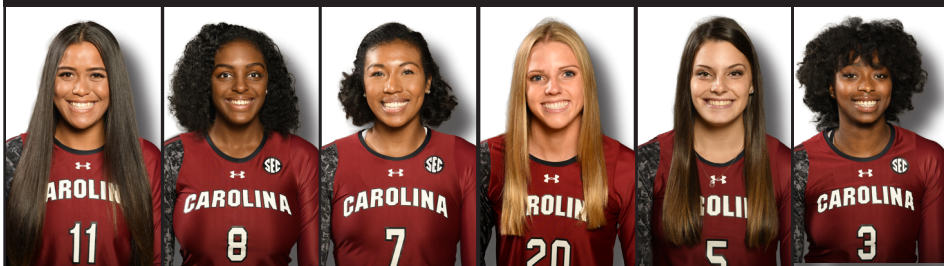

NOTEWORTHY

SCOUTING GEORGIA

The Bulldogs have already won seven more matches than they did in 2015, but are still in the hunt for a win in conference play after the first two weekends of action. Last weekend, they lost at home to Alabama (3-1) and Auburn (3-1). On offense, Georgia has five players over 100 kills for the season, led by pin Maddie Lobenstein (169 kills, 3.07 per set). Through the middle, the Dawgs have Majesti Bass and Desiree McCray, and the two combine to average 2.14 blocks and 3.90 kills per set. Shoring up the back line of the defense is libero Cassidy Anderson, who pops up an average of 4.05 digs per set and also leads the team with 25 aces on serve so far in 2016 (0.42 per set).

SCOUTING FLORIDA

Florida enters the week ranked 11th in the AVCA Top 25, and comes into Sunday's match with a full week to prepare for Carolina. The Gators boast the nation's top offense, hitting .336 as a team, and are averaging over 14 kills per set. Leading the offense are pins Carli Snyder (3.80 kills per set) and Alex Holston (3.74), with middle Rhamat Alhassan also averaging over three kills per set (3.05) while hitting .412. Alhassan is also a formidable blocker who is averaging 1.4 per set. Joining her in the middle this season is Rachael Kramer, a 6-foot, 8-inch freshman who is putting up 1.22 blocks per set and a .529 hitting percentage. The Gators are 3-1 in conference play, with wins over Ole Miss, Alabama and Tennessee, but suffered a rare 3-0 sweep at home against Kentucky for their lone loss.

WEEK TWO (TENNESSEE/KENTUCKY) NOTABLES

- The Gamecocks have now won two straight matches in the series vs. Tennessee, dating back to last November. The last time Carolina won two or more matches in a row was a span of two matches between the 2006 and 2007 seasons. Three of the last four meetings between the two programs have gone five sets.
- South Carolina is now 3-0 in five-set matches this season after beating Tennessee Wednesday night. The last time the team started the season with a better streak in five-setters was 2012, when the team won all four matches that went the distance.
- Dessaa Legros' 19 kills against Kentucky tied for the most by any Gamecock so far this season.
- Freshman Alicia Starr finished the Kentucky match with 11 blocks (two solo, nine assists), tied for the second-most in a four-set match by a Gamecock in the rally-scoring era (2001-present). She joins Darian Dozier as the only two Gamecocks with 11 total blocks over four sets in the last decade.
- Courtney Koehler passed out a season-best 25 assists to go with nine digs and an ace against Kentucky.
- Kentucky has now taken the last eight matches in the all-time series. South Carolina's win in the second set was the team's third set taken overall during the losing streak.

QUOTABLE: HEAD COACH SCOTT SWANSON

On the team's performance vs. Kentucky

"I thought we battled, I thought we did block extremely well, played pretty good defense... that's just such a good, physical team (Kentucky), they have so many weapons. I think that we hopefully earned some respect and people can see we're a better volleyball team this year, I think we just have to learn some lessons from that so we can move forward and continue to get better on what we weren't good at today."

A STAR(R) IS BORN

Freshman Alicia Starr was a standout pin hitter from Missouri, but with the team lacking middle blockers, the Gamecock coaches moved her inside and she has caught on quick. In the six matches since becoming a starter on Sept. 16, Starr is averaging 1.59 kills and 1.50 blocks per set and is hitting .457. She has already made her mark on the program record books as well, as her four solo blocks vs. Davidson are the second-most in the program's rally-scoring era (2001-) and her 11 blocks vs. Kentucky are tied for the second-most in a four set match since 2001.

NOTEWORTHY

NEW OFFENSE PAYING DIVIDENDS

The Gamecocks have struck gold two years in a row with freshmen setters, and the new flexibility has allowed the coaching staff to introduce a new 6-2 offense this season. The system allows for a bigger block at the net and more options on the attack, and sophomore Aubrey Ezell and freshman Courtney Koehler have shined in the new look. South Carolina is hitting .281 as a team (4th-best in the SEC, 19th nationally), and Ezell (5.98 assists, 2.00 digs) and Koehler (4.52 assists, 1.44 digs) have been just as valuable as defenders as they have been as setters.

SENIOR TRIO HAPPY AND HEALTHY FOR 2016

Seniors Jacqy Angermiller, Koko Atoa-Williams and Dessaa Legros have excelled thanks in large part to finally being rid of injuries that slowed them in 2015. Angermiller missed eight matches last season due to concussions, Legros suffered an injury to her hitting wrist, and Atoa-Williams was relegated to a back row defensive specialist role due to season-long back troubles. Currently, Angermiller is hitting over 100 points better than her career average, Legros is 80 points higher than her career average and Atoa-Williams has already passed her 2015 total for blocks and is just 24 kills behind last season with 15 matches still to be played.

LOOK WHO'S BACK

- The Gamecocks return 54.4 percent (797) of their kills from last season. Senior outside hitter Dessaa Legros returns after leading the team with 349 kills in 31 matches (3.14 per set). Fellow seniors Koko Atoa-Williams and Jacqy Angermiller ranked fourth and fifth on the team in kills in 2015, respectively.
- Thanks to the return of SEC All-Freshman setter Aubrey Ezell, the Gamecocks return 1341 of the team's 1362 assists from 2015. Ezell finished with 1167 assists in 2015, second-most in the rally-scoring era (since 2001).
- With the team's top six players in digs returning, the defense will be an area of strength for the team in 2016 - 89 percent of the total digs in 2015 were from players returning for this season.
- The loss of Darian Dozier in the middle will be felt, but the Gamecocks have plenty of athleticism to fill the void. Jacqy Angermiller averaged just under a block per set last season, and pins like Abreia Epps and Dessaa Legros have shown the leaping ability needed to make a difference on the outside.

DOUBLE-DOUBLE THE TROUBLE

Despite playing in a new 6-2 offensive system that keeps her solely in the back row, sophomore Aubrey Ezell is still finding ways to keep her double-double totals rising. After leading the SEC in the category last season (with 18), Ezell has four so far this season to push her up to 15th in school history for career double-doubles. Not far behind her on the career list is Koko Atoa-Williams, who has 14 coming into her final year - three away from cracking the top 20.

'FRESH' FACES

The South Carolina volleyball program welcomed in six new players for the 2016 season. The five freshmen hail from four different states and are all expected to contribute in all areas in the first season on campus and add valuable depth:

- Claire Edwards was coached there by former Gamecocks great Cindy Robarge-Esposito and enrolled early at Carolina, in time for the Spring semester, giving her a chance to work with the coaching staff during the exhibition season.
- Courtney Koehler won the AAU National Championship with her club team over the summer, and finished her high school career with over 1500 assists.
- Savannah Murray was a PrepVolleyball Academic All-American and helped her high school team win three district titles and three conference titles.
- Mikayla Shields comes to Carolina as the 36th-ranked player in the 2015 Max Prep's Senior Aces Top 100.
- Alicia Starr ranks second in Missouri high school history for career attacks, and she averaged 6.5 kills per set as a senior.
- Joining the five freshmen will be Abreia Epps, an outside hitter who transferred from Charlotte. Epps finished 2015 with 280 kills, 45 total blocks and 40 digs.

ATHLETIC LINEAGE

The 2016 Gamecocks have an athleticism that head coach Scott Swanson and his staff are excited about. It's no surprise, once you look at the team's family history. Many of the players have siblings, parents, and other family members who have competed at the Division I level in athletics, and some have gone on to have pro sports careers:

COURTNEY FURLONG

- Mother swam at St. John's University
- Three cousins played in Division I for softball, diving and volleyball
- Uncle is Frank Viola, a MLB veteran, Cy Young winner, and three-time All-Star

COURTNEY KOEHLER

- Her brother played football at Presbyterian College
- Older sister Kerstin played volleyball at College of Charleston

DESSAA LEGROS

- Her twin sister Annayka currently plays volleyball at Coastal Carolina

EMMA LOCK

- Her uncle, Andy Lock, played football at Missouri. Currently, her cousin Drew is the Tigers' starting quarterback

MIKAYLA SHIELDS

- Her parents were track and field stars at the University of Pittsburgh.
- Her mother, Najuma, still holds the school record in the high jump, pentathlon and heptathlon. She competed professionally for Guyana and competed at the 1992 Olympics and at the 1995 IAAF World Championships
- Her father, Brett, ran on the program's fastest Sprint Medley Relay team

ALICIA STARR

- Her father, Brett, played football, basketball and track at Oregon State
- Her mother, Julie, was a gymnast for the University of Vermont
- Sister Brianna is currently a senior on the UMKC volleyball team

JESSE TURNER

- Her mother, Lesli, played volleyball at Pepperdine
- Her father, Rob, played football at Eastern Michigan
- Her uncle, Roman Fortin, played in the NFL for three different teams

STANDING ROOM ONLY

It was a special atmosphere in the Carolina Volleyball Center on Sept. 4, as a crowd of 2,041 came out for the Gamecocks' match against Clemson. Wednesday vs. Tennessee, the team drew a crowd of 1,819 (second-most in program history). Of the top 10 home crowds on record, eight have come under head coach Scott Swanson and three have come this season alone. Currently, the Gamecocks rank 36th nationally in average attendance this season (1,293), on pace to be the best in program history.

NOTEWORTHY

COMFORTABLE BEING UNCOMFORTABLE

Early season tests on the road at Georgia Southern and Wake Forest have helped the Gamecocks be, as senior Dessaa Legros put it, “comfortable being uncomfortable”. The team is 2-1 in four-set matches and 3-0 in five-set matches so far this season, highlighted by the comeback Wednesday night vs. Tennessee. Carolina trailed 2-1 in the match, but battled back to win the fourth and fifth sets despite trailing by multiple points in both of those games.

COLE NAMED TO GAMECOCKS HOF

Current South Carolina assistant head coach Shonda Cole was revealed as a member of the nine-member South Carolina Athletics Hall of Fame class of 2016. She becomes just the third woman from the program to make the Hall of Fame, joining Ashley Edlund-Heidtke (inducted in 2010) and Heather Larkin (inducted in 2012).

Cole became the first Gamecock volleyball player to earn All-America honors, and was also a three-time All-SEC honoree. Cole still holds the program’s career record for points per set, kills per set, and attacks. After an equally successful professional career, which included a stint with the national team, Cole has returned to her alma mater and is in her second season as an assistant.

ALL-TIME RECORDS

- South Carolina holds a 780-602 (.564) record as a program, dating back to its first season in 1973.
- In matches in the Carolina Volleyball Center, Carolina 181-96 (.655).
- With 87 career wins, head coach Scott Swanson ranks third in program history for wins. Versus Arkansas on Oct. 25, 2015, he broke a tie with Kathy Graham (1976-77) for third all-time. Kim Hudson (1993-2004) is the program’s wins leader, with 226.

GAMECOCKS ROLL AT GEORGIA, 3-0

ATHENS, GA. - The Gamecock volleyball team broke out of its losing streak in a big way Wednesday night sweeping Georgia 25-17, 25-22, 25-20. The win gives Carolina (8-12, 1-6 SEC) its first road and conference wins of the season, and snapped a seven-match losing streak. Dessaa Legros had one of her best nights as a Gamecock, leading the team with 15 kills and adding 16 digs.

1st Set: The Bulldogs (5-12, 0-5 SEC) took the early lead, but behind the service of Dessaa Legros the Gamecocks would make what would be the only comeback needed in the set. Along with an ace, Legros kept the opposing offense off-balance and helped the team turn a 4-3 deficit into a 7-4 lead. The junior outside hitter added two early kills to go with her tough service.

Senior middle blocker Darian Dozier would take over the reins as the offense's leader later in the set, accounting for three kills over a five-point span. Solid passing out of the back row helped Dozier and setter Aubrey Ezell run an effective quick-strike attack from the middle and she finished with five kills in the set. Much of that defense came from libero Megan Kirkland, who had seven digs in the first set alone.

Koko Atoa-Williams would be the benefactor of Dozier's work through the middle, as she would catch fire from the pins to lead the way in the home stretch. She would claim three of the team's final four kills of the set, with Carolina closing out on a 5-0 run and a 25-17 win.

2nd Set: The Bulldogs showed a tremendous block, but could not stop Legros and the Gamecocks enough in set two. The Garnet and Black led from the second point of the set on, and survived a late comeback attempt to take a 2-0 lead in the match. Legros recorded seven kills in the set, helping combat a Georgia defense that put down seven blocks in the set.

A kill from Legros put the team up 19-13 before Georgia threw its block party rally. It would record five blocks all within a 6-1 run to force a Carolina timeout in a 20-19 game. A pair of kills from Elizabeth Johnbull broke the spell and the Gamecocks were able to hold on for the 25-22 win, with another kill from Dozier to cap it off.

3rd Set: Georgia would fight hard to try and extend the match, but a confident South Carolina defense would deny them the chance. The set went into the timeout with the Gamecocks ahead 15-13 but unable to get distance on the 'Dogs. A 7-2 run brought the set to 21-15, powered by kills from three different players, and the team would cruise down the stretch to clinch the sweep.

Despite the fact that she led the team in kills for the set, with six, Legros would get defensive and helped deny Georgia's pin attackers. She totaled ten digs in the third set alone to lock up her third double-double of the season thanks to a final tally of 15 kills and 16 digs.

STAT OF THE MATCH

Despite recording just four total blocks in the match, the Gamecocks held Georgia to a .101 hitting percentage in the match. The Bulldogs entered the night ranked last in the SEC in kills, and finished with just 27 total thanks to Carolina's 71 total digs.

NOTABLE

- Aubrey Ezell finished with 49 assists and 12 digs for her 13th double-double of the season. She now ranks 12th in program history for double-doubles in a single season.
- This was the sixth time all season that the team was out-blocked by the opposition, but just the second time the team won while being out-blocked.
- A big reason for the team's overall offensive success was the efficiency of the middle attackers. The trio of Dozier, Johnbull and Angermiller combined for 20 kills in 34 attacks.
- This is the first time since 2002 that the Gamecocks won at Georgia in back-to-back meetings.
- The win is head coach Scott Swanson's 69th while at Carolina, bringing him into a tie for third-most in program history with Kathy Graham (1976-77).

SCOTT SWANSON

Head Coach || Sixth Year at South Carolina

- Third in program history for career wins
- Coached seven NCAA tournament teams (Arizona State 1999, 2000, Minnesota 2006-10)
- Part of staff that coached eight All-Americans
- Recruited three top-10 classes to Minnesota

The 11th head coach in Gamecock Volleyball history, Scott Swanson has his sights set on a successful 2016 season as he enters year six in Columbia. The Gamecocks will bring an exciting balance of veterans and talented youngsters into the season, with the aim of building off 2015's 13-18 campaign.

The Gamecocks faced a season of different adversities in 2015, coming from untimely injuries and a roster featuring six freshmen who all were asked to fill important roles. The team bonded through the rigors of the season, and picked up impressive wins over Tennessee, Ole Miss, and a season sweep of Arkansas. Swanson moved into third in program history for wins in a career after winning his 72nd game at South Carolina on Oct. 25.

Individually, freshman Aubrey Ezell finished with perhaps one of the best debut seasons ever by a Gamecock, finishing the season with the second-most assists ever in the program's rally-scoring era and a spot on the SEC All-Freshman Team.

It would not just be the freshmen who would surprise, the team also saw breakout seasons from Dessaa Legros and Sarah Blomgren. Senior Darian Dozier capped her career in style, moving up to third in program history for career blocks and entered the top ten in hitting percentage as well. Off the court, the team volunteered over 1100 for community service, the most of any team at South Carolina.

In 2014, the Gamecocks posted a 17-14 record, which included seven SEC wins, the program's most since 2008. Libero Mikaela Christiaansen set the program record for most digs in a single season with 535, while middle blocker Darian Dozier set single-season rally scoring era school records for total blocks (141) and block assists (127). The Gamecocks also turned in another strong year in the classroom, as a league-best 12 players made the SEC Fall Academic Honor Roll.

During the 2013 season, outside hitter Juliette Thévenin became just the second Gamecock in school history to earn AVCA All-America honors as she was named honorable mention All-American. Thévenin was also a first-team AVCA All-Southeast Region and All-SEC selection as she left the program ranked in the top 10 in six career categories.

Swanson guided the Gamecocks to an 18-14 record in 2012, the program's second winning season in the last decade. South Carolina got off to a program-best 13-0 start and improved its hitting percentage for a second straight season, ranking second in the SEC with a percentage of .255, an improvement of 29 points from the previous year. Outside hitter Juliette Thévenin garnered second-team All-SEC honors after she ranked second in SEC play with 4.40 kills per set and 4.81 points per set, becoming the first Gamecock since 2008 to receive an All-SEC award.

In Swanson's first season, the Gamecocks went 14-16 and improved its offensive efficiency and its backline defense under his guidance. The team led the SEC with a 16.78 digs average, the best mark in four years for the Gamecocks, and hit .226, a 45-point improvement from the 2011 season.

Swanson's teams have also proved themselves in the classroom, earning the Team Academic Award from the American Volleyball Coaches Association in 2011-12, 2012-13 and 2013-14. In his first five seasons, 49 student-athletes have earned a spot on the SEC Academic honor roll, including eight of the nine eligible players from 2015. The team also claimed the department's Life Skills Team of the Year award in 2011-12, honoring the group for its academic achievements, personal development and work in the community.

Prior to his current head coaching job, Swanson spent five years on the sidelines for the Golden Gophers, helping the team to five-consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances and a 125-46 record. Three times, Minnesota finished second in the Big Ten behind perennial power Penn State. The 2009 team advanced to the national semifinals in the NCAA Tournament.

During his tenure in Minneapolis, five Golden Gophers earned All-America accolades, including 2009 first-team middle blocker and 2012 US National Team pool member Lauren Gibbemeyer. Swanson also led the Gophers' recruiting efforts, posting three top-10 recruiting classes according to PrepVolleyball.com. The 2009 group earned top honors from the outlet.

In the summer of 2009, Swanson spent time with USA Volleyball's A-2 Junior National Team, and he coached the USA Red team to a second-place showing in the 2008 USA Adult Open Championships.

Swanson brings in four years of head coaching experience to Columbia after his tenure at the University of Texas-El Paso. With a 50-61 career record, Swanson had the team on the brink of the NCAA Tournament in 2005, when the Miners went 21-10. Three player earned all-conference honors under Swanson's tutelage, including honorable mention All-American Kari Stacy. He also inked a high school All-American and saw his team improve in the classroom to a department-best 3.2 GPA in 2005.

Prior to UTEP, Swanson spent six years at his alma mater, Arizona State. He helped the team to two NCAA Tournament appearances during his time in Tempe and coached one second-team All-American and two Pac-10 All-Freshman Team players. Two of his Sun Devil players garnered Academic All-America certificates as well.

Swanson started his coaching career at Mountain View (Ariz.) High School, working as an assistant with the varsity team and leading his junior varsity group to a 17-1 record. As a head coach with the Arizona East Valley Juniors club, he led a 16-1s team to a national runner-up finish and earned Cactus Region Coach of the Year honors. He also served as head coach at Camelback High School before landing the job with Arizona State, where he also played club volleyball.

A graduate of ASU, Swanson is married to the former Erin Meier. The couple has two daughters, Rylee Sue and Haylen Rae.
