NOTEWORTHY

SCOUTING FLORIDA

Florida enters the week ranked 5th in the AVCA Top 25, and have not lost since Sept. 28 (10 straight wins). The Gators boast the nation's top offense, hitting .342 as a team, and are averaging 14.42 kills per set. Leading the offense are pins Carli Snyder (3.61 kills per set) and Alex Holston (3.67), with middle Rhamat Alhassan also averaging over three kills per set (3.13) while hitting .422. Alhassan is also a formidable blocker who is averaging 1.52 per set. Joining her in the middle this season is Rachael Kramer, a 6-foot, 8-inch freshman who is putting up 1.13 blocks per set and a .529 hitting percentage. The Gators have dropped just two sets total during their 10-game win streak, which included a win over Carolina on Oct. 9. In that meeting, the Gamecocks hit just .030.

SCOUTING MISSOURI

The Tigers are rolling through conference play, and come into the weekend after a big 3-0 win at No. 18 Kentucky last Sunday to move them to 12-1 in the SEC and 21-4 overall. The win in Lexington helped vault the Tigers up to 21st in the latest AVCA Top 25 poll. Six starters and 11 letterwinners return from a 2015 roster that went 27-6 overall and finished second in the SEC with a 14-4 record. On offense, the team averages almost two kills per set more than the opposition and has five different players pitching in 1.80 kills per set or more. Melanie Crow, a transfer from SEC rival Ole Miss, has stepped right in and led the way with 3.82 kills, 2.24 digs and 0.46 aces per set so far this season, marking a very successful return from an injury that cost her all but five matches of 2015 in Oxford. Rounding out the attack are All-American performers Kira Larson (2.17 kills/set) and Alyssa Munlyn in the middle and Carly Kan (3.08 kills/set) on the outside. Defensively, Munlyn is averaging 1.33 blocks per set and the Tigers as a team rank third in the SEC with 2.70 blocks per set and are holding opponents to just a .181 hitting percentage. In the first meeting between the two teams, Mizzou out-hit Carolina .367 to .137 in a three-set sweep.

PREVIOUS WEEKEND (MISS. STATE/GEORGIA) NOTABLES

- The Gamecocks are now 4-0 in five set matches this season after the win at Mississippi State, but this is the first time since Sept. 5 of last season that the team came back from a 2-0 deficit.
- Mikayla Shields' 23 kills against Mississippi State are a new season best. The freshman pin had five kills in the fifth set and seven in the fourth to power the comeback.
- Three different Gamecocks recorded a double-double in the win in Starkville: Mikayla Shields had 23 kills and 10 digs, Dessaa Legros had 17 kills and 12 digs and Aubrey Ezell totaled 43 assists and 12 digs. This is the second time this season the team had three in a match, the last being Georgia Southern.
- South Carolina hit .378 as a team on Sunday vs. Georgia, the best of the conference season and the third-best overall for 2016.
- The offense came out in a single-setter look, run by Ezell, against Georgia. The sophomore finished with 38 assists, five digs, four kills and three aces.
- South Carolina's middle hitters benefitted from the new offense, as Claire Edwards and Jacqy Angermiller combined for 19 kills and just three errors for the day.

HOLDING ALL THE ACES

The Gamecocks' 12 aces against Georgia on Sunday were a season high, surpassing the 11 they had against Buffalo on Sept. 9. The team's best performance in SEC play coming in was just five, and it had not recorded 12 aces combined over the previous four matches. The last time South Carolina had 12 aces in a three set match was on Sept. 8, 2007 against Appalachian State. The total is the best in any three set match in the SEC so far this season. Mikayla Shield's six aces are tied for the second-most in a three set match in program history. Megan Hosp holds the record with eight, and eight other Gamecocks have had six - including Aubrey Ezell earlier this year against Buffalo.

NOTEWORTHY

TO BE THE BEST, YOU HAVE TO BEAT THE BEST

The Gamecocks face one of the toughest conference schedules of any team in the SEC, with an 18-game slate that features two matches apiece against the top four teams in the conference - Florida, Kentucky, Missouri and Texas A&M. The Gamecocks' first ten SEC opponents currently have a combined conference record of 76-57 (.571), facing Kentucky and Texas A&M twice and the other top two teams (Missouri and Florida) once. No other team in the conference plays each of the aforementioned top four twice this year.

COMFORTABLE BEING UNCOMFORTABLE

Early season tests on the road at Georgia Southern and Wake Forest have helped the Gamecocks be, as senior Dessaa Legros put it, "comfortable being uncomfortable". The team is 4-2 in four-set matches and 4-0 in five-set matches so far this season, highlighted by the comeback Friday night at Mississippi State. Carolina trailed 2-0 in the match, but battled back to win despite trailing 20-16 late in the third set and 13-12 in the fifth. Over the four five-set matches, the Gamecocks are out-hitting opponents .271 to .196 in the fourth and fifth sets.

A 'FRESH' PERSPECTIVE

The team has received a big lift from a trio of freshman at key positions this season:

- Mikayla Shields leads the team with 3.06 kills per set, and his hitting an impressive .316 for the season despite hitting from the outside. So far this season, she has 14 matches with double-digit kills (highlighted by a season-high 23 at Mississippi State) and has hit over .500 seven times.
- Courtney Koehler has stepped in as a setter in the team's 6-2 offense and is averaging 4.46 assists and 1.25 digs per set while playing in every set so far this season. On top of her setting skills, she has been a clutch server, with 11 aces and the team's best serve percentage (eight errors in 275 attempts).
- Alicia Starr had to earn her spot in the starting lineup mid-season, after being trained at an entirely different position than she played in club and high school. She is averaging 1.11 kills and 1.14 blocks per set and hitting .320 in conference play this season. She has already made her mark on the program record books as well, as her four solo blocks vs. Davidson are the second-most in the program's rally-scoring era (since 2001) and her 11 blocks vs. Kentucky are tied for the second-most in a four set match since 2001.

WHEN THE GAMECOCKS WIN...

- The team is out-hitting the opposition .302 to .184, and have yet to lose this season when out-hitting opponents in a match (16-0).
- The opposition averages 1.08 aces per set, compared to 1.44 for Carolina. The Gamecocks are 10-0 when finishing a match with more aces.
- The Gamecocks average 2.40 blocks per set, compared to 1.52 for opponents.
- Freshman Mikayla Shields hits .353 in wins, compared to .201 in losses. Her kills per set dips from 3.39 in wins to 2.17 in losses.
- The offense features the middle attackers much more in wins, as the trio of Jacqy Angermiller, Alicia Starr and Claire Edwards combine for 4.44 kills per set and a .383 hitting percentage in wins and 2.98 and a .207 percentage in losses.

WHEN THE GAMECOCKS LOSE...

- The offense is hitting just .158 in losses with two fewer kills per set than the season average, and the defense is allowing opponents to hit .301. Only one of Carolina's top four hitters are above .200 through the team's seven losses.
- The Gamecocks are allowing 1.83 aces per set to opponents in the four matches, but only average 0.78 aces while holding serve.
- Opponent's passing success weight heavily in matches lost by Carolina. In the five losses, Gamecocks opponents are averaging almost three digs more per set (15.78 to 12.40) and has a serve-reception percentage of .956.
- Six of South Carolina's seven losses have come after dropping the first set.

KIRKLAND NAMED ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT

Senior libero Megan Kirkland (Lugoff, S.C.) was named to the CoSIDA Academic All-District team on Thursday, Nov. 3. She has carried a perfect 4.0 grade point average throughout her college career, despite carrying an exercise science major. Kirkland is due to graduate in December, and has already been accepted into Carolina's prestigious Physician Assistant Program. On the court, Megan is having a career year, already with a new season best of 72 assists and an average of 3.31 digs per set while appearing in every match for the Gamecocks.

COLE NAMED TO GAMECOCKS HOF

Current South Carolina assistant head coach Shonda Cole was inducted into the South Carolina Athletics Hall of Fame class of 2016 on Thursday, Oct. 20. She is the third woman from the program to make the Hall of Fame, joining Ashley Edlund-Heidtko (inducted in 2010) and Heather Larkin (inducted in 2012). Cole was the first Gamecock volleyball player to earn All-America honors, and was also a three-time All-SEC honoree. Cole still holds the program's career record for points per set, kills per set, and attacks.

STANDING ROOM ONLY

Of the top 10 crowds on record at the Carolina Volleyball Center, three have come this season alone. Currently, the Gamecocks rank 41st nationally in average attendance this season (1,155), despite the fact that two matches were rescheduled due to weather and four other matches went directly against either home football or basketball games.

DESSAA LEGROS

- Her twin sister Annayka currently plays volleyball at Coastal Carolina

EMMA LOCK

- Her uncle, Andy Lock, played football at Missouri. Currently, her cousin Drew is the Tigers' starting quarterback

MIKAYLA SHIELDS

- Her mother, Najuma, still holds the school record in the high jump, pentathlon and heptathlon at Pittsburgh. She competed for Guyana at the '92 Olympics
- Her father, Brett, ran on Pitt's fastest Sprint Medley Relay team

ALICIA STARR

- Her father, Brett, played football, basketball and track at Oregon State
- Her mother, Julie, was a gymnast for the University of Vermont
- Sister Brianna is currently a senior on the UMKC volleyball team

JESE TURNER

- Her mother, Lesli, played volleyball at Pepperdine
- Her father, Rob, played football at Eastern Michigan
- Her uncle, Roman Fortin, played in the NFL for three different teams

ALL-TIME RECORDS

- South Carolina holds a 784-607 (.563) all-time record, dating back to 1973.
- The Gamecocks joined the SEC for volleyball in 1991, and have an all-time conference record of 178-232 (.431).
- In matches in the Carolina Volleyball Center, Carolina 183-98 (.650).
- With 91 career wins, head coach Scott Swanson ranks third in program history for wins. Kim Hudson (1993-2004) is the program's wins leader, with 226.

GAMECOCKS LOSE TO NO. 11 FLORIDA

COLUMBIA, S.C. - The South Carolina Gamecock volleyball team lost at home Sunday afternoon to No. 11 Florida, 3-0. With the loss, the Gamecocks drop back to 13-4 overall, 1-4 in SEC play. The Gators improve to 14-2, 4-1.

1st Set: Florida led wire-to-wire to take the first set, 25-14. The Gamecocks hit just -.069 as a team due to an imposing front-line block from the Gators that featured middle blockers Rhamat Alhassan (6-foot-4) and Rachael Kramer (6-foot-8). South Carolina got as close as four, 14-10, late in the set, but Florida pulled away late behind an 8-2 run soon after that for the 1-0 match lead.

2nd Set: South Carolina came out strong to begin the second set, and fought its way to a 7-6 lead. Florida took back control thanks to a 9-0 run immediately after, though, and carried the lead to the finish. Dessaa Legros had two kills and a pair of blocks in the set, but five more blocks from Florida kept Carolina to just eight kills in total for the game.

3rd Set: The Gamecocks had their best set of the afternoon in the third, despite mixing a number of new faces into the lineup. Carolina held an early lead at 5-3, but Florida kept stringing together three- and four-point runs to take back control at the media timeout, 15-10. The Gators clinched the sweep with a 25-19 win in the third. Courtney Furlong led the team with four kills and three digs in the set, and Jesse Turner added two kills on four swings in the game.

STAT OF THE MATCH

South Carolina hit just .030 as a team for the match, its lowest of the season. Florida blocked 11 total attacks for the day, tied for the most by a Gamecock opponent this season.

VOLLEYBALL DROPS CONFERENCE OPENER AT MISSOURI

COLUMBIA, MO. - The South Carolina volleyball team opened the SEC season Wednesday night at Missouri (10-3, 1-0 SEC), and the Gamecocks (12-1, 0-1) saw their 12-match win streak ended in a 3-0 decision.

1st Set: The Gamecocks were tentative on the attack early in the first set, resorting to tips a rolls and Missouri built an early lead it would never give back. South Carolina hit .026 as a team in the set, with a pair of kills from Mikayla Shields and Koko Atoa-Williams accounting for half the team's output in the game.

2nd Set: A pair of early blocks gave Carolina the lead to start off the second set, but the Tigers used a 9-2 run to take back the lead at 12-9 and carried it through the media timeout at 15-11. The Gamecocks weren't able to string together a run to cut back into the lead, and Missouri pulled away for the 25-19 win and a 2-0 lead in the match.

3rd Set: The offense found its swing to start the third, but Missouri was countered with tough service to grab the early lead. The Tigers had four aces in their first 12 points of the set, three from Melanie Crow, and used a 5-1 run behind her serve to get early distance on Carolina, 12-7. While South Carolina had a vastly improved hitting percentage in the third, Missouri would be even better. The Tigers got kills on 11 of their first 12 swings in the game (.917) and did not commit a single attack error in the set. The home side pushed its lead up to ten, 23-13, and closed out the match 25-16.

STAT OF THE MATCH

Missouri hit .367 for the match, committing just nine errors total. It was the highest hitting percentage for an opponent since Florida on Oct. 30, 2015. The previous high for an opponent this season was .255, shared by Furman and Clemson.

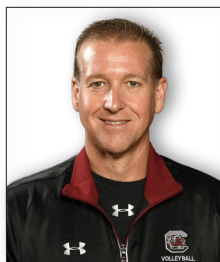

SCOTT SWANSON

Head Coach || Sixth Year at South Carolina

- Third in program history for career wins
- Coached seven NCAA tournament teams (Arizona State 1999, 2000, Minnesota 2006-10)
- Part of staff that coached eight All-Americans
- Recruited three top-10 classes to Minnesota

The 11th head coach in Gamecock Volleyball history, Scott Swanson has his sights set on a successful 2016 season as he enters year six in Columbia. The Gamecocks will bring an exciting balance of veterans and talented youngsters into the season, with the aim of building off 2015's 13-18 campaign.

The Gamecocks faced a season of different adversities in 2015, coming from untimely injuries and a roster featuring six freshmen who all were asked to fill important roles. The team bonded through the rigors of the season, and picked up impressive wins over Tennessee, Ole Miss, and a season sweep of Arkansas. Swanson moved into third in program history for wins in a career after winning his 72nd game at South Carolina on Oct. 25.

Individually, freshman Aubrey Ezell finished with perhaps one of the best debut seasons ever by a Gamecock, finishing the season with the second-most assists ever in the program's rally-scoring era and a spot on the SEC All-Freshman Team.

It would not just be the freshmen who would surprise, the team also saw breakout seasons from Dessaa Legros and Sarah Blomgren. Senior Darian Dozier capped her career in style, moving up to third in program history for career blocks and entered the top ten in hitting percentage as well. Off the court, the team volunteered over 1100 for community service, the most of any team at South Carolina.

In 2014, the Gamecocks posted a 17-14 record, which included seven SEC wins, the program's most since 2008. Libero Mikaela Christiaansen set the program record for most digs in a single season with 535, while middle blocker Darian Dozier set single-season rally scoring era school records for total blocks (141) and block assists (127). The Gamecocks also turned in another strong year in the classroom, as a league-best 12 players made the SEC Fall Academic Honor Roll.

During the 2013 season, outside hitter Juliette Thévenin became just the second Gamecock in school history to earn AVCA All-America honors as she was named honorable mention All-American. Thévenin was also a first-team AVCA All-Southeast Region and All-SEC selection as she left the program ranked in the top 10 in six career categories.

Swanson guided the Gamecocks to an 18-14 record in 2012, the program's second winning season in the last decade. South Carolina got off to a program-best 13-0 start and improved its hitting percentage for a second straight season, ranking second in the SEC with a percentage of .255, an improvement of 29 points from the previous year. Outside hitter Juliette Thévenin garnered second-team All-SEC honors after she ranked second in SEC play with 4.40 kills per set and 4.81 points per set, becoming the first Gamecock since 2008 to receive an All-SEC award.

In Swanson's first season, the Gamecocks went 14-16 and improved its offensive efficiency and its backline defense under his guidance. The team led the SEC with a 16.78 digs average, the best mark in four years for the Gamecocks, and hit .226, a 45-point improvement from the 2011 season.

Swanson's teams have also proved themselves in the classroom, earning the Team Academic Award from the American Volleyball Coaches Association in 2011-12, 2012-13 and 2013-14. In his first five seasons, 49 student-athletes have earned a spot on the SEC Academic honor roll, including eight of the nine eligible players from 2015. The team also claimed the department's Life Skills Team of the Year award in 2011-12, honoring the group for its academic achievements, personal development and work in the community.

Prior to his current head coaching job, Swanson spent five years on the sidelines for the Golden Gophers, helping the team to five-consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances and a 125-46 record. Three times, Minnesota finished second in the Big Ten behind perennial power Penn State. The 2009 team advanced to the national semifinals in the NCAA Tournament.

During his tenure in Minneapolis, five Golden Gophers earned All-America accolades, including 2009 first-team middle blocker and 2012 US National Team pool member Lauren Gibbemeyer. Swanson also led the Gophers' recruiting efforts, posting three top-10 recruiting classes according to PrepVolleyball.com. The 2009 group earned top honors from the outlet.

In the summer of 2009, Swanson spent time with USA Volleyball's A-2 Junior National Team, and he coached the USA Red team to a second-place showing in the 2008 USA Adult Open Championships.

Swanson brings in four years of head coaching experience to Columbia after his tenure at the University of Texas-El Paso. With a 50-61 career record, Swanson had the team on the brink of the NCAA Tournament in 2005, when the Miners went 21-10. Three player earned all-conference honors under Swanson's tutelage, including honorable mention All-American Kari Stacy. He also inked a high school All-American and saw his team improve in the classroom to a department-best 3.2 GPA in 2005.

Prior to UTEP, Swanson spent six years at his alma mater, Arizona State. He helped the team to two NCAA Tournament appearances during his time in Tempe and coached one second-team All-American and two Pac-10 All-Freshman Team players. Two of his Sun Devil players garnered Academic All-America certificates as well.

Swanson started his coaching career at Mountain View (Ariz.) High School, working as an assistant with the varsity team and leading his junior varsity group to a 17-1 record. As a head coach with the Arizona East Valley Juniors club, he led a 16-1s team to a national runner-up finish and earned Cactus Region Coach of the Year honors. He also served as head coach at Camelback High School before landing the job with Arizona State, where he also played club volleyball.

A graduate of ASU, Swanson is married to the former Erin Meier. The couple has two daughters, Rylee Sue and Haylen Rae.
