## South Carolina 17 North Carolina 13

**CHARLOTTE, N.C.**—The 2015 South Carolina football season kicked off Thursday evening in Charlotte as South Carolina (1-0) defeated North Carolina (0-1) 17-13 in the Belk College Kickoff game at Bank of America Stadium.

A healthy dose of the running game would power the Gamecocks all night as the Gamecocks rushed for 254 yards with Shon Carson coming up with the big run of the night with a 48-yard carry for a touchdown in the fourth quarter. The Gamecocks would also make key plays on the defensive end with three turnovers including a pair of interceptions in the end zone by junior linebacker Skai Moore.

North Carolina scored first, covering 91 yards in just five plays and a little over a minute culminating with a 21-yard pass over the middle from Marquise Williams to Bug Howard.

To respond, the Gamecocks turned to the ground game early, with Pharoah Cooper running the Wildcat and Brandon Wilds grinding out first downs. Connor Mitch would connect on his first completion of the game on a 16-yard screen out to Jerell Adams, then went for 20 more to Brandon Wilds to get them to the opponent's 25. Wilds and Cooper would carry it down to the nine before the end of the first quarter, and facing third-and-five, Mitch connected with Cooper on a slant over the middle to tie the game up at 7-7.

A field goal drive for North Carolina would put it back up 10-7, but Mitch would also show off his ground game on the ensuing drive, with runs of 15 and nine yards and a pair of first downs. The Gamecocks would not be able to cash in with a touchdown, but Elliott Fry knocked home a 25-yard field goal to tie the game back up at 10 with seven minutes to go before halftime.

Another North Carolina drive would be halted by the Gamecocks' defense on the very next drive. After taking the ball all the way down to the South Carolina 15, the Tar Heels faced a third-and-five. Kelsey Griffin and Darius English would find daylight up the middle, with Griffin making the initial contact. The sack would force another field goal, but it allowed North Carolina to take a 13-10 lead to halftime.

The Gamecock defense stiffened in the second half, keeping the team in the game while the offense found its footing. Finally early in the fourth quarter, the Gamecocks got their run game untracked. Two runs from David Williams would give them a first down across midfield, and Shon Carson would be the exclamation point. He took a shotgun sweep handoff and went 48 yards virtually untouched to give Carolina its first lead of the game.

With the Gamecock faithful getting rowdy in the stands, the defense remained locked in and forced a quick three-and-out. Perry Orth would take over the offense with 11:46 to play in the game, after Connor Mitch went to the locker room with an undisclosed injury.

Carson would take much of the pressure off him early in the drive, carrying for 27 yards on the first three plays of the drive. Orth would join in the fun to pick up a key first down with his legs and get the Gamecocks in the red zone, but the offense would miss out on fourth and inches at the UNC 12 to give the Tar Heels possession with nine minutes left to play.

The UNC defense was finally able to solve Carolina's defense and quickly moved into the red zone with a chance to take back the lead. The shortened field would come to the aid of the Gamecocks, who were able to blanket the Tar Heel receivers and force a third and goal at the three. Dante Sawyer would pull down Williams for his first career sack and force a timeout with fourth down at the eight-yard line and just 3:40 on the clock.

In a mirror image of his play in the first quarter, Skai Moore would step in front of a pass right in the end zone to end the threat. With momentum from the turnover, South Carolina would run out the clock to seal the victory.

## Kentucky 26 South Carolina 22

**COLUMBIA, S.C.**— The Kentucky Wildcats (2-0, 1-0 SEC) would do just enough to hold off a furious second-half comeback attempt in a 26-22 win over Carolina (1-1, 0-1 SEC).

The nine-day break since the team's game against North Carolina would not slow down linebacker Skai Moore, who helped set up the game's first scoring drive of the day with his third interception of the season. Just one play later, Connor Mitch ran it in for his first career rushing touchdown.

The visitors would rally back for the game's next two scores and closed the first quarter with a 14-7 lead.

Brandon Wilds would be tasked with helping to boost the offense, and his effective running between the tackles would be its first spark of the night. With 7:21 to go in the first half, Wilds ran on four of the first five plays of the drive for 25 yards total. Connor Mitch would then hook up with Pharoah Cooper on a post route to put the offense in the redzone for the first time since its one-play scoring drive in the first quarter.

Just a few plays later, though, a botched option pitch would not only cost the Gamecocks seven yards on third down, but it would cost them their starting quarterback as well. Mitch would dive for the fumbled pitch, but injured his shoulder in the process.

A missed field goal ended Carolina's drive, and the Wildcats offense made quick work in the final three minutes of the half with a 76-yard touchdown drive. Towles set it up with a pair of long completions and capped it himself with a one-yard dive with seconds remaining in the half for a 24-7 lead.

The Gamecock defense came out on a mission to start the second half and quickly forced Kentucky's first punt of the game. A low, spiraling punt would be returned for 24 yards by Pharoah Cooper to set up the offense.

Perry Orth would take the reins of the offense after Mitch was diagnosed with a shoulder injury, and he and Cooper would connect to get the team back into the redzone. Carolina would later settle for a 27-yard field goal to get back on the scoreboard.

Kentucky would go three-and-out again to set up the Gamecocks just shy of midfield. A 34-yard run for Brandon Wilds on the first play of the drive would keep sliding the momentum little by little. The drive would stall inside the 15 again, though, leading to another Fry field goal and a 24-13 game.

The Wildcats continued to be stymied on offense, going three-and-out on its third straight drive of the half with four minutes to go in the third and the Gamecocks took over with the comeback attempt thriving. Strong runs from Shon Carson would put them down to the two yard line, but a penalty would set them back.

As the third quarter came to a close, the Gamecocks held a 136-22 advantage in yards gained in the 15-minute span, but were still in search of that elusive touchdown. The penalty would ultimately come back to cost them and a third straight drive would be sealed by a field goal.

After a fourth-straight punt from Kentucky, the Gamecocks would use some clutch throws from Orth to finally hit pay-dirt. Facing a third-and-12 on their own 33, Orth hit Cooper for 16. Later in the drive, he connected with Deebo Samuel for 10 on fourth-and-two, and on the very next play Jerrell Adams took a post route 33 yards for the score and a 24-22 game. It was Orth's first career touchdown pass.

On the team's two-point attempt to try and tie the game, Cooper would fumble and Kentucky took it 98 yards for two points of their own and a 26-22 advantage. It would be a game-defining play, as it meant the Gamecocks needed a touchdown to complete the comeback.

The Wildcats would convert their first first down of the half with eight minutes to go, trying to respond to Carolina's comeback. It would go no further than that, but put 89 yards in front of the Gamecocks with just seven minutes left to go. What started as a healthy drive would be stopped after Orth was intercepted at the Kentucky 23 after being flushed from the pocket. The Wildcats were able to seal the win after a pair of first downs burned Carolina's remaining timeouts.

**ATHENS, GA.**— Greyson Lambert was 24-for-25 in the air for 330 yards and three touchdowns and Nick Chubb carried 21 times for 159 yards and two touchdowns as No. 7/8 Georgia (3-0, 2-0 SEC) defeated South Carolina (1-2, 0-2 SEC) 52-20 on Saturday at Sanford Stadium.

South Carolina junior quarterback Perry Orth went 6-for-17 in the air for 66 yards and also carried for a 4-yard touchdown in his first career start for the Garnet & Black. In his first significant action of the season, freshman quarterback Lorenzo Nuñez came on to carry 10 times for 76 yards and scored his first career touchdown with a 7-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter. He finished 4-for-5 in the air for 18 yards.

Both teams would trade field goals in the first quarter. The Bulldogs would go 71 yards on their first drive of the game and break ahead 3-0 on a 30-yard field goal by Marshall Morgan. South Carolina answered on the next drive. Orth would move the ball with a couple big plays as he connected on a 10-yard reception to Perry Orth and a 15-yard pass to D.J. Neal to break into Georgia territory. The Gamecocks would tie it at 3-3 after a 45-yard field goal by Elliott Fry.

Georgia scored on consecutive possessions in the second quarter to build a 17-3 lead. The Bulldogs regained the lead with an 82-yard drive in the second quarter capped by Nick Chubb's 2-yard touchdown run. Chubb would carry six times for 35 yards on the drive with Lambert connecting on a pair of big passes with a 17-yard completion to Terry Godwin and a 20-yard pass to Jay Rome. After forcing the Gamecocks to punt the Bulldogs would use seven plays to go 88 yards with Sony Michel scoring on a 21-yard touchdown run.

The Gamecocks fought back on the next possession with a steady dose of the ground game on the way to a 4-yard touchdown run for Orth, his first career TD run as Carolina cut the deficit to 17-10. The Gamecocks would bring freshman quarterback Lorenzo Nuñez in and he would start the drive off with a 17-yard gain on the ground. An 11-yard gain by Pharoah Cooper would break the Gamecocks into Georgia territory and Brandon Wilds followed with a 13-yard rush. Orth would come up big on a key 3rd & 6 on the UGA 23 as he connected with tight end Jerrell Adams for a 15-yard completion. Two plays later, Orth went around left end on a quarterback keeper to score from four yards out for the Carolina score.

With 2:10 remaining in the second quarter, Georgia put together eight plays for 78 yards with Lambert going 5-for-5 in the air including a 5-yard touchdown pass to Malcolm Mitchell to give the Bulldogs a 14-point lead.

Despite little time remaining in the quarter, Shon Carson gave the Gamecocks a spark with a 51-yard kickoff return with 15 additional yards tacked on after the play on a face mask penalty by Georgia's Reggie Davis. With seven seconds left, Elliott Fry knocked a career-long 51-yard field goal through the uprights to cut the Gamecocks' deficit to 24-13 as time expired for the first half.

Georgia would strike on the first drive of the second half with Lambert completing an 11-yard touchdown pass to Sony Michel. After a Carolina interception, they would connect again on an 11-yard score to build a 38-13 lead on the Gamecocks. The Bulldogs scored three touchdowns in the third quarter. Nuñez would drive the Gamecocks in the fourth quarter with a 7-yard run. The Bulldogs followed that up with one more scoring drive.

**COLUMBIA, S.C.**— South Carolina's pair of second-half interceptions from T.J. Holloman and touchdown passes from Lorenzo Nuñez defined a solid third quarter as the Gamecocks powered past UCF 31-14 Saturday afternoon at Williams-Brice Stadium. Trailing 14-8 at halftime, South Carolina played a near flawless third quarter en route to 20 unanswered points while allowing the Knights just 73 yards of offense in the period.

Save for an opportunistic second quarter for UCF, South Carolina dominated the game on the scoreboard and the stat sheet. A balanced offensive attack saw the Gamecocks' 400 total yards come via 216 rushing yards and 184 passing. Defensively, South Carolina held the Knights to 3-of-12 on third down, had five tackles for loss, along with the two picks.

The Gamecocks controlled the first 19 minutes of the game, using extended drives on offense and limiting UCF to just two first downs. In his first career start, Nuñez led the Gamecocks on a scoring drive on their first possession, with Elliott Fry connecting for a career-long 52-yard field goal.

After a South Carolina punt pinned the Knights on their own two-yard line, Boosie Whitlow found his way into the backfield for a tackle in the end zone and a 5-0 South Carolina lead with 14:42 to play in the half. It was the Gamecocks' first safety since Sept. 12, 2009, at Georgia.

The defense again forced UCF into a three-and-out, but a muffed catch on the punt gave the Knights the ball on the 1-yard line, and Nick Patti punched it in for a touchdown and a 7-5 UCF lead with 11:04 to go in the half.

The touchdown energized the Knights on both sides of the ball. After forcing a punt, UCF launched a 93-yard drive capped off by Schneider's three pass completions, including a 30-yard floater to Tre'Quan Smith in the front corner of the end zone for a 14-5 lead with 5:18 left in the quarter. The Gamecocks added another Fry field goal to head into intermission trailing 14-8.

Nuñez opened up the first scoring drive of the second half with a 23-yard rush to get into UCF territory. A pair of Shon Carson rushes set up a Nuñez lateral to Cooper in the flat with the junior looking to pass. With his wide receivers covered, Cooper reversed to the left, picked up a solid block from Nuñez and scampered up the sideline for South Carolina's first TD and a 15-14 lead midway through the third quarter.

South Carolina quickly got the ball back on the first of two T.J. Holloman interceptions. Schneider's pass was tipped by Skai Moore, and Holloman scooped it up just before it hit the ground. Three plays later, Nuñez faked a handoff to the left, rolled to the right and found Jacob August for a scoring strike.

Leading 22-14 with 4:39 to play in the third quarter, the Gamecock defense again stepped up with Holloman corraling another interception. Less than 90 seconds later, Nuñez connected on his second touchdown pass, delivering to Cooper for a 35-yard strike. A muffed extra point left the Gamecocks with a 28-14 lead heading into the final stanza.

The Knights made it into South Carolina territory on their next possession, but the Gamecock defense took over on downs after D.J. Smith wrapped up Cedric Thompson for no gain on a 4th-and-6 play. With 11:30 to play, South Carolina kept the ball on the ground, rushing 12 times to set up a 33-yard field goal from Fry with just 2:53 on the clock.

Nuñez closed out his first career start with 123 yards rushing to go with 12-of-22 passing for 184 yards and two touchdowns in the air. He connected with five different receivers, including four times with Cooper, who finished with 69 receiving yards and both rushing and receiving touchdowns.

**COLUMBIA, MO.** — Missouri broke open a close contest midway in the third quarter with a 1-yard touchdown run by Ish Witter and shut South Carolina out in the second half on the way to a 24-10 victory on Saturday afternoon at Memorial Stadium. South Carolina drops to 2-3 and 0-3 in SEC play with Missouri now 4-1 and 1-1 in league play.

Gamecock wide receiver Pharoah Cooper caught 9 passes for 102 yards and moved up to 16th on the Gamecocks' all-time career reception list with 97, two shy of Ace Sanders for 15th in school history. It was Cooper's second 100-yard receiving game of the season and sixth of his career. Freshman quarterback Lorenzo Nuñez tallied a career-high with 15 completions and finished 15-for-24 for 172 yards including a touchdown pass. Missouri quarterback Drew Lock was 21-for-28 for 136 passing yards with Witter carrying 17 yards for 98 yards to lead the Tigers.

Both teams forced 3-and-outs to open the game. Missouri would then grab a 7-0 lead on their second possession as Lock led the Tigers down the field in an 11-play 51-yard drive capped by an 8-yard touchdown pass to Nate Brown.

Late in the first quarter South Carolina cut the deficit to 7-3 on a 34-yard field goal by Elliott Fry. The Gamecocks set up the field goal on a great catch down the sideline by Cooper on a 35-yard completion from Nuñez to put the Gamecocks in scoring position.

Missouri would add a field goal early in the second quarter to extend their lead to 10-3 as Andrew Baggett kicked a 21-yard field goal with 13:42 remaining in the second quarter.

South Carolina answered with a 14-play 75-yard drive to tie the game at 10-10 capped by an 8-yard touchdown pass from Nuñez to Shon Carson. Nuñez went 4-for-4 on the drive and sophomore tailback David Williams came up with a key 16-yard run to convert a 4th down. After a targeting penalty on Missouri freshman defensive tackle Terry Beckner Jr. moved the Gamecocks inside the Missouri 10, the Gamecocks would score three plays later as Nuñez's pass was tipped by a Missouri defender into the hands of Carson, who scampered in for the Gamecock score.

Missouri regained the lead on their ensuing drive as Lock and Brown connected again for 9-yard pass as the Tigers went 11 plays, 65 yards in 4:32 to take a 17-10 lead.

Missouri defensive end Walter Brady picked off a Nuñez pass midway in the third quarter to give the Tigers the ball on the Carolina 31-yardline. Seven plays later, the Tigers would score as tailback Ish Witter scored from 1 yard out giving Missouri a 24-10 advantage.

**BATON ROUGE, LA.**— Few fans of Carolina football could have imagined they would call LSU's Tiger Stadium home, but after a tumultuous week in Columbia the Gamecocks went west to take on the seventh-ranked Tigers.

On the field, the Gamecocks faced one of the most potent offenses in the country and Heisman candidate Leonard Fournette. A relentless and physical ground game would be the difference for LSU, though, who won 45-24 behind 54 rushes for 396 yards. The Tigers are now 5-0 (3-0 SEC), the Gamecocks move back to 2-4 (0-4).

Perry Orth finished with 200 yards passing and a pair of touchdown throws. One would go to Pharoah Cooper, who hauled in seven passes for 105 yards. On defense, Marquavius Lewis had his best game in the Garnet and Black, with nine tackles and a sack.

The Gamecocks would open the scoring on their very first drive, using a big third-down conversion to set up a field goal. On their own 45, the Gamecocks faced a third and 11. Orth hooked up with Cooper for a 42 yard passing play to get the ball into the red zone, setting up Elliott Fry's 21-yard field goal.

LSU would immediately counter that score with a 13 play, 75-yard touchdown drive that was capped by a four-yard run by Darrel Williams. It would score again on its first drive of the second quarter to go ahead 14-3, but the Gamecocks would not run and hide from the early adversity. Instead, it would come up with their most explosive play of the day to ignite a small but passionate fanbase in the stadium.

After LSU's touchdown, freshman Rashad Fenton took the ensuing kickoff 96 yards for the big score. The Tigers would overcommit to the left side of the field, and Fenton would go almost untouched to score on his first kick return ever for the team. It snapped a 13-year stretch without a kickoff return for the program, with the last coming from Matthew Thomas at Virginia in 2002.

LSU added a field goal as the half expired to take a 17-10 lead into intermission.

Through the first two quarters, the defense held Fournette to just 49 yards (3.3 per carry), but Harris responded to the run-focused Gamecock defense with 135 yards on 13 completions.

Fournette would nearly double his first-half rushing total on one carry. The sophomore went for an 87-yard touchdown run on his second touch of the third quarter and the Tigers would extend the lead to 24-10. After a three-and-out for Carolina, LSU went for another big play to make it 31-10. Facing a third-and-24 at its own 38, Harris appeared to overthrow his intended receiver, but a streaking Travin Dural caught the pass on the fly and went untouched for a 62-yard score.

Needing a quick answer, South Carolina got just that as it went 60 yards in just 90 seconds to score. Staring at fourth-and-eight and just out of field goal range at the 36, Perry Orth would hit Jerrell Adams over the middle. The senior tight end broke an ankle tackle and went in for his second touchdown of the season on his longest reception of the season.

The third quarter would end with dueling touchdown drives, starting with LSU going 75 yards on just six plays right after Adams' touchdown that made it 38-17. Carolina responded through the air with a three-play drive that would also result in a touchdown. Orth started things off with a 15-yard strike to Mattrick Belton, then hit Cooper on a slant and let the playmaker take it 43 yards for the score.

It appeared that the Gamecocks caught a break on the ensuing kickoff, as Landon Ard recovered his own onside kick, but the referees ruled that D.J. Smith was offside on the kick. The Tigers would field the re-kick.

LSU's ground game continued to grind on the Gamecock defense, keeping the score at an arm's length with a touchdown on its fourth consecutive drive to begin the fourth quarter. This time it would be Derrius Guice, diving in from four yards out for the final score of a 45-24 game. Carolina would gain just 33 yards in the fourth, as the Tigers dominated possession through the run game.

## South Carolina 19 Vanderbilt 10

**COLUMBIA, S.C.**— In its first game under interim head coach Shawn Elliott, South Carolina delivered a 19-10 victory over Vanderbilt Saturday afternoon at Williams-Brice Stadium as the Gamecock defense delivered five turnovers. Four came in the second half to help South Carolina score 13 unanswered points to overcome a halftime deficit and an early Vanderbilt field goal. Senior running back Brandon Wilds delivered his sixth career 100-yard game with 120 yards on 24 carries. Junior wide receiver Pharoh Cooper's eighth career 100-yard receiving game came with 160 yards on seven catches, including a 78-yard touchdown grab in the second half.

South Carolina struck early when Jonathan Walton forced a fumble recovered by T.J. Holloman on the third play of the game. Elliott Fry delivered a 47-yard field goal for a 3-0 lead.

Quarterback Perry Orth found his rhythm passing on Carolina's ensuing possession, finding D.J. Neal for a 28-yard strike and Cooper for a 24-yard delivery that put the Gamecocks into Vanderbilt territory. Fry again delivered with a 31-yard field goal for a 6-0 Gamecock lead with 6:49 left in the quarter.

Midway through the second quarter, Vanderbilt put together its most extensive drive as McCrary connected on a series of passes. With a first down on the 10-yard line, McCrary was thrown for a two-yard loss. After a five-yard rush by Vandy's Ralph Webb, the Gamecock defense forced another incomplete pass, but Holloman was charged with targeting that gave the Commodores new life at first and goal from the 3-yard line. South Carolina sent Vanderbilt back a yard over the next two plays, but McCrary found Caleb Scott alone in the end zone to make it a 7-6 Commodore lead with 2:21 to play in the half.

The second half opened with a short South Carolina drive as Vanderbilt carried momentum into the third quarter. Darrius Sims broke through for a 41-yard rush to quickly put the Commodores into Gamecock territory. Again the Gamecock defense held up when it mattered most, holding the Commodores to a 23-yard field goal and a 10-6 lead with 5:43 on the clock.

The Gamecock offense wasted little time rewarding its defense's effort as Orth found Cooper on a short slant that the junior receiver broke open for a 78-yard touchdown that put South Carolina back in front 13-10 with 6:34 left in the quarter.

Two plays into the Vanderbilt drive, Bryson Allen-Williams reeled in his first career interception to keep the Williams-Brice Stadium crowd on its feet. McCrary tried to go over the middle where Allen-Williams tipped it straight up. Keeping his focus, the sophomore linebacker tracked it down to seal the Commodores' second turnover of the game and give the Gamecocks the ball on the Vanderbilt 45.

The running game carried the Gamecocks to the 2-yard line, where the Commodores forced a field goal after Ryan White broke up a pass intended for Neal deep in the right corner of the end zone. Fry's strike from 19 yards made it a 16-10 South Carolina advantage with 2:52 to play in the third quarter.

Vanderbilt looked to rally early in the fourth quarter when Jahmel McIntosh pulled down an errant Orth pass meant for Cooper, but sophomore Chris Lammons returned the favor on the next play, out-leaping the receiver to make the interception. The Gamecocks were forced to punt, and the Commodores were sharp early in the possession. A series of penalties set up 1st-and-28 on their own 8-yard line, though, and Skai Moore finished off the drive with a perfectly read interception on McCrary's pass over the middle. Four plays later, Fry drilled his fourth field goal of the game to put the Gamecocks up 19-10 with 5:27 to play.

The Commodores were up for the fight, though, driving efficiently down the field to the Gamecocks' 17 on five plays. After an incomplete pass set up 2nd-and-10, McCrary dropped back for another pass only to be tracked down by Moore who stripped the ball and picked up the fumble to put South Carolina back in the driver's seat.

## Texas A&M 35 South Carolina 28

**COLLEGE STATION, TEXAS—** South Carolina (3-5, 1-5 SEC) totaled a season-high 445 total yards of offense with Brandon Wilds rushing 17 times for 128 yards and two touchdowns, but Texas A&M (6-2, 3-2 SEC) freshman quarterback Kyler Murray threw for 223 yards and a touchdown and rushed for 156 yards and a score as well as the Aggies defeated the Gamecocks 35-28 on Saturday afternoon.

Wilds' 128 yards were a season-high for the senior tailback as well as his first two rushing touchdowns of the season. Junior quarterback Perry Orth was 15-for-24 for 192 yards in the air with 64 yards rushing on 11 carries.

After a missed field goal on the opening drive, A&M went nine plays and 74 yards on their next possession capped by a 10-yard touchdown pass from Kyler Murray to Josh Reynolds.

South Carolina answered with an 11-play 75-yard drive to tie it up 7-7 with Lorenzo Nuñez scoring on a 7-yard reverse. Orth was solid on the drive as he went 5-for-5 for 57 yards in the air including a key 19-yard pass to David Williams that moved the Gamecocks into A&M territory. Pharoh Cooper had a pair of receptions on the drive with Shamier Jeffery and D.J. Neal also coming up with catches. Nunez, seeing his first action since the Missouri game on Oct. 3, took the reverse handoff and initially looked to throw before keeping it himself and beating the A&M defenders to the goal line for the score.

After forcing a Texas A&M punt, the Gamecocks scored on the ensuing possession to take a 14-7 lead. The drive featured a 66-yard run from scrimmage by Perry Orth on a 3rd and 8 down to the A&M 20. It was the longest run by a Gamecocks player this season. Three plays later, Orth kept the ball on the option and scored from 6 yards out to put the Gamecocks ahead.

The Aggies tied it at 14-14 with 6:17 to go in the second quarter as senior tailback Tra Carson scored on 3rd & Goal with a 1-yard touchdown run.

The Gamecocks responded again to regain the lead on the next possession with Wilds scoring on a 3-yard touchdown run. The score was set up by the Gamecocks earlier in the drive as Orth completed a 47-yard pass to Hayden Hurst on 3rd & 10 to move the Gamecocks down to Texas A&M's 14-yard-line. Wilds would take the pitch from Orth into the corner of the end zone to give the Gamecocks a 7-point lead. Texas A&M would score right before the end of the first half with one minute to go as James White carried for a 2-yard score.

The Aggies would go ahead 28-21 on their first possession of the second half. The 11-play 81-yard drive was capped by a 1-yard score by Murray on 4th and Goal. A&M then built a 14-point lead as Donovan Wilson stepped in front of a pass from Orth and went 60 yards for an interception return for a touchdown.

South Carolina fought back and crept to within seven just before the end of the third quarter as Wilds went 33 yards for his second touchdown of the game.

Both teams were limited in the fourth quarter with A&M holding the Gamecocks to just 31 yards of total offense in the fourth quarter and the Aggies with just 66 yards of offense also.

KNOXVILLE, TENN.— South Carolina rallied from 17 points down and twice tied Tennessee, but a forced fumble with 32 seconds remaining ended a potential scoring drive for the Gamecocks in their final possession as the Volunteers defeated the Gamecocks 27-24 Saturday afternoon at Neyland Stadium.

Trailing 17-3 at halftime, the Gamecocks second drive of the third quarter resulted in a touchdown as the Gamecocks cut the Volunteers lead to seven points. Carolina went 11 plays on 80 yards in the drive culminating in a 10-yard touchdown pass from Orth to Jonathan Walton. The touchdown was the first time that Walton, a linebacker for the Gamecocks, touched the ball in his career in an offensive possession.

Carolina immediately followed with a forced turnover and converted a 4th & goal to tie the game at 17. With Tennessee pinned back deep in their territory, Gamecocks defensive tackle Phillip Dukes forced a fumble down that was recovered by linebacker T.J. Holloman. With 4th & goal at the 7, the Gamecocks elected to go for the touchdown and Orth rifled a spiral right into the end zone that was corralled in by Jerell Adams for the score.

Both teams traded touchdowns in the next two possessions including a 5-yard TD pass from Perry Orth to Pharoh Cooper. Tennessee would go ahead 27-24 with 9:14 to go in the third quarter on a 27-yard field goal by Aaron Medley. The Vols drive was keyed by a pair of third down conversions with Dobbs completing a 24-yard pass on a 3rd & 7 to Johnathon Johnson as well as 30-yard pass to Von Pearson on 3rd & 10 down to the SC 13-yardline.

South Carolina kept fighting though and down to their final timeout forced Tennessee to punt with 1:24 to go in the game. The Gamecocks worked quickly and Orth moved the team into UT territory with a 17-yard pass to Matrick Belton and a 16-yard completion to Hayden Hurst. On 3rd & 10 on the Tennessee 43, Orth connected with Gamecock tight end Jerell Adams, who shook off a UT defender. As Adams continued down the field, Tennessee nickelback Malik Foreman punched the ball from behind out of Adams' grip and linebacker Jalen Reeves-Maybin fell on the ball to recover the fumble and seal the win for UT.

Orth finished 20-for-39 in the air for 233 passing yards including a career-high three touchdown passes. Senior tailback Brandon Wilds was the Gamecocks' leading rusher with 20 carries for 79 yards.

Tennessee drove 67 yards on eight plays in the opening drive with Alvin Kamara scoring on a 4-yard touchdown run. The Volunteers increased the lead to 14-0 on their second possession as Dobbs connected with Von Pearson for a 37-yard touchdown pass.

Both teams traded field goals in the second quarter. Aaron Medley connected on a 46-yarder for the Volunteers. The Gamecocks would then put together a scoring drive right before halftime. Orth came up with a key third down conversion as he found Pharoh Cooper for a 17-yard completion. Brandon Wilds added a 12-yard run and Orth rushed 15 yards to move the Gamecocks into scoring position. Fry converted the 43-yard field goal attempt cutting the deficit to 14 points.

**COLUMBIA, S.C.**— A fourth-quarter comeback would come just a few plays short for the South Carolina football team Saturday afternoon, as it lost at home to No. 11/10 Florida, 24-14. Perry Orth and Pharoh Cooper each threw touchdowns in the fourth quarter for the Gamecocks, who now move to 3-7 overall and 1-7 in the SEC.

Florida (9-1, 7-1 SEC) opened the scoring with a touchdown with two minutes left to go in the first quarter. In total, it was a 15-play, 87-yard odyssey for the Gators, capped by a three-yard dive from Jordan Cronkrite. Florida used a trio of third-down conversions and a key fourth-down conversion in South Carolina territory to keep the scoring drive alive, along with five completions for 73 yards from Treon Harris. The 15 plays marked the longest touchdown drive allowed by Carolina so far this season.

After a three-and-out from the Gamecocks, Florida put up another long drive with a touchdown to cap it off. As it had done throughout the half, Florida used efficient short-yardage pickups on first down to create manageable conversions and stay on the field. It would be one big play, though, that would lead to the visitor's second score.

A sack from Gerald Dixon put the Gators back at the Carolina 41 on 3rd down with 11 yards to pick up. Harris looked downfield on the next play, and cornerback Chris Lammons would close on a 50-50 ball over the middle, but Cronkrite came away with the pass off the collision and put the visitors ahead 14-0.

The Gators threatened to score again late in the second quarter, as Jalen Tabor stepped in front of a hitch route for an interception at the South Carolina 18. A big pass completion to DeAndre Goolsby set the team up at the four-yard line, but the South Carolina defense held tough. On third-and-goal, Harris was flushed to the right and took a shot in the end zone, but Spur T.J. Gurley made a leaping interception to keep it a two-score game going into halftime.

Carolina picked up another turnover right out of the gate in the second half, as Gerald Dixon continued his strong day with an interception. On first down, Maquavius Lewis came off the edge and caught Harris' elbow as he went to pass. The ball pinged around the line of scrimmage before being collected by Dixon for his first career pick.

Florida's defense remained stout in its own right, though, and the Gamecocks' three total drives in the third quarter ended with a total of negative nine yards. The Gators would go for 106 yards for the quarter, but came away with only a field goal.

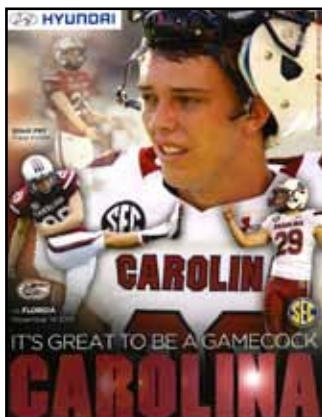
Needing to break into the scoring column as quick as possible, the Gamecocks pulled out some "trickery" to open the scoring in the fourth quarter. Three straight completions from Perry Orth got the home side into Florida territory, and Carolina soon found itself in the red zone with a first down.

The Gamecocks lined up four receivers on the left side, with Pharoh Cooper taking the step-back pass from Orth. After some blocking gave the junior receiver a "pocket", he would find his quarterback on the opposite side of the field with a perfect over-the-shoulder pass and a 17-yard touchdown to make it a 17-7 game after a 64-yard drive. It was Orth's first career reception, and Cooper's fourth career pass (first of the season).

The defense would feed off a reenergized Williams-Brice crowd, and would force a three-and-out to force a quick punt from Florida.

Orth would stay in his groove as the offense took the field again. He hit Matrik Belton over the middle for 25 yards, then went for 12 more to Jerrell Adams to get back into Florida territory. After a penalty moved the ball up to the 38, Orth returned the favor to Cooper, lofting in a touchdown over the middle to make it a 17-14 game with five minutes to go in the game.

Florida would provide a strong answer to the comeback hopes, using a quick-strike scoring drive to put the game out of reach on the very next drive. Facing a third-and-eight at their own 46, the Gators' Kelvin Taylor ran a counter play up the middle for 53 yards. He followed it with a one-yard dive for the touchdown and a 24-14 advantage for Florida with two minutes to play, sealing the win.

## Citadel 23 South Carolina 22

**COLUMBIA, S.C.**— South Carolina dropped a 23-22 decision to The Citadel Saturday afternoon. Quarterback Perry Orth and tight end Jerrell Adams had career days offensively for the Gamecocks (3-8), but the Bulldogs (8-3) racked up 350 rushing yards to earn the win.

It would be the Bulldogs who would strike first, using their triple-option offense to break a big touchdown run on the first drive. A-back Cam Jackson took a pitch to the short side right and went 59 yards to the endzone for a 7-0 advantage just 150 seconds into the game.

The Gamecocks aired it out on their next drive, with Orth hitting Pharoh Cooper for 40 yards and Adams for 12 on successive attempts to drive into the red zone, but a key penalty on what would have been another first down stalled out the offense and led to a 36-yard field goal for Elliott Fry.

The Citadel would answer with a different style of drive to take a two-score lead late in the quarter. The visitors would run 13 times out of the option and went 75 yards, Tyler Renew capped it with a seven-yard dive up the middle for a 14-3 game.

Needing a response, the Gamecocks would use a pair of fourth-down conversions to drive in for another field goal in their first drive of the second quarter. Orth would hit Deebo Samuel on a fourth-and-three from Carolina's own 40, then he would keep it on a sneak on fourth-and-one at The Citadel 42. A 30-yard completion to Adams set the team up inside the ten, but the drive would stall out again and led to a 25-yard field goal from Fry.

The Citadel's first punt of the day would help the Gamecocks edge closer on the scoreboard. Another big completion to Adams - this time a 27-yard pickup - set the team up on the fringe of the redzone. A pair of runs would be stuffed and Fry would soon find himself converting his third field goal of the game, this time a 40-yarder in a 14-9 game. The score would carry into the halftime break.

The Carolina defense stonewalled The Citadel for the fourth-straight drive as the second half got under way, giving the offense a chance to take another bite out of the deficit. As it had been all day, the drive was given a shot in the arm by a big pass play, this time it was Orth to Cooper over the middle on a deep post for a 47-yard gain. Three runs later, Brandon Wilds punched it in to give the Garnet and Black a 16-14 lead with six minutes to go in the third.

A 48-yard field goal for the Bulldogs would briefly put them ahead, 17-16, but the air raid continued from Orth and his receiving corps. He would loft a 41-yard touchdown pass to Cooper, giving him his first career 300-yard game. The two-point conversion failed, giving Carolina a 22-17 lead with nine minutes to play.

The visitors would answer back, going back to the home-run play. Renew burst through the middle for 56 yards on a second-down run to push it back to a 23-22 lead for The Citadel. In Carolina's attempt to answer, it would run out of luck on its fourth down conversions, stonewalled on a fourth-and-one at The Citadel 46 to give the Bulldogs the ball back with just four minutes to play.

Carolina's defense would hold, but burned its final two timeouts and was left with just 1:26 by the time the offense got the ball back. The drive would start at Carolina's own three-yard line.

Three passes would get the team just three yards, but on fourth-and-seven Cooper caught a seam pass and took it in for the apparent score, but it was determined that not all 11 Gamecocks were set in formation when the ball was snapped. The play was waved off, and on the next ensuing play the team would be stopped short of a first down.

## #1/1 Clemson 37 South Carolina 32

**COLUMBIA, S.C.**— The South Carolina football team ended its 2015 season Saturday afternoon with a Palmetto Bowl matchup with rival Clemson. Early missed opportunities would prove costly for Carolina (3-9), who recovered a pair of first-quarter fumbles but were unable to convert them into points in a 37-32 loss.

Perry Orth passed for 219 yards and three touchdowns in the game, Deebo Samuel had a career day with 104 yards receiving and Lorenzo Nunez paced the ground game with 75 yards on 10 carries. Deshaun Watson had 393 yards of total offense to lead the No. 1-ranked Tigers (12-0).

The Gamecocks dug deep into their play-book early and often in the first half. A variety of play packages and three different quarterbacks (Orth, Nunez, Pharoh Cooper) would keep the Tiger defense guessing. The Gamecocks converted a key fourth down and made it to the Clemson 24 on its second drive of the game, but Orth would be intercepted at the Clemson four-yard line.

Rico McWilliams and Dante Sawyer each recovered fumbles, but Carolina would gain just three yards combined in the two drives following the turnovers, as the game remained scoreless through the first stanza.

Clemson would finally break through on its first drive of the second quarter. Watson capped the scoring drive, taking in from five yards out for the touchdown. The visitors would add to their lead on their following possession, with Watson dropping a pass over the shoulder of Deon Cain for a 55-yard touchdown, capping a 94-yard drive that spanned eight plays. It would give Clemson a 14-0 lead late in the half.

The first half would close on a positive note, with the Gamecocks putting their first points on the board thanks to a field goal from Elliott Fry. It was set up by a 47-yard run from Nunez and a 25-yard run from Shon Carson. Orth hooked up with Cooper for 24 more yards on third-and-22, but Clemson tightened up inside the 10 and limited Carolina to just three points before intermission.

Any momentum gained would be taken back by Clemson coming out of halftime, with the Tigers benefitting from an official review on a fumble. Watson hit Artavis Scott over the middle for 27 yards to the South Carolina 30, but Scott was ruled to have fumbled at the end of his run. After review, the turnover was reversed and Watson would keep it on a 30-yard touchdown run on the next play for a 21-3 game.

Needing seven points to stay in it, the freshman Samuel picked up 65 of the team's 76 yards on the 10-play scoring drive, including a 48-yard pickup. He capped it with a seven-yard catch to the back corner of the end zone from Orth and made it 21-10.

Clemson would get a touchdown on its fourth-straight drive to take a three-score lead immediately after Carolina's score. The Tigers ran the ball seven times during the 12-play drive, C.J. Fuller ended it with a four-yard dive. The Gamecocks responded with another big play through the air on their next drive, with Orth hitting a wide-open Cooper for 57 yards and his eighth receiving touchdown of the season.

A third fumble of the game from Clemson gave the Gamecocks the chance to cut even more into the deficit, and this time the home side would take advantage of the turnover. Shon Carson picked up 21 yards on a run down to the 1-yard line, and punched it in on the next play. After a two-point conversion it would be just a 28-25 lead for Clemson.

The defense would not be able to hold off Clemson on the next drive, the Tigers converted all three third-down plays and Watson ran for his third touchdown on the ground to make it 34-25 after a failed PAT.

Carolina would get three more possessions to close out the game, but would get just nine yards total out of the first two drives, the second of which gave Clemson the ball in scoring position. The Tigers ran down the clock and kicked a field goal for a two-possession lead. Shon Carson would catch an 11-yard touchdown in the hurry-up offense on the team's final possession, but left just one second on the clock for any onside kick attempt.
