CAROLINA QUICK HITS

South Carolina is in its 104th season of basketball.

■ The Gamecocks are led by fourth-year head coach Darrin Horn.

The Gamecocks are in their 21st season of competition in the Southeastern Conference in 2012. Carolina owns a 128-199 all-time record in SEC play.

South Carolina was unable to overcome a first-half double-digit deficit in a 74-66 loss at No. 12/11 Florida on Thursday night in Gainesville. Sophomore forward Damontre Harris had an impressive night, matching a career high with six blocks, while adding 12 points and a team-best nine rebounds. Sophomore guard Bruce Ellington led Carolina with 15 points.

South Carolina will play its second No. 1 ranked opponent when top-ranked Kentucky visits Colonial Life Arena on Saturday, as the Gamecocks faced then-No. 1 North Carolina earlier this season in Las Vegas competing in the Las Vegas Invitational.

Saturday's contest against the Wildcats marks the 10th time the Gamecocks will play the AP No. 1 in its history, and the third time in the last three seasons. South Carolina is 1-8 all-time vs. the AP No. 1. The last time South Carolina faced the top-ranked team the Gamecocks suffered an 87-62 loss to North Carolina on Nov. 25, 2011.

The Gamecocks have faced Kentucky on two previous occassions when the Wildcats were ranked No. 1, going 1-1 in those contests, with the most recent the historic 68-62 victory vs. UK on Jan. 26, 2010, in Columbia.

South Carolina's contest vs. Kentucky is the lone home contest in the midst of four out of five on the road for the Gamecocks. The stretch started at Ole Miss last Saturday, at Florida just two days ago, and then at Tennessee and Arkansas next week.

■ In the SEC statistical standings South Carolina ranks first in rebounding defense (32.1), tied for third in steals per game (7.2), fourth in turnover margin (+1.3) and is third in the SEC in offensive rebounding (12.8).

■ In strictly SEC games, South Carolina collects 7.6 steals per contest, which ranks second in the league.

The Gamecocks have out-rebounded 12 of 21 opponents this season, including North Carolina, who leads the nation in rebounding margin at +11.8, and Kentucky, who ranks 12th in the category and leads the SEC with a +7.7 mark (as of Feb. 3 NCAA stats).

Senior forward Malik Cooke ranks tied for third in the SEC (all games) with 2.0 steals per game.

Darrin Horn-led teams are 79-54 all-time in league play.

South Carolina ranks fifth in the SEC and is among the nation's top 40 with 5.0 blocks per game. Sophomore forward Damontre Harris ranks 33rd with 2.3 blocks per game, which is fifth in the SEC.

■ In games it has won in 2011-12, South Carolina holds a +11.9 scoring margin over its opponents. To compare, in games it has lost, Gamecock opponents score 9.4 more points per game.

South Carolina is 429-434-1 all-time in the month of February.

INTERVIEW POLICIES

A SOUTH CAROLINA WIN WOULD ...

• Be the Gamecocks' second all-time over an AP No. 1, and the second over Kentucky when the Wildcats have been ranked as the AP No. 1.

· Snap a two-game losing streak for the Gamecocks

· Be South Carolina's second SEC win in a row at Colonial Life Arena

■ South Carolina has scored more points in the paint than its opponent 11 times, and has scored more points off turnovers 13 times this season. The Gamecocks average 27.3 points in the paint and average 15.3 points off turnovers per contest.

■ When South Carolina played then-No. 2 Kentucky on Jan. 7, it marked the third top-two opponent the Gamecocks faced this season, as the squad had previously played then-No. 1 North Carolina and then-No. 2 Ohio State. Those three teams have an average RPI of 6.7, with Kentucky the highest at 5 (as of Jan. 30 RPI report).

BY THE NUMBERS

6 - Sophomore forward Damontre Harris put up All-SEC type numbers against No. 12/11 Florida on Thursday. He matched a career high with six blocks - the second time in the last four games he has hit the mark - he set a career high with three steals, he matched a career best with 37 minutes played, and he nearly collected his second-career double-double with 12 points and nine rebounds vs. the Gators. Over the course of the last five games, Harris is averaging 9.0 points, 5.6 rebounds and 3.0 blocks per game.

25.0 - South Carolina held Florida to its lowest percentage of the season from beyond the arc on Thursday. The Gators shot well in the first half, hitting 6-of-15 attempts, but struggled in the second half, hitting just one of 13 attempts. It also matched a season low for made 3s in a contest for Florida, which entered the game leading the nation with 10.6 made 3s per game.

28 - South Carolina's 28 fouls vs. Florida marked a season high, which resulted in an opponent season-high 32 free throw attempts for the Gators.

44.6% - Carolina's 44.6 percent (25-56) from the floor vs. Florida marked an SEC season high for the Gamecocks in the category.

11 - Damontre Harris has blocked at least two shots in 11 games this season.

SCOUTING KENTUCKY

The Wildcats enter Saturday's contest on a 14-game winning streak with an overall record of 22-1, including an 8-0 mark in SEC games ... The Wildcats are 4-1 in road games this season, with the lone loss at Indiana on Dec. 10 ... Five Wildcats average double-figure points on the season, led by Anthony Davis' 13.5 points per game ... Davis also leads the team with 10.2 rebounds per contest (second in the SEC), and leads the nation with 4.7 blocks per outing ... UK is averaging 48.5 percent from the field, while its opponents hit just 36.0 percent ... 78.7% of Kentucky's points come from two-point field goals and free throws ... Kentucky's +19.9 scoring margin leads the SEC, and is second in the nation to only Ohio State's +21.7.

KENTUCKY SERIES INFORMATION

Kentucky holds a 45-10 advantage in the all-time series against South Carolina, including a 19-6 upperhand in games played in Columbia.

South Carolina swept the season series vs. UK for just the second time (1997) in 2009 under first-year head coach - and Lexington, Ky., native - Darrin Horn.

South Carolina head coach Darrin Horn won his first three meetings against Kentucky.

KENTUCKY CONNECTIONS

■ South Carolina head coach Darrin Horn is a Lexington, Ky., native, having played his high school hoops at Tates Creek High School. Horn stayed in-state for his college career, playing for the Western Kentucky Hilltoppers from 1992-95. Horn was an Academic All-American and an All-Sun Belt Conference honoree during his time at WKU. He spent five years as the head coach of the Hilltopper program prior to his arrival in Columbia. South Carolina assistant coach Cypheus Bunton is also a Kentucky native, hailing from Louisville. Bunton played at Sullivan Junior College before he and Horn were teammates at Western Kentucky.

UP NEXT

South Carolina continues SEC play next week with two road contests, the first at Tennessee on Wednesday, before traveling to Arkansas for a 1:30 p.m. ET matchup next Saturday. It will mark the first time the Gamecocks have played either opponent this season.

DISTRIBUTION IN THE NUMBERS

■ South Carolina has several players making a significant impact in several various categories. Only senior forward Malik Cooke (12.7) and sophomore guard Bruce Ellington (11.1) average double-digit points, but three others average at least 6.0 points per game. Similarly, sophomore forward Damontre Harris leads the team with 5.3 rebounds per game, but three others average at least 4.2 boards per outing. Same with assists, as five have tallied at least 27 this season, led by Cooke's 40 (Ellington leads assists per game with 2.4).

- South Carolina is 55-16 when holding its opponents under 45% shooting from the field.
- South Carolina has held 11 opponents, to under 45% shooting from the field in 2011-12.
- Carolina is 32-13 when out-rebounding its opponent.
- The Gamecocks have out-rebounded 12 of 21 opponents this season, including a 43-35 mark vs. UNC.

SEASON NOTABLES

Behind freshman forward Anthony Gill's 14-point performance, the Gamecocks earned a 69-59 victory over D-II powerhouse Kentucky Wesleyan in the lone exhibition of the season on Nov. 3. Senior forward Malik Cooke chipped in 11 points and sophomore forward RJ Slawson added 10, while collecting a team-best nine rebounds.

■ South Carolina earned a 75-50 victory over Western Carolina in the season opener on Nov. 11. Freshman forward Anthony Gill paced Carolina with 14 points, while sophomore guard Brenton Williams impressed, scoring 13 points on 5-of-8 shooting from the floor, while collecting five steals.

South Carolina first-year players (Gill, Leonard, Williams, Geathers) accounted for 36 points vs. Western Carolina on Nov. 11. Gill paced the group with 14 points.

■ Carolina's 12 3-point field goal attempts versus Western Carolina ranked as the second-fewest in the Darrin Horn era. The Gamecocks have attempted just 12 on six occassions, with the previous time in a 74-61 win over Delaware State on Dec. 1, 2010. Under Horn, the fewest attempts by Carolina in a game is 10, which has happened three times.

South Carolina sophomore guard Eric Smith tallied a career high 18 points in just 18 minutes vs. Tennessee State on Nov. 20. The Mullins, S.C., native hit 6-of-10 from the floor, including a stellar 5-of-7 from 3-point range. Smith's previous career high was nine points.

■ Senior forward Malik Cooke paced the Gamecocks with 18 points against Mississippi Valley State on Nov. 22, including a stellar 10-of-12 mark from the free throw line. Both his free throws made and attempted were career highs for the Charlotte, N.C., native.

South Carolina rallied from an 11-point deficit with 6:36 to go against MVSU, out-scoring the Delta Devils 22-7 over the final minutes for the win. The Gamecocks converted on six MVSU turnovers for 12 points down the stretch, using solid half-court pressure to force the giveaways.

■ Sophomore forward RJ Slawson had a career night against top-ranked North Carolina on Nov. 25, posting career highs with 13 points, 14 rebounds and four blocks. It was the most rebounds in a game for South Carolina since Sam Muldrow collected 14 vs. Vanderbilt on Jan. 8, 2011.

■ South Carolina concluded play in the Continental Tire Las Vegas Invitational with a 63-60 loss to Southern California on Nov. 26. Sophomore forward Damontre Harris led the Gamecocks with a career high 15 points in the contest.

Three Gamecocks registered season highs competing in Las Vegas. Slawson's career high 13 points vs. UNC, sophomore guard Brian Richardson's season high 12 points vs. Southern Cal, and sophomore forward Damontre Harris' career high 15 points against the Trojans.

R-senior forward Malik Cooke tallied a game-high 21 points vs. Providence on Dec. 1, just one point shy of matching his career high.

■ Sophomore guard Bruce Ellington posted the winning point on two clutch free throws with 13.0 seconds on the clock, and R-senior forward Malik Cooke sealed the win with a pair of free throws with 6.7 on the clock in a 58-55 victory at Clemson on Dec. 4. Sophomore guard Eric Smith also sank a crucial jumper with 25.9 on the clock to propel the Gamecocks to their first win at Clemson since the 2003 campaign.

■ South Carolina earned its second-consecutive win with a 66-58 victory over Presbyterian on Dec. 13 at Colonial Life Arena. Sophomore guard Bruce Ellington led three Gamecocks in double figures with 15 points on the night. It marked his best all-around performance since his return to the court from the football field, as Ellington also dished three assists and collected one steal.

■ South Carolina used 54.2 percent shooting in the opening half to hold a 33-29 lead over No. 2 Ohio State at halftime on Dec. 17 at Colonial Life Arena, however, the Buckeyes rallied around a 20-point second-half effort from Deshaun Thomas to rally for a 74-66 win over the Gamecocks.

■ South Carolina senior forward Malik Cooke battled through an eye injury versus No. 2 Ohio State to match a then-season high with 21 points, including an impressive 9-of-10 effort from the charity stripe in the contest. Despite only playing 13 minutes in the second half due to lengthy breaks to tend to a cut above his eye, Cooke matched freshman forward Anthony Gill for a team-best 11 points in the set, including a 7-of-8 performance from the free throw line.

■ Senior forward Malik Cooke and freshman forward Anthony Gill led the Gamecocks with 14 points each in a 62-43 win over SE Louisiana on Dec. 21 in the final game before the break for the holiday. Cooke also posted team highs with three assists, two blocks and four steals.

■ SE Louisiana's 26 turnovers on Dec. 21 marked the second-most by a Gamecock opponent under the direction of Darrin Horn. The most opponent giveaways under Horn was 34 by NC Central on Dec. 16, 2008. It also marked a South Carolina opponent record for turnovers in a contest.

■ Paced by Bruce Ellington's season high 17 points and Damien Leonards 14 points in 16 minutes, South Carolina earned a 57-45 victory over intrastate rival Wofford on Dec. 28 at Colonial Life Arena in the first game following the break for the holiday. South Carolina hit a season high 11 3s in the contest, including five by Ellington and four from Leonard.

■ Sophomore foward Damontre Harris matched his career high with five blocks vs. Wofford. At the time, his season total of 26 blocks in 12 games (2.2 per game) matches his total from last season, which he posted in 29 games (0.9 per game).

■ Paced by Malik Cooke's double-double and career high 24 points, the Gamecocks earned a 72-66 victory versus intrastate foe USC Upstate on Saturday. South Carolina, without Bruce Ellington in the contest as he prepared for the Capital One Bowl in Orlando, surpassed the 70-point plateau for the first time since a 75-point performance vs. Western Carolina in the season opener.

 Sophomore guard Brenton Williams, who has played sparingly since a left knee injury on Nov. 20 vs. Tennessee State, stepped into the lineup vs. USC Upstate, playing 20 minutes and scoring 11 points vs. the Spartans. The 20 minutes for Williams marked a season high.
 South Carolina scored a season high 79 points vs. SC State on Han. 3, with redshirtsenior Malik Cooke and sophomore Damontre Harris leading the way with 11 points each. Four other Gamecocks registered at least eight points in the win, including sophomore RJ Slawson with nine points and a team high nine rebounds.

■ South Carolina shot just 25% in the first half, which allowed Kentucky to hold a 34-18 lead at halftime, as the second-ranked Wildcats earned a 79-64 victory in the SEC opener for both schools at Rupp Arena on Jan. 7. Freshman guard Damien Leonard led Carolina in scoring for the first time in his career, posting 15 points, including 12 in the second half. UK's Terrence Jones led all scorers with 20 points, while Wildcat freshman forward Anthony Davis added 12 points, 10 rebounds and seven blocks.

■ Another poor shooting performance in the first half for the Gamecocks, as the squad hit just 19 percent from the floor, led to Vanderbilt holding a halftime lead that it would not relinquish in the second half, as Carolina fell to 0-2 in the SEC after a 67-57 loss to the Commodores on Tuesday. Sophomore guard Bruce Ellington tallied a season high 20 points, including 18 in the second half, to lead the Gamecocks.

■ Sophomore forward Damontre Harris collected the first double-double of his career with 11 points and 10 rebounds against Vanderbilt. Harris had two previous double-figure rebounding games in his career and three double-figure point games, but had never put up double-figures in the categories in the same game.

■ South Carolina suffered a 79-65 loss in Columbia to No. 19 Florida on Jan. 14. The Gators had six reach double-digit points in the contest, while the Gamecocks inside duo of Anthony Gill and Damontre Harris both struggled with foul trouble throughout the game. The teams hit a combined 21 3-point baskets in the contest, with UF guard Kenny Boynton and South Carolina point guard Bruce Ellington both hitting four from beyond the arc.

■ South Carolina suffered a 63-52 loss at Auburn on Jan. 21. The Gamecocks held a 28-24 lead at halftime, but poor shooting until the later part of the second half and 23 turnovers in the contest saw the Gamecocks drop the road contest. Auburn scored 28 points off of South Carolina turnovers. Sophomore forward Damontre Harris blocked a career high six shots in the game.

■ South Carolina earned its first SEC victory of the season when it snapped a four-game losing streak with a 56-54 victory over Alabama at Colonial Life Arena on Wednesday. Sophomore guard Bruce Ellington's layup with 1.3 seconds on the clock propelled the Gamecocks to victory. Fifth-year senior forward Malik Cooke paced the Gamecocks with 18 points, marking the eighth time this season he has led, or shared the team lead, in scoring this season. Sophomore forward Damontre Harris and Ellington both contributed 12 points each in the win.

■ Despite a game high 17 points from senior forward Malik Cooke, South Carolina suffered a 66-62 loss at Ole Miss last Saturday. The game was close throughout, as neither team led by more than seven points in the second half. Ole Miss' Terrance Henry hit a 3 with 17.5 on the clock which gave the Rebels the deciding four-point advantage. Sophomore forward Damontre Harris played just 16 minutes due to foul trouble.

South Carolina's 12 steals vs. Ole Miss marked a season high.

ELLINGTON SCHEDULE

Sophomore guard Bruce Ellington missed just the Dec. 31 men's hoops contest vs. USC Upstate, as he traveled following the Dec. 28 men's basketball contest vs. Wofford to join the Gamecock football team in Orlando for the Capital One Bowl. In the 30-13 South Carolina victory over Nebraska in the Jan. 2 bowl game, Ellington collected 73 yards on kick off returns, including a long of 45 yards. During the football season, Ellington posted 780 all purpose yards, including 106 rushing, 211 receiving and 463 yards on kick returns, and he scored two touchdowns. His first career TD came on a 61-yard rush in a Gamecock victory over Kentucky on Oct. 8.

HEAD COACH DARRIN HORN

Darrin Horn is in his fourth season in Columbia with a career record of 170-102, including a 59-54 mark at South Carolina. Darrin Horn-led teams are 79-54 all-time in league play. Horn led Carolina to a 10-6 record in SEC action during his first year in Columbia, a 6-10 mark in his second and one of the youngest teams in the nation to a 5-11 mark in 2011. Horn led Carolina to one of the most celebrated seasons of its 19-year participation in the SEC during the 2009 campaign, as the squad captured the 2009 SEC Eastern Division Co-Championship and won double-digit league games for the first time since the 1998 campaign. His 2010 squad earned upset wins over No. 1 Kentucky and No. 13/19 Vanderbilt.

COOKE PARTICIPATES IN DECEMBER GRADUATION

University of South Carolina redshirt-senior forward Malik Cooke took part in December graduation ceremonies on Dec. 12 at Colonial Life Arena, earning his degree in sociology. Cooke, a native of Charlotte, N.C., joins a list of student-athletes with academic success under head coach Darrin Horn, as every player who has completed his eligibility under Horn, both at South Carolina and Western Kentucky, has earned his degree.

HORN VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

■ Following South Carolina's loss to 12th-ranked Florida on Feb. 2, 2012, South Carolina head coach Darrin Horn holds a 7-22 overall record in his career against ranked opponents. Horn is 6-18 in games against ranked opponents at the helm of the Gamecock program. His victory over Drake and loss to UCLA both came during Western Kentucky's Sweet 16 run in the NCAA Tournament during the 2007-08 season.

LEXINGTON, Ky. - A strong second half wasn't enough for South Carolina to offset a cold shooting effort in the first half as No. 2 Kentucky took the SEC opener for both teams, 79-64, at Rupp Arena on Saturday.

South Carolina (8-7, 0-1 SEC) was led by freshman guard Damien Leonard's 15 points, while freshman forward Anthony Gill tallied 10, senior forward Malik Cooke added 11 and sophomore forward Damontre Harris contributed 10. Gill also pulled down a team-high seven rebounds, while Cooke and sophomore forward RJ Slawson both collected six.

Kentucky's (15-1, 1-0 SEC) Terrence Jones led all scorers with 20 points, while freshman forward Anthony Davis tallied 12 points and 10 rebounds for a double-double. The game was the third this season for South Carolina against an opponent ranked in the top two in the nation, as the Gamecocks also faced then-No. 1 North Carolina and then-No. 2 Ohio State.

South Carolina out-rebounded the Wildcats, 32-30, including a 16-7 advantage on the offensive glass, which led to 15 second-chance points for the Gamecocks. South Carolina's bench contributed 28 points, and the Gamecocks tallied 16 points off of Kentucky turnovers.

Despite a cold shooting effort in the first half, South Carolina collected 10 offensive rebounds in the set. The Gamecocks jumped out to a quick 4-0 lead on a dunk by Harris and layup by Gill, but UK would outscore the Gamecocks 9-3 over the course of the next five minutes to hold a 9-7 lead with 14:38 remaining in the opening half.

With a 21-17 lead, Kentucky ended the first half on a 13-1 run to push the advantage into double digits at 34-18 at the halftime break. South Carolina hit just 25 percent from the floor (8-32) in the first half.

The Gamecocks found an offensive rhythm in the second half, eventually holding a 46-45 advantage during the set, hitting 53.1 percent (17-32). Leonard scored all but three of his points in the half, connecting on four shots, including two 3s and a pair of free throws.

Kentucky lengthened its lead to open the half, but Slawson hit a 3 with 11:58 on the clock, and Leonard added two from 3-point range over the course of the next two minutes to pull the Gamecocks within 13 at 58-45.

UK's Kidd-Gilchrist would add a dunk and two free throws, but a 3 by sophomore guard Bruce Ellington and a jumper by Leonard pulled the Gamecocks within 12 with just under eight minutes remaining in the contest.

The Gamecocks followed with a turnover and missed shots, which allowed the Wildcats to hold the lead and close the 79-64 victory.

NON-CONFERENCE SCHEDULE

Contests against at least five teams that competed in the 2011 NCAA Tournament highlight the 2011-12 South Carolina men's basketball non-conference schedule. South Carolina will host 11 non-conference contests at Colonial Life Arena, including one exhibition, the first two rounds of the Las Vegas Invitational, Providence in the Big East/SEC Challenge and Big Ten powerhouse Ohio State. The Gamecocks will face at least six teams that compiled 18 or more wins last season, including North Carolina, Southern California or UNLV, Clemson, Ohio State and Wofford, which all advanced to the NCAA Tournament. South Carolina is slated to face five BCS schools during the coming non-conference portion of the schedule.

2012 SEC TOURNAMENT

The 2012 SEC Tournament returns to New Orleans, La., next spring, marking the third time the city has hosted the event. It will be the first time the tournament will be held at the New Orleans Arena. The SEC Basketball Tournament semifinals and championship game will be televised nationally on ABC, while the first two rounds of the event will be televised on the SEC Network.

SEC DIVISIONAL PLAY

Starting with the 2011-12 season, this year marks the first time there will not be an East/West Division champion since the conference split into two divisions in 1992. The regular season standings will be listed from one through 12. This season the schedule will still reflect the divisions of years past, as South Carolina will still play the five schools who were also in the East - Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Tennessee and Vanderbilt - twice, while playing the former West schools - Alabama, Arkansas, Auburn, LSU, Ole Miss and Mississippi State - once during the regular season.





GAME 1 - SOUTH CAROLINA, 75, WESTERN CAROLINA 50 Columbia, S.C. - Nov. 11, 2011

COLUMBIA, S.C. - Freshman Anthony Gill and sophomore Brenton Williams scored 14 and 13 points, respectively, to lead the South Carolina men's basketball team to a season-opening 75-50 victory over Western Carolina on Friday night at Colonial Life Arena.

Gill was 6-of-7 from the floor, including 1-for-1 from 3-point range, while Williams was 5-for-8 on the night. Williams also led a solid defensive effort, collecting five of the Gamecocks' 11 steals. Senior Malik Cooke added 10 points and seven rebounds, and junior Lakeem Jackson filled the stat sheet with five points, five assists, 10 rebounds and three steals.

With the win, the Gamecocks (1-0) claim their 11th straight season opener, including a 4-0 mark under head coach Darrin Horn.

South Carolina dominated nearly every statistical category as it shot 50.8 percent from the floor (30-of-59) and held the Catamounts to 36.2 percent shooting (17-of-47). The Gamecocks also held a decisive advantage in points in the paint (46-18), second chance points (20-9), bench points (38-16) and points off turnovers (22-15) and they controlled the boards with a 37-29 edge, including 18 offensive boards.

The Gamecocks used their defensive pressure to break an 8-8 tie early on with an 8-0 run, including six straight points off turnovers. Williams made a transition layup off a steal by Brian Richardson to cap the run and give South Carolina a 16-8 lead at the 10:40 mark.

Western Carolina (0-1) scrapped back with back-to-back 3-pointers and a dunk by Brandon Boggs to knot the game at 16-16, but South Carolina scored the next nine points to build a lead it would not relinquish. Williams gave the Gamecocks their biggest lead of the half at 33-22 by converting a layup off a steal by Jackson, one of five South Carolina had in the half. Williams, who paced the Gamecocks with 11 points in the half, sank a pair of free throws with less than a minute remaining to give South Carolina a 35-25 advantage heading into the locker room.

The Gamecocks outscored Western Carolina 40-25 in the second half as they held the Catamounts to just 32 percent shooting. Gill drained a 3-pointer at the 17:00 mark to give South Carolina a 43-29 lead. After Boggs knocked down a jumper to trim the Gamecocks' lead to 43-33 with 15:06 remaining, South Carolina outscored Western Carolina 26-10 over the next 10 minutes to pull away for the win.

Sophomore Eric Smith chipped in a career-high nine points and four assists for the Gamecocks.

Trey Sumler and Harouna Mutombo netted 11 points apiece to lead Western Carolina.

ELON, N.C. - The South Carolina men's basketball team (1-1) suffered a 58-53 non-conference loss at Elon (1-1) on Tuesday. Freshman forward Anthony Gill and senior Malik Cooke led the Gamecocks with nine points each.

The team's combined for 42 fouls in the game, with the Gamecocks called for 24 and Elon 18.

South Carolina shot just 31.3 percent (20-64) in the contest, including an 11.1 percent (3-27) mark from 3-point range.

Elon was led by Lucas Troutman with 16 points on 5-of-8 shooting from the field and a 6-of-6 effort from the free throw line. Freshman guard Austin Hamilton chipped in 12 points and two assists.

Back and forth play was the story of the first part of the opening half. Two Troutman free throws gave Elon a 13-10 lead with 10:52 remaining in the first half.

The teams traded layups to follow, before consecutive dunks by sophomore guard Brian Richardson followed by a jumper by sophomore guard Eric Smith gave the Gamecocks their first lead of the game at 20-19 with just over four minutes remaining before halftime.

Elon regained the lead on two Kevin Blake free throws at the 3:52 mark and the Phoenix capitalized during the final minutes of the half to hold an 11-point lead at 34-23 at the break.

South Carolina used a 15-6 run through the first eight minutes of the second half to pull within two at 40-38. Foul trouble plagued the Gamecocks during the later portion of the contest, however, as both Cooke and junior guard Lakeem Jackson fouled out of the game.

Elon held the lead for the remainder of the second half and Ryley Beaumont hit four free throws with under 30 seconds remaining to close the win for the Phoenix.

COLUMBIA, S.C. - The South Carolina Gamecocks (1-2) suffered a 64-63 defeat against Tennessee State (2-2) on Sunday night at Colonial Life Arena competing in the Continental Tire Las Vegas Invitational. Sophomore guard Eric Smith led the Gamecocks with 18 points, doubling a career high.

Tennessee State started a run as the game passed the 10-minute mark and held a 15-9 lead with just over eight minutes left in the opening half. Carolina gained new life 30 seconds later after senior Malik Cooke poked the ball free from a Tiger guard and Lakeem Jackson collected the loose ball to take it down the floor and slam home a two-handed dunk.

Tennessee State's Robert Covington would hit a 3 at the other end, but Cooke would follow with a free throw and Damien Leonard hit a 3 from the corner to pull the Gamecocks to within three points of the Tigers with 5:31 left in the stanza. Following the under-four minute media timeout, Tennessee State's Jordan Cyphers buried two 3s and added three free throws, as the Tigers took a 33-19 lead into the locker room at halftime.

Sophomore forward Damontre Harris would convert a three-point play and Smith would hit a pair of 3s from the left wing to bring the Garnet and Black scratching back in the second half. With 10:07 left, Smith drove to the hole and dished a pass to RJ Slawson who finished the possession with a layup to near the score at 49-38.

The Tigers took a timeout to halt the momentum, but the Gamecocks' run wasn't over, as right off the break solid defense set up Cooke for a mid-range jumper followed by a 3 from the wing to pull within six points of the Tiger lead with 8:46 remaining

Following the under-eight minute media timeout, Carolina pressed the Tigers off the break and Slawson came up with a steal at mid-court to set up a deep 3 from Smith at the top of the key to pull the Gamecocks to within two points with 7:20 left on the clock.

With 3:17 remaining, Tennessee State's Wil Peters hit a 3 to push the lead to 63-56 Tigers, but Smith would respond with two more 3s to pull the lead back to two with 1:19 remaining in the contest.

A steal by Leonard gave the ball to Carolina with under a minute left. Slawson would be fouled under the basket with a chance to tie, as the score stood at 64-62 with seven seconds remaining. Slawson would hit one of the two attempts from the line, and the Tigers would miss the front end of a bonus shot from the line at the other end, but Tennessee State held on to earn the 64-63 win.

The Gamecocks held the advantage in the paint, outscoring the Tigers 24-14 and holding the rebounding advantage by a mark of 33-28

Smith posted a career high with 18 points, while Jackson would add 12, and Cooke and Slawson contributed 10 apiece.

COLUMBIA, S.C. - The South Carolina Gamecocks (2-2) rallied for a 61-57 victory over Mississippi Valley State (0-4) on Tuesday night at Colonial Life Arena competing in the second game of the Continental Tire Las Vegas Invitational. Se-nior forward Malik Cooke led the Gamecocks with 18 points, and freshman guard Damien Leonard scored a career-high 16 points for the Gamecocks. Freshman forward Anthony Gill corralled a game-leading seven rebounds, and redshirt freshman Carlton Geathers blocked a career high three shots.

Mississippi Valley State was led by junior guard Terrance Joyner with 22 points and senior forward Falando Jones who tallied 11 points in the contest. The Delta Devil's senior guard Cor-J Cox pulled down a game-leading seven rebounds. Senior center Paul Crosby and freshman guard Luca Pajkovic added six boards for MVSU.

After giving up the first basket to Mississippi Valley State, the Gamecocks went on a 23-7 run to start the game. Leonard led the charge during the Gamecocks' surge with 12 points on a 4-of-5 performance from behind the arc. The run gave the Gamecocks a 14-point lead, their largest of the game, at the 8:16 mark in the first half.

Mississippi Valley State found a rhythm and went on a run of their own. The Delta Devils outscored the Gamecocks 14 to 5 over the last 6:59 of the first half to pull within four points at the break. Geathers blocked Amos Studivant's jumper in the lane that would have tied the game at 28. Cooke was fouled on the subsequent rebound and knocked down two free throws with 21 seconds left in the half to give the Gamecocks a 30-26 advantage at the break.

Mississippi Valley State took the lead early coming out of the locker room on back-to-back transition layups to begin the second half by Kevin Burwell and Terrance Joyner. Joyner drew sophomore forward Damontre Harris' third foul and converted a three-point play that gave the Delta Devils a 31-30 lead, their first lead of the game since the opening basket.

South Carolina, who had begun to chip away at the MVSU lead since the 6:36 mark in the second half, then began a feverish comeback that was ignited by the Gamecocks defense. Sophomore forward R.J. Slawson stole the ball at midcourt due to the South Carolina press. Sophomore guard Eric Smith drained a three-pointer, which was assisted by Slawson on a crosscourt pass, to cut the lead to five at 48-53 with 3:19 remaining. South Carolina continued to apply the press and forced another turnover, which resulted in two Leonard free throws to bring the Gamecocks to within three. A third consecutive steal, this time on an inbounds pass created a Leonard fast break layup to cut the MVSU lead to one at 52-53.

Gill drew a charge on Crosby to give the Gamecocks a chance to take the lead. Slawson drained a jumper with just 2:00 minutes remaining to take the lead at 54-53. Cooke put back a Slawson miss to extend the Gamecocks' lead to three Cooke collected a loose ball and hit two free throws to make the score 58-53 with 55.7 to go in the game.

The Delta Devils cut the Gamecocks' lead to one at a score of 58-57 on shots by Cox and freshman guard Brent Arrington with just 24 seconds remaining, but Cooke extended the Gamecock lead to 61-57 on two trips to the line.

LAS VEGAS - The South Carolina men's basketball team (2-4) suffered a 63-60 loss to Southern California (3-4) in the final round of the Continental Tire Las Vegas Invitational at the Orleans Arena on Saturday night in Las Vegas. COLUMBIA, S.C. - Despite a late rally, South Carolina (2-5) could not overcome a 14-point deficit and suffered a 76-67 defeat to Providence (6-2) at Colonial Life Arena on Thursday night as a part of the Big East/SEC Challenge. Senior forward Malik Cooke led the Gamecock offense, shooting 8-of-12 from the field and scoring a season-high 21 points. Sophomore guard Eric Smith also added 16 points.

Sophomore forward R.J. Slawson's eight rebounds paced South Carolina in holding a 40-34 advantage in the rebounding category, and freshman forward Carlton Geathers tied a career-high with three blocks on the night.

Providence would maintain the lead though near the end of the half and went into the break leading the game 34-27.

Carolina would fight back in the second half with a 7-0 run started by a Lakeem Jackson dunk with 11:50 left to play. Cooke would follow with two free throws and sophomore guard Brian Richardson capped off the run with a three-point play to make the game 51-47 Friars with 8:58 left to go.

Providence answered with a pair of free throws by Gerard Coleman and staved off the Gamecock rally to open their lead back up to 10 with five and a half minutes left.

South Carolina staged a late comeback as Cooke hit his third 3 of the night and sophomore Bruce Ellington finished off an acrobatic layup with 3:34 remaining. Cooke would hit another jumper to cut the Friar lead to seven, but Providence would answer with solid free throw shooting to close out the game

GAME 8 - SOUTH CAROLINA 58, CLEMSON 55 CLEMSON, S.C. - DEC. 4, 2011

CLEMSON, S.C. - Malik Cooke hit two free throws with 6.7 seconds remaining to seal a 58-55 South Carolina victory over Clemson on Sunday at Littlejohn Coliseum. The Gamecocks improve to 3-5 on the year, while Clemson falls to 4-3. The victory was South Carolina's first at Clemson since the 2003 campaign, while it was Carolina's second straight victory over the Tigers.

Sophomore forward Damontre Harris contributed 10 points, six rebounds and a career-high five blocks to pace the Gamecocks, and Cooke sealed the win with two free throws in the final seven seconds en route to six points, eight rebounds and four steals in the game. In just his second game back with the basketball team, sophomore guard Bruce Ellington contributed nine points, including two key free throws with 13 seconds remaining

Both teams traded baskets to start the contest before Clemson extended its lead to 22-16 with 8:31 remaining in the opening half. Sophomore guard Eric Smith responded for Carolina with a driving layup, but Clemson's Andre Young connected on a 3 for a 25-18 Tiger advantage with 5:44 on the clock.

Both team's had their offensive chances the remainder of the half. Young hit a layup, and a 3 by Tanner Smith pushed the Tiger lead to 35-25 with just seconds remaining before halftime, but Ellington stepped to the 3-point line and hit a jumper with 1.9 seconds on the clock to pull the Gamecocks within seven at the break, 35-28.

Both teams started slow on the offensive end to open the second half. Junior forward Lakeem Jackson hit a bank shot with 18:42 on the clock and Cooke connected on a jumper 30 seconds later, as the Tiger lead was just three points at the 16-minute mark.

A putback by Harris with 4:36 on the clock knotted the score at 47-47, before a layup by freshman forward Anthony Gill with just over three minutes remaining gave the Gamecocks a 49-47 advantage

Clemson responded to tie the score at 49 before Gill gave the Gamecocks a 52-49 advantage on a 3 from the wing with 1:19 on the clock.

Clemson's Devin Booker made two free throws to pull within one at 52-51 with 58.1 on the clock, before Smith hit a crucial shot for the Gamecocks, connecting on a jumper assisted by Ellington with 25.9 seconds remaining, pushing the Carolina advantage to 54-51.

Ellington and Cooke both connected on free throw opportunities down the stretch, and Clemson's Smith was unable to tie the score on three free throw attempts, as the Gamecock earned the 58-55 victory.

COLUMBIA, S.C. - Bruce Ellington tallied a season high 15 points to lead South Carolina (4-5) to its second straight win with a 66-58 victory over Presbyterian (4-5) Tuesday night at the Colonial Life Arena.

COLUMBIA, S.C - South Carolina gave No. 2/2 Ohio State a scare, but the Buckeyes were able to hold on late for a 74-66 win Saturday afternoon at Colonial Life Arena. Ohio State improves to 10-1, and South Carolina falls to 4-6.

Ohio State's Deshaun Thomas posted a career-high 30 points in the absence of Jared Sullinger to lead the Buckeyes to their smallest margin of victory against an unranked opponent. William Buford added 17 points, and Lenzelle Smith Jr. had nine points and nine rebounds for the Buckeyes.

Malik Cooke hit a season-high 21 points and added three assists and two steals for South Carolina. Anthony Gill contributed 11 points and a team-high four rebounds.

Ohio State only got six minutes out of Sullinger, the Preseason Player of the Year who left the court in the first half after injuring his foot. The sophomore had three points, two rebounds and a block before leaving the building on crutches.

The Gamecocks took a 33-29 lead into the half courtesy of Cooke's 10 points and an all-around effort that saw eight players score in the half. The Buckeyes jumped out to a seven-point lead midway through the opening half before the Gamecocks evened the score at 22 with a 3-pointer by Eric Smith with five minutes remaining in the period.

South Carolina took its first lead at 27-26 when Damien Leonard popped a 3-pointer from the baseline, and the team solidified the halftime advantage with Damontre Harris and Cooke scoring the final four points of the half.

Two minutes into the second half, Cooke left the game with an injury, and the Buckeyes took advantage with a 17-6 run to reclaim the lead and momentum before Cooke returned with 12 minutes to go in the game.

Ohio State pushed its advantage to as many as 13 points in the final five minutes before the Gamecocks fought back in the closing minutes. Trailing 73-66 with 32 seconds remaining, South Carolina had an opportunity to turn it into a two-possession game, but Ohio State forced a turnover and hit a free throw to seal the victory.

GAME 13 - SOUTH CAROLINA 72, USC UPSTATE 66 COLUMBIA, S.C. - DEC. 31, 2011

COLUMBIA, S.C. - Malik Cooke had his first double-double of the season and scored a careerhigh 24 points as South Carolina held on to defeat USC Upstate, 72-66, Saturday afternoon in New Years Eve action at the Colonial Life Arena. The win improves the Gamecocks to 7-6 heading into 2012, and the Spartans, in the midst of a seven-game road trip, fall to 8-6.

Cooke added a season-high 10 rebounds to his 24 points and also added three assists to give the Gamecocks three straight wins to close out 2011. It was his second double-double as a Gamecock after transferring from Nevada, besting his 11-point, 11-rebound effort against Arkansas on January 19, 2011.

Sophomore guard Brenton Williams hit double-digits for the first time since the season opener, adding 11 points for the Gamecocks off the back of an 8-for-8 effort from the free throw line. R.J. Slawson continued his strong form with 10 points and eight rebounds on the day. As a team, South Carolina shot 51.1 percent from the field, topping the .500 mark for the third time this season.

The teams traded baskets to start the game with USC Upstate leading 12-11 six minutes in before the Gamecocks raced out on a 15-4 run to put distance between the two teams. The Spartans were not able to cut the deficit for the remainder of the half with the Gamecocks leading by as many as 12 points before taking a 40-31 advantage into the break.

Upstate reclaimed the lead at 47-46 with 12:58 remaining in the game amidst a rash of Gamecock turnovers and missed outside shots. The Gamecocks quickly took the lead back with a pair of free throws by Cooke, and the team never relinquished the lead again. South Carolina stretched its lead to as many as seven points with three minutes remaining, but the Spartans mounted comebacks each time the lead threatened to swell.

After a free throw cut Carolina's lead to two, a tip-in by Damontre Harris with 25 seconds remaining put the Gamecocks ahead 70-66. South Carolina sealed the victory after the Spartans missed a 3-point attempt on their next possession that Cooke rebounded to secure the double-double

COLUMBIA, S.C - South Carolina continued its dominance over in-state foe South Carolina State with a season high 79 points in a 79-51 victory Tuesday night at the Colonial Life Arena. The Gamecocks (8-6) improve to 18-0 alltime against the Bulldogs (4-10) and conclude non-conference play with four straight victories.

All 12 Gamecocks to play in the game scored with Malik Cooke and Damontre Harris leading the team with 11 points each. For the second straight game, RJ Slawson came slightly short of a double-double with his nine-point, ninerebound effort to go along with career highs of three assists and three steals.

S.C. State freshman Luka Radovic led all scorers with 15 points, but the Gamecocks were able to limit the Bulldogs to 34.6 percent from the field, marking the best defensive effort of the season.

South Carolina raced out to a guick 20-point lead and never looked back. The Gamecocks used balanced scoring in the first half with seven players scoring at least four points and none hitting double-digits as the team coasted to a 45-23 halftime lead on the back of a 58.6 percent shooting effort. The team went 7-of-13 from beyond the arc, the most 3-pointers made in a single half this season, and scored 20 more points in the paint.

The Bulldogs never came closer than 18 points for the remainder of the game as South Carolina stretched its lead to as many as 30 with a 78-48 lead in the final two minutes of the game.

GAME 15 - SOUTH CAROLINA 64, #2 KENTUCKY 79 Lexington, Ky. - Jan. 7, 2012

LEXINGTON, Ky. - A strong second half wasn't enough for South Carolina to offset a cold shooting effort in the first half as No. 2 Kentucky took the SEC opener for both teams, 79-64, at Rupp Arena on Saturday.

South Carolina (8-7, 0-1 SEC) was led by freshman guard Damien Leonard's 15 points, while freshman forward Anthony Gill tallied 10, senior forward Malik Cooke added 11 and sophomore forward Damontre Harris contributed 10. Gill also pulled down a team-high seven rebounds, while Cooke and sophomore forward RJ Slawson both collected six.

Kentucky's (15-1, 1-0 SEC) Terrence Jones led all scorers with 20 points, while freshman forward Anthony Davis tallied 12 points and 10 rebounds for a double-double. The game was the third this season for South Carolina against an opponent ranked in the top two in the nation, as the Gamecocks also faced then-No. 1 North Carolina and then-No. 2 Ohio State.

South Carolina out-rebounded the Wildcats, 32-30, including a 16-7 advantage on the offensive glass, which led to 15 second-chance points for the Gamecocks. South Carolina's bench contributed 28 points, and the Gamecocks tallied 16 points off of Kentucky turnovers.

Despite a cold shooting effort in the first half, South Carolina collected 10 offensive rebounds in the set. The Gamecocks jumped out to a quick 4-0 lead on a dunk by Harris and layup by Gill, but UK would outscore the Gamecocks 9-3 over the course of the next five minutes to hold a 9-7 lead with 14:38 remaining in the opening half.

With a 21-17 lead, Kentucky ended the first half on a 13-1 run to push the advantage into double digits at 34-18 at the halftime break. South Carolina hit just 25 percent from the floor (8-32) in the first half.

The Gamecocks found an offensive rhythm in the second half, eventually holding a 46-45 advantage during the set, hitting 53.1 percent (17-32). Leonard scored all but three of his points in the half, connecting on four shots, including two 3s and a pair of free throws.

Kentucky lengthened its lead to open the half, but Slawson hit a 3 with 11:58 on the clock, and Leonard added two from 3-point range over the course of the next two minutes to pull the Gamecocks within 13 at 58-45.

UK's Kidd-Gilchrist would add a dunk and two free throws, but a 3 by sophomore guard Bruce Ellington and a jumper by Leonard pulled the Gamecocks within 12 with just under eight minutes remaining in the contest.

The Gamecocks followed with a turnover and missed shots, which allowed the Wildcats to hold the lead and close the 79-64 victory.

COLUMBIA, S.C. - South Carolina sophomore Damontre Harris earned his first career double-double, but it wasn't enough to offset a cold first half from the field for the Gamecocks as South Carolina (8-8, 0-2 SEC) dropped a 67-57 decision to Vanderbilt (12-4, 2-0 SEC) Tuesday at Colonial Life Arena.

GAME 18 - SOUTH CAROLINA 52, AUBURN 63 Auburn, Ala. - Jan.21, 3012

AUBURN, Ala. - The South Carolina men's basketball team suffered a 63-52 loss at Auburn on Saturday in SEC action. South Carolina falls to 8-10, 0-4 SEC, while Auburn improves to 12-7, 2-3 in conference play.

Freshman forward Anthony Gill and sophomore guard Bruce Ellington led the Gamecocks with nine points each, while sophomore forward Damontre Harris contributed six points, a team high seven rebounds and a career high six blocks.

The Gamecocks shot 40.8 percent overall in the game, hitting 20-of-49 attempts, while Auburn hit 44 percent (22-50) of its attempts. Junior guard Frankie Sullivan led the Tigers with a game high 22 points, while senior forward Kenny Gabriel added 16 and four blocks.

Turnovers plagued the Gamecocks in the contest, as the squad committed 23 against just 14 by Auburn. The Tigers scored 28 points off of turnovers in the contest.

South Carolina was down 6-2 early in the opening half, but battled back with just under 11 minutes remaining before halftime to take a14-12 lead on a 3 by freshman guard Damien Leonard. The team's traded baskets through the middle part of the set, before the Gamecocks extended their lead to 26-21 on a layup by Ellington with 1:37 remaining.

Sullivan sank a 3 with 21 seconds remaining before half, but RJ Slawson answered for South Carolina on the opposite end, hitting a jumper as time expired to send Carolina into the locker room with a 28-24 advantage at the half.

Sullivan hit two free throws to open the second half, before South Carolina freshman forward Anthony Gill, who played just eight minutes in the first half due to foul trouble, followed with a layup to push the score to 30-26 South Carolina with 18:54 remaining.

Gabriel scored the next six Auburn points over the next four minutes, as the Tigers regained the lead at 32-30 with 15:42 on the clock. Auburn would never give up the lead the remainder of the half and the Tigers outscored the Gamecocks 39-24 in the set to close the 63-52 victory.

GAME 19 - SOUTH CAROLINA 56, ALABAMA 54

COLUMBIA, S.C. - JAN. 25, 2012

COLUMBIA, S.C.. - The South Carolina men's basketball team earned their first conference victory of the season over Alabama, 56-54, in SEC action on Wednesday night at Colonial Life Arena. The grinding game featured 13 ties and 11 lead changes. The final lead change occurred when Bruce Ellington broke a 54-54 tie on a driving layup with one second to go to give the Gamecocks the win.

The Gamecocks (9-10, 1-4) were led by three players in double figures. Senior forward Malik Cooke netted 18 points and pulled in five rebounds. Sophomore guard Bruce Ellington and sophomore forward Damontre Harris both added 12 points to the winning effort. Freshman forward Anthony Gill tied a season and career high with nine rebounds. Sophomore forward R.J. Slawson also grabbed nine boards.

The Crimson Tide (13-7, 2-4) also had three players in double figures - freshman guard Levi Randolph with 12, junior forward Tony Mitchell with 11, and freshman forward Nick Jacobs with 10. Mitchell came down with 8 rebounds, as did junior guard Andrew Steele.

Alabama rushed out to an early 5-0 lead, but Cooke scored the next eight points to give South Carolina an early 8-5 lead. After gaining the upper hand, the Gamecocks stayed ahead for a long stretch of the first half. Twice, the Gamecocks built a lead of four during the middle stretch, one time after back-to-back Ellington three pointers, but could not pull ahead by more. The close action saw the lead change three times in the last 4:19 of the first half. The first time, Alabama's Randolph drained a three pointer to make the score 24-23. Ellington reclaimed the advantage for the Gamecocks with a driving layup and Cooke extended the margin to three with a pair of free throws. The final lead change gave the Crimson Tide a 29-27 advantage going into the locker room after another Randolph three-pointer and two free throws by Green.

The second half featured more back and forth action. Again with neither team able to build a lead. Again, the Gamecocks built a four point margin, but could not pull away. Throughout the game, Alabama made an effort to work the shot clock down to the final seconds on many possessions.

After scoring only two points after his initial run to begin the game, Cooke went on another offensive burst scoring three straight South Carolina baskets midway through the second half.

The pivotal play occurred with under a minute to play and the score knotted at 54 apiece. Ellington tipped the ball away from Alabama and to Cooke with 26 seconds remaining to set up a shot to take the lead. Ellington drove to the basket and laid the ball in with one second on the clock to put the Gamecocks up 56-54. Alabama got the ball to senior forward JaMychal Green on the inbounds pass, but his jumper fell short at the buzzer.

GAME 20 - SOUTH CAROLINA 62, OLE MISS 66

<u>OXFORD, MISS. - JAN. 28, 2012</u>

OXFORD, **Miss.** - The South Carolina men's basketball team suffered a 66-62 loss at Ole Miss on Saturday in SEC action. Senior forward Malik Cooke led the Gamecocks with 17 points, while sophomore guard Brenton Williams added 15.

South Carolina (9-11, 1-5 SEC) hit 40 percent (24-60) of its shot attempts in the contest, including eight made 3s in the game. Ole Miss (14-7, 4-3 SEC) hit 49 percent (24-49) from the field, but struggled from the free throw line, hitting just 13-of-24 attempts (54.2%).

South Carolina forced 18 Rebel turnovers, collecting 12 steals and posting 19 points off of takeaways. To compare, Ole Miss scored 16 points off of 13 Gamecock turnovers in the contest. Ole Miss held a 38-28 upperhand in rebounds as well.

Senior forward Terrance Henry led the Rebels with 15 points, including a 6-of-6 effort from the free throw line, while junior forward Murphy Holloway collected a double-double with 14 points and 11 rebounds, while also collecting a team high three steals.

After trading baskets to start the contest, Ole Miss took an 18-9 lead on a layup by Demarco Cox with 10:19 remaining in the first half. The Rebels extended their lead to as many as 11 before the Gamecocks used a 15-7 run over the last 7:25 to pull within three at halftime. A 3 by Williams began the run, which included two layups by freshman forward Anthony Gill and a 3 from sophomore guard Bruce Ellington.

Both teams committed nine turnovers in the opening half, with the Gamecocks dishing eight assists, including three from freshman guard Damien Leonard, while Ole Miss collected eight steals with the Gamecocks earning five.

South Carolina took its first lead since early in the contest less than a minute into the second half on a layup by Cooke. The teams would trade possessions through the under-16 minute media timeout before the Rebels would extend a lead to six at 43-37 on a made jumper by Nick Williams with 15:17 remaining.

The Gamecocks would battle back to take a one-point lead using an 8-1 run over the course of the next two minutes on a 3 by Cooke and a layup and 3 by Williams, but solid free throw shooting down the stretch gave the Rebels a lead they wouldn't give up the remainder of the game.

Neither team led by more than seven points in the second half. Two free throws by Williams put the Gamecocks behind by one point, 63-62, but a 3 by Henry with 17.5 seconds remaining sealed the game for the Rebels.

Cooke collected a team high seven rebounds for Carolina, while he and Williams both collected three steals. Gill tallied 10 points, two assists and two steals, and Ellington dished a season high five assists.

GAINESVILLE, Fla. - The Gamecocks pulled within six points, but solid free throw shooting down the stretch saw No. 12/11 Florida escape with a 74-66 win in SEC action at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center in Gainesville on Thursday night. The Gamecocks fall to 9-12, 1-6 SEC with the loss, while Florida improves to 18-4, 6-1 in league play.

The Gators held a five-point advantage at the under-16 minute media timeout and extended their lead to 10 points at 18-8 with 13:16 remaining. The Gamecocks continued to battle, as Harris was solid from the free throw line, and Cooke hit back-to-back jumpers late in the half.

Florida's Beal hit the only Gator point in the final minutes of the half on a free throw with 57 seconds remaining on the clock, and a layup by RJ Slawson at the buzzer put the score at 37-28 Florida at the break.

The teams traded baskets through the first part of the second half before the Gators took a timeout with 10:53 remaining after a 7-2 South Carolina run over the previous 3:23.

The Florida lead hovered around 10 points midway through the half. A layup by Cooke with 6:43 remaining pulled the Gamecocks within eight at 54-46. Following a missed 3 by Cooke, a tip-in by Gill saw the Gator lead at just six with 4:11 remaining.

Twice in the final three minutes the Gamecocks pulled within six. After a layup by Boynton with 55 seconds on the clock, sophomore guard Brenton Williams sank a 3 from the near corner for Carolina to bring the score to 67-62, but solid free throw shooting in the final minute by Florida saw the Gators escape with the 74-66 victory.




