Maryland Notes

- With the win, Maryland improves to 38-21 on the year. The Terrapins will face the winner of the South Carolina-Campbell game on Sunday at 7 p.m.
- The 38 victories are a school record.
- Maryland is now 3-6 all-time in NCAA Tournament games.
- The Terrapins are 34-0 when leading after eight innings this season.
- Maryland improved to 13-2 in the month of May.
- Freshman starting pitcher Mike Shawaryn earned his 11th win of the season, which is a school record, after pitching 6 1/3 innings and giving up three runs and five hits and striking out three.
- Left fielder Tim Lewis went 0-for-4 on the night, snapping his 15-game hitting streak.



South Carolina Notes

- With the loss, South Carolina falls to 43-17 on the season. The Gamecocks will face fourth seeded Campbell in an elimination game on Sunday at 1 p.m.
- The loss snaps South Carolina's 28-game home NCAA Tournament winning streak and is also the Gamecocks' first postseason loss at Carolina Stadium (17-1). The Gamecocks' last home NCAA Tournament loss was to Miami (5-2) in a Super Regional on June 8, 2002.
- The Gamecocks are now 127-63 all-time in NCAA Tournament games, including a 59-9 mark at home in postseason games.
- Tanner English's stolen base in the seventh inning was his 20th of the season. He became the first Gamecock to record 20 or more steals in a season since Steve Tolleson stole 20 in 2005.
- Taylor Widener pitched the longest outing of his career on Saturday, working 6 1/3 innings. He produced a career-high six strikeouts.
- Kyle Martin went 3-for-4 to lead the Gamecocks on Saturday. It was his team-leading 23rd multi-hit game this season.
