Duke Notes

- Duke ended a 55-year NCAA Tournament drought by appearing in Friday's game. The Blue Devils had not participated in the NCAA Tournament since 1961.
- Duke is now 18-13 all-time in NCAA Tournament games.
- The Blue Devils have lost their last two NCAA Tournament games, with the last loss a 4-3 College World Series setback to Boston College on June 12, 1961.
- Starting pitcher Brian McAfee's (7-5) outing was the shortest of his collegiate career as he was replaced after 2.0 IP. His eight runs allowed are also a career high.
- Duke got on the scoreboard in the 6th inning when Chris Proctor led off with a triple and Jack Labosky brought him home with a sacrifice fly. The triple was the second of Proctor's career and his first since May 20, 2016 against Pitt.
- Junior Bailey Clark threw five innings of scoreless relief and allowed just one hit. It was the longest scoreless outing of the season, and the first time he's thrown more than five innings without allowing a run since May 3, 2015 against North Carolina Central (6.0 IP, 2 H, 0 R)



UNCW Notes

- UNCW has now won their opening game in four of their eight NCAA Regional appearances, including each of the last two seasons.
- The Seahawks have also won at least one game in all eight of their NCAA Regional appearances.
- UNCW is now 12-14 all-time in NCAA Tournament games, including a 4-3 record in their last seven Tournament games.
- The 10-run margin of victory is a UNCW program record in NCAA Tournament play. The Seahawks had previously tallied nine-run victories in 2012 over Sacred Heart (13-4) and 2015 over Tulane (10-1).
- The Seahawks are 23-11 all-time against Duke and have won their last five meetings with the Blue Devils.
- Starting pitcher Ryan Foster (13-1) earned the win with a complete game effort. He allowed one and struck out two. It was his third complete game of the season, the fourth of his career, and his first since April 22, 2016, a victory over Towson.
- The Seahawks opened the scoring with a six-run outburst in the bottom of the 2nd inning. They now have a six-run inning in two of their last three games after also achieving the feat in their May 28 CAA Tournament loss to William & Mary.
- Brian Mims finished with five RBI, matching a UNCW NCAA Tournament single-game record. It was the sophomore's second career five-RBI effort, with the first coming Feb. 26, 2016 when he drove home six runs against South Dakota State.
