TODAY'S GAME

South Carolina hosts Oklahoma State on Saturday, marking the first time the Cowboys have traveled to Columbia since the 1975-76 campaign. The matchup is part of the SEC/Big 12 Challenge. The two teams also met in last year's Challenge, with Oklahoma State posting a 79-52 win in Stillwater. Saturday's game will be broadcast on ESPNU with Mike Morgan and Jon Sundvold on the call.



GAME STORYLINES

- South Carolina is in its 107th season of varsity basketball in 2014-15.
- The Gamecocks are led by third-year head coach Frank Martin. His associate head coach is Matt Figger, his assistant coaches are Perry Clark and Lamont Evans, and his director of operations is Andy Assaley.
- The Gamecocks return to Colonial Life Arena on Saturday fresh off their biggest road win since 2008 after defeating Marshall 77-59 on Dec. 1. Sophomore guard Duane Notice exploded for a career high 27 points in the win, hitting 10-of-18 attempts from the floor and also collecting five rebounds, while dishing a team high four assists in 36 minutes. Junior forward Laimonas Chatkevicius hit double-digits for the second straight game with 15 points, and sophomore guard Sindarius Thornwell notched his third-career double-double with 10 points and a team high 10 rebounds. The Gamecocks hit 47.6 percent from the field in the win, holding the Thundering Herd to just 28.6 percent.
- South Carolina snapped a two-game losing streak with an 89-75 victory over UNC Asheville on Nov. 26, at Colonial Life Arena. The Gamecocks posted solid offensive numbers in the game, hitting 31-of-60 attempts from the floor for a season high 51.7 percent. Chatkevicius led five Gamecocks in double-figures with a career high 17 points. Asheville hit just 36.5 percent from the floor, but guard Andrew Rowsey tallied 30 points, hitting 10

A SOUTH CAROLINA WIN WOULD ...

- Improve Frank Martin's record vs. Oklahoma State to 5-4
- Be Carolina's first over a Big 12 opponent since an 85-84 win at Baylor on Jan. 2, 2009
- Extend the Gamecocks' win streak to three games, extending its longest streak of the season

attempts, including six 3s.

- Chatkevicius posted his first-career double-double vs. the Bulldogs on Dec. 1, leading the Gamecocks in points (17), rebounds (13) and also in blocks (3). Hit point and rebound totals were both career highs, and his blocks matched a career high.

- South Carolina ranks 35th in the nation in field goal percentage defense, holding opponents to just 36.4 percent from the field. The Gamecocks rank 62nd in rebounds margin (+6.9), and 47th in steals per game (8.6).

- Carolina's game vs. Asheville marked its fifth game in the previous nine days - Baylor (Nov. 18), Cornell (Nov. 20), Charlotte (Nov. 21), Akron (Nov. 23), Asheville (Nov. 26).

- The Gamecocks battled back from a 10-point first-half deficit to tie the contest vs. Akron late in the second half, but the Zips used solid free throw shooting down the stretch to claim a 68-63 victory for third place at the Charleston Classic on Nov. 23. South Carolina had three in double-figures, Thornwell with 13, Notice with 12 and Chatkevicius the top scorer off the bench with 11, but a poor shooting performance in the early part of the first half - the Gamecocks hit just one of their first 13 attempts from the floor - saw Akron lead for the majority of the contest.

- Despite 20 points from Thornwell, the Gamecocks dropped a 65-63 decision to Charlotte on Nov. 22 in the semifinals at the Charleston Classic. Thornwell had a chance from 3 at the buzzer, but the shot hit the rim and didn't fall. Thornwell also led the Gamecocks with eight rebounds and two steals in 34 minutes played.

- South Carolina easily defeated Cornell on Nov. 20 in the quarterfinal round of the 2014 Charleston Classic at TD Arena on the campus of the College of Charleston. The Gamecocks held the Big Red to just 26.9 percent from the field, which ties for the second-lowest field goal percentage by a Carolina opponent under the direction of head coach Frank Martin. South Carolina also struggled from the floor, hitting just 37.9 percent (22-58).

- Thornwell finished with 14 points to lead Carolina vs. Cornell. He scored 13 of those points in the first half, including 10 of the Gamecocks' first 12 points in the game.

- Despite a career high 21 points from Johnson and four Gamecocks in double figures, Baylor held on to a slight lead at the end of regulation and point guard Kenny Chery hit two free throws with one second remaining to secure a 69-65 victory for the Bears on Nov. 18 at Colonial Life Arena. The game featured six ties and six lead changes, with both teams shooting poor from 3-point range, as Baylor hit just 33.3 percent (6-18) and the Gamecocks 23.8 percent (5-21).

- The Gamecocks tipped off their season with a solid 81-56 victory over North Florida on Nov. 14, led by nine different Gamecocks posting at least six points in the win, led Henry and Johnson with 12 points each. The win pushed head coach Frank Martin's all-time record in season openers to 8-0 for his career.

- South Carolina returns 11 letterwinners from last season's 14-20 team, including starters, sophomore guard Sindarius Thornwell, junior forward Michael Carrera, junior forward Mindaguas Kacinas and sophomore forward Demetrius Henry. Senior guard Tyrone Johnson started nine games before being sidelined with an injury as well.

- The Gamecocks return 71.3 percent (1,658/2,323) of their scoring from last season. The biggest void was left by the graduation of senior guard Brenton Williams who tallied 505 points.

- South Carolina posted a 92-47 victory over Benedict in the team's lone exhibition game this season. Johnson led the Gamecocks with 23 points, six rebounds and six assists in the win. Carrera was huge on the boards, collecting 15 rebounds, while junior forward Laimonas Chatkevicius also pulled down double-digit rebounds with 12. Sophomore guard Duane Notice accounted for nine of Carolina's 23 assists (on 32 made baskets) in the game.

SCOUTING OKLAHOMA STATE

The Cowboys enter Saturday's matchup receiving votes in both the Associated Press and coaches top 25 polls this week with their perfect 7-0 start on the season. Oklahoma State most recently posted an 87-61 win over North Texas in Still-

water on Wednesday night. The Cowboys also have wins over SE Louisiana, Prairie View A&M, NW Oklahoma State, Milwaukee, Oregon State and Tulsa. Saturday's matchup will be OK State's first true road contest of the season, as their wins over Oregon State and Tulsa were at the MGM Grand Main Event in Las Vegas in late November. Junior guard Phil Forte paces the Cowboys with 19.3 points per game after scoring a career-high 32 points - which included five 3s - in the win over North Texas. Senior forward Le'Bryan Nash is the team's top rebounder at 6.7 per game, but he did not play vs. North Texas due to disciplinary reasons. Former LSU point guard Anthony Hickey is now at OSU, averaging 3.4 assists per game. Oklahoma State is led by Kentucky grad Travis Ford in his seventh season.

OKLAHOMA STATE SERIES

With the Cowboys posting a 79-52 victory on their home court on a blustery and chilly day in Stillwater last December, the series is now tied at 1-1. South Carolina won the first-ever matchup between the two schools 70-61 in Columbia on Dec. 23, 1975. Gamecock great Alex English posted a double-double with 22 points and a team high 12 rebounds in that game, while Mike Dunleavy led all scorers with 24 points. Both English and Dunleavy played all 40 minutes of that contest. Below is the series breakdown vs. Oklahoma State.

12 - Sophomore guard Justin McKie has led the Gamecocks in bench points vs. both Asheville (8) and Marshall (12). His 12 points on 5-of-8 shooting vs. the Thundering Herd marked a career high, and his first-career double-figure scoring game. McKie is averaging 6.2 points per game, and has hit 10-of-19 (52.6) attempts, including 5-of-11 (45.5) from 3-point range.

4 - Junior forward Mindaguas Kacinas posted a career high with four steals at Marshall.

43-39 - Marshall held a 43-39 rebounding advantage over the Gamecocks on Dec. 1, marking the first time this season Carolina hasn't won the battle of the boards. Marshall's 18 offensive boards were an opponent season high.

+18 - South Carolina's 18-point win at Marshall was its biggest win in a true road contest since posting an 84-58 victory at Princeton on Dec. 2, 2008.

10 - Sophomore guard Sindarius Thornwell struggled from the floor at Marshall, hitting just 4-of-12 attempts - however - he led the Gamecocks in several hustle play categories, including rebounds (10) and blocks (2), while also posting three steals and three assists. Thornwell averages 13.0 points per game this season to lead Carolina.

2.6 - Thornwell's 2.6 steals per game rank second in the SEC and 27th in the nation.

41 - The Gamecocks have posted two games with 40+ points in the paint this season. South Carolina hit a season high 42 in the opener vs. North Florida, and posted 41 at Marshall.

13 - South Carolina's 13 steals at Marshall marked the most-ever in a game under the direction of Frank Martin. South Carolina bested the mark of 12, which it hit against Asheville on Nov. 26.

UP NEXT

South Carolina will not have a game until Dec. 19, as the squad will take the annual break from competition for final exams. The Gamecocks will host Upstate rival Clemson on the 19th, with that game set to tip at 7 p.m. ET on the SEC Network. The meeting vs. the Tigers will be the 165th all-time, with the Gamecocks entering that matchup with an 88-76 lead in the all-time series. Clemson has won the last two contests.

MARSHALL NOTABLES

- The 18-point win is the largest margin of victory in a true road game since winning 84-58 at Princeton in 2008.

- Sindarius Thornwell led the team with 10 rebounds, a season-high and just one shy of his career high. He tallied his third career double-double.

- Junior forward Michael Carrera missed his second-straight game due to still experiencing concussion related symptoms.

- After matching his previous best against UNC Asheville, Justin McKie set a new career high with 12 points off the bench. It is his first career double-digit game, and it comes after scoring just nine points in 17 games as a freshman.

UNC ASHEVILLE NOTABLES

- The Carolina defense limited UNC Asheville to just 8-of-34 on two-point field goals (23.5 percent).
- South Carolina dished 13 assists on 15 made baskets in the first half, including four helpers from senior guard Tyrone Johnson and three from both rookie guard Marcus Stroman and sophomore guard Sindarius Thornwell.
- Junior forward Laimonas Chatkevicius matched a career high with three blocks in the first half alone. Chatkevicius, making his first start of the season, set new career highs with 17 points and 13 rebounds as well.
- Sophomore Demetrius Henry set a new career high with 15 points, adding eight rebounds.
- Justin McKie matched a career high in points with eight, hitting a 3-of-5 shots.
- Tyrone Johnson and Marcus Stroman both set new season-highs in assists, with six apiece.
- Junior forward Michael Carrera did not play due to a concussion

AKRON NOTABLES

- The Gamecocks owned the boards with a 45-32 advantage for the game and have out-rebounded the opposition in each game this season.
- The Gamecocks entered Sunday averaging 12 offensive rebounds per game. They would have 15 by halftime and 21 for the game. Demetrius Henry led the team with seven offensive boards.
- After leading the team again with 13 points, Sindarius Thornwell wrapped up the weekend averaging 15.8 points in the tournament.
- The total margin of defeat in three games this season for Carolina has been just 11 points.

CHARLOTTE NOTABLES

- Sophomore Sindarius Thornwell and junior Michael Carrera both went over 500 career points in the game, both coming off 3-pointers. The duo finished with 31 combined points.
- Thornwell attempted a career-high 24 shots and matched a previous career high with 10 3-point attempts. His 20 points in the game is the eighth time in his career that he has reached the mark.
- Charlotte attempted 10 more free throws than the Gamecocks, making 13, while Carolina only attempted nine.

CORNELL NOTABLES

- The last time the Carolina defense held an opponent to under 50 points was Longwood on Nov. 9, 2013. Cornell entered the day averaging 65.7 points per game in three contests.
- Of its 22 total field goals made, the Gamecocks were credited with 16 assists. The Gamecocks committed just 11 turnovers.
- Justin McKie scored a career-high eight points on a perfect day from the field, hitting two 3s and a pair of free throws.

During his time at South Carolina, Carrera has participated in numerous community outreach events, including visiting the Ronald McDonald House, several events with the South Carolina Special Olympics,

volunteering at Harvest Hope food bank, visiting with Boy Scout troops, and he participated in a wish with the Make-A-Wish Foundation, among his many other service events.

THORNWELL NAMED SECOND TEAM PRESEASON ALL-SEC

Sophomore guard Sindarius Thornwell was honored with selection to the Preseason All-SEC Second Team last Thursday, the first preseason honor of his career. The Lancaster, S.C., native started all 34 games as a freshman, averaging 13.4 points, 4.1 rebounds 3.0 assists and 1.2 steals in 29.6 minutes per game. After leading all SEC freshmen in scoring and assists in conference games, Thornwell was named to the SEC All-Freshman Team last spring.

2015 SEC TOURNAMENT

The 2015 edition of the SEC Tournament will be held in Nashville, Tenn., at Bridgestone Arena. The tournament was last held in the Music City in 2013. South Carolina owns a 4-4 record in Tournament games played in Nashville. The SEC Network will televise the first three days of the SEC Basketball Tournament (March 11-15), while the semifinals and championship game will be broadcast nationally on ESPN.

Frank Martin was named the head men's basketball coach at the University of South Carolina on March 27, 2012, becoming the 32nd head coach in the history of the South Carolina program, which enters its 107th season as a varsity sport in 2014-15. Martin owns a 145-92 (.611) overall record as a head coach, entering his eighth season overall, and third season at South Carolina.

Since his appointment as head coach in Columbia, Martin, 48, has become a fixture in the community. He has spoken at numerous events, including Gamecock Club Fan Fests, numerous community council and rotary club events, coaching clinics, and the Fathers and Families Decades of Dads event, among others. He was also selected as a Court Coach for USA Basketball in June 2012, assisting Florida head coach Billy Donovan with the Men's U18 National Team training camp in Colorado Springs, Colo., at the U.S. Olympic Training Center. The camp was used to determine the 12-member roster that represented the USA at the 2012 FIBA Americas U18 Championship in late June.

Martin was honored again during the summer of 2013, serving as an assistant coach for the United States on head coach Bob McKillop's staff alongside Michigan head coach John Beilein for the U.S. Men's World University Games team. The squad spent time in Colorado Springs at training camp, before embarking on a two-week journey to Kazan, Russia, in early July, for the event. He furthered his international coaching experience as head coach of USA East Coast during the summer of 2014, which represented the United States at the Tallinn Cup in Estonia.

During his first season (2012-13) in Columbia, Martin led his squad to a 14-18 record, which included a 4-14 mark in SEC contests. The Garnet and Black captured the Hoops For Hope

Classic tournament crown after posting a 4-0 record competing in the event with home victories over Milwaukee and Rider, before defeating Missouri State in overtime, and UALR in Puerto Vallarta, Mexico, over the Thanksgiving holiday. Freshman forward Michael Carrera was honored after the conclusion of the regular season with selection to the 2013 SEC All-Freshman Team, as voted on by the league's head coaches. During the spring of 2013, the Gamecock coaching staff signed seven freshmen, while welcoming Villanova transfer Ty Johnson to the team, a recruiting class which ranked No. 23 in the nation according to ESPN.com.

Martin's second season (2013-14) leading the Gamecocks saw the squad win four of its final six games of the year, including two games in the SEC Tournament, marking the first Tournament wins for the Gamecocks since the 2008 campaign. Martin and his staff put together a non-conference schedule that challenged his team to prepare for the rigors of the SEC campaign. The Gamecocks posted several quality victories, including a win versus Saint Mary's at the Hawaiian Airlines Diamond Head Classic in December, and home victories versus Alabama, Vanderbilt and No. 17 Kentucky to name a few.

Martin tutored his second SEC All-Freshman Team honoree in as many seasons, as rookie guard Sindarius Thornwell led all freshmen in the SEC in league games in points (15.6) and assists (4.0) to earn a spot on the postseason team. Thornwell also garnered three SEC Freshman of the Week awards, and was named the Feb. 18 Wayman Tisdale National Freshman of the Week.

A native of Miami, Fla., Martin earned his bachelor's degree in physical education from Florida International in 1993. He and his wife, Anya, have three children, Brandon, Amalia and Christian.

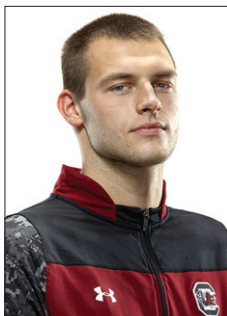

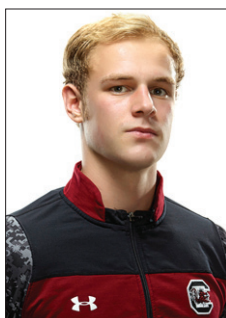

STILLWATER, Okla. - Unable to solve the hot shooting and defensive pressure of No. 9 Oklahoma State (8-1) in the first half, South Carolina (2-3) fell tonight, 79-52, at Gallagher-Iba Arena.

The Gamecocks were led by a strong performance in the second half from freshman guard Jaylen Shaw, who posted 13 points, going 4-5 from the field went 3-4 from 3-point range. Junior Tyrone Johnson chipped in 12 points as well. The combined 25 points though was not enough as the Cowboys' starters, led by Le'Bryan Nash, who had a game-high 16 points, combined for 60 points as all five were in double figures.

Forward Demetrius Henry opened up the game by giving the Gamecocks an early 2-0. Oklahoma State though clamped down on defense after the early bucket holding South Carolina to only one point over the next five-plus minutes as the Cowboys when on a 16-1 run led by the guards Marcus Smart and Markel Brown.

Duane Notice ended the run with a lay-up to make it 16-5 just before the under-12 media timeout. Out of the timeout though, Cowboy center Michael Cobbins had a put-back dunk off of a missed 3-pointer and Oklahoma State's run was back on.

The Cowboys pushed their lead to 27-5 before Johnson hit a 3 with 7:30 remaining in the half. Back-to-back 3-pointers from Smart and Phil Forte minutes later through increased the home team's lead to 35-9.

The Gamecocks held OSU to 1-7 from the field during the final minutes of the half as the Cowboys took a 39-15 lead into the break as the scoring trio of Smart, Brown and Nash combined for 29 points.

Oklahoma State took advantage of 13 South Carolina turnovers, scoring 21 points off of them as the team hit

13-26 (50 percent) from the field and were 10-14 (71.4 percent) from the line. The Gamecocks went 4-20 (20 percent) from the field.

Despite the halftime deficit, the Gamecocks continued to battle over the second half. Shaw kick-started a spurt midway through the half as he connected on a 3-pointer and followed that up with a dunk 30 seconds later to cut the lead to 50-28. Johnson followed that up with a lay-in and pair of free throws before Oklahoma State's Brian Williams responded.

With under nine minutes remaining in the game, Shaw was back it from beyond the arc as he hit his second and third 3's of the game just minutes apart, with the second making it 70-44 game.

Throughout the final 20 minutes, Oklahoma State out-scored South Carolina by three as the Gamecocks found a better rhythm, shooting 12-25 (48 percent) in the second half after going 4-20 (20 percent) in the opening half. The Cowboys though scored 14 points from the free throw line as they maintained their lead.

Guard Bruce Ellington rejoined the team this week after competing with the football team throughout the season. He saw his first game action, playing 17 minutes.
