# FOR STARTERS

The University of South Carolina baseball team ventures to Fayetteville, Ark., and Baum Stadium to face the University of Arkansas in a three-game SEC series. The series begins on Thursday night (April 12) at 6 p.m. CDT (7 p.m. EDT). The second game of the series is Friday night (April 13) at 6:30 p.m. CDT (7:30 p.m. EDT) with the series finale Sunday afternoon (April 14) at 2 p.m. CDT (3 p.m. EDT).

Thursday's game is televised on SEC Network with Mike Morgan and Chris Burke on the call. Every game will be on the IMG Gamecock Radio Network with Derek Scott and Tommy Moody on the call.

South Carolina is coming off a 12-1 win over The Citadel on Tuesday night as Jacob Olson drove in a career high five runs and Carmen Mlodzinski pitched five scoreless innings to earn the win.

# **SCOUTING ARKANSAS**

Arkansas is coming off a 7-6 win over Grambling on Tuesday night. Dominic Fletcher had three hits to pace the Razorbacks while Eric Cole drove in a pair of runs. Arkansas is led offensively by freshman Heston Kjerstad, who is hitting .370 with nine doubles, eight home runs and 32 RBI. Carson Shaddy is not far behind, hitting .364 with seven home runs. On the mound, Blaine Knight is a perfect 6-0 with a 1.93 ERA and 48 strikeouts in 46.2 innings pitched. Arkansas has been stellar at home, posting a 20-2 record with SEC sweeps over Kentucky and Auburn at Baum Stadium.

# **SERIES VS. ARKANSAS**

Arkansas has a 37-31 series advantage on South Carolina, but the Gamecocks swept the Razorbacks in the last meeting between the two schools in 2016. John Jones drove in five and LT Tolbert had a pair of hits in Sunday's 8-6 win that completed the sweep. South Carolina is 10-18 all-time in Fayetteville. The two schools also played three times in Omaha in the 2012 College World Series, with Carolina winning 2-of-3 games on its way to the championship series vs. Arizona.

# **BRIDE ON BASE**

Senior Jonah Bride had his 11-game hit streak come to a close at The Citadel, but he extended his 29-game reached base streak with a pair of walks. Bride has reached base in 32 of Carolina's 33 games this year, with the North Florida game on Feb. 20 the only game he failed to reach base. Bride leads the team with a .322 batting average and carries a .438 on-base percentage.

# BATS COME ALIVE AT THE CITADEL

Carolina belted out 13 hits and scored seven runs in the seventh inning, a team high for an inning this season, in a 12-1 win over The Citadel on April 10. Jacob Olson was 2-for-3 with three runs scored and a career high five RBI, while Chris Cullen tied his season high with three hits. Madison Stokes, starting in his first game since March 24, homered and drove in a pair of runs, while Riley

Freshman Carmen Mlodzinski allowed just two hits and struck out five in five innings of work in the 12-1 win over The Citadel on April 10. The Hilton Head native allowed just one walk and lowered his ERA to 2.45 in the victory.

# MORRIS SHUTS DOWN KENTUCKY OF-**FENSE**

Cody Morris tied his career high in both innings pitched (6.0) and strikeouts (10) while allowing just three hits and a run in the 15-1 win over Kentucky on April 7. Morris struck out eight of the first nine Wildcat batters and allowed just one solo home run in the win. Morris earned his sixth win of the season and third in conference play.

# TAYLOR DRIVES IN FIVE

Hunter Taylor had two doubles and a tworun home run in South Carolina's 19-1 win over Kentucky on April 7. He doubled in a run in the second, scoring Jonah Bride for Carolina's first run. In the third, Taylor belted a two-run home run, his sixth of the season. He ended the night with a tworun double in the eighth. Taylor also had five RBI in the win over Winthrop on Feb. 21.

# **BRIDGES PICKS UP THE SAVE**

Sawyer Bridges picked up his first career save in Saturday's win over Kentucky, pitching the final three innings and allowing just one hit with a pair of strikeouts. Bridges has a microscopic 0.59 ERA with just 11 hits allowed in 15.1 innings pitched.

# GAMECOCK LINEUPS IN FLUX

South Carolina had its 31st different lineup in 33 games in Tuesday's The Citadel contest and had its 26th different positional lineup. The Gamecocks have had just two players this season -- LT Tolbert and Jonah Bride -- start all 33 games on the year. Jacob Olson played in center field for the first time this season on Sunday at Kentucky, while Riley Hogan made his first start in right field. Carlos Cortes hit leadoff for the first time in his career in Saturday's game vs. Kentucky.

# **COMEBACK KIDS**

Saturday's 6-3 win over Tennessee (March 31) was the second for the Gamecocks when trailing going into the seventh inning. After TJ Shook got a big strikeout with the bases loaded in the top of the seventh to end that threat, Carolina tied the game at three in the bottom of the seventh on Riley Hogan's bases-loaded walk and scored three runs in the eighth on an RBI double from Jacob Olson and a two-run double off the bat of Matt Williams, completing the three-game sweep.

# **CLEAN SWEEP**

South Carolina earned its second sweep of the season and first in SEC play since March of 2017 in a three-game sweep of Tennessee. Carolina also swept Princeton on March 9-10 in a three-game series. The last three-game sweep in conference play was at Tennessee on March 17-19, 2017. South Carolina has now won 26 of the last 29 games against Tennessee and made it nine straight wins this past weekend. The Gamecocks hit .313 on the weekend and allowed just five earned runs in the three games.

# INJURY BUG BITES GAMECOCKS

The injury bug has hit the Gamecocks as TJ Hopkins (hand), Noah Campbell (finger) missed The Citadel game due to injury. Madison Stokes played his first game since March 24 and went 2-for-4 with a home run and two RBI at The Citadel on April 10.

# CAMPBELL KEEPS IT IN THE PARK

Noah Campbell got the Gamecocks going on Saturday in the bottom of the first with an insidethe-park home run, the first by a Gamecock since Whit Merrifield did the trick at Tennessee on May 10, 2009. It also was the last inside-the-park home run at Founders Park since Adam Matthews against Arkansas on April 4, 2009.

# **BRIGHT SPOTS ABOUND IN FLORIDA SERIES**

The Gamecocks opened SEC play at home against No. 2 Florida March 16-18. While Carolina did not win the series, the Gamecocks had a lot of highlights. The Gamecocks scored 15 runs, the most against Florida since a 15-10 loss to a Mark Kingston-led South Florida team on May 9, 2017, in Saturday's 15-7 win. It also was the most run scored by Carolina in a conference game since it put up 19 runs at Tennessee on April 7, 2013 in a 19-2 win. Carolina also scored more runs (20-17), had more hits (28-23) and struck out less (22-32) in the three games.

# TOUCH 'EM ALL TIME

After Madison Stokes' sixth-inning home run at The Citadel on April 10, South Carolina now has 48 home runs on the season, which is fifth in the nation. Twelve different players have home runs this season and the home run total is 20 more than last year's total after 33 games.

# SC IN THE SEC LEADERS

Adam Hill leads the SEC in opponent's batting average (.133) and is tied for ninth in strikeouts with 55. Eddy Demurias is tied for sixth with 15 appearances on the mound. Jacob Olson is tied for seventh in the league with nine home runs. TJ Hopkins is tied for third in the conference with 11 stolen bases, while Noah Campbell is tied for third with three triples. South Carolina is fifth in the league with a .979 fielding percentage.

# HILL NAMED A NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE WEEK

South Carolina junior pitcher Adam Hill has been named a National Player of the Week by Collegiate Baseball, the publication announced this afternoon (Monday, March 5). Hill earns a national award after being named SEC Pitcher of the Week last Monday.

Hill, a righty from Anderson, S.C., was magnificent for a second straight week, helping South Carolina to a 3-2 win over Clemson on Friday night. Hill struck out 14 batters in a no-decision, giving up two runs and two hits with two walks. It was Hill's second straight 14-strikeout performance, which ties his career-high and also tied his Founders Park record. Hill struck out seven consecutive batters from the first through third innings. That tied a school record which he shares with Alex Farotto (3/25/2007 vs. Mississippi State) and George Beam (3/4/1972 vs. N.C. State). Hill earned the Tom Price Award after Sunday's game against Clemson. The award is given to South Carolina's Most Valuable Player in the series.

On the season, Hill is fourth in the country in strikeouts per nine innings (14.60).

# HOPKINS, WILLIAMS STEP UP IN CLEMSON THRILLER

A pair of upperclassmen gave Carolina the offense it needed in a 3-2 win over Clemson on Friday night (March 2) at Founders Park. With the Gamecocks trailing 2-1 in the bottom of the eighth, fifth-year senior Matt Williams stepped up in a pinch hitting role and belted his fourth career home run in the South Carolina bullpen, tying the game at two. Then in the ninth, Jonah Bride walked and moved to third on a failed pickoff attempt. Hopkins brought pinch runner Danny Blair home with a sacrifice fly for the walk-off win, South Carolina's first since last March 25 against Alabama.

The South Carolina recruiting class is ranked in the top 10 by a trio of publications this fall. Collegiate Baseball had the highest ranking at No. 3, followed by Baseball America (No. 5) and D1 Baseball (No. 7).

Joining the Gamecocks for the 2017-18 academic year are Elijah Bowers (Matthews, N.C./Weddington HS), Noah Campbell (Durham, N.C./ Cardinal Gibbons HS), Logan Chapman (Liberty, S.C./Easley HS), Ridge Chapman (Taylors, S.C./Spartanburg Methodist College), Parker Coyne (Suwanee, Ga./North Gwinnett HS), Eddy Demurias (Miami, Fla./Miami Dade College), John Gilreath (Rock Hill, S.C./Northwestern), Gage Hinson (Spartanburg, S.C./Spartanburg Methodist College), Jordan Holladay (Sumter, S.C./Sumter HS), Kyle Jacobsen (Acworth, Ga./Allatoona HS), Ian Jenkins (Suwanee, Ga./Collins Hill HS), Hunter Lomas (Blythewood, S.C./Spartanburg Methodist College), Carmen Mlodzinski (Hilton Head, S.C./Hilton Head HS), Shane Roberts (Jupiter, Fla./Dywer HS), Corey Stone (Prosperity, S.C./Mid Carolina HS), Mason Streater (Duncan, S.C./Boiling Springs HS) and Cam Tringali (Columbia, S.C./Cardinal Newman HS).

Hill was downright dominant in a 7-0 win over Charleston Southern on Friday night. The junior righty set a Founders Park record with 14 strikeouts while not allowing a hit, walk or run to pick up his 11th career win as a Gamecock. He broke the old Founders Park record of 13 punchouts, set by Sam Dyson in 2009. The only base runner to reach off Hill was via a fielding error in the sixth inning. Hill had 100 pitches on the night and had two or more strikeouts in six of the seven frames.

This is Hill's second career honor from the SEC. He was named SEC Freshman of the Week on March 14, 2016, after wins over Wofford and Charleston Southern.

# CORTES NAMED BASEBALL AMERICA PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN

South Carolina sophomore outfielder Carlos Cortes was named to the Baseball America Preseason All-America third team, the publication announced Jan. 29.

Cortes enters his second season with the Gamecocks after a stellar rookie campaign. The Oviedo, Fla., native played in 50 games with 43 starts and hit .286 with a team-high 12 home runs and 41 RBI. Cortes also had a .565 slugging percentage to go along with a .368 on-base percentage. He was named to the SEC All-Freshman team and earned SEC All-Tournament team honors after hitting three home runs, driving in eight, scoring five runs and walking eight times in the five tournament games.

Cortes has been ranked the No. 35 best collegiate prospect for the 2018 MLB Draft by Baseball America. The publication also rated Cortes the No. 25 best prospect in the Cape Cod League last summer. This is the second straight year that a Gamecock has earned Preseason All-America honors by Baseball America. Last year, Wil Crowe was a third-team selection.

# CORTES NAMED PRESEASON ALL-SEC; GAMECOCKS PICKED FOURTH IN EAST

Sophomore Carlos Cortes was named to the Preseason All-SEC second team while the University of South Carolina was picked to finish fourth in the East Division in the SEC Preseason poll, the conference office announced Feb. 8.

The Gamecocks earned 50 points in the preseason poll, good for fourth in the division. Florida was picked to win the East, picking up 13 first-place votes and 91 points. The Gators were followed by Kentucky, Vanderbilt, South Carolina, Georgia, Missouri and Tennessee. Arkansas was picked to win the West Division, earning 12 first-place votes and 90 points. Texas A&M and Ole Miss earned one first-place vote apiece. South Carolina plays the top-four teams in the West Division preseason poll this year (Arkansas, Texas A&M, Ole Miss and LSU).

Florida was picked to be the SEC champion, earning 12 of 14 votes. Arkansas and Texas A&M earned one vote apiece.

# **BRAG FACTS**

South Carolina won the NCAA Division I Baseball Championship in 2010 and 2011 at the College World Series. South Carolina has made 11 College World Series appearances including six times in the last 16 years. In those 11 appearances, the Gamecocks are 32-20 for a .615 winning percentage, that is sixth-best among winning percentage leaders in CWS history. South Carolina is one of five schools in the nation to have reached at least 12 NCAA Super Regionals since 2000. In addition, the Gamecocks own the second-highest win total in Division I baseball since 2000 (826-357 record) and tied for the second-most conference wins since 2000 (321-215 record). South Carolina has ranked among the top five in the nation in total attendance for seven consecutive years including a mark of 258,407 last year. South Carolina averaged a total of 7,177 fans at Founders Park in the 2017 season.

# HILL, CORTES HEADLINE PUBLICATIONS' PRESEASON PROJECTIONS

- In D1Baseball.com's 2018 SEC preview, South Carolina was one of 10 conference teams picked to make a regional this season. The website picked the Gamecocks to finish fourth in the SEC East, behind Florida, Kentucky and Vanderbilt and ahead of Georgia, Missouri and Tennessee.
- The website also picked top prospects for the 2018 and 2019 MLB Drafts and a trio of Gamecocks were pegged as a top prospect for this June's draft. Junior Adam Hill (13th), draft-eligible sophomore Carlos Cortes (18th) and redshirt sophomore Cody Morris (33rd) were on the top-50 list. Freshman Kyle Jacobsen (21st) was a top prospect for the 2019 draft as well as an impact freshman (12th in SEC). Classmates Noah Campbell (22nd) and Logan Chapman (26th) also were on the freshman list.
- Sophomore Carlos Cortes was named to Perfect Game's Preseason All-SEC team. Cortes was named the designated hitter on the team with Perfect Game highlighting his "excellent hit tool and barrel skills."
- In Baseball America's 2018 SEC preview, the magazine listed junior Adam Hill (12th) and draft-eligible sophomore Carlos Cortes (14th) in the conference's top-20 prospects for the 2018 MLB Draft. Freshman Kyle Jacobsen was named the ninth-best freshman in the league. Jacobsen (No. 18) joined Noah Campbell (No. 19) and Carmen Mlodzinski (No. 29) on Baseball America's Top 50 Freshmen Prospects list.

# #17 MARK KINGSTON

# HEAD COACH 1ST SEASON AT SOUTH CAROLINA - 9TH SEASON AS HEAD COACH NORTH CAROLINA (1995)

**Mark Kingston** was named the head baseball coach at the University of South Carolina on June 30, 2017. He became the 30th head coach in the history of Gamecock Baseball.

Kingston came to Carolina following a three-year stint as the head coach at USF. He compiled a 100-78-1 record while in Tampa, helping the Bulls to a pair of NCAA Regional appearances. Kingston owns a career mark of 272-194-1 in eight seasons as a head coach, including five at Illinois State,

with three NCAA appearances in that eight-year span.

Kingston has helped lead 11 teams to NCAA Tournament berths as an assistant and head coach -- with four of those teams appearing in the NCAA Super Regionals, two participating in the College World Series and one winning a national championship. As a player at the University of North Carolina, Kingston was part of the 1989 Tar Heels squad that won an Atlantic Coast Conference regular-season title and advanced to the College World Series. He also helped UNC win the ACC Tournament and advance to the NCAA Regionals in 1990. As an assistant coach, Kingston helped the Miami Hurricanes capture the 2001 College World Series as the No. 1 overall seed. His 21-year collegiate coaching career also includes stops at Tulane, where he helped guide the Green Wave to the 2005 College World Series, and Purdue.

Kingston guided USF to a 42-19 mark in 2017, the first time since 1996 that the team had reached the 40-win mark. Under Kingston's leadership, the Bulls earned their second trip to the NCAA Tournament in three years. USF won 19-straight games from Feb. 19 - March 22, the second-longest streak in program history. During that streak, USF defeated then No. 3 Florida State in Tallahassee, its first victory against FSU since 1989. On May 9, the Bulls defeated then-No. 5 Florida in Gainesville. It marked the first time in program history that the Bulls beat both FSU and Florida on the road in the same season. The victories were just USF's second and third wins over top-five teams in program history. Kingston reached the 100-win mark at the helm of the program in the Gainesville Regional opener with a 9-1 win over Bethune-Cookman, making him the second-fastest coach in program history to reach 100 victories.

Kingston's Bulls dominated on the mound in 2017, posting a 3.24 team ERA and allowing 7.64 hits per nine innings, both in the top-10 nationally. The pitchers led the country with 10.1 strikeouts per nine innings and set a program record with 620 strikeouts. Offensively, shortstop Kevin Merrell set an American Athletic Conference record with a .384 average, the third-straight year he led the Bulls in hitting. Merrell was named an All-American by four separate publications and was named to the AAC First Team for a second-straight year. He was one of five Bulls named to All-American Athletic Conference teams, the most since 2009. Merrell was drafted by the Oakland Athletics with the 33rd overall pick in the MLB Amateur Draft, becoming the third-highest drafted player in program history. Overall, four USF players were selected in the draft, as Phoenix Sanders went in the 10th round to the Tampa Bay Rays, Joe Cavallaro was taken in the 24th round by the New York Mets and Ryan Valdes was selected in the 33rd round by the Pittsburgh Pirates.

In 2016, the Bulls recorded 517 strikeouts, logging back-to-back seasons of over 500 strikeouts for the first time in school history. Merrell posted a team-high .320 batting average and a first-team all-conference selection in the AAC. Pitcher Brandon Lawson also notched over 100 strikeouts on his way to a second-team all-conference honor. The Bulls won two series against ranked teams (No. 25 Michigan State, at No. 22 East Carolina), and had three players drafted - pitcher Tommy Eveld (ninth round, Arizona), pitcher Brandon Lawson (13th round, Tampa Bay), and outfielder Luke Maglich (34th round, Philadelphia).

Kingston made an immediate impact at USF in 2015, leading the Bulls to an NCAA Regional for the first time since 2002. Kingston and his staff increased the Bulls' 2014 win total by seven and earned the team's first NCAA Tournament win in 13 years. Coach Kingston's guidance helped produce four players who were drafted by Major League Baseball clubs, including pitcher Jimmy Herget (sixth round, Cincinnati), pitcher Tommy Peterson (12th round, Washington), infielder Kyle Teaf (30th round, Tampa Bay), and pitcher Casey Mulholland (37th round, Dodgers). Merrell was recognized as a Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American, and catcher Levi Borders was named to the Johnny Bench Watch list and was a unanimous selection on The American's First Team. Herget was also named to the American's First Team, and Peterson earned second-team honors. Merrell, first baseman Buddy Putnum, and Teaf were also named to the NCAA Gainesville Regional All-Tournament team.

Kingston came to USF with a long track record as a top-level recruiter and a producer of offensively explosive teams. He spent 2010-2014 as the head coach at Illinois State University, where he led the Redbirds to two MVC regular season championships and one conference tournament title while twice breaking the program's season wins record. He won more than 30 games in each of his five seasons at ISU, a program-record string that included a season-record 39 wins in 2013. He reached the MVC Tournament championship game three times and compiled an overall record of 173-102 (.629 winning percentage). Kingston was twice named a "Rising College Coach" by Kendall Rogers of Perfect Game USA during a five-year tenure at Illinois State (2010-2014) in which he earned MVC Coach of the Year honors in 2010 and 2013 and helped 18 Redbirds earn First-Team all-MVC honors. Two of his players were named MVC Player or Pitcher of the Year and eight were selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

Kingston led ISU to rapid success, as the Redbirds ranked second in conference wins (64) from 2010-14 while posting two first-place finishes and no worse than a fourth-place conclusion in the MVC. His overall winning percentage of .629 and average of 35 wins per season were a strong improvement over previous seasons. ISU's average RPI rating of 69.50 from 2010-13 ranked fifth among all northern Division I programs and Kingston's recruiting classes contained 15 players ranked in the Top-20 in the state of Illinois by Prep Baseball Report, more than any other university.

He took over the ISU program after serving one season as the team's associate head coach and promptly posted the most successful first-year head coaching stint in program history. Kingston led the 2010 Redbirds to their first-ever share of the MVC regular-season title, their first MVC Tournament title since 1994 and their first NCAA Tournament victory since 1976. ISU's 32-24 record was the most wins for the Redbirds since 1999.

In 2011, Kingston guided the team to a then-record season win total (36-18), including a marquee victory at Miami (Fla.), and placed seven players on the All-MVC team. The following year (2012) ISU went 33-19 and posted a 10-game win-streak, the program's longest since 1984. Closer Kenny Long was selected by the Houston Astros in the 22nd round of the MLB First-Year Player Draft, marking three-consecutive seasons in which a Redbird was selected in the MLB draft.

In 2013, Kingston guided ISU to a program-best 39 wins (39-19), posted a school-record 12-game winning streak, won the MVC outright for the first time in school history and set a Valley-record with eight first-team All-MVC selections. Offensively, ISU paced the MVC in batting average, on-base percentage, slugging percentage and home runs and the pitching staff fired a program-record 13 complete games, including 10 shutouts.

Prior to his stint at ISU, Kingston was part of 500 wins (500-279-2) in 13 seasons as an assistant coach and was widely respected as one of the top assistants in the nation. He spent the previous seven years at Tulane University, serving as recruiting coordinator throughout his tenure and as associate head coach the final five seasons with the responsibility of overseeing recruiting, coaching hitters and developing catchers and infielders.

At Tulane, Kingston's recruiting and coaching efforts helped the Green Wave to six postseason appearances, two NCAA Super Regionals and a berth in the 2005 College World Series. The 2005 Green Wave team was seeded as the top team overall while also receiving the top academic honor in Omaha. Tulane averaged nearly 42 wins per season with Kingston on staff.

Kingston recruited or coached seven players who became All-Americans at Tulane, including James Jurries (2002) and Michael Aubrey (2003). The Green Wave sluggers became the first hitters in 18 years to hit .400 for the season and both earned Conference USA Player of the Year recognition. Aubrey was selected by the Cleveland Indians 11th overall in 2003, the highest Tulane player ever taken in the draft.

Prior to Tulane, Kingston spent two years at Miami (Fla.), where he helped the Hurricanes capture the 2001 College World Series as the No. 1 overall seed. While at Miami, the Hurricanes finished with top-five school single-season marks in batting average, runs scored and slugging percentage, and led the nation with 228 stolen bases in 2001. In the run to the 2001 national title, the `Canes had an NCAA-best 17-0 run to end the season and set a College World Series record with 12.3 runs per game while hitting .373 as a team in Omaha.

Kingston spent one year as an assistant at Illinois State, helping the 1999 Redbirds set then-school records for wins in a season (35), runs scored, RBI, doubles, hits and walks, while finishing second in school history in home runs, total bases and batting average.

Kingston began his coaching career with two seasons at Purdue, helping the Boilermakers post three of the top-seven batting averages in school history and place five position players on the All-Big Ten team after not posting any the year before his arrival.

A 1995 graduate of North Carolina with a degree in communications, Kingston was part of the 1989 Tar Heels squad that won an Atlantic Coast Conference regular-season title and advanced to the College World Series. He also helped the team win the ACC Tournament and advance to NCAA Regionals in 1990 as a sophomore. Kingston received the Trippe Bourne "Most Dedicated Player" Award for his outstanding work ethic and leadership during his junior campaign, and was named a team captain his senior season.

Drafted by the Milwaukee Brewers out of North Carolina in 1992, the Northern Virginia native played professionally for five seasons with Milwaukee and the Chicago Cubs


