FOR STARTERS

South Carolina (27-3, 6-3 SEC) continues conference play this week with a three-game series at Arkansas (18-11, 4-5 SEC). First pitch for the opener on Thursday is 8 p.m. ET with the game televised live on ESPNU. Game two of the series is Friday at 7:35 p.m. ET. Saturday's series finale will be televised on Cox Sports Television and is scheduled for 7 p.m. ET. All three games can also be heard on the Gamecock IMG Network including flagship station, 107.5 FM, "The Game."

South Carolina is ranked No. 1 by Collegiate Baseball, No. 2 by Baseball America and the NCBWA as well as No. 3 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches' poll and Perfect Game.

A LOOK BACK

Grayson Greiner's one-out walk-off pinch-hit single in the bottom of the ninth inning lifted top-ranked South Carolina to a 2-1 victory over Appalachian State on Tuesday night.

Left-handed pitcher Vince Fiori worked 1.1 hitless innings of relief to pick up his first win of the season. He is 1-0 on the year. Appalachian State starter Taylor Thurber suffered the loss and is now 0-3 for the season. He allowed a run on three hits in 2.1 innings.

After three scoreless innings, the Gamecocks took a 1-0 lead in the bottom of the fourth. With his second hit in as many at bats, Joey Pankake singled up the middle, stole second and scored on Connor Bright's RBI single.

South Carolina starter Evan Beal hurled 5.1 scoreless innings allowing just two hits and striking out three batters.

The Mountaineers capitalized on a South Carolina error in the top of the sixth to even the score at 1-1. With two outs, Gamecock reliever Josh Reagan hit Preston Troutman with a pitch and then overthrew an attempted pickoff, which allowed Troutman to advance to third. Jaylin Davis followed with a base hit to left field to bring Troutman home

It remained that way until the ninth inning when Connor Bright opened the frame with a single up the middle and advanced to second on pinch hitter Jordan Gore's sacrifice bunt. With a runner in scoring position, Greiner stepped up to the plate. After working the count full, he hammered a 3-2 pitch to left field allowing Bright to score and sealing the Gamecocks' victory.

Carolina's nine-hit evening included a 3-for-4 game for Bright. Pankake went 2-for-3 to extend his hitting streak to 16 games. Jaylin Davis led App State with two hits.

PANKAKE WARMING UP

Junior infielder Joey Pankake owns a 16-game hitting streak. Pankake hit .462 (6-for-13) in the Tennessee series with five runs scored and three RBI. He is hitting a team-best .432 (16-for-37) in SEC contests with nine RBI a pair of homers and 11 runs scored. For the season, Pankake owns a .354 average (35-for-99) with 18 RBI and 31 runs scored. Pankake averages 1.19 runs per game. He owns a .432 on-base percentage and a .495 slugging mark. He went 2-for-3 with two runs and two RBI in the 8-0 win over Tennessee as well as 2-for-4 with a RBI and two runs scored in the 9-6 win and 2-for-6 with a run scored in the 3-2 win over the Volunteers. He is now tied for the team-lead with 12 multi-hit games.

GREINER NAMED PLAYER OF THE WEEK

South Carolina junior catcher Grayson Greiner earned SEC Player of the Week honors as announced by the conference office on Monday afternoon. Greiner hit a walk-off grand slam with two outs in the bottom of the 9th inning to lift South Carolina to a 9-6 win over Tennessee on Saturday. His play along with Jordan Gore's walk-off homer was No. 1 on ESPN's SportsCenter's Top 10 Plays of the Day.

CARDIAC GAMECOCKS

The Gamecocks have rallied three times this season from late deficits and are 4-3 trailing when entering the seventh inning.

South Carolina rallied from a 3-1 deficit in the top of the ninth with four runs in a 5-3 win at Clemson on March 2, 2014. Four consecutive two-out hits in the top of the ninth inning led to four runs. Trailing 3-1 entering the top of the ninth inning, the Gamecocks got things started with a base hit up the middle of the bat of Kyle Martin. With two outs and Martin still on first base, Grayson Greiner kept the inning alive with a single up the middle as well. Pinch hitter Brison Celek fought to a 2-2 count against Clemson reliever Clate Schmidt before knocking a base hit into left field to load the bases. That set the stage for sophomore shortstop Marcus Mooney, who jumped on the first pitch from Schmidt for a single into center field. Martin scored as did Greiner to tie the game. It was a tight play at the plate as center fielder Tyler Slaton's throw made it to home plate, but Clemson catcher Chris Okey was unable to hold on to the ball on a tag attempt as Greiner was sliding in for the tying run. With runners on second and third, Tanner English fought off a pair of two strike pitches and then belted a double to left field scoring both runners and giving the Gamecocks a two-run lead. Junior right-hander Cody Mincey retired all three Tiger batters he faced in the bottom of the ninth inning to secure the Carolina victory.

On March 15, 2014, the Gamecocks rallied from three runs down with two outs in the bottom of the ninth inning to defeat Ole Miss 5-4 in 10 innings. A two-out RBI single by Connor Bright and a two-run homer by pinch hitter Max Schrock tied it in the ninth with pinch hitter Brison Celek winning it for the Gamecocks in the 10th frame with a RBI single.

Last week, Grayson Greiner's walk-off grand slam capped a six-run bottom of the ninth inning as South Carolina rallied from three runs down with two outs and no runners on base to defeat Tennessee 9-6 for a second consecutive walk-off win on the afternoon.

Trailing 6-3 and down to its final at-bat the Gamecocks made their final rally push as pinch hitter Brison Celek kept the inning alive with a base hit to center field. The rally then continued with Max Schrock as the sophomore drove a 1-1 pitch to right field from reliever Josh Peterson just fair of the foul pole in right field for a home run cutting the deficit to one run. After the Volunteers made a change to left-hander Drake Owenby, the Gamecocks stayed alive as a fly ball off the bat of Joey Pankake was mishandled by right fielder Scott Price putting the tying run on second base. Kyle Martin drew a walk and Connor Bright was hit on a 2-2 pitch from Owenby to load the bases and set the stage for Greiner. Tennessee would make one more change as right-hander Peter Lenstrom entered from the bullpen. On a 1-0 pitch, Greiner belted the game-winning homer to left field setting off a frenzy in Carolina Stadium. It was Greiner's fourth home run of the season.

SEDDON SEALS IT

Junior right-hander Joel Seddon has not allowed a run in 16.0 innings of relief in 12 appearances this season. Seddon has yielded just four hits and three walks while striking out 23 batters. Opponents are hitting 0.77 against him. Seddon pitched 2.1 scoreless in the 3-2 win over Tennessee.

GREAT SCOTT

Freshman right-hander Reed Scott has been effective in a middle relief role for the Gamecocks. Scott pitched six scoreless innings of relief to earn his first career win in a Gamecock uniform and kept the Gamecocks alive in a 9-6 come-from-behind victory. Scott has not allowed a run in six relief appearances. He has allowed just seven hits and three walks in 16.1 innings while striking out 14 batters. Opponents are hitting only .132 against him.

CROWE MAKES AN IMPACT

Freshman right-hander Wil Crowe improved to 6-0 with a win in Sunday's 8-0 victory. Crowe pitched 7.1 scoreless innings with just eight hits allowed, no walks and three strikeouts. Crowe has a 1.37 ERA in a team-high 46.0 innings with seven runs allowed on 34 hits. He has 28 strikeouts to six walks. Opponents are hitting .214 against him.

Crowe was honored twice by the Southeastern Conference in the first two weeks of the regular season. On February 24, he earned SEC Freshman of the Week honors after working 6.1 scoreless innings in a 6-0 win over Eastern Kentucky with just four hits allowed and one walk to pick up his second win of the season.

The first week, Crowe was SEC Pitcher of the Week. He had an impressive debut as he hurled 6.1 hitless innings in his first career start. Crowe walked just one and hit one batter while finishing with five strikeouts to earn his first career win in a Gamecock uniform. Bucknell had just one runner reach second base and none reach third base while Crowe was on the mound. Crowe retired 13 consecutive batters in a row before coming out of the game as he reached his pitch count total.

GREINER SHINES

Junior catcher Grayson Greiner was named to the Johnny Bench Award Watch List for the top catcher in college baseball.

Greiner's .363 average (33-for-91) is second best on the team. He leads the Gamecocks with a .549 slugging percentage and 30 RBI. His 30 RBI is among league leaders.

Greiner won the Tom Price award as the MVP for South Carolina in the weekend series vs. Clemson. Greiner hit .400 (4-for-10) for the weekend with four runs scored. His grand slam homer helped lift South Carolina to a 9-6 win. He had a team-high four walks on the weekend as well.

JACK OF ALL TRADES

Sophomore left-hander Jack Wynkoop made his first relief appearance in the resumption of Friday's halted game. Wynkoop pitched three scoreless innings on the way to the 3-2 win over the Volunteers. He is now 5-1 with a 2.66 ERA in 40.2 innings with 37 strikeouts to five walks.

Wynkoop pitched 7.1 scoreless innings and struck out a career-high 10 batters in a 2-0 win over Eastern Kentucky on February 22. He allowed just three hits and one walk.

K-MART

Sophomore infielder Marcus Mooney is hitting .280 (28-for-100) with 13 runs scored and 12 RBI. Nine of his 12 RBI this year have come with two outs. Mooney was Carolina's top hitter vs. Stetson and Brown. Mooney hit .474 (9-for-19) vs. Stetson and Brown with a run scored and four RBI.

SOME SUPERLATIVES

The Gamecocks are 23-1 on the year when allowing five runs or less in a game. Additionally, South Carolina is 12-0 when scoring six or more runs. South Carolina is 12-2 in games decided by three runs or less. The Gamecocks are 20-1 on the year when scoring first in a game and 23-2 when out-hitting the opponent.

HOME SWEET HOME

South Carolina has three sellouts this year and 33 in school history at Carolina Stadium. South Carolina has totaled 170,389 in attendance in the first 23 home games for an average of 7,408 per contest.

South Carolina is 177-33 in all-time games at Carolina Stadium, a winning percentage of .843. That is the best winning percentage of all 14 SEC schools since opening the facility.

A HIT

South Carolina's 13-0 victory over Brown featured a team-high 18 hits. The 18-hit total is third highest by the Gamecocks in a game in the Chad Holbrook era. South Carolina has reached double-digit hit totals in 10 of 16 games this year.

GAMECOCKS SWEEP CLEMSON

South Carolina defeated instate rival Clemson in all three games played for a weekend sweep to close out February and open up March. The Gamecocks opened the series with a 9-6 win in Columbia on Friday followed that up with a 10-2 win on Saturday in Fluor Field in Greenville and finished the weekend with a 5-3 victory at Clemson. South Carolina has won 23 of the last 31 games between the two schools dating back to the 2007 regular season. The Gamecocks hit .300 against Clemson (33-for-110) with 24 runs scored and just three errors in the field.

DOMINANT WEEKEND

South Carolina opened the 2014 season with a series sweep of Bucknell at Carolina Stadium. The Gamecocks won a doubleheader on Saturday with victories of 17-4 and 12-2 and closed out the series on Sunday with a 12-0 win. South Carolina scored 41 runs on 39 hits in the weekend series vs. Bucknell. Gamecock position players hit .368 (39-for-106) with a .493 on-base percentage. LEAGUE COACHES PREDICT SOUTH CAROLINA TO WIN SEC

South Carolina has been predicted to win the SEC Championship in the 2014 SEC Preseason Baseball Coaches' Poll that was released on Tuesday, Feb. 11. South Carolina received five first place votes to win the title as well as nine first place votes to win the Eastern Division. The Gamecocks have won three league championships (2000, 2002, 2011), six Eastern Division titles (1999, 2000, 2002, 2003, 2011, 2012) and one SEC Tournament crown (2004) in school history.

Carolina has finished in the top three places of the SEC Eastern Division 17 of 22 seasons since joining the league. The 2014 season begins on Friday, February 14 as the Gamecocks host a three-game series with Bucknell at Carolina Stadium. The Gamecocks are nationally ranked as high as No. 7 in the country by Baseball America.

In addition to picking a preseason champion, the head coaches voted a predicted order of finish in the SEC Eastern and Western Divisions. Points were compiled on a 7-6-5-4-3-2-1 basis for each division. Coaches were not allowed to vote for their own team.

LAST TIME VS. ARKANSAS

Arkansas swept the Gamecocks in a three-game series in the last meeting between the two schools in Columbia in 2013.

In game one of the series, the Razorbacks sent 12 batters to the plate in the top of the fourth and scored nine runs on the way to a 15-3 win over the Gamecocks. Arkansas starting pitcher Barrett Astin allowed three runs and six hits on 5.1 innings to earn the win. South Carolina starting pitcher Evan Beal suffered the loss. He went 3.2 innings, allowed eight runs and six hits with four walks and six strikeouts.

The Razorbacks took a 9-0 lead in the top of the fourth. Tyler Spoon opened the inning with a single to right center followed by a single up the middle by Brain Anderson just out of the reach of a diving Joey Pankake at shortstop. Matt Vinson then loaded the bases as he reached base on a bunt for a base hit. Dominic Ficociello's strikeout briefly curbed the Razorbacks' momentum before walks by Willie Schwanke and Jake Wise gave Arkansas a 2-0 lead. Jacob Morris then extended the Razorback surge with a two-run double to left center. Jake Wise scored on a wild pitch by Beal then Spoon connected with a 2-2 pitch for a two-run single. Forrest Koumas entered to pitch for the Gamecocks, but Anderson turned on the first pitch sending it over the left field wall for a two-run home run, his first home run of the season, giving the Razorbacks a 9-0 advantage.

In game two, the Gamecocks broke a scoreless tie with a run in the bottom of the fifth but Arkansas rallied with four run the next three innings on the way to a 4-2 win.

Arkansas starting pitcher Ryne Stanek earned the win with a complete game. H. South Carolina starting pitcher Nolan Belcher went 7.1 innings allowing four runs on nine hits with six strikeouts.

Scoreless entering the bottom of the fifth, the Gamecocks broke through first as Grayson Greiner opened the frame reaching second base on a throwing error by Arkansas shortstop Brian Anderson after knocking a hard hit grounder. Connor Bright laid down a sacrifice bunt to move Greiner to third and Chase Vergason then scored Greiner on a sacrifice fly giving the Gamecocks a 1-0 lead.

Jacob Mahan answered for Arkansas in the top of the sixth with a leadoff single to left field and advanced to second on a sacrifice bunt from Joe Serrano. Tyler Spoon knocked a one-out RBI past a diving Chase Vergason through the left side tying the game at 1-1. The run ended a 31.2 scoreless inning streak for Nolan Belcher.

Dominic Ficociello opened the seventh inning for the Razorbacks reaching first base on a throwing error by Joey Pankake. With two outs and a 1-2 count, Jacob Morris made a gutsy squeeze bunt. Belcher looked to field the ball but could not come up with a throw as he slipped on the wet grass and Ficociello score to give Arkansas a one-run lead. Mahan then punched one through the right side for a base hit, putting runners at first and third. A throwing error by Pankake gave Serrano a RBI single extending the Razorback lead to 3-1. A solo home run by Matt Vinson in the eighth pushed the Arkansas lead to 4-1.

In game three, South Carolina rallied from a pair of runs down to tie the game in the seventh inning but Arkansas used a two-out two-run single from Matt Vinson in the top of the 11th inning to defeat the Gamecocks 5-3 and sweep the series.

Down 3-1 entering the bottom of the seventh inning, the Gamecocks fought back as Grayson Greiner drew a one-out walk and Connor Bright reached base with two outs on a fielding error by Razorback shortstop Brian Anderson. With runners on first and second, Erik Payne roped a single into the gap in right-center scoring Greiner to cut the deficit to one run. After a walk to Sean Sullivan loaded the bases, Tanner English worked a 3-2 count against Arkansas reliever Brandon Moore and then drew a walk scoring Bright and tying the game.

The 11th inning saw Arkansas get the leadoff runner on base on a walk to Jacob Morris. With one out and Morris on first base, the hit and run worked for the Razorbacks as Joe Serrano lifted a single to right field giving Arkansas runners on the corners. The Gamecocks stood tall though as a squeeze attempt by Tyler Spoon was nullified on a great scoop by Dantzler at first base to nab Morris at home plate for the second out. With runners on first and second, Arkansas loaded the bases on Brian Anderson's fielder's choice to the right side. Pankake tried to get the force at third base but Serrano was safe on the attempt. The bags full, Vinson delivered for Arkansas as he laced a 1-0 pitch from Webb just over Pankake's head at short after a great leaping attempt scoring a pair of runs for Arkansas.

Carolina looked to mount one more rally in the bottom of the 11th inning. Kyle Martin led off with a pinch-hit single off of Arkansas reliever Colby Suggs. With two outs, Chase Vergason drew a walk bringing Joey Pankake to the plate. Suggs worked out of the jam though getting Pankake on a groundout to end the game for Arkansas.

Head Coach Chad Holbrook

Chad Holbrook led South Carolina to a 43-20 record and the school's 11th NCAA Super Regional appearance in the last 14 years in his first season as head coach. Holbrook directed the 2013 squad to a final national ranking of No. 12 in the USA Today Baseball Coaches Poll along with No. 13 by Collegiate Baseball and Perfect Game and No. 14 by Baseball America. It was the school's 14th consecutive appearance in the NCAA Tournament.

Among the 2013 highlights was a series victory against instate rival Clemson, the seventh consecutive season the Gamecocks have won more games than the Tigers on the baseball diamond. Holbrook's team would sweep four SEC squads and claim six SEC series victories including a pair of wins at LSU, the only team to go into Baton Rouge in 2013 and claim a three-game set. South Carolina hosted a NCAA Regional for the fourth straight year with the Gamecocks going undefeated in three games and continuing a run of 27 straight postseason wins at home including a 16-0 mark at Carolina Stadium. Gamecock Nation flocked to Carolina Stadium as South Carolina set a school record with 5,835 season tickets sold. South Carolina ended the 2013 season with a total attendance of 260,605, third highest in the country.

The 2013 team raised its season batting average 19 batting points to .284 with a .375 on-base percentage and a .419 slugging clip. South Carolina led the SEC and ranked 18th in the nation with 52 homers. The 2013 pitching staff was among the best in the nation with a 3.02 earned run average to go along with a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.3 that ranked third best in the nation. South Carolina pitchers averaged 7.8 strikeouts per nine innings while walking just 2.36 batters per contest.

Among the top players on the 2013 squad was third-team All-America designated hitter LB Dantzler. The senior ranked third in the SEC in homers (15) slugging percentage (.617) and walks (42) as well as fifth in total bases (132) sixth in on-base percentage (.444). Dantzler led Carolina in hitting with a .322 average (69-for-214) and was drafted by the Toronto Blue Jays. Senior left-hander Tyler Webb, earned third-team All-America honors from Collegiate Baseball and the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association and second-team All-SEC honors after anchoring a bullpen with 17 saves. That mark is fifth highest in school history and ranked second in the league and seventh in the nation. Webb struck out 60 batters in 43.0 innings and pitched in 32 games on his way to setting a school record for career appearances with 110 on the mound with the Garnet & Black. Webb was selected in the 10th round by the New York Yankees. Sophomore catcher Grayson Greiner was tabbed second-team All-SEC at catcher and made USA Baseball's Collegiate National Team. He hit .298 (61-for-205) with 10 doubles and 38 RBI. Sophomore shortstop Joev Pankake continued his rise with a .311 average (69-for-214) with 11 homers and 42 RBI. Two Gamecock newcomers recruited by Holbrook garnered Freshman All-America honors. Max Schrock started 61 games at second base and hit .282 with six homers and 49 RBI with 36 walks to just 23 strikeouts and was second-team choice by Baseball America, the NCBWA and Perfect Game. Jack Wynkoop went 7-3 with a 3.09 ERA in 64.0 innings pitched on his way to recognition by Collegiate Baseball.

Holbrook's team succeeded off the field logging its highest cumulative GPA in school history with a 3.201 in the Fall 2012 semester. The Gamecocks maintained a high mark in the Spring of 2013 with a 3.050 GPA. The baseball team had 16 players named to the 2013 SEC Spring Academic Honor

Roll. Among those were Dantzler, who was named 2013 CoSIDA Baseball Academic All-American of the Year. Dantzler was a finalist for the Senior CLASS Award. Senior right-hander Patrick Sullivan was South Carolina's male nominee for the 2012-13 Brad Davis SEC Community Service Scholarship.

Chad Holbrook was named head baseball coach for the University of South Carolina on July 16, 2012. Holbrook was promoted to the top spot by athletics director Ray Tanner after four seasons as associate head coach and recruiting coordinator for the Gamecocks. Holbrook came to South Carolina in July 2008 as associate head coach. Along with his recruiting coordinator duties, he served as hitting instructor, overseeing the Gamecock offense, including base running and the short game and was the third base coach. He also worked with the outfielders. Holbrook came to the Gamecock program after serving 15 seasons as a member of the University of North Carolina coaching staff. Holbrook was the 2011 ABCA/Baseball America Assistant Coach of the Year after the Gamecocks won a second consecutive national championship.

A tremendous evaluator of talent, Holbrook was named the No. 10 best recruiter in all of college sports by ESPNU & ESPN The Magazine in the publication's 2011 January edition. The list was put together in conjunction with three-dozen experts who were asked the question: Who are the top 20 recruiters in college sports? Holbrook was the only baseball coach on the list.

Holbrook's offensive prowess made an immediate impact on the South Carolina baseball program in his first four seasons. His guidance was instrumental in helping the Gamecocks to back-to-back national championships in 2010 and 2011 at the College World Series as well as a national runner-up finish in 2012

Holbrook helped in the development of two-time All-America Christian Walker, who led the Gamecocks in all three Triple Crown categories in 2011 and 2012. He finished 2012 hitting .321 (77-for-240) with 11 homers and 55 RBI as well as a .450 on-base percentage and a .525 slugging percentage. Walker was a fourth round selection by the Baltimore Orioles in the 2012 MLB Draft. Walker was named to the CWS All-Tournament team for a third time. He tied a CWS record for hits also in a career as he notched 28 that put him alongside Dustin Ackley of North Carolina (2007-09), ironically also a player that Holbrook recruited and coached while in Chapel Hill.

Holbrook worked to bridge together a new crop of Gamecocks in the 2012 season as he molded newcomers Tanner English, Grayson Greiner and Joey Pankake into SEC All-Freshman honorees. All three would factor into Carolina's successful season. The group of newcomers was also rated the top recruiting class in the country in 2011 by Collegiate Baseball and No. 6 in the nation by Baseball America.

Holbrook played a key role in 2011 MLB supplemental draft selection Jackie Bradley Jr.'s Gamecock career. In 2010 Bradley was a All-SEC selection and College World Series Most Outstanding Player. That season, Holbrook helped to oversee an offense that peaked in the postseason with a .309 batting average in 12 postseason contests. Evan Marzilli was the team's top postseason hitter with a .419 average (18-for-43) with Walker right behind him at .389 (21-for-54) and Bradley hitting .348 with four HR and 17 RBI. Carolina finished the season with a .300 team batting average as well as a .392 on-base percentage. The squad's 734 hits were second highest in the conference with the team also tallying 298 walks, 14th highest in the country.

In 2009, Holbrook's first season, the Gamecocks finished with a team batting average of .310 on the year, the highest average in over nine seasons, along with an improved on-base percentage of .394 and a .528 slugging percentage. Carolina was fifth in the nation with 109 home runs. Among the players he tutored that first year were Freshman All-America Jackie Bradley Jr. and All-SEC selections, Justin Dalles, Nick Ebert, Bobby Haney and DeAngelo Mack.

Prior to joining the Gamecock program, Holbrook worked for 15 seasons on the North Carolina coaching staff. While at UNC, the Tar Heels made 11 NCAA Tournament appearances including four NCAA Super Regionals and three trips to the College World Series. The 2007 squad also captured an ACC championship, the first in Chapel Hill since 1990 when Holbrook was a freshman player.

Holbrook and his wife, the former Jennifer Hilliard, were married in August of 2000. They have two sons, Reece, who was born on May 4, 2002, and Cooper, who was born on June 14, 2004.
