SOUTH CAROLINA TEAM NOTES

- South Carolina snapped a five-game losing streak with Tues.'s 8-0 (5) win over Eastern Kentucky.
 The Gamecocks' 3-2 win at No. 3/3 Arizona State marked the first win at a top-five team's park since March 13, 2004, a 6-4 win in nine innings at LSU.
- This year's 14-2 start is bettered only by a 12-1 mark by the 2009 team in the last six years of Gamecock Softball. The 2007 Gamecocks went 24-3, the best start since the first year of SEC play.
- The four double plays in the Florida Atlantic win (2/16) is believed to be a school record, as it matches what was once listed but could not be verified.
- After posting only eight hits combined in the first two games, South Carolina tallied at least eight in each the next seven. Overall, the Gamecocks have five or more hits in 20 of 22 games.
- In the Ball State loss, South Carolina snapped a streak of 11 games with one or no errors, a stretch that included a 10-game winning streak.
- The Gamecock leadoff hitters have reached base at a .453 clip, sixth best in the SEC.
- While no Gamecocks rank in the SEC top 15 in stolen bases, seven different student-athletes have three or more on the year, helping the team stand seventh overall in the league.
- The Gamecocks' win in game one against Western Carolina came when they were down after five innings, the first South Carolina triumph coming back that late in a game this season.
- All of South Carolina's losses have come when they've given up four or more earned runs. In fact, of the 58 team earned runs allowed, 48 have come in the seven losses.

INDIVIDUAL NOTABLES

- Nickie Blue earned her first SEC Freshman of the Week honor on Feb. 24 after picking up a win and two saves in relief as well as her first career shutout during the prior week.
- Junior Sarah Mooney, a transfer from James Madison, has a team-best seven homers on the year, tying for the 11th spot in the single-season charts at South Carolina just 22 games into the year.
- The college veterans have come through with runners on third and less than two outs, as Dana Hathorn, Chelsea Hawkins, Ashlyn Masters and Sarah Mooney have posted 17 RBI in 22 chances.
- To add to that, sophomore Ansley Ard is 2-for-2 and sophomore Jordan Bizzell is 2-for-3 bringing in runners from third with less than two outs. The rest of the team is 9-for-28.

THE PITCHERS REIGN SUPREME

- The group posted a 29-inning scoreless streak from the final game at Florida Atlantic through the final game of the Gamecock Invitational, with the UNC Wilmington posting an unearned run in the first inning.
- Freshman Nickie Blue is 9-3 on the season, starting 10 of her 20 appearances.
- When Blue pitches, she's produced over double the ground-ball outs (96) versus fly outs (47).
- Both Blue and redshirt junior Julie Sarratt already owns three saves on the year, tying for ninth at South Carolina in a single season. Either's next would move them into fourth with five others.
- Sarratt's fanned 65 batters in 59.2 innings, a rate (7.63 K/7IP) over three K's better her career standard (4.56) entering the year.
- Sarratt struck out a career-high 10 in the win over Maryland.
- She is at her best with two strikes against right-handed hitters, holding them to a .069 batting average (5-of-72) with 43 of her K's in those counts.

THE JOYS OF PLAYING AT HOME

- After playing only 17 games at its home facility last season, tying the second-lowest mark in the SEC era (since 1997), South Carolina has scheduled 34 games for Carolina Softball Stadium at Beckham Field before hosting the 2014 SEC Softball Tournament.
- Barring any rainouts, it would take two postseason games at home to tie the 2002 team's record with 36 home games.
- The Gamecocks have already surpassed their 2013 home win total, going 10-1 this year compared to 7-10 in Carolina Softball Stadium a year ago.
- Out of those 11 home games, South Carolina has posted a shutout in eight of them.

THE ROAD GETS TOUGHER

- The Gamecocks have scheduled 24 of their 55 regular-season games against teams who made the 2013 NCAA Tournament. Next up is Texas A&M, Minnesota and Tennessee, all of whom earned at-large bids.
- South Carolina downed No. 3/3 Arizona State before falling to No. 19/20 Minnesota in its first two encounters against 2013 NCAA Tournament teams.
- A total of 35 of the Gamecocks' scheduled games come against teams that finished in the top 100 of the NCAA's Ratings Percentage Index last year. Of those, 21 are against RPI top-50 teams.
- After facing nothing but NCAA Tournament participants in SEC play last year, South Carolina has two conference weekends against non-tourney teams this year (home vs. Mississippi & Auburn).
- Two of the Gamecocks' SEC contests will be on television, including the opening game to ESPN's national coverage (March 22 at Tennessee on ESPNU).
- The Gamecocks' April 19 game against LSU will also be on ESPNU, while all nine games of the SEC Softball Tournament will be on the ESPN family of networks.

SCOUTING TEXAS A&M

- The Aggies enter the series with a 20-5 overall mark and a 2-1 SEC record. They won at College of Charleston on Wednesday 11-3.
- Nicole Morgan tops the team in many offensive categories, including her nine homers and 33 RBI.
- The league leader in homers, Morgan's walked 23 times to post an on-base percentage of .578, while she leads the nation with a .954 slugging percentage.
- April Ryan has scored 29 runs while knocking eight doubles and two triples, all three tops on the team, and is second on the squad with 27 RBI.
- Emily Albus stands second in batting average (.430) and is a perfect 11-for-11 in stolen bases.
- Both Cassie Tysarczyk and Amber Garza have five homers, with the former ranking third on the teamwith 24 RBI.
- Seven of the possible offensive starters have on-base percentage over .400.
- Sophomore Katie Marks leads the Aggies in the circle, posting a 1.54 ERA and 10-0 record in 63.2 innings of work.
- Rachel Fox handles most of the rest of the load with a 2.46 ERA in 59.2 innings.
- Both Marks and Fox have struck out over 35 while walking 16 or less.

TIES BETWEEN SOUTH CAROLINA AND TEXAS A&M

• Aggie ace Katie Marks played her freshman year at South Carolina before transfering last summer to be closer to home.

SERIES HISTORY VS. THE AGGIES

- Texas A&M holds a 15-11 advantage in the series all-time, including a 5-3 mark in Columbia.
- The Gamecocks' last wins in the series came in the NFCA Leadoff Classics of 1996 and 1997 in Columbus, Ga.
- This is the first meeting between the softball teams since the Aggies joined the SEC last year. Only four games have come since the SEC first sponsored softball in 1997.

THE LAST MEETING - TEXAS A&M VS. SOUTH CAROLINA - MAY 17, 2003

The Aggies eliminated the Gamecocks from the 2003 NCAA Regional in Tucson, Ariz., by a 6-3 score.

GAMECOCKS VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

- South Carolina is 95-230-1 (.293) all-time against ranked opponents.
- Broken down by site, the Gamecocks are 41-73 (.360) at home, 16-103 (.134) on the road and 38-54-1 (.414) in neutral-site outings.
- So far this season, the Gamecocks are 1-4 against ranked teams, with the next seven games coming against top-20 foes according to this week's NFCA poll..
- Last season, the Gamecocks went 3-16 (.158) against ranked foes, including a 2-7 mark when playing in the opponent's home park and a 1-8 record at home.
- With the 3-2 win at No. 3/3 Arizona State on Feb. 27, South Carolina is now 2-21 against top-five opposition on the road.

HISTORY IN THE MAKING

- South Carolina has played 2,016 games in its softball history, going 1314-696-6 (.653) in its 41st season of sponsorship.
- With the season-opening 1-0 win over Iowa, the Gamecocks gained their 1,300th program victory.
- Gamecock head coach Beverly Smith needs two more triumphs to crack the century mark, and her 18th victory this year would put her in second in program history past Lou Piel.
 - Smith moved into third on SC's coaching wins list with the 13-0 (5) victory vs. UNC Greensboro.
- She is the third Gamecock head coach to coach a fourth season at South Carolina, joining Piel and NFCA Hall-of-Fame coach Joyce Compton.

SNAER'S EARLY START

- Freshman Kaylea Snaer leads the Gamecocks in five offensive categories over a third of the way through the season.
- She already has four homers and 21 RBI, both over halfway to the top-15 in a season at South Carolina.
- She's also a third of the way to single-season listings on the Gamecocks' doubles (5) and walks (8).
- Snaer's posted two or more hits seven times and multiple RBI in eight games, the latter tops on the team.
- Snaer has only failed to reach base four times this season (vs. Boston University, 2/21; vs. Western Carolina-2, 2/25; at No. 3/3 Arizona State 2/27; vs. Ball State 2/28).
- Eleven of Snaer's 21 RBI have come with two outs.

ROLLER COASTER RIDE IN TEMPE

- South Carolina picked up its second win in history in the home park of a top-five team when it downed No. 3/3 Arizona State 3-2 to open its stay in the ASU Louisville Slugger Invitational.
- Senior Chelsea Hawkins accounted for every Gamecock run, hitting a two-run homer for the initial lead and scoring the insurance run in the seventh after leading off the inning with a double.
- Hawkins went 3-for-3 in the win with a homer, double, two RBI and two runs scored. The seven total bases is the most for a Gamecock this year.
- Freshman Nickie Blue tossed 101 pitches, the most in her budding college career, in the completegame win. It's her second complete game as a Gamecock.
- Blue matched her career high by striking out five Sun Devils in the win.
- Over night, however, the team was swept by a virus that kept two players from the field on Friday and weakened many others. Ten student-athletes were treated for similar symptons during the trip.
- It still took allowing 11 and 10 runs to fall to No. 19/20 Minnesota and Ball State, respectively.
- In the two losses, South Carolina allowed seven earned runs in each. The team had been charged with 19 in the previous 16 games combined.
- The Gamecocks, after falling down 7-0 to Minnesota, cut the lead to 7-4 after five innings.
- In the Ball State contest, South Carolina scored seven in the sixth before succumbing to the Cardinals, who scored three in the bottom half of the sixth and two more in the final frame.
- Three Gamecocks homered in the contest: junior Sarah Mooney, sophomore Jordan Bizzell and redshirt freshman Lauren Masters.
- At Arizona State, senior Chelsea Hawkins, sophomore Jordan Bizzell and redshirt freshman Lauren Masters all hit their first homers of the year. It was the first career homer for Bizzell and Masters.

OPENING WEEKEND NOTES

- South Carolina spent the opening weekend at home at the newly-finished Carolina Softball Stadium at Beckham Field, a year after spending the first five weeks on the road waiting for construction to finish.
- The Gamecocks went 3-1 in the Carolina Classic, posting three shutouts on the weekend.
- South Carolina last recorded three shutouts in its first four games in 2003. The team had two shutouts in its first four games from 2004-07.
- Freshman Kaylea Snaer hit two homers in her first weekend in the Garnet and Black, while rookie Nickie Blue went 3-0, pitching in all four games.
- Sarah Mooney and Taylor Williams both had home runs in their first weekend as a Gamecock as well.
- Over 1,000 fans paid to see the weekend's action, the largest paid crowds for regular-season softball at South Carolina in history.

ROSTER NOTES

- South Carolina returns six position starters from last year's team, including at second base (Dana Hathorn), in left (Alaynie Page) and in right field (Chelsea Hawkins). All 59 starts in center field and at designated player return as well as the majority of starts at first and third bases.
- In the loss of Samie Garcia, the Gamecocks lose their leader in batting average, runs, hits, doubles, triples, total bases, slugging percentage, sacrifice hits and stolen bases and the only person who started at shortstop.
- The greatest losses come in triples (7 of 10) and sacrifice hits (9 of 19).
- In the rest of the offensive categories, the Gamecocks bring back from 70.7 percent (doubles) to 80 percent (home runs) of their production from 2013, a season where the Gamecocks set six team offensive records.
- Back is the 2013 team leader in on-base percentage (Dana Hathorn, .463), home runs (Chelsea Hawkins, 8), walks (Alaynie Page, 26) and hit by pitches (Dana Hathorn, 25).
- In the circle, the team loses almost 60 percent of the innings and strikeouts from a year ago but returns team ERA, IP, K and win leader Julie Sarratt.
- Nine newcomers join the roster, including eight freshmen and the transferring Sarah Mooney, who earned Colonial Athletic Association Player of the Year honors at James Madison.
- The team is again dominated by South Carolina natives, with 36.4 percent of the roster (eight players) hailing from the Palmetto State. Georgia is second with three players.
- The Gamecocks hail from 10 states this year, adding players from North Carolina, Colorado, Illinois, California, Texas and Virginia.

MORE ON THE NEWEST GAMECOCKS

- With nine new student-athletes, South Carolina retooled after losing seven players, four to graduation and three to transfers.
- Three of the incoming eight freshmen have been honored by *MaxPreps.com* on their High School All-America teams, including two on its small school listings.
- Kaylea Snaer earned second-team accolades in the country, while, on the small school lists were Taylor Williams (first team) and Victoria Williams (second team).
- The Williams and Snaer join Alaynie Page as Gamecocks who earned those honors. Page made the Junior All-America list earlier at Boiling Springs High School.
- The eight freshmen all represent different states: California (Snaer), Colorado (Nickie Blue), Georgia (Effie Manahan), Illinois (Kate Shereyk), North Carolina (Macey Webb), South Carolina (V. Williams), Texas (T. Williams), and Virginia (Mackenzie Moler).
- Nickie Blue is the first Gamecock to be listed over 6-0 since Melanie Henkes (6-3) in 2006.
- The lone transfer this year, Sarah Mooney, earned 2013 Colonial Athletic Association Player of the Year accolades.
- Leading the Dukes in eight offensive categories, Mooney won the CAA triple crown and set new program records with 17 homers and 67 RBI in 59 games.
- Mooney moves closer to home in two aspects, hailing from the greater Charlotte area and also likely to serve as the Gamecocks' starting catcher.

FAMILY TIES

- The Masters sisters Ashlyn and Lauren are the first siblings to play on the same Gamecock team and the second set ever in the program's recorded history, after the Troesh sisters, Leanna (1997-99) and Debralee (2000-03).
- While both Williams, freshmen Taylor and Victoria are not sisters.
- Chelsea Hawkins is the niece of Tia Rogers (2002-04 letter-winner).

GAMECOCKS ADDED TO THEIR RICH HISTORY IN NCAA TOURNAMENT

- South Carolina made its 16th appearance in the 2013 NCAA Tournament and the first since 2007.
 The Gamegocks are 31-29 in these trips, making three Women's College World Series in their his.
 - The Gamecocks are 31-29 in those trips, making three Women's College World Series in their history (1983, 1989 and 1997).
 - The program has five AIAW World Series trips in its history as well prior to 1982.
- Four times, South Carolina has won a regional.
- The Gamecocks made their seventh regional final (in multi-team regionals) in 14 appearances. The regionals in 1982-83 were best-of-three series against one opponent.

2013 STANDS ALONE IN OFFENSIVE RECORDS

- South Carolina set six cumulative team offensive records in 2013 and five in the per-game categories.
- Overall, the 338 runs, 45 homers, 295 RBI, 60 hit by pitches, .384 on-base percentage and .450 slugging percentage all topped previous marks.
- In per-game comparisons, the 5.73 runs, 5.00 RBI, 12.17 total bases, 2.78 walks and 1.02 hit by pitches broke records.
- Dana Hathorn got hit 25 times, more than tripling the previous season record.

THE SINGLE-SEASON CHARTS SAW MANY CHANGES

- Dana Hathorn more than tripled the single-season hit-by-pitch mark, getting plunked 25 times in 59 games. She also posted the fifth-best on-base percentage in a year (.463).
- Chelsea Hawkins made it a five-way tie for sixth place with eight homers and tied Danielle Quinones for sixth in homers per game (0.14). She also tied for 13th with three sacrifice flies.
- Kristen Struett tied for fifth with 43 RBI in a season and stood fifth with 0.78 RBI per game.
- Alaynie Page finished 10th in runs per game (0.78), 11th in homers (7), 13th in walks (26) and walks per game (0.44) and tied for third in hit by pitches (7).
- Ashlyn Masters had four sacrifice flies, tying for seventh with six others.
- Pitcher Julie Sarratt made the single-season relief appearances chart (13, T-13th), and tied for seventh with 12 hit batters.

How the Gamecocks Made the 2013 SEC Tournament and About the Win

- The Gamecocks won their first SEC Tournament game since 2003 with a 6-3 win over seventhseeded and host Kentucky in the first round.
- It was South Carolina's first SEC Tourney win since May 9, 2003 over Mississippi State.
- It took a win over No. 2/3 Florida, the first win over the Gators since 2003, ending a 28-game losing streak in the series, to secure the berth, the first in Beverly Smith's head coaching career.
- South Carolina swept its first SEC series of the year at Mississippi State, marking the first road three-game SEC sweep for the Gamecocks since doing it at Kentucky over March 29-30, 2008.
 It was the first three-game sweep in Starkville in history for South Carolina.
- The Gamecocks won their first SEC series of 2013 at Auburn, the first winning weekend in any SEC road series since the 2011 Arkansas win (4/16-17).

- South Carolina got its first win in Carolina Softball Stadium history with a 5-0 shutout of Appalachian State on April 3, 2013.
- Carolina Softball Stadium at Beckham Field has a seating capacity near 1,300.
- The stadium sits on the same site that the Gamecock Softball team has called home since 1983.
- Home plate has been in the same spot since the beginning of the 1997 season, when the former structure was built to usher in Southeastern Conference play.
- All time, South Carolina is 534-208-2 (.719) on the site. Since being renamed Beckham Field in 1998, the Gamecocks own a 254-154 (.623) mark on the field.
