11 Entering her fourth season at the helm of the Gamecocks, head coach Dawn Staley is beginning to feel comfortable with the way her program has started running itself. With a core group of eight returners – all juniors and seniors – who spent the summer and preseason preparing the newcomers for what lay ahead, the Gamecocks are poised to continue the program's steady improvement under Staley's watchful eye.

10 "Our upperclassmen really understand what is expected of them, and they can draw on their experiences and lend them to our younger players," Staley said. "That's how you build, by having gone through some good things, some bad and some indifferent, and then you learn from them. We can move a lot quicker once we understand how to be successful."

09 Success is something the Gamecocks have chipped away at achieving since Staley arrived on campus prior to the 2008-09 campaign. A four-win improvement each season carried South Carolina into the WNIT last season, narrowly missing an NCAA berth after finishing tied for fifth in the SEC, the program's best league finish since 2002-03. This year's team is eyeing the next rung in the ladder – a spot in the 2012 NCAA Tournament.

08 "My key message to the team, the thing I always tell them is that the disciplined person can do anything," Staley said. "There is a certain kind of discipline and sacrifice that comes along with being successful. That applies to whatever you're doing, if it's education or building relationships or playing basketball."

07 South Carolina returns three starters among its eight upperclassmen, and the group includes last season's top two in points, rebounds and assists. In fact, the Gamecocks bring back 74.5 percent of their scoring, 81.4 percent of their assists and 63.1 percent of their rebounds from 2010-11.

The Backcourt

no matter how many times they have faced the tandem.

With 10.2 points and 3.1 assists per game last season, Sutton became one of just 13 Gamecocks in school history to average that many assists while also averaging double-figure points. With a career scoring average of 10.3 points over her first three years, the Trenton, N.J., native has developed a keen passing eye and a mentality to get her teammates involved in the game.

"What I see in La'Keisha is the ability to take over a game, but she looks at the bigger picture where she likes to ensure that her teammates are happy and that the bottom line is we win basketball games," Staley said. "With this being her final year, I anticipate her being more aggressive with her shooting, which we actually tried to get her to do late last season. I don't want her to come out and shoot every shot, but she has the experience of last year to draw on to continue to be more balanced in her offense."

Walker more than doubled her offensive production from her freshman to sophomore seasons, earning Second Team All-SEC honors from the league's coaches behind a team-best 12.2 points per game. A threat on both sides of the ball, she also ranked third in the league in steals with 2.4 per game.

"The difference in Ieasia from her freshman year is experience," Staley said. "She has a strong build, a great mentality and an incredible work ethic, so I was happy to see that she was able to see something tangible come of that last year. The sky is the limit for her. She is still growing on the basketball court, and she's maturing off the court to the point where she wants to take more of a leadership role with the newcomers."

Senior Markeshia Grant asserted herself late last season and worked tirelessly throughout the summer to raise her game to match those of Sutton and Walker. Grant turned in her best games of last season in postseason play, averaging a team-best 12.3 points per game during the SEC Tournament and WNIT. Her powerful will to win and trust in the coaching staff will be guiding forces for the team this season.

Another senior, Ebony Wilson has developed her defensive game, which Staley looks for her to extend. A key sign of the maturity of this year's team will be the extent to which everyone accepts and thrives in their roles, and Wilson can set that tone.

"Ebony wants more, and I love her for that attitude," Staley said. "If she

can accept her role, whatever that role is, she has the ability to change the complexion of any game.”

Staley added height to the backcourt this season in the form of guards Tina Roy and Sancheon White. The duo raises the physical presence on the perimeter, and each adds a different element to the core group of three.

At 5-foot-11, Roy posted 31.1 points and 20 rebounds per game as a senior at Kaplan (La.) High. She earned Farm Bureau/Miss Basketball honors from the Louisiana Sports Writers Association for that effort, adding to her three-time all-state honors.

“Plain and simple, Tina can shoot the basketball,” Staley said. “She is going to be a special player, because to that shooting ability she adds a great basketball IQ, the ability to listen and the drive to be a good player.”

White is a 5-foot-10 junior transfer from Central Arizona College where she earned First Team NJCAA All-Region I honors. In her prep days at Hammond (Ind.) High, she was a three-time all-area selection as well.

“Sancheon is probably one of the quickest players on our team,” Staley said. “She has the unique ability to get out in front of other people and down the floor, which will change the tone of a game from the defensive end with easy buckets in transition.”

The Frontcourt

“Our frontcourt players are driven to contribute more, mainly from an offensive standpoint because that’s what we lacked last year on a consistent basis. They have worked to the point where they’re going to contribute. We won’t be in a place where we pass it on the block because we have to. We’ll be passing to the block truly believing those players will do something positive with the ball.” – Head coach Dawn Staley

The Gamecocks will have an undersized frontcourt again this season, but the trait was not as significant a problem last season as Staley had anticipated. The whole team’s commitment to rebounding allowed the Gamecocks to rank sixth in the SEC in rebounding margin despite being the only team without at least two players over 6-foot-1.

“Last season, we talked early on about being vertically challenged with rebounding,” Staley said. “We had to offset that by working hard, sticking to the techniques and pretty much wanting it more. We have the same plan and mentality in place for this year.”

Beyond rebounding, though, Staley is looking for more offensive contribution from the post as well. Senior Charenee Stephens is capable of putting up good offensive numbers on the back of her rebounding, and Staley likes how the six-foot forward approached the offseason ahead of her final collegiate season. Stephens led the team in rebounding eight times last year and grabbed double-digit boards in five games. She enjoyed her best offensive season as a sophomore, which Staley looks for her to build upon in 2011-12.

Junior Ashley Bruner was the team’s top rebounder last season but went through some growing pains in her first season as a regular part of the lineup. She exploded out of the blocks with back-to-back double-doubles in the season’s first two games, but then did not repeat the effort until the SEC opener at Georgia. Staley looks for Bruner to have more consistent efforts over the course of the season, which the coach knows her team needs to be successful.

“Once Ashley focuses on something, she is pretty good at it,” Staley said. “When you see her inconsistent play, though, it’s because of a lack of focus. Hopefully this season she can draw on some of the success she had last year and show more often the player she is capable of being night-in and night-out.”

Fifth-year senior Courtney Newton is also back to mix things up in the post where Staley loves the toughness and never-back-down approach to every game. Enduring five different knee surgeries from her high school career through her first four seasons in Columbia, Newton is rarely intimidated by anything and has a warrior’s mentality that Staley wants to see trickle down to every member of the team.

“Courtney doesn’t back down from anybody or anything, and you want someone like that on your team because a lot of times the odds are stacked against us to win certain basketball games,” Staley said. “Her mentality is that they lace them up just like we do, and she’s certainly one that’s surprised a lot of people specifically because of that approach.”

The primary height addition to the frontcourt is 6-foot-3 Elem Ibiam.

Ranked among the country’s top 15 post players in the 2011 class, she helped Fayette County (Ga.) High to region and state titles in her career. While both coach and student-athlete know there will be a transition period from high school to the college game, Staley is confident that Ibiam’s presence will have an impact on the Gamecocks on both ends of the floor.

“There are a lot of things that go into making the transition to being a college freshman, both on the court and off,” Staley said. “In the beginning of the season, I’m sure she’s going to take her hits, but she’s still 6-foot-3, and no matter what opponents have to play that honestly. I believe she has yet to play her best basketball. Once she finds her confidence in the things she can do on the block and stepping off it, she will be on her way.”

Fellow freshman Aleighsa Welch will also add some offensive punch to the frontcourt. South Carolina Miss Basketball as a senior, the six-foot forward was the three-time *Charleston Post & Courier* Player of the Year and guided Goose Creek to its first state basketball championship her junior year.

“Aleighsa has a skill set that is going to allow us to have the type of player we haven’t had since Demetress Adams,” Staley said. “She can shoot well out to the 3-point line and can put the ball on the floor. The fact that she’s a lefty, too, gives us a different dimension.”

An X-factor of the Gamecocks could come in the form of 6-foot-1 freshman Pamela Decheva from Bulgaria. Participating with her national team since 2007, she helped her Women’s National Basketball League team Levski to a runner-up finish in the league last season. A multi-faceted player, Decheva will add another dynamic element to the frontcourt this season.

The Schedule

Staley has put together another challenging schedule for her team with more than half of South Carolina’s 29 games coming against teams that participated in the 2011 postseason. The team’s newcomers will be tested right out of the gate as the Gamecocks play two of their first three games on the road, including at archrival Clemson. The schedule also includes trips to Xavier and NC State as well as the annual Carolinas Challenge in Myrtle Beach, S.C., against North Carolina. Overall the schedule is a blend of challenges and confidence-building games that will allow the 2011-12 team to further meld together before heading into the always challenging SEC schedule.
