SOUTH CAROLINA TEAM NOTES

- South Carolina snapped a five-game losing streak with the 8-0 (5) win over Eastern Kentucky.
- The Gamecocks' 3-2 win at No. 3/3 Arizona State marked the first win at a top-five team's park since March 13, 2004, a 6-4 win in nine innings at LSU.
- The four double plays in the Florida Atlantic win (2/16) is believed to be a school record, as it matches what was once listed but could not be verified.
- After posting only eight hits combined in the first two games, South Carolina tallied at least eight in each the next seven. Overall, the Gamecocks have five or more hits in 22 of 25 games.
- In the Ball State loss, South Carolina snapped a streak of 11 games with one or no errors, a stretch that included a 10-game winning streak.
- While no Gamecocks rank in the SEC top 15 in stolen bases, seven different student-athletes have three or more on the year, helping the team stand eighth overall in the league.
- The Gamecocks' win in game one against Western Carolina came when they were down after five innings, the first South Carolina triumph coming back that late in a game this season.
- This year's 14-2 start is bettered only by a 12-1 mark by the 2009 team in the last six years of Gamecock Softball. The 2007 Gamecocks went 24-3, the best start since the first year of SEC play.
- The college veterans have come through with runners on third and less than two outs, as Ansley Ard, Dana Hathorn, Chelsea Hawkins, Ashlyn Masters and Sarah Mooney have posted 19 RBI in 24 chances. The rest of the team is 13-for-37.
- Junior Sarah Mooney, a transfer from James Madison, has a team-best seven homers on the year, tying for the 11th spot in the single-season charts at South Carolina just 22 games into the year.
- All of South Carolina's losses have come when they've given up four or more earned runs. In fact, of the 85 team earned runs allowed, 53 have come in the eight losses.
- The Gamecocks seem to be allergic to offense in the second inning, hitting .202 with four runs in the frame. They hit over .250 with 16 or more runs in all other frames.

MONUMENTAL WEEKEND FOR GAMECOCKS AND COACH SMITH VS. TEXAS A&M

- South Carolina won its first series over a ranked SEC opponent since 2009 with Saturday's doubleheader sweep of No. 13/15 Texas A&M.
- It also stands as the first SEC series win in Carolina Softball Stadium for the Gamecocks in five tries in the new facility.
- The second win on March 15 marked Beverly Smith's 100th at South Carolina.
- The come-from-behind in the bottom of the seventh is the first since March 11, 2012 vs. Arkansas.
- Both games featured two-run, walk-off homers, Evan Childs with the one over the Hogs in 2012 and Ashlyn Masters with the shot against the Aggies.
- Entering the seventh tied, the Gamecocks won their first game in that scenario in 2014. Five times, South Carolina did that in 2013, with three in SEC play (at Mississippi State and at Auburn twice).
- Julie Sarratt earned SEC Pitcher of the Week honors for getting the win and the save during the doubleheader along with her win over Eastern Kentucky on March 11.

THE PITCHERS REIGN SUPREME

- Both redshirt junior Julie Sarratt and freshman Nickie Blue have won weekly awards from the Southeastern Conference, Sarratt most recently being named pitcher of the week on March 17.
- Blue earned her first SEC Freshman of the Week honor on Feb. 24 after picking up a win and two saves in relief as well as her first career shutout vs. Michigan State.
- When Blue pitches, she's produced over double the ground-ball outs (115) versus fly outs (53).
- Blue has three saves, tying for 10th in a single season at South Carolina and one away from joining six others in a tie for fourth.
- Sarratt picked up SEC Pitcher of the Week honors on March 17 after going 2-0 with a save the week prior, which included a complete-game, nine strikeout win over No. 13/15 Texas A&M.
- Sarratt's fanned 80 batters in 71.1 innings, a rate (7.85 K/7IP) over three K's better her career standard (4.56) entering the year.
- Sarratt struck out a career-high 10 in the win over Maryland, while she sat down nine in her complete-game victory over No. 13/15 Texas A&M, her best in an SEC game.
- She is at her best with two strikes against right-handed hitters, holding them to a .072 batting average (6-of-83) with 52 of her K's in those circumstances.
- Sarratt already owns four saves on the year, tying for fourth at South Carolina in a single season. Her next save would tie her with Aleca Johnson in third in a single year.
- Both are better in relief (Sarratt 0.78 ERA, Blue 1.01) than starting (Sarratt 2.36, Blue 4.05). In fact, boths strikeout-to-walk ratio is 3:1 or better out of the bullpen.
- The group posted a 29-inning scoreless streak from the final game at Florida Atlantic till the final game of the Gamecock Invitational. UNC Wilmington posted a first-inning unearned run.
- As a team, the Gamecock pitchers have allowed 0.04 triples and 0.39 homers per game, which ranks sixth and third in the league, respectively.
- The staff has given up only two runs in the fifth inning all year.

SCOUTING MINNESOTA

- The Golden Gophers are 21-3 on the season and hold the 16th spot in the latest NFCA poll.
- The first loss came against No. 1/2 Florida (15-2 [6]) in Las Vegas, while they beat LSU in Baton Rouge 1-0 in the year's opening weekend.
- Under fourth-year head coach Jessica Allister, Minnesota went to its first NCAA Tournament last season in a decade.
- This is the second foe the Golden Gophers will face twice with at least two weeks between games. UM beat Oklahoma State 1-0 at LSU before falling 5-4 in Stillwater in the second meeting.
- One All-American returns in junior Kaitlyn Richardson, who led the team in five offensive categories including all three "slash" stats (.430/.544/.705).
- Also returning is junior Tyler Walker, a year after posting 15 doubles, 12 homers and 53 runs while finishing behind Richardson in the slash categories (.379/.462/.681).
- Both are doing well in 2014, leading the team in everything except for sacrifice hits between them.
- The team had 39 stolen bases already, led by Walker and senior Bree Blanchette's 7-of-8 marks.
- Junior Erica Meyer is 6-for-7 when trying to steal and leads the squad with four sacrifice bunts.
- Meyer (23-of-27 SB), Walker (20-of-23) and Blanchette (18-of-19) led the team last year in steals.
- In the circle, senior Sara Moulton and sophomore Nikki Anderson return.
- Moulton tossed 275.2 innings, fanning 308 and walking 69 to tally a 1.57 ERA in 2013, and she's already gone 95 innings with a 1.25 ERA, striking out 141 and walking only 23.
- Freshman Sara Groenewegen has gone 36.2 innings, striking out 60 and walking 18 for a 3.05 ERA. She's allowed each of the Golden Gophers five home runs.
- Groenewegen has also hit a team-high six homers and driven in 16 runs this year.

MINNESOTA AND SOUTH CAROLINA AGAINST COMMON FOES

- Minnesota won at UNC Greensboro 8-0 (5), while the Gamecocks won a 13-0 (5) game at home against the Spartans.
- Both teams own 3-2 wins over then-No. 3/3 Arizona State.

SERIES HISTORY VS. THE GOLDEN GOPHERS

- The Gamecocks are 2-1 against Minnesota all-time, including a win in the 1988 Mideast Regional at Arizona.

THE LAST TIME - MINNESOTA VS. SOUTH CAROLINA - FEB 28, 2014

- In the Arizona State Louisville Slugger Invitational, No. 19/20 Minnesota claimed a 11-4 win over South Carolina.
- The Gamecocks were weakened, with 10 players being treated for stomach problems over the night before the game.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE

- Heading into Tuesday's game against Middle Tennessee State, the Lady Vols are 24-3 and ranked fourth and third in the major polls.
- Both teams own wins over Western Carolina, the Lady Vols getting a 15-0 (5) victory.
- Pitching leads Tennessee, and senior Ellen Renfroe anchors the staff with a 0.49 ERA, striking out 124 while walking 13 in 99.1 innings of work.
- Eight possible offensive starters have on-base percentages over .400.
- Senior Madison Shipman leads Tennessee's offense in six categories, including standing as the only Lady Vol with an on-base percentage over .500. Her seven homers also tops the team.
- Senior Melissa Davin has a team-best 24 RBI and is tied for second with sophomore Lexi Overstreet with six homers.
- Freshman Annie Aldrete, the niece of former MLB regular Mike Aldrete, has two triples and ranks second on the team with 23 RBI.
- Freshman Megan Geer tops the team with nine doubles and 10 stolen bases without being caught. She's also drawn 19 walks.

TIES BETWEEN SOUTH CAROLINA AND TENNESSEE

- Three freshmen, Tennessee's Taylor Koenig and Megan Geer along with South Carolina's Kaylea Snaer, all played for the SoCal Athletics group before college.

SERIES HISTORY VS. THE LADY VOLS

- Tennessee owns a 32-15 lead in the all-time meetings, including a 16-7 advantage in Knoxville.
- South Carolina last beat Tennessee on April 1, 2003, falling in the last 25 encounters.
- In Sherri Parker Lee Stadium, the Gamecocks are 0-5.

THE LAST MEETING - TENNESSEE VS. SOUTH CAROLINA - MAY 9, 2013

- No. 4/4 Tennessee (44-9) posted three runs in the first, more than enough for junior pitcher Ellen Renfroe to help the Lady Vols take a 5-0 win over South Carolina (32-23) in the quarterfinals of the 2013 SEC Tournament on Thursday night at John Cropp Stadium.

GAMECOCKS VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

- South Carolina is 97-231-1 (.296) all-time against ranked opponents.
- Broken down by site, the Gamecocks are 43-74 (.368) at home, 16-103 (.134) on the road and 38-54-1 (.414) in neutral-site outings.
- So far this season, the Gamecocks are 3-5 against ranked teams, with the next four games coming against top-20 foes according to this week's NFCA poll..
- Last season, the Gamecocks went 3-16 (.158) against ranked foes, including a 2-7 mark when playing in the opponent's home park and a 1-8 record at home.
- With the 3-2 win at No. 3/3 Arizona State on Feb. 27, South Carolina is now 2-21 against top-five opposition on the road.
- The Gamecocks won their first series over a ranked foe since 2009 by taking two of three games from then-No. 13/15 Texas A&M.

THE JOYS OF PLAYING AT HOME

- After playing only 17 games at its home facility last season, tying the second-lowest mark in the SEC era (since 1997), South Carolina has scheduled 34 games for Carolina Softball Stadium at Beckham Field before hosting the 2014 SEC Softball Tournament.
- Barring any rainouts, it would take two postseason games at home to tie the 2002 team's record with 36 home games.
- The Gamecocks have already surpassed their 2013 home win total, going 12-2 this year compared to 7-10 in Carolina Softball Stadium a year ago.
- Out of those 14 home games, South Carolina has posted a shutout in eight of them.
- In the 10 home dates, the Gamecocks have posted paid crowds over 1,000 in eight of them.

THE ROAD GETS TOUGHER

- The Gamecocks have scheduled 24 of their 55 regular-season games against teams who made the 2013 NCAA Tournament. Next up is Minnesota and Tennessee, both at-large teams last year.
- South Carolina downed No. 3/3 Arizona State before falling to No. 19/20 Minnesota in its first two encounters against 2013 NCAA Tournament teams.
- A total of 35 of the Gamecocks' scheduled games come against teams that finished in the top 100 of the NCAA's Ratings Percentage Index last year. Of those, 21 are against RPI top-50 teams.
- After facing nothing but NCAA Tournament participants in SEC play last year, South Carolina has two conference weekends against non-tourney teams this year (home vs. Mississippi & Auburn).
- Two of the Gamecocks' SEC contests will be on television, including the opening game to ESPN's national coverage (March 23 at Tennessee on ESPNU).
- The Gamecocks' April 19 game against LSU will also be on ESPNU, while all nine games of the SEC Softball Tournament will be on the ESPN family of networks.

HISTORY IN THE MAKING

- South Carolina has played 2,019 games in its softball history, going 1316-697-6 (.653) in its 41st season of sponsorship.
- With the season-opening 1-0 win over Iowa, the Gamecocks gained their 1,300th program victory.
- Gamecock head coach Beverly Smith next victory puts her in second in program history, surpassing Lou Piel's 100 wins in four seasons (1983-86).
- Smith moved into third on SC's coaching wins list with the 13-0 (5) victory vs. UNC Greensboro.
- She is the third Gamecock head coach to coach a fourth season at South Carolina, joining Piel and NFCA Hall-of-Fame coach Joyce Compton.

SNAER'S EARLY START

- Freshman Kaylea Snaer leads the Gamecocks in four offensive categories as we near the halfway point of the season.
- She already has five homers and 23 RBI, both over halfway to the top-15 in a season at South Carolina.
- She's also over a third of the way to single-season top-15 listings in doubles (5) and walks (10).
- Snaer's posted two or more hits eight times and multiple RBI in nine games, the latter tops on the team.
- Snaer has only failed to reach base five times this season (vs. Boston University, 2/21; vs. Western Carolina-2, 2/25; at No. 3/3 Arizona State 2/27; vs. Ball State 2/28; vs. No. 13/15 Texas A&M-2, 3/15).
- Twelve of Snaer's 23 RBI have come with two outs.

ROLLER COASTER RIDE IN TEMPE

- South Carolina picked up its second win in history in the home park of a top-five team when it downed No. 3/3 Arizona State 3-2 to open its stay in the ASU Louisville Slugger Invitational.
- Senior Chelsea Hawkins accounted for every Gamecock run, hitting a two-run homer for the initial lead and scoring the insurance run in the seventh after leading off the inning with a double.
- Hawkins went 3-for-3 in the win with a homer, double, two RBI and two runs scored. The seven total bases is the most for a Gamecock this year.
- Freshman Nickie Blue tossed 101 pitches, the most at that time in her budding college career, in the complete-game win. It's her second complete game as a Gamecock.
- Blue matched her career high by striking out five Sun Devils in the win.
- Over night, however, the team was swept by a virus that kept two players from the field on Friday and weakened many others. Ten student-athletes were treated for similar symptoms during the trip.
- It still took allowing 11 and 10 runs to fall to No. 19/20 Minnesota and Ball State, respectively.
- In the two losses, South Carolina allowed seven earned runs in each. The team had been charged with 19 in the previous 16 games combined.
- The Gamecocks, after falling down 7-0 to Minnesota, cut the lead to 7-4 after five innings.
- In the Ball State contest, South Carolina scored seven in the sixth before succumbing to the Cardinals, who scored three in the bottom half of the sixth and two more in the final frame.
- Three Gamecocks homered against the Cardinals: junior Sarah Mooney, sophomore Jordan Bizzell and redshirt freshman Lauren Masters.
- At Arizona State, senior Chelsea Hawkins, sophomore Jordan Bizzell and redshirt freshman Lauren Masters all hit their first homers of the year. It was the first career homer for Bizzell and Masters.
- One game was lost due to rain as well.

OPENING WEEKEND NOTES

- South Carolina spent the opening weekend at home at the newly-finished Carolina Softball Stadium at Beckham Field, a year after spending the first five weeks on the road waiting for construction to finish.
- The Gamecocks went 3-1 in the Carolina Classic, posting three shutouts on the weekend.
- South Carolina last recorded three shutouts in its first four games in 2003. The team had two shutouts in its first four games from 2004-07.
- Freshman Kaylea Snaer hit two homers in her first weekend in the Garnet and Black, while rookie Nickie Blue went 3-0, pitching in all four games.
- Sarah Mooney and Taylor Williams both had home runs in their first weekend as a Gamecock as well.
- Over 1,000 fans paid to see the weekend's action, the largest paid crowds for regular-season softball at South Carolina in history.

2014 SOUTH CAROLINA GAMECOCK SOFTBALL

ROSTER NOTES

- South Carolina returns six position starters from last year's team, including at second base (Dana Hathorn), in left (Alaynie Page) and in right field (Chelsea Hawkins). All 59 starts in center field and at designated player return as well as the majority of starts at first and third bases.
- In the loss of Samie Garcia, the Gamecocks lose their leader in batting average, runs, hits, doubles, triples, total bases, slugging percentage, sacrifice hits and stolen bases and the only person who started at shortstop.
- The greatest losses come in triples (7 of 10) and sacrifice hits (9 of 19).
- In the rest of the offensive categories, the Gamecocks bring back from 70.7 percent (doubles) to 80 percent (home runs) of their production from 2013, a season where the Gamecocks set six team offensive records.
- Back is the 2013 team leader in on-base percentage (Dana Hathorn, .463), home runs (Chelsea Hawkins, 8), walks (Alaynie Page, 26) and hit by pitches (Dana Hathorn, 25).
- In the circle, the team loses almost 60 percent of the innings and strikeouts from a year ago but returns team ERA, IP, K and win leader Julie Sarratt.
- Nine newcomers join the roster, including eight freshmen and the transferring Sarah Mooney, who earned Colonial Athletic Association Player of the Year honors at James Madison.
- The team is again dominated by South Carolina natives, with 36.4 percent of the roster (eight players) hailing from the Palmetto State. Georgia is second with three players.
- The Gamecocks hail from 10 states this year, adding players from North Carolina, Colorado, Illinois, California, Texas and Virginia.

MORE ON THE NEWEST GAMECOCKS

- With nine new student-athletes, South Carolina retooled after losing seven players, four to graduation and three to transfers.
- Three of the incoming eight freshmen have been honored by *MaxPreps.com* on their High School All-America teams, including two on its small school listings.
- Kaylea Snaer earned second-team accolades in the country, while, on the small school lists were Taylor Williams (first team) and Victoria Williams (second team).
- The Williams and Snaer join Alaynie Page as Gamecocks who earned those honors. Page made the Junior All-America list earlier at Boiling Springs High School.
- The eight freshmen all represent different states: California (Snaer), Colorado (Nickie Blue), Georgia (Effie Manahan), Illinois (Kate Shereyk), North Carolina (Macey Webb), South Carolina (V. Williams), Texas (T. Williams), and Virginia (Mackenzie Moler).
- Nickie Blue is the first Gamecock to be listed over 6-0 since Melanie Henkes (6-3) in 2006.
- The lone transfer this year, Sarah Mooney, earned 2013 Colonial Athletic Association Player of the Year accolades.
- Leading the Dukes in eight offensive categories, Mooney won the CAA triple crown and set new program records with 17 homers and 67 RBI in 59 games.
- Mooney moves closer to home in two aspects, hailing from the greater Charlotte area and also likely to serve as the Gamecocks' starting catcher.

FAMILY TIES

- The Masters sisters Ashlyn and Lauren are the first siblings to play on the same Gamecock team and the second set ever in the program's recorded history, after the Troesh sisters, Leanna (1997-99) and Debralee (2000-03).
- While both Williams, freshmen Taylor and Victoria are not sisters.
- Chelsea Hawkins is the niece of Tia Rogers (2002-04 letter-winner).

GAMECOCKS ADDED TO THEIR RICH HISTORY IN NCAA TOURNAMENT

- South Carolina made its 16th appearance in the 2013 NCAA Tournament and the first since 2007.
- The Gamecocks are 31-29 in those trips, making three Women's College World Series in their history (1983, 1989 and 1997).
- The program has five AIAW World Series trips in its history as well prior to 1982.
- Four times, South Carolina has won a regional.
- The Gamecocks made their seventh regional final (in multi-team regionals) in 14 appearances. The regionals in 1982-83 were best-of-three series against one opponent.

2013 STANDS ALONE IN OFFENSIVE RECORDS

- South Carolina set six cumulative team offensive records in 2013 and five in the per-game categories.
- Overall, the 338 runs, 45 homers, 295 RBI, 60 hit by pitches, .384 on-base percentage and .450 slugging percentage all topped previous marks.
- In per-game comparisons, the 5.73 runs, 5.00 RBI, 12.17 total bases, 2.78 walks and 1.02 hit by pitches broke records.
- Dana Hathorn got hit 25 times, more than tripling the previous season record.

THE SINGLE-SEASON CHARTS SAW MANY CHANGES

- Dana Hathorn more than tripled the single-season hit-by-pitch mark, getting plunked 25 times in 59 games. She also posted the fifth-best on-base percentage in a year (.463).
- Chelsea Hawkins made it a five-way tie for sixth place with eight homers and tied Danielle Quinones for sixth in homers per game (0.14). She also tied for 13th with three sacrifice flies.
- Kristen Struett tied for fifth with 43 RBI in a season and stood fifth with 0.78 RBI per game.
- Alaynie Page finished 10th in runs per game (0.78), 11th in homers (7), 13th in walks (26) and walks per game (0.44) and tied for third in hit by pitches (7).
- Ashlyn Masters had four sacrifice flies, tying for seventh with six others.
- Pitcher Julie Sarratt made the single-season relief appearances chart (13, T-13th), and tied for seventh with 12 hit batters.

HOW THE GAMECOCKS MADE THE 2013 SEC TOURNAMENT AND ABOUT THE WIN

- The Gamecocks won their first SEC Tournament game since 2003 with a 6-3 win over seventh-seeded and host Kentucky in the first round.
- It was South Carolina's first SEC Tourney win since May 9, 2003 over Mississippi State.
- It took a win over No. 2/3 Florida, the first win over the Gators since 2003, ending a 28-game losing streak in the series, to secure the berth, the first in Beverly Smith's head coaching career.
- South Carolina swept its first SEC series of the year at Mississippi State, marking the first road three-game SEC sweep for the Gamecocks since doing it at Kentucky over March 29-30, 2008.
- It was the first three-game sweep in Starkville in history for South Carolina.
- The Gamecocks won their first SEC series of 2013 at Auburn, the first winning weekend in any SEC road series since the 2011 Arkansas win (4/16-17).

CAROLINA SOFTBALL STADIUM AT BECKHAM FIELD

- The latest in a long line of facility upgrades for South Carolina came online, as Carolina Softball Stadium at Beckham Field hosted its first games in the spring of 2013.
- The Gamecocks opened their brand-new facility on March 15, 2013, against defending national champion Alabama.
- All three games during opening weekend had a maximum capacity of 830 fans.
- Throwing out the first pitch on Friday night was Mitzi Beckham, who along with her husband David, continue to be honored by having the field named after them.
- Head women's basketball coach Dawn Staley and head football coach Steve Spurrier also helped out on opening weekend, throwing out first pitches on Saturday and Sunday, respectively.
- South Carolina got its first win in Carolina Softball Stadium history with a 5-0 shutout of Appalachian State on April 3, 2013.
- Carolina Softball Stadium at Beckham Field has a seating capacity near 1,300.
- The stadium sits on the same site that the Gamecock Softball team has called home since 1983.
- Home plate has been in the same spot since the beginning of the 1997 season, when the former structure was built to usher in Southeastern Conference play.
- All time, South Carolina is 536-209-2 (.719) on the site. Since being renamed Beckham Field in 1998, the Gamecocks own a 256-155 (.623) mark on the field.

In Honor of "Mac" Rumph

One of the most ardent Gamecock Softball followers, Wilber McPerry "Mac" Rumph passed away on Friday, Jan. 31 at the age of 69. A retired teacher and administrator in Orangeburg and Spartanburg District 6 schools, Rumph taught history at two North Carolina higher education institutes. A second lieutenant in the U.S. Army, Rumph served his country in Vietnam. After watching the 2011 team face Alabama, Rumph started following the Gamecocks, with his passion causing him to drive and even fly to almost every road game. His seat will have a yellow ribbon on it throughout 2014 in honor of his support of Gamecock Softball.
