TODAY'S GAME

South Carolina hosts Texas A&M on Saturday in the lone regular-season matchup between the two schools this season. The meeting is just the fourth all-time between the Gamecocks and Aggies, and the second-straight between the two schools in Columbia. Roy Philpott (pxp) and Jon Sundvold (analyst) will handle the call for the SEC Network.

GAME STORYLINES

- South Carolina is in its 107th season of varsity basketball in 2014-15.
- The Gamecocks are led by third-year head coach Frank Martin. His associate head coach is Matt Figger, his assistant coaches are Perry Clark and Lamont Evans, and his director of operations is Andy Assaley.
- South Carolina used stellar shooting and nine made 3s in the contest, to post a 64-58 road win at Georgia on Tuesday. It was Carolina's first SEC road win of the season. Sophomore guard Duane Notice and senior guard Tyrone Johnson led the Gamecocks with 17 points each, with Johnson posting four 3s and Notice three. South Carolina hit 58.3 percent in the opening half to hold a 41-23 lead at halftime.
- South Carolina's nine made 3s at Georgia marked a season high in the category.
- South Carolina held Georgia to just 37.7% (20-53) from the field, marking the 13th time this season the Gamecocks have held their opponent to under 40 percent from the field.
- South Carolina has victories this season over four teams in the top 50 of the RPI (Feb. 19) in Iowa State (10), Oklahoma State (28) and Georgia (43, twice).
- The Gamecocks suffered a 77-43 loss at Rupp Arena to top-ranked Kentucky on Feb. 14. Sophomore guard Sindarius Thornwell posted a game high 20 points, but the Gamecocks shot just 23.6% (13-55) from the field in the contest.

South Carolina ranks 12th in the country in field goal percentage defense (37.9%) entering Saturday's matchup vs. A&M. The Gamecocks have peaked at third in the country in the category this season.

Junior forward Mindaugas Kacinas is averaging 6.4 rebounds (2.8 offensive) per game over the last 5 games, which includes a team high nine rebounds vs. Georgia on Tuesday.

58.3%

The Gamecocks hit 58.3% from the field in the first half at Georgia. It matched the 2nd half at Auburn for the highest single-half percentage this season.

A SOUTH CAROLINA WIN WOULD ...

- Even the all-time series with the Aggies to 2-2.
- Improve Frank Martin's record to 7-4 all-time vs. Texas A&M.
- Be Carolina's fifth win this season over a team that is currently ranked in the NCAA RPI top 50.
- Be the 10th home win for Carolina, the most since 2012-13.

- The Gamecocks are in their 24th season of competition in the Southeastern Conference in 2015. Carolina owns a 142-243 (.368) all-time record in SEC play.

- Frank Martin owns a 63-68 (.480) all-time record in conference games.

- Sophomore guard Justin McKie returned to the lineup for Carolina at Kentucky after missing the previous five games due to a concussion.

- Rookie point guard Marcus Stroman missed his third-straight contest vs. Georgia on Tuesday due to a throat infection.

- South Carolina posted a 65-60 victory over visiting Missouri on Feb. 10 at Colonial Life Arena. The Gamecocks scored 28 points in the paint and 16 points off of 15 Tiger turnovers in the win. Thornwell and senior guard Tyrone Johnson each dished six assists for Carolina. Thornwell posted a team high 14 points in the win.

- An 18-0 run in the second half allowed Vanderbilt to post a 65-50 home win at Memorial Gymnasium on Feb. 7 over the visiting Gamecocks. Thornwell led Carolina with 12 points, and Notice added 10. The Commodores out-rebounded the Gamecocks 33-20, holding Carolina to a season low four offensive boards.

- Undermanned due to injuries, the Gamecocks suffered a 75-55 setback on the road at Arkansas on Feb. 3. Sophomore guard Sindarius Thornwell posted a team high 16 points in the game, including a pair of 3s in the first half. The Gamecocks struggled offensively, hitting just 27.9 percent from the field.

- South Carolina snapped a four-game losing streak on Jan. 31 with a 67-50 victory over visiting Georgia at Colonial Life Arena. Four Gamecocks scored in double-figures in that contest, led by 12 from junior forward Laimonas Chatkevicius. Sophomore guards Sindarius Thornwell (10) and Duane Notice (11), and senior guard Tyrone Johnson (10) also scored in double figures. Junior forward Michael Carrera led the Gamecocks for the fourth straight game on the glass, pulling down a game high nine rebounds.

- The Gamecocks held Georgia to just 22.0 percent (11-50) from the field, including just a 4-of-25 (16.0%) mark in the second half. Both figures set new Gamecock records for lowest opponent field goal percentage in a single half and for a game in the SEC regular season. It is also the lowest field goal percentage by a Gamecock

opponent since the addition of the 3-point basket in college basketball.

- South Carolina was in a back-and-forth battle on the road at LSU on Jan. 28, but the home team was able to secure a 64-58 victory in Baton Rouge, using key free throws from Jordan Mickey and Tim Quarterman in the final 19 seconds to seal the win. The Gamecocks struggled offensively, hitting just 34.4 percent (21-61) from the field, however, Carolina hit seven 3s in the contest. Mickey and Jarell Martin blocked six shots each for the Tigers.

- South Carolina suffered a 58-43 loss to visiting No. 1 Kentucky on Jan. 24 at Colonial Life Arena. In front of its first sellout since the 2011 campaign, the Gamecocks battled, out-rebounding the Wildcats 40-28, including an 18-3 margin on the offensive glass, but a poor shooting performance (12-53, 22.6%) from Carolina, saw UK claim the win. Sophomore guard Sindarius Thornwell led Carolina in scoring for the second straight game with 14 points, and junior forward Michael Carrera pulled down a game high nine rebounds, including five offensive.

- South Carolina upset No. 9/9 Iowa State on Jan. 3 in a neutral site matchup vs. the Cyclones at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn, N.Y. Sophomore guard Duane Notice led three Gamecocks in double figures with 15 points, while senior guard Ty Johnson and sophomore guard Sindarius Thornwell posted 13 apiece. Thornwell notched six of those points in the final two minutes of the game, also collecting his lone steal of the contest to seal the win for Carolina.

- South Carolina received votes in both the AP and USA Today Coaches Top 25 Polls for the week of Jan. 5. It marked the first time that Carolina has received votes in the AP Poll since Jan. 2009, and the first time with votes in the Coaches Poll since March 2006.

SCOUTING TEXAS A&M

The Aggies bring an 18-7 overall record, which includes a 9-4 mark in SEC games, to Columbia for Saturday's matchup. Texas A&M is currently projected as an NCAA Tournament team and according to ESPN's BPI, the Aggies' strength of schedule is rated the 21st toughest in the nation. A&M has notable wins this season vs. Arizona State, College of Charleston and New Mexico in the non-conference portion of its schedule, and a pair of wins over LSU, and road wins at Tennessee and Florida in league play. Junior guard Danuel House leads the Aggies with 14.4 points per game and 15.9 per game in league play. Junior point guard Alex Caruso leads the SEC (overall games) with 5.8 assists per game, which ranks 17th nationally. The Aggies rank third in the SEC in field goal percent (45.8), but rank last in free throw percent (64.2), while they are second in field goal percent defense (39.8) and second in 3-point field goal percent defense (30.0). Head coach Billy Kennedy is in his fourth season with the Aggies.

TEXAS A&M SERIES

The Gamecocks and Aggies have only met three times, with all of those contests occurring since Texas A&M joined the SEC prior to the 2013 campaign. The Aggies hold a 2-1 edge in the all-time series, but the Gamecocks won the only meeting in Columbia, 80-52, on Jan. 29, 2014. Below is the series breakdown:

17 - Senior guard Ty Johnson posted 17 points in Tuesday's win at Georgia, the most he has scored since posting 20 vs. Florida in the Jan. 7 SEC opener.

17 - Sophomore guard Duane Notice also scored 17 points in Tuesday's victory vs. the Bulldogs. It was Notice's highest scoring output in league play this season.

4 - Johnson's four made 3s vs. Georgia marked a new career high. He had hit his previous career high of three twice, most recently at Auburn earlier this season.

3.6 - Among freshmen in the SEC, Marcus Stroman ranks fourth in overall games with 3.6 assists per outing. In strictly league games, he ranks third with 2.7 per outing.

10-7 - The Gamecocks are 10-7 this season when out-rebounding their opponent.

4th - South Carolina ranks fourth in the SEC in average home attendance, as an average of 11,372 fans attend Carolina home games this season.

3rd - South Carolina ranks tied for third in scoring defense in the SEC (overall games), as opponents average just 61.8 points per game.

74.1% - The Gamecocks rank second in the SEC (overall games) in free throw percent, hitting 74.1 percent at the charity stripe this season.

84.6% - Senior guard Tyrone Johnson ranks third in the SEC (overall games) in free throw percent, as he has hit 66-of-78 attempts this season for a mark of 84.6%

38 - According to ESPN's BPI (Feb. 19), South Carolina's strength of schedule ranks 38th in the nation this season.

UP NEXT

South Carolina travels to Alabama for the second 2015 meeting between the two schools on Tuesday for a 7 p.m. ET matchup on the SEC Network. Led by 13 points from Ty Johnson, South Carolina posted a 68-66 win over the Crimson Tide in Columbia on Jan. 13. Following Tuesday's contest, the Gamecocks return home to host Mississippi State on Saturday, Feb. 28.

GAMECOCKS IN THE POLLS

South Carolina received votes in both the AP and USA Today Coaches Top 25 Polls for the week of Jan. 5 after their 9-3 non-conference record, capped by an upset win over No. 9/9 Iowa State on Jan. 3. The Gamecocks appear in the AP poll votes for the first time since Jan. 2009, and in the Coaches poll votes for the first time since March 2006.

THORNWELL SEC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Sophomore guard Sindarius Thornwell was named SEC Player of the Week on Jan. 5 after averaging 12 points, 6.5 rebounds and two assists as the Gamecocks downed North Carolina A&T and No. 9 Iowa State. It was the first conference player of the week honor for the Lancaster, S.C., native. He earned SEC Freshman of the Week honors three times last season. Thornwell opened the week posting 11 points, five rebounds and two steals, while matching a season high with four assists, and a career high with two blocks vs. North Carolina A&T. He followed that up with 13 points and eight rebounds against No. 9 Iowa State in the Barclays Center in Brooklyn, N.Y. Of those 13 points, ten would come in the second half, including six points in the final two minutes and a key steal to seal the win with 12 seconds left and the Cyclones looking to tie the game down 63-60. The win was Carolina's first over a top-10 opponent since 2010.

BREAKDOWN: IOWA STATE WIN

South Carolina's win vs. ninth-ranked Iowa State was the Gamecocks' first win over a top-10 opponent since Jan. 26, 2010, when Carolina defeated top-ranked Kentucky. It was also the Gamecocks' first neutral site win over a ranked opponent since defeating 14th-ranked Tennessee in the 2006 SEC Tournament. The win propelled South Carolina's RPI 43 points, from 129 to 86, and gave the Gamecocks a 9-3 record for non-conference play this season.

NOTICE SEC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Sophomore guard Duane Notice was named the SEC co-Player of the Week on Dec. 8 after averaging 23.5 points, 4.5 rebounds and three assists in wins over Marshall and Oklahoma State the previous week. The weekly honor was the first of his career. Notice posted back-to-back 20-point performances for the first time in his career, including hitting a career high 27 points in a road win at Marshall. He hit over 50 percent from the field in both contests, including a 10-of-18 performance at Marshall, along with five rebounds, four assists and two steals. Notice scored 20 points against Oklahoma State, including 12 points in the second half, helping the Gamecocks to victory. Notice also connected for 3-of-6 from 3-point range vs. the Cowboys.

SHEPPARD RETURNS FROM INJURY

Freshman forward Shamiel Sheppard made his collegiate debut on Dec. 30 vs. North Carolina A&T, after missing the first 10 games of the season due to a knee injury suffered this summer which required surgery. Sheppard battled through the rehab process and was nearly a month ahead of his projected schedule for return. The Brooklyn, N.Y., native played in his second collegiate game at the Barclays Center in Carolina's upset win over No. 9/9 Iowa State on Jan. 3, scoring two points and collecting two rebounds.

"I'm so proud of them. The Kentucky game was an aberration... We came out and we guarded, we fought, we clawed, we rebounded in the first half and then we stopped rebounding the ball. And then late when Mindaugas [Kacinas] was just great. I almost yanked him off the court when he shot that three, but he was great and his aggressiveness on the glass, Ty Johnson's three comes off his rebound, just really happy for our guys." - *South Carolina head coach Frank Martin's opening statement after his team's win at Georgia on Feb. 17.*

@ GEORGIA NOTABLES

- Six of Carolina's 13 wins have come against current RPI Top 100 schools (Clemson, Oklahoma State, Iowa State, Alabama, Georgia twice).
- Georgia posted only two second-chance points in first half, but finished with 16. It pulled down 12 offensive rebounds in the second half alone, one more than the total rebounds Carolina had in the half.
- Mindaugas Kacinas finished just one rebound shy of a double-double, posting a line of 13 points and nine rebounds in just 21 minutes of playing time. It is his fifth double-digit scoring effort of the season, and first since Jan. 13.
- Tyrone Johnson made a career-high four 3-point field goals in the game and played a season-high 39 minutes. His 17 points were the most in a game since he had 20 against Florida on Jan. 7.
- Marcus Stroman missed his third straight game with an illness.
- Prior to the game, head coach Frank Martin announced that sophomore forward Demetrius Henry and freshman guard/forward Shamiel Sheppard have been suspended for the remainder of the regular season due to conduct detrimental to the team.

KENTUCKY NOTABLES

- Justin McKie returned after missing the previous five contests with a concussion. He played five minutes total. Marcus Stroman missed his second straight game as he recovers from a throat infection.
- Sindarius Thornwell recorded his ninth career 20-point game, and second of the season. He also set a new season high with nine free throws made.
- The Gamecocks are now 1-12 against the AP No. 1 team, including a 0-5 on the road. The Wildcats lead the all-time series 49-11.

MISSOURI NOTABLES

- Sophomore guard Justin McKie did not play vs. Missouri due to concussion-related symptoms. Freshman guard Marcus Stroman did not play vs. Missouri due to an illness.
- The 25 3-point attempts are the most by the Gamecocks this season, and are the most in a single game dating all the way back to a Nov. 19, 2012 matchup with Rider. Duane Notice and Brian Steele each set a new career high in 3-pointers attempted, with 11 and six, respectively.
- The Gamecocks committed just ten turnovers for the game while forcing 15. It is the fourth time all season that the team has committed ten turnovers or fewer. In the 13 games where the team had a positive assist-to-turnover ratio, Carolina has a 10-3 record.
- The ten steals in the game were the most for Carolina in the conference season. Neither the Gamecocks nor their opponents have reached double figures in the category since recording 10 in a win over Iowa State on Jan. 5. Four different players had two steals.

@ VANDERBILT NOTABLES

- Sophomore guard Justin McKie did not play at Vanderbilt. He is still experiencing concussion related symptoms. Freshman guard/forward Shamiel Sheppard did not play at Vanderbilt due to a sore right knee.
- Junior forward Demetrius Henry returned for the Gamecocks after missing the last three games due to a concussion.
- The previous low in offensive rebounds for Carolina this season is eight, against Clemson. It is the fewest in a game since the team had four against Missouri State on Nov. 24, 2012.

@ ARKANSAS NOTABLES

- Sophomore guard Justin McKie did not play vs. Arkansas, he is still experiencing concussion related symptoms. Freshman guard Shamiel Sheppard did not play vs. Arkansas due to fluid on his right knee.
- Sophomore forward Demetrius Henry did not play vs. Arkansas. He is engaging in the gradual return to activity protocol after suffering a concussion last week, but was not available for the game vs. the Razorbacks.
- The Razorbacks finished with 71 field goal attempts, a season high by a Carolina opponent. The previous high was 65 by Oklahoma State, the Razorbacks reached 65 shots with more than six minutes to go in the game.
- The Gamecocks attempted a season-high 24 3-point attempts, surpassing a previous high of 22 from the non-conference season. All eight players in the main rotation attempted at least one shot from deep in the game.
- Tyrone Johnson played just 24 minutes Tuesday, his lowest since the Oklahoma State game on Dec. 6. His seven points marked just the third time in the last 12 games that he has not scored in double figures.

GEORGIA NOTABLES

- Carolina's win snaps a five-game Georgia winning streak in the series. It's the Gamecocks' first win over Georgia since a 57-56 home win over the Bulldogs on Feb. 15, 2012.
- Junior forward Laimonas Chatkevicius led the Gamecocks with 12 points. It marked the second time this season and the second time in his career that he has led the team in scoring.
- Sophomore guard Sindarius Thornwell collected three steals vs. the Bulldogs, marking his third game of the season with three or more steals, and the seventh time in his career he has reached the mark.
- Carolina held Georgia to 22 percent shooting (11-of-50), which is the Bulldogs' worst shooting percentage this season.
- The Gamecocks matched a season high by scoring 25 points off of 11 Georgia turnovers. Carolina also scored 25 points off of turnovers in a win at Marshall on Dec. 1.
- Both UGA's 16.0 percent in the second half, and 22.0 percent overall for the game set new Gamecock records for lowest opponent field goal percentage in a single half and for a game in the SEC regular season.

@ LSU NOTABLES

- Junior forward Demetrius Henry and sophomore guard Justin McKie did not play vs. LSU due to concussions.
- After either setting or tying a season-high in rebounds in each of the last two games, Michael Carrera set yet another high mark for the season with 10 boards. Four would come on the offensive end.
- The 13 blocks were the most by any Carolina opponent this season. The previous high for an opponent was nine by Kentucky in the previous game.
- Tonight was the team's first loss at the Pete Maravich Center since 2009. The loss evens the all-time series at 15.

- The Gamecocks owned a 19-7 advantage in offensive rebounds, but it only led to a 12-7 margin in second-chance points. Opponents are averaging just under six offensive rebounds per game in the last three contests.

During his time at South Carolina, Carrera has participated in numerous community outreach events, including visiting the Ronald McDonald House, several events with the South Carolina Special Olympics, volunteering at Harvest Hope food bank, visiting with Boy Scout troops, and he participated in a wish with the Make-A-Wish Foundation, among his many other service events.

THORNWELL NAMED SECOND TEAM PRESEASON ALL-SEC

Sophomore guard Sindarius Thornwell was honored with selection to the Preseason All-SEC Second Team last Thursday, the first preseason honor of his career. The Lancaster, S.C., native started all 34 games as a freshman, averaging 13.4 points, 4.1 rebounds 3.0 assists and 1.2 steals in 29.6 minutes per game. After leading all SEC freshmen in scoring and assists in conference games, Thornwell was named to the SEC All-Freshman Team last spring.

2015 SEC TOURNAMENT

The 2015 edition of the SEC Tournament will be held in Nashville, Tenn., at Bridgestone Arena. The tournament was last held in the Music City in 2013. South Carolina owns a 4-4 record in Tournament games played in Nashville. The SEC Network will televise the first three days of the SEC Basketball Tournament (March 11-15), while the semifinals and championship game will be broadcast nationally on ESPN.

DOZIER, SILVA SIGN WITH GAMECOCKS

University of South Carolina head men's basketball coach Frank Martin announced on Nov. 13 the signing of **P.J. Dozier** (G - 6-6 - 185 - Columbia, S.C. - Spring Valley High School) and **Chris Silva** (F - 6-8 - 205 - Roselle, N.J. - Roselle Catholic High School) to National Letters of Intent. A 6-7 guard, who is a point guard, who knows how to play off the ball. He has the ability, just like Chris (Silva) to be a tremendous defender. We are super excited for what those two guys will bring to the table. They complement our team in ways that we need and we are lucky to have both of them."

DOZIER NAMED MCDONALD'S ALL-AMERICAN

South Carolina men's basketball signee P.J. Dozier was named to the roster for the 38th annual McDonald's All-American Games, as announced on ESPNU Jan. 28. The men's game will take place on April 1, 2015, at the United Center in Chicago. Dozier is just the fourth South Carolina player to be selected to the squad, as the others include Dozier's uncle, Terry Dozier, South Carolina's all-time leading scorer BJ McKie, and Rolando Howell. It is Carolina's first McDonald's All-American signee since 2000.

Frank Martin was named the head men's basketball coach at the University of South Carolina on March 27, 2012, becoming the 32nd head coach in the history of the South Carolina program, which enters its 107th season as a varsity sport in 2014-15. Martin owns a 145-92 (.611) overall record as a head coach, entering his eighth season overall, and third season at South Carolina.

Since his appointment as head coach in Columbia, Martin, 48, has become a fixture in the community. He has spoken at numerous events, including Gamecock Club Fan Fests, numerous community council and rotary club events, coaching clinics, and the Fathers and Families Decades of Dads event, among others. He was also selected as a Court Coach for USA Basketball in June 2012, assisting Florida head coach Billy Donovan with the Men's U18 National Team training camp in Colorado Springs, Colo., at the U.S. Olympic Training Center. The camp was used to determine the 12-member roster that represented the USA at the 2012 FIBA Americas U18 Championship in late June.

Martin was honored again during the summer of 2013, serving as an assistant coach for the United States on head coach Bob McKillop's staff alongside Michigan head coach John Beilein for the U.S. Men's World University Games team. The squad spent time in Colorado Springs at training camp, before embarking on a two-week journey to Kazan, Russia, in early July, for the event. He furthered his international coaching experience as head coach of USA East Coast during the summer of 2014, which represented the United States at the Tallinn Cup in Estonia.

During his first season (2012-13) in Columbia, Martin led his squad to a 14-18 record, which included a 4-14 mark in SEC contests. The Garnet and Black captured the Hoops For Hope

Classic tournament crown after posting a 4-0 record competing in the event with home victories over Milwaukee and Rider, before defeating Missouri State in overtime, and UALR in Puerto Vallarta, Mexico, over the Thanksgiving holiday. Freshman forward Michael Carrera was honored after the conclusion of the regular season with selection to the 2013 SEC All-Freshman Team, as voted on by the league's head coaches. During the spring of 2013, the Gamecock coaching staff signed seven freshmen, while welcoming Villanova transfer Ty Johnson to the team, a recruiting class which ranked No. 23 in the nation according to ESPN.com.

Martin's second season (2013-14) leading the Gamecocks saw the squad win four of its final six games of the year, including two games in the SEC Tournament, marking the first Tournament wins for the Gamecocks since the 2008 campaign. Martin and his staff put together a non-conference schedule that challenged his team to prepare for the rigors of the SEC campaign. The Gamecocks posted several quality victories, including a win versus Saint Mary's at the Hawaiian Airlines Diamond Head Classic in December, and home victories versus Alabama, Vanderbilt and No. 17 Kentucky to name a few.

Martin tutored his second SEC All-Freshman Team honoree in as many seasons, as rookie guard Sindarius Thornwell led all freshmen in the SEC in league games in points (15.6) and assists (4.0) to earn a spot on the postseason team. Thornwell also garnered three SEC Freshman of the Week awards, and was named the Feb. 18 Wayman Tisdale National Freshman of the Week.

A native of Miami, Fla., Martin earned his bachelor's degree in physical education from Florida International in 1993. He and his wife, Anya, have three children, Brandon, Amalia and Christian.

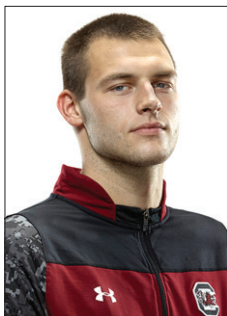

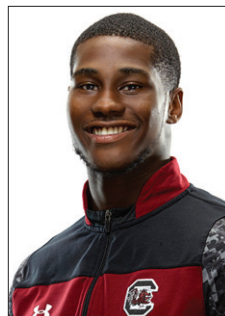

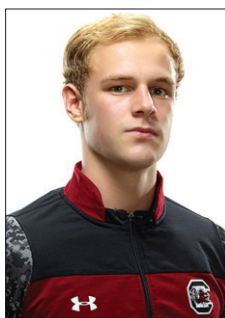
