Spring Outlook

EFFORT, TOUGHNESS, DISCIPLINE

After 11 seasons under the leadership of the Head Ball Coach, Steve Spurrier, Will Muschamp has been handed the reins of the South Carolina football program. Coach Muschamp assembled an energetic staff that immediately hit the ground running in the recruiting circuit. Now, after the 91 players on campus spent an offseason in the weight room under the direction of new strength & conditioning coach Jeff Dillman, who worked to instill a renewed dedication to effort, toughness and discipline into the program, Coach Muschamp and his lieutenants will take the lead. They have 15 spring practices to evaluate the returning talent, install new schemes, identify playmakers and infuse the philosophies and principles that will define Gamecock Football for the foreseeable future.

Coach Muschamp knows that there is much work to be done. Despite being just two years removed from three-consecutive 11-win seasons, the Gamecocks are coming off a 3-9 year, Carolina's worst record since a winless campaign in 1999. However, last year's squad showed that it was competitive more often than not, posting a season-opening win over ACC runnerup North Carolina and dropping five contests by a combined total of 20 points.

The on-field coaching staff, save one, is new to Columbia. On the offensive side of the ball, only offensive line coach Shawn Elliott is a holdover from Coach Spurrier's staff. Kurt Roper was named the co-offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach, and will have the responsibility for calling the plays. Bryan McClendon, who served as Georgia's interim head coach in its 2016 TaxSlayer Bowl win over Penn State, also holds the co-offensive coordinator title and will mentor the wide receivers. Bobby Bentley, one of the most successful high school coaches in South Carolina history, returns to the Palmetto State as the running backs coach. Veteran SEC assistant coach Pat Washington, an Auburn grad who has logged stints at Missouri, Tennessee, Mississippi State and Kentucky, will coach the tight ends.

Coach Muschamp has earned his stripes on the defensive side of the ball and will have tremendous input on the schemes and packages the Gamecocks will employ. Travaris Robinson will serve as the defensive coordinator and defensive backs coach. Lance Thompson was named the assistant coach defense and will mentor the defensive line. Fourteen-year NFL veteran Mike Peterson will be in charge of the outside linebackers, while Coleman Hut**zler** will coach the linebackers and will serve as the special teams coordinator.

The new staff will have 44 returning lettermen to work with, including 12 starters - four on offense, six on defense and two specialists. Key losses from last year's squad include wide receiver Pharoh Cooper, tight end Jerell Adams, left tackle Brandon Shell, tailback Brandon Wilds and safety Isaiah Johnson.

As is always the case in the nation's top conference, the road to Atlanta and the Georgia Dome for the SEC Championship game will be challenging. The Gamecocks' schedule is quirky, with three conference road games on the docket before the first conference home contest is played.

As has become somewhat of a tradition, Carolina will kick off the college football season on a Thursday night, this year drawing a contest at Vanderbilt. A second road conference game awaits the following week in Starkville against Mississippi State. The 2016 home opener is set for Sept. 17 against East Carolina, which will also be Parents' Weekend, but then another road conference game is in store for the Gamecocks, this time at Kentucky to wrap up the season's first month.

After traveling for three of the first four games, Columbia's Williams-Brice Stadium will host five consecutive games, including four conference tests, over a six-week period. Texas A&M and Georgia get things started in October before the season's only bye week. UMass makes its first appearance in Columbia on Oct. 22 before the Gamecocks host two more SEC Eastern Division rivals in Tennessee and Missouri. The Missouri game has been identified as this year's annual Homecoming game.

Two of the final three contests will be on the road, including a date at Florida to wrap up the conference slate, along with the annual Palmetto State showdown at Clemson on Nov. 26 in the regular season finale. In between is the final home game and Senior Day on Nov. 19 with Western Carolina providing the competition.

Spring drills get underway on Tuesday, March 15, when the Gamecocks hit the practice fields for the first time under Coach Muschamp and company. The spring culminates with the annual Garnet & Black Spring Game, which is set for Saturday, April 9, at Williams-Brice Stadium, beginning at noon. The game will be televised on either the SEC Network or on ESPNU.

Offense

The Carolina offense returns four starters from a squad that averaged just under 22 points a game, or 11 fewer than in the previous season. The Gamecocks return 48 percent of their rushing yards, 99 percent of their passing yards and

27 percent of their receiving yards from a unit that ranked 99th in the country in total offense a year ago. The returning starters are quarterback Perry Orth, wide receiver Matrick Belton, and offensive linemen Alan Knott and Mason Zandi. The biggest question marks entering the spring come at the skill positions, most notably, quarterback and wide receiver. The Gamecock coaching staff hit the recruiting trail hard in search of more difference-makers, but many of them will not get to campus until the summer. The spring will be a time to implement Kurt Roper's offensive schemes and determine which quarterback is best suited to run the attack when the Gamecocks travel to Vanderbilt to open up the 2016 regular season on Sept. 1.

Defense

The Gamecocks will look to shore up a defense that has registered back-to-back seasons. However, six starters return, led by second-team All-SEC linebacker Skai Moore. Moore has led the team in tack-

les in each of the past three seasons and has a chance to become the school's all-time leader in career interceptions. Other returning starters include defensive linemen Marquavius Lewis and Taylor Stallworth, linebacker T.J. Holloman and cornerback Rico McWilliams. In addition, Jordan Diggs is a returning starter who played safety last season, but is being looked at as a linebacker in his final campaign. Overall, seven of the team's top 10 tacklers return from a year ago.

Special Teams

New special teams coordinator Coleman Hutzler is blessed to have arguably the best returning placekicker/punter tandem in the SEC in seniors Elliott Fry and Sean Kelly. Fry continues in his quest to shatter nearly every placekicking record in school

history and has his eyes set on becoming the all-time leading scorer in South Carolina Football history. Kelly, a former transfer from FAU, was outstanding in his first season in the Garnet & Black, helping the Gamecocks rank second in the SEC and seventh in the nation in net punting yards (41.3). Senior Drew Williams returns as the incumbent to handle the deep snapping duties for a third-straight season. As is usually the case in the spring, the Gamecocks will take a look at several candidates to handle kickoff and punt returns. Sophomore Rashad Fenton is certainly a candidate for kick return duty, as he averaged over 26 yards per return last season, and took one to the house at LSU. The sure hands of Pharoh Cooper on punt returns will be missed.

Spring Notebook

CAROLINA FOOTBALL

QUICKLY: It's a new era of South Carolina Football as Will Muschamp takes over as the program's 34th head coach. The Muschamp Era gets underway with the start of spring drills on Tuesday, March 15. The Gamecocks will go through 15 spring practices, culminating with the Garnet & Black Spring Game on Saturday, April 9. Practice dates are set for March 15, 17, 18, 19, 22, 24, 25, 26, 29 and 31 and April 2, 5, 7, 8 and 9. All dates are subject to change.

WE'RE TALKING ABOUT PRACTICE: Most practices will be held at the new practice fields, located at the west end of Gamecock Park, beginning at 4:30 p.m. Saturday scrimmages will take place in Williams-Brice Stadium. Please refer to GamecocksOnline.com, the official website of Gamecock Athletics, for the latest practice information. With the exception of March 29 and 31 and the spring game on April 9, practices will be closed to the public. Media members will be able to watch the flex period, along with the first three periods of the practices scheduled for March 15, 17, 18, 22 and 24, and April 5 and 7. No autographs will be allowed before, during or after any of the practices.

THE SPRING GAME: The annual Garnet & Black Spring Game is Saturday, April 9. Game time is set for Noon ET at Williams-Brice Stadium. Admission is free. The game will be televised on either the SEC Network or ESPNU.

PRO TIMING DAY: South Carolina will hold its annual Pro Timing Day on Wednesday, March 30. The event will begin in the Crews Building weight room and will be closed. The field work that will take place at Williams-Brice Stadium is open to the public. In the event of inclement weather, the field work will move to the indoor practice facility and will be closed to the public. Four former Gamecock players, tight end Jerell Adams, wide receiver Pharoh Cooper, offensive tackle Brandon Shell and running back Brandon Wilds, were invited to the NFL Combine. The NFL Draft is set for April 28-30 in Chicago.

THE HISTORY: 2016 will mark the 123rd season of intercollegiate football at the University of South Carolina, dating back to 1892. It is the 110th-consecutive year in which South Carolina has competed on the gridiron. The University did not field a team in either 1893 or 1906. Carolina owns an all-time record of 586-562-44.

SEC HISTORY: The 2016 season will mark South Carolina's 25th year in the Southeastern Conference. South Carolina and Arkansas joined the league prior to the 1992 campaign. The Gamecocks earned the SEC Eastern Division title in the 2010 season. The Gamecocks are 82-109-1 (.430) all-time in SEC regular-season play, but are 27-21 (.563) in conference action since the start of the 2010 season.

2015 IN REVIEW: South Carolina football concluded its 122nd season of intercollegiate football in 2015 with a record of 3-9, including a 1-7 mark in the SEC. Five of the losses were decided by a combined total of 20 points. The Gamecocks had their school record of 11-straight seasons with at least a .500 record snapped in the process.

IT TOOK TWO: The Gamecocks had two head coaches during the 2015 season. Steve Spurrier, the winningest football coach in South Carolina history, stepped down after a 2-4 start to the season. The reins were turned over to co-offensive coordinator/offensive line coach Shawn Elliott. Despite bringing a renewed energy to the team, the Gamecocks, under Elliott, were able to win just one of their final six games. Spurrier finished his Carolina career with a record of 86-49 (.637) and a 26-year collegiate coaching mark of 228-89-2 (.718).

SO YOU'RE SAYIN' THERE'S A CHANCE:

Despite winning just three games last season including a victory over No. 15 North Carolina, the Gamecocks lost their share of close contests. Five of their setbacks were within one score and were decided by a total of 20 points, including losses to Kentucky (by 4), at Texas A&M (7), at Tennessee (3), The Citadel (1) and Clemson (5). Four of their losses came to teams ranked in the AP's final top-25 (#2 Clemson, #16 LSU, #22 Tennessee and #25 Florida), while another setback came at Georgia, ranked 24th in the final Coaches' poll.

A NEW SHERIFF IN TOWN: Will Muschamp was introduced as the 34th head football coach at the University of South Carolina on December 7, 2015. A 21-year coaching veteran, Muschamp, a 1994 graduate of the University of Georgia, has spent 13 years in the SEC, including four as the head coach at Florida, where he posted a 28-21 record from 2011-14. He was recognized as the SEC Coach of the Year in 2012 after an 11-win campaign. Last season, he served as the defensive coordinator at Auburn. Muschamp has coached in the SEC Championship Game twice and once in the Big 12 Championship Game, winning all three. He has also coached in two national championship games, helping LSU win the national title in 2003.

AND HE BROUGHT HIS POSSE: With the exception of holdover offensive line coach Shawn Elliott, Coach Muschamp brought an entirely new coaching staff to Columbia. Bobby Bentley (Running Backs), Coleman Hutzler (Special Teams Coordinator/Linebackers), Bryan Mc-Clendon (Co-Offensive Coordinator/Wide Receivers), Mike Peterson (Outside Linebackers), Travaris Robinson (Defensive Coordinator/Defensive Backs), Kurt Roper (Co-Offensive Coordinator/Quarterbacks), Lance Thompson (Assistant Head Coach - Defense/Defensive Line), and Pat Washington (Tight Ends) are the newcomers.

Spring Notebook

BREAKING IT DOWN: The 91-man spring roster (as of March 1) consists of 20 seniors, 20 juniors, 22 sophomores, 22 redshirt freshmen and seven true freshmen.

THEY'RE BACK: The Gamecocks welcome 44 returning letterwinners to begin the 2016 spring session. The 44 lettermen consist of 19 offensive players, 21 defensive players and four special teams players.

IT'S A NUMBERS GAME: The Gamecocks return 48 percent of their rushing yards, 99 percent of their passing yards and 27 percent of their receiving yards from a year ago. The top returning rushers are Lorenzo Nuñez (375 yards) and **David Williams** (299). **Perry Orth** (1,929 yards) and Lorenzo Nuñez (376) are the top returning passers, while Deebo Samuel (12 catches, 161 vards) and Matrick Belton (11 for 121) are the top two returning receivers. Seven of the squad's top 10 tacklers return for the 2016 season, including Skai Moore (111 tackles) and T.J. Holloman (63).

RETURNING STARTERS: The Gamecocks list 12 returning starters from the 2015 squad (four on offense, six on defense and two specialists). The returning offensive starters are WR Matrick Belton, OC Alan Knott, QB Perry Orth and OT Mason Zandi. The returning defensive starters include SS Jordan Diggs, LB T.J. Holloman, DE Marquavius Lewis, CB Rico McWilliams, LB Skai Moore, and DT Taylor Stallworth. The returning specialists are PK Elliott Fry and P Sean Kelly.

EVERY TIME OUT: The Gamecocks had six players start every game in 2015, three on each side of the ball. On offense, WR Pharoh Cooper, LT Brandon Shell and RG Will Sport made every start. On defense, DT Gerald Dixon Jr., DE Marquavius Lewis and FS Isaiah Johnson started each contest. Lewis is the only player who will return in 2016.

MISSING YOU: The Gamecocks lost 25 lettermen, including 14 on offense, 10 on defense and one special teams performer.

GONE BUT NOT FORGOTTEN: The Gamecocks said goodbye to 25 lettermen from last year's roster including 12 starters. The departing starters include TE Jerell Adams, WR Pharoh Cooper, WR Carlton Heard, LG Mike Matulis, LT Brandon Shell, RG Will Sport and TB Brandon Wilds on offense and DE Gerald Dixon, DT Gerald Dixon Jr., Spur T.J. Gurley, CB Al Harris Jr., and FS Isaiah Johnson on defense.

IN THE CLASSROOM: The Gamecocks placed 28 players on the 2015 SEC Fall Academic Honor Roll. Among those who made the SEC Honor Roll include returnees Rivers Bedenbaugh, Jor-

dan Diggs, Jalen Dread, Elliott Fry, Kelsey Griffin, Terry Googer, Ali Groves, Shannon James, Chris Lammons, Cedrick Malone, Nick McGriff, Perry Orth, Jasper Sasser, Michael Scarnecchia, Demetrius Smalls, D.J. Smith, Donell Stanley and Rod Talley.

HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE: The Gamecocks are 24-7 in their last 31 home games (.774) and 40-10 (.800) in their last 50 home games, including a school-record 18-game game home winning streak during that span. The school's previous longest home winning streak was 15 games, set from 1978-80.

THEY'RE NOT SEC WORTHY: South Carolina has won 21 of its last 24 non-conference games. The Gamecocks had their 18-game nonconference winning streak snapped in the 2014 regular season finale at Clemson, then lost the final two games of the 2015 regular season to nonconference in-state foes in The Citadel and Clemson. Prior to the Clemson loss at the end of the 2014 campaign, Carolina's last non-conference loss came to Florida State in the 2010 Chick-fil-A Bowl.

NOT IN OUR HOUSE: South Carolina had won 22-straight home games against non-conference opponents before dropping the final two games of the 2015 regular season to non-conference instate foes in The Citadel and Clemson. Prior to that, the last home loss to a non-conference team was to Clemson in the 2007 regular-season finale.

THEY PAY TO SEE THE GAMECOCKS PLAY: South Carolina ranked 16th in the nation in home attendance during the 2015 season, as an average crowd of 78,822 filed in to Williams-Brice Stadium on six occasions, just shy of the 80,250 capacity. That total came in spite of losing one scheduled home game, as the LSU contest was moved to Baton Rouge due to extensive flooding in Columbia and throughout the Midlands.

ENROLLING EARLY: The Gamecocks brought in a record number six high school recruits who graduated a semester early and enrolled in time for spring drills in 2016. Here is the list of the Gamecocks who have enrolled early since 2006:

HAIL TO THE CHIEF: The Gamecocks have turned in some of their best seasons in those years in which our country is electing its president. Starting with 1976, there have been 10 national elections. The Gamecocks own a 75-43 record, a .636 winning percentage, in those seasons. Included are the 11-2 campaign of 2012 and the 10-2 season in 1984.

WINNER, WINNER, CHICKEN DINNER: The Gamecocks return three quarterbacks (Connor Mitch, Lorenzo Nuñez and Perry Orth) who have a win as a starter under their belt. South Carolina and Baylor are the only FBS schools in the country that can boast three quarterbacks on its roster with a win as a starter.

BASEBALL'S BEEN GOOD TO ME: True freshman quarterback Brandon McIlwain will have a busy spring. Not only will the 6-0, 198-pounder from Newtown, Pa. be participating in his first round of spring football drills and trying to pick up the offense, he will be spending his "free time" as part of Chad Holbrook's Carolina baseball squad.

A ROSE BY ANY OTHER NAME: Known last year as Jalen Henry, the sophomore from Foley, Ala. has officially changed his name. The 5-10, 214-pound linebacker now goes by the moniker Jalen Dread.

THE SKAI'S THE LIMIT: Skai Moore, a 6-2, 218-pounder from Cooper City, Fla., was the Gamecocks' leading tackler in 2015 with 111 stops, tying for third in the SEC with 9.2 tackles per game. He also led the team with 6.5 tackles for loss and with four pass interceptions, tying for fourth in the SEC. Moore became the first Gamecock to reach the century mark in tackles since 2006, while his 111 tackles was the second-highest total recorded by a Carolina player in the last 25 years. He led the team in tackles for a thirdconsecutive season, becoming the first player to do so since 1992-94. In addition, Moore has 11 career picks, tying for third on the all-time list.

MOORE FROM SKAI: Skai Moore can become the first player in South Carolina history to lead the team in tackles in four-straight seasons. That accomplishment is rare across the country. Here are the players who have led their team in tackles in all four years of eligibility:

KICKIN' IT WITH KELLY: Senior punter Sean Kelly was, in some people's eyes, the MVP of the Gamecock squad in 2015. The 5-10, 195-pounder from Oakland, Fla. averaged 44.3 yards per punt, third in the SEC, while the Gamecocks ranked second in the SEC and seventh in the nation in net punting with a 41.3 yard average. He booted 55 punts with just a 1.5 yard average return. Fourteen of his punts sailed over 50 yards, with a long of 69. Only four of his punts resulted in touchbacks, while 25 of his 55 punts (45 percent) were placed inside the 20.

THE FRISCO KID: Senior Elliott Fry hit on 20of-28 field goal attempts and all 25 extra point efforts to lead the Gamecocks in scoring with 85 points in 2015. The six-foot, 165-pounder from Frisco, Texas ranked eighth in the SEC among kickers with 7.1 points per game and tied for third in the league with 1.67 field goals made per game. He has connected on a school record 124 consecutive extra points and has hit nearly 75 percent of his career field goal attempts. That average jumps to 81 percent when attempting from under 50 yards out. He holds the school's career records for extra points made and attempted and is second in points scored with 289, behind only Collin Mackie (330).

IT'S A WONDERFUL LIFE: Zack Bailey was the only Gamecock named to the 2015 SEC All-Freshman team, as selected by the league's 14 coaches. The 6-6, 326-pound true freshman from Summerville, S.C., played in all 12 games, making five starts, with three at center and two at left guard.
