponent by double digits 38 times in the 84 quarters, including a season-high differential of 22 points (27-5) in the first quarter against Alabama State (Nov. 10).

South Carolina has shot at least 50.0 percent from the field 46 times in its 84 quarters of action, led by a its 81.8 (9-of-11) percent accuracy in the third quarter at Kentucky (Jan. 21).

Defensively, South Carolina has held an opponent to single digits in a quarter 17 times this season with five of those quarters resulting in five or fewer points, including a program-record low of three points by Savannah State (Dec. 17) in the third quarter. An opponent has shot to 20.0 percent or less from the field in 16 quarters, including a program-record low of 5.6 percent by College of Charleston (Dec. 5) in the second quarter.

Individually, A'ja Wilson leads the Gamecocks with 11 double-digit scoring quarters and has the highestscoring quarter this season with 18 points in the fourth against \#6/6 Notre Dame (Nov. 26). Alexis Jennings has three double-digit quarters, and Tyasha Harris and Lindsey Spann each have one.

## Location, Location, Location

The Gamecock frontcourt simply reloaded this season, and South Carolina averages 41.2 points in the paint this season, making up 50.5 percent of its offense. In fact, 67.8 percent of the team's made field goals this season have come in the paint.

The Gamecocks are out-pacing their opponents in that space by 15.6 points per game, and their interior advantage has been at least 20 points six times, including twice with a season-high 48 - against Alabama State (Nov. 10) and Western Carolina (Nov. 30). Only four games have seen South Carolina out-scored in the paint this season - vs. \#6/6 Notre Dame (Nov. 26) 58-42, at \#15/15 Missouri (Jan. 7) 28-34, \#6/6 Tennessee (Jan. 14) 36-44 and \#11/11 Missouri (Jan. 28) 18-26.

South Carolina's starting frontcourt - whatever the combination has been (Jennings/Wilson, Jennings/ Herbert Harrigan or Jennings/Grissett) has accounted for 43.2 percent of the Gamecocks' scoring this season, averaging a combined 35.3 points per game.

## Blocking Scheme

South Carolina ranks 11th in the nation with 6.3 blocked shots per game, which is second in the SEC. While the Gamecocks have been atop this category over the last few seasons, the formula this season is slightly different.

Instead of being dominated by two Gamecocks, nine different members of the team have recorded at least one blocked shot this season with three logging double-digit blocks.

Senior forward A'ja Wilson ranks fifth in the nation with an SEC-best 3.6 blocks per game. She has five games of five or more blocks, including a season-high eight at Temple (Dec. 21) and her SEC-season high of seven against Arkansas (Jan. 25).

Behind Wilson, sophomore Mikiah Herbert Harrigan and junior Alexis Jennings are tied at 12th in the SEC with 1.0 blocks per game.

## They're Free, Take Two!

Built around an inside presence for the last three seasons, South Carolina retains its annual spot among the top teams in free throws made and attempted this season.

The Gamecocks are fifth in the nation in free throw attempts (486) and 13th in free throws made (328). The Gamecocks have attempted 25 or more free throws nine times this season, including a season-high 33 at \#15/13 Maryland (Nov. 13)

Senior forward A'ja Wilson leads the Gamecocks' parade to the charity stripe, ranking 11th in the nation in free throw attempts (154) and 20th in free throws made (106).

## 52 Pick Up

Preseason All-SEC Second-Team selection Tyasha Harris has heeded her head coach's challenge to expand her game not that "the novelty has worn off," and the sophomore has recorded six double-doubles this season to set the school record for points-assists double-doubles.

Harris has picked up her scoring this season, ranking third on the team with 11.6 points per game on 45.5 percent shooting. She has netted double figures in 10 of the last 11 games, including posting 13.7 points per SEC contest, during which she is shooting 47.4 percent.

Meanwhile, Harris continues to show great court vision and command of the offense, ranking 10th in the nation with an SEC-best 6.7 assists per game - a number that rises to 7.1 in league play. Her 2.9 assist-toturnover ratio is 13th in the nation.

Defensively, Harris has become a menace as well with 2.6 steals per game to rank third in the SEC. She has seven games of four or more steals, including a season-high six against Western Carolina (Nov. 30) and Savannah State (Dec. 17).

Harris' six double-doubles put her among just three Gamecocks in the SEC era to record multiple pointsassists double-doubles. Cristina Ciocan leads the group with nine in her career ( 4 in 2002-03, 5 in 2003-04) with Shaunzinski Gortman joining the trio with two in 1999-2000.

## Just Jennings

Junior transfer Alexis Jennings has strengthened the Gamecocks' frontcourt, providing a steady, physical presence in the lane. After averaging 8.9 points and 5.4 rebounds in her two seasons at Kentucky, the powerful post has elevated her play this season, posting 13.0 points and 7.5 rebounds per game to rank second on the team and among the SEC's top 25 in both categories.
Jennings is fourth in the nation and tops in the SEC in field goal percentage (.641). She is 14 th in the league in rebounding and 23rd in scoring. Both her scoring and rebounding have been on full display versus ranked opponents, against which she averages 11.6 points and 7.1 rebounds. Two of her four double-doubles so far this season have come against top-15 foes in \#15/13 Maryland (Nov. 13, 12 pts/13 rebs) and \#14/16 Duke (Dec. 3, 21 pts/10 rebs).

Jennings has 11 other double-figure scoring games this season, including three 20 -point outings -25 vs. St. John's (Nov. 25), 27 at Vanderbilt (Jan. 18) and 22 against Arkansas (Jan. 25).

## Utility Player

Junior guard Doniyah Cliney is one of the best
examples of Dawn Staley's message to "trust the process." The 6 -foot Newark, N.J., product redshirted her first season on campus, only allowed to practice with the team in the second semester. The next season (201516), a preseason hand injury kept her off the court until SEC play began. Still, Cliney worked and absorbed everything she could about Staley's offense and defense.
In 2016-17, she was finally able to participate in the full preseason, and her game was growing. The Gamecocks already had two stars at her position, but Cliney did not let that affect her competitive fire. She figured out what the team needed beyond just points, and she committed to excelling at those things. In any given game, she would provide timely points, rebounds, steals, assists - whatever the Gamecocks needed to reclaim momentum.
Now a junior, Cliney has stepped into the starting lineup, and the spotlight has only amplified how much more she is prepared to contribute. Staley has marked her as a "stat stuffer" because her versatility and athleticism allow her to impact the game in so many ways. Any single number may not jump off the box score, but she will contribute to nearly all of them.

So far this season, Cliney averages 8.1 points, 3.2 rebounds, 2.3 assists and 1.2 steals. She has seven double-figure scoring games, including two against ranked opponents ( 12 vs. \#6/6 Notre Dame, 16 vs. \#22/21 Texas A\&M), and eight games of three or more assists.

## Spanning the Distance

Senior transfer Lindsey Spann brings solid experience and leadership to the Gamecocks' young roster, but the biggest impact the 1,000 -point scorer from Penn State will have will likely be from 3 -point range.
Claiming eighth place on the Lady Lions' career made 3 s list, the 5 -foot- 6 guard got off to a quick start from long range - leading the SEC in 3 -point field goal percentage (.550) and ranking second in the league in made 3 s per gam (3.1) before missing five games due to injury. Her first field goal attempt upon her return against \#22/21 Texas A\&M (Dec. 31) - was a 3.

Overall on the season, Spann is shooting 48.0 percent from 3-point range to average 11.2 points per game on 2.83 s per game to go along with 1.7 assists per game.

## Getting Some Le-way

Freshman forward LeLe Grissett spent the semester break putting in extra time in the gym, especially with assistant coach Fred Chmiel. The work began paying off just when the Gamecocks needed it most due to injuries, as the athletic, energetic newcomer thrived in the two games A'ja Wilson missed with her ankle injury.

In the last five games, Grissett has averaged 7.6 points on 61.5 percent shooting along with 6.4 rebounds per game. That stretch includes a season-best 29 minutes against \#6/6 Tennessee (Jan. 14) and starts at Vanderbilt (Jan. 18) and Kentucky (Jan. 21). She posted double figures in both games that Wilson missed, including a 22-point performance at Vanderbilt on 11-of-12 shooting.

## Steady Start

The daughter of two NCAA Div. I basketball coaches, freshman guard Bianca Jackson has shown all the poise and development attributed to such progeny, even while thrust into the starting lineup just eight games into her college career due to injuries to seniors Bianca CuevasMoore and Lindsey Spann.

Jackson earned that starting job and her 27.5 minutes per game because of her ability to deliver solid play and contribute what the team needs when it is needed. She opened her career against her mother's team, Alabama State, with eight points, six rebounds, three assists and two blocks. Jackson was steady in a hostile environment at \#15/13 Maryland (Nov. 13) and handed out seven assists in the rivalry game at Clemson (Nov. 16). In her first career start, she was equally balanced with seven points, four rebounds and three assists against just one turnover. Against \#14/16 Duke (Dec. 3), the embraced the role of stopper against the Blue Devils' high-scoring 3-point shooter Rebecca Greenwell, limiting her to just eight points and 0 -of-2 from the 3-point line. ## Great Gamecock Fans

With over 10,000 season-ticket holders for the third-straight season, South Carolina continues to lead the nation in average attendance at 12,984 and is the only program drawing at least 10,000 fans per game.

The Gamecocks have posted the highest average attendance in the nation at the end of the last three seasons, averaging at least 12,000 fans in each of those seasons, during which they boast two sellouts of 18,000 seat Colonial Life Arena.

With a career-high 34 points against No. 6/6 Notre Dame (Nov. 26) following a 32 -point outing at No. 15/13 Maryland (Nov. 13), A'ja Wilson became the first Gamecock to record three 30-point games against nationally ranked opponents. The most recent outing against the Fighting Irish broker her tie with Shannon Johnson, who is the only other Gamecock to record more than one such game against ranked opponents.

With just 10 such games in program history, Wilson and Kaela Davis each recorded one last season, the first new additions to the list since Feb. 15, 2996. Those two games along with Wilson's first entry this season are the only road games on the list. Davis' 37 -point showing at

When three-time Olympic gold medalist Dawn Staley took the reins of the University of South Carolina women's basketball program on May 10, 2008, the Gamecocks' stature immediately rose not just in the Southeastern Conference but on the national stage as well. Nine seasons later, Staley delivered on those expectations with the program's first NCAA National Championship in 2017. South Carolina has the fifth-longest streak of appearances in the Associated Press Top 25, hitting the 100-week mark on Dec. 25, 2017; and the Gamecocks boast six straight 25-win seasons, which include four SEC regular-season championships, three SEC Tournament titles, two NCAA Final Four appearances and three other Sweet 16 seasons, the program's first ever No. 1 national ranking and a school-record 34 wins in 2014-15. Staley's success has united every demographic in the state of South Carolina as the Gamecocks' fan base tripled over a span of three seasons, and three times led the nation in home attendance.

While her coaching career is blossoming, Staley is still recognized for her body of work as a one of the most decorated participants in United States women's basketball history. The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame solidified her legacy with her enshrinement as part of the Class of 2013. The Phoenix Club of Philadelphia established the Dawn Staley Award recognizing the nation's top guard in women's Division I basketball in 2013 as well. Staley was inducted into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame as part of the Class of 2012 and was one of the final nominees for induction to the U.S. Olympic Hall of Fame the same year. In the summer of 2011, the WNBA recognized her as one of the league's "Top 15," honoring the most influential players in the league's history.

In her 18th season as a head coach, Staley has amassed a 411-163 (.716) record, including her 239-83 (.742) slate in her 10th season at South Carolina. She has led her teams to eight 25 -win seasons, a total of 14 postseason appearances and 76 weeks in the Associated Press top 10, including 12 in the No. 1 spot. Also a force in USA Basketball, she was named the U.S. Women's National Team head coach for 2017-20 after leading three other U.S. teams to gold medals - 2015 FIBA U19 World Cup, 2014 FIBA U18 Americas Cup, 2007 Pan Am Games - and serving as an assistant on the Senior National Team 2006-08 and again 2014-16, during which the U.S. claimed gold in the 2014 FIBA World Cup and the 2008 and 2016 Olympic Games.

At the helm of the Gamecocks over the last 10 seasons, Staley has been named National Coach of the Year, a Naismith National Coach of the Year Finalist three times, SEC Coach of the Year three times and BCA Female Coach of the Year. She became the fastest coach to 200 wins in program history, needing just 277 games at South Carolina to do it.

Under Staley's leadership, four Gamecocks have collected eight All-America selections, two have picked up four SEC Player of the Year honors, two have earned SEC Defensive Player of the Year recognition, one has been the SEC 6th Player of the Year and three were named SEC Freshman of the Year. She has coached 10 Gamecocks who earned All-SEC honors 21 times, including 11 first-team selections, and five Gamecocks have been selected in the WNBA Draft, including Alaina Coates who, as the No. 2 pick in 2017, became the highest pick in program history, and three others who earned WNBA All-Rookie Team honors.

On Staley's watch, the Gamecocks are enjoying the most sustained success in program history. After posting back-to-back 25-win seasons in 2011-12 and 2012-13 for the first time in more than 30 years, the 2014-15 team broke the school record with 34 wins. South Carolina won more SEC games than the season before in each of Staley's first seven seasons, culminating in the 2015-16 team recording just the second 16-0 conference record in league history. Staley's 97 SEC wins are more than any other Gamecock coach, accounting for 60.2 percent of the program's total 161 wins over its 26 seasons in the league. She has delivered the only SEC championships in program history, lifting that trophy four times in as many seasons, and she has helped the Gamecocks to six of the program's seven top-four finishes in the SEC. Off the court, Staley's Gamecocks have been active in the community and thriving in the classroom. Every studentathlete who completed her eligibility under Staley at South Carolina has graduated or is on track to graduate, and the team GPA has been over 3.0 for seven of the last eight semesters
