



Mark Berson, one of three coaches all-time to post 450 victories while coaching only in NCAA Division I, begins his 37th season at the helm of the South Carolina soccer program in 2014. Berson has been at South Carolina from the beginning, hired in 1978 to move the program to varsity status.

Before coming to Carolina in 1978, Berson went 11-5-0 in one season at The Citadel, making his overall record 462-205-68, a .675 winning percentage at the start of 2014. In 2006, Berson became one of five active (at that time) Division I coaches and the 10th all-time to reach the 400-victory milestone when his Gamecocks defeated UAB, 2-0, in a televised contest at Stone Stadium. Berson entered the year with a 451-200-68 record at South Carolina.

Berson has taken the Gamecocks to 20 NCAA Tournaments, with those teams advancing to at least the second round 11 times. His squads have four quarterfinal and two NCAA College Cup appearances to their credit as well. In 1993, the Gamecocks advanced to the NCAA Championship Game.

Though Carolina has been independent during the majority of the program's tenure, the Gamecocks have captured four conference titles under Berson's leadership. Carolina won the 1993 Metro Conference Championship in one of its two years competing in the conference. The Gamecocks joined Conference USA in 2005 and promptly claimed the league's tournament championship and automatic berth to the NCAA Tournament, while Carolina also won the C-USA Championship Tournament in 2010 and collected the regular season championship in 2011.

Besides making an impact in collegiate soccer, Berson's presence is also felt at higher ranks. The Gamecocks are one of only two collegiate programs to have had a player on each of the last four United States World Cup teams. Josh Wolff competed on the United States World Cup team for the second time during the summer of 2006 and was also an Olympic team member in 2000. Clint Mathis, a teammate of Wolff during his time at Carolina, also enjoyed a celebrated professional career that spanned 11 seasons in Major League Soccer. Mathis, who retired from professional soccer in 2010, was a member of the 2002 U.S. World Cup squad and helped his MLS team, Real Salt Lake, capture the MLS Cup in 2009. Mathis also graced the cover of Sports Illustrated in May 2002 prior to the World Cup, marking the third Gamecock athlete, in any sport, to be featured on the cover of the prestigious magazine. Former Gamecock goalkeeper Brad Guzan was honored during the summer of 2010 with a roster spot on the U.S. Men's National Team for the 2010 FIFA World Cup in South Africa. The netminder continued the Gamecocks' streak with a roster spot for the 2014 FIFA World Cup in Brazil.

Berson led Carolina to a 113-39-12 mark (.726) in the 1990s, which rated the Gamecocks as one of the winningest programs in NCAA Division I soccer. In 1998, Berson earned the inaugural Independent Coach of the Year award after leading Carolina to the best record of all Independent schools. Berson has also been honored as the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) Coach of the Year in the South Region on four occasions (1984, 1985, 1988, 1995).

Berson has been involved in soccer development as a coach, teacher and administrator on many levels. He is a U.S. Soccer National Instructional Staff Coach with an "A" coaching license and has served as a US Soccer National Instructional staff coach since 1989. He has served as State Coach for the South Carolina Youth Soccer Association (SCYSA), working in player development and coaching certification. In 1992, he was inducted into the South Carolina Youth Soccer Association Hall of Fame.

Berson also coached the U.S. National U-18 team in the Granatkin/Leningrad Tournament in January 1989, in the Soviet Union. In July 1987, he directed the South team to the gold medal in the U.S. Olympic Festival in Durham, N.C., one year after serving as an assistant coach for the South squad.

A 1971 graduate of Summit (N.J.) High School, Berson attended the University of North Carolina and received

his bachelor of arts degree in journalism in 1975. Berson played on the Tar Heel soccer squad for four years, one as a midfielder and the other three in goal. As a senior, Berson received the UNC Educational Foundation Award and was a member of the Academic ACC Honor Roll. Berson earned his master's of education degree in sport administration from Ohio University in 1977

Born March 16, 1953, in Hartford, Conn., Berson is married to the former Shauna Hopkins, a South Carolina alum, of Columbia. They have two children, Erin Rhea and Luke William. Erin graduated from South Carolina in 2009, and Luke is currently enrolled at the University of South Carolina in the Moore School of Business.

CONFERENCE USA TOURNAMENT CONTINUES IN NORFOLK WITH SC VS. UAB IN SEMIS

- The seventh seed, the Gamecocks opened the event by beating second-seeded Kentucky 2-1.
- At 4:30 PM on Fri., South Carolina faces UAB, who defeated Marshall 1-0 in the second match on Wed.
- This is the Gamecocks' eighth appearance in the event, with the team going 8-5-1.
- Twice, the Gamecocks have won the C-USA Tournament (2005 and 2010).
- Entering the event, SC faced a rematch against a team it lost to in the regular season once before.
- In 2010, South Carolina fell to SMU in the regular season 3-1 but came back to win the semifinal rematch 2-1 en route to its second tourney title.
- The Gamecocks added to that total with Wed.'s win over No. 18 Kentucky.
- Charlotte, the top seed, received a bye into the semifinals, where it will face Old Dominion.
- The semifinals will be shown on the C-USA Digital Network, an online streaming platform.

SOUTH CAROLINA CELEBRATING 10 YEARS IN CONFERENCE USA

- The 2014 season is South Carolina's 10th as a men's soccer affiliate member of Conference USA.
- In 2011, the Garnet and Black captured the league's regular-season crown, sharing it with UAB.
- South Carolina's student-athletes have taken 44 all-league nods, with 14 coming on the first team.
- In C-USA outings, South Carolina owns a 38-28-16 (.561) mark.
- On the road, that mark is 19-13-10 (.571). At Stone Stadium, that record is 19-15-6 (.550).
- The Gamecocks fell one game shy of their fifth undefeated road slate in their C-USA history.

KNUDSEN HEADLINES FOUR GAMECOCKS ON ALL-CONFERENCE USA TEAMS

- Redshirt freshman Mikkel Knudsen gained four honors from Conference USA as part of their 2014 awards.
- Knudsen captured the Golden Boot with his six goals in league play and the Freshman of the Year.
- He's the fourth Gamecock to be named Freshman of the Year, following Mike Gustavson, Jeff Scanella and Jimmy Maurer.
- Knudsen also headlined the All-Freshman Team and took a spot on the second team, matching Maurer's honors in 2007.
- Senior defenders Mahamoudou Kaba and Braeden Troyer joined Knudsen on the second team.
- Sophomore midfielder Kurtis Turner garnered a third-team spot.

SOUTH CAROLINA TEAM NOTES

- South Carolina has been a second-half team, winning more corner kicks (57-34) and shot chances (147-108) in the second 45 in its 18 matches.
- Two Gamecock defenders have played every minute this year: senior Braeden Troyer and sophomore Ive Burnett.
- South Carolina took 131 of their 261 shots, 50 percent, in six home matches: Belmont, Mercer, UNC Greensboro, Marshall, Georgia State and Kentucky.
- Four times, SC has held foes to 2 or less shots on goal: Belmont, Marshall, Georgia State and UAB.
- South Carolina stands with an all-time record of 460-209-68 (.671).
- The 3-0 start was South Carolina's best in a decade, when the 2004 squad won its first four matches.
- Ranked 17th in the Sept. 9 NSCAA/Continental Tire poll, South Carolina received its first ranking since the last regular season poll of 2011 (23rd).

ESPECIALLY EXPERIENCED IN OVERTIME

- The Gamecocks hold a 4-4 mark in overtime this year, the most OT wins in a season in history and the most extra-time matches played without a tie for the Gamecocks.
- The eight overtime matches ties for most in a season with 2013.
- South Carolina has played 15 overtime matches in its last 31 outings dating back to last year.
- The eight OT contests ties for eighth in NCAA Division I this year, behind UC Davis' 14, Valparaiso's 10 and Albany's, Army's, Detroit's, Loyola's (Chicago), Northwestern's nine.
- The Gamecocks are tied with American, Brown, Bryant, Butler, Cal State Fullerton, Cal State Northridge, James Madison, Lafayette, Loyola Marymount, Marist and SIU Edwardsville with eight (as of Nov. 12).
- Of those 19 teams playing at least eight matches into overtime, South Carolina stands alone without a tie.

2014 GAMECOCKS ROAD WARRIORS IN C-USA ACTION

- The Gamecocks went 3-1 in road Conference USA contests, with the lone loss coming at No. 25 New Mexico in the final match of the regular season.
- In league play, South Carolina scored 11 goals on the road and three at home, with four matches in each category.
- South Carolina went 0-4 in league play at home, the first winless home slate since joining C-USA.
- All three goals at home came in the final 50 minutes of action vs. No. 19/22 Kentucky.
- The three goals against the Wildcats pushed their goals-against average down 10 spots to No. 12 in the Oct. 27 NCAA Division I stats rankings.

GAMECOCKS ARE COMEBACK KINGS IN 2014

- In six of South Carolina's nine wins, the team has come from behind to take the victory.
- Five victories came from one goal back, with the fifth marking the largest comeback in school history (down 0-3 at Florida Atlantic).
- Twice, the team has fought back against a ranked foe despite being down a player to force double overtime (down 0-1 vs. No. 25/18 Clemson, down 0-3 vs. No. 19/22 Kentucky).
- The only wins that didn't involve overtime or falling behind were a 2-0 decision over Mercer and the 1-0 triumph at Old Dominion.

BERSON RANKS SIXTH ON NCAA DIVISION I COACHING WINS LIST

- The only head coach in South Carolina men's soccer history, Mark Berson ranks as one of four coaches in NCAA Division I history with 450 wins at one institution.
- Berson owns 471 career victories in 38 years, which includes his 11 in 1977 at The Citadel.
- He holds 6th on the NCAA Division I wins list and 16th on the all-divisions listing.
- The FAU win broke a tie with former Kean head coach Tony Ochrimenko to give Berson 16th alone on the all-divisions list.
- Berson coached his 750th collegiate match vs. Kentucky on Oct. 25.
- He's coached 13 players who have captured 15 All-America nods at South Carolina.
- He's also guided at least one player on each of the past four US Men's National Teams in the World Cup (Clint Mathis 2002, Josh Woolf 2002 and 2006, Brad Guzan 2010 and 2014).

THREE NAMED TO CAPITAL ONE ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT 4 TEAM BY COSIDA

- South Carolina, for the third time in seven years, had three student-athletes claim a spot on the Capital One Academic All-District 4 Team as selected by CoSIDA.
- Forwards Jeffrey Torda and Eli Dent garnered recognition for the first time, while senior Braeden Troyer made his third appearance on the team.
- Honorees must have a 3.3 cumulative grade point average, completed one full academic year at the school and be a sophomore both athletically and academically.
- Academic All-Americans will be announced on Tues., Nov. 25.
- The 2008 and 2010 teams also had three members make what was then two squads honored.

WE SCHEDULED STRONG FOES

- Of the 17 regular-season matches scheduled this season for the Gamecocks, 12 came against top-100 RPI teams in the final 2013 report from the NCAA.
 - Seven ranked in the top 50, four from C-USA (Charlotte, UAB, Old Dominion & New Mexico).
- Four foes made the NSCAA/Continental Tire Preseason Top 25, well, 26 when you count Old Dominion tying for the 25th spot with Navy.
- Five Gamecock foes from 2014 appear in the latest NSCAA top 25, while another receives votes.
- SC is 3-6 against top-40 teams in the latest RPI report.

GAMECOCKS VS. RANKED FOES

- South Carolina is 33-57-9 (.379) against foes ranked in the NSCAA top 25 (since 1996).
- Broken down by site, the Gamecocks are 17-27-4 (.396) at home, 11-19-5 (.386) on the road and 5-11 (.313) in neutral-site outings.
- This season, the Gamecocks are 2-4 against NSCAA-ranked opponents.

RECENT DOMINANCE OF ARCHRIVAL CLEMSON

- Since 2007, the Gamecocks are 6-2 against their archrival Clemson, with both of the losses coming in double overtime on the road (2011 & 2013).
- The last four matches at Stone Stadium have gone to the Gamecocks, three coming in shutouts.
- It's the best stretch since the Gamecocks went 10-4 from 1985-95 against the Tigers, with three of the wins in that stretch coming in NCAA Tournament play.

SCOUTING UAB

- UAB enters the semifinal match with a 11-6-1 record, winning five of its last seven.
- Foes have outshot the Blazers, 195-182, with the team being called for 178 fouls compared to 145 committed by the opposition.
- Junior Freddy Ruiz, the C-USA Co-Offensive MVP, leads the Blazers with 10 goals and has added two assists.
- Redshirt senior Alex Clay ranks second in points, tallying seven goals and six assists.
- Rami Dajani has five goals and an assist, third on the team in points.
- Twelve Blazers have contribued to the team's 35 goals, while 12 different student-athletes have registered at least one helper.
- Redshirt junior Joe Kuzminsky has 62 saves and a 1.16 goals against average, playing all but 17 minutes in goal.
- He's posted three shutouts, including one against the Gamecocks in Columbia and playing as part of one in the last two matches.

SERIES HISTORY VS. THE BLAZERS

- The Gamecocks are 9-5-1 against UAB all-time, including a 1-1 mark in C-USA Tournament play.
- Both of those were in quarterfinals, with the Blazers winning in 2006 and the Gamecocks taking the 2010 meeting.

GAMECOCKS HAVE A RICH HISTORY IN NCAA TOURNAMENT

- On 20 occasions, the Gamecocks made an NCAA Tournament, the most in Conference USA.
- Eleven times, the Gamecocks have played the NCAA Tournament Round of 16.
- South Carolina is 16-19-1 in the tourney, making two College Cups in 1988 and 1993.
- To make their 21st appearance, the Gamecocks will need to win the C-USA Tournament for the third time.

THE LAST TIME - OCT. 11, 2014

South Carolina vs. UAB - Stone Stadium

COLUMBIA, S.C. - No. 21 UAB (7-4-1, 2-1 C-USA) scored in the 71st minute and made it stand up with a save

with 90 seoconds left to take a 1-0 win over South Carolina (6-6, 1-2 C-USA) on Saturday night at Stone Stadium. On a counter attack after clearing a Gamecock corner kick try, Lars Willemse worked past the Gamecock defense and goalkeeper and fired from the right wing, bouncing a shot off the left post. Freddy Ruiz, the Conference USA Preseason Offensive Player of the Year, got to the rebound and fired it into the net for UAB's only goal and his sixth of the year.

Three minutes after the UAB goal, junior Ryan Arambula had his header of a Gamecock corner kick go right to UAB goalkeeper Joe Kuzminsky. The Blazers used offsides calls as a way to shave time off the clock, being whistled six times on the night, three times in the final 11 minutes.

With 90 seconds left, the Gamecocks had their best look at goal all night. Sophomore midfielder Kurtis Turner fired a shot from just inside the 18-yard box that Kuzminsky blocked away. The rebound went to junior midfielder Jeffrey Torda, but his touch from inside the six sent the ball over the crossbar, ending South Carolina's chances.

The Blazers nearly took the lead in the 49th on a free kick. DeAndre Robinson tried to wrap one past the wall from just outside the penalty box, but Gamecock sophomore goalkeeper Marco Velez dove to his left and made the grab. South Carolina had a chance in the 56th, when senior defenders Mahamoudou Kaba and Braeden Troyer played up on a corner kick. Troyer redirected the clearance attempt to Kaba at the six, but the shot missed high.

Both teams had four shots in the first half, with the Gamecocks recording the only one taken on goal in the 17th minute by sophomore midfielder Kurtis Turner from outside the 18. Ruiz had a shot from the corner of the 6 miss wide after a give and go 10 minutes into play.

- The Gamecocks return 80 percent of their goals and 76 percent of their assists from last year.
- Included in that returning group is the top-two goal scorers (Jeffrey Torda and Mahamoudou Kaba) and the top-two assist distributors (Kurtis Turner and Ryan Arambula).
- Only one goalkeeper of three who played in 2013 is not back from last year (Chris Duzan, 30:19).
- Four Conference USA award winners return, including defenders Kaba and Braeden Troyer as well as 2013 All-Freshman Team members Turner (midfielder) and Marco Velez (goalkeeper).

THE GAMECOCKS SHINE IN THE CLASSROOM AS WELL

- South Carolina's 18 returners have a total of 30 SEC Academic Honor Roll certificates and 31 Conference USA Academic Honor Roll notations between them.
- Four of the seniors, Robert Beebe, Mahamoudou "Mo" Kaba, Asa Kryst and Braeden Troyer have three certificates each.
- Ten C-USA Academic Medals have been given to Gamecock student-athletes, with honorees holding a 3.75 cumulative GPA or higher.
- Troyer has three of those Academic Medals, while both Ryan Arambula and Jeffrey Torda have two.

GAMECOCKS COME BACK AT FLORIDA ATLANTIC FOR BIG WIN

- The Gamecocks scored four unanswered goals in the final 30 minutes of regulation and five minutes of overtime to claim a 4-3 road win at Florida Atlantic on Oct. 17.
- South Carolina posted its biggest come-from-behind victory with that effort, the first time in 37 years a Gamecock team overcame a three-goal deficit.
- Doubling the Owls in shots in the second half, SC had two goals from redshirt freshman Mikkel Knudsen, including the neutralizer with 7:59 remaining.
- Two Gamecocks made their season debut in the win, juniors Devin L'Amoreaux and Wesley Eads. L'Amoreaux had an assist on the game-tying goal by Knudsen.

AWARDS CAME IN BUNCHES IN SECOND WEEK

- Sophomore goalkeeper Marco Velez won two honors over Sept. 8-9, the Conference USA Defensive Player of the Week and the Disney Soccer/NSCAA Player of the Week.
- It's Velez's second C-USA weekly honor, matching his award on Oct. 28, 2013, as a freshman.
- He's the first national player of the week for SC since Bradlee Baladez took the College Soccer News award on Oct. 4, 2010.
- The last Gamecock before Velez to earn NSCAA's weekly nod was Ayo Akinsete on Oct. 25, 2006.
- Mahamoudou Kaba took a spot on CSN's Team of the Week on Sept. 8 after garnering the C-USA Preseason Defensive Player of the Year award.

ATTENDANCE OUTSTANDING AT STONE STADIUM

- The 2014 Gamecocks have the fifth-highest paid attendance average in NCAA Division I at 2,602.
- That 2,602 attendance average is the largest for a season in Stone Stadium history.
- The paid attendance of 5,415 for the season-opening match against Belmont ranks as the 4th-best in Stone Stadium history and 8th in the site's history of men's matches.

TROYER NAMED A SENIOR CLASS AWARD CANDIDATE

- Gamecock Braeden Troyer was one of 30 candidates for its men's soccer Senior CLASS Award but was not one of 10 finalists.
- Troyer leads all SC returners with 10 career goals, tied for seventh in Gamecock history during the Conference USA era (since 2005).
- Twice he's been named to the C-USA All-Academic Team, and he has four All-C-USA nods, ('12, '13 & '14 second team, '11 third team).
- He also made the 2011 Conference USA All-Freshman Team and has been honored once on the College Soccer News Team of the Week (Sept. 29, 2013).
- On three occasions, CoSIDA has voted him on the Capital One Academic All-District 4 team.
- In the classroom, he's been a member of the Honors College at South Carolina and earned three C-USA Academic Medals, given to student-athletes with a 3.75 GPA.
- He's a co-captain in 2014 (along with Mahamoudou "Mo" Kaba).
