Gamecocks Host Rees Jones Invitational

South Carolina is set to host the Rees Jones Invitational for the first time. The 54-hole tournament runs Monday through Tuesday at the Rees Jones Signature Course at Haig Point. The teams will play 36 holes on Monday and 18 on Tuesday. The course is a par-72, 7,380-yard setup.

This Week's Lineup

The Gamecocks' are mixing up their lineup for a second-straight week. Juniors Dykes Harbin and Clint Tolleson, sophomores Blaine Woodruff and Caulder Moore and freshman Sean Kelly get the nod for the two-day event. Freshman Caleb Sturgeon is also slated to play as an individual in his first career tournament. Tolleson's start is his first of the season.

Something about Haig Point?

The Gamecocks have had plenty of success at the Rees Jones Invitational. South Carolina has claimed two titles at the tournament, which is in its fourth year. The Gamecocks won the inaugural event in 2008 with four golfers finishing in the top 10, including Wesley Bryan and Paul Woodbury tying for medalist honors.

South Carolina also won the 2009 event, as Woodbury and George Bryan IV tied for medalist honors. The Gamecocks did not send a varsity squad to last year's tournament.

Breaking Down the Field

South Carolina will compete against 12 teams at the 2011 Rees Jones Invitational. Defending conference championship squads from UNC Wilmington (Colonial Athletic Association), Kennesaw State (Atlantic Sun) and Liberty University (Big South) are in the field, joining Charleston Southern, Chattanooga, Georgia State, Iowa State, Jacksonville, Michigan State, South Florida, Wake Forest and Winthrop. Kennesaw State defeated Liberty in a playoff to win last year's Rees Jones Invitational.

South Carolina Finishes 11th at Mason Rudolph Championship

South Carolina freshman Sean Kelly posted a 1-under 70 to lead the Gamecocks in the final round of the Mason Rudolph Championship at the Vanderbilt Legends Club South Course. South Carolina shot a final-round 288 (+4) to finish the tournament in 11th place with a three-round score of 877 (+25).

Kelly got off to a strong start as he started the day at the 10th hole and carded a birdie. The Staten Island, N.Y., native recorded his second birdie of the day on the 14th and he went on to make the turn at 34 (-2). Kelly fell back to even with back-to-back bogeys on the first and second holes but he birdied the sixth and made par the rest of the way to wrap up the round at 1-under to finish in a tie for 31st.

Sophomores Blaine Woodruff and Caulder Moore also had solid rounds for the Gamecocks with a pair of 1-over 72s. Woodruff finished in a tie for 55th, while Moore tied for 51st.

Junior Dykes Harbin was the second-highest finisher for the Gamecocks, claiming a tie for 34th after a final-round 75 (+4). Senior Wesley Bryan wrapped up the event in a tie for 39th after carding a 74 (+3).

Gamecocks Tie for 11th to Open Season

South Carolina recorded a final-round 300 (+12) and tied for 11th place to wrap up play at the Carpet Capital Collegiate at The Farm Golf Club to open the 2011-12 season. The Gamecocks finished the week with a team total of 890 (+26).

Junior Dykes Harbin proved to be the most consistent Gamecock during the weekend as he posted a final-round 72 (E) to finish the tournament in a tie for 21st with rounds of 73-73-72=218 (+2).

Sophomore Blaine Woodruff improved his score for the third straight day with a 1-over 73 as he finished in a tie for 35th with rounds of 76-74-73=223 (+7).

After posting the Gamecocks' tournament low with a 3-under 69 in the second round, senior Wesley Bryan was unable to carry that momentum into the final round with a 6-over 78 to wrap up the tournament in a tie for 42nd with rounds of 78-69-78=225 (+9).

Sophomore Caulder Moore made the turn at even par but fell back on the back nine with four bogeys and a double bogey as he turned in a 77 (+5) for the round, while sophomore Logan Harrell posted an 82 (+10) for the Gamecocks.

Coaching Staff Shake-up

Longtime Gamecock assistant coach Michael Burcin patiently waited for his first head coaching job, and the wait paid off in June. Burcin was named head coach at the University of Wisconsin after serving the last seven years as an assistant with the Gamecocks.

Burcin's departure opened the door for Don Hill to join the South Carolina coaching staff. On June 15, Hill was named South Carolina's associate head golf coach after an eight-year stint as an assistant at North Carolina.

During his time as North Carolina's assistant coach, the Tar Heels won 10 tournaments, including the ACC Championship in 2006 and the UNCG Bridgestone Golf Collegiate in the fall of 2010, and five Tar Heels captured seven individual championships. Hill has coached three All-Americans - Martin Ureta in 2005 and 2006, Dustin Bray in 2002-04 and Kevin O'Connell in 2008.

Hill was a member of the UNC men's golf team (1995, 1997-99). He was a two-time All-ACC performer and two-time honorable mention All-American in 1998 and 1999. Hill helped lead North Carolina to 10th-place NCAA finishes in 1997 and 1999. He was the runner-up at the 1998 ACC Championship, one stroke behind Clemson's Charles Warren, and finished 10th at the 1999 NCAA Championship. Hill posted 13 top-10 finishes during his four-year collegiate career and 23 top-25 finishes. He posted a 72.88 stroke average in 1997-98 and a 73.03 average in 1998-99.
