# Gamecock Basketball Staley and the Gamecocks Chip Away at Challenging Season 

The Gamecocks showed fans passion and hard work, despite setbacks that often left them out of the win column.

South Carolina head coach Dawn Staley's first year at the helm was bookended by challenges. The Gamecocks opened the 2008-09 season with nine sophomores and freshmen on the roster, an entirely new coaching staff and a schedule that featured all of the participants in the previous season's NCAA Women's Final Four. There was learning required by everyone involved with the program, but the heaviest burden would fall on the players' shoulders. The trio of seniors would be invaluable in carrying the youthful team, but the group would be decimated by injury by the end of January, leaving what appeared to be the more favorable part of the SEC schedule in the hands of the uninitiated. From beginning to end, however, Staley's mantra remained the same.
"I don't like to make excuses," she said. "In the beginning of the season, the newness of what we were asking players to do was foreign to them to a certain degree. It's difficult to break old habits and to create new ones. In the end, we just played. You have to play the hand you're dealt, and we did that. We had to figure out a way to keep ourselves in games and win games. Winning helps the morale of a team, but we were still encouraged because we were getting better right through the end of the season. We may have taken a step or two back along the way, but for the most part, for who we had and the lack of experience we had, they played as well as they could play."

## At the Tip-Off

From the moment Staley was hired on May 10, 2008, the South Carolina program began a transformation. From off-season conditioning to playbook to uniforms to office renovation, no stone was left unturned in pursuit of living up to Staley's reputation for success, leaving every player to feel like a freshman again. Early season practice sessions were intense and loaded with information as Staley constantly imparted her knowledge and wisdom on her team. "Your body is an amazing thing. Let it be amazing," she implored her team in its most exhausted moments.

Heading into the season opener, Staley knew her team would struggle to score, but hoped that their commitment to defense would be enough to carry the Gamecocks until the offense came around. The defense did its job in the first two games, holding Penn State and Clemson to 56 and 52 points, respectively. Carolina came up short on the other end of the court, however, suffering losses in its first two outings.

The first win of the Staley era came against Davidson at Colonial Life Arena thanks to a defense that allowed just 47 points and an offense that exploited the Wildcats' defensive pressure to score quick-strike layups through much of the second half.

## Ties that Bind

Carolina took its winning ways international with a six-day trip to Cancun, Mexico, for the Cancun Thanksgiving Classic. For a new team, the adventure was as much about basketball as it was forming ties among the players and with the staff.
"It was a good trip for us to bond, to get away, to enjoy each other," Staley said. "As far as the basketball, we were still learning each other and figuring out who did what well. We had success, but were still not putting it all together, which is quite normal with what we were facing - a new coaching staff and adding players to what was already here. The preseason is too short, especially when you're coming into a new situation. With the hand we were dealt, we played it out the best that we could. There were players who had great games [in Cancun], but we couldn't get three or four people hitting some kind of offensive stride at the same time."

One of those players having success was senior Brionna Dickerson, who earned tournament MVP honors after leading the Gamecocks to the title with 15.0 points per game. The event was just the beginning of what would be a prolific scoring season for the Gamecocks' quintessential student-athlete, who finished her career among the program's all-time top 10 in 3-point shooting percentage.

The Carolina defense allowed Ohio and UNC Wilmington to score just 34 and 54 points, respectively, in the tournament and ranked the Gamecocks among the nation's stingiest teams. Back in the United States, the team took that reputation to Wake Forest, also ranked among the best four defensive teams in the country. Carolina held Wake to just 39.4 percent shooting, but the Demon Deacons collected the victory by picking up 19 steals among the Gamecocks' 32 turnovers.

South Carolina righted the ship with overwhelming wins over High Point and USC Upstate to set the stage for the most intriguing part of the schedule.

Measuring Progress Against the Best

With final exams behind them, the Gamecocks faced their toughest tests over the next three games beginning with a visit from No. 3/4 Stanford on Dec. 19. South Carolina gave the Cardinal all they could handle in the first half before running out of gas against a bigger team in the second half.

"In the first half, I thought we came out well and were in the game," Staley said following the loss. "We were doing things that we worked on for the past week, and I thought we looked pretty good. We got beat by a good rebounding team, a big body team, and a well-coached basketball team. You have to learn from losses. You have to take good and bad things from it, and we will do both. For our young players to play the way they played, I think it's promising looking ahead to the SEC season."

League play was on the horizon for the Gamecocks, but they had plenty of work to do before that. Two days after the physical Stanford game, the Charlotte 49ers arrived, looking to send Carolina into its brief Christmas break with a loss.

The game of runs featured 10 lead changes in the first half alone as both offenses poured in the points. After building a 12-point lead midway through the second half, the Gamecocks sustained a 49er spurt that had the margin down to three with 20 seconds left to play. Still up by three with seven seconds left, Staley laid out a strategy to seal the win against the 49ers aggressive defense, and C.J. Pace delivered the nearly full-court pass to Kennedy streaking up the sideline. The ensuing layup left five seconds on the clock, during which the 49 ers hit a 3 -pointer, making Kennedy's the decisive points in the 78-76 victory.

Holiday celebrations were cut short for Carolina with No. 1 Connecticut waiting just three days after Christmas. The Gamecocks limited the Huskies to their lowest point total of the season at that point, but could not muster enough offense to stay with the perennial national contenders.
"I can honestly say we competed through that stretch when we were playing the top three teams in the country," Staley said after the season ended. "I don't think we got out-worked in those games, and that's what you want. You want to work as hard as you can work, and if they're a better team, so be it. Because we played it in between Stanford and UConn, we were able to win the Charlotte game. I don't think if we had played a less talented team and won maybe by 30 points, we would have been in a position to beat Charlotte in that intense environment right before Christmas break."

## Locked In

The good home vibe continued for the Gamecocks, who battled out a win over Jacksonville to lift their record to 7-5. Carolina embarked on just its second true road trip of the season, traveling to NC State. The returning Gamecocks had a bone to pick with the Wolfpack for Carolina's stunning loss in the second round of the 2008 WNIT in the previous trip to Raleigh. More than that, though, Staley's group needed its first road win before heading into SEC play.

In a game that changed leads five times in the final minute, South Carolina senior Demetress Adams struck the final blow at the buzzer to give the Gamecocks a $56-55$ win. The teams were tied at the half, and the Wolfpack overcame a double-digit Carolina lead midway through the second half to set up late-game heroics for both teams. With just six seconds on the clock, Staley used her final time out to set her team's final play, which was reminiscent of the final strike against Charlotte just four games prior. Senior C.J. Pace withstood the Wolfpack pressure on her in-bounds pass and arced a perfect strike to Adams just across half-court. The veteran forward eluded a defender on the perimeter before driving the left side of the lane and releasing the shot at the buzzer. The ball hung tantalizingly on the rim before falling through and sending the Gamecock bench charging onto the floor.
"Going into the [NC State] game, I felt good about our team," Staley said. "They were coming together as a team and getting an understanding of how we needed to play going into the SEC schedule. We hung in there, hung tough to get a win on the road. I thought I was going to be a turnaround for us, something good to go into the SEC part of our season."

And a turnaround it was. No. 9/8 Auburn opened the SEC schedule at Colonial Life Arena, and the eventual SEC regular-season champion

had its hands full against the Gamecocks. Carolina fought back from a 10 -point deficit with five minutes left in the game, twice narrowing the gap to two points inside of 15 seconds left to play. In the final throes of the contest, the gap was down to 76-74 after Dickerson's three-point play and a steal and layup from Kennedy on the ensuing in-bound play. With just 13 seconds left on the clock, the Gamecocks were forced to foul, and the Tigers were able to escape with a four-point victory, their narrowest of the season.
"We had a tremendous effort against Auburn, a team that lost just two SEC games all season," Staley said. "I thought if we could give that type of effort every night, we would win a lot more basketball games than we'd lose. We were in a good place at that point, playing good basketball. We put ourselves in a position to win those games."

Staley continued to be happy with her team's play in the next game at Georgia, but it proved to be another in what would be a string of games in which the Gamecocks were within a handful of plays of a win against a top-tier team. In Athens, Carolina fought back from a six-point deficit in the final five minutes to tie the game twice before the Lady Bulldogs were perfect in four trips to the free-throw line to seal the 69-63 victory.

The Gamecocks suffered a setback at home against Florida before traveling to long-time nemesis Tennessee, ranked No. 13/15 at the time. Carolina was the aggressor early and led at every media time out of the first half, but fell behind early in the second half to suffer their fourth-straight loss.

Despite the losses, few players shone in the spotlight of the early SEC schedule, playing against the league's elite teams, more than freshman La'Keisha Sutton. She served notice to the league with 17 points in her debut against Auburn and followed it with 18 points and five assists at

Georgia. Sutton would go on to reach double figures in nine of the 14 regular-season SEC contests and led all freshmen in scoring average in league games.

## When It Rains...

The Gamecocks scratched out their first SEC win at Mississippi, thanks to a career effort from Dickerson, but still left Oxford with a sour taste in their mouths, worried about Adams, who left the game 10 minutes into the first half with a knee injury. Dickerson willed Carolina to victory, scoring 21 of her career-high 31 points in the second half as she matched her career high with five 3-pointers. Freshman Charenee Stephens also stepped up with her first career double-double ( 11 points/12 rebounds) to lead the team on the glass, and the team combined to hit 9-of-10 from the free-throw line in the final two minutes to seal the 76-67 victory.

The Mississippi win sealed Dickerson's standing among the SEC's top shooters as she emerged from that game ranked second in the league with 21.2 points per SEC game and was the league's most prolific and accurate 3 -point shooter, hitting 3.63 -pointers per league game at a 42.9 percent clip. She had scored 17 or more points in every SEC game of the season.

The news on Adams' injury was finalized the next day - season ending. As a team, the Gamecocks had little time to wallow or console as they prepared for No. 17/18 Vanderbilt. While lightning may not strike twice, the Gamecocks endured déjà vu all over again three days after Adams' injury.

This time it was Dickerson who would fall midway through the first half, suffering an injury in a melee under the basket. Again, a senior stepped up when it mattered most, and Pace led the way with a career-high 19 points to go with nine rebounds, including five offensive. While Carolina played Vanderbilt even in the second half, the 10 -point halftime deficit was too much to overcome.

The Gamecocks played the next two weeks under the possibility that Dickerson could return, and the senior went about her rehab as passionately as she had the team's regular practices. After three weeks, however, Dickerson's injury was not progressing enough to allow her to return to the court for the remainder of the season.

## Ch-ch-ch-ch-changes

Taking the top scorer and top rebounder out of the lineup in the span of two games, Carolina faced the unknown and eight more regular-season SEC games. Players would be forced to play out of position, more minutes and in more featured roles. Just nine players were available to play, and Staley would demand the maximum effort from all nine.
"We didn't have to start over [after the injuries], but we did have to rely more on outside shooting," she said. "We didn't have a steady low-post threat. Demetress [Adams] attracted a lot of attention even if she wasn't scoring. Losing her took a big piece of people concentrating on her and giving us uncontested outside looks. Now those shots were contested, and we didn't have Brionna [Dickerson] to shoot them. We asked C.J. [Pace] to do a lot more scoring, and we put a ton of responsibility on La'Keisha [Sutton]."

The Gamecocks battled and worked their coach's game plan each time out, but still ended the regular season on a 1-7 skid. Carolina was close for most of the games only to see a team with a deeper bench and more offensive threats pull away in the waning minutes of the contest. The lone victory in the stretch was a 68-57 decision over Alabama that saw the inside game doing the damage. Pace and Stephens scored 18 and 15 points, respectively, with Pace narrowly missing the double-double with a game-high nine rebounds, including six on the offensive end.

## Celebrating Seniors

Prior to tipoff of the final regular-season game, South Carolina honored its trio of seniors. During the tearful presentation of flowers and framed jerseys, the fans enthusiastically honored Adams, Dickerson and Pace, along with their families, for their contributions to the Gamecock program.

Adams closed her time in a Gamecock uniform ranking among the program's top 10 in four career categories - blocked shots ( $140,3 \mathrm{rd}$ ), field goal percentage (.535, 8th), offensive rebounds (274, 4th) and defensive rebounds (462, 4th). She was an All-SEC and SEC All-Defensive Team selection in 2007-08, a break-out junior season that saw her average career highs in both points ( 10.9 ppg ) and rebounds ( 8.9 rpg ). Adams recorded 16 double-doubles and reached double-figure points 36 times in her career. Her 26 rebounds against Arkansas in 2007-08 broke a 33-year-old school record and tied the SEC mark originally set 20 years ago.

Dickerson capped her career with a season that saw her earn ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District honors as she established herself among the SEC's premier shooters. Ranked among the league's top-10 scorers for much of the season, she scored 17 or more points in every complete SEC game she played, including a career-high 31 at Mississippi. At the time of her injury, she ranked second in the league in points per SEC game and was the league's most prolific and accurate 3-point shooter. She finished her time in a Gamecock uniform ranked eighth in school history in career 3-point field goal percentage at .328 .

Pace spent just two seasons in a Carolina jersey but doubled her scoring average from one season to the next. She finished the 2008-09 regular season ranked 16th in the SEC with 6.0 rebounds per game. Pace scored her first career double-double with a 10 -point, 11-rebound effort at NC State and scored in double figures six times in the 10 games that either Adams or Dickerson missed with injury.


Flashy Frosh
Guard La'Keisha Sutton became the Gamecocks' first selection on the SEC's All-Freshman team since 2005-06 when the league's coaches unanimously voted her onto the squad. She was the SEC's highest-scoring freshman in league games ( 13.6 ppg ) while ranking eighth in field goal percentage (.425) and ninth in assists per SEC outing (3.6). Her SEC scoring average was the highest by a freshman in South Carolina history (in SEC beginning with the 1991-92 season) and the highest by a Gamecock since Cristina Ciocan netted 15.1 ppg against SEC opponents in 2002-03.
"La’Keisha was the lone bright spot this season," Staley said. "Seeing her driving down from Tenton, N.J., very unsure of herself, lacking confidence in her ability to play at this level, it was great to see her grow into a player that pretty much became our go-to player. She truly blossomed. It doesn't mean she made all the right decisions, but she took in the information and tried to do exactly what we asked her. She did that and more."

Sutton netted a career-high 24 points against USC Upstate, but was at her most prolific scoring in SEC games. She netted double figures nine times in 14 league games, hitting at least 15 points in eight of those nine outings. With relentless drives to the basket, she shot a team-high 114 free throws, hitting 77 of those - both numbers that rank third among freshmen in Gamecock history. In addition to her own offense, she handed out a team-high 51 assists during the season, including seven games of five or more assists.

Court Presence
While no player relishes profiting from a teammate's loss, redshirt freshman Courtney Newton made the most of her increased playing time after the injuries to Adams and Dickerson. A tough player who will mix it up on the block and hit the outside shot, Newton contributed to the Gamecock effort in every way possible. In the 10 games after Adams suffered her injury, Newton averaged 4.9 points and 3.7 rebounds, after entering the Mississippi game averaging 0.9 points and 2.1 rebounds.
"Courtney was our blue-collar worker," Staley said. "Our opponents were nameless and faceless to her. She always approached it the same way, and that's what I like. Other people may have been more talented for us to insert in the starting lineup, but I felt like we needed some stability, some predictability. I knew Courtney was going to compete, to fight, to work hard, and we needed that to start the basketball game."

In the absence of Adams for much of the Jan. 22 game against Mississippi, Newton grabbed a then-career-high five rebounds and scored 10 points, hitting a pair of 3 -pointers and sinking 4 -of- 6 from the free-throw line. It was her first double-figure scoring game of the season. She scored nine points and picked up three steals at Kentucky then topped both those efforts with a season-high 12 points and a career-high four steals against Mississippi. After two games with her new career high of six rebounds (at Arkansas and against Alabama), Newton again reset the mark with seven boards at Florida to go with four steals and eight points.

Wiping the Glass
Freshman forward Charenee Stephens was the Gamecocks' leading rebounder in SEC play and finished the regular season ranked 14th in the league with 6.0 boards per conference game. She pulled down seven or more rebounds in five of her 14 conference games, including two games of double-digit boards - 11 at Tennessee and 12 at Mississippi. She was the first Gamecock freshman to average at least 6.0 rebounds per game in SEC play since Iva Sliskovic grabbed 7.0 per game in 2003-04.

Gamecocks Face Final Four
South Carolina's 2008-09 schedule included all of the teams that played in the 2008 NCAA Women's Final Four. Only one of those games, Tennessee, took place outside of Columbia as Stanford, Connecticut and LSU all visited Colonial Life Arena. The Gamecocks were the only team in the country that had all four teams on its schedule. Rutgers played all but LSU, going 0-4 against the three teams after playing UConn twice.

Elite Visitors
Vanderbilt was the fifth top- 25 team to visit Colonial Life Arena in 2008-09, providing Gamecock fans more opportunities to see the nation's elite at home during the season than any since 2000-01, when five top25 squads also arrived in Columbia. The most nationally-ranked teams (top 25) to play in Columbia in the regular season is six, which happened in 1989-90. Overall that season, South Carolina squared off against a school-record 13 top- 25 teams, against which the Gamecocks were 4-9. Six nationally-ranked squads also played the Gamecocks on their home court in 1979-80, but two of those games were part of the AIAW Region II Tournament.

South Carolina has hosted a team ranked in the nation's top three 16 times in its history, but only three of those games were against non-SEC teams, including two in 2008-09 - UConn and Stanford.

# Gamecock Basketball 

Penn State 56, South Carolina 42 November 16, 2008<br>Bryce Jordan Center (University Park, Pa.)

A pair of five-minute scoring droughts led to a 56-42 loss for South Carolina in the season opener. The Gamecocks struggled shooting the ball throughout the game, but it was second-half turnovers that helped the Lady Lions first recover then extend their 10 -point halftime lead. Senior Demetress Adams recorded a double-double in the outing with 11 points and 12 rebounds.

The first half was marked by poor shooting from both teams, although the Gamecocks suffered more, hitting just 5-of-28 from the field. Things started well for South Carolina as Adams netted the game's first three points. She scored first on a put-back of a Brionna Dickerson missed 3-pointer and scored again on a free throw moments later. Penn State got its forward Evelyn Lewis going as she also scored the Lady Lions' first three points to tie the game with 16:46 on the clock.

Penn State claimed the lead on a Brianne O'Rourke 3-pointer from the top of the key, putting the Lady Lions up 7-5. South Carolina freshman Tonia Williams scored her first career point on a free throw, but the Lady Lions scored the next six points for a 13-6 margin. The Gamecocks pulled back within two as freshman Sada Wheeler hit a short jumper from the right block and C.J. Pace sank a 3-pointer from the right wing.

The Lady Lions rattled offeight straight points as the Gamecock shooting cooled off further and the turnovers began to mount. Pace ended the half on a high note for the Gamecocks as she hit a 3-pointer from the right side just before halftime.

Carolina opened the second half on a defensive tear, scoring the first four points on steals and the resulting layups. The first came from Jewel May and the second from Adams. Mashea Williams stopped the run for Penn State with a bucket from the left block, which the Gamecocks answered with a similar lay-up from May for a 27-21 Lady Lion lead at the 15:58 mark.

A spate of turnovers, however, helped Penn State to a 9-0 run and a 15-point lead at $36-21$ with 11:25 left in the half. La’Keisha Sutton stopped the spurt with a free throw, and Adams stepped out for a 15 -foot jump shot on the right side to cut the Gamecocks' deficit to 24-36. After a Penn State steal and layup, Dickerson's 3-pointer from the right wing brought Carolina within 11 points.

Another Lady Lion 9-0 pushed the lead back to a comfortable margin, which also improved Penn State's shooting percentage for the rest of the half.

Clemson 45, South Carolina 52<br>November 19, 2007<br>Colonial Life Arena (Columbia, S.C.)

South Carolina staged a fierce second-half rally but could not push past Clemson in a 52-45 loss in the home opener at Colonial Life Arena Wednesday night. The Gamecocks trailed the Tigers by 12 points with six minutes left then ratcheted up the defense to spark a 7-0 run to get within five at the $4: 18$ mark. Clemson did just enough work on the glass to hold on down the stretch for its first win over South Carolina in four tries.

For the second-straight game, the Gamecocks fell behind early as the Tigers had a 13-point lead 6:30 into the game. Carolina chipped away to pull within nine at 19-10 on a Brionna Dickerson layup with 8:48 left in the half. Clemson hit three straight jumpers to push the lead back to 17. Freshmen Tonia Williams and Miranda Tate came off the bench to provide some more offense, and the deficit was again down to nine on Dickerson's free throw with 1:22 remaining before the break. In the final minute, Tate drove the lane in transition and narrowed the gap to seven heading into halftime.

A handful of Gamecock turnovers helped the Tigers get back to a double-digit lead early in the second half. South Carolina cobbled together a 7-0 run behind more aggression on both ends of the floor, forcing Clemson into turnovers on three straight possessions. Dickerson started the run with a free throw, and Williams added a pair of jump shots to get within six at 31-37. After Williams picked up a steal on the defensive end, C.J. Pace had the Gamecocks within striking distance at 33-37 with a transition layup.

A lapse on the defensive glass allowed the Tigers multiple looks on the next three trips, and they capitalized with a pair of layups and a jump shot to get back to a 10 -point margin. The lead grew to 12 on Whitney Hood's jumper with 6:09 on the clock, but the Gamecocks were not quite finished with the Tigers.
Aggressively driving to the basket, Carolina narrowed the gap to seven points, all on free throws. La'Keisha Sutton extended the run to seven points with a drive through the lane for a layup. It was the last surge for the Gamecocks, however, as missed shots and missed rebounds helped the Tigers hang on for the victory.

Clemson's Lele Hardy led all scorers with 17 points on 6 -of15 shooting. South Carolina guard Lauren Falohun paced the Gamecocks with a career-high 10 points on 3-of-4 accuracy. Senior Demetress Adams grabbed a game-high 11 rebounds, despite being saddled with foul trouble and playing just 22 minutes.

South Carolina women's basketball used a smothering defense early and a quick-strike offense late to post a 68-47 win over Davidson Monday night at Colonial Life Arena. The first Gamecock win for head coach Dawn Staley came with leadership from senior Demetress Adams and double-digit scoring from freshmen La’Keisha Sutton and Miranda Tate. South Carolina held the Wildcats to just 30.2 percent shooting in the game and forced 31 turnovers, including 20 in the first half alone.

The Gamecocks were defensive minded early, building a ninepoint lead five minutes into the game as Davidson committed five turnovers in its first 11 possessions. Meanwhile, the Carolina interior went to work with Adams and Jewel May combining for nine of the team's first 13 points. The Wildcats bounced back and managed to tie the score at 13-13 with 10:53 left in the first half with a 9-0 run behind offensive rebounding and their own interior power. Tate hit a long jumper from the right wing to put the Gamecocks back on top on the next possession, and the lead quickly grew to 13 points as the Gamecocks once again turned up the defensive pressure to go on a 19-6 run.

After holding a 32-23 lead at the break, South Carolina wasted little time extending its lead to 20 with Tate guiding the team with eight straight points, including a pair of 3-pointers. Despite the sizable deficit, the Wildcats would not go quietly, hounding the Gamecocks into a series of turnovers and crashing the defensive boards to pull within 10 points at $48-38$ with 6:41 left to play.

Sophomore guard Lauren Falohun stopped the Wildcats surge with a quick layup up after driving up the left side against defensive pressure. With that example, the Gamecocks worked to exploit the aggressive Davidson defense and found a series of quick-strike layups allowed them to regain a 20 -point margin with 3:44 left to play.

Tate's 13 points was a game high and included three 3 -pointers, while Sutton added 11 points on 4 -of- 8 shooting. Adams rounded out the trio of double-digit scorers for Carolina with 10 points to go with eight rebounds, including four on the offensive glass. Adams also swiped four steals, and Samone Kennedy handed out a game-high seven assists. Mercedes Robinson led the Davidson offense with nine points and 11 rebounds to go with her five steals.

South Carolina battled to a 43-34 victory over Ohio to advance to the championship game of the Cancun Thanksgiving Classic. The Gamecocks forced the Bobcats into 26 turnovers and just four assists en route to the win. Seniors Brionna Dickerson and Demetress Adams led the way with 15 and 14 points, respectively.

The first half was a battle on the offensive end for both teams. The Gamecock defense forced Ohio into 15 turnovers and just 15.0 percent shooting in the period. Ohio scored the first basket of the game, but South Carolina went to seniors Dickerson and Adams to build a 6-2 lead three minutes into the game. Both teams went into a scoring drought from there with the Bobcats hitting 2-of-4 free throws to cut the lead to $6-4$ before the Gamecocks scored a bucket, a Dickerson 15 -foot jumper, eight minutes later.

South Carolina rallied for a nail-biting 56-54 win over UNC Wilmington to claim the title of the Cancun Thanksgiving Classic. Freshman La’KeishaSutton, who earned a spot on the All-Tournament team, drove the lane with the shot clock winding down and hit what proved to be the game-winning shot with 26 seconds left. The Gamecock defense stepped up in the final seconds, and sophomore Jewel May secured the final rebound to seal the win.

In the first half, Carolina shot a sparkling 50 percent from the field but was plagued by 11 turnovers, leading to the 25-22 halftime deficit. The teams traded one- and two-point leads throughout the half until Lauren Falohun knotted the game at 17-17 with a driving layup with 4:26 left in the half. Freshman Miranda Tate gave the Gamecocks a three-point lead with a 3-pointer from the right sideline.

UNC Wilmington answered with a 3-pointer from Treasure Johnson on the next possession. That bucket kicked off an 8-0 run for the Seahawks, yielding a five-point lead - the largest margin for either team in the half. Brionna Dickerson, who was named Tournament MVP, cut into the lead with a jumper from the right elbow just before heading into the locker room.

The Gamecocks handled the ball better in the second half, turning it over just seven times to make up ground on the Seahawks. The game was tied 13 times as neither team could wrest control of the contest. The Gamecocks twice extended to a four-point lead only to see UNCW storm back.
After Dickerson knotted the game at 51-51 with a free throw at the $4: 28$ mark, the Seahawks took their last lead of the game on a pull-up jumper from Greta Luksyte, who tied for team-high honors with 14 points. May netted her second bucket of the game, a put back on a critical offensive rebound, to put the Gamecocks back on top 54-53 with 2:01 remaining.

The lead grew to 11 points at the 11:48 mark on Dickerson's third 3-pointer of half. The teams traded baskets over the next two minutes before the Demon Deacons went on a 17-7 spurt that spanned eight minutes and brought the home team within one at 31-32. The run included three 3 -pointers as Wake quickly raised their shooting percentage after a dismal start and was helped by three Gamecock turnovers.

It was more of the same in the second half, and Wake took its first lead of the game at 39-38 on a jumper by Camile Collier with 16:33 left to play. Dickerson hit a pair of free throws to put South Carolina back up, but Wake turned up the defensive pressure and was able to beat the Gamecocks press to go on a 12-0 run to build its own 11-point lead with 11:22 on the clock. The run, during which the Gamecocks failed to take a shot, was punctuated with three layups after breaking the South Carolina full-court pressure.

With both teams among the nation's top four in scoring defense, both offenses were efficient with the Demon Deacons shooting 29-4 percent to the Gamecocks' 44.4 percent. Wake made up the difference with 19 steals as part of 32 Gamecock turnovers in the contest.

Adams posted her third double-double of the season, grabbing 10 rebounds to go with her 15 points. Sophomore Jewel May posted 11 points and reeled in seven rebounds. Wake Forest's Alex Tchangoue led all scorers with 19 points and matched Adams' 10 rebounds for game-high honors. Corinne Groves netted 18 points, and Brittany Waters rounded out the double-digit scorers with 14 points.

Four South Carolina players reached double-figure points as aggressive defense and solid work on the glass to claim a 7352 win over High Point tonight at Colonial Life Arena. The Gamecocks scored a season-high 73 points with senior Demetress Adams leading four players in double figures with 16 points to go with 11 rebounds for her fourth double-double of the season. Sophomore Jewel May recorded her first career double-double with 10 points and a career-high 12 rebounds.

The teams were tied at halftime after each team put together a significant run. The Gamecocks had the lead early but saw High Point put together an 11-2 surge to move ahead and extend its lead to nine at 28-19 on LaTeisha Dean's 3-pointer from the top of the key with 5:08 left in the period. C.J. Pace answered with a three of her own to kick off an 8-0 rally. Adams added a pair of layups, and Brionna Dickerson swiped a steal and hit a jumper to knot the game at 28-28 with $2: 55$ on the clock. Adams and High Point's Shamia Brown traded jump shots just before the end of the half.

High Point was quicker out of the locker room and built a five-point lead at 39-34 less than four minutes into the half. South Carolina head coach Dawn Staley went to her bench and asked her team to turn up the defensive pressure. Dickerson kicked off the spurt with a 3 -pointer from the right wing, and freshman La'Keisha Sutton picked up a steal and hit a 3-pointer of her own from the left sideline to put the Gamecocks back on top 40-39.

South Carolina got a game-high 24 points from freshman La’Keisha Sutton, making her first career start, and saw senior Demetress Adams pour in her fourth double-double ( $16 \mathrm{pts} / 12$ rebs) of the season, her second in as many games.

Even with a lineup depleted by injuries, the Gamecocks wasted little time getting offensive, quickly opening an 11-4 lead behind five points from Sutton. The lead reached double figures at 19-8 midway through the first half as Lauren Falohun opened a 6-0 run with a long jump shot followed by a pair of free throws from Sutton. Samone Kennedy, in her first start of the year, capped the surge with a steal and a layup. South Carolina 78, Charlotte, 76<br>December 21, 2008<br>Colonial Life Arena (Columbia, S.C.)

With season-high shooting, South Carolina scrapped through to a $78-76$ win over Charlotte this afternoon at Colonial Life Arena. Sophomore point guard Samone Kennedy had a career day to lead the Gamecocks with 23 points, while senior Demetress Adams battled outstanding post play for the secondstraight game to fall just one rebound shy of a double-double.

The game was back and forth early in the first half with Lauren Falohun's long jump shot for a 23-23 game. Charlotte put together an $8-0$ run with a pair of free throws from Traci Ray. Three different 49ers hit buckets to stake the largest lead by either team at 31-23 with 6:14 until halftime. Carolina answered with a long jumper from C.J. Pace and a layup from Adams and Charlotte's Erin Floyd stopped the Gamecocks' momentum with a short jumper with just over five minutes remaining.

Kennedy sparked a 6-0 run with her first career 3-pointer and a driving layup. Pace's free throw knotted the game at 33-33. Following Shannon McCallum's short jumper in the lane, Pace buried a 3-pointer to put the Gamecocks back on top 36-35. Danielle Burgin's layup briefly returned the lead to Charlotte, but Brionna Dickerson hit a pair of free throws to send the Gamecocks into the locker room with a 38-37 advantage.

Kennedy wasted expanded the lead in the second half, hitting back-to-back 3-pointers to open a 16-4 surge for the Gamecocks. Adams added a driving layup, and Kennedy and Pace each sank a 3-pointer during the run, which gave Carolina a 54-41 lead with 14:52 left in the game.

The Gamecocks' lead was as large as 12 points after Pace hit a pair of free throws for a 60-48 margin. Floyd hit a jumper on the left block, and Aysha Jones cut the lead to seven with a 3-pointer. Ashley Spriggs made it a four-point game with a short jumper and a free throw before Dickerson stopped the surge with consecutive baskets, giving Carolina a $64-56$ lead at the 6:16 mark.

Charlotte had one more surge left, in the game's final minute. The Gamecocks held an eight-point lead 44 seconds remaining, which Jones sliced nearly in half with a 3 -pointer. Jabrenta Hubbard got loose for a layup to pull the 49ers within three with 20 seconds to play. Adams hit a pair of free throws, which Danielle Burgin answered with a putback on the other end, holding the margin at three points with seven seconds left. Pace did a nearly full-court pass to Kennedy streaking up the right side, who finished with a layup with five seconds remaining.

## No. 1/1 UConn 77, South Carolina 48 December 28, 2008 <br> Colonial Life Arena (Columbia, S.C.)

South Carolina held No. 1 Connecticut to its lowest point total of the season but could not match the Huskies' offensive output in a $77-48$ loss this afternoon at Colonial Life Arena. The Gamecocks battled on the glass, but could not overcome UConn's 56.5 percent field goal shooting, as 56 of the Huskies' 77 points came in the paint, including 28 points off turnovers.

The Gamecocks got off to a solid start as sophomore Samone Kennedy drained her first two shots of the game for a 4-0 lead. The Huskies pushed back with Tina Charles hitting a layup from the left block and Maya Moore sinking a 15 -foot jumper. After Moore's steal and layup put UConn on top, freshman La'Keisha Sutton answered with a 3-pointer on the left baseline for another Gamecock lead 7-6 just four minutes into the contest.
From that point, however, Connecticut took advantage of three Gamecock turnovers to go on a 12-0 run, capped by Moore's 3 -pointer from the left sideline. Lauren Falohun stopped the spurt with a 3-pointer as the shot clock expired, but the Huskies were undeterred, going on a 14-4 surge to take a commanding 32-14 lead with $4: 46$ left to play in the first half. A jump shot from Jewel May and a Kennedy 3-pointer from the right wing narrowed the Gamecock deficit to 13 with just under two minutes in the period before a 5-0 surge took it back to 18 points at 37-19 heading into the locker room for halftime.

The Connecticut lead hovered around 20 points through the first 13 minutes of the second half as the teams seemed to trade baskets early in the period. After May hit a free throw to bring the Gamecocks back within 18 points at 62-44, UConn answered with another run, this one going 11 points and spanning three minutes for a 73-44 margin with 3:51 left to play.

The Huskies' 56.5 percent accuracy was the best by a Gamecocks opponent this season, while UConn became just the fourth team this season to score 70 points or more against Carolina. The Gamecocks were nearly even on the glass, trailing their opponent just 30-33. Charles led all scorers and rebounders with 21 points and 14 boards. Three other Huskies reached double-figure points.

For the Gamecocks, Sutton and Kennedy tied for team-high honors, scoring 11 points each. Demetress Adams and May tied for team-high rebounding honors, grabbing five each.

South Carolina's Demetress Adams struck the final blow at the buzzer to give the Gamecocks a $56-55$ win over NC State Sunday afternoon at Reynolds Coliseum. The teams were tied at the half, and the Wolfpack overcame a double-digit South Carolina lead midway through the second half to set up lategame heroics for both teams.

The teams battled back and forth in the first 20 minutes to hit the locker room tied 21-21. South Carolina stormed into the second half with a 13-2 run to take an 11-point lead just four minutes into the period. The Gamecocks built the lead on the inside game as Jewel May opened with a layup from the left block and Adams muscled through the lane for a basket. Beal's jumper pushed the margin to three points. Brionna Dickerson answered with a long jumper then converted an offensive rebound on the next possession to give Carolina the lead back at 52-51 with 1:08 to go.

South Carolina suffered a 69-63 defeat at Georgia Sunday at Stegeman Coliseum. The Gamecocks fought back from a sixpoint deficit to tie the game twice before the Lady Bulldogs were perfect in four trips to the free-throw line to seal their victory.

Georgia pushed past a 10-7 Gamecock lead with a 7-0 run. Mitchell and Ashley Houts each hit one of two free throws to give the Lady Bulldogs their first lead of the game at 11-10 with 10:32 left in the period. Jaleesa Rhoden made it a four-point margin with a 3-pointer from the left baseline. South Carolina answered with an 8-0 surge as Dickerson answered Rhoden's 3-pointer with one of her own. La'Keisha Sutton hit a bucket in transition and, after Dickerson hit 1 -of-2 free throws, the freshman added another driving layup for an 18-14 Carolina lead. South Carolina senior guard Brionna Dickerson poured in a season-high 20 points, but it was not enough in a 77-63 loss to No. 19/19 Florida tonight at Colonial Life Arena. The Gamecocks trailed by 10 at the half and saw the lead balloon to 21 points with under eight minutes to play. A $14-2$ run brought the deficit under double digits, but the Gators were solid at the free-throw line in the final minute to seal the victory.

South Carolina senior Brionna Dickerson's career night propelled the Gamecocks to a $76-67$ win at Mississippi Thursday night, the first SEC win of the season for Carolina. South Carolina played much of the game without senior Demetress Adams, who left midway through the first half with an injury, but other post players stepped up.

The game got off to an emotional start for the Gamecocks with a moment of silence to recognize the passing of Kay Yow and with sophomore Jewel May wearing the No. 24 jersey in honor of senior Demetress Adams, who had her career cut short by a knee injury suffered at Mississippi on Thursday. On the other hand, Vanderbilt came out shooting and stormed to a 14-point lead just eight minutes into the game.

Samone Kennedy stopped a 12-0 Vanderbilt run with a driving layup, and Pace drilled a 3-pointer from the top of the key to narrow the gap to nine at $20-11$. Merideth Marsh hit a bucket to push the margin back to double-digits, but Carolina's Brionna Dickerson suffered a right knee sprain in the ensuing melee under the basket.

The Gamecocks were emotional yet again, but responded in much the way they had when Adams left the Mississippi game just three days ago. May hit a bucket from the right block then swiped a steal on the other end to set up Pace's second 3-pointer from the top of the key. La'Keisha Sutton took a charge on the Commodores' next possession, and Kennedy hit a pull-up jumper in the lane to pull the Gamecocks within 18-22 with nine minutes left to play.

Vanderbilt got back on track, stringing together nine straight points, aided by four Carolina turnovers, over a five-minute span to get the lead back to 13 points. Pace ended the spurt with a long jump shot, which also keyed a 6-0 surge for the Gamecocks. Lauren Falohun hit a driving layup, and Charenee Stephens scored from the right block to pull within seven.

After leading by 10 at the half, Vanderbilt saw the Gamecocks continue to battle back. Christine Wirth put the Commodores up 40-29 with a mid-range jumper at the 15:14 mark but were then held scoreless over the next two minutes. South Carolina dropped a 63-56 decision to LSU at Colonial Life Arena tonight after a second-half rally that saw the deficit close to five points in the final three minutes. The Gamecock out-scored the Lady Tigers by two in the second half, but could not get over the hump in the final minutes.

The Gamecocks did not reach double figures until Miranda Tate's 3-pointer with 4:36 left in the first half. The LSU lead was as large as 15 points with 3:36 left in the half before Carolina went on an 8-0 run to close within seven. Sutton kicked off the surged with a driving layup and kept things going with a 3-pointer from the top of the key after Courtney Newton buried a pair of layups. South Carolina got a game-high 15 points from freshman La'Keisha Sutton but could not overcome a cold-shooting first half in a 61-47 loss at Kentucky tonight. The Gamecocks managed just 15 points in the first half, rebounding in the second half to out-score the Wildcats by one. It was simply not enough to overcome a 15 -point halftime deficit.

The Gamecocks let the icy weather outside infiltrate their shooting in the first half, making just four field goals in the first 20 minutes of play. The lack of points was not for lack of good looks at the basket as Carolina shot just 14.3 percent (4-of-28) in the period. Meanwhile, Kentucky was shooting just 38.2 percent but capitalizing on 12 offensive rebounds to put together sustained surges throughout the half.

The first Wildcat spurt was an 8-0 run with just more than four minutes gone in the game. Victoria Dunlap opened the surge with a pair of free throws. Eleia Roddy added the next four points, and Amani Franklin capped it with a driving layup for 14-4 Wildcat lead. Miranda Tate hit a 3-pointer from the left sideline to cut the lead to seven, but the Gamecocks would get no closer and trailed 15-30 at the break.

The Gamecocks' shooting improved early in the second half, but the Wildcats continued to pull away. South Carolina 68, Alabama 57<br>February 15, 2009<br>Colonial Life Arena (Columbia, S.C.)

South Carolina senior C.J. Pace scored 13 of her 18 points in the second half to lead the Gamecocks (10-14, 2-9 SEC) to a $68-57$ win over Alabama at Colonial Life Arena. The 5,438 fans saw South Carolina go on an $18-6$ run in the final six minutes to collect is first home league win of the season.

South Carolina came back from an early deficit to tie the game 17-17 midway through the first half on Miranda Tate's 3-pointer with the shot clock winding down. Alabama put together a 9-3 run to stretch its lead back to six just three minutes later, but the Gamecocks again fought back, beginning with a 3-pointer from sophomore Samone Kennedy and Pace's improbable, offbalance runner in the lane, which narrowed the gap to 25-26 with $4: 26$ left in the period. Courtney Strauthers hit a free throw to briefly interrupt the surge, but Lakeish Sutton knotted the game at 27-27 with a pair of free throws. Pace sank a 3-pointer from the right wing for a $30-27$ lead that the Gamecocks would not relinquish.

After taking a three-point lead into halftime, South Carolina withstood every surge the Crimson Tide made. After Courtney Newton's 3-pointer from the top of the key and Charenee Stephens' bucket from the right block gave the Gamecocks a seven-point lead, back-to-back inside baskets brought Alabama back within three with 12:38 left on the clock. The lead hovered around five points for the next six minutes, until a putback by Dedrea Magee cut the Gamecocks' advange to just two at 50-48 with 6:29 left to go.

A barrage of second-half 3-pointers dealt South Carolina an 82-66 loss at No. 15/15 Florida this afternoon at the O'Connell Center. The Gamecocks ( $10-15,2-10$ SEC) shot 53.1 percent in the second half, but could not match the Gators' 7 -of-11 shooting from 3 -point range over the final 20 minutes. Four Gamecocks scored in double figures with freshman La'Keisha Sutton leading the way with 17 , while Courtney Newton tied for team-high honors with a career-high seven rebounds and four steals.

A late rally in the first half sent the Gamecocks into the locker room trailing just 30-26 after Carolina had fallen behind by as many as 14 midway through the period. Following a 12-2 Florida run that saw the Gators push the lead to $28-14$ with $5: 33$, the Gamecocks put together their own 12-2 spurt to close the half, crashing the boards hitting free throws. Sutton kicked off the surge with a driving layup and free throw as the Gamecocks broke Florida's full-court pressure. Lauren Falohun hit a pair of free throws, and Charenee Stephens stuck back an offensive rebound to cut the deficit to 21-28 with 3:51 left in the half. Ndidi Madu hit a bucket for Florida at 3:26, but it was the last basket the Gators would score as C.J. Pace and Falohun combined for five points, largely at the free-throw line to end the half.

The teams traded baskets through the eight-minute mark of the second half, although the Gators extended their lead to six points with six 3 -pointers to just three for the Gamecocks during the stretch. After Newton hit a mid-range jumper for a 50-56 South Carolina deficit, the Gators opened a 7-0 run with a traditional three-point play from Sharielle Smith, who kept it going with a jumper just beyond the free-throw line. Marshae Dotson capped it with a move on the right block for a 63-50 lead with 6:20 left to play. Carolina answered with a driving layup from Sutton and a pair of free throws from Stephens, but nine points was as close as the Gamecocks would get despite a scrappy defensive effort.

Sutton was joined in double figures by Stephens and Pace, who netted 11 each, and Falohun, who finished with 10. Pace matched Newton with seven rebounds to lead the team, while Kennedy handed out a team-high five assists.

Cold shooting in the second half dealt South Carolina a 5841 loss at Mississippi State tonight as the Gamecocks fell to 10 16 on the season. After trailing by just one point at the half, the Gamecocks took a brief lead early in the second period but could not sustain their defensive pressure and saw the Lady Bulldogs surge ahead midway through the half.

South Carolina had a two-point lead at the half but could not stop Kentucky in the second period as the Wildcats posted a $70-53$ victory at Colonial Life Arena. The 3,187 fans that came to send the 2008-09 Gamecock Senior Class out in style saw a hard-fought first half before a 17-4 Kentucky run early in the second half established a decisive lead for the visiting team.

The Gamecocks took a 29-27 lead into halftime thanks to offensive rebounding limiting their turnovers. South Carolina built a lead early in the game as Jewel May netted the first two buckets of the game. The Gamecocks stayed focused on the interior game and had a 13-8 lead at the 11:39 mark after Charenee Stephens hit a bucket on the left block after an inside handoff from Courtney Newton. The lead grew to six on a pair of free throws from Lauren Falohun and a 3-pointer from Pace.

Kentucky's Carly Morrow sparked the Wildcats with a 3 -pointer. It was the beginning of a $10-0$ surge that would put Kentucky on top 22-18 with just over five minutes left in the period. A La'Keisha Sutton drive stopped the spurt, and, following a Wildcat free throw, Stephens hit another short shot from the right block to cut the lead to one. Samone Kennedy picked Carly Ormerod's pocket on the next trip down the court, and her resulting layup put the Gamecocks back on top 24-23 with 2:46 left before the break.

Back-to-back buckets from UK's Victoria Dunlap gave the Wildcats a three-point lead with inside a minute in the half. On the next possession, Pace snagged a pair of offensive rebounds and, after being fould on the last one, hit a pair of free throws. A Kentucky turnover gave the Gamecocks a final possession, which led to a 3-pointer from the top of the key by Pace to send her team into the locker room with the lead.

The teams tradied the lead six times in the first five minutes of the half. Kennedy's runner in the lane was the last bucket of the stretch, giving the Gamecocks a 40-39 lead with 15:18 left to play. Four consecutive Gamecock turnovers helped the Wildcats end the back-and-forth and use a 9-0 run, during which they scored inside to establish a 48-40 lead just three minutes later.

Stephens hit a shot from the right block, but Dunlap answered quickly on the other end. Another Kennedy driving bucket looked to right the ship for South Carolina, but Eleia Roddy scored six of the game's next eight points to further extend the Kentucky lead. Her final move on the left block put the Wildcats up 58-44 with 7:39 on the clock, but the lead would not be in jeopardy again.

South Carolina ended its season with a 49-39 loss to Mississippi State in the first round of the SEC Tournament at Alltel Arena. The Gamecocks jumped out to a big early lead but struggled to find the basket in the second half to finish with 13 points in the last 20 minutes of the game.
C.J. Pace opened things up with the game's first five points on an inside move for a jumper from the left block and then a 3 -pointer from the left baseline. Swarming defense and dominance of the defensive glass helped Carolina hold Mississippi State scoreless until the 9:26 mark of the first half. On the other side of the floor, aggressive moves to the basket set up mid-range and outside jumpers to spark an 18-0 run to start the game.
