South Carolina Notables

- The Gamecocks are in their 41st season of women's basketball and the program's 24th in the SEC.
- South Carolina is in its seventh season under head coach Dawn Staley, during which the Gamecocks have gone 122-71. South Carolina has played in the last three NCAA Tournaments, including two trips to the Sweet 16.
- The 2013-14 Gamecocks will receive their SEC Championship rings and the banners for that title and the team's trip to the NCAA Sweet 16 will be unveiled prior to tonight's game.
- South Carolina is looking for its 20th-straight win at Colonial Life Arena tonight.
- With this week's ranking of No. 2, South Carolina has been in the AP top 10 for 13 straight weeks/polls. The Gamecocks ended the 2013-14 season ranked eighth and opened this season at No. 2. It matches the longest top-10 stretch for the program, originally set from Jan. 22, 1980 through Dec. 16, 1980.
- South Carolina has not allowed a team to shoot 50.0 percent from the field since Feb. 28, 2013, (Missouri). The highest field goal percentage defense last season was .459 by North Carolina in Myrtle Beach as one of just six games that saw an opponent reach the .400 mark.
- In a vote of student-athletes and coaches, the Gamecocks have four captains this season – Asia Dozier, Elem Ibiam, Tiffany Mitchell and Aleighsa Welch.
- The Gamecocks were predicted to repeat as SEC Champions by both the league's coaches and the media.
- All five starters from last season's NCAA Sweet 16 squad return for 2014-15 as well as the bench's top scorer and rebounder in Alaina Coates.
- The Gamecocks have won at least 25 games in each of the last three seasons, the first such stint in school history.
- The addition of the SEC Network has allowed for 24 of the Gamecocks' 29 regular-season games to be broadcast nationally this season.

Clemson Series Notes

The Tigers continue to lead the overall series 33-26, but the Gamecocks have won the last four meetings by an average of 19.3 points. South Carolina holds a 17-10 advantage in Columbia, including the last two meetings at Colonial Life Arena.

Playing in her final game of the rivalry, senior Aleighsa Welch enters tonight's matchup averaging 10.0 points and 8.0 rebounds in 23.3 minutes per game while shooting 61.6 percent from the field against the Tigers.

Junior Tiffany Mitchell's numbers are nearly as good against the Gamecocks' archrival, averaging

15.0 points, 6.0 rebounds, and 3.5 assists on 61.9 percent shooting.

Frenemies

Adding to the rivalry of night's game, the matchup pits a pair of former teammates against each other in South Carolina head coach Dawn Staley and Clemson head coach Audra Smith. The two played for Debbie Ryan's Virginia Cavaliers for four seasons (1989-92), collaborating on three trips to the NCAA Final Four and two ACC Championships.

Home Sweet Home

The Gamecocks are in the midst of unprecedented success at Colonial Life Arena, having won their last 19 games on their home court, including the first perfect season in 2013-14. That 16-0 mark alone matched the previous record for win streak at the facility, originally set Jan. 20, 2002-Jan. 9, 2003. South Carolina's last loss at Colonial Life Arena was a 50-48 decision to then-No. 14 Texas A&M on Feb. 10, 2013.

Overall, South Carolina is 134-58 (.698) at Colonial Life Arena, including a 68-25 (.731) mark under head coach Dawn Staley. In the now 41-year history of the program, the Gamecocks are 379-155 (.710) in home games.

Poll Presence

South Carolina's second week at No. 2 in the Associated Press Preseason Top 25, makes it the Gamecocks 13th-straight week in the AP top 10. The current streak matches the program's longest top-10 stretch originally set from Jan. 22, 1980 through Dec. 16, 1980.

The No. 2 ranking, originally earned in the preseason poll matches the program's all-time highest ranking and marked the best preseason rank in school history. The 1981-82 team earned the previous best marks with a preseason rank of No. 4 and spending three weeks at No. 2 (Dec. 20, 1981-Jan. 3, 1982).

Crowd Control

The Gamecocks drew 10,057 fans to their season opener against Southern Cal, the largest crowd for a home opener since the opening game at Colonial Life Arena drew 17,712.

South Carolina women's basketball has logged five crowds of over 10,000 fans in Colonial Life Arena history, four of which have come in the last three seasons.

Back in (Garnet and) Black

A huge reason the this season's lofty expectations is the return of all five starters among the 10 returning letterwinners. The Gamecocks return

97.6 percent of their scoring, 96.0 percent of their rebounding, 98.4 percent of their assists and 97.1 percent of their school-record shot blocking from last season's top-10 squad. Nine of the 10 returners played in at least 29 of the team's 34 games last season and contributed at least 2.0 points per game.

Elite Additions

The Gamecocks added the nation's No. 2 signing class to their core of returning letterwinners. Four of the five signees will take the court for the Gamecocks this season, led by No. 1 A'ja Wilson and No. 7 Jatarie White. Two other top-35 signees – Bianca Cuevas, Kaydra Duckett – round out the group that will contribute this season.

SEC Title Talk

In 2013-14, South Carolina became the seventh program to win the SEC regular-season title and were predicted by the league's coaches and media to repeat the feat this season. If Staley's group brings that forecast to fruition, it would be just the fourth team to repeat as the regular-season champion, joining Tennessee (multiple times), Georgia (1996, 1997) and LSU (2005, 2006).

Rare Company

As just the second sophomore ever to earn SEC Player of the Year honors from the league's coaches last season, junior Tiffany Mitchell was tabbed by the SEC coaches and media to claim the award again this season. If that prediction comes true, Mitchell would become just the seventh player to pick up the award twice in her career, joining South Carolina assistant coach Nikki McCray (1994, 1995) among others.

South Carolina's other player of the year candidate last season, Aleighsa Welch also received votes for the award in both preseason polls. If she can dethrone her teammate this season, it would be the first time in league history that the same school had different student-athletes win the award in consecutive seasons.

Power of Three

Prior to the season, espnW ranked the top 25 college players in the nation, and a trio of Gamecocks made the list. Reigning SEC Player of the Year Tiffany Mitchell was tabbed No. 4 in the nation because "[her] greatest strength is that she doesn't really have a weakness. Shooting, penetrating, distributing, rebounding, defending and leading from her point guard spot are all part of Mitchell's resume," according to Charlie Creme. Two-time All-SEC selection Aleighsa Welch came in on the No. 7 spot for her ability to "come up with the big basket or the big rebound when the Gamecocks need it most," per Michelle Smith. 2014 SEC Freshman of the Year Alaina Coates captured the No. 25 position despite "just scratching the surface of her potential...she could be unstoppable inside, even without a large repertoire of moves," per Mechelle Voepel.

Ticket Boom

After updating the Colonial Life Arena attendance top-10 list five times last season, South Carolina ranked 10th in the nation in average attendance (6,371) last season. The athletics department responded to the demand by expanding the number of reserved-seat sections available to fans. The response was so overwhelming that the sections expanded again

in late October. In all, the Gamecocks have over 7,600 season-ticket holders, a significant increase from last season's 4,213.

Home Grown, Nationally Known

Since her arrival for the 2008-09 season, South Carolina head coach Dawn Staley has been working to protect her new home state's best prospects while fielding a team that competes at a national level. Her efforts have paid huge dividends as eight of the 15 members of this year's team hail from South Carolina. Beginning with Aleighsa Welch, the first South Carolina player to sign a National Letter of Intent for Staley, the Palmetto State has frequently sent its players of the

Cliney to Miss 2014-15 Season

South Carolina announced in September that the NCAA approved an initial eligibility waiver for freshman Doniyah Cliney, which allowed her to enroll in school but not compete for the Gamecocks in the 2014-15 season. The guard will focus on academics in the fall semester with an opportunity to begin practicing with the team beginning in the spring semester.

Cliney was ranked the 13th-best guard in the 2014 class and helped Malcolm X Shabazz to state titles in her final two seasons. The honorable mention all-state selection averaged 13.4 points, 3.3 assists and 5.2 rebounds as a senior. She shot 48 percent from the field, including 39 percent from 3-point range.

Class of 2015 Signees

Head coach Dawn Staley added one future Gamecock during the early signing period. Canada's Shay Colley signed her NLI with South Carolina on Nov. 18 and will have four years of eligibility upon enrollment.

Colley is a three-year standout for Team Canada in junior international play, representing her country in the 2014 FIBA U18 Americas Championship (silver), the 2013 FIBA U19 World Championship (7th) and the 2012 FIBA U17 World Championship (bronze).

DAWN STALEY

7th Season at South Carolina Virginia, 1992

When three-time Olympic gold medalist Dawn Staley took the reins of the University of South Carolina women's basketball program on May 10, 2008, the Gamecocks' stature immediately rose not just in the Southeastern Conference but on the national stage as well. Building on a foundation of hard work, defensive effort and a "team first" mentality, South Carolina began to realize those expectations in 2011-12. Three consecutive 25-win seasons were capped with the 2013-14 squad's 29-win effort that included the program's first SEC regular-season championship and No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament as well as the Gamecocks' second NCAA Sweet 16 appearance in three seasons.

In her 14 seasons as a head coach, Staley has amassed a 293-151 record, including her 121-71 slate in six seasons at South Carolina. She has led her teams to nine 20-win seasons, a total of 11 postseason appearances (two WNIT), highlighted by the Gamecocks' pair of Sweet 16 appearances and 14 weeks in the Associated Press top 10, including four in the top five. The future continues to brighten as the nation's top recruits make Columbia, S.C., a highly coveted destination. Consistently signing the top players in the state, Staley's 2014 group illustrated the seeds her staff had been sowing since its arrival as the No. 1 recruit in the class joined two other top-35 entries among the five-member class that was ranked No. 2 in the nation.

While her coaching career is blossoming, Staley is still recognized for her body of work as a one of the most decorated participants in United States women's basketball history. The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame solidified her legacy with her enshrinement into the Hall as part of the Class of 2013. The Phoenix Club of Philadelphia established the Dawn Staley Award recognizing the nation's top guard in women's Division I basketball in 2013 as well. Staley was inducted into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame as part of the Class of 2012 and was one of the final nominees for induction to the U.S. Olympic Hall of Fame the same year. In the summer of 2011, the WNBA recognized her as one of the league's "Top 15," honoring the most influential players in the league's history.

At the helm of the Gamecocks over the last six seasons, Staley has been named National Coach of the Year (2014, Basketball Times), Naismith National Coach of the Year Finalist (2014), SEC Coach of the Year (2014, Coaches and AP) and BCA Female Coach of the Year (2012). She has coached an All-American, 12 All-SEC selections, five SEC All-Freshman team selections, an SEC Player of the Year, an SEC Sixth Player of the Year, an SEC Defensive Player of the Year and two SEC Freshmen of the Year. South Carolina's 29 wins in 2013-14 were one shy of the overall school record, breaking the best mark since joining the SEC of 25 set in 2011-12 and tied in 2012-13. The Gamecocks have won more SEC games than the season before in each of Staley's last five seasons, and her 52 SEC victories are more than any other Gamecock coach and account for 44.8 percent of the program's total 116 league wins. She has helped the Gamecocks to three of the program's four top-four finishes in the SEC, including the first regular-season championship in 2013-14. Her 97 overall wins in the last four seasons marks the most successful four-year stretch in program history.
