## South Carolina Notables

- The Gamecocks are back in the friendly confines of Colonial Life Arena for the first time in nearly three weeks, having not played a home game since Tue., Nov. 22.
- South Carolina has not lost a home game to an unranked non-conference opponent in the Dawn Staley era. Overall, the Gamecocks have lost just once in their last 53 home games.
- The nation's leader in made free throws per game, the Gamecocks average 194. per game.
They are second in free throw attempts per game (27.7).
- The Gamecocks boast four of the SEC's top-20 scorers this season - A'ja Wilson (6th), Kaela Davis (14th), Allisha Gray (17th) and Alaina Coates (19th) but have NO entries in the league's top 20 for minutes played per game.
- Three of the top nine field goal percentage shooters in the SEC (and top 91 nationally) wear garnet and black this season. Coates leads the SEC and ranks sixth nationally, while Wilson is fourth in the league (38th in the country) and Gray comes in ninth in the conference and 90th in the nation.
- Junior forward A'ja Wilson has been on a tear the last three games, averaging 22.0 points and 7.7 rebounds, including 3.3 offensive boards per game, during the stretch, which included wins over \#4/4 Louisville and at \#14/15 Texas.

## Five Second Count

South Carolina is one of three programs in the nation to appear in every AP top 10 since the start of the 2014-15 season. The Gamecocks have played in four of the last five NCAA Sweet 16s, including the 2015 Final Four. In the SEC, South Carolina is the three-time reigning regular-season champion, including last season's 16-0 record, and claimed the last two SEC Tournaments.

## Minnesota Series Notes

South Carolina leads the series against Minnesota 3-1, although the programs have not met since Dec. 13, 2005. The Gamecocks and Golden Gophers have twice scheduled home-andhome series with the first coming in the 1994-95 season.

The Gamecocks claimed the inaugural meeting 78-75 in Minneapolis then dominated the Golden Gophers in the return game 73-35 on Nov. 29, 1995. Minnesota defended its home court with a $63-53$ win on Jan. 3, 2004, as did South Carolina in a 79-61 victory on Dec. 13, 2005.

## Holding Home Court

The Gamecocks are 410-154 all-time on their home court, including a 168-59 mark in Colonial Life Arena. South Carolina is 103-26 at home during the Dawn Staley era and has lost just once in its last 53 home games, including undefeated

home seasons in 2013-14 and 2014-15.
The Gamecocks' last home loss to an unranked opponents was Feb. 27, 2011, overtime decision to Vanderbilt ( $60-74$ ). Staley has not lost to an unranked non-conference opponent in Colonial Life Arena.

## Rankings Review

Ranked sixth in this week's AP Poll, the Gamecocks are in the midst of the nation's thirdlongest active top-10 ranking streak (55), trailing just UConn (218) and Notre Dame (111) and well ahead of fourth-place Baylor (40).

## Tough Tasks

Head coach Dawn Staley did not shy away from a challenging schedule this season, despite having to replace five seniors from last season's squad. The Gamecocks' schedule is ranked the seventh-toughest in the nation based on opponent winning percentage (.737).

South Carolina's schedule features 10 games against teams ranked in either the AP or USA Today Coaches Top 25 this week, including four against this week's top-10 teams. Just three of those 10 games are home games for the Gamecocks.

The Gamecocks are currently 3-0 against ranked opponents.

## League Legends

The Gamecocks are the only team in the nation to boast two former WNBA All-Stars on

their coaching staff in head coach Dawn Staley and assistant coach Nikki McCray-Penson. Five other programs tout multiple WNBA alums - Miami, Notre Dame, Penn State, Texas and Vanderbilt - but only Beth Cunningham at Notre Dame and Tina Thompson at Texas earned AllStar status at least once in their time in the league.

South Carolina has the added bonus of its other two coaches - associate head coach Lisa Boyer and assistant coach Fred Chmiel - having experience coaching in the WNBA as well.

## Alai-ja Awaits

Opponents may be inclined to think of the paint as the Gamecock-owned continent of Alai-ja as senior center Alaina Coates and junior forward A'ja Wilson have firmly planted the flag in the lane on both ends of the court. Earning All-America and First-Team All-SEC status last season, the duo averaged a combined 27.3 points, 18.5 rebounds and 4.2 blocks. In the Gamecocks' 15 games against ranked opponents, the pair was even more dominant with 29.7 points per game, 20.3 rebounds per contest and 4.9 blocks per outing.

Both were on numerous preseason AllAmerica lists this season with Wilson grabbing 32 of a possible 33 first-team votes from the Associated Press. ESPN tapped Wilson as the top player in the nation this season as well, naming Coates the No. 9 player.

Through seven games this season, the pair
combine to average 30.9 points and 16.7 rebounds while shooting a combined 61.2 percent (79-of129) from the field.

## Quarter Breakdown

Through seven games this season, South Carolina has out-cored its opponent in all but five quarters. The Gamecocks have out-paced their opponent by double digits nine times in the 28 quarters, including a season-high differential of 25 points (37-12) in the first quarter against Saint Peter's (Nov. 22).

South Carolina has shot at least 50.0 percent from the field 10 times in its 28 quarters of action, led by a its 71.4 percent accuracy in the first quarter against Saint Peter's (Nov. 22). The Gamecocks' 37 points in that quarter are the most for the program since the NCAA went to the format for the 2015-16 season.

Individually, junior guard Kaela Davis leads the Gamecocks with four double-digit scoring quarters. Senior center Alaina Coates' 12 points in the second quarter against Hampton are the most in any quarter this season.

## Location, Location, Location

South Carolina averages 42.6 points in the paint this season, making up 51.6 percent of the Gamecocks' offense. Just one opponent has outscored South Carolina in the paint this season Duke (42-32; 12/3/16), and the Gamecocks have out-paced their opponents in that space by 18.6 points per game. Their interior advantage has been at least 20 points three times, including a season-high 44 points against Maine (Nov. 21). In three games against ranked opponents, South Carolina has out-scored its opponent 118-84 in the paint.

## They're Free, Take Two!

South Carolina ranks 24th in the nation in both free throws made and attempted, all while playing 1-4 fewer games than all but one team ranked ahead of them.

The Gamecocks are the only team in the nation averaging at least 19.0 made free throws (19.4) and one of two teams averaging at least 27.0 free throw attempts (27.71). Milwaukee is next in line in average free throws made at 18.9, while Alabama leads the Gamecocks in free throw attempts per game with 28.1 .

## SEC Active

Senior Alaina Coates and junior A'ja Wilson feature prominently in the SEC's active leader boards this season.

## Record Book Watch

The Gamecocks' starting frontcourt of Alaina Coates and A'ja Wilson are moving up the career record books quickly. Here's their current standing:

double chart at 46 and the rebounding mark at 1,006 - more than 350 more than the secondplace player. Coates' 181 career blocks are just behind league leader Wilson's 186, more than 60 ahead of third place. Coates is fourth in scoring at 1,338 and in field goals made (495).

In addition to leading the blocks list, Wilson is third in double-doubles with 20 and sixth in scoring with 1,135 career points. She is fourth in rebounding (571).

## This is 30

With 30-point games already this season by juniors Kaela Davis (37 at \#7/6 Ohio State, $11 / 14$ ) and A'ja Wilson (31 at \#14/15 Texas, $12 / 1$ ), the Gamecocks have more 30-point games in a season since the 2002-03 season when Jocelyn Penn recorded three such outings, none of which were against a ranked opponent.

The program record for 30-point games in a season is six with the most recent coming in 1994-95. In each of the three seasons with six 30-point games, every game was recorded by the same Gamecock. Shannon Johnson posted six in 1994-95 to duplicate her effort in 1993-94. Beth Hunt originally set the record with her six 30 -point games in the 1989-90 campaign. The only 30-point outing against a ranked opponent in those three seasons was Beth Hunt's 34 -point showing in a losing effort at then-No. 18 Southern Miss.

Individually, only eight 30 -point games by a Gamecock have come against ranked opponents, including this season's showings from Davis and Wilson. Davis' 37 points is the most in a game against a ranked opponent and was the first since Johnson netted 35 against then-\#5 Tennessee on Feb. 15, 1996, which until Davis' 37 was the highest-scoring came against a ranked opponent in program history.

## Great Gamecock Fans

With over 10,000 season-ticket holders for the second-straight season, South Carolina leads the nation in average attendance at 11,436 and is the only program drawing at last 10,000 fans per game. Of the five games this season to draw fivedigit fans, the Gamecocks own three of them.

The Gamecocks have posted the highest average attendance at the end of the last two seasons and have enjoyed steady fan growth over the last five years - 3,952 in 2012-13; 6,371 in 2013-14; 12,293 in 2014-15; 14,364 in 2015-16.

## Fourth Follow-Up?

The Gamecocks enter the 2016-17 season as the three-time reigning SEC regular-season champions, becoming just the third program to win three straight titles, joining Tennessee (200004 and 1993-95) and Auburn (1987-89).

SEC coaches and the media picked the Gamecocks to claim the conference title again this season. The league has had the same champion four straight seasons just once before when

## The Staley Era

In her ninth season at the South Carolina helm, head coach Dawn Staley has guided the program to unprecedented success not just in the SEC but on the national stage as well. Staley led the program to its first ever No. 1 ranking in both the AP and USA Today/Coaches Poll. She also delivered the first SEC regular-season and tournament championships. In fact, Staley has accounted for 83 of the program's all-time 147 SEC regular-season victories -56.5 percent in just eight of the 25 seasons the Gamecocks have been in the league.

All four were first-team allconference selections last season as well.

## Back in (Garnet and) Black

The Gamecocks return four letterwinners from last season with a fifth, Tiffany Davis, returning after missing 2015-16 due to injury. Five of those six letterwinners are junior and seniors.

Five new Gamecocks join the fold this season with the four freshmen taking the court right away. Junior forward Alexis Jennings will sit out this season due to NCAA transfer rules.

Guard Tyasha Harris (Noblesville, Ind.) headlines the freshman class, coming off a summer spent helping the U.S. to its seventh-straight gold medal in the FIBA U18 Americas Championship. Araion Bradshaw (Hyde Park, Mass.) and Victoria Patrick (Orlando, Fla.) join her in the guard spot. Bradshaw is point guard with good court vision, and Patrick comes in as a scorer to help stretch the floor. Forward Mikiah Herbert Harrigan rounds out the class, bringing athleticism, speed and perimeter shooting to the team.

The quartet combines to play 51.7 minutes per game, while contributing 12.9 points per game. Harris leads the group in minutes at 21.7 per game, and Herbert Harrigan is on top of the scoring average at 6.7.

## The Amazing Technicolor Dream Coates

Senior center Alaina Coates has started the 2016-17 season on a mission and with a passion that is on display every minute she is on the court. The result has her averaging a double-double (13.9
$\mathrm{ppg} / 10.9 \mathrm{rpg}$ ) and ranked among the nation's top 20 in field goal percentage ( 7 th, .667), rebounding (16th) and double-doubles (22nd, 4).

In the midst of one of the most productive careers for a post player in South Carolina history, Coates became the third Gamecock all-time to reach the 1,000 -rebound plateau, hitting the mark in a strong second-half effort at \#14/15 Texas (Dec. 1). At 1,006 career boards, she trails Marsha Williams' second-place total by 20 rebounds and is 421 off the school record, which has been held by Sheila Foster since 1982.

Coates' 46 career double-doubles are second in program history, trailing only Foster's schoolrecord 72. The Irmo, S.C., native is also a defensive force, ranking second in career blocked shots at 181, just behind teammate A'ja Wilson's 185.

## AW = All-World

In her third season at South Carolina, junior forward $A^{\prime}$ ja Wilson is already one of the most decorated Gamecocks in program history as a three-time All-American, the reigning SEC Player and Defensive Player of the Year and a finalist for all three national player of the year awards last season.

This season, Wilson shrugged off a foulplagued season opener to score double figures in every other game this season, including a careerhigh 31 points to power home a win at \#14/15 Texas (Dec. 1). The outburst moved her up the SEC scoring standings into sixth with 17.0 points per game, and her 56.9 percent field goal shooting is fourth in the SEC and 38th in the nation.

Defensively, Wilson is just as strong as last season when she set the school record for blocked shots in a season with 103 . This season, her 2.6 blocks per game lead the SEC and rank 28th in the nation. She broke the school record for career blocks (previously 177) with two against Saint Peter's (Nov. 22) and now sits at 186 in just 77 career games played.

## KD for 3

Junior transfer Kaela Davis wasted little time making her mark on the Gamecock program, opening her South Carolina career with a 37-point, 10 -rebound, five-assist effort at No. 7/6 Ohio State (Nov. 14). Her 2.4 made 3s per
game rank her second in the SEC, as does her 43.6 percent shooting from beyond the arc. With 14.7 points per game, she ranks 14th in the league in scoring.

Davis established herself as an elite scorer in two seasons at Georgia Tech, where she became the fastest Yellow Jacket to 1,000 career points, needing just 52 games to hit the mark, and was a two-time First-Team All-ACC selection.

So far at South Carolina Davis has proven to be much more, showing the ability and willingness to play a variety of positions. She is second on the team in assists at 2.9 per game and in steals with a 1.3 average, while ranking third in rebounding at 5.7 per contest.

## Gray Area

Junior transfer Allisha Gray may be the Gamecocks' most quiet and consistent offensive power, scoring in double figures in all but one game this season, including opening her inaugural Gamecock season with five straight double-digit scoring outings.

The unassuming six-foot guard amassed 1,000 points in her first two seasons at North Carolina and kicked off her South Carolina career with a 24 -point outing at No. $7 / 6$ Ohio State that included 10 -of- 18 shooting and some of the most momentum-killing baskets of the game. With sniper-like accuracy, she scores 14.1 points per game ( 17 th in the SEC ) on 50.7 percent shooting, which is good for ninth in the SEC and 91st in the nation.

Gray's contributions go beyond the scoring column, though. She leads the team with 21 assists ( 3.0 apg ), including five games of at least three, and is third in the SEC in assist-to-turnover ratio (2.6), which ranks 40th in the country. Gray also adds 4.6 rebounds per game with three games of six or more boards. In fact, she led the team in rebounding against Saint Peter's (Nov. 22) with eight and averages 4.4 per contest.

## Bronx Bandit

Earning a steady starting role for the first time in her career, point guard Bianca CuevasMoore is directing the team on both sides of
the ball with the maturity typical of a junior playing the position under Staley. The transition has Cuevas-Moore balancing her blazing speed and instinct to attack with abandon against her improved communication and ability to set up her teammates. She has multiple assists in all but one game this season and has committed multiple turnovers just twice through seven games.

What hasn't changed in Cuevas-Moore's game is her lightning quick hands on defense. She ranks sixth in the SEC with 2.4 steals per game. She has multiple steals in all but one game this season, including matching her career high with five against Saint Peter's (Nov. 22).

## Designated Survivor

As the lone non-starting post player on the Gamecocks' active roster, freshman forward Mikiah Herbert Harrigan may be in the brightest spotlight among the newcomers. Charged with learning lessons from All-Americans Alaina Coates and A'ja Wilson, the lithe, athletic Herbert Harrigan is rising to the challenge early in the season.

Pressed into service early at \#7/6 Ohio State (Nov. 14) when Wilson endured foul trouble throughout the game, Herbert Harrigan reeled in five rebounds in just four minutes in the first quarter.

After the initial trial by fire on the road against a top-10 opponent, the Florida native thrived in the next four games (Hampton, Maine, Saint Peter's, Louisvolle), averaging 10.3 points, 5.3 rebounds and 1.3 blocks during the stretch.

## Talking Ty

Freshman point guard Tyasha Harris arrived in Columbia with lofty expectations and the ambition needed to play the position under Hall of Famer Dawn Staley. Rated the No. 8 point guard in the 2016 recruiting class, Harris has a winning pedigree with three straight state championships at Heritage Christian (Noblesville,

Ind.) and a gold medal in the 2016 FIBA U18 Americas Championship.

Averaging 21.7 minutes off the bench so far this season, Harris is showing the poise and command of the position that originally caught Staley's eye. Things seemed to click for the young guard against \#4/4 Louisville (Nov. 27) when she drew the second-half start and handed out five of her career-high six assists in the final two periods. Her solid play continued at \#14/15 Texas (Dec. 1) where she earned a career-best 30 minutes on the court with great effort that included three steals and no turnovers.

## USA Basketball Connection

At least one Gamecock has donned the red, white and blue for USA Basketball in each of the last three summers, and the group has helped six U.S. teams to five gold medals and one bronze in that time. Former Gamecock Tiffany Mitchell got the streak started with her FIBA $3 \times 3$ World Championship gold in 2014, which A'ja Wilson and Dawn Staley matched with a gold in the 2014 FIBA U18 Americas Championship. Staley went on to assist on USA Basketball's FIBA World Championship gold-medal team that same year. The next summer, Wilson and Staley claimed the 2015 FIBA U19 World Championship gold.

The most recent medals came from freshman Tyasha Harris who steered the U18 team to gold in the FIBA U18 Americas Championship and junior transfer Alexis Jennings, who brought home bronze from the 2016 FIBA $3 \times 3$ World Championship.

# Dawn Staley <br> Head Coach <br> 9th Season at South Carolina Virginia, 1992 

When three-time Olympic gold medalist Dawn Staley took the reins of the University of South Carolina women's basketball program on May 10, 2008, the Gamecocks' stature immediately rose not just in the Southeastern Conference but on the national stage as well. Building on a foundation of hard work, defensive effort and a "team first" ment=ality, South Carolina began to realize those expectations in 201112, and the program has continued to thrive as one of seven in the nation to be ranked in every Associated Press Top 25 poll since the start of the 2013-14 season. The Gamecocks boast five straight 25 -win seasons, which include three SEC regular-season championships (2014, 2015, 2016), two SEC Tournament titles (2015, 2016), an NCAA Final Four appearance (2015) and three other Sweet 16 seasons (2012, 2014, 2016), the program's first ever No. 1 national ranking and a school-record 34 wins in 2014-15. Staley's success has united every demographic in the state of South Carolina as the Gamecocks' fan base tripled over a span of three seasons, and twice led the nation in home attendance (2014-15, 2015-16).

While her coaching career is blossoming, Staley is still recognized for her body of work as a one of the most decorated participants in United States women's basketball history. The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame solidified her legacy with her enshrinement as part of the Class of 2013. The Phoenix Club of Philadelphia established the Dawn Staley Award recognizing the nation's top guard in women's Division I basketball in 2013 as well. Staley was inducted into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame as part of the Class of 2012 and was one of the final nominees for induction to the U.S. Olympic Hall of Fame the same year. In the summer of 2011, the WNBA recognized her as one of the league's "Top 15," honoring the most influential players in the league's history.

Now in her 17th season as a head coach, Staley has amassed a 366-157 (.700) record, including her 194-77 (.716) slate in her ninth season at South Carolina. She has led her teams to seven 25 -win seasons, a total of 13 postseason appearances (two WNIT) and 55 weeks in the Associated Press top 10, including 12 in the No. 1 spot. Also a force in USA Basketball, she has been the head coach of three gold medal teams - 2015 FIBA U19 World Championships, 2014 FIBA U18 Americas Championship, 2007 Pan Am Games - and served as an assistant on the Senior National Team 2006-08 and again from 2014 to present, helping the team to gold medals in the 2014 FIBA World Championship and the 2008 and 2016 Olympic Games.

At the helm of the Gamecocks over the last eight seasons, Staley has been named National Coach of the Year (2014, Basketball Times), a Naismith National Coach of the Year Finalist (2014, 2015, 2016), SEC Coach of the Year (2014, Coaches and AP; 2015, Coaches; 2016, Coaches and AP) and BCA Female Coach of the Year (2012). Under Staley's leadership, four Gamecocks have collected eight All-America selections, two have picked up three SEC Player of the Year honors, two have earned SEC Defensive Player of the Year recognition, one has been the SEC 6th Player of the Year and three were named SEC Freshman of the Year. She has coached 10 Gamecocks who earned All-SEC honors a combined 19 times, including nine first-team selections, and two Gamecocks have been selected in the WNBA Draft in the last two seasons, including 2016 selection Tiffany Mitchell who became the third first-round selection for South Carolina.
