Mark Berson, one of three coaches all-time to post 450 victories while coaching only in NCAA Division I, begins his 37th season at the helm of the South Carolina soccer program in 2014. Berson has been at South Carolina from the beginning, hired in 1978 to move the program to varsity status.

Before coming to Carolina in 1978, Berson went 11-5-0 in one season at The Citadel, making his overall record 462-205-68, a .675 winning percentage at the start of 2014. In 2006, Berson became one of five active (at that time) Division I coaches and the 10th all-time to reach the 400-victory milestone when his Gamecocks defeated UAB, 2-0, in a televised contest at Stone Stadium. Berson entered the year with a 451-200-68 record at South Carolina.

Berson has taken the Gamecocks to 20 NCAA Tournaments, with those teams advancing to at least the second round 11 times. His squads have four quarterfinal and two NCAA College Cup appearances to their credit as well. In 1993, the Gamecocks advanced to the NCAA Championship Game.

Though Carolina has been independent during the majority of the program's tenure, the Gamecocks have captured four conference titles under Berson's leadership. Carolina won the 1993 Metro Conference Championship in one of its two years competing in the conference. The Gamecocks joined Conference USA in 2005 and promptly claimed the league's tournament championship and automatic berth to the NCAA Tournament, while Carolina also won the C-USA Championship Tournament in 2010 and collected the regular season championship in 2011.

Besides making an impact in collegiate soccer, Berson's presence is also felt at higher ranks. The Gamecocks are one of only two collegiate programs to have had a player on each of the last four United States World Cup teams. Josh Wolff competed on the United States World Cup team for the second time during the summer of 2006 and was also an Olympic team member in 2000. Clint Mathis, a teammate of Wolff during his time at Carolina, also enjoyed a celebrated professional career that spanned 11 seasons in Major League Soccer. Mathis, who retired from professional soccer in 2010, was a member of the 2002 U.S. World Cup squad and helped his MLS team, Real Salt Lake, capture the MLS Cup in 2009. Mathis also graced the cover of Sports Illustrated in May 2002 prior to the World Cup, marking the third Gamecock athlete, in any sport, to be featured on the cover of the prestigious magazine. Former Gamecock goalkeeper Brad Guzan was honored during the summer of 2010 with a roster spot on the U.S. Men's National Team for the 2010 FIFA World Cup in South Africa. The netminder continued the Gamecocks' streak with a roster spot for the 2014 FIFA World Cup in Brazil.

Berson led Carolina to a 113-39-12 mark (.726) in the 1990s, which rated the Gamecocks as one of the winningest programs in NCAA Division I soccer. In 1998, Berson earned the inaugural Independent Coach of the Year award after leading Carolina to the best record of all Independent schools. Berson has also been honored as the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) Coach of the Year in the South Region on four occasions (1984, 1985, 1988, 1995).

Berson has been involved in soccer development as a coach, teacher and administrator on many levels. He is a U.S. Soccer National Instructional Staff Coach with an "A" coaching license and has served as a US Soccer National Instructional staff coach since 1989. He has served as State Coach for the South Carolina Youth Soccer Association (SCYSA), working in player development and coaching certification. In 1992, he was inducted into the South Carolina Youth Soccer Association Hall of Fame.

Berson also coached the U.S. National U-18 team in the Granatkin/Leningrad Tournament in January 1989, in the Soviet Union. In July 1987, he directed the South team to the gold medal in the U.S. Olympic Festival in Durham, N.C., one year after serving as an assistant coach for the South squad.

A 1971 graduate of Summit (N.J.) High School, Berson attended the University of North Carolina and received

his bachelor of arts degree in journalism in 1975. Berson played on the Tar Heel soccer squad for four years, one as a midfielder and the other three in goal. As a senior, Berson received the UNC Educational Foundation Award and was a member of the Academic ACC Honor Roll. Berson earned his master's of education degree in sport administration from Ohio University in 1977.

Born March 16, 1953, in Hartford, Conn., Berson is married to the former Shauna Hopkins, a South Carolina alum, of Columbia. They have two children, Erin Rhea and Luke William. Erin graduated from South Carolina in 2009, and Luke is currently enrolled at the University of South Carolina in the Moore School of Business.

#### SOUTH CAROLINA TEAM NOTES

- The 2014 Gamecocks have the fifth-highest paid attendance average in NCAA Division I at 2,751.
- South Carolina has been a second-half team, winning more corner kicks (46-29) and shot chances (109-82) in the second 45 in its 14 matches.
- The Gamecocks hold a 4-3 mark in overtime this year, the most OT wins in a season in history and
  the most extra-time matches played without a tie for the Gamecocks.
- The seven overtime matches ranks second for most in a season. Last year's squad played eight
  matches that lasted over 90 minutes.
- South Carolina has played 14 overtime matches in its last 27 outings dating back to last year.
- Three Gamecocks have played every minute this year: senior co-captain Braeden Troyer and sophomores Ive Burnett and Kurtis Turner.
- South Carolina has taken 104 of their 200 shots, 52 percent, in five home matches: Belmont, Mercer, UNC Greensboro, Marshall and Georgia State.
- Four times, SC has held foes to 2 or less shots on goal: Belmont, Marshall, Georgia State and UAB.
- The Gamecocks stand with an all-time record of 458-207-68 (.671).
- The 3-0 start was South Carolina's best in a decade, when the 2004 squad won its first four matches.
- The paid attendance of 5,415 for the season-opening match against Belmont ranks as the 4th-best in Stone Stadium history and 8th in the site's history of men's matches.
- Ranked 17th in the Sept. 9 NSCAA/Continental Tire poll, South Carolina received its first ranking since the last regular season poll of 2011 (23rd).

## MILESTONES COMING ON SATURDAY'S SENIOR NIGHT

- While South Carolina honors seven seniors on Saturday night, two other big milestones come with the contest.
- Gamecock head coach Mark Berson, in his 38th year as a NCAA Division I head coach, will coach his 750th collegiate match.
- And the field he's coached on in each of his 37 years at South Carolina will see its 400th Gamecock men's soccer contest.

## GAMECOCKS COME BACK AT FLORIDA ATLANTIC FOR BIG WIN

- The Gamecocks scored four unanswered goals in the final 30 minutes of regulation and five minutes of overtime to claim a 4-3 road win at Florida Atlantic on Oct. 17.
- South Carolina posted its biggest come-from-behind victory with that effort, the first time in 37 years a Gamecock team overcame a three-goal deficit.
- Doubling the Owls in shots in the second half, SC had two goals from redshirt freshman Mikkel Knudsen, including the neutralizer with 7:59 remaining.
- Two Gamecocks made their season debut in the win, juniors Devin L'Amoreaux and Wesley Eads. L'Amoreaux had an assist on the game-tying goal by Knudsen.

## BERSON RANKS SIXTH ON NCAA DIVISION I COACHING WINS LIST

- The only head coach in South Carolina men's soccer history, Mark Berson ranks as one of four coaches in NCAA Division I history with 450 wins at one institution.
- Berson owns 469 career victories, which includes his 11 in 1977 at The Citadel.
- He holds 6th on the NCAA Division I wins list and 16th on the all-divisions listing.
- The FAU win broke a tie with former Kean head coach Tony Ochrimenko to give Berson 16th alone on the all-divisions list.
- He's coached 13 players who have captured 15 All-America nods at South Carolina.
- He's also guided at least one player on each of the past four US Men's National Teams in the World Cup (Clint Mathis 2002, Josh Woolf 2002 and 2006, Brad Guzan 2010 and 2014).

### **WE SCHEDULED STRONG FOES**

- Of the 17 regular-season matches scheduled this season for the Gamecocks, 12 come against top-100 RPI teams in the final 2013 report from the NCAA.
- Seven rank in the top 50, four from C-USA (Charlotte, UAB, Old Dominion & New Mexico).
- Four foes made the NSCAA/Continental Tire Preseason Top 25, well, 26 when you count Old Dominion tying for the 25th spot with Navy.
- Six of the Gamecocks' foes appear in the current NSCAA top 25 or are receiving votes.
- Two teams currently ranked remain on the schedule: No. 19/22 Kentucky and 18/23 New Mexico.
- The Gamecocks are 1-2-0 against ranked teams in 2014, beating No. 25/18 Clemson.
- SC is 1-4 against top-35 teams in the latest RPI report.
- South Carolina's remaining foes have RPIs in the top 50 (Kentucky 28, Old Dominion 46, New Mexico (30).
- The remaining three foes combine to have a 24-10-5, giving SC the eighth-toughest remaining schedule in NCAA Division I.

## SOUTH CAROLINA CELEBRATING 10 YEARS IN CONFERENCE USA

- The 2014 season is South Carolina's 10th as a men's soccer affiliate member of Conference USA.
- In 2011, the Garnet and Black captured the league's regular-season crown, sharing it with UAB.
- Twice, the Gamecocks have won the league's tournament (2005 and 2010).
- South Carolina's student-athletes have taken 40 all-league nods, with 14 coming on the first team.
- In C-USA outings, South Carolina owns a 37-26-16 (.570) mark.
- At Stone Stadium, that record is 19-14-6 (.564), with SC never failing to win a league home match in a year.

#### AWARDS CAME IN BUNCHES IN SECOND WEEK

- Sophomore goalkeeper Marco Velez won two honors over Sept. 8-9, the Conference USA Defensive Player of the Week and the Disney Soccer/NSCAA Player of the Week.
- It's Velez's second C-USA weekly honor, matching his award on Oct. 28, 2013, as a freshman.
- He's the first national player of the week for SC since Bradlee Baladez took the College Soccer News award on Oct. 4, 2010.
- The last Gamecock before Velez to earn NSCAA's weekly nod was Ayo Akinsete on Oct. 25, 2006.
- Mahamoudou Kaba took a spot on CSN's Team of the Week on Sept. 8 after garnering the C-USA Preseason Defensive Player of the Year award.

### RECENT DOMINANCE OF ARCHRIVAL CLEMSON

- Since 2007, the Gamecocks are 6-2 against their archrival Clemson, with both of the losses coming in double overtime on the road (2011 & 2013).
- The last four matches at Stone Stadium have gone to the Gamecocks, three coming in shutouts.
- It's the best stretch since the Gamecocks went 10-4 from 1985-95 against the Tigers, with three of
  the wins in that stretch coming in NCAA Tournament play.

### TROYER NAMED A SENIOR CLASS AWARD CANDIDATE

- Gamecock Braeden Troyer was one of 30 candidates for its men's soccer Senior CLASS Award but
  was not one of 10 finalists.
- Troyer leads all SC returners with 10 career goals, tied for seventh in Gamecock history during the Conference USA era (since 2005).
- Twice he's been named to the C-USA All-Academic Team, and he has three All-C-USA nods, ('12 second team, '11 & '13 third team).
- He also made the 2011 Conference USA All-Freshman Team and has been honored once on the College Soccer News Team of the Week (Sept. 29, 2013).
- On two occasions, CoSIDA has voted him on the Capital One Academic All-District 4 team.
- In the classroom, he's been a member of the Honors College at South Carolina and earned three C-USA Academic Medals, given to student-athletes with a 3.75 GPA.
- He's a co-captain in 2014 (along with Mahamoudou "Mo" Kaba).

#### ROSTER NOTES

- South Carolina brought back 18 letter-winners to go with nine newcomers for 2014.
- The Gamecocks return 80 percent of their goals and 76 percent of their assists from last year.
- Included in that returning group is the top-two goal scorers (Jeffrey Torda and Mahamoudou Kaba) and the top-two assist distributors (Kurtis Turner and Ryan Arambula).
- Only one goalkeeper of three who played in 2013 is not back from last year (Chris Duzan, 30:19).
- Four Conference USA award winners return, including defenders Kaba and Braeden Troyer as well as 2013 All-Freshman Team members Turner (midfielder) and Marco Velez (goalkeeper).
- Both Kaba and Troyer made the C-USA Preseason team, with Kaba garnering the Defensive Player
  of the Year title.

#### THE GAMECOCKS SHINE IN THE CLASSROOM AS WELL

- South Carolina's 18 returners have a total of 30 SEC Academic Honor Roll certificates and 31 Conference USA Academic Honor Roll notations between them.
- Of those, 10 are Conference USA Academic Medal mentions, which is awarded to student-athletes with a 3.75 cumulative GPA or higher.
- Troyer has three of those Academic Medals, while both Ryan Arambula and Jeffrey Torda have two.
- Four of the seniors, Robert Beebe, Mahamoudou "Mo" Kaba, Asa Kryst and Braeden Troyer have three certificates each.

#### GAMECOCKS VS. RANKED FOES

- South Carolina is 32-55-9 (.380) against foes ranked in the NSCAA top 25 (since 1996).
- Broken down by site, the Gamecocks are 17-26-4 (.404) at home, 11-18-5 (.397) on the road and 4-11 (.267) in neutral-site outings.
- In 2013, the Gamecocks went 2-2 against teams ranked in the NSCAA poll.
- South Carolina had taken its last three against ranked teams before the Oct. 4 loss to No. 10 Charlotte (No. 25 New Mexico on 10/26/13, No. 10 UAB on 11/3/13, No. 25 Clemson on 9/2/14).

#### SCOUTING KENTUCKY

- Making their debut in the NSCAA poll this week at No. 19, the Wildcats are 8-3-3 on the season.
- Kentucky is the only C-USA team who has not taken a loss in league play, going 3-0-2 on the year.
- Things start with UK's defense, with Callum Irving posting a 0.41 goals against average during his
  junior year, the second-best GAA in NCAA Division I.
- He's totaled nine shutouts in 14 matches, making 43 saves in 1,302 minutes of play.
- Most offensive categories are even between UK and its foes.
- Of note, Kentucky has not given up a penalty kick while only taking one all season.
- · Forty-six percent of the Wildcats' shots have come on goal.
- Justin Laird, the current NSCAA/Disney Soccer National Player of the Week, leads Kentucky with five goals and has added three assists.
- Napo Matsoso and Charlie Reymann have four assists each, tops on the team.
- Only four of the Wildcats' 17 goals have been unassisted.

#### SERIES HISTORY VS. THE WILDCATS

- The Gamecocks hold a 5-4-3 advantage in the all-time series, including a 3-1-1 record at home.
- In C-USA regular-season play, Kentucky has a 4-3-2 mark against South Carolina.

## SOUTH CAROLINA VS. KENTUCKY - UK SOCCER COMPLEX

LEXINGTON, Ky. - South Carolina and Kentucky played to a 0-0 draw at the UK Soccer Complex.

A second-minute header from SC forward J.P. Rafferty bounced off the crossbar to start the day. The Wildcats fired the next seven shots, the most dangerous ones coming in the 11th minute from Kaelen Fox and in the 31st minute from Isak Krogstad, both ending in Velez saves.

South Carolina came out of the break firing, as Jeffrey Torda and Koty Millard registered shots in the first six minutes after halftime. Torda tallied the first shot on goal of the match for the Gamecocks.

In overtime, Hunter Wyer pushed a shot towards the net two and a half minutes in, but Irving saved it.

Starting at the 94:51 mark, the Wildcats registered six shots in the remaining time of the first OT period. Forward Brad Doliner and Fox had two apiece, but the Gamecocks held UK off with the help of two saves by Velez.

In the second overtime, SC's defenders blocked all four UK attempts in the first six minutes. Kentucky's last two attempts sailed high.

Kentucky outshot the Gamecocks 28-11, putting six of its 28 shots on goal. South Carolina put three shots on frame. Torda returned to action after an injury, recording three shots to lead the Gamecocks. Kentucky's Fox fired six shots, two on frame.

Between the posts, Marco Velez hauled in six saves in his second shutout of the season. For the Wildcats, Callum Irving collected three saves.
