Dawn Staley, South Carolina Head Coach:

Opening Statement

Quentin Hillsman, Syracuse Head Coach:

Opening Statement

Obviously South Carolina played a tremendous basketball game. They get a lot of credit. They came out early and made some shots and made threes early and we knew that if they came out and started making threes, we were going to have a problem, so we had a problem. They came out and they made some shots. I thought early in the basketball game, we did some things, in the first three or four minutes, of what we were trying to do. We really wanted to pressure the ball, but just like that, the fouls are 7-1, so we've got to stop pressing. You really can't get up and be physical and be aggressive and pressure when you have seven fouls...it kind of took our aggressiveness away a little bit when you have players on the bench with fouls. Overall, you've got to give Dawn [Staley] a lot of credit. She had a great game plan. She came out and her players didn't make shots the first time against us (earlier this season in the Bahamas) that are capable shooters, came out the second game, tonight, and made shots. All the credit goes to them. As far as my team, love them to death because they compete with anybody to the highest level. They don't play scared. They don't play conservative. We could have sat back and just let them come down and take 35 seconds off the shot clock and it would have looked good on the ticker but we wanted to compete and keep fighting and keep playing hard the entire game. We're not going to lay down and submit to anybody. That's not how we do it at Syracuse. We're going to compete the whole game. I thought our kids gave it everything they had. These are my kids. These are my daughters. When they hurt, I hurt. Like I said last game, when they don't play well, I take it personal. When they play well, I give them a lot of credit. They give it everything they have. As you can see, I gave everything I have. I went to the locker room and everyone should feel how I feel, have nothing left, and we've got nothing left. As far as I'm concerned, our season was a great success because if we had a game tomorrow we couldn't play. Because we ain't got nothing left. So I'm very proud of them.

On South Carolina early shooting success

It was tough. We knew they had two shooters: [Tiffany] Mitchell and [Asia] Dozier. So we knew that they were going to make shots. We weren't confused about that. I thought that what it did, for us, is it made us start to come out a little bit and increase their points in the paint and that's where they really took control, was the points in the paint. Obviously we didn't make any shots...we had to go out and start guarding them. When you look at, between [Mitchell and Dozier], they made five of their eight threes. They can shoot the ball, and more importantly, they shoot 62 percent in the first half and we shoot 25 percent in the first half, you're going to lose that game.

On if he would have changed opening game plan

Not at all, because when we started the game, I think [the score was] 5-7. I think we were actually up, so no I wouldn't change it all. When you're playing a game and you're best players are on the bench with fouls, it's tough and that's it. We played about 25 minutes without our starting center in the game and that's their strength, is their interior game. Our center [Briana Day] didn't play. She played 20 minutes, she played five minutes in the first half. It's tough to win that way.

On South Carolina's home-court advantage

When we were in the Bahamas we didn't really have a crowd of our own...but I think being in their home, it gave them a lot of energy.

On South Carolina's early run
