NOTEWORTHY

SOUTH CAROLINA TEAM NOTES

- Out of the six hitters who have played in half the sets and averaged at least one kill per set, three hit over .265 (Thévenin, Howley and Dozier).
- The Gamecocks are undefeated when they win the blocking battle (8-0). More record breakdowns are found on page 6.
- At No. 21 Tennessee (9/23), the Gamecocks did not allow an ace, successfully passing all 87 serves they received.
- The last time South Carolina did not allow an ace came in Scott Swanson's first game as head coach, against Montana on Aug. 26, 2011.
- On the Mississippi weekend trip, the Gamecocks only gave up four points in the service game (two service errors at Mississippi State, one ace at both MSU and Ole Miss).
- The Oct. 21 outing against the Rebels was the first all year the team did not make a service error.
- Only two non-conference opponents hit over .200 against South Carolina: East Tennessee State (.207) and UAB (.285). In 14 of the 15 SEC matches, the foes have topped that mark.
- One win stands between the Gamecocks and an overall .500 record for the year. It would mark the second time in the last decade that the team has accomplished that feat.
- Four teams went undefeated in the opening weekend of SEC play: Florida, Missouri, Texas A&M and South Carolina.

ALL ABOUT THE WINNING STREAK

- The 13-0 start for the Gamecocks ranks as the best in the program's NCAA-era history. The 1983 team began the season 12-0.
- The 13-match winning streak was the second-longest documented skein in program history.
- The longest winning streak came in 1983, as the team posted a 14-match streak from Oct. 15-Nov. 18.
- The loss that ended the longest skein came in the 1983 Metro Conference Tournament final. Florida State won the five-set match to earn the automatic berth to the third NCAA Tournament. The field only had 28 teams at the time.
- That 1983 team also had the best start previously in program history with 12 wins. That was the second-longest documented winning streak for the Gamecocks until this year.
- For the second-consecutive year, South Carolina was the last undefeated team in the Southeastern Conference.

THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN WINNING & LOSING

- South Carolina hits .319 in matches it wins and .180 in those it loses, a .149 difference.
- The opponents when South Carolina wins hit .169. That jumps to .345 if the Gamecocks lose, a .176 gap.
- Winning Gamecock matches see SC post 2.75 more digs per set than the opposition. When the foes triumph, the Gamecocks are outdug by 2.63 a frame.
- In wins, South Carolina wins the blocking battle by averages of 2.06 to 1.61. In setbacks, the Gamecocks get outblocked 2.67 to 1.45.

ATTACKING THE RECORD BOOK

- Taylor Bruns is sixth in assists (2,666), passing Shellie Higgins with her 37 assists at Coastal Carolina. Bruns is also eighth in assists per set (7.45) in Gamecock history.
- Juliette Thévenin stands 12th in SC history with 1,030 kills and 10th with 2,678 attacks.
- Fifty kills ties Thévenin with Caryn Case in 11th place.
- Thévenin's now second in kills per set (3.81) and 11th in digs per set (2.76) on the career charts.
- Thévenin ranks 14th on the career points chart (as it would stand had everyone played in the rally-scoring era) with 1,140. Just 16 points would move Thévenin into 13th past Amy Collinsworth.
- She's fourth on the points-per-set charts with a 4.22 average.
- Cara Howley stands 15th on the career hitting percentage charts (.249). Thévenin ranks 19th at .244.
- Paige Wheeler's 933 digs is tied with Caryn Case for 15th on the career dig charts.
- Paige Wheeler is third on SC's career charts in digs per set (3.57).

NOTEWORTHY

GAMECOCKS IN THE SEC STAT SUPERLATIVES

- South Carolina hit the third-highest hitting percentage in four-set match (.370 vs. Niagara) and in a five-setter (.297 vs. ETSU) for an SEC team this fall.
- Cara Howley's five aces at Mississippi State tied for the most for an SEC player in a three-set match and for second in any match length this year.
- The Gamecocks' .402 hitting percentage at Mississippi State is the eighth-best mark in SEC play this season.
- In SEC matches only, Juliette Thévenin has the third-most kills in a three-set match this year (18 vs. Georgia and LSU) and the fifth-most in a four-set contest (22 vs. Auburn).
- Thévenin also stands second (20.5 vs. Georgia) in points in a sweep this year in an SEC match.

HISTORICAL RECORDS

- South Carolina is 721-547 (.569) all-time in volleyball.
- In the Volleyball Competition Facility, the team stands at 146-74 (.664).

COMPETITION LEVEL RISING

- Two of the three opponents in the 2012 Carolina Clash held better final 2011 RPIs than SC's first eight foes.
- Clemson finished at 54, UAB 84 and Winthrop 149 in the last RPI of 2011 (Niagara was 146).
- In the sixth RPI report from the NCAA (Nov. 5), the Gamecocks ranked 95th.
- South Carolina beat top 100 RPI teams Clemson (54), Georgia (53) and LSU (70).
- Nine of the 12 losses came against top-100 RPI teams (Florida 13, Kentucky 17, Tennessee 20, Texas A&M twice 24, Auburn twice 51, Missouri 52, LSU 70).

Home Matches Notes

- South Carolina is playing 17 matches plus one exhibition in the Volleyball Competition Facility this fall, the most since moving into the building in 1996.
- It's one more than the inaugural season of the VCF, when SC hosted the 1996 SEC Tournament.
- The most home matches ever for South Carolina came in 1990, when the team hosted 21 contests.
- The match against Clemson on Sept. 7 had 1,512 fans in attendance, the third-largest crowd in the history of the Volleyball Competition Facility.
- It was the largest crowd since 2001 in the building, when 1,793 people packed the stands for the Sept. 21 match against Florida.
- The 1,512 fans were nearly 250 over the capacity of the gym in the setup the team utilized starting during SEC play last fall.
- Four times, over 1,000 people have packed the VCF for a match, tying the 1996 inaugural year in the building for the most crowds over 1,000.
- This 2012 team holds the second-longest winning streak for a Gamecock team since moving into the VCF in 1996, winning 12 straight matches from Nov. 6, 2011 to Sept. 16, 2012.
- All three double-digit VCF winning streaks were snapped by Florida, a 17-match span from Oct. 14, 2001 to Oct. 24, 2002, a 10-match stretch from Sept. 13, 2000, to Nov. 10, 2000, and the latest.

ROSTER NOTES

- Eight freshman, including seven true rookies, are a part of the 17-person roster.
- Three players hail from each South Carolina and Texas, the most on the team.
- A pair of student-athletes both hail from California and Maryland.
- Six other states and another country are represented by the seven remaining athletes.
- For the 17th-consecutive season, the Gamecocks have had at least one international player.
- A total of 16 players have appeared on the court so far. Only freshman Kira Speer has not seen any
 action and is on track for a redshirt year.

SOUTH CAROLINA OVERVIEW

- South Carolina returns four starters and its starting libero from the 2011 team.
- That 2011 team, the first coached by Scott Swanson, doubled the win total from the previous year.
- The leading attacker by kills, junior outside hitter Juliette Thévenin, is back.
- $\bullet\ \$ The top defender by digs, junior libero Paige Wheeler, returns.
- Setters Taylor Bruns and Lexie Pawlik make up the vast majority of the 97 percent of assists back.
- The Gamecocks lost almost 50 percent of the team blocks from last season.
- The next highest total of "lost" stats are kills, where 32.2 percent departed.
- Last season, the Gamecocks led the SEC in digs per set. Only 12.2 percent of those departed.

PRESEASON TOURNAMENT ACCOLADES

- Cara Howley earned Gamecock Invitational MVP honors.
- Joining Howley on the all-tournament team were Christina Vereb and Paige Wheeler.
- Juliette Thévenin took Patriot Invitational Most Outstanding Player and Best Hitter honors.
- Taylor Bruns was named Best Setter, and Wheeler claimed Best Defender accolades.
- Bruns claimed the MVP award for the Carolina Clash, and joining her on the all-tournament team was Howley and Thévenin.

(RECENT) HOME TOURNAMENT HISTORY

- South Carolina has hosted a home tournament every year since 2000 except for 2001 and 2005.
- The Gamecocks have won six of the last seven home non-conference events, including perfect marks in both tourneys this fall.
- This is the first year since 2003 that the Gamecocks have hosted two pre-conference tournaments.

A LOOK AT THE WEEKEND'S OPPONENTS

SCOUTING MISSISSIPPI STATE

The Bulldogs stand at 4-20 overall and 0-15 in SEC play. Recently getting back setter Rachel Williams, Mississippi State won its first set since Sept. 28 last Sunday against Alabama. The Bulldogs rank in the bottom two of the SEC-only stats in every team category except digs, where they stand fifth.

Williams' return puts the Bulldogs' best player, Roxanne McVey, back to the libero spot, where she leads the SEC with 5.64 digs per set. In SEC play, that mark is 5.40, still 0.36 better than the next person. Taylor Scott, Lainey Wyman and Sarah Nielsen all average over two kills a set, but only Nielsen has a hitting percentage over .200. Scott adds 2.93 digs per set to go with her team-best 2.89 kills average. Wyman leads the team with 0.87 blocks a frame.

SERIES HISTORY VS. THE BULLDOGS

South Carolina owns a 27-10 advantage in the all-time series against Mississippi State. In the VCF, that mark improves to 11-2. The Gamecocks swept the Bulldogs last year at home.

THE LAST TIME VS. MISSISSIPPI STATE - OCT. 19, 2012

South Carolina posted a dominating sweep at Mississippi State, taking the sets 25-9, 25-15, 25-9, at Humphrey Coliseum.

Gamecock junior outside hitter Juliette Thévenin posted a match-best 15 kills without an error, hitting .556 in the contest. Freshman middle blocker Darian Dozier set a personal best with a .600 hitting percentage on a then career-best tying 10 kills. Redshirt sophomore middle blocker Cara Howley had a career-best five of the Gamecocks' nine aces, a season best for South Carolina, while junior libero Paige Wheeler led everyone with 16 digs. Outside hitters Jenna Allen and Bethanie Thomas added 14 and 13 digs, respectively. Senior setter Taylor Bruns compiled 35 assists and nine digs.

Lainey Wyman led Mississippi State with eight kills. Alex Scott and Chanelle Baker tied for the Bulldogs' best with 11 digs.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE

Receiving votes in the latest AVCA poll, Tennessee enters the weekend fresh off a five-set win at then-No. 13 Florida, handing the Gators their first loss in SEC play. The Lady Vols play great defense, posting 2.63 blocks per set, third in SEC games only, and 17.28 digs a frame, second in league-only outings. Tennessee hits .239 in league matches, fourth in the standings, and holds foes to a .194 clip, fifth in the league.

Kelsey Robinson leads the Tennessee attack, posting 4.35 kills and 3.50 digs a frame, the latter second on the team to libero Ellen Mullins' 4.42 average. Tiffany Baker presents a strong second offensive option, tallying 3.11 kills a set. A trio of seniors, Leslie Cikra, DeeDee Harrison and Kayla Jeter also provide plenty of offense when in the rotation. Harrison leads the block, posting 1.19 a frame, while Olivia Okoro has taken more playing time recently and averaged 0.91 blocks a set. Mary Pollmiller guides the attack, dishing 10.48 assists a frame.

SERIES HISTORY VS. THE LADY VOLS

The earliest documented foe of South Carolina, Tennessee holds a 32-25 advantage in the series, including eight-straight Lady Vol wins. In the VCF, South Carolina is 10-6 against UT, but the Lady Vols have won the last three outings in Columbia.

THE LAST TIME VS. TENNESSEE - SEPT. 23, 2012

A resilient South Carolina squad came within a couple of points of forcing a fifth set, but No. 21 Tennessee prevailed in four, 25-14, 25-20, 23-25, 25-23, in front of 1,052 fans at Thompson-Boling Arena.

Kelsey Robinson posted 21 kills and 22 digs for the Lady Vols, while Kayla Jeter added 12 kills. Tiffany Baker had 11 kills and five blocks, three of those solo, while Mercedes Vaughn also had five blocks. Ellen Mullins had 22 digs, while Mary Pollmiller posted 26 assists and 10 digs.

Junior outside hitter Juliette Thévenin posted 14 kills and three aces, leading South Carolina. Senior setter Taylor Bruns added 32 assists, 10 digs, two kills and three block assists. Redshirt sophomore middle blocker Cara Howley and sophomore outside hitter Bethanie Thomas added nine kills each, with Thomas posting 10 digs. Junior libero Paige Wheeler led the Gamecocks with 15 digs.

SCOTT SWANSON

Head Coach • Second Year at South Carolina

- Coached seven teams that played in the NCAA Tournament (Arizona State 1999, 2000, Minnesota 2006-10)
- Part of staff for seven All-Americans
- Recruited three top-10 classes to Minnesota

The 11th head coach in Gamecock Volleyball history, Scott Swanson looks to build upon a season where he helped South Carolina double its win total in his first year.

The Gamecocks went 14-16 in Swanson's first year and improved its offensive efficiency and its backline defense under his guidance. The team led the SEC with a 16.78 digs average, the best mark in four years for the Gamecocks, and hit .226, a 45-point improvement from the 2011 season. Three times, South Carolina student-athletes garnered an SEC weekly award, with Juliette Thévenin picking up the first offensive listing and Paige Wheeler twice gaining the defensive certificate.

Swanson's teams also proved themselves in the classroom, earning the program's second Team Academic Award from the American Volleyball Coaches Association in 2011-12. Thirteen Gamecocks were listed on the SEC Academic Honor Rolls for the year as well, and the team claimed the department's Life Skills Team of the Year award, honoring the group for its academic achievements, personal development and work in the community.

Prior to his current head coaching job, Swanson spent five years on the sidelines for the Golden Gophers, helping the team to five-consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances and a 125-46 record. Three times, Minnesota finished second in the Big Ten behind perennial power Penn State. The 2009 team advanced to the national semifinals in the NCAA Tournament.

During his tenure in Minneapolis, Swanson helped the Golden Gophers become an elite blocking team. In five years, Minnesota never ranked lower than 35th in NCAA Division I in blocks. The 2007 team set a program record with 3.54 blocks per set. Five Golden Gophers earned All-America accolades during those five years, including 2009 first-team middle blocker and 2012 US National Team pool member Lauren Gibbemeyer.

Swanson also led the Gophers' recruiting efforts, posting three top-10 recruiting classes according to *PrepVolleyball.com*. The 2009 group earned top honors from the outlet.

The summer of 2009, Swanson spent time with USA Volleyball's A-2 Junior National Team, and he coached the USA Red team to a second-place showing in the 2008 USA Adult Open Championships.

Swanson brings in four years of head coaching experience to Columbia after his tenure at the University of Texas-El Paso. With a 50-61 career record, Swanson had the team on the brink of the NCAA Tournament in 2005, when the Miners went 21-10. Three players earned all-conference honors under Swanson's tutelage, including honorable mention All-American Kari Stacy. He also inked a high school All-American and saw his team improve in the classroom to a department-best 3.2 GPA in 2005.

Prior to UTEP, Swanson spent six years at his alma mater, Arizona State. He helped the team to two NCAA Tournament appearances during his time in Tempe and coached one second-team All-American and two Pac-10 All-Freshman Team players. Two of his Sun Devil players garnered Academic All-America certificates as well.

Swanson started his coaching career at Mountain View (Ariz.) High School, working as an assistant with the varsity team and leading his junior varsity group to a 17-1 record. As a head coach with the Arizona East Valley Juniors club, he led a 16-1s team to a national runner-up finish and earned Cactus Region Coach of the Year honors. He also served as head coach at Camelback High School before landing the job with Arizona State, where he also played club volleyball.

 \boldsymbol{A} graduate of ASU, Swanson is married to the former Erin Meier. The couple has one daughter, Rylee Sue.
