



ATTENTION BOOSTERS

The University of South Carolina Office of Compliance Services is committed to a comprehensive compliance program that educates everyone about the importance of adhering to NCAA, SEC, and institutional rules. We strive to create a "compliance conscience" within the University and throughout the community.

The commitment to compliance ensures institutional control over the department of athletics and furthers the mission of the University of South Carolina. The existence of a successful compliance program depends on the willingness of coaches, administrators, staff, student-athletes and boosters to be cognizant of NCAA, SEC, and institutional rules.

WHAT IS COMPLIANCE?

At South Carolina, the Office of Compliance Services works within the department of athletics and the University to ensure South Carolina's compliance with all applicable rules. In doing so, the compliance staff is charged with the following tasks:

- Educating administrators, coaches, staff, prospects, student-athletes and boosters about NCAA, SEC, and institutional rules;
- Developing monitoring systems to ensure compliance with these rules. These systems are designed to monitor rules pertaining to recruiting, academic eligibility, financial aid, awards, extra benefits, ethical conduct, amateurism, agents, employment, occasional meals, and the playing and practice seasons for each sport; and
- Investigating and reporting violations of NCAA, SEC, and institutional rules to the appropriate governing authority.

ARE YOU A BOOSTER?

You are a booster if you are or ever have:

- Been a member of a booster organization that supports University of South Carolina athletics;
- Made any financial contributions to any area the University of South Carolina;
- Made any annual or lifetime membership commitment to a booster organization;
- Been involved with the recruitment of a prospect;
- Provided benefits to an enrolled student-athlete or his/her relatives or friends;
- Been involved in promoting South Carolina's athletic program;
- Provided or helped to arrange employment for student-athletes;
- Been a season ticket holder.

PROSPECTIVE STUDENT-ATHLETES

A prospective student-athlete (prospect) is a student who has:

- Started classes for the ninth grade, or
- Ever received any financial assistance or other benefit prospective students do not generally receive.

An individual remains a prospect until one of the following occurs (whichever is earlier):

- The individual officially registers and enrolls in a minimum full-time program of studies and attends classes in any term (including summer) of a four-year collegiate institution's regular academic year.
- The individual participates in a regular squad practice or competition at a four-year collegiate institution that occurs before the beginning of any term.

Remember a prospect remains a prospect even after signing a National Letter of Intent with the University of South Carolina.

EXTRA BENEFITS

A recruiting inducement or extra benefit is any special arrangement by a University of South Carolina employee or booster to provide a prospect, a student-athlete, or their relatives or friends a benefit not expressly authorized by the NCAA. Examples of impermissible extra benefits include, but are not limited to:

- Free or reduced cost services, rentals, or purchases of any type (e.g., meals, drinks, clothing, laundry, haircuts, legal fees, tattoos, car repairs, free upgrades on products or services, etc.)
- Gifts of any kind, including special occasions (birthdays, holidays, graduation, etc.)
- VIP access to bars, clubs, events, etc.
- Free or reduced cost housing for any length of time
- Loans (including co-signing)
- Cash or like items
- Use of an automobile or transportation
- An employment arrangement for a prospect or student-athlete's relatives
- Entertainment
- Use of your telephone or credit card
- Providing a meal in your home
- Academic assistance of any kind (e.g., tutoring, editing papers/projects, assistance in completing classwork, use of computer, etc.)
- Any tangible items, including merchandise

WHAT ARE THE CONSEQUENCES?

South Carolina is responsible for the actions of its boosters. If a booster provides an impermissible benefit to a prospect, a student-athlete, or their relatives or friends, South Carolina may be subject to penalties, even if the student-athlete has completed his or her eligibility. The prospect or student-athlete who accepts an impermissible benefit jeopardizes his or her eligibility for intercollegiate competition. A booster who provides an impermissible benefit may be disassociated from the University's athletics program. Disassociation results in a loss of all benefits or privileges offered by the department of athletics and may involve other penalties as appropriate.

In February 2012, the University of South Carolina appeared before the NCAA Committee on Infractions as a result of violations committed by boosters of its athletics program. CURTIS FRYE

Head Coach (Sprints / Hurdles) 20th Season Alma Mater: East Carolina ('74)

Entering the 2016 track

season in his 20th year as head track & field and cross country coach at South Carolina, Curtis Frye has established a program that is regarded as one of the nation's elite. Frye has coached or overseen over 60 NCAA champions, 116 SEC champions, 14 Academic All-Americans and more than 450 NCAA All-Americans.

The 2015 was an exciting one for the program, which celebrated its best finish at outdoor nationals for the women since 2007 and 2010 for the men. The program crowned a national champion in Jeannelle Scheper (high jump) and saw, between indoor and outdoor, seven individuals and one relay team earn an All-America certificate. In addition, Frye's dream of a brand new track facility was realized with the ground breaking of the Morris and Sheila Cregger Track Stadium, a fitting new home for Carolina's hall of fame head coach.

In December of 2013, Frye's significant impact on the history of track and field at the collegiate, national and international levels through his coaching and the legacies of his student-athletes was recognized as he was enshrined in the U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCCA) Hall of Fame. Earlier in the fall, Frye was also inducted into the Sandhills Community College Hall of Fame in Pinehurst, N.C.

In October 2008, Frye was bestowed the Order of Ikkos Medallion, presented by the United States Olympic Committee. A special order reserved for the coach of an Olympic or Paralympic medalist, Frye received the honor after coaching Jerome Singleton Jr. to a silver medal in the men's 100-meter dash at the 2008 Paralympic Games in Beijing. He is also a former President of the United States Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association and is currently a non-voting member of the USTFCCCA Board of Directors.

Frye has coached an NCAA champion in all but five years since taking over the program in 1996, including coaching LaKya Brookins three years ago to the 60-meter dash indoor title in 2009 en route to being named USTFCCCA Southeast Region Athlete of the Year for both the indoor and outdoor seasons. Brookins followed up her performance in 2009 with a second 60-meter dash

indoor title in 2011. In addition, Frye has coached an SEC champion in 17 of the 19 seasons he has been at South Carolina.

One of the most well-respected coaches in the country, Frye brought South Carolina its first team NCAA championship in any sport when his women's team captured the 2002 NCAA Outdoor Championship crown. Frye is a three-time United States Track Coaches Association (USTCA) National Coach of the Year, taking home the 1999 and 2002 women's outdoor honors and the 1999 men's indoor honors. In taking home the men's indoor and women's outdoor coach of the year honors in 1999, he became the first person in the history of the USTCA to win the award indoors and outdoors in the same year. In 2001, he earned the prestigious Nike Coach of the Year award and was also named the 1997 USOC Track & Field Coach of the Year. Frye is also a three-time SEC Coach of the Year with the honor coinciding with his three women's outdoor conference championships in 1999, 2002 and 2005.

During his tenure at South Carolina, Frye has coached 13 SEC Athletes of the Year, the most recent being Jeannelle Scheper, who was named the 2015 SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year (outdoor). He has also coached five national athletes of the year in Hastings (2007-overall), Demetria Washington (2002-indoor), Lashinda Demus (2002-overall), Terrence Trammell (2000-outdoor) and Miki Barber (2000-outdoor). Demus was acknowledged by Track & Field News while the United States Track & Field & Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCCA) honored the other four recipients.

On the women's side, Frye's teams have placed in the top ten nationally outdoors in ten different seasons at Carolina. In addition to the team title in 2002, his teams earned the silver medal in 2005 and took home the bronze in 2003 and 2006. On the men's side, Frye's team placed in the top 25 nationally indoors on 12 occasions and in the

top 20 nine times outdoors.

Along with continued success on the track, Frye has produced winners in the classroom on a consistent basis. Frye's athletes have earned four USTFCCCA National Scholar-Athlete of

the Year honors in addition to three SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year awards. Jason Richardson swept the indoor and outdoor national honors in 2008, following awards earned by 2006 National

Indoor Scholar Athlete of the Year Shalonda Solomon and 2002 National Scholar Athlete of

the Year Otukile Lekote.

Marvin Reitze earned the 2012 SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year award and Natasha Hastings ('07) and Jeannelle Scheper ('15) have also won the award. In 2009, the men's team was named Scholar

Team of the Year.

In his career, Frye has coached 25
Olympians who have garnered 13 medals at the Olympic Games.
Nine of his former student-athletes competed at the 2008 Olympic

Games in Beijing, six of them as first-time Olympians. At the Games, Natasha Hastings earned a gold medal as a member of the USA 4x400m relay team. Frye served as an assistant coach for the 2004 USA Olympic women's track team with responsibilities that included working with the sprinters and the relays. He also accompanied his former athletes to the 2000 Sydney Olympics. Frye's athletes won three gold medals in 2004 by Tonique Williams-Darling (Bahamas-400m), Otis Harris (USA-4x400m relay) and Aleen Bailey (Jamaica-4x100m relay). At the London 2012 Olympics, the total increased by two as Demus (400m hurdles) and Richardson (110m hurdles) claimed silver for the United States.

Most recently, Frye spent the majority of his summer in Russia. First, the Gamecock traveled to Kazan as the Team USA men's head coach for the World University Games. A short time later, he traveled to Moscow as an assistant coach for the IAAF World Championships to work with the men's sprints and hurdles. The sprint and hurdle group medaled in every event of the meet, capturing three gold medals.

Never one to sit on the sidelines, Frye established the Frye Foundation after his family was devastated by diabetes. The foundation is dedicated to assisting those dealing with diabetes and mental illness. Each year, they host a 5K run/ walk as well as a golf tournament and silent auction.

Hired at South Carolina on July 29, 1996, Frye came to Columbia after serving as assistant head coach at North Carolina for four years. During his tenure at UNC, he was a part of 13 ACC championship teams.

Prior to his stint with the Tar Heels, Frye was an assistant coach at Florida from 1988 to 1992. While with the Gator program, he coached three NCAA individual champions and one relay champion team. In total, 29 All-America certificates were earned while Frye was in Gainesville.

From 1984 to 1988, Frye was an assistant coach for N.C. State, aiding the Wolfpack to four conference championships. He was instrumental in leading State to 27 All-America honors, four individual NCAA second-place finishes and 37 conference champions.

Frye began his coaching career as an assistant at his alma mater, East Carolina, in 1974. He also served as head coach for the men's soccer team and was director of facilities. Frye took a break from the collegiate ranks from 1979 to 1984 when he was head track and field coach for Douglas Byrd High School in Fayetteville, N.C. Frye and his wife, Wilma, have three children: Crystal, C.J. and Curtrell.







FRYE ENSHRINED INTO USTFCCCA HALL OF FAME

ORLANDO, Fla. - South Carolina track and field head coach Curtis Frye earned one of the highest honors of his career on Dec. 16, 2013, as he was enshrined into the U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCCA) Hall of Fame.

Joining Frye in the Class of 2013 are: Ron Allice, Al Cantello, Dennis Craddock, Jim Hunt and Paul Olsen.

Many of Frye's former athletes and staff members were on hand to celebrate the accomplishment with the coach, including Olympic gold medalists Aleen Bailey, Allen Johnson, along with Olympians Shalonda Solomon and Lisa Misipeka. Jim Bibbs, former Michigan State coach and one of Frye's oldest and most important mentors, was also on hand for the event.

Started in 1995, the USTFCCCA Coaches Hall of Fame exists to recognize coaches who have brought great distinction to themselves, to their institutions and to the sports of cross country and track & field. Each of the honorees exemplifies the qualities of dedication to the sport, leadership and passion for their profession that serve as an inspiration to coaches everywhere in the sport.

Frye joins Weemie "Weems" Baskin as one of two Gamecocks included in the USTFCCCA Hall of Fame. Baskin was the track & field head coach at the University of South Carolina from 1948-69 and the University's outdoor track is named in his honor.













DELETHEA QUARLES

Asst. Head Coach (Jumps/Multis) 19th Season Alma Mater: Liberty ('89)

Delethea "Dee" Quarles is in her 19th year with the South Carolina program and her 26th year as a collegiate coach entering the 2016 season.

Promoted to assistant head coach in 2005, her primary responsibilities include coaching the multi-event performers and jumps. Quarles also oversees eligibility and is the team's academic liaison.

Quarles has extensive international experience, none more impressive than her 2015 post as the head women's coach for Team USA at the IAAF World Championships in Beijing, China.

Prior to her 2015 appointment, Quarles has been appointed to the Team USA staff for the last two IAAF World Championships. Most recently in Moscow at the 2013 IAAF World Championships, Quarles served as the jumps and multis coach for the women's team. The group claimed a gold (Brittney Reese - long jump) and two silvers (Jennifer Suhr - pole vault and Brigetta Barrett - high jump) to win medals in three of their five events.


Quarles served as assistant coach for Team USA at the 2011 IAAF World Championships in Daegu, South Korea, with responsibility for the jumping events.

In 2007 Quarles was the head coach of the USA Pan American Junior Championship women's team that competed in Brazil in July. While the head coach she was responsible for all jumps and multi events. The men's and women's teams combined to win 48 medals at the meet. Quarles worked as an assistant coach on the all-star squad of coaches for the 2006 USA World Cup team in Athens, Greece, with the responsibility of coaching all the jumps. Quarles ended the 2005 season as an assistant coach for Team USA at the Pan American Championships held in Windsor, Ontario, Canada.

With her assistance, the USA team earned 57 medals, the second-highest of all time.

Academically, Quarles has guided three student-athletes to national Scholar Athlete of the Year honors. Jason Richardson became the first Gamecock to sweep indoor and outdoor honors as he was awarded by the USTFCCCA for both seasons in 2008 as the male Scholar Athlete of the Year. Shalonda Solomon was named 2006 Indoor Scholar Athlete of the Year, and Otukile Lekote picked up the accolade in 2002. The South Carolina women's team was honored by the organization as the 2006 Academic National Champion, and the men's team was named the 2009 Academic National Champion. In addition, Natasha Hastings was named the 2006 SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year, Marvin Reitze earned the honor in 2012 and Jeannelle Scheper won the recognition in 2015. Carolina has also earned 14 national Academic All-America honors in her time with the program.

Quarles has coached her student-athletes to 26 All-America honors and seven SEC championships.. In addition, former Gamecock Chelsea Hammond became the first multi-event student-athlete in South Carolina history to qualify for the Olympic Games. Coached by Quarles from 2002 to 2005, Hammond competed for Jamaica at the 2008 Olympic Games in the



ships. Her crowning achievement under Coach Dee would come in 2015, when she became the first jumper (man or woman) in program history to win a national title after taking the outdoor high jump win in Eugene. She was Quarles' first individual national champion.

Quarles has coached 14 of the 16 school record holders in the events for which she is responsible at South Carolina. Greig Cryer finished a career-high third in the long jump at the 2006 NCAA Indoor Championships after setting the indoor school record in the triple jump, crossing the board at 52-5.25;. The mark was a foot longer than the record that had stood for 12 years. Derek Pressley, a 2008 graduate, jumped a career-best 51-10 ½ as runner-up in the triple jump at the 2007 SEC Outdoor Championships. Scheper holds the indoor and outdoor high jump records and set a new program record in the 2015 outdoor season with a height of six feet, five inches. Also in 2015, the program saw new program records set in the women's indoor triple jump (LeAnna Morrison, 43-5.25) and

men's outdoor triple jump (Michael Wamer, 54-0.5).

Leading the women's team, Quarles coached Kettiany Clarke, Kemesha Whitmire, Tacita Bass, Erin Narzinski and Jeannelle Scheper to SEC titles. Clarke became Carolina's first pentathlon winner with the title at the 2010 SEC Indoor Championships. Whitmire jumped a 43-7 in 2005 to take the long jump title, Scheper jumped a school record 6-5 to win the high jump in 2015, while Bass and Narzinski combined for three heptathlon titles. In her first year, Quarles saw Narzinski shatter the school record in the heptathlon, finishing fifth at the NCAA Championships, second at the SEC Championships and eighth at the USATF Junior Nationals. Narzinski earned her second heptathlon title in 1999.



Prior to coming to South Carolina, Quarles was an assistant coach at her alma mater, Liberty, for eight years. As an athlete at the school, Quarles helped Liberty claim indoor and outdoor track conference championship titles during her junior and senior campaigns (1988 and 1989), thanks to her standout performances in the heptathlon. She earned All-America honors in the event in 1987 and 1988, placing fifth in the heptathlon at the NCAA Division II National Championship.

A three-time All-American, Quarles was the first student-athlete in program history (men's or women's) to score more than 200 points in a season and one of only 11 in program history to do so at any level of competition (227.5 points as a senior). The 1989 Penn Relays 100-meter hurdles champion held the program record in the event for more than 20 years before it was broken in 2010.

For all her efforts as a coach and athlete with the Flames, she was elected in to the school's hall of fame in the Fall of 2014.

Quarles has a bachelor's degree in psychology and is a native of Covington, Va.



MIKE SERGENT

Assistant Coach (Throws) 19th Season Alma Mater: Virginia Tech ('92)

Mike Sergent enters his 19th season with the Gamecock track and field program in 2016. His primary responsibilities are coaching the throw-

ers and coordinating the strength and conditioning program. Sergent has coached 26 All-Americans, 42 NCAA qualifiers, 14 SEC champions and five NCAA champions at South Carolina.

Sergent had a memorable first season as he coached Lisa Misipeka and Brad Snyder to a total of four NCAA individual championships. Misipeka took home titles in the 20-pound weight and the hammer, while Snyder swept the indoor and outdoor titles in the shot put. Snyder repeated in 1999 when Sergent coached him to the indoor shot put title for the second-consecutive year.

He fostered a young and talented team of throwers in 2015, helping to produce top-ten marks in the program's outdoor history in the shot put, ham-

mer, discus and javelin. Freshman Josh Awotunde was a dual threat in the shot put and discus, qualifying for NCAA regionals in both events. He set the sixth-best shot put mark (best since 2009) and fifth-best discus mark (best since 1999) in the Spring. Sophomore Clarence Gallop also qualified for the regional meet after posting the fifth-best hammer throw in school history (best since 1999). On the women's side, junior Olivia Hassler and freshmen Shelby Freedman and Amy Suttmeier threw for the program's top-five in the javelin. Freedman now sits second all-time, Hassler third and Suttmeier fifth, providing the team with a deep and developing pool of talent.

In 2011, Michael Zajac brought home All-America honors in the weight throw and hammer throw. Five throwers qualified for the NCAA Preliminary, and his athletes earned 22 points at SEC Championship events.

On the men's side, Zajac was the SEC bronze medalist in the weight throw and earned All-America honors by taking 7th in the weight throw at the NCAA Indoor Championships and 15th in the hammer throw at the

NCAA Outdoor Championships. He concluded his career with 46 points in SEC competition and as one of two Gamecocks to score in both the hammer and weight throw in all four of his seasons.

On the women's side, four Gamecocks scored at the SEC Outdoor Championships to continue Sergent's streak of having a thrower score at the meet every season since he has been at Carolina. Four throwers qualified for NCAA Regionals: senior Aimee Kodat, juniors Stacee Roberts and Katie Vuckovich, and freshman Breanna Radford.

Sergent has also seen success in coaching his student-athletes on the international stage. In 2003, former Gamecock and NCAA champion Dawn Ellerbe reached the World Championships in Paris under Sergent's tutelage. He also worked with Ellerbe in 2002 to help her become the USATF national runner-up in both the weight and hammer throws. She finished the year ranked seventh in the world in the hammer, set the American record in the hammer, and finished ranked eighth nationally in the discus throw.

In 2001, two of Sergent's former student-athletes, Snyder and Misipeka, along with Ellerbe, traveled to Edmonton, Canada, for the 2001 World Championships. In his third year at South Carolina, Sergent coached Candy Mitchell, Bert Sorin and Ryan Harrison through the U.S. Olympic

trials. At the 2000 Olympic Games, Snyder, Misipeka and Michelle Fournier all competed.

In 1999, Sergent's student-athletes won four SEC titles. Fournier, an academic All-American and NCAA runnerup, was awarded an NCAA Post-Graduate Scholarship. Misipeka also won a bronze medal at the 1999 World Championships - the school's first in a major international meet.

Prior to coaching at Carolina, Sergent was an assistant coach at his alma mater, Virginia Tech, for five years. At Tech, he assisted in one Metro and four Atlantic 10 Conference championship teams from 1993 to 1997.

Sergent holds a bachelor's degree in exercise science and a master's degree in sports management from Virginia Tech. He was a 1992 All-American and Olympic trials qualifier in the hammer. In the fall of 2012, Sergent was inducted into the Virginia Tech Sports Hall of Fame in his first year of eligibility

Sergent and his wife, Karen, have a daughter named Kelsey.





KEVIN BROWN

Assistant Coach (Sprints, Relays, Pole Vault) Recruiting Coordinator 6th Season Alma Mater: North Carolina ('94)

Kevin Brown enters the seventh year of his second stint with the Gamecocks in the 2016 season.

His primary responsibility is working with the pole vaulters in addition to working with South Carolina's well-respected relay teams and sprinters. Brown is also the program's recruiting coordinator.

Last season, he had success coaching multi-event athlete Markus Leemet. In just his first season on the roster, Leemet recorded the program's second-highest heptathlon and decathlon scores ever and earned All-America honors in the decathlon for the outdoor season. Brown also helped to coordinate one of the most talented recruiting classes in the program's recent history.

While in his first stint at Carolina, Brown was named to the Team USA coaching staff for the 2003 Junior Pan American Games and served as an

assistant coach during the competition in Barbados. In December 2002, he was voted to the Team USA staff by the USATF Coaches Championship Selection Committee, a group that selects national coaching staffs for International competition including the Pan American Games and Goodwill Games. Brown became the second USC assistant coach to serve as a part of a Team USA staff.

Under Brown's tutelage as pole vault coach in his first stint at South Carolina, pole vaulter Chris Steddum earned three first-place finishes during the 2003 outdoor season, including a meet record 17-0 3/4" to win the Orange and Purple Classic at Clemson, a vault that earned him SEC Athlete of the

Week honors. Steddum finished second at the SEC Indoor Championships. In 2002, Steddum finished fourth at the NCAA Outdoor Championships in 2002 and was named All-American. He also finished fourth at the SEC Indoor Championships, second at the SEC Outdoor Championships and eighth in the NCAA Indoor Championships in the pole vault, garnering All-American honors.

In 2001, Brown coached Jared Farabee and Steddum to a one-two finish at the SEC Outdoor Championships. Steddum also qualified for the NCAA

Indoor Championships and set a school record with a height of 17'-8. Farabee posted a first place finish in the pole vault at the Penn Relays.

In 2011, Brown coached Lakya Brookins to a NCAA record in the 60-meter dash at 7.09. Brookins won the 2009 60m NCAA title as a sophomore and capped her senior indoor season

with a second title in 2011 where she tied the record in the finals to win the championship.

Marvin Reitze also reached national prominence under Brown as she was the runner up in the pole vault in the SEC and NCAA Indoor Championships. Reitze vaulted 18'1 to become the Penn Relay's Pole Vault Champion and was named Field Event Athlete of the Meet. In addition to his athletic accomplishments, Reitze was also a NCAA Academic All-American.

Prior to coming to South Carolina in 2000, Brown spent two years as assistant coach at the University of Akron. While at Akron, Brown assisted with the sprints on the track and field team and specialized as the team's field events and jumps coach.

Brown began his coaching career in 1995 as an assistant coach at his alma mater, the University of North Carolina, where he left as the most decorated vaulter in school history.

A pole vault All-American in 1994, Brown placed fourth for the Tar Heels at the NCAA meet, clearing 18-0 1/2. Brown was the only college vaulter in the state of North Carolina to clear 18-0 in 1994. He was an Atlantic Coast Conference scorer in five different events including the pole vault, long jump, triple jump, 4x400 and the 4x100. He still holds the UNC indoor and outdoor records in the pole vault.

A native of Richmond, Va., Brown attended Henrico High School where he was the 1989 Virginia state

high school champion in the pole vault. Brown also was a Junior Olympic Regional Champion while he lettered in football, wrestling and track and field.

A 2000 and 1996 Olympic Trials qualifier, his personal best in the pole vault is 18-6.

Brown graduated from North Carolina with a Bachelor of Arts degree in recreational administration. He and his wife Eboni have four children, Dymonic, Daija, Dorien and Daila, and reside in Columbia.





ANDREW ALLDEN

Assistant Coach (Distances/XC) 3rd Season Alma Mater: Emory ('86)

A 24-year veteran of distance coaching, Andrew Allden returned to South Carolina as the assistant track coach for distance and cross country for

the 2013-14 season and enters the 2016 season with a young and talented group of distance runners.

In the 2015 season, his cross country team won four meets for the season and an 18th-place finish at the regional meet. This success came despite the fact that 19 members of the team were in either their first or second year. The team's upperclassmen provided plenty of leadership though, including junior Anna Todd who recorded the program's fifth-fastest 6K time ever.

Moving in to the track season, Todd and the distance group continued to flourish with Allden at the helm. On the men's side indoors, Kevin Keating ran the sixth-fastest 800 and fourth-fastest 1000 in program history,

and Alex Sullivan ran the seventh-fastest 1000. Todd led the women with the program's fastest 1000, third-fastest mile, and fourth-fastest 3000 indoors along with a spot on the second-fastest 4x800 relay team in school history. Outdoors, the youthful Gamecock women climbed in to the program record book in the 10K (Hannah Giangaspro) and Steeplechase (Allie Whitley and Sarah Taylor).

Allden spent five years at the Palmetto state's flagship institution as its head cross country and distance coach from the fall of 1996 through the spring of 2001, helping head coach Curtis Frye's teams to new heights. The women's track team finished fourth or better in the Southeastern Conference all five

years with Allden on staff, including winning the 1999 outdoor championship. Twice, the team finished second in the NCAA Indoor Championships. He coached four-time All-American Charmaine Howell (800m) as well as 1998 10,000m All-American Tanya Povey. On the men's side, Marvin Watts (once) and Otukile Lekote (twice) both earned All-America honors in the 800m during Allden's tenure, with Lekote winning the first of his two outdoor 800m titles under Allden's guidance.

In his five years as the Gamecocks' head cross country coach, he led the team to its best finish in the SEC in 1999. That season, Allden had two pupils, Sara Hadwin and Joyce Peebles, earn All-SEC accolades, the only year the Gamecocks have had two runners earn that distinction. Both Hadwin and Peebles were South Carolina natives.

After his stint in Columbia, Allden moved to Coastal Carolina to take over the Chanticleers' men's program. His stint as the men's coach at Coastal Carolina still stands out as some of the best years for the Chanticleers. His 2003 team won the Big South Conference title, ending a dynasty by Liberty. Three student-athletes made the NCAA Championships that he coached, including top distance pupil Terak Kipchiris. The Big South Coach of the Year and Southeast Region Coach of the Year in 2003, Allden helped

Kipchiris win the Big South Cross Country Championships individual title twice and earn all-region honors two times as well. Kipchiris became the first CCU male to compete in an NCAA Championship in cross country or track, earning an individual spot in the cross country field twice in 2002 and 2003 and in the 3000m steeplechase in 2004.

In 2004, Allden also served as a men's assistant coach for distance in the IAAF World Indoor Championships in Hungary.

For the nine years prior to his return to the Gamecocks, Allden has run AA Elite Coaching in North Carolina, coaching many professional and amateur athletes in the Raleigh-Durham area. Karjuan Williams ranks as his most prominent charge in recent years, as he finished fifth in the 2010 USA

Track & Field Outdoor Championships in the 800-meter run. He also serves as the USATF East Coast Coordinator for Level I Coaching Education, directing more than a dozen coaching schools per year on the eastern seaboard. In his over 14 years of coaching education, he's helped educate over 3,000 coaches.

Earlier in his career, he coached at Tulane, taking over as the interim head coach in 1995. During that season, his team set nine school records, won seven individual conference titles and saw 19 performers earn All-Conference USA accolades.

This will be the third time Allden has worked with Coach Frye, after serving on his staff at North Carolina from 1989-93 as well as his 1996-

2000 stint at South Carolina in this same capacity. His 1993 women's cross country team with the Tar Heels advanced to the NCAA Championships, ranking eighth nationally, while his 1991 men's team also made the national finals. He also guided one ACC individual men's cross country champion, one runner-up and seven All-ACC cross country harriers.

Allden earned his bachelors from Emory University in English in 1986 and holds a masters in sports administration from Georgia in 1991. Allden helped Emory's cross country team to one of its three NCAA Championship berths during his time there. He is also a USATF Level I and II certified coach as well as a Level I and II endurance instructor.

Allden is married to Tara Disy Allden, and they have one daughter, Kathleen, who already is a national qualifier in the junior Olympics in track and cross country.





HADRIEN CHOUKROUN

Assistant Coach (Sprints, Hurdles) 1st Season

Hadrien Choukroun will join the full-time staff as an assistant coach for sprints and hurdles for 2016. Choukroun has been with the program since 2013,

and spent last season as a graduate assistant.

Prior to coming to work for the Gamecocks, Hadrien worked down the road at Benedict College, where he was responsible for the hurdle, jump, throw and multi-event athletes. Before Benedict, he was an Assistant Coach during three seasons at Lille Track & Field Club in his native country of France. With the club, Choukroun was in charge of development and succeeded in qualifying several of his athletes for the Youth National Championships.

He joined the Gamecocks in the Spring of 2013, focusing on sprints and hurdles as well as assisting the cross country program. As the team's graduate assistant, his day-to-day duties included video breakdown, marketing and advertising efforts, home meet management and recruiting.

day-to-day duties included video breakdown, marketing and advertising chorts, nome meet management and rectuting.

In his time with the program, Carolina has crowned 11 All-Americans (five men, six women) in the sprint and hurdle events, including three men in the 60-meter hurdles this past indoor season.

In addition to his work at Carolina, he has worked these past three seasons as a coach for Speed Elite, a professional athlete group, designing workouts and managing practices.

Choukroun is a member of USATF association and is certified by the USATF Level 1 and by the FFA (French Federation of Track and Field) National Supervisor.

He earned a bachelor's degree in Physical Education at the Université Lille 2 in France, he also received a master's degree in Conditioning, Training and Mental Preparation from Lille. In 2011, Choukroun earned a second bachelor's degree, this time in psychology at Benedict College, and recently earned a MBA from Claffin University.

Currently, he is pursuing a doctorate in Philosophy (Foundations of Education) from South Carolina.







CAROLINA WITH A STRONG PRESENCE AT 2000 OLYMPICS

South Carolina sent a combined 19 athletes/coaches to the 2000 Olympics in Sydney, Australia, 12 of whom came from the track and field program. Graduates Charmaine Howell and Terrence Trammell both won silver medals, with Howell's coming in the 4x400-meter relay for Jamaica and Trammell's in the 110-meter hurdles for the USA. Former volunteer coach Monique Hennagan scored a gold medal as a member of the USA's 4x400m relay squad. Another former volunteer, Melissa Morrison, received a bronze medal competing for the USA in the 100-meter hurdles. Former Gamecocks Miki Barber, Dawn Ellerbe, Michelle Fournier, Tonique Williams-Darling and Marvin Watts competed in the Sydney Olympics, as well as former volunteer coach Allen Johnson. Former student-athletes Lisa Barber, Jimmie Hackley, Jackie Madison, Candy Mitchell, Demetria Washington, Antoinette Wilks and Ellakisha Williamson were Olympic trials participants.

TEN GAMECOCKS COMPETE AT 2004 OLYMPICS

Ten Gamecocks, currently and formerly coached by Curtis Frye (who served as an assistant coach for the USA Women's Track and Field Team), were among the 2004 Olympians in Athens, Greece. Of those 10, four brought home a total of five medals, including the USC track and field program's first three gold medals won by former athletes Tonique Williams-Darling (Bahamas) in the 400m, Otis Harris (USA) in the 4x400m relay and Aleen Bailey (Jamaica) in the 4x100m relay. Harris also won a silver medal in the 400m, while Terrence Trammell claimed his second consecutive silver medal in the 110m hurdles. Former volunteer coach Melissa Morrison also added to her medal count with a bronze in the 100m hurdles. Other USC Olympians included Lisa Misipeka, Michelle Fournier, Brad Snyder, Lashinda Demus, Adrian Durant and Shevon Stoddart, as well as former volunteer coaches Allen Johnson and Monique Hennagan.

2008 & 2012 OLYMPIC GAMES

NINE GAMECOCKS REPRESENT AT 2008 OLYMPICS

South Carolina sent a combined 13 athletes/coaches to the 2008 Olympics in Beijing, China, nine of whom came from the track and field program. An unfortunate string of events left Team USA hurting on the medal stand, but Natasha Hastings helped bring home a gold medal in the 4x100-meter relay, marking the second consecutive Games that a Gamecock took gold in the event. Chelsea Hammond narrowly missed medaling in her first Olympic Games, taking fourth in the long jump, while Tiffany Ross led the field through the preliminary rounds before taking eighth in the 100-meter hurdles. For a large contingent of Gamecocks favored to medal in their events, the scoreboards showed multiple "Did Not Finish" results, including for relay members Aleen Bailey, Leroy Dixon, Mechelle Lewis and Rodney Martin. Terrence Trammell, a favorite to medal in the 110-meter hurdles for his third consecutive Games, suffered a hamstring injury in the preliminary round to end his quest.

RICHARDSON, DEMUS BRING HOME OLYMPIC SILVER FROM 2012 OLYMPICS

Former Gamecocks Lashinda Demus and Jason Richardson both claimed silver in London. The two medals bring the South Carolina track and field Olympic medal count up to 13 since the 2000 Olympic Games in Sydney.

Demus claimed silver in the 400-meter hurdles at 52.77, the fastest secondplace Olympic time in history, and Richardson claimed silver in the 110-meter hurdles at 13.04.

Having struggled with injuries all season and battling back problems in London, Demus ran a composed race in the 400 hurdles. Jamaica's Kaliese Spencer got out well in the outside lane, with Demus and Natalya Antyukh of Russia very close behind. The Russian moved into the lead halfway through and had a stride and a half lead over Demus coming off the penultimate hurdle. The 2008 world silver medalist and 2011 world champion, Demus closed hard as both women lunged for the finish. Antyukh won in a personal-best time of 52.70, with Demus second in a season best of 52.77. Zuzana Hejnova of the Czech Republic won bronze in 53.88. Demus ran the fastest second-place time in Olympic history.

"I can't explain how bad I wanted a gold," Demus said. "I have been dreaming about it for years. So many people were supporting me. I am grateful I got on the podium. Number two in the world says a lot but number one says a lot more so I won't stop till I get that. I'm a fighter, I have always been one."

The 2011 World Outdoor champion, Richardson was slightly sluggish out of the blocks but passed world record holder Dayron Robles of Cuba over the fourth hurdle to move into second. He finished in 13.04 to win the silver medal, holding off Hansle Parchment of Jamaica, who was third in 13.12.

"You don't train to get second," Richardson said. "I'm so happy for Aries (Merritt, gold medalist from USA). I made a few tactical errors but I didn't give up. The best man won here today. It is an honor to be part of a race with two American medals. I am very happy for the experience. If I am satisfied with silver then there is no hope for gold, so I will keep that hunger."

Former Gamecock Natasha Hastings also represented South Carolina in London as a member of the 4x100m relay pool. Hastings did not see action on the track in London.

HASTINGS' MEDAL HIGHLIGHTS GAMECOCKS RUN AT WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS IN BEIJING, CHINA

BEIJING, CHINA - The eyes of the track and field world rested on the Bird's Nest in Beijing, as the IAAF World Championships were held Aug. 22-30. South Carolina's track program was well represented at the meet, with five former Gamecocks representing four different countries and assistant head coach Delethea Quarles serving as the head women's coach for Team USA.

The meet began for the Gamecocks with the men's and women's 400-meter hurdles. Johnny Dutch would make it to the semifinal round for Team USA but missed a shot at the finals by just .28 seconds. Shevon Stoddart, running for Jamaica, came up just short of moving out of the preliminary rounds for her race.

In the high hurdles, Kierre Beckles ran the 100-meter race for Barbados and had a breakthrough for her home country. After entering the meet with a personal best of 13 seconds, Beckles ran a 12.88 with a head wind to advance out of the preliminary rounds. In the process, her time broke Barbados' national record. Her time would be similar in the semifinals, at 12.90, but she came just shy of making the finals.

The Gamecocks had another semifinalist out of the women's sprints, as Natasha Hastings made it through the second round of action in the 400-meter dash. She had a top time of 51.25, but could not crack the final eight. Her meet was not finished, though, as she earned a spot on the 4x400 relay team to close out the meet. She ran the second leg of the race and helped the U.S. earn silver.

In the field events, 2015 NCAA high jump national champion Jeannelle Scheper took the field representing St. Lucia. She had little trouble in the qualifying round, hitting 1.92 meters to finish sixth in her flight. In the finals, she would match that mark and finished seventh overall.

The World Championships is one of the final major tune-ups ahead of the 2016 Olympic Games in Rio de Janiero, Brazil, where Carolina head coach Curtis Frye will be part of Team USA's coaching staff. The next World Championships meet will be held in London in 2017.

2002 NCAA WOMEN'S OUTDOOR NATIONAL CHAMPIONS

BATON ROUGE, La. (June 1, 2002) — Winning the 4x400m relay with an NCAA meet and collegiate record, the University of South Carolina women's track and field team won the NCAA Outdoor Track and Field title in Baton Rouge, La. It is the school's first-ever NCAA team title in any sport.

USC's women scored 82 points to win the title with UCLA scoring 72 points. Southern California, the defending champions, finished third and LSU, the 2002 indoor champions, was fourth.

On the men's side, South Carolina's men finished sixth with 30 points. LSU won the title with 64 points and Tennessee, favored all year, finished second with 57 points.

"I've learned a lot from a lot of great people," Carolina head coach Curtis Frye said. "I stand on the shoulders of incredible giants in the sport. I think our kids understand what it means to be a class act and win a championship. I knew some things had to happen for UCLA. We didn't have a lot of things go wrong and we wanted to control our own destiny. We wanted to run our best race of the year in the 4x400m relay and we did. I am just thrilled; I have waited 27 years for this.

"I'm just as thrilled with the men's finish," Frye continued. "We came here hoping to finish in the top 10 — maybe top five. I am proud of our efforts. I knew after we won the SEC title in the 4x400m relay, our men would win the race here. All four put it on the line and did an incredible job."

The women ran a time of 3:26.46 to break its own collegiate and NCAA Championship records in the 4x400m relay. The team of Tiffany Ross, Demetria Washington, Tacita Bass and Lashinda Demus helped USC to a first-place finish over Texas. It last won the NCAA title in 2000.

"I can't put into words how I feel right now," Lisa Barber said. "Winning the school's first NCAA title - ever - wow! I am so proud of our entire team. We knew we had a chance if we just worked hard. We are thrilled. I am so proud of the men's and women's teams."

On the men's side, USC won the final event of the meet, the men's 4x400m relay with a school-record time of 3:02.16. The relay included James Law, Otukile Lekote, Otis Harris and Jon Fortenberry. Fortenberry, hoping to reverse his luck after dropping the stick in the prelims, wore his uniform backward and beat LSU and Baylor at the tape.

"I didn't want to drop the stick again tonight, so I wore my uniform backward. It worked," Fortenberry said.

In the final day of the NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championships,



USC's quarter-mile runners went 2-3-4 to collect 19 points in the event alone. Barber ran a personal-best at 50.87 to finish as the runner-up in the 400m. Demus was third, finishing at 51.30, also a personal best. Demus won the 400m hurdles Friday. Washington was fourth, finishing at 51.38. Washington was the runner-up in 2001 and at the indoor meet in 2002.

One hour later, Aleen Bailey stepped on the track with Barber and picked up 12 points in the 200m, finishing second and fifth, respectively. Bailey ran a 22.99 to finish as the runner-up and Barber finished fifth at 23.29.

"Coach Frye told us before the 200m race that we had to score six points to help the team," Bailey said. "We scored 12! I am so happy to finish second. I know the points helped the team."

On the men's side, Harris was eighth in the 400m at 45.99. It was the first time Harris has scored at the outdoor meet and his first outdoor All-America honor. Fortenberry was ninth and also collected All-America honors.

Ross was eighth in the 100m hurdles at 13.57. It was a first-time appearance for Ross in the event, as she was the NCAA runner-up Friday in the 400m hurdles with a time of 55.22.
