Noting The Tigers

- ♦ The Tigers are currently fourth in the SEC Western Division and eighth overall in the SEC. Auburn holds a two game lead over Arkansas for the eighth and final spot for the SEC Tournament. The Tigers took two of three from the Hogs April 20-22, giving AU the tiebreaker over Arkansas. Auburn also holds a three game lead over Ole Miss and has the tiebreaker over the Rebels after winning two of three on March 30-April 1 in Oxford. The Tigers are looking to earn a fifth consecutive berth in the SEC Tournament.

- ♦ South Carolina holds a 22-21 record against the Tigers all-time. Auburn has won six straight in the series and is 15-5 against the Gamecocks in the last 20 meetings. South Carolina has a 11-7 edge in games played in Columbia, but the Tigers swept a three-game series in the last meeting in South Carolina in 2010.

- ♦ The Tigers had more than half of their hits go for extra-bases in the series against Arkansas. Auburn had 16 hits in three games with nine of those going extra-bases. The Tigers had five doubles, one triple and three home runs against the Razorbacks. Junior 2B Brooke Lathan accounted for two of AU's home runs, hitting a pair in a 5-1 win in game two of the series. Lathan also picked up a triple in Sunday's series finale.

- ♦ Senior shortstop Lauren Guzman has started 222 consecutive games, which is the longest streak in Auburn history. Guzman has started every game on the Tigers' schedule since coming to Auburn in 2009. Guzman broke the previous record of 221 held by Ashley Griffin (2003-06) from Feb. 25, 2003, to May 20, 2006. Additionally, Guzman has not been lifted from a game since April 13, 2010, a span of 122 straight games and 841 innings.

- ♦ Senior pitcher Jenee Loree had a strong showing against Arkansas, posting a 1-0 record with a 0.66 ERA in two appearances. Loree earned the complete-game win in game two of the series, holding Arkansas to one hit. Loree allowed a two-out, RBI double in the first inning against the Hogs and then found a groove and retired 19 of the final 21 batters of the game, allowing just two walks over the final six innings of work. Loree also pitched 3.2 scoreless innings of relief in game three, scattering three hits with no walks but did not factor in the decision.

- ♦ Auburn notched its second walk-off win of the season in the series opener against Arkansas. The Tigers and Razorbacks went to the eighth inning tied 2-2. Auburn loaded the bases on an error and a pair of walks, all with no outs. Junior OF Baylee Stephens then drilled the first pitch of the at-bat off the wall in center to score Caitlin Schultze from third for a walk-off single. Auburn's first walk-off win this season came in game three against Kentucky on March 25.

- ♦ The Tigers hit three home runs in their game two win against Arkansas marking their first multi-home run game since March 11, a span of 22 games. Auburn hit three home runs against Presbyterian on March 11, with Caitlin Schultze, Brooke Lathan and Elizabeth Eisterhold each going yard. Lathan and Eisterhold accounted for all three home runs in the game two win vs. Arkansas, with Lathan hitting a pair of homers. That was Auburn's eighth multi-home run game of the season. Additionally, Lathan's second home run of the game and Eisterhold's homer were back-to-back shots coming in the sixth inning, marking the fourth time the Tigers have had consecutive homers and the first since Feb. 19 against Georgia Tech.

♦ Auburn goes into the South Carolina series with a 4-7 record in SEC road games this season. The Tigers have lost four straight after losing the series finale at Ole Miss on April 1 and all three games at No. 3 Florida on April 13-15. Auburn has been its own worst enemy in those 11 games, committing 13 errors which have led to 10 unearned runs. Senior Lauren Guzman has led the Tigers, hitting .421 (16-for-38), in SEC road games.

♦ Auburn has won nine of its last 12 SEC road series when the Tigers win game one of the series. Auburn is 1-1 this season when winning game one. The Tigers beat No. 8 Georgia 2-0 in game one, but lost the series as the Bulldogs took games two and three. Auburn did take the series against Ole Miss, beating the Rebels 9-5 in game one and 7-4 in game two. Ole Miss prevented the sweep with a 6-1 win in the finale. The last time Auburn lost game one of an SEC road series, but rebounded to take the series was last season against Mississippi State. Auburn lost game one 4-3, but took game two 5-3 and game three 5-4 in eight innings.

♦ The Tigers will play a pair of nights in Columbia with games one and two each scheduled for a 7 p.m. ET/6 p.m. CT starts. Auburn is 6-6 in night games and 4-2 in road nights games.

♦ Auburn set an attendance record in its doubleheader against Alabama as 3,628 fans packed Jane B. Moore Field Tuesday night. That broke the previous high for a doubleheader of 3,125 set on April 3, 2010, also against Alabama. Although not counted as a single game, Auburn's first game against the Tide on Tuesday drew 1,822 fans which is the most fans to ever witness one game at Jane B. Moore Field. The highest single-game home attendance for the Tigers is 1,723 fans set against Alabama on April 13, 2008.

♦ Auburn's 2-1 win over Kentucky in the series finale marked the Tigers' first walk-off win since March 20, 2011 in a 3-2 win over South Carolina. The Tigers and Gamecocks were tied 2-2 in that game before Kyndall White hit a one-out, solo home run to claim a 3-2 win in the bottom of the ninth inning. Against UK, freshman Brannndi Melero drew a bases-loaded HBP to force the winning run home with two outs in the bottom of the seventh. Auburn trailed 1-0 entering the bottom of the seventh.

♦ Auburn tied the program record for consecutive wins with 15 before suffering its first loss of the season. The Tigers' first loss this season came against No. 16 Michigan, 4-0, on March 2 at the Citrus Classic. The 2012 Tigers tied the record set by the 2011 team that won 15 straight from Feb. 12 to March 4, losing 6-0 to No. 10 Oklahoma in Norman.

♦ Auburn has three home games on the 2012 television schedule. Auburn's second game of a double-header against Alabama on March 27 will be televised on ESPNU. The Tigers will appear on ESPNU again on Saturday, April 7 when the Tennessee Lady Vols come to the Plains. Game two of the Auburn-Arkansas series on Saturday April 22 will air on Fox Sports Net/Sports South. Auburn has appeared on TV 15 times since the 2010 season.

♦ Tina Deese is in her 16th season as Auburn's head coach. Deese is the longest tenured softball coach in the Southeastern Conference and the third-longest tenured head coach at Auburn. Men's tennis coach Eric Shore is the longest tenured head coach at Auburn at 22 years, followed second by women's golf head coach Kim Evans at 18 years. Deese's career record is 813-554-1 and her Auburn record is 527-431-1.

In her 15th season as Auburn's head coach Tina Deese led the 2011 Tigers back into the NFCA top 25 and to series wins over No. 4 Georgia and No. 18 Kentucky. Auburn posted seven wins over top 25 teams in 2011, including wins over No. 19 Oklahoma State, No. 11 Tennessee and No. 3 Florida in the SEC Tournament.

Auburn's win over the Gators put the Tigers in the semifinals of the conference tournament for the first time since 2005. Auburn lost to eventual tournament champion Tennessee by a score of 2-1.

Auburn advanced its fourth consecutive, and eighth overall, NCAA Regional in 2011. The Tigers traveled cross-country for the Seattle Regional hosted by the University of Washington. Additionally, the 2011 Tigers set a program record with a 15-game winning streak to open the season.

Now in her 16th season as Auburn's head coach, Deese has led the Tigers to seven of the past eight NCAA Regionals and 11 of the past 12 Southeastern Conference Tournaments.

Deese is the longest tenured coach in the Southeastern Conference.

Averaging nearly 40 wins per season since 2004, the Tigers advanced to a third consecutive NCAA tournament in 2010, taking part in the nationally-televised Atlanta Regional.

With the SEC agreeing to a new multi-media partnership with the ESPN family of networks, CBS, Fox-Sports Net, the SEC Network, CSS and Sirius/XM Radio, the Tigers had 15 televised games since the 2010 season including home games against Alabama, Arkansas and Tennessee.

Under Deese's guidance, the 2010 Tigers extended the program's streak of placing at least one player on the All-SEC Team to seven consecutive years as junior Kyndall White earned Second Team honors.

With a roster that featured 14 underclassmen, the Tigers posted four-year highs in home runs, RBI, total hits and batting average in 2010. The Auburn pitching staff had the league's third-best ERA, third-lowest opponent batting average and the second-most strikeouts during the season.

Playing with just three seniors and eight freshmen, the 2009 Tigers were limited in experienced players. But Deese and the coaching staff got the Tigers off to a strong start with wins over No. 18 North Carolina, No. 11 Cal and 2009 regional teams Jacksonville State, FIU and Cal-Fullerton.

Although injuries prevented the 2009 squad from being at full strength down the stretch, the Tigers were still able to earn berths in the SEC Tournament in Knoxville, Tenn., and the NCAA Regional hosted by Georgia Tech in Atlanta.

Deese put together one of her strongest teams in 2005 as the Tigers rolled to a program-record 50 victories and hosted its first ever NCAA Regional at picturesque Jane B. Moore Field. For a second straight season, the Tigers finished in the top 25 of both collegiate polls.

Deese was also responsible for starting the softball program at Huntingdon College in Montgomery, Ala.

In her eight seasons at Huntingdon, Deese amassed a 286-123 record. She led her teams to seven straight winning seasons and third-place finishes in the NAIA in 1992 and 1994. In 1992, Deese was named NAIA District 27 Coach of the Year.

Prior to her arrival at Huntingdon, Deese served as a pitching coach at her alma mater, Florida State, from 1985-86. Deese began her playing career in 1982 as a member of Golden West College's (Calif.) Varsity Softball team. She helped lead the team to the California State Championship in 1983 and was named the California State Championship Most Valuable Player.

Her accomplishments at Golden West led her to Florida State where she once again was greeted with immediate success. In 1984, her first season with the Seminoles, Deese led the nation in strikeouts per seven innings at 11.6. As a result, she was named the Lady Seminoles Most Valuable Player while helping lead the team to the Florida State Championship. She was also named to the All-Southeast Region First Team -- a feat she duplicated her second season and final season at Florida State.

Deese received a bachelor of science degree in leisure services and studies from Florida State in 1986. She later received a bachelor of arts degree from Huntingdon College in human performance and kinesiology in 1994. She completed her master of arts in teaching from Troy State University in 1995.

Deese and her husband, Allen, have one son, Kyler, 18, and daughter, Jessi, 14.
