

#### **TODAY'S GAME**

South Carolina begins the 2017 Southeastern Conference season on Wednesday when it travels to face Georgia in Athens. The Gamecocks aim to snap a four-game UGA win streak in the series. The meeting marks the 50th all-time between the Gamecocks and Bulldogs in Athens.

#### GAME STORYLINES

- South Carolina is in its 109th season of varsity basketball in 2016-17.
- On the sidelines, Frank Martin is joined by associate head coach Matt Figger, assistant coaches Perry Clark and Bruce Shingler, and director of operations Andy Assaley.
- The Gamecocks are 9-16 all-time in SEC openers, which includes a 3-10 mark in league openers on the road. Carolina has only faced Georgia once in an SEC opener, that game was played in Athens, with the Bulldogs winning 80-56 on Jan. 10, 2007. South Carolina posted an 81-69 road win in last season's opener at Auburn paced by 22 points and seven assists from then-junior guard Sindarius Thornwell.
- Foul trouble plagued Carolina in a 70-54 loss at Memphis to close the non-conference campaign on Dec. 30. Two Gamecock starters fouled out with several minutes remaining in the second half, as sophomore forward Chris Silva collected his fifth foul with 6:11 remaining, and sophomore guard PJ Dozier fouled out with 4:19 on the clock. The Gamecocks hit a season low 31.6 percent from the field, while Memphis hit 46.5 percent, which was an opponent high for the season. Dozier's 13 points led Carolina, while rookie guard Rakym Felder hit three 3s and scored 10 points for his second-straight double-figure scoring contest.
- South Carolina head coach Frank Martin is 76-78 (.493) all-time in conference games.

Rookie guard Rakym Felder was **8-14** from 3-point range combined last week vs. Lander and at Memphis. He scored a season high 20 vs. Lander and 10 vs. the Tigers.

#### A SOUTH CAROLINA WIN WOULD ...

- Snap a four-game UGA win streak in the series dating back to the 2015 SEC Tournament.
- Be the Gamecocks' first win in Athens since a 64-58 victory at Stegeman on Feb. 17, 2015.
- Improve Frank Martin's record to 3-8 all-time vs. the Bulldogs.
- Be Carolina's second-straight in an SEC season opener on the road after posting an 81-69 win over Auburn in last season's opener.
- Be just the third Gamecock win in Athens in the last 10 games at Stegeman.
- South Carolina is in its 26th basketball season as a member of the Southeastern Conference. The Gamecocks are 155-253 (.379) all-time in SEC games.
- The Gamecocks currently rank 51st in the NCAA RPI (games through Jan. 1), which is sixth in the SEC behind Florida (2nd), Kentucky (6th), Georgia (37th), Arkansas (39th) and Ole Miss (48th).
- University of South Carolina senior guard Sindarius Thornwell has been reinstated to full playing status and will be available for Carolina's SEC opener at Georgia on Wednesday, Jan. 4, Gamecock head coach Frank Martin announced on Monday. Thornwell was suspended on Dec. 4, 2016, as a result of a violation of athletic department policy.
- South Carolina currently ranks first in the country (NCAA stats games through Jan. 1) in 3-point field goal percentage defense, as opponents are hitting just 26.0 percent (59-227) from beyond the arc this season. - Carolina rebounded from a two-point loss to Clem-
- son with a 28-point victory over instate foe Lander on Dec. 27 at Colonial Life Arena. Rookie guard Rakym Felder erupted for a season high 20 points, hitting six baskets, including a 5-of-7 effort from 3-point range. Fellow freshman, Maik Kotsar, notched his first career double-double with 10 points and 11 rebounds in the winning effort. The Gamecocks hit 51.5% from the floor, converting on a season high 35-of-68 shot attempts in the game.
- Sophomore guard PJ Dozier snapped a streak of fivestraight games scoring 20 or more points when he tallied 15 vs. Lander on Dec. 27. His stretch of five straight over 20 marked the longest streak of its kind since mid-season during the 2009-10 campaign when Devan Downey hit 20 or more in nine consecutive
- South Carolina suffered a loss to intrastate rival Clemson on Dec. 21 at Colonial Life Arena despite a career high 26 points from sophomore guard PJ Dozier. Dozier recorded at least 20 points in five straight games. Sophomore forward Chris Silva recorded a career high 14 as well, but Clemson connected on 41 percent of its attempts from the floor, and was 5-of-6 from the free throw line in the final minute to close the two-point victory. Carolina hit just 35.5 percent from the floor vs. the Tigers, which was the Gamecocks' second-lowest percentage of the season.
- The Gamecocks rebounded from their first loss of the season with an 11-point road win at USF on Dec. 17. Trailing by six at halftime, the duo of senior guard Duane Notice and sophomore guard PJ Dozier record-

- ed 28 of Carolina's 46 second-half points to help the Gamecocks earn the road win. Carolina committed a season low seven turnovers in the contest, forcing 17 by the Bulls, and collecting nine steals and posting 16 points off of turnovers.
- The Gamecocks jumped in to the national rankings on Nov. 28 for the first time this season after posting wins over two ranked opponents the previous week in No. 25/24 Michigan and No. 18/16 Syracuse. The Gamecocks checked in at No. 20 in the Associated Press poll and No. 23 in the Coaches Poll. The Gamecocks have risen to as high as 15th in the AP poll this season, which was the highest rank for Carolina since the Gamecocks were ranked 14th in the final poll of the 1997-98 campaign. The Gamecocks high mark in the Coaches poll this season was at No. 15.
- South Carolina returns two starters and eight letterwinners from last season's squad that posted a 25-9 overall record, matching the Carolina record for total
- Those returning starters feature the only backcourt in the SEC with two 1,000-point scorers, in senior guards Sindarius Thornwell and Duane Notice. The duo accounted for 24.2 points and 6.1 assists per game last season.
- Thornwell was named to the SEC All-Defensive Team last March, while Notice was named the league's Sixth Man Of the Year.
- The Gamecocks began the 2015-16 season 15-0, their best start since the 1933-34 campaign.
- Carolina welcomes 10 newcomers to the squad this season in Tommy Corchiani, Rakym Felder, Hassani Gravett, Khadim Gueye, Evan Hinson, Kory Holden, Sedee Keita, Maik Kotsar, Christian Schmitt and Ran

## KEY STAT

#### **SCOUTING GEORGIA**

- Georgia enters Wednesday's matchup with a 9-4 overall record, which includes a 1-0 mark in league games after the Bulldogs came from behind to post a 96-84 road win at Auburn last Thursday in the league opener for both schools.



- UGA is led by head coach Mark Fox in his eighth season. Fox is 12-4 all-time vs. Carolina as a head coach.
- Junior forward Yante Maten paces the Bulldogs and ranks second in the SEC, scoring 20.6 points per game, while his 8.2 rebounds per game are a team best and rank third in the league.
- Maten was the team leader in Georgia's win over Auburn. He tallied his third 30-point game of the season with a season-high 31 points and added eight rebounds. He was 10-for-19 from the floor and he converted 9-for-9 from the foul line.
- Maten collected SEC co-player of the week honors on Monday for his performance last week in the win over Auburn.
- Senior guard J.J. Frazier also provides double digit points per game this season with 16.0 per outing. His 91.2 percent from the foul line is second in the SEC and ranks 18th nationally. Frazier averaged 17.3 points per game in three games vs. Carolina last season.
- Georgia is among SEC leaders in free throw percent (5th, 74.2%), rebound margin (4th, +5.4), assists (4th, 15.2) and assist to turnover ratio (4th, 1.1).
- Individually, Maten is fourth in the SEC in field goal percentage (56.4%), Frazier is tied for fifth in assists per game (4.4) and is second in free throw percent (91.2), and tied for fourth in steals per game (1.8).
- Georgia is 6-1 in home games this season, their only loss at Stegeman an 89-79 decision vs. Marquette on Dec. 4.

#### A LOOK BACK AT THE NON-CONFERENCE

South Carolina faced a tough non-conference slate in 2016-17, highlighted by four contests away from home, including two neutral site and two true away games. Carolina posted an 8-1 record at home during non-league action, with wins over La Tech, Holy Cross, Monmouth, SC State, Michigan, Vermont, FIU and Lander. Carolina posted a strong 64-50 neutral site win over Syracuse at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn, and also captured a road win at USF. Carolina's losses came in a three-point decision vs. Seton Hall at Madison Square Garden and a two-point home loss to Clemson before the break for the holiday. The final non-conference game of the regular season saw former Metro Conference foe Memphis post a 16-point win over Carolina at FedExForum. The Gamecocks conluded the non-conference slate at No. 50 in the NCAA RPI.

#### **DOZIER NUMBERS**

South Carolina sophomore guard PJ Dozier has tallied double-digit points in 10 games this season, including in eight straight entering Wednesday's matchup at Georgia, scoring at least 15 points in seven of eight games during the stretch. His field goal percentage of 45.8 percent (76-166) is nearly 10 percentage points higher than last season's number of 38.1 percent (91-239) during his rookie campaign. Most notably is his accuracy from beyond the arc. Dozier connected on 10-of-47 attempts last season (21.3%), and has already surpassed his mark of made 3s just 13 games into this season, hitting 23-of-52 attempts at 44.2 percent. He is also making a mark on the defensive end, leading the team and the SEC with 31 steals, 2.4 per game, which ranks 14th nationally.

#### **GEORGIA SERIES**

Georgia holds a 58-50 lead in the all-time series vs. South Carolina, including a 33-16 upperhand in games played in Athens. The Gamecocks and Bulldogs have met three times in both of the last two seasons, with UGA winning four of the six meetings, including four straight. UGA posted a 69-56 win in last season's meeting at Stegeman. Below is a breakdown of the series, and the last 10 meetings between the two schools:

- season high four steals vs. FIU. **144** Senior guard Sindarius Thornwell now ranks in the top 10 in career steals at Carolina with 144, including 11 this season.
- **58.4%** Rookie forward Maik Kotsar has hit 58.4 percent of his shot attempts through the first 13 games of the campaign, connecting on 52-of-89 attempts.
- **2,571** Senior guards Duane Notice and Sindarius Thornwell have combined to score 2,571 points during their time in the Garnet and Black.
- 510 Sindarius Thornwell ranks fourth among active players in the SEC with 510 career rebounds.
- **1,409** Senior guard Sindarius Thornwell ranks 15th all-time at Carolina with 1,409 career points. He needs 16 points to pass Melvin Watson (1,424) for 14th all-time. Thornwell is just the fourth Gamecock to score at least 1,400 points since the turn of the century.
- **1,162** Senior guard Duane Notice ranks 30th all-time at Carolina with 1,162 points. He is 31 points away from surpassing Michael Foster for 29th all-time.
- **29-2** Over the course of the last two seasons, the Gamecocks are 29-2 in games when leading at the half. Carolina was 20-1 last season when leading at the half, and 9-1 this season when holding the edge at the break.

#### THE DEFENSE

South Carolina is making headlines this season for its tenacious defense, which has held eight of 13 opponents to below 40% from the floor. The Gamecocks have ranked among the top 25 in the nation in field goal percentage defense at the conclusion of the last two seasons - 13th in 2014-15 when opponents hit 38.7%, and 25th in 2015-16 when opponents hit 39.7% - while Carolina currently ranks third nationally (opponent field goal percent of 35.9%) in the category this season.

#### **UP NEXT**

South Carolina continues SEC play when it hosts Texas A&M this Saturday at 1:30 p.m. ET in the league home opener at Colonial Life Arena. The contest will be just the sixth all-time between the two schools and the third in Columbia. Spero Dedes (pxp) and Clark Kellogg (analyst) will handle the call on the nationally-televised broadcast on CBS.

This marks the third-straight season that Thornwell has garnered preseason honors from the coaches, as he was named to the Preseason All-SEC Second Team prior to his sophomore and junior campaigns.

#### **2016-17 SCHEDULE**

South Carolina has an exciting schedule set for the 2016-17 campaign. The slate features 14 games, with 10 home contests, including one exhibition. Highlighting the non-conference portion of the schedule is the Gamecocks' participation in the Brooklyn Hoops Holiday Invitational, as well as a matchup versus Seton Hall in the Under Armour "Reunion" doubleheader at Madison Square Garden in mid-December. The Gamecocks will face eight teams that advanced to the postseason a year ago, with four of those NCAA Tournament participants, including Syracuse, which advanced to the Final Four.

### **GAMECOCKS CONCLUDE HISTORIC** 2015-16 REGULAR SEASON

South Carolina concluded an historic regular season on March 5, 2015, with a 76-61 win on the road at Arkansas. That victory set the school record for regular-season wins at 24. The Gamecocks began the season 15-0, their best start since the 1933-34 campaign, and the 24 wins marked the most since the 1996-97 squad also posted 24 victories. In addition, South Carolina's 11 SEC wins marked the most since 1998, match the second-most ever by a Carolina team and marked just the fourth time that the Gamecocks had double-digit SEC wins in their 25 years in the league.

#### **GAME 22 - GEORGIA 69. CAROLINA 56** FEB. 2, 2016/ATHENS, GA.

ATHENS, Ga. - The No. 25/23 South Carolina men's basketball team was unable to overcome first-half offensive woes and lost at Georgia Tuesday night, 69-56. The Bulldogs (12-7, 5-4 SEC) held off numerous second-half rallies from the Gamecocks (19-3, 6-3) and had four players reach double figures in scoring. Sindarius Thornwell and Michael Carrera finished with double-doubles for Carolina.

It was a slow start to the night for the visiting Gamecocks on the offensive end. The team started 0-of-5 from the field and sat at just 3-of-20 through the first 16 minutes of action. Thankfully for Carolina, the Bulldogs would not take full advantage and led just 23-16 when the Gamecocks broke a five-minute field goal drought with three straight makes to take it into the final three minutes of the half. A pair of baskets from Georgia's Yante Maten pushed the lead up to double digits heading into halftime, 33-23.

The Gamecocks shot just 6-of-28 (21.4 percent) in the first half. Sindarius Thornwell led the team with nine points and five rebounds, Michael Carrera pitched in eight points, four rebounds and three blocks. Georgia had a pair of scorers reach double figures in the period, with Maten and Kenny Gaines sharing the half's scoring lead at 10 points apiece.

Georgia's lead grew to 13 after a 3-pointer from J.J. Frazier opened the second half, but the Gamecocks weathered the storm and cut it back to a two-possession game thanks to an 8-0 run. In the span of just three possessions, Duane Notice and Thornwell hit 3s and Carrera added a jumper to cut it to 39-34 with 15:55 still to go in

While the Gamecocks were able to pare down the big lead, it would be unable to string together enough stops to get over the hump. The team came all the way back to two, 50-48, with six minutes left, but Georgia responded with two quick baskets. Three minutes later, Frazier hit a 3-pointer to extend the lead back up to seven. He would provide the dagger in the waning minutes, taking a pass off an offensive rebound and hitting another 3 to push the Bulldog lead to 62-53, its largest margin since 17:11 in the period.

After starting the second half hitting 9-of-16 field goals, the Gamecock offense cooled down at an inopportune time. The team made just one field goal in the final four minutes of the game, allowing Georgia to push back into a double-digit lead before the final horn.

#### **GAME 30 - GEORGIA 74, CAROLINA 72** MARCH 3, 2016/COLONIAL LIFE ARENA

COLUMBIA. S.C. - The South Carolina men's basketball team (23-7, 10-7 SEC) dropped a slugfest in its home finale Thursday night, losing 74-72 to Georgia (16-12, 9-8). The two sides would exchange the lead four times in the second half behind big runs, with the Bulldogs pulling ahead in the final three minutes

Mindaugas Kacinas led the team with 21 points on his senior night, with fellow seniors Michael Carrera and Laimonas Chatkevicius also providing big moments in their final game at Colonial Life Arena.

The Gamecocks came off the tip fired up and saw their first eight points come from Kacinas and Carrera, but the aggressive pace would work against them. After taking an 8-2 lead just three minutes in, South Carolina went through a four-minute scoreless drought that was compounded by a 10-0 run by Georgia to flip the score in its favor. Kacinas broke the stretch with his third-straight made 3-pointer, but the rest of the team shot just 1-of-10 from the field in the opening

Georgia's defensive zone slowed down South Carolina's penetration, forcing the Gamecocks to settle for 3s on almost half (16 of 37) of their possessions in the first half. When they could work it inside in the first half, they saw an effective performance from Laimonas Chatkevicius, who finished the opening period with six points and six rebounds.

After the 10-0 run to take over the lead, the Bulldogs held the lead for the rest of the half, pushing ahead by as much as eight before the Gamecocks cut it to 39-34 by the horn. Kacinas' nine points led the way for the home side, while Georgia's Kenny Gaines led all scorers with 14.

The Bulldogs opened the second half with four-straight points and threatened to put the game out of reach early, but the Gamecocks responded with an 8-0 run to cut the deficit to 43-42. The Lithuanians scored on back-to-back possessions, and Sindarius Thornwell converted on two trips down the court after that to force Georgia into an early timeout.

South Carolina wasn't able to fully capitalize on the run, though, as it missed sixstraight shots and committed four turnovers over the next five minutes. That cold ch allowed the Bulldogs to pull back ahead by multiple possessions, 47-42, with 12 minutes left to play.

Michael Carrera started his night uncharacteristically cold from the field, missing three of his first 16 shots from the field, but he would heat up at just the right time to get the Gamecocks out of their slump. The senior hit a 3 from the top of the key, then poked the ball away for a fast-break dunk on the very next possession to tie the game up at 49 and send the crowd into a frenzy. On Georgia's next possession, he pulled down a rebound and drew a foul. His two makes gave Carolina its first lead

of the night and capped a personal 7-0 run in just under 90 seconds. Georgia went over eight minutes without a field goal to allow the Gamecocks to take the lead, but a quick 7-0 pushed the visitors back ahead 57-55 after Carolina had a pair of misses around the basket.

The lead yo-yoed back to Carolina after baskets on three-straight possessions made it 63-60 with just 3:32 left to play. Thornwell again found success on the dribble-drive and earned a pair of easy baskets inside to help his side retake the lead. Georgia would get the last punch, though, with an 11-0 run to take the 71-63 lead heading into the final minute that would be too much to overcome. Carolina hit a trio of 3s in the final 30 seconds, but the Bulldogs hit their free throws and held off any chance of a comeback.

#### **GAME 32 - GEORGIA 65, CAROLINA 64** MARCH 11, 2016/NASHVILLE, TENN.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - The South Carolina men's basketball team (24-8) dropped its SEC tournament quarterfinal meeting with Georgia (19-12) in heartbreaking fashion Friday night, losing 65-64 in the final seconds of regulation. Sindarius Thornwell led the team with 23 points.

The early pace of play was very much in line with the recent history of the rivalry, with physical defense found on both ends of the floor. The Gamecocks took the lead from the jump, but both offenses suffered from turnover issues in the opening 10 minutes and scored just 15 points between them in that span.

The offense picked up down the stretch, first from South Carolina. The Gamecocks made 6-of-8 field goals over a stretch of five minutes to extend their lead as high as 11, 29-18, with four minutes to play in the period. Sindarius Thornwell led the way with 13 first-half points, but it would again be a group effort for South Carolina in the absence of Michael Carrera. Seven players would score at least a point in the first half.

Georgia made a run to close out the opening period, taking advantage of a four-minute scoreless drought from the Gamecocks after taking the 29-18 lead. Six free throws in the closing minutes made up the bulk of what ended up as an 8-0 run to send the game into halftime with Carolina ahead 29-26.

The opening 20 minutes were a defensive aficionado's delight, with the two teams forcing 21 combined turnovers and shooting just 18-of-58 from the field. The Gamecocks picked off six steals in the half, but only converted Georgia's 10 turnovers into six points.

South Carolina came out of the locker room aiming to break its scoring slump and did just that, scoring the first five points of the second half to force Georgia to burn an early timeout. The offenses for both teams would look inwards, scoring the first

-- points of the second half on two-pointers. Georgia would not make its first 3 of the half until 10:43 remained, but it was an important one. JJ Frazier's make pushed the Bulldogs up to a 9-0 run that cut South Carolina's lead down to 45-43. The lead would extend out to 13-2 and Georgia tied the game up at 47-all before Thornwell sank a clutch 3 to put the team back up

with nine minutes to play.

His basket would help the Gamecocks hold the Bulldogs at an arm's length over the next five minutes, but similar to how the game played out in the regular season finale, the Bulldogs would never go away and remained within three, 59-56, with four minutes left to play.

Behind an 8-0 run over a two-minute span, the Bulldogs took their first lead of the night at 60-59 with three minutes remaining, but again it would be Thornwell who broke their spell with a layup to answer. The two would trade leads all the way down to the final two minutes, when a Duane Notice free throw tied it up at 62 with 1:54 to play. Two more free throws from Marcus Stroman gave Carolina the lead, but Georgia responded with a basket with 20 seconds to go.

Carolina held for the last shot, but Thornwell was stripped with under 10 seconds to play and fouled Frazier. He would sink the first to clinch the win.

College Head Coach Kansas State, 2007-12 South Carolina, 2012-present Frank Martin was named the head men's basketball coach at the University of South Carolina on March 27, 2012, becoming the 32nd head coach in the history of the South Carolina program, which enters its 109th season as a varsity sport in 2016-17. Martin owns a 187-117 (.600) overall record as a head coach, entering his 10th season overall, and a 70-63 (.526) record entering his fifth season at South Carolina.

In Martin's fourth season leading the Garnet and Black (2015-16), Carolina put together one of the top seasons in its history, matching a school record for wins with a 25-9 overall record on the year, while the Gamecocks reached double-digit SEC wins for just the fourth time since joining the league, posting an 11-7 mark in conference contests. The SEC finish was Carolina's highest since the league combined its East and West Divisions prior to the 2012 season. South Carolina began the season 15-0, its best start since the 1933-34 campaign and went on to post a school-record 24 regular-season wins.

The Gamecocks received votes or were ranked for 15 weeks in the USA Today Coaches Poll, rising to as high as 15th, and for a total of 14 weeks in the AP poll, rising to as high as 19th, during the season. Carolina advanced to postseason play for the first time since 2009, making their 12th appearance in the Postseason NIT as one of the top four seeds in the event. The Gamecocks posted a win over High Point in the opening round, before suffering a season-ending loss to visiting Georgia Tech on March 21.

Three Gamecocks were honored with postseason awards by the SEC coaches, with senior forward Michael Carrera earning First Team All-SEC accolades, junior guard Sindarius Thornwell was named to the All-Defensive Team and junior guard Duane Notice was named the league's Sixth Man of the Year. Carrera went on to earn honors from several organizations following the best season of his career. Carrera, Notice and Thornwell each reached the 1,000 career-point plateau during the season as well.

Prior to his appointment in Columbia, Martin spent the previous five season as the head coach at Kansas State University, leading the Wildcats to the NCAA Tournament four times, including a trip to the "Elite 8," during the 2009-10 campaign when the squad won a school record 29 contests. Martin's Wildcats won at least 21 games in each of his five seasons at the helm, as the program compiled a record of 117-54 (.684) under his direction. During that time, Kansas State posted a 50-32 (.609) record in Big 12 Conference games, finishing fifth or higher in each season, with three season finishes of third or better.

A native of Miami, Fla., Martin earned his bachelor's degree in physical education from Florida International in 1993. He and his wife, Anya, have three children, Brandon, Amalia and Christian

#### **EXB - SOUTH CAROLINA 107, NEWBERRY 89 NOV. 6, 2016/COLONIAL LIFE ARENA**

COLUMBIA, S.C. - South Carolina opened its 2016-17 season with a 107-89 exhibition win over Newberry College on Sunday afternoon at Colonial Life Arena. Carolina shot 50.0 percent from the field in the game en route to its offensive outburst. Senior guard Sindarius Thornwell led all players with 34 points on 13-of-24 shooting. The Lancaster, S.C., native, recorded a double-double with 11 rebounds, which led the team. He also led the team with five assists and five blocks

South Carolina jumped out to a 12-point lead in the first half with 11:23 left, but Newberry would keep the game competitive forcing 12 turnovers and knocking down 10 shots from deep. Thornwell led all scorers at the break with 16 points on 6-of-10 shooting. He also led the team with five rebounds. Carolina shot 51.5 percent from the field as they headed to halftime with a 53-46 lead.

The Gamecocks opened the second half on a 29-11 run, building their lead to 81-57. Thornwell (10 points) and sophomore guard PJ Dozier (nine points) helped fuel the scoring outburst with 26 of those points. Dozier finished tied for second on the team with 17 points. Senior guard Duane Notice, last season's SEC Sixth Man of the Year, also poured in 17 points. Notice was 4-for-9 from behind the arc.

Carolina's defense ramped up in the second half holding Newberry to a 42.1 field goal percentage. The Gamecocks forced  $21\,$ turnovers in the game and out-rebounded the Wolves 52-33. Newberry, who looked to run all game with a smaller lineup, would finish the game with 39 attempts from three-point range.

With the win, South Carolina remains unbeaten in five career exhibition contests under the direction of Head Coach Frank Martin

COLUMBIA, S.C. - The South Carolina men's basketball team (1-0) opened the 2016-17 regular season with an 85-76 victory over Louisiana Tech (0-1) Friday night. Four Gamecock starters were in double-figures, led by senior guard Sindarius Thornwell, who poured in 18 points. The Lancaster, S.C., native filled up the stat sheet leading the team in rebounds (7) and assists (6).

Senior guard Duane Notice (17), sophomore guard PJ Dozier (17) and sophomore forward Chris Silva (11) were the other South Carolina starters in double figures. Dozier's 17 points were a new career-high.

The Gamecocks jumped out to a 7-2 lead to start the game behind five points from Dozier. The Gamecocks extended their lead to 16-6 after Thornwell hit a 3-pointer with 12:49 left in the first half.

South Carolina's half court defense was suffocating in the first 10 minutes, as they held the Bulldogs to 29 percent shooting from the field. Louisiana Tech finished half one 11-of-29 from the field (37.9 percent).

The Bulldogs closed the gap to 18-16 with 10:24 left, but Carolina pushed the lead back to nine at 36-27 with 2:36 to play in the half after backto-back 3s from senior guard Justin McKie and sophomore guard Hassani

Gravett ended the first half with an exclamation point as he tipped in a Notice 3-point miss at the buzzer. Carolina led 42-31 at the break as the, Villa Rica, Ĝa. native's, tip-in gave the team its biggest lead of the first half at 11.

Thornwell led all scorers at halftime with nine points on 4-of-8 shooting. He also had five rebounds and three assists. Junior forward Ran Tut had a nice first half off the bench, dropping four points and tying for the team lead in rebounds with five. Notice had eight points, Dozier seven and Gravett seven to round out Carolina's scoring in the opening period. Carolina out-rebounded La Tech 22-18 in half one.

In the second half, the Bulldogs cut the deficit to seven with 14:13 left after a 3-pointer by sophomore guard Derric Jean from the right wing. La Tech's Jacobi Boykins stole the ball at half court finishing with an emphatic dunk at the other end to cut the lead to 59-54. He was whistled for a technical foul after the play. Notice missed both free throws but Silvia put the Gamecocks back up by seven after a dunk on the ensuing possession off a great dish from Gravett.

La Tech's Daquan Bracy would cut the lead to four at 65-61, knocking down a 3-pointer with 7:58 left. Thornwell would answer the basket with a fast break 3 of his own from the left corner to put Carolina back up seven with 5:56 on the clock. The Bulldogs answered, but Silva increased the lead to nine with a 3-point play with 4:31 left after beating Jean to the hole for the and-one bucket.

Thornwell and Silva again halted La Tech's momentum after bringing Colonial Life Arena to its feet with two straight transition dunks, pushing the lead to 80-70 with 2:37 left, and the Gamecocks would close the nine-point win.

#### **GAME 2 - SOUTH CAROLINA 81, HOLY CROSS 49** NOV. 13. 2016/COLONIAL LIFE ARENA

COLUMBIA, S.C. - South Carolina (2-0) picked up its second win of the season Sunday night at Colonial Life Arena after an 81-49 victory versus Holy Cross (0-1). The Gamecock defense limited the Crusaders to just 17 second half points and 30 percent shooting (6-20) from the field in the half. Carolina senior guard Sindarius Thornwell had 20 points to lead all scorers.

After trailing 4-3 early in the game, Carolina went on a 9-0 run after a put-back dunk by sophomore Chris Silva that put the Gamecocks up 12-4. Senior guard Justin McKie extended the early lead to 10 after a transition layup put Carolina ahead 18-8 with 11:56 to go in the first half. McKie's layup forced Crusader Head Coach Bill Carmody to take a timeout after his team started the game 2-for-11 from the field (18.1 percent).

After the timeout, freshman guard Rakym Felder hit a 3-pointer from the top of the key to put the Gamecocks up 24-13. Carolina started the game on fire from the field, hitting 10-of-14 shots, good for 71.4 percent.

Holy Cross cut the lead to five at the 7:08 mark, but Thornwell answered with a post up bucket from the left block to put the Gamecocks up 33-26. Senior guard Duane Notice then hit a 3 on the team's next possession, putting Carolina up 10, 36-26, with 3:03 left in the opening half.

Senior guard PJ Dozier hit his third 3 of the first half from the left wing with 1:29 left to put the Gamecocks up 15. Holy Cross answered with a 3-point bucket of its own. The teams exchanged 3s again on their next possessions, as Thornwell hit from deep for Carolina and Robert Champion, the Crusaders' leading scorer from a year ago, hit one for Holy Cross. Champion's 3 cut the deficit to 12 just before the half with Carolina leading 44-32.

Thornwell led all scorers at the break with 14. Dozier was the second-leading scorer on the stat sheet with 13 first-half points for the Gamecocks. Notice had four assists to lead all players. Carolina shot 58.3 percent in the opening period, including going 8-of-13 from deep. Champion, and forward Malachi Alexander, each scored 12 points for the Crusaders to account for 24 of the team's 32 first-half points.

Carolina picked up right where it left off in the second half as Thornwell hit a 3 at the 15:03 mark to give the Gamecocks a 16-point lead, 53-37. McKie tallied his eighth point with just under 12 minutes to play with a high floater in the lane, which put Carolina up by 20, 59-39.

The Gamecocks defense remained locked in during half two. Holy Cross started the second half 4-for-13, just 30.8 percent from the field. Carolina's hot shooting continued on the offensive end, as it started the second half 8-of-16 (50 percent).

Thornwell hit his fourth 3 of the game with 8:34 left to put the Gamecocks up 66-42. He finshed the night 4-for-6 from behind the arc. McKie joined Thornwell in double figures, scoring his 10th point of the night with 3:08 left after stealing the ball and taking it coast-to-coast for the lay in to give Carolina a 74-47 lead late in the game.

#### GAME 3 - SOUTH CAROLINA 70, MONMOUTH 69 NOV. 15. 2016/COLONIAL LIFE ARENA

COLUMBIA, S.C. - PJ Dozier scored the game-winning jumper on a lob from Duane Notice as time expired in overtime Tuesday night at Colonial Life Arena to power South Carolina (3-0) to a 70-69 non-conference win over Monmouth (1-1). Senior guard Sindarius Thornwell led all scorers for the third-straight game with 23 points. He also had nine rebounds and five assists.

Tonight's game marks Carolina's third game in five days to open the 2016-17 season. Carolina got off to a fast start, opening the game on a 13-0 run. Thornwell and Notice each hit 3s as the Gamecocks opened the game 4-of-7 from the field. Monmouth started the game 0-for-9 and didn't get its first bucket until 13:12 left in the first half.

South Carolina pushed its run to 17-2 just before the second media timeout on a Chris Silvia made free throw. The Gamecocks went 9-for-13 from the charity stripe in the first 10 minutes, after a pair of Notice free throws made the score 19-2.

The Hawks would bartle back into the game, cutting the lead to 19-7 with 7:35 left in the opening period, after taking advantage of an 0-for-11 field-goal drought for Carolina that lasted over 10 minutes. Redshirt-sophomore guard TeMarcus Blanton ended the drought after knocking down a 3 to push the Carolina lead to 22-7 with 6:59 left in the half.

Monmouth went on a 6-0 run to cut the lead to nine at 22-13, but the Gamecocks remained ahead 26-13 after back-to-back buckets by senior guard Justin McKie. The Hawks scored the final two baskets of the half to make it 29-22 as the teams headed to the locker room.

Both teams struggled shooting the ball for long stretches in the first half. Monmouth finished the first half 7-for-30 (23.3 percent), while South Carolina shot 8-of-30, good for 26.7 percent.

The Gamecocks started the second half much like half one, going on an 11-0 run after knocking down 4-of-7 shots from the field (57.1 percent). They led 38-22 at the first media timeout. Thornwell (4) and Notice (5) tallied nine of the 11 points on the run.

The Hawks started half two 2-of-9 (22.2 percent) from the field, but then went on a 16-2 run, holding Carolina scoreless for nearly five minutes before a Silva reverse lay-in. McKie and Notice each hit 3s in the stretch to make it 50-46, but the Hawks got back within two at the under-eight media timeout. Monmouth took its first lead at 52-50 with 6:52 left after a put-back lay-in by big man Diago Quinn.

Thornwell scored five-straight points to put the Gamecocks back ahead, 55-52, forcing a timeout by head coach King Rice with 5:45 remaining in the second half. Monmouth then had a four-minute field goal draught before scoring four-straight to tie it up at 58-58 with 1:23 remaining. A pair of Thornwell free throws put Carolina ahead by two with 31.7 seconds left, but Micah Seaborn answered for the Hawks with two free throws of his own to jit the score again.

The Camecocks runned it over off an inbounds play with eight seconds left. Monmouth got a shot off from the right wing, but Thornwell skied high to block it. Carolina got the ball back with .07 seconds left. Dozier launched a half-court heave from the left side that rimmed in sundout and the carne beaded to overtime tied as 600 cm.

the left side that rimmed in-and-out and the game headed to overtime tied at 60. Dozier, who did not score in regulation, scored six of the team's 10 points in overtime, to propel Carolina to victory. Thornwell scored the other four points from the free throw line. Nine of his 23 points came from the charity stripe Tuesday night. Notice (15) and Silva (10) joined Thornwell in double-figures. Silva tallied his first career double-double after leading the team with 10 rebounds.

The Hawks finished the game with four players in double-figures. Chris Brady led the way with 17 points and 10 rebounds. Je'Lon Hornbeak (14), Micah Seaborn (11) and Justin Robinson (11) were also in double-figures for Monmouth. The Gamecocks held Robinson, who was the unanimous selection for MAAC Preseason Player of the Year, to just 2-of-13 shooting.

#### GAME 4 - SOUTH CAROLINA 90, SC STATE 52 NOV. 18. 2016/COLONIAL LIFE ARENA

COLUMBIA, S.C. - South Carolina (4-0) picked up a non-conference home win Friday night after downing South Carolina State (1-2) 92-50. Senior guard Sindarius Thornwell led all scorers for the fourth-straight game with 22 points (8-0f-15 from the field). It was Thornwell's third 20-point game of the season.

Carolina went to the first media timeout up 11-3, after starting the game 5-of-7 from the field. The Bulldogs cut the lead to 13-8 after an Edward Stephens 3. The Gamecocks then held the Bulldogs scoreless for the next 3:25 (14:44 to 11:19). Two Khadim Gueye free throws and a jumper by Maik Kotsar pushed the lead back to nine at 17-8 at the 13:44 mark in the opening period.

In the first 10 minutes, Carolina held SC State to just 29 percent shooting (4-of-14). The Gamecocks were the exact opposite, starting the game shooting 59 percent from the field (10-for-17).

Kotsar put Carolina up 25-11 after a nifty reverse layup with 8:56 left in the opening half to force Bulldogs head coach Murray Garvin to take his first timeout of the game. After the timeout, the Gamecocks went on a 10-2 run after 3s from sophomore guard PJ Dozier and r-sophomore guard Hassani Gravett.

Thornwell pushed the lead to 40-18 after knocking down a corner 3 with five minutes left to play in the opening half. The Lancaster, S.C. native, then hit another 3 with 1:46 left to push Carolina's lead to 45-23. The 3 gave him 16 first-half points, which led all scorers. The Gamecocks ended the half on a 5-0 run to take a 50-25 lead at the break. Kotsar had eight points at the break and led the team with seven rebounds. The Bulldogs did not connect for a field goal the final 2:41 of the first half and finished 9-for-28 (32 percent) from the field.

Carolina continued to build on its lead in the second half. Kotsar hit double-figures for the first time in his career with 16:54 left in the game after a put back lay-in off a Thornwell miss. The lay-in opened up a 30-point lead for the home team, 60-30.

The Gamecocks would lead by 26 or more for the rest of the night.

Kotsar, a native of Tallin, Estonia, finished the game with 15 points and eight rebounds. He was a perfect 7-of-7 from the field.

Chris Silva also was in double-figures with 11 points. He also had seven rebounds, including four on the offensive end.

Eric Eaves, the Bulldogs leading returner scorer, finished with a game-high 14 points for SC State.

#### GAME 5 - SOUTH CAROLINA 61, 25/24 MICHIGAN 46 NOV. 23. 2016/COLONIAL LIFE ARENA

COLUMBIA, S.C. - South Carolina (5-0) stifled No. 25/24 Michigan (4-1) 61-46 at Colonial Life Arena Wednesday evening, handing the Wolverines their first loss of the season. The Gamecocks had four players in double figures, led by senior guard Sindarius Thornwell, who finished with 21 points and 10 rebounds. It was the Lancaster, S.C. native's fourth-straight game scoring 20-plus and his first double-double of the season.

Carolina threw the first punch Wednesday evening, jumping out to a 13-5 lead at the first media timeout with 15:42 left in the first half. Notice and Silva combined for 10 of the team's first 12 points with five apiece.

Three forced turnovers and a 6-2 advantage on the boards aided the Gamecocks solid start. The Wolverines countered with a 7-0 run to bring the score to 13-12 as Carolina went scoreless for over four minutes.

Michigan struggled to shoot the ball against South Carolina's stifling defense the entire first half, but was able to keep the game tight with solid shooting from the charity stripe. Eleven of the team's first 18 points came from the free throw line, as they went 11-of-12 (94 percent).

The Wolverines led 20-19 but a Thornwell 3 put the Gamecocks back in front 22-19 with 7:56 left in the first half. Thornwell started the game 4-of-6 with nine points. Michigan answered right away and the teams headed to the under eight media timeout tied at 22-22. Up to that point, the Wolverines were just 5-of-19 (26 percent) from the field and 1-for-10 (10 percent) from behind the arc.
Senior guard Justin McKie came off the bench and scored five-straight points to put

Senior guard Justin McKie came off the bench and scored five-straight points to put Carolina back ahead 27-23. The Gamecocks remained ahead 29-25 at the final media timeout of the half with 3:43 left. Michigan's poor shooting continued, as it was 5-for-20 (25 percent) up to that point.

Notice ended the first half emphatically for Carolina with a coast-to-coast transi-

Notice ended the first half emphatically for Carolina with a coast-to-coast transition layup with 20 seconds left. His layup put the Gamecocks up 33-27 at the half. Carolina held the Wolverines scoreless the final 3:19 of the half. Thormwell led all scorers in the first half with 11 points on 5-of-8 shooting. Michigan shot 6-of-24 (25 percent) and 1-of-12 from behind the 3-point line. Sophomore PJ Dozier did an outstanding job on the Wolverines leading scorer, Zak Irvin, as he went 2-of-8 and scored just five points.

It was much of the same story for Michigan in the second half, as they started 1-for-6 from the field. Sophomore Hassani Gravett hit a jumper from the right wing to put Carolina up 37-29 with 15:47 left in the game. A Notice layup then put Carolina up by 10 with 14:48 left. It was the Gamecocks' first double-digit lead of the game.

Michigan's Muhammad-Ali Abdur-Rahkman tallied a 3-point play on the ensuing possession to cut the lead to seven at 39-32. That would be the closest the Wolver-ines would get the rest of the night. Abdur-Rahkman's lay-in ended a 4:08 scoring drought.

After a timeout by Michigan head coach John Beilein, freshman Maik Kotsar scored on an aggressive dribble drive to his left with 10:54 left to put Carolina up 43-33. A pair of Thornwell free throws then pushed the lead to 45-33 with 10:06 left.

An and-1 put back layup by Wolverine big man Mark Donnal ended a 6:53 scoring draught for Michigan. He made the ensuing free throw to cut the lead to 51-40 with 7:35 left. Gravett halted the momentum with a lob to Silva he threw down a thunder-ous dunk to push the lead hack to 13 at 53-40.

ous dunk to push the lead back to 13 at 53-40. With 3:07 left, Kotsar slipped to the hoop again. Thornwell fed him and the freshman big man finished for his 10th point, giving Carolina its biggest lead of the game at 59-43 with 3:07 left.

A Dozier steal put the game on ice in the final 1:20. He threw an outlet pass to Thornwell, who threw it ahead to Notice. The Toronto, Ontario, native, finished to put Carolina up 61-46 with 1:14 left.

#### GAME 6 - SOUTH CAROLINA 64, #18/16 SYRACUSE NOV. 26, 2016/BROOKLYN, NY. (BARCLAYS CENTER)

BROOKLYN - The South Carolina men's basketball team picked up another top-25 victory Saturday afternoon, earning a 64-50 win over No. 18/16 Syracuse (4-1) in the Barclays Center in Brooklyn, N.Y. as part of the Brooklyn Hoops Holiday Invite. The Gamecocks (6-0) had three players score 15 points or more, and used a fierce defensive effort to hold the Orange to 36 points under their season scoring average.

The Gamecocks set the tone early against Syracuse, softening its vaunted zone defense with a pair of 3s from Sindarius Thornwell and PJ Dozier to open the game. It took Carolina just 25 seconds to earn a lead it held for the entire half—and ultimately, the game—and after an 8-0 run the lead grew to 20-11 and remained at least a two-possession game for the final 10 minutes of the period.

South Carolina's defense frustrated and harassed the Orange, limiting them to just eight field goals total in the half and a 34 percent success rate from the floor. Driven by 21 points combined from Thornwell and Dozier, the Gamerococks took a 37-26 lead into the halftime break. As a team, South Carolina shot 50 percent in the half, making 11-of-21 attempts on two-point field goals thanks to great dribble penetration from the point guard tandem of Dozier and Thornwell. The duo's ability to get inside Syracuse's zone paid off all afternoon, with South Carolina enjoying a 30-8 margin in points in the paint by the time the final buzzer sounded.

Syracuse made a strong push out of intermission, starting with an 8-3 run to get the Barclays Center crowd of 8,733 on their feet in a 40-34 game. A Thornwell layup off a Maik Kotsar steal broke off the momentum for a spell, but Syracuse's pressure did not let up. Freshman Sedee Keita gave South Carolina some juice off a big block on a dunk attempt, with the ensuing rebound scooped up and taken coast-to-coast by Hassani Gravett for the lay-in. After the Orange split a pair of free throws, Duane Notice relived some more pressure on a deep 3-pointer to make it a 47-39 game with 13 minutes still to play in the game.

Foul troubles would be a major hurdle early in the second half for the Game-cocks, as Syracuse went into the double bonus with 11 minutes still to play while the Gamecocks saw the Orange whistled just twice in the same span. Free throw opportunities gave Syracuse a chance stop the clock and cut into its deficit, but Frank Howard missed four straight shots at the line to keep Carolina ahead by three possessions, 51-43, at the eight-minute mark. South Carolina's defense made sure that free throws would be the best looks the opposition could get; the Gamecocks held Syracuse without a made field goal from the 15:16 mark until a 3-pointer finally broke the spell with 6:37 to play.

South Carolina's offense would not enjoy the same success as its defense, though, as a scoring drought from 10:32 to 4:37 kept it from taking advantage of Syracuse's struggles. Kotsar flipped in his tenth point of the game off a helper from Thornwell to snap the dry spell and make it 53-46 with four minutes to go. The Orange's 17th turnover of the game on the following possession helped Carolina continue what would become a key 6-0 run over a span of three and a half minutes that put the Gamecocks back ahead by double-digits, 57-46, and they would cruise to the 64-50 win thanks to a 7-of-8 success rate at the free throw line down the stretch and just one Syracuse field goal over the final three minutes.

## GAME 7 - NO. 20/23 CAROLINA 68, VERMONT 50 DEC. 1, 2016/COLONIAL LIFE ARENA

COLUMBIA, S.C. - No. 20/23 South Carolina (7-0) downed Vermont (6-3) 68-50 Thursday night to remain undefeated. Sophomore PJ Dozier tallied a new career-high 21 points to lead the way for the Gamecocks. Freshman Maik Kotsar (14), sophomore Chris Silva (12) and senior Sindarius Thornwell (11) were also in double-figures.

Carolina jumped out to a 7-3 lead at the first media timeout behind five points from Dozier. The Gamecock defense was stifling in the early goings as the Catamounts started the game 1-for-6 from the field (16.7 percent). Two free throws by Dre Willis cut the lead to 7-5 and ended a 4:09 scoreless draught for Vermont with 13:11 left in the first half.

The game then went back-and-forth the next few minutes as the teams traded baskets. A jumper by Vermont's Cam Ward cut it to 13-11 with 12:01 remaining in the first half, but five-straight points by Thornwell pushed the Gamecocks' lead to 18-11.

Vermont closed the gap, but South Carolina pushed the lead back to seven at 24-17 on a jumper from Hassani Gravett. A Vermont 3-pointer and a free throw brought the game back to three points at 24-21 before Silva scored seven-straight points to make it 31-23, giving Carolina its biggest lead of the half at the under-four media timeout. Dozier hit a 3 to make it 34-23 on the first possession out of the timeout. The made 3 marked a scorching 14-for-21 (66.7 percent) start from the field for the Gamecocks.

A Silva and-1 play made it 39-25 with 2:21 left. Vermont would close the half on a 7-4 run, as Carolina led 43-32 at the break. Dozier and Silva were both in double-figures for the Gamecocks with 12 points apiece at halftime. The duo tied for the team-lead in rebounds as well with four. Thornwell nearly broke into double-figures for Carolina, as he tallied nine points in the opening period. The Gamecocks finished half one 17-of-28 (60.7 percent) from the field.

Carolina came out firing on all cylinders in the second half. Two quick baskets by Kotsar and a transition alley hoop from Thornwell to Dozier forced Catamount head coach John Becker to take a timeout just two minutes into the half after the 6-0 run by the Gamecocks.

The run was stretched to 13-1 after a Dozier made 3 with 16:10 left in the game. South Carolina's hot first half shooting continued as they started 6-of-7 (85.7 percent) from the field after the break.

The Gamecocks led 58-37 at the under 12 media timeout with 11:09 left after pushing the run to 16-5. From there, Carolina would lead by 19 or more the rest of the game.

Kotsar exploded in the second half with 12 points to lead all scorers. Dozier added nine and tallied his first career 20-point game with 4:52 left after a made layup. Thornwell got into double-figures with a made put back late, as he finished with 11 points and led the team with nine assists, which tied a career single-game high for the senior. The Lancaster, S.C. native, has been in double-figures every game this season for South Carolina.

COLUMBIA, S.C. - No. 20/23 South Carolina (8-0) picked up its eighthstraight win of the season after defeating FIU (3-6) 70-54 at Colonial Life Arena on Sunday afternoon. Senior guard Duane Notice tied a career-high with 27 points. He was on fire from deep, knocking down six 3s, which set a new-career high. Joining Notice in double-figures was sophomore PJ Dozier (20), who logged his second-straight 20-point game.

Carolina got off to another solid start as Dozier faked a pass to the corner and pulled up from the left wing knocking down a 3 with 17:11 remaining in the first half. The made long-ball forced a Panther time out just three minutes in as the Gamecocks opened play on a 7-0 run.

Freshman Rakym Felder ended the draught from long range and knocked down back-to-back 3s to put South Carolina ahead 24-21,. Jahmal McMurray then hit consecutive 3-pointers to put USF back in front 29-27 at the final media timeout of the first half with 3:47 left.

The Gamecocks trailed by six at the break, 37-31, as the Bulls ended the open ing period on a 14-4 run. Felder (3-for-6 from 3) and sophomore PJ Dozier (4for-9) led Carolina in half one with nine points each. Kotsar had seven points and led the team with four rebounds. McMurray led all scorers with 15 at the break (5-of-10, 2-2 from 3). USF held a 26-17 edge on the glass at halftime.

Back-to-back 3s by Notice brought the Gamecocks within two at the under-16 media timeout with 15:45 left in the second half. A Silva dunk and two Felder free throws put the Gamecocks back ahead, 48-46, with 14:47 to go. A Dozier steal and layup by senior Justin McKie then put Carolina up four, forcing a timeout by the Bulls with 12:16 left.

Dozier threw down a transition dunk after the timeout to cap a 9-0 run for the Gamecocks, which put them ahead 57-51. USF clawed back into it and pulled within one at 57-56 after consecutive 3s by McMurrav with 9:03 left. McKie answered with a 3 on the ensuing possession after an offensive board by freshman Khadim Gueye.

After a Dozier made 3 with 5:23 left, Carolina began to pull away. With the shot clock dwindling, the Gamecocks swung the ball around the perimeter and Notice hit his fourth 3 of the second half to put Carolina up nine, 72-63 with 3:05 left. The Gamecocks would lead by eight or more the rest the way en route to the 77-66 victory.

Felder and Dozier tied for the team lead with five assists, as Carolina matched season-high 18 assists on the day. Kotsar led the way on the glass for the Gamecocks, snagging nine rebounds. McKie recorded a new career-high with four steals to lead the team.

COLUMBIA. S.C. - No. 22/20 South Carolina (9-2) fell at home Wednesday night to Clemson (9-2), 62-60. PJ Dozier tallied a new career-high 26 points on 10-of-22 shooting. He also had eight rebounds and led the team with five assists. Colonial Life Arena was electric from the start, as sophomore Chris Silva threw down a thunderous dunk on the game's first possession. From there, it went back-and-forth and Carolina took a 7-6 lead at the first media timeout with 15:37 left. Three different Gamecocks scored the team's first seven points.

Donte Grantham gave the Tigers a 12-10 lead with 12:29 left in the half after itting a 3 from the right wing. His made long ball ended an over four-minute field goal draught for Clemson.

The Tigers pushed the lead to 17-14 with 7:32 left after another bucket by Grantham. A Dozier layup versus contact in the lane brought Carolina within two at 21-19 with 5:48 left. The hoop was Dozier's 11th point, as he was the game's first player in double-figures.

Sophomore guard Hassani Gravett pushed the ball ahead and brought the Gamecock faithful to their feet after scoring in transition to tie the game at 25-25 with 2:04 left in the opening half. Clemson ended a 2:43 scoring draught with a pair of Elijah Thomas free throws moments later to regain the lead 27-25.

The Tigers held a 29-25 edge as the horn sounded at the end of the first half. Dozier led all scorers at the break with 13 points on 5-of-8 shooting. He was 2-for-2 from 3. Grantham and Thomas led Clemson with eight each. Carolina shot 11-for-29 (37.9 percent) in half one, while the Tigers were 11-for-26 (42.3 nercent)

The Gamecocks opened the second half on a 6-0 run to regain the lead 31-29. They pushed the run to 8-3 after a dunk by Dozier that made it 33-32 with 18:07 left, but Clemson retook the lead 37-35 at the first media timeout of the second half with 15:48 remaining.

The score would remain 37-35 for the next 3:48 as both teams ramped up their defensive pressure. Maik Kotsar's layup with 13:20 left ended the draught for both teams. Carolina held a 39-37 advantage at the next media timeout with 11:27 left. A pair of free throws snapped a 6:05 scoring draught for the Tigers and brought them within one at 40-39 with 11:03 on the clock.

Silva converted an and-1 to put the Gamecocks up 46-43 with 8:40 to go. Clemson's leading-scorer Jaron Blossomgame brought them within one again at 47-46 with 6:26 remaining.

The Gamecocks led 54-52 at the final media timeout with 3:32 remaining.

Dozier made a tough, second-effort bucket to put Carolina up three, but Blossomgame made a tip in on the ensuing possession to bring the Tigers back within one. Head coach Frank Martin then took a timeout with 1:14 left, his team up 58-57.

Two free throws by Marcquise Reed put Clemson up 59-58 with 52 seconds left. Carolina got two 3-point looks, but senior Justin McKie and Gravett's shots just missed and the Gamecocks were forced to foul with 20.3 seconds left. Avry Holmes hit both to put the Tigers up three before PJ Dozier then was fouled with 9.8 seconds left and hit both to bring Carolina within one at 61-60. Holmes was fouled again with 9.2 on the game clock. He made the first and missed the second, but the Gamecocks were unable to convert on the opposite end and the Tigers held on for the 62-60 victory.

Felder led the way with 15 points, as he was 4-of-4 from behind the arc in the first half. Nine different players scored in half one for Carolina.

PJ Dozier (15), Duane Notice (13) and Kotsar (10) joined Felder in double-figures. Chris Silva tied Kotsar for the team lead with 11 rebounds and Carolina tied a season-high with 18 assists on the night.

**MEMPHIS, Tenn.** - The South Carolina men's basketball team dropped a 70-54 decision at Memphis (10-4) Friday night in its final game of 2016. Three Gamecocks reached double figures in scoring, but a season-low shooting percentage and a season-high 30 fouls stunted the offense. PJ Dozier led the team with 13 points in 24 minutes of action.

Both teams battled self-inflicted woes in the opening 10 minutes of the game, as South Carolina (10-3) shot well from the field but were held back by foul troubles and nine turnovers, and Memphis hit just four of its first 17 attempts. A jumper by PJ Dozier made it 15-12 in the Gamecocks' favor with 11:23 to play, but the Tigers countered with an 11-0 run over the next four minutes for their first lead of the night. Following the Dozier basket, Carolina ended the half just 3-of-14 from then on, but took advantage of a Memphis scoring spell late in the period to cut what once was a 10-point deficit down to five points at the buzzer.

Memphis took a 33-28 lead into the break, powered by 11 points from Markel Crawford. The guard accounted for almost half of his team's total field goals (five out of 11), as the Tigers shot 39 percent from the floor but made up for that with 10 free throws. South Carolina was led by six points from Chris Silva and five points from Hassani Gravett and Dozier, but were unable to keep a consistent lineup on the floor thanks to 13 team fouls that saddled four different players with two fouls in the period.

The Gamecocks were able to trim the lead back to one possession, 39-38, eight minutes in to the second half thanks to a 7-1 run. Memphis struck back with an 11-3 run over the next three minutes to ward off the Gamecock momentum, using five straight missed field goals from South Carolina to maintain the lead.

Foul trouble started to weight heavily on the Gamecocks as the final period wore on. Leading rebounder Chris Silva picked up his fifth foul with six minutes to go, and leading scorer Dozier took a seat as well just two minutes later. The Tigers pulled away late from the free throw line and took its largest lead of the game to the final buzzer, 70-54.
