COLUMBIA, S.C.— No. 9 South Carolina saw its 18-game home winning streak end tonight to No. 21 Texas A&M, 52-28 at Williams-Brice Stadium in the first-ever meeting between the two teams. Aggie sophomore quarterback Kenny Hill passed for a school record 511 yards and three touchdowns. Senior quarterback Dylan Thompson threw for 366 yards and four touchdowns and senior wide receiver Nick Jones had a career-high 113 yards receiving and two touchdowns.

On a third-and-five on the opening drive, Hill stepped up in the pocket to create time and found an open Ricky Seals-Jones over the middle where he weaved his way down to the 1-yard line for a 21-yard gain. Tra Carson punched it in to give Texas A&M an early 7-0 lead just over three minutes into the game. Senior kicker Josh Lambo made it 10-0 with 5:02 left in the first quarter after converting a 33-yard field goal.

South Carolina responded quickly though on the next drive, despite staring down a three-and-out. On his own 31-yard line, Thompson took a shot down the field and found Jones streaking down the field, getting behind the defense to make a grab at the Aggie 30-yard line before heading into the end zone for a 69-yard touchdown. The drive, which took just over a minute, brought the Gamecocks within three at 10-7 with just over three minutes remaining in the opening quarter.

After getting the ball back, South Carolina was unable to sustain the momentum and was forced to punt. During the next 2:22 minutes, Hill methodically moved the ball down the field before connecting with Seals-Jones over the middle for a three-yard score to give the Aggies a 17-7 lead.

Needing a quick response, the Gamecocks found it in senior wide receiver Damiere Byrd. Moving the ball to the Aggie 46-yard line on five plays, Thompson then connected with Byrd after the wideout slipped past his defender and found a 10-yard cushion for an easy 46-yard score to bring the Gamecocks within three at 17-14.

With just over seven minutes remaining in the half, Hill and the Aggies marched down the field with an eight-play, 75-yard drive that resulted in Hill finding Edward Pope in the back of the end zone to make it 24-14.

After Carolina was forced to punt the ball back to Texas A&M with 3:35 left in the half, the Aggies strung together an 11-play, 80-yard drive on the ensuing possession that ended a on Carson's second touchdown as Hill optioned left to the tailback on third-and-goal from 2-yard line. The score gave the Aggies a 31-14 lead heading into intermission.

Early in the third quarter, Hill found Josh Reynolds in the corner of the end zone to make it 38-14. Thompson then engineered an eight-play drive, amassing 81 yards that was capped off by a five-yard touchdown pass to Cooper over the middle to make it 38-21. On the ensuing kickoff, South Carolina went for the onside kick, but it was recovered by the Aggies at the 42-yard line. Eight plays later, Carson scored his third touchdown of the game from two yards out as the Aggies extended the lead to 45-21.

A pair of 27-yard passes to Jerrell Adams and Cooper marched the Gamecocks back into the red zone on the following drive. Thompson was able to find Jones drifting out to the right side of the end zone where the wide receiver hauled in his second touchdown of the game to bring Carolina back within 17 points at 45-28. It was his second multi-touchdown game of his career.

After holding the Aggies to their second punt of the quarter, Carolina had a chance to cut into the deficit late in the third quarter, but a deep ball from Thompson was intercepted by Watts at the Texas A&M 17-yard line. Ten plays and 83 yards later, Trey Williams made it 52-28 with a two-yard touchdown run with 12:09 remaining in the game.

COLUMBIA, S.C.— No. 21 South Carolina defeated East Carolina, 33-23, tonight at Williams-Brice Stadium, giving Head Coach Steve Spurrier his 200th win as a coach in the Southeastern Conference. Junior running back Mike Davis led the way with his eighth-career 100-yard rushing game, as he totaled 101 yards and a pair of touchdowns.

After forcing the Gamecocks to punt on the opening possession of the game, a 53-yard punt from Tyler Hull was down at the Pirates' 3-yard line. East Carolina strung together an 11-play drive to move into the red zone, but from there, the drive stalled. The Gamecock defense clamped down and forced the Pirates to convert on a 26-yard field goal by Warren Harvey.

On the following drive, redshirt senior quarterback Dylan Thompson was intercepted by Josh Hawkins, giving ECU the ball at the South Carolina 43-yard line. The Pirates were unable to muster much and Harvey connected on a 35-yard field goal to give the visitors a 6-0 lead with 6:35 on the clock.

Trailing 6-0, the Gamecocks mounted a 10-play drive with Thompson going four-of-five and Davis rushing four times for 48 yards. The tailback capped off the drive by bursting through an open whole on the right side of the line and taking it 36 yards into the end zone to give Carolina a 7-6 lead with 1:56 remaining in the opening quarter.

The Pirates responded though as quarterback Shane Carden went five-of-six for 67 yards on the next drive. Chris Hairston finished the drive with a 10-yard touchdown run to give ECU a 13-7 lead early in the second quarter. Eleven plays later, South Carolina cut the deficit to three with a 39-yard field from sophomore Elliott Fry with 9:55 left in the half.

A three-and-out for the Pirates gave the Gamecock offense a spark and Thompson went four-of-four on the drive connecting on a 31-yard pass down the middle to junior wide receiver Shaq Roland and a 19-yard completion to Davis that got the Gamecocks down to the 3-yard line. The tailback then pounded his way into the end zone on the next play for his second touchdown of the half to give South Carolina a 17-13 lead with under five minutes remaining in the half.

ECU's Breon Allen countered on the next possession with a 42-yard run down to the Gamecock 19-yard line. South Carolina's defense then forced a pair of incomplete passes and a rush for no gain, before junior defensive tackle Gerald Dixon Jr. blocked a 42-yard field goal attempt, the Gamecocks' first blocked field goal since 2011. With just over a minute left before the end of the half, Fry connected on his second field goal, a 42-yarder to take a 20-13 lead.

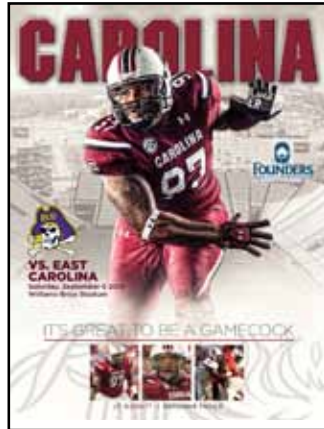
Aided by a roughing the passer penalty and a 20-yard completion to Cam Worthy, the Pirates set up Harvey for a 40-yard field goal, his third conversion of the half with four seconds remaining, and the Gamecocks held a 20-16 lead at the break.

East Carolina opened the second half driving into Gamecock territory, but on a third-and-five, junior defensive end Cedrick Cooper put pressure on Carden, forcing the Pirate quarterback into a tough throw which spur Sharrod Golightly intercepted just before stepping across the sideline. It was the senior's first career interception.

Thompson completed six-straight passes on the ensuing drive before finding wide receiver K.J. Brent open in the left corner of the end zone for the junior's first-career touchdown reception to push the Gamecocks lead to 27-16 with 8:36 left in the third.

T.J. Gurley intercepted Carden on the Pirates next possession allowing the Gamecocks to use up 5:40 off the clock before Fry converted on a 26-yard field goal to put South Carolina up 30-16 heading into the final stanza. With the Gamecocks seizing control, Carden engineered an 11-play drive, capping it off with a 17-yard touchdown pass across the middle to Worthy to cut the Pirates deficit to 30-23 early in the fourth.

South Carolina put the game away with an 18-play, 86-yard drive, lasting 10:33, the second-longest drive during the Spurrier era, that culminated in a 20-yard field goal conversion by Fry, tying his career-high with four in a game.

COLUMBIA, S.C.— After inclement weather caused an hour and 26-minute delay to the start of the game, lightning struck as No. 24 South Carolina took down No. 6 Georgia, 38-35. After Georgia kicker Marshall Morgan missed his second field goal of the night with 4:24 left, the Gamecocks were able to run out the clock as Dylan Thompson narrowly converted on a fourth-and-inches at midfield to secure the win.

The Gamecocks took the first possession of the game 75 yards to paydirt, climaxed by a Thompson to Shaq Roland 10-yard score. It only took Georgia two plays to respond though as quarterback Hutson Mason connected with Isaiah McKenzie for a 36-yard pass down the right side. On the ensuing play, Mason dumped off a short pass to Sony Michel for a 33-yard touchdown to tie the game at 7.

A Carolina fumble led to a 36-yard field goal from Morgan to give the Bulldogs a 10-7 advantage.

The Gamecocks drove the field again on their next possession. Thompson found Pharoah Cooper on the left side where the receiver put a quick left-to-right move on his defender before racing into the end zone for an eight-yard score to put the Gamecocks up 14-10.

Morgan was able to pull the Bulldogs within one at 14-13 with a 26-yard field goal, but Thompson continued to find open receivers as he marched the Gamecocks down the field, finding Damiere Byrd for a 24-yard completion and Jones for a 20-yard pass, before connecting in the back of the end zone with Anderson for an 18-yard touchdown to give Carolina a 21-13 lead with 5:34 remaining in the first half.

With just over two minutes left, Cooper and Byrd rushed for back-to-back first downs as the Gamecocks tried to put together a scoring drive before the end of the half. Jones came up with a big 25-yard reception along the sideline before taking a big hit to put Carolina at the 22-yard line. An eight-yard run from Davis set up Elliott Fry for a 32-yard field goal to give the Gamecocks a 24-13 lead heading into the half.

Georgia struck on its opening drive in the third quarter as Gurley got loose for a 40-yard run to get to the South Carolina 25-yard line. The Georgia tailback eventually punched in a two-yard touchdown run, bringing the Bulldogs' deficit to 24-20. South Carolina continued to have its way with Georgia's defense on the following drive as Thompson went two-for-two and Davis and Wilds combined for 43 yards on the ground. Thompson capped off the drive with a one-yard touchdown rush to push the lead back to 11.

With 2:13 remaining in the third quarter, a personal foul on a Carolina punt put Georgia in good field position. Six plays later, Mason found Jay Rome in the end zone. The two-point conversion cut the deficit to three.

On the ensuing kickoff, junior tailback Shon Carson found space on the left side and picked up a career-long return of 42 yards to put Carolina on the Georgia 42-yard line. Davis picked up 19 on the first two plays of the drive before Wilds finished off the drive by breaking runs of 15 and 24 yards to extend the Gamecocks' lead to 10 at 38-28 with 13:01 to play. Nearly six minutes later, Georgia responded with a one-yard touchdown run from Quayvon Hicks on an 11-play drive.

Four plays into the Gamecocks' following drive, Thompson was intercepted across the middle by Georgia's Damian Swann. With the ball on the Carolina three-yard line, Mason was called for intentional grounding as sophomore defensive end Gerald Dixon came at him unblocked. The Gamecock defense held Georgia to a 28-yard field goal attempt, but the Georgia kicker missed his second attempt of the night.

South Carolina was able to run out the final 4:24 of the game to hold on for the three-point win in front of the fifth-largest crowd in stadium history at 84,232.

NASHVILLE, TENN.— After trailing 14-0 early in the game, No. 14 South Carolina came back to defeat Vanderbilt on the road, 48-34, Saturday night at Vanderbilt Stadium.

It only took 11 seconds into the game for the Commodores to get on the board as Darrius Sims found an alley on the opening kickoff and returned it 91 yards for a touchdown, his first of two of the night, to give Vanderbilt the early 7-0 lead.

Later in the quarter, Patton Robinette hit an open Davis Dudchuck for a 29-yard gain off of a play action pass to get the Commodores down to the South Carolina 27-yard line. Vanderbilt moved the ball down inside the 10, and on third-and-goal, Robinette connected with C.J. Duncan on a slant for an eight-yard touchdown to give the home team a 14-0 advantage.

On their third possession of the game, the Gamecocks were able to move the ball into Vanderbilt territory as senior quarterback Dylan Thompson hit Pharoh Cooper, who had been involved early and often, for a 22-yard gain. Unable to move deeper into the Commodores' end, Elliott Fry converted on a 45-yard field goal to cut the deficit to 14-3 with under 13 minutes left in the first half.

After forcing Vanderbilt to punt on its next possession, momentum began to shift. Back-to-back 19-yard gains from Cooper and Brandon Wilds moved the Gamecocks down to the Commodores' 42-yard line. Four plays later, Damiere Byrd slipped past his defender and Thompson connected with him at the back of the end zone for a 29-yard score to move within four at 14-10 with 5:58 on the clock.

Carolina grabbed its first lead of the night with 23 seconds left before halftime as Brison Williams jumped a late out-route from freshman Wade Freebeck, who entered the game in the first quarter after Robinette left the game with an injury. The defensive back returned the interception 53 yards to give the Gamecocks a 17-14 lead.

On the opening drive of the second half, South Carolina picked up where it left off in the second quarter and moved the ball into Vanderbilt territory. Facing a third-and-15, Thompson got the pass off to Cooper on the left sideline for a 15-yard gain. Following a review of the play, Thompson hit Shaq Roland on a 29-yard post route for a touchdown to extend the Gamecocks' lead to 24-14. On the ensuing kickoff though, Sims struck again, finding a crease and returning the ball 100 yards for his second touchdown of the game to bring Vanderbilt back to within three.

Fry extended the Gamecocks' lead to 27-21 on the next possession, converting from 43 yards out for his second field goal of the night with 6:42 on the clock. Late in the third quarter, the Carolina defense held the Commodores to a 25-yard field goal after Vanderbilt had a first-and-goal from the Gamecocks' five-yard line.

South Carolina responded with a 10-play, 61-yard drive that Thompson capped off by rolling to his right and finding Nick Jones in the corner of the end zone for a 7-yard touchdown to extend the lead to 34-24 with 10:34 left in the game. Vanderbilt followed with a 9-play drive that gave Tommy Openshaw a 46-yard field goal attempt to cut into the deficit, but J.T. Surratt came up with the Carolina's second blocked field goal of the season.

On Carolina's first play of the ensuing drive, Mike Davis lost a fumble. Vanderbilt used the opportunity to close to within seven, at 34-27, after Openshaw converted on a 30-yard field goal with 5:57 remaining.

South Carolina went into the wildcat on the next drive, and on the second play, Cooper broke a 70-yard run before being caught just before he crossed the goal line. Thompson came in on the following play and scored on a one-yard rush to make it 41-27.

After Bryson Allen-Williams recovered a fumble on the kickoff, redshirt David Williams capped off a short drive with a two-yard touchdown run with 1:32 on the clock. With 47 seconds left, Freebeck connected with Kris Kentera for a seven-yard touchdown to make it 48-34.

COLUMBIA, S.C.— No. 13/15 South Carolina fell 21-20 to Missouri Saturday night at Williams-Brice Stadium as the Tigers' tailback Russell Hansbrough scored his third touchdown of the game, a one-yard rush with 1:36 remaining to give Missouri the go-ahead score.

South Carolina opened the game up with the ball, but unable to convert on a fourth-and-one from its own 42, turned the ball over to the Tigers. Missouri quarterback Maty Mauk's second pass on the drive was intercepted on the goal line by sophomore safety Chaz Elder, but an offside penalty on the Gamecocks negated the play. Three plays later, Hansbrough found a hole on the right side, cut outside and found an alley to the end zone for an 18-yard run to give the Tigers a quick 7-0 lead less than three minutes into the game.

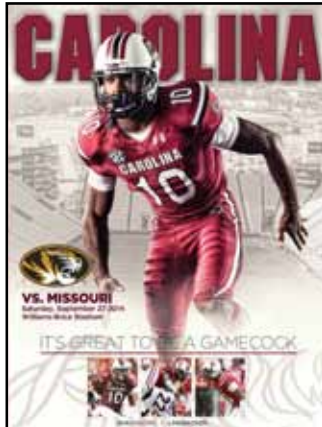
With 4:48 on the clock in the first quarter, Missouri's Andrew Baggett lined up for a 48-yard field goal, but the attempt was wide right. Carolina struck on the following play with a 27-yard pass from senior quarterback Dylan Thompson to sophomore wide receiver Pharoh Cooper. A six-yard run from junior tailback Mike Davis and a pass interference call on the Tigers moved the Gamecocks down to the 23-yard line. Unable to convert on a third-and-five from the 18, sophomore kicker Elliott Fry came on and converted a 33-yard field goal to cut Carolina's deficit to 7-3 with just over two minutes remaining in the first quarter.

As the second quarter was winding down, a 42-yard punt from Missouri's Christian Brinser was returned 24 yards by Cooper to the Carolina 41-yard line. Davis took over from there, accounting for 55 yards on four plays, including a 24-yard burst after a short pass from Thompson. That play set up a 17-yard touchdown run, which he cut to the right and bounced to the outside to give the Gamecocks a 10-7 lead with 1:36 remaining before the half.

On the fourth possession of the second half, South Carolina added to its lead with Fry's second field goal of the game, this time from 41 yards out, his fourth this season from 40-plus yards. The attempt was set up by a 47-yard reception from senior wide receiver Nick Jones.

South Carolina extended its lead to 20-7 midway through the fourth quarter as six rushes in seven plays was followed by a 23-yard strike from Thompson to Cooper over the middle. The wideout made a two-handed grab just across the goal line and held on after taking a big hit. The Tigers struck quick though as Mauk covered 67 yards through the air on two plays before Hansbrough capped off a 36-second drive with a one-yard touchdown run to cut the deficit to 20-14 with 6:49 remaining.

Forced to go three-and-out on its next possession, South Carolina punted the ball back to Missouri with 4:40 remaining. Senior punter Tyler Hull's 48-yard punt was returned 22 yards by Marcus Murphy to midfield. The Tigers converted on a fourth-and-one at the Carolina 42-yard line to keep their drive alive. A Gamecock pass interference call, followed by a 22-yard run by Murphy brought the ball down to the South Carolina two-yard line. On fourth down from the one-yard line, Hansbrough scored the go-ahead score.

LEXINGTON, KY.— In a game that saw multiple momentum swings, South Carolina fell 45-38 to Kentucky as the Wildcats scored 21 unanswered points during the final eight-plus minutes. Defensive end Alvin Dupree gave Kentucky the lead with under three minutes remaining in the game with a six-yard interception return for a touchdown.

Carolina opened the game with the ball and proceeded to use a punishing ground attack that chewed up nearly the first eight minutes that ended with Mike Davis giving the Gamecocks a 7-0 lead with a one-yard touchdown run, his first of three scores on the night. On the drive, South Carolina ran a total of 19 plays, the second-most during the Steve Spurrier era, and 17 of the plays came via the ground, accounting for 70 of the 79 yards.

After getting the ball back just over two minutes later, Carolina nearly lost the ball deep in its own territory on a high snap, but senior quarterback Dylan Thompson was able to fall on the ball. Facing a second-and-18, the Gamecocks went back to the ground, optioning to the left to Davis where the tailback found an open lane and raced out for a 40-yard run to midfield. Thompson was then able to go four-of-four as Carolina continued to march down the field. Davis finished off the drive with a two-yard run to extend the lead to 14-0 early in the second quarter.

Kentucky cut the deficit in half as Jojo Kemp finished off a six-play, 52-yard drive with a three-yard run up the middle. The Wildcats held the Gamecocks to a three-and-out on their next possession, but Carolina was able to force a fumble from Kentucky quarterback Patrick Towles. South Carolina turned the fumble into points as sophomore kicker Elliott Fry converted on a 31-yard field goal attempt.

It took the Wildcats just 56 seconds though to pull within three at 17-14 with 3:39 remaining in the half as Braylon Heard had rushes of 15 and 38 on the following drive. With time still left on the clock, South Carolina was able to move the ball down to the Kentucky 15-yard line, but an interception, followed by a 50-yard return by A.J. Stamps gave the Wildcats an opportunity late in the first half. With time expiring, Austin MacGinnis converted on a 47-yard field goal to tie the game at 17.

Kentucky took its first lead of the night on the opening drive of the second half. On third-and-four from midfield, the Wildcats went to a trick play with the ball exchanging hands three times before Towles, on the edge, found a wide open Ryan Timmons down field for a 48-yard touchdown pass to give the home team a 24-17 advantage.

Carolina quickly responded with a five-play drive that ended with a Shon Carson 25-yard run to tie the game at 24.

After the defense was able to force the Wildcats to punt, the Gamecock offense was back on the move despite starting from its own nine-yard line. Carolina steadily moved the ball down the field. Facing a third-and-four at the Kentucky 12-yard line, Thompson found Pharoh Cooper on the left sideline where the wideout spun back inside and dove to the end zone as the Gamecocks regained the lead at 31-24 with 1:48 left in the third quarter.

Carolina extended the lead to 14 early in the fourth quarter as the offense put together an eight-play drive that Davis capped off with a 26-yard run up the middle. Kentucky wouldn't go away though as a 41-yard return on the ensuing kickoff from Demarco Robinson put the Wildcats in South Carolina territory. Seven plays later, Kemp scored his second touchdown of the night on a one-yard run.

After a Carolina punt, the Wildcats came back down the field with Kemp doing the bulk of the work. The running back equalized the game at 38-38 with 2:46 on the clock with a five-yard run.

On the second play of the Gamecocks' ensuing possession, Thompson's pass was batted up in the air and Dupree came up with the interception and returned it six yards for a touchdown to give Wildcats a 45-38 lead with 2:23 remaining. Ashely Lowery sealed Kentucky's win with an interception in the game's final minute.

COLUMBIA, S.C.— South Carolina's ground attack produced 267 yards and three touchdowns on the day as the Gamecocks defeated Furman 41-10 on Homecoming this afternoon at Williams-Brice Stadium.

Redshirt senior quarterback Dylan Thompson opened up the game by going four-of-five on Carolina's opening drive, culminating in a 15-yard fade route to junior wide receiver Shaq Roland in the back of the end zone. It didn't take Furman long to respond, as Hank McCloud, on the Paladins' fourth play of their drive, found an opening on the right side and took the ball 60 yards down the sideline to the end zone to equalize the game.

Starting on their own 25-yard line on their next possession, Thompson led the Gamecocks back down the field before an 11-yard rush from junior tailback Shon Carson and a five-yard touchdown run from junior running back Mike Davis finished off the drive to give South Carolina a 14-7 lead with 5:29 left in the first quarter.

After the teams traded fumbles, the Gamecocks began their next drive with a 25-yard rush to the left side from Davis. The tailback accounted for 19 more yards before Thompson lofted a pass down field to junior Jerrell Adams, which the tight end took into the end zone for a career-long 45-yard reception, his first touchdown of the season.

With 3:22 left in the second quarter, sophomore linebacker Skai Moore came up with a fumble recovery at the Furman 28-yard line. A two-yard run by Davis was followed by the tailback catching a 24-yard pass that moved the ball down to the Paladins' two-yard line. Davis punched it in for his second score of the game to extend Carolina's lead to 28-7 with 2:32 left in the half.

A fumble on the Gamecocks' opening possession of the second half was turned into three points for the Paladins as Hunter Townes converted on a 29-yard field goal to cut the deficit to 28-10 just over five minutes into the half. Eight plays and 84 yards later, including a 56-yard scamper by Carson down to the one-yard line, set up his second touchdown of the season to extend South Carolina's lead to 35-10.

Two plays later, sophomore safety Chris Moody made his first-career interception and returned it 26 yards down to the Furman 36-yard line. Sophomore kicker Elliott Fry gave the Gamecocks a 38-10 advantage with a 27-yard field goal with 5:17 remaining in the quarter. Fry pushed the lead to 31 on Carolina's next possession with a 23-yard field goal as redshirt freshman tailback David Williams accounted for 51 yards on four carries on the nine-play, 62-yard drive.

AUBURN, ALA.— South Carolina went into Jordan-Hare Stadium and pushed No. 5 Auburn to the brink in a shootout, before falling 42-35, as Dylan Thompson tied a school record with five touchdown passes and threw for 402 yards.

The Gamecocks got off to a quick start after electing to receive to start the game. On their second play, Mike Davis busted a 24-yard run to get the ball out to midfield. Three plays later, Thompson hit Pharoh Cooper for a 12-yard gain. After a one-yard run from Davis, Thompson hooked up with Shaq Roland for a 32-yard touchdown along the right pylon.

South Carolina was able to force a punt from Auburn, and subsequently marched right down the field again with 32 yards on two receptions from Cooper and a 28-yard run from Davis. Facing a second-and-11 at the Tigers' 12-yard line, Thompson was intercepted by Tiger Cassanova McKinzy. Auburn took advantage of the Gamecock turnover and put together an 11-play, 92-yard drive that Brandon Fulse capped off with a three-yard touchdown reception to equalize the game late in the first quarter.

The Gamecocks answered back with a 10-play drive that ended with Thompson connecting with a Cooper for the third time on the possession, this time for a 16-yard touchdown. After an illegal block on the return, Auburn opened its drive inside its own 10-yard line for the second-straight possession, but the Tigers were able to move the ball 93 yards on 10 plays, eight via its ground game, including a two-yard touchdown run from Cameron Artis-Payne.

With the game tied at 14 midway through the second quarter, South Carolina was forced to punt, but after a 28-yard return by Auburn's Quan Bray, the Tiger had the ball knocked loose and Chris Moody jumped on the ball for the Gamecocks. Facing a third-and-10, a facemask penalty on Auburn kept the Gamecocks' drive alive. On the ensuing drive, Davis scored on a 27-yard run. The Tigers though responded two-and-half minutes later as quarterback Nick Marshall found a seam and ran for a 37-yard touchdown to tie the game at 21-21 just minutes before the end of the second quarter.

Coming out of the half, Auburn grinded out a 13-play drive with 11 plays coming on the ground. Marshall's four-yard run gave the Tigers their first lead of the game at 28-21. The back-and-forth affair continued as Carolina, on a second-and-four from midfield, saw Thompson connect with Cooper across the middle and the receiver was able to outrun the Auburn secondary for a 51-yard touchdown.

Just 11 seconds later though, Auburn's Ricardo Louis gave the Tigers the lead back with a 75-yard touchdown return on the kickoff. Trailing midway through the third, and unable to stop the Tigers' offense, the Gamecocks went for it on a fourth-and-six from their own 45-yard line. Thompson found Cooper for a nine-yard gain to extend the drive. Davis followed that up with a 23-yard run, and three plays later Thompson found redshirt senior wide receiver Nick Jones for a 10-yard score to even the game at 35-35 with 2:20 left in the third quarter.

The Gamecocks continued to gamble as they attempted an onside kick, which Skai Moore recovered to give the offense a chance to regain the lead. Carolina moved the ball into the red zone, but Thompson was intercepted for the second time on the night.

As they did in the first half, the Tigers capitalized on the turnover. After moving the ball 71 yards on five plays, Marshall ran for a nine-yard touchdown, his third rushing score on the night, to take a 42-35 lead with 11:22 remaining in the fourth quarter. Carolina was able to get back into the red zone on the ensuing possession, having extended the drive twice on fourth down, but Thompson was unable to connect with Roland on a fourth-and-14 from Auburn's 19-yard line.

The Gamecock defense was able to stop the Auburn offense on the ensuing possession to give its offense a chance with 1:08 left in the game. Thompson and the offense was able to convert on two third downs on the drive, but Jonathan Jones came up with his second interception of the night on a 41-yard pass attempt as time expired.

COLUMBIA, S.C.— Despite a career night from sophomore wide receiver Pharoh Cooper, South Carolina fell to Tennessee, 45-42, at Williams-Brice Stadium on Saturday night.

Cooper caught a career-high 11 passes for a school-record 233 yards and two touchdowns, passed for one score and rushed for another, and also recovered an onside kick, but it wasn't enough.

The Gamecocks opened the scoring when Cooper took a direct snap 11-yards for a touchdown.

The Vols tried to respond, but were stopped on a fourth-and-goal from the 1. However, two plays later though, Dylan Thompson was intercepted by Justin Coleman, setting up the game-tying score.

Tennessee put together an 11-play, 80-yard drive to take a 14-7 lead after a seven-yard rush from quarterback Joshua Dobbs, his first of three touchdown runs on the night. On the ensuing drive, Cooper accounted for 67 yards on three plays, ending the possession with a 30-yard touchdown pass down the right sideline to Brandon Wilds to even the game at 14-14.

Dobbs responded with a 36-yard touchdown run with seven seconds left before intermission, giving the Vols another seven-point advantage.

The Gamecocks scored 14 unanswered points in the third quarter, first on a Brandon Wilds' five-yard run, then on a 12-yard strike from Thompson Cooper, putting Carolina on top, 28-21, heading into the final stanza.

The Carolina defense forced a Tennessee three-and-out on its next possession. Three plays later, Thompson threw a rope to Cooper over the middle. The receiver took it 85 yards to the end zone, his longest reception of the season, and his second receiving touchdown in less than two minutes to extend the Gamecocks' lead to 35-21 with 13:22 remaining in the game.

With Tennessee driving on the following possession, senior defensive back Brison Williams shut down the drive by intercepting Dobbs at the Carolina 22-yard line. A three-and-out led to a Gamecock punt, allowing the Vols to start their drive in South Carolina territory. On a fourth-and-six from the 21-yard line, Dobbs connected with Jalen Hurd for a touchdown to bring Tennessee within seven.

Back-to-back negative yardage plays to start the following possession had the Gamecocks looking at a third-and-18. Thompson though found open space on the left side and rushed for 20 yards. On the ensuing play, Wilds broke free down the left sideline for a 70-yard touchdown run, the longest of his career to put the Gamecocks back up 14 at 42-28 with just under five minutes remaining. Tennessee responded again with a 10-play, 78-yard drive that Dobbs capped off with a three-yard run to narrow the margin to seven.

After a failed onside kick, the Vols held the Gamecocks to a three-and-out and proceeded to put together a nine-play, 85-yard drive as Dobbs found Jason Croom over the middle of the end zone for a nine-yard touchdown to tie the game at 42-42 with 11 seconds remaining in regulation.

Medley converted on a 32-yard field goal to put the Vols ahead, 45-42 in overtime. Tennessee sent heavy pressure on the Gamecocks' possession, leading to back-to-back sacks and a hurry on Thompson. On fourth-and-25, Fry missed a 58-yard field goal attempt to end the game.

GAINESVILLE, Fla. – After enduring so many heartaches for the season, it would be South Carolina (5-5, 3-5 SEC) that would play the role of spoiler Saturday afternoon, beating the Florida Gators (5-4, 4-4 SEC) 23-20 in overtime. Dylan Thompson would keep it on a read option from four yards out to shock The Swamp and send the Gamecocks home a winner.

With under three minutes to play in the game, South Carolina was faced with a 4th-and-10 at the Florida 41. A bad snap forced a hurried throw and an incomplection to give the home side the ball with 2:32 to play. After three run plays to take the clock all the way down to 46 seconds, the Gators would punt from its own 43.

Junior Carlton Heard would barrel in untouched on the punt attempt, snuffing it out and putting the offense on the Florida 34 yard line. It was the first blocked punt for the program since Devin Taylor at N.C. State in September of 2009.

A pass out to the left sideline to Mike Davis would get a quick 27 yards right off the bat, as the team would have to move fast with 46 seconds to play and no timeouts. Four plays later after the pitch and catch, Davis would fall on a fumbled option pitch in the end zone for a touchdown and a 17-17 game. The Gators would kneel on the ensuing possession to take it to overtime.

In the extra frame, Florida opened with a five-play drive leading to 35-yard field goal to put the pressure on the Carolina offense. Mike Davis would tote it four plays in a row, converting a 3rd-and-3 to the Florida 14 to keep the drive rolling. Two plays later, facing third down at the four-yard line, Thompson ran untouched to the left for the instant win.

Overtime would have never happened had it not been for another clutch play from the Gamecock special teams earlier on in the fourth quarter. With the home side ahead 17-10 and 3:40 left to play, Francisco Velez lined up to attempt a field goal from the 32 to make it a two-possession game. It would be knocked back by Gerald Dixon Jr. to keep it just a seven-point lead.

It appeared to be an all-too-familiar theme for South Carolina early on, as it would dominate the first quarter but would allow the Gators to storm back as the game wore on. Thompson orchestrated an eight play, 85-yard drive in the opening possession of the game, capitalized by a 20-yard touchdown run from Brandon Wilds. Elliott Fry added a 32-yard field goal in the team's next possession to put the them up 10-0, and Carolina would ultimately hold the ball for 11:30 of the opening quarter.

The Gators would use a potent run game to score the next 17 points and force the miraculous comeback from the Gamecocks. Quarterback Treon Harris ran 20 times for 122 yards, and the home side would total 219 yards rushing to just 60 passing on the day.

The Gamecocks would total 299 yards of offense on 80 plays while limiting Florida to 278 on 60, respectively. It is the first road win for the team since Vanderbilt on Sept. 20 and the first win at Ben Hill Griffin Stadium since 2010.

COLUMBIA, S.C.— A stout defensive performance from South Carolina (6-5) would more than make up for its five turnovers, as it held South Alabama (6-5) to just 289 yards of offense and forced five turnovers of its own in a 37-12 win Saturday afternoon.

After the teams traded field goals on the opening drives of the game, the Gamecocks went ahead 10-3 on a 29-yard touchdown pass from senior Dylan Thompson to his classmate, Nick Jones, who would personally finish the first quarter with three catches for 53 yards. Thompson moved into fifth all-time in passing yards for a season on the touchdown to Jones.

The Gamecocks were driving deep into South Alabama territory hoping to extend its lead early in the quarter, but Mike Davis was stripped at the end of an eight-yard rush to give up possession. It would not last long, as its second play from scrimmage would be an interception taken to the house by Brison Williams. The swing pass out to the left-side flat was sniffed out by the senior safety, who ran up from deep coverage, snagged the pass in stride and went 21 yards for the touchdown, his second pick-six of the year for a 17-6 advantage.

Williams would strike again on the Jags' next possession, making a leaping catch at the Carolina 11-yard line to stop a potential scoring drive and record his fourth interception of the season. The Gamecocks would drive near midfield before a mistimed pass from Thompson would be returned by South Alabama to just outside the red zone.

Two plays after giving it up, possession would pinball back to the Gamecocks after Skai Moore stepped in front of a pass at the six-yard line. The celebrations were just starting to die down before the quarter's sixth and final turnover would happen, with Davis fumbling a 13-yard pass from Thompson. That set the Jaguars up for a field goal to close out the half with the Gamecocks up 17-9.

USA had almost 21 minutes of possession in the first half. It was able to soak up the clock thanks to a 5-of-8 success rate on third-down conversions.

While the turnovers would never go away for either side in the second half, the Carolina defense tightened up, allowing just 82 yards in the final 30 minutes and 2.5 yards per play. It also forced four punts and a trio of three-and-outs.

A pair of Elliot Fry field goals was all the scoring that would come in the third quarter for either team, as he hit a career-long 47-yard attempt and a 24 yarder. His second make came after Mason Harris forced a fumble on a sack in Jaguar territory, leading to a 23-9 lead going to the fourth.

The Gamecocks pulled a special trick out of its sleeve to put the game out of reach early on in the fourth. Starting on its own four-yard line, Carolina embarked on a season-long 96-yard drive that ended with a seven-yard pass from Pharoh Cooper to Thompson. Cooper returned the favor to his quarterback just two plays after he took a post route 73 yards to the South Alabama 13 yard line.

In the very next drive, Moore made his second interception of the game and returned it 42 yards to get the home side back in the red zone. One play later, David Williams scampered the final 14 yards for the score and a 37-9 advantage. Of Carolina's four interceptions, three came as the Jaguars were driving into the home half of the field.

Thompson finished his final home game on a high note, exiting to a raucous applause from the home crowd in the team's final drive. Along with his first career touchdown catch, the Boiling Springs native passed for 237 yards.

The offense was able to even out the early advantage in time of possession that South Alabama built by running the ball 37 times for 210 yards with seven different players. Brandon Wilds led the team with 77 yards rushing and Williams went 12 times for 65 yards. In another game flashing his versatility, Cooper finished with 95 yards receiving, 42 yards running and the touchdown pass.

CLEMSON, S.C. – The Gamecocks saw their five-game winning streak over Clemson snapped Saturday afternoon, losing 35-17. The Tigers were able to control the line of scrimmage on offense and defense to claim a sizable 487-309 advantage in total yardage, including 221 yards on the ground.

The #23/24 Tigers came up empty on a field goal attempt in its opening drive of the game and South Carolina drove 70 yards to open the game's scoring. Dylan Thompson went 3-for-3 passing for 43 yards on the drive, including a 24-yard strike to Rory Anderson. Pharoh Cooper capped the drive off with a 20-yard touchdown run off a direct snap for a 7-0 lead.

Clemson (9-3) would answer by scoring the next 21 points in the game, broken only by an Elliott Fry field goal just before the end of the first half made it 21-10 for the home side. The 47-yard make tied his previous career high and was set up by a Skai Moore interception. In the opening half, the Gamecocks (6-6) were outgained 307-118 in total yards and allowed over eight yards per play to the Tigers.

Down 28-10 and stuck at their own 12 with ten minutes still to play, the Gamecocks were finally able to break off a big play and rewrite some history in the process. On third and seven, Thompson broke containment and lofted a pass to David Williams along the sideline. He would take it 59 yards down to the Clemson 26, also giving his quarterback the new single-season passing yardage record as well. The senior Thompson passed Todd Ellis' 1987 record of 3,206 and moved up to eighth on the career passing yardage list with 5,107 and a possible bowl game yet to play.

The drive nearly stalled, but Damiere Byrd hauled in a high throw in the back of the end zone on third and goal to draw South Carolina to 28-17. With the touchdown pass, Thompson drew even with his former teammate Connor Shaw for the second-most touchdown passes in a single season. The Tigers would answer back with another touchdown on a five-minute drive that ended with 2:35 to play that put any comeback hope to rest.

Thompson finished the game with 21 completions for 249 yards. The Gamecock run game was grounded by the nation's top defense and was held to just 51 total yards. Along with snapping the win streak it had enjoyed over Clemson, the loss ends an 18-game winning streak against non-conference opponents for Carolina.

SHREVEPORT, LA.— It would come down to the very last minute of the game, but the South Carolina Gamecocks (7-6) secured their 11th-straight season with a record of .500 or better thanks to a 24-21 win over Miami (6-7) in the Duck Commander Independence Bowl.

A bend-but-don't-break defense helped carry the Gamecocks through the early portion of the game while the offense was still finding its footing. Despite a pair of Miami drives that went deep into Carolina territory, the Hurricanes could only muster a pair of field goals after being stopped inside the ten yard line both times.

It took a big play halfway through the second quarter to shake the offense from its slow start. On second down at its own 22, Dylan Thompson hit a wide-open Pharoh Cooper on a post route down the middle for the 78-yard touchdown to move the Gamecocks ahead 7-6 with just under eight minutes to play in the first half. The yardage in just that one play matched the offense's total gains for the entire game up until that point, and tied for the longest pass play in the bowl's history.

The score broke the seal on the offense, which scored on the very next drive after the defense forced a three-and-out from Miami. Starting near midfield, Thompson spearheaded the scoring drive with a trio of difficult throws. After hooking up with Cooper for a 13-yard first down, he followed it up with a 35-yard strike to Damiere Byrd to get to the Hurricane five-yard line.

A penalty pushed the Gamecocks back to the 15-yard line before Thompson rolled to his left and threw across his body to Mike Davis in the back of the end zone for a 14-6 lead.

On the very next drive, a pass from Miami's Brad Kaaya was tipped up in the air and intercepted by Jonathan Walton. The turnover would set up a 32-yard field goal from Elliott Fry and cap the team's scoring for the half, a 17-6 lead.

After struggling to stop Miami's nationally renowned rushing offense in the first quarter, the Gamecocks defense learned quickly and held the opposition to just 44 yards in the second quarter after allowing 160 in just the first two drives of the game.

The third quarter was largely controlled by Miami, who drew within a field goal of tying the game after an 11-play, 93-yard drive for a touchdown and a two-point conversion. The offensive momentum for Carolina would not carry over the break, as its first four drives of the second half would go for just 71 yards on 25 plays.

The Gamecocks continued to be stymied offensively early on in the fourth quarter, before another game-changing moment would provide the difference.

Carolina would punt the ball with seven minutes left in the game, still ahead 17-14. On the drive's second play, Miami's Duke Johnson rushed to the right and was swarmed immediately. Gerald Dixon would emerge from the pile with the ball, but the game officials ruled that he was already down before the ball came out. After it was reviewed, however, it was decided that it was a fumble.

On the ensuing possession, Thompson and Cooper would combine yet again for a big play, as the sophomore wide receiver went over the back of his defender on the under-thrown ball and hauled in the 25-yard strike to set up first-and-goal at the two yard line. On the very next play, Thompson would sell the read option fake and keep it for the touchdown, strikingly similar to his game-winner against Florida.

Miami drove 72 yards in under two minutes for a touchdown to make it 24-21.

With 2:16 still to play and needing to run out the clock, the Gamecocks turned to Davis to seal the win. He converted a third-and-one that would be the clincher, as it forced the Hurricanes to use their final two timeouts.

In his final game in the Garnet and Black, Thompson would finish with 284 yards through the air and a pair of touchdowns to go with his rushing score.

Cooper would bring in nine catches for 170 yards and earned offensive MVP honors for his efforts. Skai Moore earned defensive MVP honors.
