# QUICK PITCHES

- Mizzou returns seven of nine batters from the lineup used in last season's NCAA Tournament. Those seven batters accounted for 373 hits, 210 runs, 192 RBI and 29 home runs combined in 2014.
- Currently No. 20/21, the Tigers have been ranked in the Top 25 in both the USA Today/NCFA poll and the ESPN.com/USA softball every week for six seasons. Mizzou has been a Top 25 squad since June 10, 2008. That's 2,460 consecutive days.
- In **nine** appearances, sophomore pitcher Cheyenne Baxter has been lights out, surrendering two earned runs in 18.1 innings in the circle. Baxter ranks fifth in the SEC in ERA (0.76) and leads the conference in runs allowed (2) and hits allowed (14).
- Mizzou has won its last five conference opening games and six of its last eight since head coach Ehren Earleywine's arrival. In that span, the Tigers have a 10-7 record on conference-opening weekend. This is the first time Mizzou isn't starting conference play vs. Texas A&M since 2012, when the Tigers swept rival Kansas.
- The Tigers have swiped 25 bases as a team on 27 attempts. Mizzou's first three hitters in the lineup are responsible for 23 of the squad's stolen bases. Meanwhile, Tiger catchers have allowed just two stolen bases, the lowest mark in the SEC.

# CURRENT TIGER STORYLINES

### ARMS RACE

- Freshman Paige Lowary is off to an eye-opening start to her collegiate career, winning six consecutive decisions in her first six starts. Lowary was named SEC Pitcher of the Week for her performance at the Mary Nutter Classic after she went 3-0 in the circle, striking out 15 batters and allowing only four earned runs. The Dallas Center, Iowa, native ousted two Top 25 opponents in Arizona and Texas. She has a 2.29 ERA in seven appearances, limiting the opposition to a .224 batting average.
- » Despite losing two pitchers from, the Tigers return dominant ace, Tori Finucane. The sophomore was named the 2014 SEC Freshman of the Year and grabbed two SEC Pitcher of the Week honors last season. Finucane recorded 21 wins in 32 appearances, tossing 19 complete games and six shutouts. She opened her 2015 season with two dominant starts, allowing a run each to Louisville and UCF in complete games. At the Mary Nutter Classic, Finucane split a pair of starts, but picked up two crucial saves to help Lowary and the Tigers shut the door in tight battles with Texas and Arizona. The saves were the first two of Finucane's career and has her tied for first in the SEC.
- The Tiger pitching staff now owns a 1.75 combined ERA through 13 games. Mizzou has the fifth lowest ERA in the SEC.

### **OH WHAT A RELIEF**

» Sophomore pitcher Cheyenne Baxter has been a vital asset to the Tigers' early success this season. Baxter, who leads the SEC with eight relief appearances, has come in and shut down opposing lineups in the middle to late innings. The transfer from Nebraska-Omaha has an SEC-best 0.76 ERA, allowing a leaguelow two total runs in 18.1 innings in the circle. Baxter tossed 7.1 innings in relief at the Citrus Classic and gave up one run.

### SCOUTING THE GAMECOCKS

- Mizzou is 6-2 in conference opening games since coach Ehren Earleywine's arrival. This is the first time the Tigers' open their SEC slate with South Carolina. Mizzou is 3-3 all-time vs. the Gamecocks, but the Tigers have won the last three meetings since moving to the SEC.
- Led by head coach Beverly Smith, South Carolina is 15-5 with victories over No. 14/16 California, North Carolina and Stanford. Following two sub. 500 seasons, the Gamecocks have won 34 and 36 games, respectively in the last two campaigns. In those two seasons, the Gamecocks surpassed the 30-win plateau and clinched back-to-back NCAA Tournament berths.
- The Gamecocks have four hitters that have played 16 games or more batting north of .350. Junior OF Alaynie Page has started all 20 contests and currently owns a .441 batting average with 14 extra-base hits and 25 RBI. Senior Kristen Struett adds a .390 average at the dish and 23 hits for a tough 1-2 punch at the top of the lineup.
- South Carolina's pitching staff is paced by sophomore hurler Nickie Blue. Blue was a member of the 2014 SEC All-Freshman Team. She was the 2014 NCAA Divison I and SEC leader in saves with seven. Blue is 8-2 in 10 starts with a 0.93 ERA in 75.1 innings in the circle. She has allowed just 10 earned runs and thrown six complete games thus far.

### **ROCK AT THE HOT CORNER**

» Freshman Amanda Sanchez has started all 13 of Mizzou's games at third base. Sanchez has been efficient in the field while adjusting offensively, collecting 25 assists while only committing two errors. Sanchez had a breakout performance against Penn State, going 3-for-5 at the plate with three RBI. In that game, Sanchez pummeled her first career home run to tack on a Tiger insurance in the eigth-inning of a wild comeback victory for Mizzou. Sanchez has drawn a team-high eight walks and boasts a .413 OBP.

### **RACKING UP HONORS**

- » Four of Ehren Earleywine's players were honored on May 6, 2014, when the Southeastern Conference announced its All-SEC teams, which are voted on by the league's coaches. In additon to freshman P Tori Finucane's highest recognition (SEC Freshman of the Year), she also earned First Team All-SEC and Freshman All-SEC honors
- » Redshirt sophomore OF Taylor Gadbois and junior IF Corrin Genovese joined Finucane with First Team All-SEC nods in 2014. Gadbois finished second all-time in school history for hits in a season with 85 and tied for third all-time for steals in a season with an SEC-best 46 swipes. Genovese torched opponents, combining a sizzling .410 batting average with a slick glove in
- » A pair of Tigers were named to the annual Preseason All-SEC squad. Freshman pitcher Tori Finucane was one of the only three pitchers on the team. Finucane was also placed on USA Softball's Preseason Top 50 Player of the Year Watch List.. Additionally, junior OF Taylor Gadbois joined three other SEC outfielders on the list. In 2014, Gadbois became Ehren Earleywine's 11th All-American following a dominant sophomore campaign on the base paths. The Preseason All-SEC Team was voted on by the league's coaches. ### THE THIEF IS BACK

» Gadbois led the SEC in stolen bases with her 46 swipes in 2014. Her success ranked her in Mizzou's single-season Top 10 for stolen bases at third, all-time. The speedy junior patented the Gadbois' Double: get on base by any means necessary and immediately steal second. Gadbois has stolen 11 bases in 11 game appearances to start the 2015 campaign. She has a team-high 17 hits and 12 runs scored, batting .459 to open the season. Gadbois swiped six bases on six attempts at the Mary Nutter Classic. With 63 steals in her career she has cracked Mizzou's all-time top 10 list in that category in just 77 starts.

### CONTROLLING THE BASE PATHS

» Mizzou has swiped 23 more stolen bases than its opponents in its first 13 contests. The Tigers have stolen 25 bases in 27 attempts. Meanwhile, Mizzou catchers have allowed only two combined stolen bases, which tops the SEC.

### **POWER SURGE FROM FAGAN**

» Junior 2B/C Sami Fagan is off to a sizzling start to 2015. Fagan hit .353 at the Nutter Classic (6-of-17), with a team-best five runs batted in and three runs scored. Then at the Citrus Classic, Fagan went 5-for-7 combined in wins over Penn State and Maryland with four runs scored, four stolen bases, three RBI and two walks.

» Fagan has recorded three hits in a game on three separate occassion already. She has five multi-hit games and five multi-RBI games, recording three RBI in a contest on three separate occassions thus far. Fagan leads the team with 19 RBI and a .689 slugging percentage. Her career batting average improved to .359, moving her to fifth all-time in school history.

### **TOUGH AT THE TOP**

» Mizzou's first three batters have been responsible for most of the Tigers' offensive production so far this season. The trio of juniors, Taylor Gadbois, Emily Crane and Sami Fagan, have accounted for 47 hits, 34 runs scored and 28 RBI. The three have combined to hit .370 at the dish and account for 65 total bases. Addtionally, the trio has swiped 23 bases on 23 attempts to help launch scoring rallies.

### **TV TIME**

» The entire three-game set between Mizzou and South Carolina will be televised on the SEC Network. It's the first time the Tiger softball squad will be showcased on the channel since it was launched in August of 2014. Last season, Mizzou was featured on three national broadcasts, splitting a pair of ESPN games against Alabama and dropping an SEC tournament matchup with LSU on ESPNU. The conference-opening series begins Saturday and runs thru Monday.

# EHREN EARLEYWINE'S EXCELLENCE

**HEAD COACH** NINTH SEASON WESTMINSTER, 1994 2007 BIG 12 COACH OF THE YEAR 2011 BIG 12 COACH OF THE YEAR 379-124 (.752) AT MIZZOU | 525-180 (.745) CAR

Mizzou Softball has become one of the top programs in the nation, and is a perennial contender to reach the Women's College World Series under the direction of Head Coach Ehren Earleywine, a mid-Missouri native who enters his ninth year leading the charge for the Tigers. With a career winning percentage of .745 (523-179) over 12 seasons), Earleywine is truly among the top coaches in the nation. He is the 13th-winningest coach in NCAA Division I history entering this season, according to winning percentage

Mizzou enjoyed a proud softball tradition before Earleywine took over in 2007, but he's clearly since taken the Tigers to the next level. In the seven seasons before Earleywine's arrival, Mizzou averaged 32.0 wins per season (2000-06). The Tigers have averaged 46.1 wins per season in Earleywine's eight seasons in the dugout. Earleywine has built the Tigers by striving for excellence in all phases of the game. Shut-down pitching, consistent fielding and explosive offense have been constants during his tenure in Columbia. In his eight seasons at the helm of the Missouri softball program, the Tigers have made three Women's College World Series appearances, recorded the first three 50-win seasons in school history and have advanced to six NCAA Super Regionals. These accomplishments have come while building an incredible .752 winning percentage to rank as one of the winningest programs in the nation since 2007.

Mizzou Softball has competed at the highest level during Earleywine's time leading the Tigers, including the capture of two of the programs' seven all-time conference championships. As part of a stellar 50-12 overall record in 2009, Mizzou won the 2009 Big 12 Conference Tournament. The Tigers followed that up with a Big 12 Regular Season Championship in 2011, posting a stout 53-10 overall record. In Mizzou's first season of Southeastern Conference action in 2013, Earleywine's squad left an immediate impression. The Tigers placed third in the league's regular season standings before finishing as runners-up at the SEC Tournament.

Earleywine's teams have been ranked in the Top 10 for six straight seasons, including as high as No. 3 in the nation during a three-week run in 2010. Mizzou has finished as a Top 10 team in the polls three times under Earleywine's leadership

Big offense led to success in Earleywine's first season in 2007, in which he took a team that posted just 26 wins and had a losing record the year before and turned them into a 40-win squad that finished the year with a regional bid and a Top 20 national ranking.

Named Missouri's head coach in August of 2006, Earleywine's model for winning was rewarded with a seven-year contract extension on Aug. 31, 2011, making him the first Olympic coach in Missouri history to receive an extension greater than five years. In his eight seasons at Missouri, Earleywine has managed a record of 369-122 and became the fastest Missouri softball coach to reach 300 victories. Since beginning his head coaching career in 2003 at Georgia Tech, Earleywine has turned in a .744 winning percentage, the 11th-best amongst active Division I coaches. He was the fifth fastest coach to reach 100 wins in NCAA Division I softball history.

In eight seasons, the three-time conference coach of the year has become the first Missouri softball coach to lead his squad to six-straight NCAA Regional titles, doing so on the road in 2008 and again at home in Columbia, Mo., from 2009-13. In fact, Mizzou was one of only three schools in the country from 2008-13 to win six-straight regional titles. The Tigers were joined by Arizona State and Florida in achieving that feat.

Since Earleywine took the reins, Missouri's batting averages have been on the rise, which includes a .313 mark in 2009, a .304 mark in 2013 and a .310 rate in 2014, while the team ERA has been on the decline, highlighted by 2011's 1.40 mark, the Tiger's best end of the year ERA since 1998.

In addition to the success Missouri has seen on the field, Earleywine's squad has received exemplary marks in the classroom. Mizzou posted a 994 NCAA Academic Progress Rate (APR) for the 2011-12 academic year, the second highest mark for an SEC softball program, and they followed by ranking third in the SEC in figures for the latest report (May, 2014). In 2011, Missouri led the Big 12 with a 997 APR rate for the softball team, while 10 Tigers were named to the Academic All-Big 12 list, the most in the league. They followed that up with eight in 2012.


