NOTEWORTHY

SOUTH CAROLINA TEAM NOTES

- The 13-0 start for the Gamecocks is the best in the program's NCAA-era history. The 1983 team began the season 12-0.
- South Carolina ranks as one of seven teams in NCAA Division I still undefeated entering Thursday's action.
- Four teams went undefeated in the opening weekend of SEC play: Florida, Missouri, Texas A&M and South Carolina.
- The Gamecocks have the second-largest difference between their hitting percentage and their foes in the SEC. The .134 difference (.311-.177) is only bettered by Missouri (.306-.164).
- Only two non-conference opponents hit over .200 against South Carolina: East Tennessee State (.207) and UAB (.285). Both Georgia (.214) and LSU (.256) topped the mark.
- South Carolina has only been out-blocked three times thus far in 2012 (3-0), while the 2011 team was topped on 13 occasions (1-12 in those matches).
- South Carolina has posted a better hitting percentage, more kills and more digs than all but one foe in 2012.
- Out of the six hitters who have played in half the sets and averaged at least one kill per set, five hit over .240 and three are at .325 or better.
- For the second-consecutive year, South Carolina is the last undefeated team in the Southeastern Conference.

MORE ON THE WINNING STREAK

- The 13-match winning streak is the second-longest documented skein in program history.
- The longest winning streak came in 1983, as the team posted a 14-match streak from Oct. 15-Nov. 18.
- The loss that ended the longest skein came in the 1983 Metro Conference Tournament final. Florida State won the five-set match to earn the automatic berth to the third NCAA Tournament. The field only had 28 teams at the time.

ATTACKING THE RECORD BOOK

- Taylor Bruns is seventh in assists (2,289) and eighth in assists per set (7.20).
- Juliette Thévenin stands 15th in SC history with 855 kills and 2,239 attacks.
- With 37 more kills, Thévenin will tie Belita Salters for 14th. Eleven more attacks move Thévenin past Colleen McKenzie for 14th on that list.
- Thévenin's now second in kills per set (3.77) and 10th in digs per set (2.80) on the career charts.
- Paige Wheeler is third on SC's career charts in digs per set (3.54).
- These updated charts can be found on page 26 of the notes.

RECORD-CHARTING SINGLE-MATCH PERFORMANCES

- Sophomore Bethanie Thomas's three solo blocks vs. ETSU (8/25) tied for second on the five-set match listing.

GAMECOCKS IN THE SEC STAT SUPERLATIVES

- South Carolina hit the second-highest hitting percentage in four-set match (.370 vs. Niagara) and top in a five-setter (.297 vs. ETSU) for an SEC team this fall.

PRESEASON TOURNAMENT ACCOLADES

- Cara Howley earned Gamecock Invitational MVP honors.
- Joining Howley on the all-tournament team were Christina Vereb and Paige Wheeler.
- Juliette Thévenin took Patriot Invitational Most Outstanding Player and Best Hitter honors.
- Taylor Bruns was named Best Setter, and Wheeler claimed Best Defender accolades.
- Bruns claimed the MVP award for the Carolina Clash, and joining her on the all-tournament team was Howley and Thévenin.

HISTORICAL RECORDS

- South Carolina is 719-536 (.573) all-time in volleyball.
- In the Volleyball Competition Facility, the team stands at 146-70 (.676).

NOTEWORTHY

COMPETITION LEVEL RISING

- The three opponents in the 2012 Carolina Clash held better final 2011 RPIs than all but one of SC's first eight foes.
- Clemson finished at 54, UAB 84 and Winthrop 149 in the last RPI of 2011 (Niagara was 146).
- Georgia finished 2011 with an RPI of 123; LSU at 66.
- Auburn closed last year at 120. Tennessee stood at 14 (South Carolina ended 2011 at 113).

SOUTH CAROLINA OVERVIEW

- South Carolina returns four starters and its starting libero from the 2011 team.
- That 2011 team, the first coached by Scott Swanson, doubled the win total from the previous year.
- The leading attacker by kills, junior outside hitter Juliette Thévenin, is back.
- The top defender by digs, junior libero Paige Wheeler, returns.
- Setters Taylor Bruns and Lexie Pawlik make up the vast majority of the 97 percent of assists back.
- The Gamecocks lost almost 50 percent of the team blocks from last season.
- The next highest total of "lost" stats are kills, where 32.2 percent departed.
- Last season, the Gamecocks led the SEC in digs per set. Only 12.2 percent of those departed.

ROSTER NOTES

- Eight freshman, including seven true rookies, are a part of the 17-person roster.
- Three players hail from each South Carolina and Texas, the most on the team.
- A pair of student-athletes both hail from California and Maryland.
- Six other states and another country are represented by the seven remaining athletes.
- For the 17th-consecutive season, the Gamecocks have had at least one international player.
- A total of 16 players have appeared on the court so far. Only freshman Kira Speer has not seen any action and is on track for a redshirt year.

HOME MATCHES NOTES

- South Carolina is playing 17 matches plus one exhibition in the Volleyball Competition Facility this fall, the most since moving into the building in 1996.
- It's one more than the inaugural season of the VCF, when SC hosted the 1996 SEC Tournament.
- The most home matches ever for South Carolina came in 1990, when the team hosted 21 contests.
- The match against Clemson on Sept. 7 had 1,512 fans in attendance, the third-largest crowd in the history of the Volleyball Competition Facility.
- It was the largest crowd since 2001 in the building, when 1,793 people packed the stands for the Sept. 21 match against Florida.
- The 1,512 fans were nearly 250 over the capacity of the gym in the setup the team utilized starting during SEC play last fall.

(RECENT) HOME TOURNAMENT HISTORY

- South Carolina has hosted a home tournament every year since 2000 except for 2001 and 2005.
- The Gamecocks have won six of the last seven home non-conference events, including perfect marks in both tourneys this fall.
- This is the first year since 2003 that the Gamecocks have hosted two pre-conference tournaments.

NOTEWORTHY

LOOKING TO CHANGE FORTUNE VS. RANKED TEAMS

Since 1991, the Gamecocks hold a 8-92 record against ranked opponents. Half of those wins over ranked teams have come against SEC foes, two over a Florida team (1994 and 2006). Also, never has a win over a ranked team come on the road in SEC play. Only once have the Gamecocks won a match against a ranked team at its gym (Notre Dame, 9/14/2003).

A LOOK AT THE WEEKEND'S OPPONENTS

SCOUTING AUBURN

Auburn enters Friday's contest with a 10-2 record after going 1-1 during the SEC opening weekend, sweeping Mississippi State before falling in four at Texas A&M. The Tigers defense has been strong, holding foes to a .153 hitting percentage, third in the league. That's helped by the 2.46 blocks per set the team averages, fifth in the SEC, and 17.05 digs per set, third in the SEC. Auburn is seventh in kills, ninth in assists and 11th in service aces in the SEC stat rankings.

In the 6-2 alignment, Auburn has a balanced offensive attack, led by Sarah Bullock's 3.21 kills per set. Bullock also stands second on the team with 3.11 digs per set, but she may be out after leaving the Texas A&M contest. Katherine Culwell stands second on the team with 2.93 kills per set, while she's blocking 0.83 attacks a frame. Camila Jersonsky hits at .387 and holds a 1.24 blocks average, both best on the team, while she's third in kills at a 2.46 per-set average. Chelsea Wintzinger and Ciara Richards do the setting, with both averaging over five assists a set, and libero Sarah Wroblicky ranks third in the SEC with 4.95 digs per set. Richards is the toughest server, posting 0.37 aces a set, third in the SEC.

SERIES HISTORY VS. THE TIGERS

South Carolina owns a 21-11 advantage in the all-time series against the Tigers, including a 10-5 mark in Auburn. The Gamecocks had a 10-match winning streak on the plains snapped in 2009, and the Tigers have won the last two years in the Student Activities Center as well. The two teams split last year's outings.

THE LAST TIME VS. AUBURN - NOV. 18, 2011

In a hard-fought match on Senior Night, South Carolina came through with a four-set win over Auburn, taking the sets 25-17, 25-19, 20-25, 30-28 in front of 706 fans at the VCF.

Middle blocker Teresa Stenlund posted 10 kills for the Gamecocks. Setter Taylor Bruns and outside hitter Juliette Thévenin both had double-doubles, as Bruns posted 42 assists and 10 digs to compliment Thévenin's 19 kills and 15 digs. Thévenin also led South Carolina in hitting with her .306 mark. Libero Paige Wheeler compiled a match-best 18 digs, and outside hitter Bethanie Thomas added 11. Outside hitter Cara Howley had 11 points on eight kills and a team-best four block assists.

Auburn's Brittany Rhude and Chloe Rowand both posted career bests in kills, with 17 and 12, respectively. Kathia Rud also had 16 kills. MacKenzy Harper and Sarah Bullock both made 16 digs, while Chelsea Wintzinger posted 30 assists and 11 digs.

SCOUTING NO. 21 TENNESSEE

The preseason choice of the league's coaches to take the SEC title, the Lady Vols begin the weekend with an 8-3 record and a 1-1 SEC mark. Tennessee is the second-best blocking team in the league so far, averaging 2.65 blocks a set. The Lady Vols stand fourth in hitting percentage and kills.

Leading the Lady Vols is Kelsey Robinson, who tops the SEC with 4.95 kills per set. An all-around threat, she also leads Tennessee with 3.71 digs a set and 0.34 aces a frame. Leslie Cikra hits .330, blocks one attack a frame, best on the team, and stands second with 2.98 kills per set. Tiffany Baker stands third with 2.95 kills per set. Mary Pollmiller guides the Lady Vol attack, averaging 11 assists, while she also contributes 2.23 digs per set. Ellen Mullins posts 3.68 digs per set as the libero.

SERIES HISTORY VS. THE LADY VOLS

The earliest documented foe of South Carolina, Tennessee holds a 31-25 advantage in the series, including seven-straight Lady Vol wins. When playing in Knoxville, the Gamecocks are 9-18, last winning on Nov. 8, 2002.

THE LAST TIME VS. TENNESSEE - NOV. 13, 2011

No. 20 Tennessee swept South Carolina, 25-13, 25-20, 25-14 at Thompson-Boling Arena.

Tiffany Baker topped Tennessee, hitting .519 with 15 kills and 12 digs. Kelsey Robinson added 13 kills and 10 digs, while Ellen Mullins posted 11 digs. Dee Dee Harrison had seven kills and four blocks, two of those solo, and Leslie Cikra contributed eight kills on a .636 hitting percentage.

South Carolina middle blocker Megan Kent posted a .545 hitting percentage and seven kills, and outside hitter Juliette Thévenin made nine kills and 11 digs. Libero Paige Wheeler compiled a team-high 12 digs.

SCOTT SWANSON

Head Coach • Second Year at South Carolina

- Coached seven teams that played in the NCAA Tournament (Arizona State 1999, 2000, Minnesota 2006-10)

The 11th head coach in Gamecock Volleyball history, Scott Swanson looks to build upon a season where he helped South Carolina double its win total in his first year.

The Gamecocks went 14-16 in Swanson's first year and improved its offensive efficiency and its backline defense under his guidance. The team led the SEC with a 16.78 digs average, the best mark in four years for the Gamecocks, and hit .226, a 45-point improvement from the 2011 season. Three times, South Carolina student-athletes garnered an SEC weekly award, with Juliette Thévenin picking up the first offensive listing and Paige Wheeler twice gaining the defensive certificate.

Swanson's teams also proved themselves in the classroom, earning the program's second Team Academic Award from the American Volleyball Coaches Association in 2011-12. Thirteen Gamecocks were listed on the SEC Academic Honor Rolls for the year as well, and the team claimed the department's Life Skills Team of the Year award, honoring the group for its academic achievements, personal development and work in the community.

Prior to his current head coaching job, Swanson spent five years on the sidelines for the Golden Gophers, helping the team to five-consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances and a 125-46 record. Three times, Minnesota finished second in the Big Ten behind perennial power Penn State. The 2009 team advanced to the national semifinals in the NCAA Tournament.

During his tenure in Minneapolis, Swanson helped the Golden Gophers become an elite blocking team. In five years, Minnesota never ranked lower than 35th in NCAA Division I in blocks. The 2007 team set a program record with 3.54 blocks per set. Five Golden Gophers earned All-America accolades during those five years, including 2009 first-team middle blocker and 2012 US National Team pool member Lauren Gibbemeyer.

Swanson also led the Gophers' recruiting efforts, posting three top-10 recruiting classes according to *PrepVolleyball.com*. The 2009 group earned top honors from the outlet.

The summer of 2009, Swanson spent time with USA Volleyball's A-2 Junior National Team, and he coached the USA Red team to a second-place showing in the 2008 USA Adult Open Championships.

Swanson brings in four years of head coaching experience to Columbia after his tenure at the University of Texas-El Paso. With a 50-61 career record, Swanson had the team on the brink of the NCAA Tournament in 2005, when the Miners went 21-10. Three players earned all-conference honors under Swanson's tutelage, including honorable mention All-American Kari Stacy. He also inked a high school All-American and saw his team improve in the classroom to a department-best 3.2 GPA in 2005.

Prior to UTEP, Swanson spent six years at his alma mater, Arizona State. He helped the team to two NCAA Tournament appearances during his time in Tempe and coached one second-team All-American and two Pac-10 All-Freshman Team players. Two of his Sun Devil players garnered Academic All-America certificates as well.

Swanson started his coaching career at Mountain View (Ariz.) High School, working as an assistant with the varsity team and leading his junior varsity group to a 17-1 record. As a head coach with the Arizona East Valley Juniors club, he led a 16-1s team to a national runner-up finish and earned Cactus Region Coach of the Year honors. He also served as head coach at Camelback High School before landing the job with Arizona State, where he also played club volleyball.

A graduate of ASU, Swanson is married to the former Erin Meier. The couple has one daughter, Rylee Sue.
