## CAROLINA QUICK HITS

- South Carolina is in its 35th season of varsity soccer in 2012.
- South Carolina head coach Mark Berson is in his 36th season overall and his 35th season as head coach of the Gamecocks. He is assisted by former players Spencer Lewis and Joey Worthen, both in their first season. Another former player for the Gamecocks, Clark Brisson, is the volunteer assistant coach.
- The contest vs. Clemson marks Carolina's fourth home contest of the season and first since Sept. 2.
- Tuesday's contest marks the first for the Gamecocks since last Wednesday's 3-2 double-overtime loss at No. 5 Charlotte, a span of six days.
- Tuesday is "National Cheeseburger Day," and the first 100 cheeseburgers solid at the concession stand at Stone Stadium will be just \$1.
- Junior striker Bradlee Baladez scored both Carolina goals vs. Charlotte last week, marking the first two goals of the season for the Dallas, Texas, native. Baladez was a Preseason All-Conference USA selection earlier this fall. He leads the Gamecocks with 14 shots on the year.
- Junior goalkeeper Alex Long collected a career high seven saves vs. Charlotte.
- Following Tuesday's contest vs. Clemson, South Carolina begins Conference USA play when it travels to No. 23 Tulsa on Friday and SMU on Monday, Sept. 24.
- Sophomore midfielder Niklas Kivinen scored the first goal of his career in the impressive 1-0 victory at No. 2 USF on Sept. 6. The Mikkeli, Finland, native posted the score on a free kick opportunity in the first half.
- Junior netminder Alex Long posted his third shutout of the season, and the sixth of his career vs. USF. The Gamecocks now have three shutouts in six contests this season. The three shutouts in 2012 matches the season total from 2011.
- South Carolina ranks 15th in the nation in shutout percentage (Sept. 10 NCAA rankings).
- Former South Carolina goalkeeper Warren Lipka was honored with selection to the South Carolina Athletic Hall of Fame for the 2012 class. Lipka was inducted on Thursday, Sept. 13, in a ceremony at Williams-Brice Stadium.
- Carolina is receiving votes in the most recent NSCAA Top 25 Poll, which was released on Tuesday, Sept. 11. (The updated poll will be released on Tuesday, Sept. 18).
- South Carolina is the reigning Conference USA Co-Regular Season champions, as both the Gamecocks and UAB finished the 2011 league campaign with a 6-1-1 record.
- Carolina made its 20th appearance all-time in the NCAA Tournament in 2011, earning hosting duties for the first round.
- Baladez was selected to the Conference USA Preseason Team, the second-straight season the Dallas, Texas, native has been honored with selection to the list.
- Baladez and Troyer were both named to the Preseason All Conference USA squad earlier this month published by College Sports Madness, while Baladez was tabbed a Third-Team Preseason All-American by CollegeSoccerNews.com.

### SCOUTING CLEMSON

Clemson, who returns nine starters from its 2011 squad, enters Tuesday's contest with a 1-4-2 mark on the year. The Tigers' victory came against USC Upstate in the season opener on Aug. 24. Clemson has also played two ACC contests on the season, holding an 0-1-1 record with a loss to Duke and draw vs. Wake Forest. Freshman forward TJ Casner and sophomore midfielder Manola Sanchez pace the squad with one goal each, while goalkeeper Cody Mizell has played the majority of time in net, holding a 1.28 goals against average on the year. The Tigers are coached by Mike Noonan in his third year with the program.

### THE CLEMSON SERIES

Clemson holds a 23-15-1 upperhand in the all-time series with South Carolina, but the Gamecocks enter the 2012 match having won four of the last five meetings between the two schools, having allowed the Tigers to score just two goals during the stretch. Carolina last defeated Clemson during the 2010 season, 2-0, at Stone Stadium.

### WARREN LIPKA HONORED WITH SELECTION TO HALL OF FAME

Former South Carolina goalkeeper Warren Lipka (1982-85) was honored with selection to the South Carolina Athletic Hall of Fame as part of the 2012 class. Along with the other honorees, Lipka was inducted into the Hall of Fame on Thursday, Sept. 13, in a ceremony at Williams-Brice Stadium. Lipka, the 1985 National Goalkeeper of the Year, was also an All-American during his time at Carolina. He was the team captain of the 1985 squad that compiled the most wins in school history (20) and advanced to the NCAA Tournament Quarterfinals.

### 35TH SEASON NOTABLE

Over the course of 10 seasons, beginning with the 1985 campaign, Mark Berson led his team to the NCAA Tournament nine times out of those 10 years. During the stretch, the Gamecocks went to the NCAA Quarterfinals twice (1985, 1989) and the 1993 NCAA National Championship Game. Through the 2011 campaign, Carolina has advanced to 20 NCAA Tournaments, all under the direction of Berson.

### USF MATCH STARTS LATE DUE TO WEATHER DELAY

The Sept. 6, South Carolina vs. No. 2 USF match started at 10:55 p.m., due to a lightening delay. The match started three hours and 25 minutes past its scheduled start time of 7:30 p.m. The team waited out the delay in a building on USF's campus.

### MARTINEZ, STAM NAMED TO GAMECOCK CLASSIC ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

South Carolina defenders, and team co-captains, junior Eric Martinez and senior Kevin Stam put forth stellar play in two matches at the Gamecock Classic vs. No. 15 St. John's and No. 25 Northwestern. With hot and humid temperatures during both matches, the duo played all 90 minutes vs. the Red Storm and all 110 minutes against the Wildcats. The Gamecock defense earned its second shutout of the season against Northwestern.

### DID YOU KNOW?

Reserve defender, freshman Jeffrey Torda's entire family has played a sport at the college level. His father was a golfer at LSU, his mother played basketball at St. Gregory's University, his brother played soccer at Dayton, and his sister played soccer at TCU. Torda is a native of Colleyville, Texas. One of three Texans on the South Carolina roster (Baladez, Hubbard).

### CONFERENCE USA PRESEASON POLL

■ The South Carolina men's soccer team was picked to finish first in the 2012 Conference USA Preseason Poll, while junior forward Bradlee Baladez was selected to the 13-member Men's Soccer Preseason All-Conference Team for the second-consecutive season, as announced by the league office in mid-August. 2012 marks the first time the Gamecocks have been selected as the preseason favorite in the league. Their previous high mark was when the team was projected to finish second in 2006. The Gamecocks were the 2011 regular season co-champs of the league last year. SMU was picked to finish second, followed by UCF, UAB, Memphis, Tulsa, Kentucky, Marshall and FIU.

## MARK BERSON

**35TH SEASON AT SOUTH CAROLINA (441-185-62)**

**36TH OVERALL (452-190-62)**

**Mark Berson**, the reigning Conference USA Coach of the Year, and one of three coaches all-time to post 450 Division I victories, begins his 35th season at the helm of the South Carolina soccer program in 2012. Below are some of Berson and the team's accomplishments:

### **Berson's Accomplishments:**

- Ranks No. 1 among active coaches in victories (450) as a Division I head coach
- Ranks No. 3 all-time in victories (450) as a Division I head coach
- One of only three coaches to collect at least 450 victories while head coach at a D-I institution
- Has the most Division I NCAA Men's Soccer Tournament appearances among active coaches (20)\*
- Ranks eighth among active coaches in winning percentage, .688, while head coach at a D-I institution
- Among NCAA men's soccer coaches across all divisions, has the 17th-most victories all-time
- Reigning Conference USA Coach of the Year
- In just seven seasons competing in the league, has earned two Conference USA Tournament titles, one regular-season title
- Four-time NSCAA South Region Coach of the Year: 1984, 1985, 1988, 1995
- Member of the South Carolina Youth Soccer Association's Hall of Fame (1992)
- Three former players are currently playing in the MLS, one in the EPL and one professionally in Chile

### **Team Accomplishments:**

- 20 NCAA Tournament Appearances
- Four conferences titles in nine seasons competing under a conference affiliation
- One of three collegiate programs to have had a player on each of the last three United States World Cup teams
- Over 50 Gamecocks have been drafted into or entered professional soccer
- 11 individual All-Americans and two National Goalkeepers of the Year
- 45 individuals have combined for 69 NSCAA All-South Region honors
- 16 individuals have earned 19 national academic awards
- One Conference USA co-MVP and co-Player of the Year (Blake Brettschneider, 2010)
- Three Conference USA Freshman of the Year honorees (Jimmy Maurer, 2007; Jeff Scannella, 2006; Mike Gustavson, 2005)
- One Conference USA Defensive Player of the Year (Greg Reece, 2005)
- One Conference USA Newcomer of the Year (Tyler Ruthven, 2007)
- In just seven seasons in the league, 13 First-Team All-Conference USA selections

**Berson** has been at South Carolina from the beginning. He was hired to move the program to varsity status in 1978, and he quickly put Carolina on the map. He has gone on to mold the Gamecocks into consistent winners that compete for championships.

Before coming to Carolina in 1978, Berson went 11-5-0 in one season at The Citadel, making his overall record 450-187-61, a winning percentage of 68.8 percent. In 2006, Berson became one of five active (at that time) Division I coaches and

the 10th all-time to reach the 400-victory milestone when his Gamecocks defeated UAB, 2-0, in a televised contest at Stone Stadium. Berson now has a 439-182-61 record at South Carolina.

Berson has made his mark on the college soccer world by taking the Gamecocks to 20 NCAA Tournaments. The Gamecocks have advanced to at least the second round 11 times and have four quarterfinal and two Final Four appearances. In 1993, the Gamecocks advanced to the NCAA Championship game.

Though Carolina has been independent during the majority of the program's tenure, the Gamecocks have captured four conference titles under Berson's leadership. Carolina won the 1993 Metro Conference Championship in one of its two years competing in the conference. The Gamecocks joined Conference USA in 2005 and promptly claimed the league's tournament championship and automatic berth to the NCAA Tournament, while Carolina also won the C-USA Championship Tournament in 2010 and collected the regular season championship in 2011.

South Carolina saw continued success during the 2011 campaign, earning the Conference USA regular season crown with a stellar 6-1-1 mark in league contests. The Gamecocks earned an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament and held hosting duties in the event's first round. Several Gamecocks earned postseason accolades from the league and NSCAA, including C-USA First Team member Bralee Baladez and All-Freshman honoree Braeden Troyer.

South Carolina won the 2010 Conference USA Tournament Championship, earning the No. 7 national seed in the NCAA Tournament en route to a first-round bye. The home field advantage propelled the Gamecocks to a 1-0 win over Duke during the second round, advancing the squad to the Round of 16. South Carolina concluded the season ranked No. 12 in the final NSCAA Top 25 Poll, while the team also earned the NSCAA's top team academic award.

South Carolina is very successful in its recruiting, bringing in a top-20 recruiting class in 2006, while in 2007 the South Carolina recruiting class ranked No. 10, the 2008 class ranked No. 14, the 2009 class No. 23, the 2010 class ranked No. 16 and the most recent 2011 class ranked No. 11 in the nation according to CollegeSoccerNews.com.

A 1971 graduate of Summit (N.J.) High School, Berson attended the University of North Carolina and received his bachelor of arts degree in journalism in 1975. Berson played on the Tar Heel soccer squad for four years, one as a midfielder and the other three in goal. As a senior, Berson received the UNC Educational Foundation Award and was a member of the Academic ACC Honor Roll. Berson earned his master's of education degree in sport administration from Ohio University in 1977.

Born March 16, 1953, in Hartford, Conn., Berson is married to the former Shauna Hopkins, a South Carolina alum, of Columbia. They have two children, Erin Rhea, and Luke William. Erin graduated from South Carolina in 2009, and Luke is currently enrolled at the University of South Carolina in the Moore School of Business.
