## Last Time Out

South Carolina surpassed No. 11/12 Penn State in a number of statistical categories but could not keep the door closed against the Lady Lions, who escaped Colonial Life Arena with a 55-50 victory. Entering the game averaging 69.3 points and 46.7 rebounds, Penn State was held well below both averages as the Gamecocks nullified the height differential for much of the game with aggressive ball pressure and strong rebounding. Despite forcing 23 Penn State turnovers and reeling in 25 offensive rebounds that led to 34 extra possessions, South Carolina could not overcome dismal shooting to collect the win. The Gamecocks led by eight with under six minutes to play, but the Lady Lions' Maggie Lucas surged late, scoring eight of PSU's final 13 points down the stretch to deliver the victory.

## College of Charleston Series Notes

South Carolina leads the series 13-9, although the two programs have not met since 2005. The Gamecocks have won the last six meetings and 12 of the last 14 dating back to 1978.

The Gamecocks are a perfect 7-0 against the Cougars in Columbia with the last meeting on Jan. 13, 2005, resulting in a 67-37 decision. The Cougars' last win in the series was a 66-63 outcome on Dec. 7, 1991, in Charleston.

## Home Sweet Home

South Carolina has won 69.2 percent of its home games since the 1976-77 season (records did not include the site of games for the first two seasons of women's basketball). That 338-150 mark includes a $94-53$ mark in Colonial Life Arena.

The Gamecocks turned in their most productive home season in 2001-02, winning 17 of their 18 contests in their final season playing at

Carolina Coliseum. The team's best home record at Colonial Life Arena came in 2006-07 when South Carolina went 15-5. Last season, South Carolina was $14-5$ at home, the fourth-most home wins in school history. So far this season, the Gamecocks are 1-1 at Colonial Life Arena.

## Helping Hand

With arguably the best point guard in international women's basketball history at the helm, South Carolina has been at its best when its assist numbers are highest. In the Dawn Staley era (2008-09 through present), the Gamecocks are 34-15 when handing out 10 or more assists, including a 3-0 mark this season. When missing the 10-assist plateau, South Carolina is just 11-34 overall with Staley, including a 4-20 mark in SEC action. Those records include last season's 3-10 overall slate and 2-5 ledger in league play.

## Triple Play

Coming into the season, may observers felt the fate of the Gamecocks' season rested largely in the hands of its experienced backcourt - seniors Markeshia Grant and La'Keisha Sutton and junior Ieasia Walker. Through the first three games, that has certainly been the case as between their points and assists, the trio has contributed to 64.6 percent of the team's 61.5 points per game.

The trio's camaraderie on and off the floor has bred friendly competition specifically between the two seniors, designed to ultimately guide the team to its goals. After Sutton led the team with 3.6 assists per game last season, Grant has set her sights on unseating her classmate in the assist department. After the two each handed out three assists in the season opener, Grant surged ahead with a career-high six against Alabama A\&M. Sutton answered with six at Clemson, and out dished her classmate by one against No. 11/12 Penn State.

Sutton is currently leading the friendly competition with 16 assists - 4.0 per game, which ranks her ninth in the SEC. Grant has the edge in efficiency, however, holding down the No. 2 spot in the SEC with a 4.3 assist-to-turnover ratio. Walker leads the scoring battle as her 10.5 points per game is second-best on the team and among the league's top 30 averages.

## Not So Fast

While the backcourt got all the attention leading into the season, a member of the Gamecock frontcourt led the team in scoring in each of the first three games. Highlighting that group's effort is junior Ashley Bruner whose team-high 11.0 points per game include a pair of double-digit outings to start the season.

Particularly when it comes to the assist battle in the backcout, South Carolina's forwards will be counted on to deliver the basket at the end of those passes. That ability was especially on display in the second half against Alabama A\&M when Bruner and freshman Aleighsa Welch netted 15 of the team's 30 points. The duo finished the night with 27 of the Gamecocks' 60 points and handed out three assists of their own. Bruner also matched her career high with four steals in the outing.

The six forwards on the South Carolina roster have accounted for 46.0 percent of the team's 61.5 points per game - Bruner 11.0 ppg, Charenee Stephens 6.8 ppg, Aleighsa Welch 5.5 ppg, Elem Ibiam 3.0 ppg , Courtney Newton 2.0 and Pamela Decheva 0.0.

## Hitting a High Note

The Gamecocks' 71 points at Illinois were their most since posting 77 against NC State in

Colonial Life Arena on Dec. 12, 2010, and the most on the road since a $73-70$ win at then-No. 22 Vanderbilt on Feb. 28, 1010. South Carolina netted 70 or more points three times last season -77 vs. NC State (Dec. 12), 75 vs. Charleston Southern (Dec. 1) and 73 vs. Clemson (Nov. 18) - and won all three contests. In fact, the Gamecocks are 15-3 in the Dawn Staley era when reaching the 70-point plateau.

## Noting November

The Gamecocks are 72-39 (.649) all-time in the month of November, including a 35-10 (.778) record at home. Under head coach Dawn Staley, South Carolina is 11-10 in the first month of basketball season. The Gamecocks went 3-2 in Staley's first year at the helm (2008-09), were 3-3 in 2009-10 and posted a 2-4 mark last season. The team is currently 3-1 this month.

## Preseason Props

SEC Coaches voted two Gamecocks to the Preseason All-SEC team last week as senior La'Keisha Sutton and junior Ieasia Walker earned spots on the second team. The pair of guards accounted for 38.2 percent of the team's scoring last season and handed out 54.0 percent of the assists.

## Strength of Schedule

After finishing the 2010-11 campaign with the nation's 19th-toughest schedule, the Gamecocks are facing another challenging slate in 2011-12. With both the Associated Press and USA Today/ESPN Coaches preseason polls released this week, South Carolina will play seven games against nationally ranked

## On the Horizon

Head coach Dawn Staley inked four players in the early signing period. Below is a brief look at each of the future Gamecocks.

- Tiffany Davis (Houston, Texas/Westbury Christian) is a 5 -foot-8 point guard rated the 29th in the 2012 class at that position. Before transferring to Westbury Christian, she helped Westside High to the 2011 District 20-5A championship game. Davis earned all-region and first-team all-district honors as a junior, netting 16.0 points per game.
- Asia Dozier (Columbia, S.C./Spring Valley) is a 5 -foot-11 guard who helped Spring Valley to state championships in 2009 and 2011. Rated the 34th-best guard in the 2012 class and a four-star player by ESPN Hoop/Gurlz, Dozier averaged 17.1 ppg and 3.8 apg as a junior as the Lady Vikings went 29-0. As a freshman, her 18.3 ppg and 3.8 apg earned her Class 4A Area Player of the Year honors from The State newspaper. Her father, Perry, and uncle Terry Dozier also played basketball for the Gamecocks.
- Tina Mitchell (Charlotte, N.C./Providence Day) is a 5 -foot-10 guard who is rated among the top 50 players in the 2012 class by ESPN Hoop/Gurlz. She earned South Charlotte player of the year honors and was an Associated Press All-State selection after averaging 18.4 points, 6.9 rebounds, 4.2 steals and 3.9 assists as a junior. She guided the Chargers to 21 straight wins in 201011, including the program's second-straight NCISAA state title.
- Khadijah Sessions (Myrtle Beach, S.C./ Myrtle Beach) is a 5 -foot-6 point guard rated the seventh-best in the class at her position by ESPN Hoop/Gurlz. The 40thranked player overall, she averaged 17.9 points and 5.7 assists as a junior while leading the Seahawks to their secondstraight AAA state championship. A member of the all-state team, Sessions also captured all-region honors last season.
teams. Another five games will be against teams that also received votes in one or both polls.

Seventeen of the Gamecocks' 29 games this season will be against teams that participated in the 2011 postseason, including nine who were in the NCAA Tournament. Of the 24 opponents on the schedule, eight finished the 2010-11 season with an RPI in the top 50 . Six others closed with an RPI between 51 and 100 .

## We're Back...

South Carolina returns eight letterwinners from last season's Women's NIT team. All are juniors and seniors, including three starters. Additionally, the group includes the top two in points, rebounds and assists for the season. The two seniors that departed in May provided vast leadership and experience, but did not necessarily have a significant game-to-game statistical impact.

The returning Gamecocks accounted for 74.5 percent of last season's scoring, 63.1 percent of rebounding and 81.4 percent of assists. The group of five seniors and three juniors amassed 103 starting assignments a year ago.

## Fresh Look

South Carolina head coach Dawn Staley added five student-athletes to her roster this season, providing depth and height on the backcourt while building a foundation for the frontcourt. As a group,

Following the CSS broadcast of the game at Tennessee (Feb. 2), ESPN2 comes to Columbia for the Florida game (Feb. 12). The games against Georgia (Feb. 16) and at Alabama (Feb. 19) will air on FSN, and SEC Network closes out the string with the regular-season finale against Arkansas (Feb. 26).

South Carolina was 9-5 last season in games televised live, including a 5-3 mark in SEC action.
