

FOR STARTERS

College baseball's premier rivalry is this weekend as South Carolina (9-0) meets Clemson (6-1) for three games in three different sites. The series opens on Friday at Founders Park with first pitch at 7 p.m. Game two of the series shifts to Greenville and the Reedy River Rivalry contest at Fluor Field with first pitch at 2:30 p.m. The series concludes on Sunday in Clemson at Doug Kingsmore Stadium at 2 p.m.

Carolina has had success against Clemson in recent years winning 24 of the last 34 contests between the two schools dating back to the 2007 season. Friday's game will be broadcast on SEC Network Plus with Saturday streamed on ClemsonTigers.com and Sunday's game live on ESPN3.

All three games can also be heard on the Gamecock Radio Network from IMG College including flagship station 107.5 FM "The Game." Andy Demetra, Derek Scott and Tommy Moody will have the call this weekend.

PRICE AWARD & BRADLEY AWARD

For the 16th consecutive year, the Tom Price Award and Bob Bradley Award will be presented to the MVP for South Carolina and Clemson respectively. The presentation will be made at the end of Sunday's game.

Both Price and Bradley had a tremendous positive influence on the baseball programs at Clemson and South Carolina as the school's sports information directors.

Price passed away on Feb. 1, 2008 at the age of 81 after 45 years of service to the Gamecock program. Bradley passed away on Oct. 30, 2000. He served as the Tigers' baseball athletic communications director for 45 years and still served as Clemson's official scorer for most of the 2000 season.

South Carolina sophomore catcher John Jones earned National Player of the Week honors from Collegiate Baseball and SEC Co-Player of the Week after putting together arguably one of the greatest weekends at the plate in school history. Jones reached base in all 14 plate appearances vs. Penn State batting 1.000 (8-for-8) with six walks for an OBP of 1.000 as well.

MR. JONES

Jones went 4-for-4 with a homer and four RBI in a 7-1 series-opening win vs. the Nittany Lions. He followed that up with a grand slam and tying a single-game school record with four walks in Saturday's 16-5 victory vs. Penn State. In the series finale, Jones went 3-for-3 including a two-run single and a walk in the 4-2 win to sweep the series vs. Penn State. Jones' slugging percentage for the weekend was 1.750 also.

In records going back to 1997, Jones is the only Gamecock in school history to start three games in a series and put up a 1.000 OBP, besting the previous mark of .875 set by Christian Walker in 2011 at Mississippi State as well as Walker's .909 batting average (10-for-11). Jones' six walks tied for the most by a Gamecock in a series since Scott Wingo's six walks vs. Brown in 2010. Jones' 10 RBI are the most by a Gamecock in a series since LB Dantzler drove in 10 vs. Albany vs. 2013. Jones' 1.750 slugging percentage is the best in a series since Steven Neff's 2.000 slugging mark vs. Arkansas in 2011.

For the season, Jones is hitting .581 (18-for-31) with two doubles, three homers, 12 runs scored, 19 RBI, a .690 on-base percentage and a .935 slugging mark. Jones leads the SEC in batting average and on-base percentage. Jones has six multi-hit games and six-multi-RBI games this season. Jones has driven in 11 of his 19 runs with two outs.

SCHMIDT OFF TO GOOD START

Sophomore right-handed pitcher Clarke Schmidt pitched seven scoreless innings and allowed just one walk and one hit while striking out eight batters in Friday's 7-1 win over Penn State. Schmidt's seven innings was the longest stint in his career with his eight strikeouts tying a career-high as well.

Schmidt is 2-0 with a 0.69 ERA and has a team-high 14 strikeouts in a team-high in 13.0 innings pitched. Opponents are batting .100 against him as he has allowed just one run on four hits in two starts. His opposing batting average is fourth-best in the SEC with an eighth-best ERA.

THAT WAS OFFENSIVE

After a .323 opening weekend, the Gamecocks were even better at the plate the second weekend with a .373 average (41-for-110) in the Penn State series. As a team, Carolina had a .449 on-base percentage and a .536 slugging mark.

For the season, South Carolina is hitting .341 (107-for-314) with a .446 on-base percentage and a .459 slugging mark. South Carolina's OBP is second-best in the league with a third-best batting average as well. South Carolina is fielding .975 also.

TO ARMS

The Gamecock pitching staff continues to succeed as the staff allowed just eight runs, six earned, on 19 hits in 27.0 innings vs. Penn State with 28 strikeouts.

The South Carolina pitching staff owns a team ERA of 1.67, second-best among all 14 SEC schools. The Gamecocks have allowed 19 runs, 15 earned, on 49 hits in 81.0 innings with 29 walks and 100 strikeouts. The Gamecocks lead the SEC with a .173 opposing batting average. South Carolina has allowed five runs or less in all nine games this year.

DYNAMIC DESTINO

Sophomore first baseman Alex Destino homered twice including a grand slam homer and drove in seven runs, the most by any SEC player this year in a game in South Carolina's 16-5 win over Penn State. He was also 3-for-4 with four RBI in last Wednesday's win over Winthrop. Destino has started all nine games and has 12 RBI, second-most on the team this year and tied for ninth-most in the SEC.

JONAH WITH A JOLT

Sophomore infielder Jonah Bride is second on the team in on-base percentage at .561 with a teamhigh 13 runs scored. Bride is hitting .333 (9-for-27), has walked seven times with seven hit by pitches also. Bride leads the nation and the SEC in hit by pitch. He is tied for fifth in runs scored and is seventh in on-base percentage in the league. Bride is one of only two Gamecocks to have reached base in all nine games this year.

He was 2-for-4 with a RBI and three runs in the 16-5 win over Penn State and 1-for-3 with two runs scored in Sunday's 4-2 win over the Nittany Lions.

CULLEN CATCHING ON

Freshman catcher Chris Cullen owns a six-game hitting streak and is batting .375 (9-for-24) for the season with four runs scored and seven RBI. Cullen went 2-for-4 with a double, a RBI and a run scored Tuesday night at the Citadel.

WEBB WITH A WIN

Freshman right-hander Braden Webb improved to 2-0 on the year with a win vs. Penn State in Saturday's contest. He allowed two runs, both unearned on three hits with two walks and five strikeouts in five innings of work.

He has 10 strikeouts in 10.0 innings with opponents batting .114 against him. Webb's opposing batting average is fifth-best in the league.

MOONEY IN THE MIDDLE

Senior infielder Marcus Mooney is hitting .333 (8-for-24) for the season with a .515 on-base percentage. Mooney has seven walks and two hit by pitches to one walk. He has scored eight runs and driven in six as well. Mooney also is tied for the team-lead with three doubles.

He went 2-for-4 with a double and two RBI in Saturday's 16-5 win over Penn State and 2-for-3 with a run in the 7-1 win over the Nittany Lions.

REAGAN FROM THE LEFT

Junior left-hander Josh Reagan pitched a perfect inning of relief to earn his third save on Tuesday night and the Citadel and pitched a scoreless inning for his second save in Sunday's 4-2 win over Penn State.

Reagan has not allowed a run in four relief appearances and just one hit in 4.2 innings while striking out nine batters.

GREAT SCOTT

Junior right-hander Reed Scott picked up his first win of the season with 3.1 scoreless innings in Sunday's 4-2 win over Penn State. Scott did not allow a hit, walked just one and had a strikeout to earn the victory.

DTW

Junior outfielder Dom Thompson-Williams has reached base in all nine games this year and is hitting .371 (13-for-35) for the season with 10 runs scored and five RBI. He has seven walks and a .488 on-base percentage.

SCOUTING CLEMSON

Clemson enters with a 6-1 overall record. After dropping its season opener, the Tigers have run off six consecutive wins with pair of victories vs. Maine, a sweep last weekend of James Madison and a non-conference victory on Tuesday vs. Wofford.

Head coach Monte Lee is in his first season at the helm of the Tigers. Lee worked six seasons at South Carolina from 2003-08 under former head coach Ray Tanner, five as volunteer assistant and one as recruiting coordinator before taking over as head coach of the College of Charleston from 2009-14.

The Tigers are hitting .324 (78-for-241) as a team with a .428 on-base percentage. Junior infielder Weston Wilson leads the Tigers in hitting with a .462 batting average (12-for-26). Sophomore outfielder Chase Pinder has supplied the early power with three homers and 10 RBI to go along with a .346 average. Junior catcher Chris Okey has also homered twice and driven in 10 runs. Sophomore outfielder Reed Rohlman has a .417 average (10-for-24) also with five runs scored and eight RBI as well as a team-high three doubles.

On the mound, the Tigers will open the weekend with sophomore left-hander Charlie Barnes on the mound. Barnes is 1-0 with a 2.38 ERA as well as 14 strikeouts in 11.1 innings. Opponents are hitting .186 against him. The Tigers will start senior right-hander Clate Schmidt on Saturday. Schmidt is the older brother of current Gamecock sophomore right-hander Clarke Schmidt. Clate Schmidt is 2-0 with a 3.00 ERA for the Tigers. He has pitched a team-high 12.0 innings for Clemson. Freshman right-hander Alex Eubanks is 1-1 with 12 strikeouts in 19.1 innings and a save in three relief appearances. As a team the Tigers own a 1.86 ERA with 68 strikeouts in 63.0 innings and opponents batting .206 against them.

THE ALBANY SERIES

South Carolina hit .323 (31-for-96) for the Albany weekend with a .446 on base percentage. The Gamecocks also walked 16 times to 12 strikeouts and were hit by pitch seven times. Carolina committed just two errors and fielded .983 for the weekend with two error-less games for the series.

A NEW NAME

Founders Federal Credit Union and the University of South Carolina announced a partnership awarding naming rights of Carolina Stadium to Founders Federal Credit Union. Carolina Stadium officially became Founders Park on October 22, 2015.

Unveiled in 2009, the \$35-plus million facility has a capacity of 8,242 fans and is the crown jewel among baseball stadiums across the nations. South Carolina has ranked among the top three in the nation in total attendance in five consecutive years, including a mark of 250,057 last season as well as a season-high 6,049 season tickets sold last year.

Founders Park will be officially dedicated on Sat., April 23 before game two of the Missouri series. South Carolina totaled 22,480 in attendance the first weekend for an average of 7,493 per contest at Founders Park.

RECRUITING CLASS RANKED NO. 2 IN THE NATION

South Carolina's newcomers have been ranked the No. 2 recruiting class in the country by Collegiate Baseball. This year's crop features seven players previously selected in the MLB Draft.

A LOOK CLOSER AT THIS YEAR'S SCHEDULE

South Carolina's schedule this year includes 35 home games at Founders Park.

South Carolina and Clemson will meet in a unique three-game setting for a seventh consecutive year. The series opens in Columbia on Friday, Mar. 4 vs. Clemson with first pitch set for 7 p.m. The series shifts to the Reedy River Rivalry game at Fluor Field, home of the Greenville Drive, a minor league affiliate of the Boston Red Sox, on Saturday, and concludes in Clemson on Sunday afternoon.

The Gamecocks will play three times at Fluor Field with contests vs. USC Upstate (March 15) and Furman (April 20) as well. In addition, the Gamecocks will also face North Carolina on April 12 at BB&T Ballpark, home of the Charlotte Knights, a minor league affiliate of the Chicago White Sox.

Additional in-state contests for the Gamecocks include Charleston Southern, Coastal Carolina, College of Charleston, Presbyterian, The Citadel, Winthrop and Wofford. Other non-conference opponents include Appalachian State, Penn State and Davidson.

South Carolina's 30-game SEC slate begins Friday, Mar. 18, with Carolina hosting Arkansas. South Carolina also hosts Tennessee (April 8-10), Missouri (April 22-24), Florida (April 29-May 1) and Texas A&M (May 13-15). SEC three-game series opponents on the road are Ole Miss (Mar. 24-26), Vanderbilt (Mar. 31-April 2), Georgia (April 15-17), Kentucky (May 6-8) and Alabama (May 19-21).

Head Coach Chad Holbrook

Chad Holbrook is in his fourth year as head coach of the South Carolina program and has spent over 20 seasons in college baseball including two national championship staffs with five national championship series appearances, six College World Series trips and 16 NCAA Regionals.

Holbrook was named head baseball coach for the University of South Carolina on July 16, 2012. He was promoted to the top spot by athletics director Ray Tanner after four seasons as associate head coach and recruiting coordinator for the Gamecocks. Holbrook came to South Carolina in July 2008 as associate head coach. Along with his recruiting coordinator duties, he served as hitting instructor, oversaw the Gamecock offense, including base running and the short game and was the third base coach. He also worked with the outfielders. Holbrook came to the Gamecock program after serving 15 seasons as a member of the University of North Carolina coaching staff. Holbrook was the 2011 ABCA/Baseball America Assistant Coach of the Year after the Gamecocks won a second consecutive national championship.

A tremendous evaluator of talent, Holbrook was named the No. 10 best recruiter in all of college sports by ESPNU & ESPN The Magazine in the publication's 2011 January edition. The list was put together in conjunction with three-dozen experts who were asked the question: Who are the top 20 recruiters in college sports? Holbrook was the only baseball coach on the list.

Holbrook's 2015 team was highlighted by first-team All-America first baseman Kyle Martin, who led the Gamecocks in all three Triple Crown categories with a .350 average, 14 homers and 56 RBI. Martin earned first-team All-SEC honors as well and was selected in the fourth round of the 2015 MLB Draft. Junior second baseman Max Schrock also received All-SEC honors and was an 11th round MLB Draft choice by the Washington Nationals. Junior left-handed pitcher Jack Wynkoop would be selected in the sixth round of the MLB Draft as well by the Colorado Rockies after going 8-5 with a 3.27 ERA in 104.1 innings. The 2015 Gamecocks set a school record as well with over 6,000 season tickets sold. Carolina would finish third in the nation in total attendance with 250,057 fans flocking to watch the Gamecocks play at home.

The 2014 team finished 44-18 and finished ranked as high as No. 22 by the USA Today coaches' poll. South Carolina went 18-12 in the SEC and was one of only two schools in the conference to finish among the top four teams in the league in both 2013 and 2014 and one of four schools in the SEC to win at least 40 games in both 2013 and 2014. South Carolina was also one of only nine schools in the nation to host a NCAA Regional in 2013 and 2014.

Among the highlights in 2014 included a series sweep of instate rival Clemson. Holbrook's team would claim six SEC series including a pair of wins at eventual national champion Vanderbilt as well as a series victory vs. CWS participant Ole Miss. South Carolina hosted a NCAA Regional for the fifth-straight year marking the Gamecocks as one of only two schools in the nation to claim that distinction. South Carolina set a total attendance record at 305,564 in 2014, the first time South Carolina eclipsed the 300,000-plus mark.

The 2014 Gamecocks led the SEC with a 2.43 earned run average that ranked ninth in the nation. The pitching staff was among the best in the country with 13 shutouts, fifth-highest in the nation, a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.03, sixth-best in the country and a 1.12 WHIP that was eighth overall. South Carolina hit .281 as a team with a .361 team on-base percentage and fielded .975 as well.

South Carolina would have seven players selected in the 2014 MLB Draft including five players in the first 11 rounds. Highlighting that group was junior catcher Grayson Greiner, who was a third round pick and the No. 99 overall selection by the Detroit Tigers. Greiner was a second-team All-America honoree by Baseball America and Perfect Game and was named the 2013-14 USC Co-Male Student-Athlete of the Year alongside Gamecock football/basketball standout Bruce Ellington. He would also be a semi-finalist for the Johnny Bench Award for the top catcher in college baseball and a member of the SEC All-Defensive team. Greiner played in 60 games with 58 starts, hit .311 (66-for-212) with 39 runs scored, 50 RBI, 13 doubles and eight homers, also a .389 on-base percentage and a .486 slugging mark. Greiner hit a team-best .327 (37-for-113) in league games with four homers and 24 RBI vs. SEC teams. Junior left-handed pitcher Jordan Montgomery was a 4th round selection by the New York Yankees after leading the pitching staff with an 8-5 record and a 3.42 ERA in a team-high 100 innings with 95 strikeouts. Montgomery became the 22nd pitcher in school history to reach the 20win total as well. Junior infielder Joey Pankake was a seventh round pick by the Tigers. He became the 26th player in school history to tally 200 or more hits with a double in the second inning of the Florida game at the SEC Tournament on May 22. He finished his career with 204 hits in the Garnet & Black. He started 58 games and hit .303 (67for-221) with a team-high 52 runs scored. Junior outfielder Tanner English went in the 11th round to the Minnesota Twins after manning the center field position the entre year with 62 starts and being named to the SEC All-Defensive team. Joel Seddon also

was selected in the 11th round after earning second-team All-America honors from the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association with 14 saves. He was a second-team All-SEC choice. Junior first baseman Kyle Martin was South Carolina's best hitter with a .336 average (82-for-244) and would be picked in the 20th round but chose to return to school for the 2015 season. Right-handed pitcher Evan Beal rounded out the group as a 21st round choice by the Royals. A Gamecock newcomer also found success as freshman right-handed pitcher Wil Crowe earned Freshman All-America honors as announced by Collegiate Baseball on Wednesday morning. In his first season, Crowe went 8-3 in 15 starts with a 2.75 ERA in 91.2 innings pitched. Crowe allowed just 32 runs, 28 earned, on 76 hits with 19 walks and 59 strikeouts. Crowe was strong in his last start with the Garnet and Black as he pitched four-hit complete game shutout in a 9-0 win vs. Campbell in the NCAA Regional that earned him All-Tournament Team honors. Crowe earned SEC Pitcher of the Week and SEC Freshman of the Week also.

The Gamecocks also shined off the field as Greiner continued a streak of a Gamecock making the Capital One Academic All-America teams to four years, following LB Dantzler's Academic All-America Division I Baseball Player of the Year nod in 2013 and Michael Roth's two selections to the first team in 2011-12.

Holbrook's first season as head coach in 2013 saw the Gamecocks compile a 43-20 record and the school's 11th NCAA Super Regional appearance. Holbrook directed the 2013 squad to a final national ranking of No. 12 in the USA Today Baseball Coaches Poll along with No. 13 by Collegiate Baseball and Perfect Game and No. 14 by Baseball America.

The 2013 highlights was a series victory against Clemson, four sweeps of SEC teams and six SEC series victories including a pair of wins at LSU, making the Gamecocks the only team to go into Baton Rouge in 2013 and claim a three-game set. South Carolina hosted a NCAA Regional for the fourth straight year with the Gamecocks going undefeated in three games and continuing a run of 27 straight postseason wins at home including a 16-0 mark at Carolina Stadium. South Carolina ended the 2013 season with a total attendance of 260,605, third highest in the country.

The 2013 team raised its season batting average 19 batting points to .284 with a .375 on-base percentage and a .419 slugging clip. South Carolina led the SEC and ranked 18th in the nation with 52 homers. The 2013 pitching staff was among the best in the nation with a 3.02 earned run average to go along with a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.3 that ranked third best in the nation. South Carolina pitchers averaged 7.8 strikeouts per nine innings while walking just 2.36 batters per contest.

2013 featured third-team All-America designated hitter LB Dantzler. The senior ranked third in the SEC in homers (15) slugging percentage (.617) and walks (42) as well as fifth in total bases (132) sixth in on-base percentage (.444). Dantzler led Carolina in hitting with a .322 average (69-for-214) and was drafted by the Toronto Blue Jays. Senior left-hander Tyler Webb, earned third-team All-America honors from Collegiate Baseball and the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association and second-team All-SEC honors after anchoring a bullpen with 17 saves. That mark is fifth highest in school history and ranked second in the league and seventh in the nation. Webb struck out 60 batters in 43.0 innings and pitched in 32 games on his way to setting a school record for career appearances with 110 on the mound with the Garnet & Black. Webb was selected in the 10th round by the New York Yankees. Greiner was tabbed second-team All-SEC at catcher as a sophomore and made USA Baseball's Collegiate National Team. He hit .298 (61-for-205) with 10 doubles and 38 RBI. Sophomore shortstop Joey Pankake continued his rise with a .311 average (69-for-214) with 11 homers and 42 RBI. Two Gamecock newcomers recruited by Holbrook garnered Freshman All-America honors. Max Schrock started 61 games at second base and hit .282 with six homers and 49 RBI with 36 walks to just 23 strikeouts and was second-team choice by Baseball America, the NCBWA and Perfect Game. Jack Wynkoop went 7-3 with a 3.09 ERA in 64.0 innings pitched on his way to recognition by Collegiate Baseball.

Holbrook's team succeeded off the field logging its highest cumulative GPA in school history with a 3.201 in the Fall 2012 semester. The Gamecocks maintained a high mark in the Spring of 2013 with a 3.050 GPA. The baseball team had 16 players named to the 2013 SEC Spring Academic Honor Roll. Among those were Dantzler, who was named 2013 CoSIDA Baseball Academic All-American of the Year. Dantzler was a finalist for the Senior CLASS Award. Senior right-hander Patrick Sullivan was South Carolina's male nominee for the 2012-13 Brad Davis SEC Community Service Scholarship.

Holbrook is the only head coach in South Carolina history to have led a team to the NCAA Regionals in his first two years as head coach. His overall winning percentage of .696 is the second-highest of any South Carolina coach in his first two seasons at the helm of the program.
