GAMECOCKS HEAD TO SECOND FALL TOURNAMENT

South Carolina women's golf heads to its second tournament of the fall, travelling to Reunion, Fla., for the second-annual ANNIKA Intercollegiate Presented by 3M, a 54-hole stroke play event at Reunion Resort which features 12 of the top programs from throughout the country. The Gamecocks won the event last year on their way to the program's first No. 1 ranking. The three-day event is set to begin on Sunday morning at the par-72, 6,321-yard course and run through Tuesday.

DEFENDING THEIR CROWN

South Carolina won the ANNIKA last season in the event's inaugural year, beating 12 teams who all finished in the top 25 of Golfweek's 2015 final rankings. Carolina dominated the event with a score of 282-290-282=854 (-10), claiming victory by seven strokes. The three-day score of 854 matched the second-lowest 54-hole score in program history. Justine Dreher won the individual crown, shooting 68-68-71=207 (-9), while Nanna Madsen shot 2-under to finish tied for ninth. Dreher's performance matched the school record for lowest 54-hole score, set by Kristy McPhweon in the 2001 SEC Championship.

LAST TIME OUT

The Gamecocks finished in a tie for 12th-place at the Mason Rudolph Championship, held at the Vanderbilt Legends Club in Franklin, Tenn. Carolina received solid play from junior Katelyn Dambaugh, who posted a three-day score of 218(+2). Junior Jia Xin Yang and senior Sarah Schmelzel were remarkably consistent as well posting scores of 75-74-76=225(+9) and 75-75-75=225(+9) for the event.

HISTORIC LAST SEASON

The Gamecocks began last season in impressive fashion capturing the title at the ANNIKA. The win helped South Carolina earn the program's first ever No. 1 ranking the following week. The Gamecocks would later earn the program's first No. 1 seed for the NCAA East Regional where they took home the title for the third time in six seasons, advancing to their sixth-straight NCAA Championships. The team captured the school record for top-five finishes in a season, finishing with 10, capping off a streak of 15 straight top-five finishes dating back to 2013-14.

TOP TEN PROGRAM

For the second-consecutive year, the Gamecocks were ranked No. 10 in the country entering the season, cementing the program as one of the nation's elite. South Carolina finished last season ranked No. 6 after winning the NCAA East Regional and was regularly ranked in the top four throughout the season.

RECORDS FALLING

After a historic season, the Gamecocks followed the same recipe for success by starting the season later than usual to maximize practice time. Carolina hopes to repeat its record-breaking season, which saw it finish with the second-lowest team scoring average in program history. Senior Justine Dreher departed with the school's single-season scoring average, finishing at 72.53. Graduating senior Mary Fran Hillow and junior Katelyn Dambaugh set the new low-18 score record each with a round of 65 during the season. Dambaugh's 65 at the SEC Championship matched the SEC Championship record. She is currently on pace to break the school's career scoring average record after two years with a mark of 73.68.

WHO'S BACK

Three of the five golfers from the Gamecocks' core lineup in 2014-15, including junior Jia Xin Yang and two-time All-SEC honoree junior Katelyn Dambaugh, return. Senior Sarah Schmelzel, an SEC All-Freshman selection in the 2012-13 season, is back as well along with sophomore Ainhoa Olarra, who played in five tournaments as a freshman. Every returning player has been in the Gamecock lineup at some point in her career.

RECORD BREAKING

Earning its first No. 1 ranking last fall, South Carolina finished the season at No. 6 in the Golfstat rankings. The Gamecocks set a school record with 10 top-five finishes on the season, received a No. 1 seed in the NCAA East Regional for the first time in program history and won the East Regional title for the third time in the last six years. The team finished in the top six at every regular-season tournament and recorded 15 straight top-five finishes dating back to the 2013-14 season, the longest streak in program history. A pair of wins at the ANNIKA Intercollegiate and the Mercedes-Benz Collegiate as well as a runner-up finish at the SEC Championship also highlighted the season.

SUMMER SUCCESS

A pair of Gamecocks participated in the 113th Women's North & South Amateur Championship this July. Senior Sarah Schmelzel and junior Katelyn Dambaugh represented South Carolina at the event where nine of the last 12 winners have gone on to draw paychecks as members of the LPGA Tour. Schmelzel finished +18 after three days of stoke play, one stroke away from qualifying for match play. Dambaugh advanced to the semifinals of the tournament before falling (3 and 2). She finished her week at Pineburst No. 2 course with two match-play victories and medalist honors after posting the championship's top stroke play score (+8). Her 2-under (68) in the third round of stroke play marked the field's only round under par during stroke play.

UP NEXT FOR THE GAMECOCKS

South Carolina continues the fall season at the Ruth's Chris Invitational, in Chapel Hill, N.C. The event, formerly known as the Tar Heel Invitational, is hosted by North Carolina and will take place Fri., Oct. 9 - Sun., Oct. 11 at UNC Finley Golf Course. The Gamecocks finished 2nd of 18 at the event last year.

Prior to South Carolina: Played for Buchholz High School in Gainesville, Fla...led Buchholz to four straight state tournaments...helped team qualify for state her senior year by firing a team-low 76 in the Region 1-3A golf tournament...placed fourth at 2014 Class 3A state tournament where she shot a 2-under 70 on the second day - the second-best round of the tournament...earned top-five finish at the Gainesville Junior Challenge...placed 44th of 229 at TaylorMade-adidas Golf Junior at Innisbrook this April...named the 2014 Women's Golfer of the Year by *The Gainesville Sun* after her senior year...as a junior, named to *The Gainesville Sun's* All-Area Golf First Team...finished with a 4.452 GPA at Buchholz.

Head coach Kalen Harris on Amos: "I'm thrilled to have Gaby representing the Gamecocks. She has an exceptional attitude, and has shown great improvement in the first month here. Gaby will do all of the things necessary to be successful, and I am eager and excited to watch her fast progression."

Prior to South Carolina: A native of Chile, attended Hilton Head Preparatory School in Hilton Head, S.C., and was a student at the Junior Players Golf Academy in Hilton Head...represented Chile in the South American Amateur and Junior Orange Bowl in 2013 and is currently a member of the Chilean National Team...finished 13th at the Junior Orange Bowl with rounds of 72-73-75-77...represented Chile in the 2013 Copa Los Andes in Bogota, Columbia...won the IJGT Invitational at Harbor Town and the IJGT Georgia Open...finished second at the Optimist International Tournament of Champions...owns a scoring average of 73.71 to rank 23rd in the 2015 graduate class...holds a career-low round of 68 with a best two-day tournament total of 138 (-6) on a pair of 69s...the 2012 Player of the Year on the Hurricane Junior Golf Tour.
