



# GAMECOCK VOLLEYBALL 2008 PREVIEW

# **GENERAL OUTLOOK**

In 2007, the South Carolina volleyball program underwent a change, as Ben Somera took over the reigns as head coach and brought in a plethora of new faces to help bring the Gamecocks back into the top half of the Southeastern Conference.

It was mostly a transition year and a learning experience for a roster comprised in half by true freshmen. Somera explains it this way.

"A coach always has more confidence when he has a ton of returning players," said Somera. "They know your expectations and your system. It becomes about just getting better and better each week. When you are a freshman, there are just so many new things. Not just how we play, but how we travel. It's not like they get to acclimate when they get to school. They are starting their sport before they start their school. So that is a pretty difficult transition from high school."

The transition took the team some time. After falling to 9-11, the squad fought back with its second league road win at Auburn and then proceeded to split weekends until the last two, getting swept on the road by NCAA Tournament participant Kentucky and 2005 NCAA Volleyball National Semifinalist Tennessee. After the dream of a .500 record slipped by, the young team bounced back to finish strong, winning its final two home matches, including an upset over NCAA Tourney-bound Alabama on the final day of the season.

Fast forward a year, and the 10th volleyball coach of the Carolina Gamecocks has an experienced group back while adding in a handful of new players to keep the gym environment competitive. No one person is completely secure in their job from last season, as players will be working to earn jobs at every spot in 2008. The first goal would be to end a five-year stretch of losing seasons. The last time the squad finished

above .500 in 2002, they went to the NCAA Tournament, the obvious goal of every team in the nation. Coach Somera has other objectives in mind as well.

"I think we need to always be ready to play. We want to have good preparation the week before then come out and play our style of play and not let other teams dictate the tempo of our matches. Within the conference, we are becoming known as a team that plays very hard and with a lot of spirit. We always set some outcome goals, but I want us to be focused on the process of getting to those goals. It's great to say you want to get to the NCAA Tournament, but how do you get there? Those are the goals that really matter. We want to play some better defense, play with the right intensity and understand our system. Those are things we have to do to get to those outcome goals."

The team goes from no seniors to three this season, and all three will have the chance to play quality roles on the floor for this group. But they will also be leaned upon to provide leadership and guidance once again after growing in those roles in 2007.

And the schedule grew a little tougher for 2008, especially at the start. The squad travels to Tempe, Ariz., for the ASU Sheraton

Classic, facing off against two NCAA Tournament teams in Dayton and UNLV and an ever-dangerous host in the Pac-10's Sun Devils. The team also plays in the Ram Classic Invitational at the University of Rhode Island before coming home to host the Carolina Challenge, which will have four of the top teams in the state of South Carolina battling for bragging rights over Sept. 12-13. Two of those teams made the NCAA field a year ago, including Clemson and the College of Charleston. The meeting against the Tigers will be the 54th renewal of the rivalry that had no matches last season after playing every year since 1977.

From there, the Gamecocks enter SEC play, as the league continues the double round-robin schedule started in 2006. That means Carolina will play home-and-home with the 10 other league teams, including the five that made last year's national championship field. Last season, five SEC teams finished with records above .500 in league play, and the NCAA Tournament Selection Committee chose all five for the field of 64.

The only position to lose a starter from a year ago, the outside hitters still return with a lot of depth that saw extensive playing time in 2007. The four returners drew 69 starts in 2007, and two juniors should get a lot of the playing time. Two sophomores could share time at the final spot.


The group is led by junior Ivana Kujundzic, who started all 29 matches on the post last year after working as a middle blocker as a freshman. The Subotica, Serbia, native was the Gamecocks' top hitter last season, averaging 3.32 kills per game while taking over 250 swings more than the second-highest. Kujundzic also was very good on defense, digging 2.37 balls a game. With another offseason to gain experience on

the outside, Kujundzic could really blossom in 2008.

"With Ivana, we had no idea going into the season how effective she would be," said Somera. "But she just really took to it. Luckily for us, Ivana just likes to get the ball a lot, so she got the ball a lot more often. I think that is a role she enjoys."

Another junior returning is Meredith Moorhead. Atrue right side hitter, Moorhead ranked fourth on the squad with 2.31 kills per game. She hit .258 on the campaign, the highest among this group. Moorhead missed some time last season with an ankle injury that flared up at times during summer workouts, but the Charlotte, N.C., product should be able to work through that and contribute once again.

The other returning starter in this group is sophomore Hannah Lawing. She made strides in the offseason to becoming a more complete player, as her defensive prowess kept her on the court. Carolina's top non-libero defender, Lawing averaged 2.93 digs per game and really helped the Garnet's passing. Lawing worked hard during the spring and should once again find her way into the starting mix.


"It's always nice having a player like Hannah back there is such a good passer that such good defensive instincts. She always has good ball control."

The Gamecocks' top player in the spring, however, was sophomore Annie Thomas. After missing the majority of her freshman year with a shoulder injury, Thomas played great in the spring season and could work her way into a good amount of playing time on the outside. During her limited time last season, she averaged 2.00 kills per game. That figure could jump depending on how much playing time she sees.

"Annie had a little bit of playing time last year," Somera commented, "but the shoulder injury just wasn't going to allow her to play the full season. She looked great in the spring and was probably one of our most efficient players. I really look forward to having her back as one of the most viable hitters on the outside for us.

Two freshmen also contribute some depth on the outside. Olivia Ryder was one of the *Detroit Free-Press'* "Five Players to Watch" last year before a knee injury ended her high school career prematurely. Coming off of surgery, the staff hopes to ease Ryder into action, possibly even utilizing a redshirt this year if possible. Lindsey Roy is a walk-on from Cincinnati and will try to fight her way into the rotation this year. The Gamecocks could also move Megan Laughlin or Tory Anderson to the outside if pressed to by other developments.

Last season, the middle blockers blossomed into vital parts of the squad, as Laughlin and Belita Salters became quite the one-two punch. The duo started all 29 matches and played in every game during 2007. This year, Somera and his staff have made this position even deeper, which could bring more versatility to this group.

Leading the way will still be the senior Salters. One of the top blockers in the league last season, the Scranton, S.C., native is back to try to etch her name into the Carolina record books. She stands just outside the career top-10 list in blocks assists and total blocks, while she currently stands eight in block solos and ninth in hitting percentage. Salters led the way with her .330 hitting percentage and 1.21 blocks per game in 2007. Comparable numbers could push her

higher onto both charts and help propel the Gamecocks to new heights.

"She is an amazing athlete," Somera said about Salters, "and was recruited by the track program here. She is quick, springy and a very dominant player at the net for us."

Not to be outdone, Laughlin finished right behind Salters in kills per game with 2.71, while she also stood second in blocks and hitting percentage to Salters' lead. Laughlin, however, had an impact with her serves, ranking sixth in the SEC with her 0.40 aces per game. The Cornell, III., product earned a spot on the SEC All-Freshman Team last year, the second Gamecock in history to pick up the honor. With a year of experience behind her, Laughlin looks to continue her growth into one of the top middle blockers in the league.

"Megan Laughlin hit over .280 for us last year," spoke Somera. "She was just a solid player for us as a freshman. We expect her to come in and have similar stats and take on a bigger role in other areas."

But the incumbents cannot rest on their laurels, as Somera has added two high-quality athletes to their ranks. Anderson comes to Carolina by way of Florida Gulf Coast, where she redshirted during her freshman season for the top team in the Atlantic Sun Conference. Now the 6-0 Anderson comes north to compete for a spot in the Gamecocks' rotation. She will also have to fight off freshman Teresa Stenlund, who was named the *Orange County (Calif.) Register's* Player of the Year during her final year at Beckman High School. Stenlund's 6-2 frame could become a big part of a block for the Gamecocks and possibly push Laughlin and Anderson to the outside.

The 2007 team played in the 6-2 system most of the year, giving Somera the chance to use both senior Petra Lorenzi and sophomore Jordan Bradosky as the offensive "quarterback." Both return for this season, but they will be pushed by the addition of two-time second-team All-BIG EAST setter Bridget Denson-Dorman.

Lorenzi has seen time in each of the past three seasons, primarily as a back-row setter. She could once again fill that role, after averaging 6.10 assists per game last season. Lorenzi had a good spring season until she sustained a shoulder injury, but she should be ready to go at the start of the season.

Bradosky started one less match than her senior counterpart in 2007, but she led the way with a 6.38 assist-per-game average while also making 2.23 digs per game, third-best among non-defensive specialists. Bradosky also was dangerous with her serves, ranking second on the team with 29 aces on the season. She had a strong spring and hopes to keep a spot in the rotation.

"Jordan had a very good freshman season," said Somera. "She was a good server and setter for us. She didn't play a whole lot of front row (last year), and that's just what we need her to do."

Battling the two incumbents will be Denson-Dorman. The Golden Valley, Minn., native led the Huskies with 12.59 assists per game in her two season and could add a lot to Carolina's rotation. While not an outstanding blocker, she has been a strong defender (2.70 digs per game) and server (0.36 aces per game) in a very competitive conference. Denson-Dorman may also bring a little more offensive threat if used on the front row, as she has averaged 0.73 kills per game for her career.

"Bridget has been a good setter from day one in college," Somera said. "She is going to be competing for some time. Bridget gives us an opportunity to run a different system, because she's a little bit bigger than the setters we have. I think she'll be a great addition to our team."

Senior Dinelia Concepcion and junior Sarah Cline combined to play every game at libero in 2007 and could once again share some time in the wrong-colored jersey this season. The duo played well during different periods of the year, and the staff hopes both step up and play at a high level consistently throughout the season.

Concepcion ranked second on the squad with a 3.34 digs-per-game average last season, while she was stronger during the early part of the season. The senior needs around 200 digs to find her way into Carolina's top-10 all-time in the category.

A year younger, Cline drew a majority of the libero starts toward the end of the year. She finished ninth in the SEC with a 3.76 digs-per-game average and set a new school record with 36 digs in the five-game victory over Arkansas. Cline worked extra with the staff last season to improve, and it showed during the end of the season, as she

helped the squad to three wins in their final five matches, including two over NCAA Tournament teams.

Lawing could push the duo for time in the backcourt if she is unable to land a spot in the rotation.

"Sarah did a great job at the end of the year for us," commented Somera. "Dinelia did great job at the beginning of the year. Libero was really our deepest position. Both of those players played a pretty high level, and I think we got good play out of both of them because there was so much competition in the gym every week. The good thing for us is that we have a competitive situation at every position now, and, as a coach, that is what you want to see."
