

Mark Berson, the winningest active coach in NCAA Division I, has been at the helm of the South Carolina soccer program since his hiring in 1978 ushered the program to varsity status, a reign that stands at 38 years.

Before coming to Carolina in 1978, Berson went 11-5-0 in one season at The Citadel, putting his overall record entering 2015 at 472-215-68, a .670 winning percentage. In 2006, Berson became the 10th NCAA Division I coach all-time to reach the 400-victory milestone when his Gamecocks defeated UAB, 2-0, in a televised contest at Stone Stadium. Berson entered 2015 with a 461-210-68 record at South Carolina.

In 2015, Berson has received two huge honors. In January, the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) honored him with the Bill Jeffrey Award, given to an individual for outstanding service or achievement in college soocer, at its annual convention. In July, Berson was announced as one of eight selected to join South Carolina Lettermen's Association Hall of Fame, where he joins six of his former players.

Overall, Berson has taken the Gamecocks to 20 NCAA Tournaments, with those teams advancing to at least the second round 11 times. His squads have four quarterfinal and two NCAA College Cup appearances to their credit as well. In 1993, the Gamecocks advanced to the NCAA Championship Game.

Though Carolina has been independent during the majority of the program's tenure, the Gamecocks have captured four conference titles under Berson's leadership. Carolina won the 1993 Metro Conference Championship in one of its two years competing in the conference. The Gamecocks joined Conference USA in 2005 and promptly claimed the league's tournament championship. Carolina also won the C-USA Tournament in 2010 and collected the regular season crown in 2011.

Besides making an impact in collegiate soccer, Berson's presence is also felt in the higher ranks. The Gamecocks are one of only two collegiate programs to have had a player on each of the last four US Men's National World Cup teams. Josh Wolff competed on the US teams in 2002 and 2006 and was also an Olympic team member in 2000. Clint Mathis, a teammate of Wolff during his time at Carolina, also enjoyed a celebrated professional career that spanned 11 seasons in Major League Soccer. Mathis, who retired from professional soccer in 2010, was a member of the 2002 U.S. World Cup squad and helped his MLS team, Real Salt Lake, capture the MLS Cup in 2009. Mathis also graced the cover of Sports Illustrated in May 2002 prior to the World Cup, marking the third Gamecock athlete, in any sport, to be featured on the cover of the prestigious magazine. Former Gamecock goalkeeper Brad Guzan has been on the US roster for the past two FIFA World Cups in 2010 and 2014.

Six times, Berson has been recognized as a coach of the year. Most recently, he was the Conference USA Coach of the Year in 2011 after winning the league's regular-season title. In 1998, Berson earned Independent Coach of the Year honors after leading Carolina to the best record of all Independent schools. Berson has also been honored as the NSCAA South Region Coach of the Year on four occasions (1984, 1985, 1988, 1995).

Berson has been involved in soccer development as a coach, teacher and administrator on many levels. He is a U.S. Soccer National Instructional Staff Coach with an "A" coaching license and has served on the US Soccer National Instructional staff coach since 1989. He has served as State Coach for the South Carolina Youth Soccer Association (SCYSA), working in player development and coaching certification. In 1992, he was inducted into the South Carolina Youth Soccer Association Hall of Fame.

Berson coached the U.S. National U-18 team in the Granarkin/Leningrad Tournament in January 1989. In July 1987, he directed the South team to the gold medal in the U.S. Olympic Festival in Durham, N.C., one year after serving as an assistant coach for the South squad.

A 1971 graduate of Summit (N.J.) High School, Berson attended the University of North Carolina and received his bachelor of arts degree in journalism in 1975. Berson played

on the Tar Heel soccer squad for four years, one as a midfielder and the other three in goal. As a senior, Berson received the UNC Educational Foundation Award and was a member of the Academic ACC Honor Roll. Berson earned his master's of education degree in sport administration from Ohio University in 1977.

Born March 16, 1953, in Hartford, Conn., Berson is married to the former Shauna Hopkins, a South Carolina alum, of Columbia. They have two children, Erin Rhea and Luke William. Erin graduated from South Carolina in 2009, and Luke is currently enrolled at the University of South Carolina in the Moore School of Business.

OFFENSE HIGHLIGHTS FOR THE GAMECOCKS

- Senior Jeffrey Torda has three Gamecock game-winners, the second getting national recognition.
- His scissor kick goal made the No. 2 spot on ESPN SportsCenter's Top 10 plays for Aug. 31.
- Junior Danny Deakin has three game-winners as well.
- · Leading South Carolina in goals and points, Deakin recorded a hat trick and two braces as well.
- Deakin's three vs. UNC Greensboro on Sept. 8 Gamecock hat trick came almost exactly 14 years after the previous one, as Jordan Quinn recorded his on Sept. 9, 2001, against TCU.
- The braces (two-goal matches) came in home wins over No. 8 Elon, scoring both in the second half, and Florida Atlantic, tallying both in the first period.
- Junior Koty Millard has a goal and a team-best four assists, tying senior Ryan Arambula in helpers.
- Redshirt senior Asa Kryst has a goal and two assists, while junior Kurtis Turner has one assist.
- As a group, they have tallied 68 percent of the goals and 82 percent of the assists.

WE SCHEDULE TOP COMPETITION

- Of the 17 regular-season matches scheduled for the Gamecocks, 12 come against top-100 RPI teams in the final 2014 report from the NCAA.
- Ten of those ranked in the top 50, five from C-USA (Charlotte, Kentucky, UAB, Old Dominion and New Mexico).
- Four foes made the NSCAA/Continental Tire Preseason Top 25, with five more among those receiving votes.
- Eight of the Gamecocks' foes made last year's NCAA Tournament.
- South Carolina has faced six RPI top-30 foes already, nine in the top 50 and 12 in the top 100.
- The final two outings come against teams currently in the top 20 of the RPI.
- According to the NCAA's data, the Gamecocks have played the toughest non-conference schedule
 in the country and the 13th-toughest overall.

FORWARDS PRODUCED IN WIN STREAK

- Kevin Walker and Bjorn Gudjonsson came on strong during the Gamecocks' four-match winning streak.
- Walker scored the first Gamecock goal in three straight outings in the skein.
- He's the first Gamecock since Mahamoudou Kaba in 2013 to score in three-consecutive matches.
- Gudjonsson returned to the pitch at Marshall and promptly scored the game-winning goal, his
 first collegiate tally.
- In the evolving alignment, eight of South Carolina's last 13 goals have come from the front line.

GAMECOCKS SERVE COLUMBIA COMMUNITY DURING FLOODS

- Twice in the week after the unprecedented storms caused creeks to swell and lake levees to breach, this Gamecock team stepped out to help.
- On Thurs., Oct. 8 and Sun., Oct. 11, they assisted at centers helping those most affected, spending
 the first day at Harvest Hope Food Bank and the second at Rosewood Baptist Church.
- Donations were also taken at the Gamecocks' match on Fri., Oct. 9 against Florida Atlantic.
- Relief efforts continue, and the South Carolina athletic department continues to help.
- The University of South Carolina teamed up with local vender School Cuts to sell a T-shirt, with proceeds benefiting three non-profits who are assisting with the cleanup.

GAMECOCKS KEEP COSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT STREAK ALIVE WITH TWO PICKS

- Senior Jeffrey Torda and junior Ive Burnett gained CoSIDA Academic All-District 4 honors on Oct. 28.
- Torda garnered his second selection, while Burnett gets his first.
- The Gamecocks have had at least one honoree in each of the past 10 years and have had multiple students make the list for three consecutive years now.
- The two move onto the national ballot, and the Academic All-America Teams will be announced on Nov. 24.

THE NCAA DIVISION I ACTIVE WINS LEADER: MARK BERSON

- The only head coach in South Carolina men's soccer history, Mark Berson ranks as one of four coaches in NCAA Division I history with 450 wins at one institution.
- NCAA Division I's active wins leader, Berson is fifth on the Division I wins list and 15th on the alldivisions listing with 480 career victories in 38 years, which includes his 11 in 1977 at The Citadel.
- Berson coached his 750th collegiate match vs. Kentucky on Oct. 25, 2014, while his 750th South Carolina match came in the 2-1 win over Florida Atlantic on Oct. 9, 2015.
- He's coached 11 players who have captured 13 All-America nods at South Carolina.
- He's also guided at least one player on each of the past four US Men's National Teams in the World Cup (Clint Mathis 2002, Josh Woolf 2002 and 2006, Brad Guzan 2010 and 2014).

ATTENDANCE OUTSTANDING AT STONE STADIUM

- In the 2015 season opener, 4,325 fans packed the stands for the eighth-largest crowd to watch a men's match in Stone Stadium's history.
- In the Oct. 28 report from the NCAA, South Carolina ranks eighth in average attendance this season, with 2,614 fans counted through seven home matches.
- The Gamecocks have performed well for their home fans, going undefeated (6-0-1) so far.
- Over 1,000 season tickets have been sold for Gamecock Soccer in 2015.
- The first two exhibitions of 2015 had over 4,000 students scan in for each, filling the stands.
- The 2014 Gamecocks had the fifth-highest paid attendance average in NCAA Division I at 2,602.
- That 2,602 attendance average is the largest for a season in Stone Stadium history.

Homegrown Gamecocks Highlight 2015 Roster

- Eight Gamecock players hail from inside the Palmetto State, highlighting Mark Berson's commitment to recruiting and developing local talent.
- At least three SC natives have started in 11 of the 13 matches, with junior Koty Millard starting every match.
- For the past decade, South Carolina's roster has increased its number of natives on the team, with six or more on each squad since 2006, a mark only hit twice in the previous 15 years.

ROSTER NOTES

- South Carolina brings back 13 letter-winners and 16 members from the squad that made the 2014 Conference USA Tournament Championship Match.
- Ten newcomers join the group: three transfers and seven freshmen.
- The Gamecocks return 47 percent of their goals and 57 percent of their assists from last year.
- Third-team All-Conference USA midfielder Kurtis Turner is the top returning scorer.
- Turner has led the Gamecocks in assists in each of his first two years.
- Junior goalkeeper Marco Velez is also back after playing 87 percent of the minutes in goal and recording three solo shutouts last season.

THE GAMECOCKS SHINE IN THE CLASSROOM AS WELL

- South Carolina's 16 returners have a total of 26 SEC Academic Honor Roll certificates and 25 Conference USA Academic Honor Roll notations between them.
- Last season, 20 of the roster members picked up spots on each honor roll.
- Ryan Arambula (three) and Jeffrey Torda (two) both own multiple C-USA Academic Medals, which go to honorees holding a 3.75 cumulative GPA or higher.
- Both seniors also have CoSIDA Academic All-District nods.
- Torda earned his second CoSIDA Academic All-District honor this season, and junior Ive Burnett joined him on the 2015 team.
- Ten times, SC has garnered the NSCAA Team Academic Award, including in each of the past seven years.
- Twice in the past six years, the Gamecocks have captured the top GPA in NCAA Division I according to the NSCAA.

11th Year for South Carolina in Conference USA

- The 2015 season is South Carolina's 11th as a men's soccer affiliate member of Conference USA.
- In 2011, the Garnet and Black captured the league's regular-season crown, sharing it with UAB.
- Twice more, the Gamecocks won the league's tournament, in 2005 and 2010.
- South Carolina's student-athletes have 48 all-league nods, 14 coming on the first team.
- In C-USA outings, South Carolina owns a 43-30-16 (.573) mark.
- On the road, that mark is 21-15-10 (.565). At Stone Stadium, that record is 22-15-6 (.581).

SCOUTING OLD DOMINION

- The Monarchs are 8-2-3 this season, tying their last two outings against top-25 teams.
- After scoring multiple goals in seven of eight matches, Old Dominion has tallied one goal or less
 in its last four, including a scoreless tie against Kentucky.
- The only statistic that the Monarchs have a large advantage over their foes is in goals, scoring 25
 while allowing only 11.
- The three Monarchs leading the team in points got there in different ways.
- · Josue Henriquez has a team-high five goals on the season, including two game-winners.
- Ivan Militar leads the team in assists (5) while tying with Henriquez and Nik Klosterhalfen with 11 points.
- Militar is also tied with Henriquez with two game-winning goals.
- Klosterhalfen has four goals, tied with Jesse Miralrio for second on the team, while he's also second
 with three assists.
- Ryan Condotta has three goals, two coming on penalty kicks.
- Alex Tiesenhausen has played every minute in goal, posting a 0.79 goals-against average.
- He has five shutouts and stopped 50 shots in 13 matches.

SERIES HISTORY VS. THE MONARCHS

- Old Dominion leads the all-time series 4-2, winning twice in the last two seasons since joining Conference USA.
- In Columbia, the series is split 1-1.

GAMECOCKS HAVE A RICH HISTORY IN NCAA TOURNAMENT

- On 20 occasions, the Gamecocks made an NCAA Tournament, the most in Conference USA.
- Eleven times, the Gamecocks played the NCAA Tournament Round of 16.
- South Carolina is 16-19-1 in the tourney, making two College Cups in 1988 and 1993.

THE LAST TIME - Nov. 16, 2014 South Carolina at Old Dominion - ODU Soccer Complex

Trying to pull off another comeback, South Carolina could not get past Old Dominion, as the Monarchs captured the 2014 Conference USA Tournament championship with a 2-1 win.

Old Dominion scored in the 19th when Sidney Rivera poked in a loose ball in front of the net. Michael Nelson gained an assist on the play, giving the Monarchs the lead. Insurance came for ODU in the 75th minute, as Geoffrey

Hill polished off the feed from David Macsicza to put ODU up 2-0.

South Carolina cut the lead in half with eight minutes to play, as Turner sent a long ball down the left side that Wesley Eads got and fed across the goal to Jeffrey Torda, who put it in the net for the Gamecocks.

The Gamecocks came close to knotting things with five minutes to play. In the 84th, an SC cross in front of the ODU goal was not touched by a Gamecock standing inside the six, while Knudsen had a shot in the 85th that hit off the right post.

The Gamecocks' goalkeeper Marco Velez made four saves in the first half, keeping it a one-goal match. Many of those saves came on headers inside the six that Velez positioned himself perfectly to nab. South Carolina had eight shots in the first half, none coming on goal however. Mahamoudou Kaba posted two shots in the first five minutes, one going wide and the other high. Mikkel Knudsen also had two good looks later in the half, but both went left.

BEATING TWO TOP-10 TEAMS IN A WEEK BRINGS RECOGNITION

- The Gamecocks won their first game vs. an NSCAA top-10 team since 2013 by downing No. 8 Elon 3-1 on Tues., Sept. 22.
- They followed that with a 2-1 overtime victory over No. 7 New Mexico on Fri, Sept. 25.
- It's the second time South Carolina has downed top-10 foes in consecutive matches, matching wins in 2000 over No. 3 Virginia and No. 8 Maryland (9/8-10).
- Goalkeeper William Pyle earned the Conference USA Defensive Player of the Week nod and made Top Drawer Soccer's (TDS) Team of the Week for his efforts.
- College Soccer News (CSN) put midfielder Danny Deakin on its Team of the Week after his two goals in the Elon win.
- All four national polls recognized the Gamecocks, with the NSCAA putting the squad 19th in the country on Sept. 29.

GAMECOCKS VS. RANKED FOES

- South Carolina is 36-61-9 (.382) against foes ranked in the NSCAA top 25 (since 1996).
- Broken down by site, the Gamecocks are 19-27-4 (.420) at home, 11-23-5 (.364) on the road and 6-11 (.353) in neutral-site outings.
- This season, the Gamecocks are 2-3 against foes ranked at the time of the match, winning consecutive home matches over top-10 teams (No. 8 Elon, No. 7 New Mexico).

RECAP OF C-USA OPENING WIN AT UAB

- South Carolina used Asa Kryst's goal to take a 1-0 win at UAB to start Conference USA play.
- His game-winner came in the 55th minute, getting the help from Ryan Arambula and Koty Millard.
- Sophomore William Pyle, making his first Gamecock start in goal, made six saves in the win.
- Seven Gamecocks played all 90 minutes, including defender Matt McManis in his debut in the Garnet and Black.

RECAP OF GEORGIA SOUTHERN VICTORY

- South Carolina downed Georgia Southern 4-2 in its second match of the season.
- The highlight came on senior Jeffrey Torda's scissor kick goal in the 62nd minute.
- That goal, which proved to be his second game-winner of the year, made the No. 2 spot on ESPN SportsCenter's Top 10 plays of the day.
- Three other Gamecocks scored in the match, including the first goals as Gamecocks for senior Kevin Walker and junior Danny Deakin as well as the first of the season for junior Koty Millard.
- Three Gamecocks made assists, including senior Ryan Arambula on Torda's game-winner with his free kick.

Notes from Mercer Win

- South Carolina posted a 2-1 win over 2014 Southern Conference regular-season champion Mercer in the season opener at Stone Stadium.
- Senior Jeffrey Torda tallied his third career game-winning goal with a 55th-minute strike, assisted by junior Danny Deakin.
- The Gamecocks owned the lead since the 18th minute when freshman Ben Davidson curved his free kick around the wall and into the upper 90 of the goal.
- Seven of South Carolina's starters played all 90 minutes.

RECENT DOMINANCE OF ARCHRIVAL CLEMSON

- Since 2007, the Gamecocks are 6-3 against their archrival Clemson, with all three losses coming on the road (2011, 2013, 2015).
- The last four matches at Stone Stadium have gone to the Gamecocks, three coming in shutouts.
- It's the best stretch since the Gamecocks went 10-4 from 1985-95 against the Tigers, with three of the wins in that stretch coming in NCAA Tournament play.
