



Mark Berson, one of three coaches all-time to post 450 victories while coaching only in NCAA Division I, begins his 37th season at the helm of the South Carolina soccer program in 2014. Berson has been at South Carolina from the beginning, hired in 1978 to move the program to varsity status.

Before coming to Carolina in 1978, Berson went 11-5-0 in one season at The Citadel, making his overall record 462-205-68, a .675 winning percentage at the start of 2014. In 2006, Berson became one of five active (at that time) Division I coaches and the 10th all-time to reach the 400-victory milestone when his Gamecocks defeated UAB, 2-0, in a televised contest at Stone Stadium. Berson entered the year with a 451-200-68 record at South Carolina.

Berson has taken the Gamecocks to 20 NCAA Tournaments, with those teams advancing to at least the second round 11 times. His squads have four quarterfinal and two NCAA College Cup appearances to their credit as well. In 1993, the Gamecocks advanced to the NCAA Championship Game.

Though Carolina has been independent during the majority of the program's tenure, the Gamecocks have captured four conference titles under Berson's leadership. Carolina won the 1993 Metro Conference Championship in one of its two years competing in the conference. The Gamecocks joined Conference USA in 2005 and promptly claimed the league's tournament championship and automatic berth to the NCAA Tournament, while Carolina also won the C-USA Championship Tournament in 2010 and collected the regular season championship in 2011.

Besides making an impact in collegiate soccer, Berson's presence is also felt at higher ranks. The Gamecocks are one of only two collegiate programs to have had a player on each of the last four United States World Cup teams. Josh Wolff competed on the United States World Cup team for the second time during the summer of 2006 and was also an Olympic team member in 2000. Clint Mathis, a teammate of Wolff during his time at Carolina, also enjoyed a celebrated professional career that spanned 11 seasons in Major League Soccer. Mathis, who retired from professional soccer in 2010, was a member of the 2002 U.S. World Cup squad and helped his MLS team, Real Salt Lake, capture the MLS Cup in 2009. Mathis also graced the cover of Sports Illustrated in May 2002 prior to the World Cup, marking the third Gamecock athlete, in any sport, to be featured on the cover of the prestigious magazine. Former Gamecock goalkeeper Brad Guzan was honored during the summer of 2010 with a roster spot on the U.S. Men's National Team for the 2014 FIFA World Cup in South Africa. The netminder continued the Gamecocks' streak with a roster spot for the 2014 FIFA World Cup in Brazil.

Berson led Carolina to a 113-39-12 mark (.726) in the 1990s, which rated the Gamecocks as one of the winningest programs in NCAA Division I soccer. In 1998, Berson earned the inaugural Independent Coach of the Year award after leading Carolina to the best record of all Independent schools. Berson has also been honored as the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) Coach of the Year in the South Region on four occasions (1984, 1985, 1988, 1995).

Berson has been involved in soccer development as a coach, teacher and administrator on many levels. He is a U.S. Soccer National Instructional Staff Coach with an "A" coaching license and has served as a US Soccer National Instructional staff coach since 1989. He has served as State Coach for the South Carolina Youth Soccer Association (SCYSA), working in player development and coaching certification. In 1992, he was inducted into the South Carolina Youth Soccer Association Hall of Fame.

Berson also coached the U.S. National U-18 team in the Granatkin/Leningrad Tournament in January 1989, in the Soviet Union. In July 1987, he directed the South team to the gold medal in the U.S. Olympic Festival in Durham, N.C., one year after serving as an assistant coach for the South squad.

A 1971 graduate of Summit (N.J.) High School, Berson attended the University of North Carolina and received

his bachelor of arts degree in journalism in 1975. Berson played on the Tar Heel soccer squad for four years, one as a midfielder and the other three in goal. As a senior, Berson received the UNC Educational Foundation Award and was a member of the Academic ACC Honor Roll. Berson earned his master's of education degree in sport administration from Ohio University in 1977.

Born March 16, 1953, in Hartford, Conn., Berson is married to the former Shauna Hopkins, a South Carolina alum, of Columbia. They have two children, Erin Rhea and Luke William. Erin graduated from South Carolina in 2009, and Luke is currently enrolled at the University of South Carolina in the Moore School of Business.

SOUTH CAROLINA TEAM NOTES

- The Gamecocks have the fifth-highest paid attendance average in NCAA Division I, at 3,057 fans in 2014.
- Contrast that to the road crowds that average 528 fans (Coastal Carolina, ETSU, FIU).
- South Carolina has been a second-half team, winning more corner kicks (37-22) and shot chances (86-66) in the second 45 in its 11 matches.
- Three Gamecocks have played every minute this year: senior Braeden Troyer and sophomores Ive Burnett and Kurtis Turner.
- South Carolina has taken 104 of their 144 shots in five home matches: Belmont, Mercer, UNC Greensboro, Marshall and Georgia State.
- Three times, SC has held foes to 1 or no shots on goal: Belmont, Marshall and Georgia State.
- The Gamecocks stand with an all-time record of 457-205-68 (.672).
- The 3-0 start was South Carolina's best since 2004, when it won its first four matches.
- The paid attendance of 5,415 for the season-opening match against Belmont ranks as the 4th-best in Stone Stadium history and 8th in the site's history of men's matches.
- Ranked 17th in the Sept. 9 NSCAA/Continental Tire poll, South Carolina received its first ranking since the last regular season poll of 2011 (23rd).

BERSON TRYING TO MOVE UP NCAA COACHING WINS LIST

- The only head coach in South Carolina men's soccer history, Mark Berson ranks as one of four coaches in NCAA Division I history with 450 wins at one institution.
- Berson owns 468 career victories, which includes his 11 in 1977 at The Citadel.
- He holds 6th on the NCAA Division I wins list and is tied for 16th on the all-divisions listing.
- With one more win, Berson would break a tie with former Kean head coach Tony Ochrimenko and hold 16th alone on the all-divisions list.
- He's coached 11 players who have captured 13 All-America nods at South Carolina.
- He's also guided at least one player on each of the past four US Men's National Teams in the World Cup (Clint Mathis 2002, Josh Woolf 2002 and 2006, Brad Guzan 2010 and 2014).

SOUTH CAROLINA CELEBRATING 10 YEARS IN CONFERENCE USA

- The 2014 season is South Carolina's 10th as a men's soccer affiliate member of Conference USA.
- In 2011, the Garnet and Black captured the league's regular-season crown, sharing it with UAB.
- Twice, the Gamecocks have won the league's tournament (2005 and 2010).
- South Carolina's student-athletes have taken 40 all-league nods, with 14 coming on the first team.
- In C-USA outings, South Carolina owns a 36-25-16 (.571) mark.
- At Stone Stadium, that record is 19-13-6 (.579).

TROYER NAMED A SENIOR CLASS AWARD CANDIDATE

- On Sept. 2, the Senior CLASS Award announced its 30 candidates for its men's award, naming Gamecock Braeden Troyer to the list.
- Troyer leads all SC returners with 10 career goals, tied for seventh in Gamecock history during the Conference USA era (since 2005).
- Twice he's been named to the C-USA All-Academic Team, and he has three All-C-USA nods, ('12 second team, '11 & '13 third team).
- He also made the 2011 Conference USA All-Freshman Team and has been honored once on the College Soccer News Team of the Week (Sept. 29, 2013).
- On two occasions, CoSIDA has voted him on the Capital One Academic All-District 4 team.
- In the classroom, he's been a member of the Honors College at South Carolina and earned three C-USA Academic Medals, given to student-athletes with a 3.75 GPA.
- He's a co-captain in 2014 (along with Mahamoudou "Mo" Kaba).

WE SCHEDULED STRONG FOES

- Of the 17 regular-season matches scheduled this season for the Gamecocks, 12 come against top-100 RPI teams in the final 2013 report from the NCAA.
- Seven rank in the top 50, four from C-USA (Charlotte, UAB, Old Dominion & New Mexico).
- Four foes made the NSCAA/Continental Tire Preseason Top 25, well, 26 when you count Old Dominion tying for the 25th spot with Navy.
- SC is 1-3 against top-35 teams in the latest RPI report, with UAB the next to join that group.
- Five of South Carolina's remaining six foes have RPIs in the top 90, including two top-25 foes.
- Two teams currently ranked remain on the schedule: No. 21 UAB and No. 12/15 New Mexico.
- The Gamecocks are 1-1-0 against a ranked team in 2014, beating No. 25/18 Clemson.

RECENT DOMINANCE OF ARCHRIVAL CLEMSON

- Since 2007, the Gamecocks are 6-2 against their archrival Clemson, with both of the losses coming in double overtime on the road (2011 & 2013).
- The last four matches at Stone Stadium have gone to the Gamecocks, three coming in shutouts.
- It's the best stretch since the Gamecocks went 10-4 from 1985-95 against the Tigers, with three of the wins in that stretch coming in NCAA Tournament play.

GAMECOCKS VS. RANKED FOES

- South Carolina is 32-54-9 (.384) against foes ranked in the NSCAA top 25 (since 1996).
- Broken down by site, the Gamecocks are 17-25-4 (.413) at home, 11-18-5 (.397) on the road and 4-11 (.267) in neutral-site outings.
- In 2013, the Gamecocks went 2-2 against teams ranked in the NSCAA poll at the time of the game, including a 1-1 mark on the road.
- South Carolina had taken its last three meetings against a ranked team before the Oct. 4 loss to No. 10 Charlotte (No. 25 New Mexico on 10/26/13, No. 10 UAB on 11/3/13, No. 25 Clemson on 9/2/14).

DELAYS AND WAITING PART OF GAMECOCK SEASON

- The first three South Carolina games all came with some sort of delayed start.
- For the season opener against Belmont, the previous games at Stone Stadium pushed the start back to 9:37, over an hour later than the 8:30 PM scheduled start.
- Lightning in the Columbia area pushed back the start against No. 25/18 Clemson by 1:40.
- Heavy rains brought standing water to the Stone Stadium pitch for a time, but the field crew and event managers got it cleared and ready for a 7:15 PM kickoff, 15 minutes after the set time.

Awards Came in Bunches in Second Week

- Sophomore goalkeeper Marco Velez won two honors over Sept. 8-9, the Conference USA Defensive Player of the Week and the Disney Soccer/NSCAA Player of the Week.
- It's Velez's second C-USA weekly honor, matching his award on Oct. 28, 2013, as a freshman.
- He's the first national player of the week for SC since Bradlee Baladez took the College Soccer News award on Oct. 4, 2010.
- The last Gamecock to earn NSCAA Player of the Week was Ayo Akinsete on Oct. 25, 2006.
- Mahamoudou Kaba took a spot on CSN's Team of the Week on Sept. 8 after garnering the C-USA Preseason Defensive Player of the Year award.

ROSTER NOTES

- South Carolina brought back 18 letter-winners to go with nine newcomers for 2014.
- The Gamecocks return 80 percent of their goals and 76 percent of their assists from last year.
- Included in that returning group is the top-two goal scorers (Jeffrey Torda and Mahamoudou Kaba) and the top-two assist distributors (Kurtis Turner and Ryan Arambula).
- Only one goalkeeper of three who played in 2013 is not back from last year (Chris Duzan, 30:19).
- Four Conference USA award winners return, including defenders Kaba and Braeden Troyer as well as 2013 All-Freshman Team members Turner (midfielder) and Marco Velez (goalkeeper).
- Both Kaba and Troyer made the C-USA Preseason team, with Kaba garnering the Defensive Player
 of the Year title.

GAMECOCKS HAVE A RICH HISTORY IN NCAA TOURNAMENT

- On 20 occasions, the Gamecocks made an NCAA Tournament, the most in Conference USA.
- Eleven times, the Gamecocks have played the NCAA Tournament Round of 16.
- South Carolina is 16-19-1 in the tourney, making two College Cups in 1988 and 1993.

THE GAMECOCKS SHINE IN THE CLASSROOM AS WELL

- South Carolina's 18 returners have a total of 30 SEC Academic Honor Roll certificates and 31 Conference USA Academic Honor Roll notations between them.
- Of those, 10 are Conference USA Academic Medal mentions, which is awarded to student-athletes with a 3.75 cumulative GPA or higher.
- Troyer has three of those Academic Medals, while both Ryan Arambula and Jeffrey Torda have two.
- Four of the seniors, Robert Beebe, Mahamoudou "Mo" Kaba, Asa Kryst and Braeden Troyer have three certificates each.

SCOUTING UAB

- UAB enters Saturday's contest with a 6-4-1 record, losing the last two to Akron and Kentucky 1-0.
- Foes have outshot the Blazers, 121-101, with the team being called for 121 fouls compared to 85
- committed by the opposition.Eleven of the team's 18 goals have come in the second half.
- Junior Freddy Ruiz, the C-USA Preseason Offensive Player of the Year, leads the Blazers with five goals and has added two assists.
- Ruiz is tied for the team lead in points with redshirt senior Alex Clay's four goals and four assists.
- Redshirt junior Stewart Abrahart has three assists, while freshman David Valverde has two.
- Ten Blazers have contribued to the team's 18 goals, while 11 different student-athletes have registered at least one helper.
- Redshirt junior Joe Kuzminsky has 40 saves and a 1.16 goals against average, playing every minute.
- He's posted one shutout, coming in the team's only overtime match, a draw against Dayton.

SERIES HISTORY VS. THE BLAZERS

- The Gamecocks are 9-4-1 against UAB, including a 7-3-1 mark since joining the Blazers in Conference USA in 2005.
- At Stone Stadium versus UAB, South Carolina is 3-2-1, dropping the 2012 matchup in Columbia.

SOUTH CAROLINA VS. UAB - BIRMINGHAM, ALA.

With goals from midfielder Jeffrey Torda and forward Asa Kryst in the 85th minute, South Carolina upset No. 10 UAB 4-3 in a back-and-forth thriller at West Campus Field.

UAB looked to be on its way to victory after a goal from Moses Adeniran with less than seven minutes remaining. Ian Svantesson was credited with the assist on the goal that gave the Blazers a 3-2 lead.

It took the Gamecocks less than two minutes to pull even for the second time in the match. Stephen Anderson sent a ball towards Torda, who contained the ball and sent it to the lower left corner of the goal to tie the match at 3-3. Just 44 seconds later, Kryst found himself on the other end of a cross from Kotv Millard. Kryst deftly netted

what would be the game-winner with just 5:03 on the clock.

In the first half, Torda collected a loose ball in the six-yard box and pushed it past keeper Joe Kuzminsky to give SC a 1-0 lead in the ninth minute.

In the 26th minute, the Blazers equalized. Freddy Ruiz took the ball to the endline and found Norris Howze near the top of the six-yard box. Howze fired a low ball through traffic and in the net towards the near post, tying the score at 1-1.

It took UAB just 10 minutes in the second half to take its first lead of the match. Patrick Huang sailed a long free kick into the box, connecting with Darion Copeland who scored on the header for a 2-1 Blazer lead.

Set-up by a long ball from J.P. Rafferty, Eli Dent leveled the score at 2-2 on a well-placed strike to the keeper's right in the 61st minute.

With just 12 seconds on the clock, Howze gave the Gamecocks a scare with a rocket that flew straight to the goal. The ball hit the crossbar and sailed out of play to give South Carolina the 4-3 victory.
