A South Carolina win over Miami would...

• Extend the Gamecocks' bowl winning streak to a school-record four-straight games. The Gamecocks have won each of their last three bowl games. They also won three-straight bowl games from 1995-2002.

• Give the Gamecocks a winning record for a school-record seventh-consecutive season and at least a .500 record for a school-record 11th-consecutive season.

◆ Snap the Gamecocks' six-game losing streak to Miami. The Gamecocks last win over Miami came by an 8-0 score in 1947.

SETTING THE STAGE: The South Carolina Gamecocks (6-6, 3-5 SEC) face the Miami Hurricanes (6-6, 3-5 ACC) in the 2014 Duck Commander Independence Bowl in Shreveport, La. on Saturday, December 27. Kickoff is set for 3:30 p.m. Eastern, 2:30 p.m. in Shreveport. The game will be televised nationally on ABC with Dave Neal and Andre Ware in the booth and Laura Rutledge on the sidelines. Eli Gold and Charles Arbuckle have the national radio call for Sports USA. Todd Ellis and Tommy Suggs handle the call for the Gamecock Radio Network and WNKT in Columbia with Langston Moore on the sidelines.

A LITTLE HISTORY: 2014 marked the 121st season of intercollegiate football at the University of South Carolina, dating back to 1892. It is the 108th-consecutive year in which South Carolina has competed on the gridiron. The University did not field a team in either 1893 or 1906. Carolina owns an all-time record of 582-553-44. The Gamecocks were nine games under .500 until head coach Steve Spurrier took the reins in 2005, but are 38 games over since that time.

SEC HISTORY: 2014 marked South Carolina's 23rd year in the Southeastern Conference. South Carolina and Arkansas joined the league prior to the 1992 campaign. The Gamecocks earned their first SEC Eastern Division title in the 2010 season. Carolina was 37-66-1 (.361) in SEC action from 1992-2004, but is 44-36 (.550) in conference play since Coach Spurrier took the reins, including a 21-11 (.656) mark since 2011.

SENIOR SALUTE: Seventeen seniors will be playing in their final game for the Garnet & Black. The list includes: Rory Anderson, Damiere Byrd, A.J. Cann, Ryland Culbertson, Jordan Diaz, Patrick Fish, Cody Gibson, Sharrod Golightly, Tyler Hull, Nick Jones, Kadetrix Marcus, Connor McLaurin, Sidney Rhodes, Corey Robinson, J.T Surratt, Dylan Thompson and Brison Williams. GOING BOWLING: The 2014 Duck Commander Independence Bowl marks Carolina's 20th bowl appearance. The Gamecocks are 7-12 all-time in bowl games. They dropped their first eight bowl games, won three straight, lost four of the next five but now have won each of their last three bowl appearances. GAMECOCKS AND CANES: South Carolina and Miami have met 15 times on the gridiron with the Hurricanes holding an 8-5-2 advantage in the all-time series. The Cames are 7-4-2 against Carolina in Miami, while the teams split the two games in Columbia. Miami has won each of the last six meetings, but the teams have not met since 1987 and have competed just twice since 1960. The teams first met in 1936. South Carolina's last win was by an 8-0 score in 1947.

THE HBC VS. MIAMI: South Carolina head coach Steve Spurrier has faced Miami just once in his career, which also happened to come in a bowl game. Second-ranked Miami, coached by Butch Davis, defeated Coach Spurrier's 2000 Florida Gator squad, ranked seventh in the country, by a 37-27 score in the 2001 Sugar Bowl.

NON-CONFERENCE WINS: South Carolina had its 18-game non-conference winning streak snapped in the 2014 regular season finale at Clemson. Prior to that loss, Carolina's last non-conference loss came to Florida State in the 2010 Chick-fil-A Bowl. Between the two losses they defeated East Carolina (three times), Navy, The Citadel, Clemson (three times), Nebraska, UAB, Wofford, Michigan, North Carolina, UCF, Coastal Carolina, Wisconsin, Furman and South Alabama.

CAROLINA VS. THE ACC: South Carolina has won four of its last five and seven of its last nine games against teams from the Atlantic Coast Conference.

BEEN HERE BEFORE: The Gamecocks played in the 2005 Independence Bowl, falling to Missouri by a 38-31 score, capping Steve Spurrier's first season in Columbia. Carolina opened up a 21-0 lead after the first quarter, but Brad Smith led the Tigers to the come-from-behind win. **Sidney Rice** finished with 12 catches for 191 yards.

MAKING A POINT: The Gamecocks have scored 400 points in a season for a third-straight year and for the fourth time in the last five years. They would need to put up 44 points in the bowl game to become the highest scoring team in school history. The school record for points per game is 36.5, set in 1995 in an 11-game season (401 to-tal points). Here are Carolina's yearly points and points per game under Steve Spurrier:

THROWIN' IN THE WIND: Dylan Thompson has taken most every meaningful snap this season. Thompson, a 6-3, 218-pounder from Boiling Springs, S.C., waited patiently for his turn behind Connor Shaw, the winningest quarterback in school history. Thompson, who proposed marriage to his girlfriend at midfield in August, is 9-6 as a starter, is one of only 13 players in school history to throw for over 3,000 yards, one of only 10 players to throw for over 4,000 yards and one of only eight players to throw for over 5,000 yards. He has thrown for over 300 yards in a game five times and has thrown three or more TD passes in a game four times. He ranks eighth in school history in career passing yards and is tied for fifth with 38 career touchdown passes.

THOMPSON IN 2014: Dylan Thompson has completed 59.5 percent of his passes this season (248-for-417) for 3,280 yards with 24 touchdowns and 11 interceptions. He ranks first in the SEC and 16th in the country in passing yards per game (273.3), is fourth in the SEC and 32nd in the country in total offense per game (268.9), and his 24 TD passes ranks second in the SEC and 20th in the country. His best game statistically came when he threw for 402 yards, the fifth-best single-game performance in school history, with a school record-tying five touchdown passes at Auburn. He owns two of the top-10 single-game yards passing in school history:

RECORD CAMPAIGN: Dylan Thompson has thrown for a school-record 3,280 yards, breaking Todd Ellis' school record for passing yards in a season. He has matched Connor Shaw's 2014 mark of 24 touchdown passes thrown, tying for second on the single-season list behind Steve Taneyhill's record of 29, set in 1995. He is eighth in the SEC in rushing yards per game at 77.2 and is tied for 11th in touchdowns with 10. He has four 100-yard rushing games this season, posting an 18-carry, 101yard, 2 TD effort against East Carolina, carrying 22 times for 104 yards and a score against Missouri, going for a career-high 183 yards on 23 carries with three scores at Kentucky, then rumbling for 111 yards and 2 TDs on 18 carries against Furman. He logged the fourth-most single-season rushing yards in school history last season when he rambled for 1,183 yards with 11 touchdowns. He is the 16th player in school history to rush for more than 2,000 yards in a career. Davis is the younger brother of former Clemson standout James Davis.

FOUR OF A KIND: The Gamecocks feature four wideouts that receive the bulk of the action:

♦ An All-SEC first-team selection as a wide receiver and a second-team pick as an all-purpose back, **Pharoh Cooper** is the Gamecocks' top pass catcher with 60 receptions (5.0/game, fourth in the SEC), for 966 receiving yards (80.5/game, second in the SEC) and eight TDs. He had a breakout game at Vanderbilt, catching 10 passes for 114 yards, surpassed that with a seven-catch, 127-yard, 2 TD effort at Auburn, then went for a career-high 11 receptions for a school record 233 yards and two scores against Tennessee.

◆ Fifth-year senior Nick "Governor Nicky" Jones has been consistent and sometimes overlooked throughout his career. He just has a knack for getting open and catching the ball. He logged his first 100-yard receiving game against Texas A&M, catching five passes for a 113 yards and two scores, including a 69-yard TD reception. He is second on the squad in receptions (39), receiving yards (490) and touchdown receptions (5).

◆ Junior **Shaq Roland** is a former "Mr. Football" in the state of South Carolina, following in the footsteps of Stephon Gilmore, Marcus Lattimore and Jadeveon Clowney. He had a big bowl ame a year ago, posting a career-high 112 receiving yards in the 2014 Capital One Bowl win over Wisconsin. This season, he had a career-high seven catches for 94 yards against East Carolina and has 26 catches for 356 yards and four scores overall.

◆ Senior **Damiere Byrd** (5-9, 170) is the fastest Gamecock. He has nine career receptions of 40 yards or more, including a 46-yard TD catch against Texas A&M, is a three-time CoSIDA Academic All-District selection, is a semifinalist for the Campbell Trophy and was a captain on the Gamecocks' track & field squad. THIS OLD MAN, HE PLAYED ONE: Redshirt junior defensive end Michael Washington not only made his first appearance for the Gamecocks versus Furman, he was tabbed a starter. The oldest player on the team at 27, Washington enlisted in the Marines following high school and logged a tour in Iraq. He has since spent time at USC-Aiken and at South Carolina State, before matriculating to Columbia, where he joined the team as a walk-on in the spring of 2012. He responded in his first action with three assisted tackles and recovered a fumble.

REVOLVING DOOR: Nine players have rotated at the linebacker and Spur positions. Seven different players have made at least one start at the three spots. Skai Moore (9), Marcquis Roberts (5), Jonathan Walton (5), T.J. Holloman (4), and Kaiwan Lewis (1) have started at the Mike and Will linebacker positions, and Sharrod Golightly (10) and Jordan Diggs (2) have each made starts at the Spur position.

THE SKAI'S THE LIMIT: Skai Moore led the Gamecocks in both tackles (56) and interceptions (4) as a true freshman in 2013, despite starting just four games. This season, he leads the team and is ninth in the league in tackles (82), is second on the squad with three interceptions, and was named to Phil Steele's Midseason All-SEC second team. He has led the team in tackles six times with seven stops against East Carolina, a career-best 10 vs. Georgia, nine more tackles at Kentucky, eight at Auburn, nine vs. South Alabama and another 10 at Clemson. He has logged all three of his interceptions in the last two games, picking off two against South Alabama before getting another one at Clemson. He had two picks in last year's Capital One Bowl win over Wisconsin.

LEADER IN THE SECONDARY: Senior Brison Williams is the unquestioned leader in the secondary. The 5-11, 208-pounder has played both safety positions during his Gamecock career and has spent the bulk of the 2014 season at cornerback. He has started 36 games in his career, second on the squad. He has 33 tackles, owns four of the team's 10 interceptions and has a team-high six pass breakups. He turned the Vandy game with his 53-yard interception return for a TD and had another pick-six against South Alabama. His four picks ties for third in the SEC. No Gamecock has had more than four interceptions in a season since Ko Simpson had six in 2004.

THE FRISCO KID: Elliott Fry, a second-team All-SEC selection, missed his only field goal try in the opener against A&M (from 54 yards out) before hitting each of his next 12 attempts. He is 17-for-22 on the season, with two of the Lou Groza semifinalist's misses coming from beyond 50 yards. His 80.0 career field goal percentage (32-of-40) ranks tied for ninth all-time in the SEC. He went 4-for-4 against East Carolina, accounting for 15 points while earning SEC Special Teams Player of the Week honors. He hit a career-long 47-yarder against South Alabama and matched at Clemson. He is tied for third in the SEC with 17 field goals and is fourth in the league in points scored by kicking, averaging 8.2 per game. Fry walked on to the squad last summer and earned the starting placekicking chores. The Frisco, Texas product who also deals with Type 1 diabetes, went 15-for-18 in field goal attempts and hit 54-of-55 extra point attempts for a team-leading 99 points, earning Freshman All-SEC accolades. HULL OF A PUNTER: Senior **Tyler Hull**, who was on the Ray Guy Watch List, handles the punting chores for Carolina for a third-straight season. He averaged 39.4 yards as a sophomore and 37.8 yards as a junior. He is having his best season to date, punting 38 times for a 41.2-yard average.

GOOD HOME COOKIN': The Gamecocks are 22-3 in their last 25 games at Williams-Brice Stadium and 38-6 (.864) in their last 44 home games. The Gamecocks had their school-record 18-game home winning streak snapped in the 2014 season opener. The school's previous longest home winning streak was 15 games, set from 1978-80. The only home losses since the start of the 2009 season have come to top-ranked Florida in 2009, to 17th-ranked Arkansas in 2010 and to defending national champion Auburn in 2011 before the 2014 home losses to Texas A&M, Missouri and Tennessee.

HOME CROWD ADVANTAGE: The Gamecocks have played in front of 12 sellouts in their last 14 home contests. The Gamecocks rank 15th in the nation in home attendance with an average of 81,381 per game, including a season-high 84,232 against Georgia, the fifth-largest crowd to attend a game in Columbia. Three of this year's home crowds have figured in the top-30 all-time at Williams-Brice Stadium.

ROAD WARRIORS: South Carolina went 2-3 on the road this season, and are 14-8 in their last 22 true road contests. Five of the eight road losses in that stretch came to teams ranked in the top 11 in the country: at No. 8 Arkansas in 2011, at No. 9 LSU and No. 3 Florida in 2012, at No. 11 Georgia in 2013, and at No. 5 Auburn this season. This season they also lost at No. 23 Clemson.

FIRST START: Eleven Gamecocks made their first career starts this season, nine on defense. Linebackers Jonathan Walton and Bryson Allen-Williams and cornerback Al Harris Jr. made their first career start in the season opener against Texas A&M. Center Alan Knott and safety Chris Moody made their first start against East Carolina. Defensive end Mason Harris got the call at Vanderbilt. Safety D.J. Smith got the nod at Kentucky. Walk-on defensive end Michael Washington and cornerback Chris Lammons earned their first start against Furman. Defensive end David Johnson got his first start at Auburn, while wide receiver Shamier Jeffery started at Florida. **REMEMBER HIM?:** Linebacker Bryson Allen-Williams and cornerback Al Harris Jr. became the first true freshmen to start a season opener for Carolina since Jadeveon Clowney in 2011.

WORKING OVERTIME: The Gamecocks are 1-1 in overtime games in 2014 and 2-3 all-time in games decided in the extra session. They won their first overtime game in school history when they defeated Missouri, 27-24, in two overtimes on October 26, 2013 in Columbia, Mo., and won in "The Swamp" over Florida by a 23-20 count in 2014. All three overtime losses have come against Tennessee by a field goal: a 23-20 setback on September 27, 2003 in Knoxville, and a 27-24 loss in Knoxville on October 27, 2007 and a 45-42 loss in Columbia on November 1, 2014.

BROTHERLY LOVE: The Gamecocks have two sets of brothers on the squad. Redshirt sophomore offensive linemen **Brock and Clayton Stadnik** are twins. On the defensive line, **Gerald Dixon and Gerald Dixon Jr.** are half-brothers. They share the same father, Gerald Dixon Sr., who played at Carolina in the early '90s.

TOTING THE SHEEPSKIN: Nine Gamecocks earned their degree prior to the start of the season, including A.J. Cann, Ryland Culbertson, Patrick Fish, Cody Gibson, Sharrod Golightly, Nick Jones, Connor McLaurin, Sidney Rhodes and Dylan Thompson. Seven more are in line to join that list in December including Jordan Diaz, Deon Green, Tyler Hull, Corey Robinson, Brandon Shell, J.T. Surratt, and Brison Williams.

EVERY TIME OUT: The Gamecocks have had six players start every game this season. On offense, LT Corey Robinson, LG A.J. Cann, RT Brandon Shell and QB Dylan Thompson have made every start. On defense, DT J.T. Surratt, and DB Brison Williams have been starters in each contest.

EARNING THEIR KEEP: Two former walk-ons – junior wide receiver **Carlton Heard** and senior fullback **Jordan Diaz** – were rewarded with scholarships during the preseason camp.

LOOKING AHEAD: The Gamecocks 2015 schedule is set. South Carolina and North Carolina will open the college football season on Thursday, September 3, when the two bordering state flagship schools hook up at Bank of America Stadium in Charlotte. The other three non-conference games will all be at home, with UCF (September 26), The Citadel (November 21) and Clemson (November 28) providing the opposition. In the SEC rotation, the Gamecocks will host LSU, while they will travel to College Station, Texas for the first time to face their permanent rival, Texas A&M. HALF A GRAND: In a four-game stretch this season, the Gamecocks amassed 500 or more yards of offense in each game, totaling 500 yards at Kentucky, 548 yards against Furman, and 535 at Auburn before rolling up a season high 625 yards against Tennessee, the third-highest single-game tally under Steve Spurrier. That marked the first time in school history that South Carolina had put together four-straight games of 500-plus yards of offense. Logging 500 yards of offense in three-straight games had only happened twice previously - first in 1987, then again in 1995.
