## NOTEWORTHY

## SCOUTING WAKE FOREST

Wake Forest enters Friday morning's match against Carolina with a 1-3 record. The team went 1-2 last weekend at home in the Demon Deacon Classic tournament, beating College of Charleston 3-0 but losing to Davidson 3-1 and Loyola 3-2. Wake Forest is under a new head coach this season in Bill Ferguson, who coached the Southern Cal men's program from 2005-15. The team is young, with just one senior and seven underclassmen on the 12-woman roster. The offense is led by junior pin Kylie Long, who is averaging 4.32 kills per set so far this season. She is joined on the attack by freshman Carolina Rassenfoss, who is averaging 3.44 kills per set but is hitting just .185. The team's biggest flaw in the early part of the season has been blocking, as opponents have doubled them up to the tune of 76 blocks in just 19 sets (2.63) while the Deacs have put down just 1.32 per set.

## SCOUTING BUFFALO

The Bulls are another young team, headed up by second-year head coach Blair Brown Lipsitz, a 2011 graduate of Penn State. Buffalo welcomed in eight newcomers to the roster this season, giving the program 12 underclassmen. The strength of the team lies in its middle blockers, where Amber Hatchett and Cassie Shado provide not only veteran leadership, but talent on both the offensive and defensive sides of the net. Sophomore Valisha Watkins has been the team's top producer on offense through the first two weekends of competition, averaging 2.71 kills per set from the pin. The offense has felt growing pains with freshman setter Scout McLerran, who averages just 8.27 assists per set as the primary setter, but she has proven to be a stout server (0.45 aces per set) and confident passer (2.50 digs per set).

## SCOUTING GEORGIA SOUTHERN

The Eagles had a fruitful weekend as the hosts of the Bash in the 'Boro tournament, beating all four opponents over the two-day tournament. They had a Monday match at Winthrop, losing 3-2, moving them to 4-4 heading into this weekend's action. The team has a very balanced offense, offering five different hitters who have 30 or more kills through the first eight matches of the year. Leading the way are Katie Bange, a right side hitter/setter who posts 2.82 kills, 4.21 assists and 1.64 digs per set, and pin Cathrine Murray, who averages 2.78 kills and 2.07 digs per set.

## CAROLINA CLASSIC NOTABLES

- This was the fourth season of the Carolina Classic, which rotated around the four schools - Carolina, Clemson, Furman and Winthrop. The Gamecocks went 3-0 for the first time, after finishing with a combined record of 3-6 in the previous three years.
- The Gamecocks' win over Furman on Saturday afternoon snapped a three-game losing streak to the Paladins. Carolina is now 5-0 at home in the all-time series.
- Aubrey Ezell recorded eight aces over the two matches Saturday (vs. Furman and Winthrop), giving her nine so far this season. The team's single-game high for the season was just four coming into the weekend, but it finished with six against Furman and seven against Winthrop.
- The Sunday attendance record of 2,041 against Clemson broke the previous high of 1,807, set against Ole Miss on Sept. 26 of 2014. Of the program's top 10 attendance marks, eight have come under head coach Scott Swanson.
- Jacqy Angermiller's .625 hitting percentage in the win over Clemson set a new career high, and her 12 kills were just two off her personal best.

## QUOTABLE: HEAD COACH SCOTT SWANSON

*On the team's win over Clemson*

"I'm extremely proud, through adversity we ended up playing well under pressure. I thought we did a really good job of re-composing ourselves and making a comeback in the fourth set after being down early and often in the early part of that set. I think we showed our true character... I can't say enough about the leadership, especially of Dessaa, Koko, Megan, they're leading by example. They're doing everything the right way, and I'm so glad they're being rewarded with wins."

## NEW OFFENSE PAYING DIVIDENDS

The Gamecocks have struck gold two years in a row with freshmen setters, and the new flexibility has allowed the coaching staff to introduce a new 6-2 offense this season. The system allows for a bigger block at the net and more options on the attack, and sophomore Aubrey Ezell and freshman Courtney Koehler have shined in the new look. South Carolina is averaging a full kill per set more than 2015, and Ezell (6.11 assists, 1.95 digs) and Koehler (5.05 assists, 1.37 digs) have been just as valuable as defenders as they have been as setters.

## NOTEWORTHY

## SENIOR TRIO HAPPY AND HEALTHY TO START 2016

The fast start to the season has come in large part due to the contribution of the team's three senior starters - Jacqy Angermiller, Koko Atoa-Williams and Dessaa Legros. All three of them have excelled early thanks in large part to finally being rid of nagging injuries that slowed them in 2015. Angermiller missed eight matches last season due to concussions, Legros suffered an injury to her hitting wrist, and Atoa-Williams was relegated to a back row defensive specialist role due to season-long back troubles. Though it is still early in the season, Angermiller is currently averaging career bests in kills and blocks per set, Legros is hitting almost 150 points higher than 2015 and Atoa-Williams has seen major bumps both in kills, digs and blocks.

## BUILDING A ROOF OVER THEIR HEADS

Losing one of the best blockers in program history might have left some fans nervous about the team's net defense, but the Gamecocks have used a committee to more than make up for Darian Dozier's absence. **South Carolina leads the SEC in blocks per set** with 3.05, a mark that ranks 13th in the country through the first two weekends of the season. Starting middles Jacqy Angermiller and Claire Edwards each average over a block per set (1.12 and 1.22, respectively), and pins Mikayla Shields (0.84) and Dessaa Legros (0.67) each have three solo blocks to go along with double digit totals. Thanks in large part to their block total, opponents are hitting just .149 so far this season, third-lowest in the SEC.

## SHIELDS NAMED SEC FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

The first Southeastern Conference weekly awards were released for volleyball Monday afternoon, and outside hitter Mikayla Shields was recognized as the Freshman of the Week after earning MVP honors at the College of Charleston Invitational. She hit .403 for the weekend and finished with 33 kills and nine blocks. She finished the weekend ranked eighth in the SEC in kills per set (3.67), eighth in hitting percentage (.403) and 12th in blocks per set (1.0), making her the only freshman to be ranked in each of those three categories.

## LOOK WHO'S BACK

- The Gamecocks return 54.4 percent (797) of their kills from last season. Senior outside hitter Dessaa Legros returns after leading the team with 349 kills in 31 matches (3.14 per set). Fellow seniors Koko Atoa-Williams and Jacqy Angermiller ranked fourth and fifth on the team in kills in 2015, respectively.
- Thanks to the return of SEC All-Freshman setter Aubrey Ezell, the Gamecocks return 1341 of the team's total 1362 assists in 2015. Ezell finished her freshman season with 1167 assists, the second-most in the rally-scoring era (since 2001).
- With the team's top six players in digs returning, the defense will be an area of strength for the team in 2016 - 89 percent of the total digs in 2015 were from players returning for this season. Seniors Megan Kirkland and Joely Cabrera, and sophomore Emma Lock all saw major minutes at libero and will vie for the starting role early on this season.
- The loss of Darian Dozier in the middle will be felt, but the Gamecocks have plenty of athleticism to fill the void. Jacqy Angermiller averaged just under one block per set last season as a middle, and pins like Abreia Epps and Dessaa Legros have shown the leaping ability needed to make a difference on the outside.

## 'FRESH' FACES

The South Carolina volleyball program welcomed in six new players for the 2016 season. The five freshmen hail from four different states and are all expected to contribute in all areas in the first season on campus and add valuable depth:

- Claire Edwards is a middle blocker from right down the road from campus at River Bluff High School. She was coached there by former Gamecocks great Cindy Robarge-Esposito. Edwards was admitted to Carolina in time for the Spring semester, giving her a chance to work with the coaching staff during the exhibition season.
- Courtney Koehler is a talented setter who will join with Aubrey Ezell to give the offense a unique look. She won the AAU National Championship with her club volleyball team over the summer, after finishing her high school career with over 1500 assists.
- Savannah Murray signed with the team in February and will compete for a spot as a defensive specialist/libero. She was a PrepVolleyball Academic All-American and helped her high school team win three district titles and three conference titles.
- Mikayla Shields could make the largest impact of this class in 2016. The outside hitter swings from the left side and comes to Carolina as the 36th-ranked player in the 2015 Max Prep's Senior Aces Top 100.
- Alicia Starr will reunite with former club teammate Emma Lock here at South Carolina. She ranks second in Missouri high school history for career attacks, and she averaged 6.5 kills per set as a senior. Starr will compete for time as an outside/right side hitter.
- Joining the five freshmen will be Abreia Epps, an outside hitter who transferred from Charlotte. Epps finished 2015 with 280 kills, 45 total blocks and 40 digs as a front row player. Those numbers earned her All-Conference USA Second Team honors, and now the Columbia native will return home to help take the Gamecocks to the next level.

## ATHLETIC LINEAGE

The 2016 Gamecocks have an athleticism that head coach Scott Swanson and his staff are excited about. It's no surprise, once you look at the team's family history. Many of the players have siblings, parents, and other family members who have competed at the Division I level in athletics, and some have even gone on to have professional athletic careers:

## COURTNEY FURLONG

- Mother swam at St. John's University
- Three cousins played in Division I for softball, diving and volleyball
- Uncle is Frank Viola, a major league baseball pitcher for Minnesota, Boston, and the New York Mets

## COURTNEY KOEHLER

- Her brother played football at Presbyterian College
- Older sister Kerstin played volleyball at College of Charleston

## DESSAA LEGROS

- Her twin sister Annayka currently plays volleyball at Coastal Carolina

## EMMA LOCK

- Her uncle, Andy Lock, played football at Missouri. Currently, her cousin Drew is the Tigers' quarterback

## MIKAYLA SHIELDS

- Her parents were track and field stars at the University of Pittsburgh.
- Her mother, Najuma, still holds the school record in the high jump, pentathlon and heptathlon. She competed professionally for Guyana and competed at the 1992 Olympics and at the 1995 IAAF World Championships
- Her father, Brett, ran on the program's fastest Sprint Medley Relay team

**STANDING ROOM ONLY**

It was a special atmosphere in the Carolina Volleyball Center Sunday afternoon, as a crowd of 2,041 fans showed up for the Gamecocks' match against Clemson. The attendance total shattered the previous best of 1,807, set back in 2014. Of the top 10 home crowds on record, eight have come under head coach Scott Swanson's tenure.

**COLE NAMED TO GAMECOCKS HOF**

Current South Carolina assistant head coach Shonda Cole was revealed as a member of the nine-member South Carolina Athletics Hall of Fame class of 2016. She becomes just the third woman from the program to make the Hall of Fame, joining Ashley Edlund-Heidtke (1995-98, inducted in 2010) and Heather Larkin (1994-97, inducted in 2012).

Cole became the first Gamecock volleyball player to earn All-America honors, and was also a three-time All-SEC honoree. Cole still holds the program's career record for points per set, kills per set, and attacks. After an equally successful professional career, which included a stint with the national team, Cole has returned to her alma mater and begins her second season as an assistant.

**ALL-TIME RECORDS**

- South Carolina holds a 770-600 (.562) record as a program, dating back to its first season in 1973.
- In matches played at the Carolina Volleyball Center, South Carolina is 177-95 (.651) all time.
- With 80 career wins, head coach Scott Swanson ranks third in program history for wins. Versus Arkansas on Oct. 25, 2015, he broke a tie with Kathy Graham (1976-77) for third all-time. Kim Hudson (1993-2004) is the program's wins leader, with 226.

**COLUMBIA, S.C.** - It was a rivalry match that proved to be worth the wait, as South Carolina defeated Clemson 3-1 Sunday afternoon, making up for the Friday match postponed due to weather. A well-balanced Gamecocks offense, led by 13 kills from Koko Atoa-Williams and 12 from Jacqy Angermiller, held off a tremendous effort from Clemson's Leah Perri (26 kills).

With the win, South Carolina moves to 6-0 for the season, the program's best start since 2012, and it clinched the Carolina Classic tournament title. Dessaa Legros earned tournament MVP honors after finishing with 25 kills and seven blocks, and Atoa-Williams and Angermiller joined her on the All-Tournament team. On top of all the on-court excitement, the Gamecocks also welcomed in a crowd of 2,041 fans Sunday, a new program record.

**1st Set:** The pace of play on the court matched the level of excitement in the stands to start out the match, as the two teams battled for a foothold. Clemson held the lead early, but never could get further than three points clear of Carolina. The offense looked to freshman Mikayla Shields for consistency, and she delivered with six total kills in the frame. Her presence on the attack would later prove to be valuable in a different way, as the Tigers defense's focus on her opened up the offense to a handful of other hitters.

Clemson maintained the lead for most of the set, and were pressuring for the win with a late 22-20 advantage. The Gamecocks stoked the crowd with kills from Claire Edwards and Jacqy Angermiller to tie the set up at 23-all, then an emphatic block from Angermiller and Legros flipped the lead to South Carolina's favor for the first time since it was 3-2 and the Tigers would not recover. Atoa-Williams put a stamp on the 25-23 win with a kill to end it.

**2nd Set:** After both teams hit well over .400 in the opening frame, the second set would be a grinder. The Gamecocks would be their own worst enemy, committing 11 attack errors while Clemson had just nine kills -- its lowest of any of the four sets.

It was a promising start for Carolina, thanks to a 4-0 run off the opening whistle, but the offense met a foe it had not seen to through the first 10 sets of the weekend -- physical net defense. The Tigers out-blocked the Gamecocks 5-0 in the set, and what balls were blocked down were deflected favorably for the back-row defense for Clemson. The Gamecocks had a chance to still win despite a big rally from the opposition, holding a 22-21 lead late, but Clemson scored the final four points of the set. South Carolina hit just .091, and while Clemson would not be much better (.200), it would be enough to even the match at 1-1.

**3rd Set:** The team took the court out of the break facing its first must-win situation of the season, and it leaned on its core of seniors to get the job done. Early kills from Legros and Atoa-Williams and two blocks by Angermiller staked the team an early 12-7 lead, and Atoa-Williams' versatility helped the Gamecocks expand out their lead as the set went on. An ace from her to make it 19-12 forced Clemson into a timeout, and the Tigers would not be able to recover from the deficit. The crowd coerced a service error from Clemson to close out the third set, 25-21, and put the Gamecocks ahead 2-1.

**4th Set:** The Tigers pushed hard for a fifth set, jumping out to a quick 11-4 lead in the fourth. The Gamecocks were able to bounce back and slowly began to chip away at the lead. It wouldn't be one big run, rather small bursts of two to three points at a time, but soon enough the lead would be down to just one, 15-14, and Clemson was forced into a timeout. From that point on, the set was bitterly contested, with four ties and four lead changes over the final 10 points alone.

Jacqy Angermiller provided the most critical points of the set, from either side of the net. Trailing 22-21, she started with a kill, then followed with a solo block on the very next play to flip the score around for good. Atoa-Williams put the finishing touches on the win, with back-to-back kills to seal the 25-23 win.

#### STAT OF THE MATCH

The offensive flow played to South Carolina's advantage Saturday, as each of the starting five hitters put down six or more kills and four had nine or more. Abreia Epps added eight more off the bench, and Aubrey Ezell had three key kills as the setter.

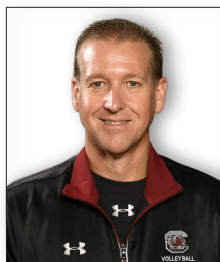

# SCOTT SWANSON

## Head Coach | Sixth Year at South Carolina

- Third in program history for career wins
- Coached seven NCAA tournament teams (Arizona State 1999, 2000, Minnesota 2006-10)
- Part of staff that coached eight All-Americans
- Recruited three top-10 classes to Minnesota

The 11th head coach in Gamecock Volleyball history, Scott Swanson has his sights set on a successful 2016 season as he enters year six in Columbia. The Gamecocks will bring an exciting balance of veterans and talented youngsters into the season, with the aim of building off 2015's 13-18 campaign.

The Gamecocks faced a season of different adversities in 2015, coming from untimely injuries and a roster featuring six freshmen who all were asked to fill important roles. The team bonded through the rigors of the season, and picked up impressive wins over Tennessee, Ole Miss, and a season sweep of Arkansas. Swanson moved into third in program history for wins in a career after winning his 72nd game at South Carolina on Oct. 25.

Individually, freshman Aubrey Ezell finished with perhaps one of the best debut seasons ever by a Gamecock, finishing the season with the second-most assists ever in the program's rally-scoring era and a spot on the SEC All-Freshman Team.

It would not just be the freshmen who would surprise, the team also saw breakout seasons from Dessaa Legros and Sarah Blomgren. Senior Darian Dozier capped her career in style, moving up to third in program history for career blocks and entered the top ten in hitting percentage as well. Off the court, the team volunteered over 1100 for community service, the most of any team at South Carolina.

In 2014, the Gamecocks posted a 17-14 record, which included seven SEC wins, the program's most since 2008. Libero Mikaela Christiaansen set the program record for most digs in a single season with 535, while middle blocker Darian Dozier set single-season rally scoring era school records for total blocks (141) and block assists (127). The Gamecocks also turned in another strong year in the classroom, as a league-best 12 players made the SEC Fall Academic Honor Roll.

During the 2013 season, outside hitter Juliette Thévenin became just the second Gamecock in school history to earn AVCA All-America honors as she was named honorable mention All-American. Thévenin was also a first-team AVCA All-Southeast Region and All-SEC selection as she left the program ranked in the top 10 in six career categories.

Swanson guided the Gamecocks to an 18-14 record in 2012, the program's second winning season in the last decade. South Carolina got off to a program-best 13-0 start and improved its hitting percentage for a second straight season, ranking second in the SEC with a percentage of .255, an improvement of 29 points from the previous year. Outside hitter Juliette Thévenin garnered second-team All-SEC honors after she ranked second in SEC play with 4.40 kills per set and 4.81 points per set, becoming the first Gamecock since 2008 to receive an All-SEC award.

In Swanson's first season, the Gamecocks went 14-16 and improved its offensive efficiency and its backline defense under his guidance. The team led the SEC with a 16.78 digs average, the best mark in four years for the Gamecocks, and hit .226, a 45-point improvement from the 2011 season.

Swanson's teams have also proved themselves in the classroom, earning the Team Academic Award from the American Volleyball Coaches Association in 2011-12, 2012-13 and 2013-14. In his first five seasons, 49 student-athletes have earned a spot on the SEC Academic honor roll, including eight of the nine eligible players from 2015. The team also claimed the department's Life Skills Team of the Year award in 2011-12, honoring the group for its academic achievements, personal development and work in the community.

Prior to his current head coaching job, Swanson spent five years on the sidelines for the Golden Gophers, helping the team to five-consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances and a 125-46 record. Three times, Minnesota finished second in the Big Ten behind perennial power Penn State. The 2009 team advanced to the national semifinals in the NCAA Tournament.

During his tenure in Minneapolis, five Golden Gophers earned All-America accolades, including 2009 first-team middle blocker and 2012 US National Team pool member Lauren Gibbemeyer. Swanson also led the Gophers' recruiting efforts, posting three top-10 recruiting classes according to PrepVolleyball.com. The 2009 group earned top honors from the outlet.

In the summer of 2009, Swanson spent time with USA Volleyball's A-2 Junior National Team, and he coached the USA Red team to a second-place showing in the 2008 USA Adult Open Championships.

Swanson brings in four years of head coaching experience to Columbia after his tenure at the University of Texas-El Paso. With a 50-61 career record, Swanson had the team on the brink of the NCAA Tournament in 2005, when the Miners went 21-10. Three players earned all-conference honors under Swanson's tutelage, including honorable mention All-American Kari Stacy. He also inked a high school All-American and saw his team improve in the classroom to a department-best 3.2 GPA in 2005.

Prior to UTEP, Swanson spent six years at his alma mater, Arizona State. He helped the team to two NCAA Tournament appearances during his time in Tempe and coached one second-team All-American and two Pac-10 All-Freshman Team players. Two of his Sun Devil players garnered Academic All-America certificates as well.

Swanson started his coaching career at Mountain View (Ariz.) High School, working as an assistant with the varsity team and leading his junior varsity group to a 17-1 record. As a head coach with the Arizona East Valley Juniors club, he led a 16-1s team to a national runner-up finish and earned Cactus Region Coach of the Year honors. He also served as head coach at Camelback High School before landing the job with Arizona State, where he also played club volleyball.

A graduate of ASU, Swanson is married to the former Erin Meier. The couple has two daughters, Rylee Sue and Haylen Rae.
