## Louisiana Tech Series Notes

The Lady Techsters lead the series 3-1 over the Gamecocks, but the two programs have not met since the 1982-83 season. South Carolina won the first game of the series, a 77-69 decision in the consolation game of the AIAW National Tournament in Mt. Pleasant, Mich. The Gamecocks were ranked fourth in the nation at the time and finished third in the event with the victory. The two teams met once in each of the next three seasons, culminating in LA Tech's 94-54 victory on Jan. 15, 1983 in Ruston, La.

## Scouting the Lady Techsters

After losing five seniors, Louisiana Tech has a young team this season, but its returners are setting a good pace for the newcomers. Junior center Tavasha Anderson opened the season with a 15 -point outing in the Lady Techsters' 66-59 loss at Tulane Friday night, hitting 4 -of- 6 from the field and all seven of her free-throw attempts. Sophomore forward Whitney Frazier, who earned WAC All-Freshman and AllDefensive team honors last season, added 10 points, eight rebounds and five steals to the season-opening effort in New Orleans. After two seasons at Temple, senior Brittany Lewis kicked off her LA Tech career with 12 points and eight boards, shooting 6 -of- 9 from the field.

Head coach Teresa Weatherspoon is in her fourth full season after taking over as interim head coach in February 2009. She has a career head coaching record of 73-35, all amassed at LA Tech. She has led her Lady Techsters to a pair of WAC regular-season titles $(2009,2011)$ and the conference tournament crown in 2010.

## Eclipsing Elon

The Gamecocks jumped out quickly in their season opener Friday night and kept the pressure on in a 77-44 win over Elon at Colonial Life Arena. Shooting 56.7 percent in the first half and forcing 22 turnovers in the game, South Carolina asserted itself on both sides of the ball early. Seniors Ashley Bruner (15) and Ieasia Walker (13) led the offense, while sophomore Elem Ibiam (11) and freshman Asia Dozer (11) set the pace on the glass. The Gamecocks went into the post early and often in the game, scoring 52 of their 77 points in the paint. It was the third season-opening win in head coach Dawn Staley's tenure.

## Old Home Week

South Carolina's first two games have included opponents the program has not played in decades, but the head coaches stalking the sidelines of both contests are much more familiar than that. As the players that laid the foundation of professional women's basketball in the United States have moved into the coaching ranks, it has come much more common for South Carolina head coach Dawn Staley to face off with former teammates and foes. After opening the season against Elon's Charlotte Smith, a teammate of at the WNBA's Charlotte Sting for six seasons, Staley squares off tonight against Teresa Weatherspoon, whose WNBA career overlapped Staley's for 10 seasons. In USA Basketball terms, Weatherspoon passed the point guard mantle to Staley after playing in the 1988 and 1992 Olympics, with Staley leading the United States to three straight gold medals in the next three games (1996, 2000, 2004).

## Road Warriors

The Gamecocks are 188-231 (.449) all-time in games on enemy territory, including a 13-26 mark under head coach Dawn Staley. Those numbers

improve when factoring in just non-conference outings. Since 1983-84 when South Carolina first joined a conference for women's basketball, the Gamecocks are 70-63 (.526) in regular-season non-conference outings. Staley's four seasons account for a 6-7 in that subset of games.

## Noting November

South Carolina is 75-39 (.658) all-time in games played in November. Those totals include a 38-10 record (.792) at home and a 21-17 mark (.553) on the road. Head coach Dawn Staley accounts for a 15-10 record (.600) in the first month of the season.

## Preseason Predictions

South Carolina was picked by both the media and league's coaches to finish in the middle of the 14 -team pack in the Southeastern Conference. The media predicted the Gamecocks would take seventh place, while the coaches slotted South Carolina into sixth.

Senior guard Ieasia Walker drew preseason second-team all-conference honors from both groups. She is the team's lone returning starter and the highest returning scorer from last year's squad. Her 7.9 points per game came with 3.2 assists per outing, which combined to earn her Second-Team All-SEC honors for the second-straight year.

## We're Back...

South Carolina technically returns just one starter from last season, but two others were key members of the Gamecocks' NCAA Sweet 16 run. Senior Ieasia Walker has started 64 of the team's 68 games over the last two seasons. As a sophomore (2010-11), she led the team in scoring with 12.2 points per game. Walker went on to pace the squad in assists, ranking seventh in the SEC at 3.2 per game, as a junior.

Among the team's other five returning letterwinners are senior Ashley Bruner and sophomore Aleighsa Welch, both of whom played considerable minutes last season. Bruner has proven over the last two seasons to be one of the SEC's most tenacious rebounders, overcoming her height disadvantage with good instincts and effort. She was among the league's top 20 rebounders last season and ranked sixth in offensive rebounding as a sophomore. Welch earned SEC All-Freshman honors after pacing the Gamecocks with 6.1 rebounds per game, good for 13 th in the league.

## Fresh Look

South Carolina head coach Dawn Staley added five student-athletes to her roster this season, especially providing talent and height on the backcourt while building a foundation for the frontcourt. The group is made up of the Gatorade North and South Carolina Players of the Year (Tiffany Mitchell and Asia Dozier, respectively), a Parade All-American (Khadijah Sessions), a top-30 point guard (Tiffany Davis) and a JUCO All-American (Wilka Montout).

## Quick Re-Take

South Carolina put together its best season in a decade last season, reaching the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 for the first time since 2001-02 and making the program's first ever appearance in the SEC

Tournament semifinals. The team's 25 victories tied for the most during the program's time in the SEC, matching that of the 2001-02 team, which advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight.
The Gamecocks found success behind a steady dose of stifling defense, ranked fourth in the nation, and a diversified offense. South Carolina allowed more than 55 points just 12 times in 25 games and held five nationally ranked opponents to that mark or lower. Seven different Gamecocks led the team in scoring, and eight scored in double figures at least once. South Carolina's 14-2 start earned the program's first national ranking since the end of the 2002-03 season, and the Gamecocks finished the season ranked No. 25 by the Associated Press. The team posted the most SEC wins since the 2001-02 squad also had 10 . Signature league wins included the program's first sweeps of Vanderbilt and Florida and its first win over Tennessee in Knoxville.
