GAMECOCKS USE SECOND HALF SURGE TO ADVANCE TO FINAL FOUR

South Carolina out-scored Florida by 14 points, and held the Gators 0-of-14 from 3-point range in the second half, to close a 77-70 victory in the East Regional Final on Sunday to advance to the Final Four this week in Phoenix. Senior guard Sindarius Thornwell led the squad in scoring for the seventh straight game, posting a game high 26 points, along with seven rebounds and two steals to earn the Regional's Most Outstanding Player Award. Joining Thornwell on the All-Tournament Team was sophomore guard PJ Dozier, who was electric on Sunday night, connecting on seven shots for 17 points. Classmate Chris Silva added 13 and pulled down a team high nine rebounds, while rookie forward Maik Kotsar added 12 points in the win.

SOUTH CAROLINA IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

South Carolina's selection to the 2017 NCAA Tournament field marked the Gamecocks' ninth trip all-time to the NCAA Tournament and the first since 2004. Carolina holds an all-time record of 8-9 in NCAA Tournament games, with its last win prior to its win over Marquette in the opening round coming in the 1973 East Regional Consolation versus Southwestern Louisiana (now Louisiana Lafayette). Carolina's first-ever win in the Tournament came in a 53-51 win over Temple in 1972, when Gamecock great Kevin Joyce hit a last-second jumper to propel the Gamecocks past the Owls into the Sweet 16.

Below are a few notables about South Carolina's NCAA Tournament history:

- The Gamecocks have advanced to the NCAA Tournament nine times (including 2017): 1971, 1972, 1973, 1974, 1989, 1997, 1998, 2004 and 2017

- South Carolina's first-ever NCAA Tournament win came in a 53-51 victory over Temple on March 11, 1972, in Williamsburg, Va., in the NCAA First Round

- Tom Riker (1970-72) owns the Carolina record for most points scored in a tournament game with 39 vs. Fordham on March 20, 1971, in Raleigh. He made 18-of-26 attempts from the floor in that contest

- Melvin Watson dished a Gamecock NCAA Tournament record 10 assists vs. Richmond on March 12, 1998, in Washington, D.C.

Carolina, the Gamecocks are 5-1 in games played in New York City with wins over Manhattan, Iowa State and Syracuse at the Barclays Center, the loss to Seton Hall in December at Madison Square Garden and the NCAA Tournament wins over Baylor and Florida.

- Over the course of the last two seasons, Carolina is 9-3 in neutral site games.

- Senior Guard Sindarius Thornwell has pulled in several awards this postseason for his outstanding season on the court. He was named the SEC Player of the Year, as well as garnering All-SEC First Team and All-Defensive Team accolades from the league coaches. He was named a unanimous selection to the AP All-SEC First Team and he earned USBWA All-District III (Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina, Maryland) honors and he was named a Basketball Times Third Team All-American.

- South Carolina captured its 20th win of the season on Feb. 11 in Starkville over Mississippi State. It marked the first time the Gamecocks have had back-to-back 20-wins seasons (25-9 during 2015-16 campaign) since the 2003-04 (23-11), the 2004-05 (20-13) and the 2005-06 (23-15) seasons when the Gamecocks posted three-straight 20-win campaigns.

- The Gamecocks posted their 10th SEC win of the season in Starkville as well, marking just the fifth double-digit win total in SEC play for Carolina in its

- South Carolina head coach Frank Martin is now 10-4 all-time in NCAA Tournament games following Sunday's win over Florida in the East Regional Final. Martin's first six wins in the postseason event came while he was the head coach at Kansas State. Martin also led his 2009-10 K-State squad to an Elite Eight appearance, while each season that Martin's team have advanced to the NCAA Tournament it has won at least one game.

- With the Gamecocks selection to the NCAA Tournament this season it marks the first time that South Carolina has had back-to-back postseason bids (NIT in 2016) since Carolina advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 2004 and then the NIT in 2005 and 2006.

- South Carolina is 5-2 in neutral site contests this season, as the Gamecocks upset then-No. 18/16 Syracuse at the Barclays Center on Nov. 26, before suffering a three-point loss to Seton Hall at Madison Square Garden on Dec. 12, a loss on March 10 to Alabama in the SEC Tournament Quarterfinals in Nashville, and the NCAA Tourney wins over Marquette, Duke, Baylor and Florida.

- Since Frank Martin has taken over as head coach at

26-seasons in the league. It's also just the second time that Carolina has had back-to-back seasons with double-digit league wins, as the Gamecocks posted 11 last season. (15 SEC wins in 1997, 11 in 1998).

- Thornwell was named to the Naismith Trophy Top 30 list, the Atlanta Tipoff Club announced on Feb. 9.

- Thornwell has accounted for 31.2% of the team's scoring over the course of the last five games. Overall this season, he accounts for 24.6% of Carolina's scoring. In league play, that number jumped to 30.2%. Only one other player in the last 18 SEC seasons accounted for more of his team's scoring in SEC games and had winning SEC seasons than Thornwell. UT's Ron Slay accounted for 31.3% of the Vols scoring during the 2003 league campaign.

- In league play, Carolina opponents averaged 18.4 turnovers per contest. Two straight opponents near the end of the season - Tennessee (Feb. 25) and Mississippi State (Feb. 28) - both committed 20 turnovers. It marked the sixth and seventh SEC opponents that committed at least 20 turnovers.

- Through 33 games this season, South Carolina has held the opposing team's top scorer to below his season average in 24 of those games.

- South Carolina forced at least 15 turnovers in every SEC game this season except the Arkansas game (the Razorbacks had 13). Texas A&M's 25 marked an opponent season high in the category, and Alabama (Feb. 7 game) was just behind with 24 giveaways.

- South Carolina currently ranks seventh in the nation in 3-point field goal percentage defense, holding opponents to just 29.8 percent from beyond the arc this season. Carolina has held eight opponents to below 20% from 3-point range this season and 19 opponents below 30%.

- South Carolina leads the SEC in several defensive categories entering Final Four action. In overall games, Carolina is second in scoring defense (64.9), first in FG% defense (39.8%) and first in 3-point FG% defense (29.8%), and in steals (7.8 per game). In strictly league games, Carolina finished third in scoring defense (68.2), second in 3-point FG% defense (31.3%) and first in steals (7.9 per game).

- Individually in the SEC statistics (overall games), Thornwell leads the league in scoring (21.6), is sixth in rebounds (7.2), first in steals (2.2) and seventh in offensive rebounds per game (2.6). Dozier is sixth with 1.7 steals per outing.

- South Carolina was 15-3 at home during the regular season, averaging 75.7 points per game and hitting 41.8% from the field.

- The Gamecocks were 6-5 in away games this season (5-4 in SEC games), and averaged 69.4 points per game and hit 41.1% from the field.

- South Carolina head coach Frank Martin is 88-84 (.511) all-time in conference games following the 2017 campaign.

- Frank Martin is 12-6 all-time in NCAA and NIT games during his tenure as a head coach. He is 10-4 in the NCAA Tournament and 2-2 in the NIT.

- Martin is 26-33 (.440) against ranked opponents as a head coach. His teams have four wins over opponents ranked in the top five, and two wins over opponents who are ranked No. 1.

- South Carolina finished its 26th basketball season as a member of the Southeastern Conference in 2017. The Gamecocks are 167-259 (.392) all-time in SEC games.

- The Gamecocks finished the season ranked 43rd in the NCAA RPI (games through March 12), which was fifth in the SEC behind Kentucky (4th), Florida (10th), Arkansas (28th) and Vanderbilt (38th).

- South Carolina had 11 top 100 RPI and 15 top 150 RPI wins this season.

- Three would finish in double-figures, but the Gamecocks would suffer a 64-53 loss to Alabama in the SEC Tournament Quarterfinals on March 10. Senior guard Sindarius Thornwell led Carolina with 16 points, sophomore guard PJ Dozier added 15 with a team high two assists, and freshman guard Rakym Felder would add 10 off the bench. Alabama out-rebounded the Gamecocks by 15 in the contest.

- Sindarius Thornwell would score 25 points with seven rebounds, six assists and two steals, but a furious second-half comeback by South Carolina would fall short at Ole Miss in the regular-season finale, as the Rebels posted a 75-70 victory in Oxford on March 4. Thornwell would score 11 of his points at the foul line and connected on four of Carolina's nine 3s in the contest. The Gamecocks trailed by as many as 21 in the second half, and pulled to within four late in the game.

- Senior guard Sindarius Thornwell would score 17 of his 22 in the second half, and sophomore forward Chris Silva posted the third double-double of his career with 15 points and 11 rebounds, in Carolina's 63-57 victory over Mississippi State on Feb. 28 in Columbia on Senior Night. Carolina did not shoot the ball well, hitting just 34.0% of its attempts, but the Gamecock defense held the Bulldogs to just 36.4% in the game and 26.9% from 3, while forcing 20 turnovers (for the second straight game) to clinch the home-court win.

- South Carolina captured its 11th win of the SEC season on Feb. 25 with a 27-point win over Tennessee. Four scored in double-figures for the Gamecocks, led by sophomore guard PJ Dozier's 19. Senior guard Duane Notice was key in a big second half for the Gamecocks, as he hit five 3s in the game, including three in the first five and a half minutes of the second half. The Gamecock defense was strong against the Vols, holding UT to just 7.7% from 3-point range (1-13) and 33.3% overall in the game.

- Senior guard Sindarius Thornwell claimed sole possession of first place in Carolina history with his 117th career start at LSU. He passed Gamecock greats BJ McKie and Melvin Watson, who both started 116 career games, to claim the top spot.

- Carolina's win at Tennessee on Jan. 11 was the 200th of head coach Frank Martin's coaching career. He amassed a 117-54 record as head coach at Kansas State, and holds a mark of 84-66 in his fifth season at Carolina.

GAMECOCKS ELITE EIGHT BOUND

Led by four in double figures, including a game high 24 points from senior guard Sindarius Thornwell, South Carolina posted a 70-50 victory over third-seeded Baylor last Friday night in Sweet 16 play to advance to the Elite Eight matchup versus No. 4 seed Florida. South Carolina held Baylor to just 30.4% (17-56) from the field, while the Gamecocks connected on 23-of-50 (46.0%) attempts, including eight 3-point field goals in the win. The Gamecocks have now won three-straight and are 4-2 in neutral site contests this season.

GAMECOCKS UPSET DUKE TO ADVANCE TO SWEET 16

Seventh-seeded South Carolina scored 65 second-half points in an upset win over the second-seeded Duke Blue Devils on March 19 to advance to its first Sweet 16 (current Tournament format) with an 88-81 victory. Carolina was led by five players in double figures, with senior guard Sindarius Thornwell once again leading the way with 24 points, six rebounds and five assists. Sophomore forward Chris Silva tallied a career high 17 points, and notched his fourth double-double of the season also grabbing a team high 10 rebounds. It was South Carolina's first win over its old ACC foe since Dec. 12, 1970.

GAMECOCKS POST FIRST NCAA TOURNAMENT WIN SINCE 1973

Led by a 29-point, 11-rebound performance by SEC Player of the Year Sindarius Thornwell, South Carolina posted its first NCAA Tournament win since 1973 on March 17 with a 93-73 victory over 10th-seeded Marquette in the event's opening round at Bon Secours Wellness Arena in Greenville. South Carolina used a huge second half to clinch the win, out-scoring the Golden Eagles 54-33 in the second stanza, including a 21-6 run over the final 7:43. Gamecock sophomore guard PJ Dozier was also big for Carolina in the win, scoring 21 points, including 13 in the second half, while adding four assists and two steals. The stifling Gamecock defense played to its strength, forcing 18 Marquette turnovers, which turned into 25 Carolina points. South Carolina committed just nine turnovers in the win, and hit 52.2 percent (35-67) from the floor, including a 20-of-36 (55.6%) mark in the second half.

SCOUTING GONZAGA

- Gonzaga is coached by Mark Few, now in his 18th season leading the Bulldogs. He has a career record of 502-112 at GU.

- Though the team rose to fame through Cinderella runs in the tournament, the Bulldogs are more than battle-tested when it comes to postseason play. The program has made the NCAA tournament every year since 1999, and has made at least the Sweet 16 round for three straight seasons. This, however, is the first time that Gonzaga has made the Final Four.

- Now riding a seven-game win streak, Gonzaga enters the matchup with South Carolina at 36-1 overall. Since the 2010-11 season, no other program in the country has a better record than Gonzaga (205-39, .840).

- The team's 36 wins this season are a new program record.

- Gonzaga is one of just four teams in the country to shoot better than 50 percent from the field so far this season.

- On the other side of the court, the GU defense ranks second in the nation in field goal percentage defense, limiting opponents to just 36.5 percent through 37 games.

- Gonzaga is led by a veteran group of players, with four seeing time in over 100 career games. Przemek Karnowski leads the team with 149 career games played, 115 starts.

- Behind the best scoring margin in the country (+22.3), Gonzaga has four players averaging double-figure points per game. Washington transfer Nigel Williams-Goss leads the team with 16.7 points per game, followed by Karnowski at 12.2.

- Williams-Goss is the West Coast Conference player of the year; in total there were three Gonzaga players who made the conference's postseason first team.

SCOUTING NORTH CAROLINA

- North Carolina is coached by Roy Williams, who is in his 14th season as head coach at the school, accumulating a record of 396-115. His career record as a coach is 814-216.

- The Tar Heels rank second in history for NCAA tournament wins, with 121, and are the No. 1 seed for the 16th time in program history.

- This is the 11th Final Four appearance for the school, it enters with a 5-5 record. The last national championship for the Tar Heels came in 2009, but the team did make the final last season before losing on a buzzer-beater to Villanova.

- North Carolina ranks ninth nationally with an average of 85 points per game, and sixth in scoring margin (+14.4).

- The Tar Heels are in a class of their own when it comes to rebounding. The team averages 43.7 per game, almost two more than any other team in country, and limits the opposition to just 30.7 per game. No other team in the country has a rebounding margin greater than nine per game – UNC stands alone at 13.

- Four different players average double figures in scoring for UNC, with Justin Jackson leading the way at 18.2. Joel Berry (14.6), Kennedy Meeks (12.3) and Isaiah Hicks (12.1) also help to drive the team's offense.

SCOUTING OREGON

- Oregon is coached by Dana Altman, who is in his seventh year in Eugene. He is 187-69 with Oregon, and has a career coaching record of 720-336.

- The Ducks upset number one seed Kansas to make their first Final Four since 1939. This is the 25th postseason appearance for the program, which has an all-time record of 48-27.

- Oregon is 33-5, with the win over Kansas extending a school record for wins in a single season.

- The Ducks are outscoring opponents by 13.4 points per game coming into the Final Four. Oregon's 78.9 points per game offensively ranks in the top 50 nationally.

- It has been a defensive show for UO all season long, as the team ranks first in the NCAA in total blocked shots and averages 6.3 per game as a team. Jordan Bell (84) and Chris Boucher (79) currently lead the team and rank third and fourth, respectively, in the program's single-season block list. Boucher has 79 blocks despite missing the last five games for Oregon.

- Junior Dillon Brooks leads the offense with 16.3 points per game despite averaging just 25 minutes per game. Fellow guard Tyler Dorsey sits second with 14.5 points per game.

- Along with his blocks total, Jordan Bell also leads the team with 8.6 rebounds per game (108 offensive rebounds).

SEC COACHES POSTSEASON AWARDS

South Carolina senior guard Sindarius Thornwell was named the 2017 SEC Player of the Year, while he also garnered First Team All-SEC honors, as well as All-Defensive Team accolades from the league's coaches. Thornwell's distinction as the Player of the Year marks the first Gamecock to ever earn the honor. His First-Team honors mark the first All-SEC award of his career, while he was named to the All-Defensive team for the second straight season. Thornwell led the SEC in scoring in league games this season with 22.1 points per game, while he was sixth with 7.5 rebounds per league game and first with 2.4 steals. He posted 11 20-point games during league action, which included a 34-point outing at Kentucky, and an historic 44-point performance against Alabama. During his career in the Garnet and Black, Thornwell has earned SEC All-Freshman Team (2014), First Team All-SEC (2016), All-Defensive Team (2016, 2017) accolades and the 2017 SEC Player of the Year award.



NATIONAL RANKINGS

South Carolina was ranked in the AP poll for nine weeks this season and in the Coaches Poll for 10 weeks. The Gamecocks jumped in to the national rankings on Nov. 28 for the first time this season after posting wins over two ranked opponents the previous week in No. 25/24 Michigan and No. 18/16 Syracuse. The Gamecocks checked in at No. 20 in the Associated Press poll and No. 23 in the Coaches Poll. The Gamecocks have risen to as high as 16th in the AP poll this season (Dec. 12), which was the highest rank for Carolina since the Gamecocks were ranked 14th in the final poll of the 1997-98 campaign. The Gamecocks high mark in the Coaches poll this season was at No. 15 (Dec. 12).

BY THE NUMBERS

1.3 - Sophomore forward Chris Silva is averaging 1.3 blocks per game this season, which is a team high.

1.7 - PJ Dozier's 1.7 steals per game is second on the team and ranks sixth in the SEC. Dozier has eight games this season with at least three steals, and collected a season high four steals vs. FIU and again vs. Alabama.

2.2 - Senior guard Sindarius Thornwell is averaging 2.2 steals per game this season, which leads the SEC and ranks 15th nationally.

2.4 - Thornwell's 2.4 steals per game led the SEC in conference games this season. It marked the most steals per game in conference play by a Gamecock since Devan Downey averaged 2.5 per SEC game during the 2010 season. Additionally, it was the most seals per game in the SEC during league games since LSU's Anthony Hickey averaged 2.8 during the 2013 league season.

2.982 - The Gamecocks excelled in the classroom during the fall semester, as the team posted a cumulative GPA of 2.982.

+4.0 - South Carolina leads the SEC and is eighth nationally with a turnover margin of +4.0.

5+ - Senior guard Sindarius Thornwell dished a team high five assists in Carolina's 88-81 win over Duke in the NCAA Tournament second round, marking the 28th game of his career with five or more helpers.

6 - South Carolina committed just six turnovers in the win vs. A&M on Jan. 7, trying for the fewest in the Frank Martin era.

8-8 - Sophomore forward Chris Silva was a perfect 8-of-8 from the charity stripe in the win over Auburn on Jan. 24.

9 - Sophomore forward Chris Silva hit a career high nine free throws in the Elite Eight victory over Florida. He connected on 9-of-12 attempts at the line in the victory.

13 - South Carolina's 13 steals vs. FIU on Dec. 4 marked a season high in the category, surpassing the previous high of 12 vs. Syracuse.

13 - Senior guard Justin McKie scored a career high 13 points in the win over Auburn on Jan. 24. He hit 5-of-7 from the floor, including a career best 3-of-4 from range.

14-15 - Senior guard Sindarius Thornwell set then-career highs when he hit 14 free throws on 15 attempts at Kentucky on Jan. 21. Thornwell missed his first free throw of the game, and went on to finish 14-14 from the line the rest of the way.

16 - Sophomore forward Chris Silva scored a then-career high 16 points in Carolina's win vs. Ole Miss on Jan. 14, and matched the mark three times in league play.

17.2 - South Carolina leads the SEC and ranks fifth nationally with 17.2 forced turnovers per game.

20+ - Senior guard Sindarius Thornwell's 19 20-point games this season mark the most 20-point games in a campaign since Devan Downey also had 19 20-point efforts during the 2009-10 season.

21.6 - Thornwell's 21.6 points per game in overall games this season leads the SEC and ranks 14th nationally. Thornwell has scored in double-figures in every game this season and has scored 15 or more 27 times.

23 - South Carolina dished a season high 23 assists in the Jan. 24 win over Auburn. It is the third-most ever during the Frank Martin era.

25 - The 25 turnovers by Texas A&M were an opponent high this season. It was the most turnovers in a game by a Carolina opponent since SE Louisiana committed 26 turnovers on Dec. 21, 2011.

34 - Freshman guard Rakym Felder's 34 3s on the year mark the most by a Carolina freshman since Sindarius Thornwell had 37 during his rookie campaign in 2013-14.

37-28 - South Carolina head coach Frank Martin holds a 37-28 all-time record in neutral site games as a head coach.

34 - Senior guard Sindarius Thornwell scored a then-career high 34 points in the contest at Kentucky on Jan. 21. It marked the first 30-point game of his career.

34 - South Carolina scored a season high 34 points off of 22 LSU turnovers in the win at the Maravich Center on Feb. 1.

36 - Three Gamecocks played at least 36 minutes in Carolina's win over Florida in the Elite Eight. Kotsar, Thornwell and Dozier all played 36, while Notice played a game high 38.

38-3 - Over the course of the last two seasons, the Gamecocks are 38-3 in games when leading at the half. Carolina was 20-1 last season when leading at the half, and 18-2 this season when holding the edge at the break.

41 - Dozier's 41 made 3s this season are 31 more than his total of 10 from his rookie campaign.

51 - South Carolina has out-scored its opponent in points in the paint in 51 of the last 68 games dating back to last season. The Gamecocks are 42-9 in those games, including an 18-6 mark this season when scoring more points in the paint than its opponent.

50.6% - South Carolina collects an assist on 50.6 percent of its made baskets this season (455/898). Carolina dished 17 assists in the NCAA First Round matchup vs. Marquette, led by four each from senior guard Justin McKie and sophomore guard PJ Dozier.

62 - The senior trio of Sindarius Thornwell (22), Duane Notice (27) and Justin McKie (13) accounted for 62 points in the Carolina win over Auburn on Jan. 24.

64.9 - South Carolina ranks 31st in the country and second in the SEC in scoring defense, as opponents are averaging just 64.9 points per game this season.

80+ - Three different Gamecocks have registered at least 80 assists this season. Sophomore guard PJ Dozier's 99 are a team high, while senior guards Duane Notice and Sindarius Thornwell have both dished 84.

SILVA EMERGING AS CONSISTENT OFFENSIVE THREAT

Sophomore forward Chris Silva has emerged as a consistent offensive threat this season. The Libreville, Gabon, native set a new career high with 17 points in the upset win over Duke in the NCAA Tournament, and has 20 double-figure scoring games this season after having just six during rookie campaign. Silva has hit 53.8 percent of his shot attempts this season (119-221), and is also hitting 74.7 percent (127-170) at the foul line. His rebounds per game average (5.9) is significantly higher than his freshman season, and his 48 blocks this season are 20 more than he had in all of 2015-16. THORNWELL'S HISTORIC NIGHT VS. ALABAMA

Senior guard Sindarius Thornwell put forth an historic performance in Carolina's four-overtime loss to Alabama on Feb. 7 at Colonial Life Arena. His 44-point performance tied for the fourth-most points in a game by a Gamecock and the most in a game since 1979, while his 21-rebounds were the most by any player in the SEC this season and the most by a Gamecock since 1993. Below are some notes on his performance:

- Thornwell set the SEC record for made free throws in a league game with 25 vs. the Crimson Tide. He broke a record held by LSU's Pete Maravich of 22 made free throws in a game vs. Florida in 1969.

- Thornwell's 25 made free throws and 33 attempts were both South Carolina school records.

- Thornwell's 44 points marked the first 40-point game by a Gamecock since Michael Foster had 40 in a win vs. Vanderbilt on Dec. 28, 1986, in New Orleans. That game was a double-overtime contest.

- Thornwell's 44 points marked the most in a game by a Carolina player since Cedrick Hordges had 44 vs. Biscayne on Dec. 1, 1979.

- Thornwell's 21 rebounds marked the first 20-rebound game by a Gamecock since Emmett Hall pulled down 23 vs. the College of Charleston on Dec. 22, 1993.

- The 21 rebounds by Thornwell were the most by a player in the SEC this season, and tied for the 15th-most by any player nationally (games played through Feb. 8).

- Thornwell became the first Gamecock to record two games with at least 30 points in a season since Devan Downey had six games with 30 or more points during the 2009-10 campaign.

THE DEFENSE

South Carolina is making headlines this season for its tenacious defense, check out a few key stats on the Gamecock D:

- Carolina has held 17 opponents this season to below 40% from the floor.

- The Gamecocks have ranked among the top 25 in the nation in field goal percentage defense at the conclusion of the last two seasons - 13th in 2014-15 when opponents hit 38.7%, and 25th in 2015-16 when opponents hit 39.7% - while Carolina currently ranks 15th nationally (opponent field goal percent of 39.8%) in the category this season.

- The Gamecocks have scored double-digit points off of turnovers in all but one game this season, including a season high 34 points off of turnovers in the win at LSU on Feb. 1.

- Carolina leads the SEC and ranks fifth nationally with 17.2 opponent turnovers per game. Only West Virginia (20.0), The Citadel (17.6), Fordham (17.5) and Grambling (17.5) force more turnovers per contest.

- The Gamecocks lead the SEC and rank 24th nationally in steals per game with 7.8 per contest.

MCKIE KEY VS. GEORGIA ON FEB. 4

A huge 3 from the corner with 3:17 on the clock, and the eventual game winning free throws, solidified a career moment for senior guard Justin McKie in Carolina's home win over Georgia on Feb. 4. McKie picked up a steal and added a lay-in in the opening half vs. the Bulldogs, before collecting two steals in half two, while connecting on a huge 3 late in the game, which gave the Gamecocks a nine-point advantage. McKie hit two free throws with six seconds on the clock, which gave Carolina a four-point advantage. The makes would stand as the game winners as the Bulldogs hit a last-second lay-up just before the buzzer to make the final score 77-75. McKie is having a stellar year in 2016-17, averaging career highs in every major statistical category, including points per game (4.1). He is also dishing 1.3 assists compared to just 0.6 turnovers per outing.

DOZIER NUMBERS

South Carolina sophomore guard PJ Dozier has tallied double-digit points in 24 games this season, including 21 in the historic Gamecock win over Marquette in the NCAA Tournament First Round on March 17. Dozier also has 19 games with at least 15 points and he has scored 20 or more in nine games. His field goal percentage of 40.6 percent (184-453) ranks higher than last season's number of 38.1 percent (91-239) during his rookie campaign. Most notably is his accuracy from beyond the arc. Dozier connected on 10-of-47 attempts last season (21.3%), and has surpassed his mark of made 3s this season, hitting 41-of-138 attempts at almost 30 percent. He is also making a mark on the defensive end with 58 steals (1.7 per game/6th in the SEC).

DOZIER NAMED TO SEC COMMUNITY SERVICE TEAM

South Carolina sophomore guard PJ Dozier was named to the 2017 SEC Community Service Team on March 2. This season marks the 19th that the SEC has named its Community Service Team in men's basketball. Dozier has done outstanding work in community outreach during his time at Carolina, reading to local schools, helping with Meals on Wheels and the annual 8K In 8 Days campaign to name a few.

A LOOK BACK AT THE NON-CONFERENCE

South Carolina faced a tough non-conference slate in 2016-17, highlighted by four contests away from home, including two neutral site and two true away games. Carolina posted an 8-1 record at home during non-league action, with wins over La Tech, Holy Cross, Monmouth, SC State, Michigan, Vermont, FIU and Lander. Carolina posted a strong 64-50 neutral site win over Syracuse at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn, and also captured a road win at USF. Carolina's losses came in a three-point decision vs. Seton Hall at Madison Square Garden and a two-point home loss to Clemson before the break for the holiday. The final non-conference game of the regular season saw former Metro Conference foe Memphis post a 16-point win over Carolina at FedExForum.

FLORIDA NOTABLES (MARCH 26)

- Carolina will be making its first ever Final Four appearance next weekend.
- With the win this afternoon, Frank Martin is now 10-4 in March Madness.
- Thornwell was named the 2017 NCAA East Regional All-Tournament Most Outstanding Player.
- Thornwell and Dozier were both named to the 2017 NCAA East Regional All-Tournament Team, along with KeVaughn Allen (Florida), Chris Chiozza (Florida) and Nigel Hayes (Wisconsin).
- Four or more Gamecocks have scored in double figures in all four of the team's NCAA Tournament games.
- Kotsar's 12 points were his most since scoring 10 in a road win at Mississippi State back on Feb. 11.
- After being out-rebounded by six in the first half, Carolina turned the table and outrebounded Florida by nine (23-14) in the second half to finish plus-three in rebounding margin, 34-31.
- With his first basket, Thornwell passed former Carolina standout Devan Downey (1,901 points) for fourth on the all-time scoring list.

BAYLOR NOTABLES (MARCH 24)

- With the win tonight, head coach Frank Martin is advancing to his second career Elite Eight. He led Kansas State to a spot in the final eight in 2010. He's now 9-4 all-time in March Madness.
- South Carolina's 25 wins matches a single-season program record, which was set last season.
- The Gamecock defense held Baylor to a season-low 50 points. They also held the Bears to a season-low 30 percent shooting (17-for-56).
- Baylor was held to 50 points just once all season (54 vs. Kansas State on Feb. 4). This is just the fourth time all year the Bears have been held to less than 40 percent shooting, the previous three all coming in Big 12 play.
- After scoring 24 Friday night, Thornwell is now just two points shy of passing former Carolina standout Devan Downey (1,901 points) for fourth on the all-time scoring list.
- Notice, who tied for the team lead with 34 minutes, is now the all-time leader in games played (136) at South Carolina.

DUKE NOTABLES (MARCH 19)

- Thornwell filled up the stat sheet with 24 points, six rebounds and a team-high five assists.

- The Brooklyn, N.Y., native scored in double figures for the eighth time this season.
- Senior Duane Notice is in third place all-time in program history with 133 career games played.
- Silva logged his 13th game of the season with at least two blocks.

OLE MISS NOTABLES (MARCH 4)

- Thornwell logged his 15th 20-point game of the season (30th career) Saturday night. He became the first Gamecock to lead the SEC in scoring in league games (22.1 ppg) since Devan Downey (26.2 ppg) in 2009-10.
- The Lancaster, S.C., native, went 11-for-16 at the charity stripe, marking his fifth game in SEC play with double-digit makes at the foul line.
- Gravett, who made his second career start, finished with 10 points. It was his first game with 10-plus since he scored a career-high 12 in a road win at Tennessee on Jan. 11. He set a new career high with six assists in tonight's game.
- Carolina forced 17 turnovers. The Gamecocks forced 15-plus turnovers in 17 of their 18 SEC games.
- South Carolina's 17 assists Saturday night were it's most since a season-high 23 vs. Auburn on Jan. 24.

MISSISSIPPI STATE NOTABLES (FEB. 28)

THORNWELL NAMED TO PRESEASON SQUAD

Senior guard Sindarius Thornwell was named to the Preseason All-SEC First Team on Thursday by the league's coaches. Thornwell enters the season as the league's high scorer for active players with 1,278 career points. This marks the third-straight season that Thornwell has garnered preseason honors from the coaches, as he was named to the Preseason All-SEC Second Team prior to his sophomore and junior campaigns.

2016-17 SCHEDULE

South Carolina has an exciting schedule set for the 2016-17 campaign. The slate features 14 games, with 10 home contests, including one exhibition. Highlighting the non-conference portion of the schedule is the Gamecocks' participation in the Brooklyn Hoops Holiday Invitational, as well as a matchup versus Seton Hall in the Under Armour "Reunion" doubleheader at Madison Square Garden in mid-December. The Gamecocks will face eight teams that advanced to the postseason a year ago, with four of those NCAA Tournament participants, including Syracuse, which advanced to the Final Four.

GAMECOCKS CONCLUDE HISTORIC 2015-16 REGULAR SEASON

South Carolina concluded an historic regular season on March 5, 2015, with a 76-61 win on the road at Arkansas. That victory set the school record for regular-season wins at 24. The Gamecocks began the season 15-0, their best start since the 1933-34 campaign, and the 24 wins marked the most since the 1996-97 squad also posted 24 victories. In addition, South Carolina's 11 SEC wins marked the most since 1998, match the second-most ever by a Carolina team and marked just the fourth time that the Gamecocks had double-digit SEC wins in their 25 years in the league.

GAMECOCKS ANNOUNCE MARTIN'S MATH CLUB

The SC Education Oversight Committee (EOC) announced on Nov. 28 "Martin's Math Club," a partnership with University of South Carolina head men's basketball coach Frank Martin and the University of South Carolina Athletics Department. Martin, a former high school math educator, developed the project designed to help young people learn that math is fun and relevant in their daily lives. The inaugural "Martin's Math Club" contest will run from November 28, 2016-February 24, 2017. The contest provides the opportunity for teachers and students in grades Kindergarten through 8th grade to win two tickets to a Gamecock men's basketball home game. He was captain of the 1969-70 team that went 25-3 and captured the ACC regular-season title with an undefeated 14-0 mark in league games. Cremins was an assistant at South Carolina for legendary head coach Frank McGuire following his playing career, before he became a college head coach at Georgia Tech, Appalachian State and College of Charleston. Cremins led his teams to 18 post-season appearances, including 11 NCAA Tournament berths.

Frank Martin was named the head men's basketball coach at the University of South Carolina on March 27, 2012, becoming the 32nd head coach in the history of the South Carolina program, which enters its 109th season as a varsity sport in 2016-17. Martin owns a 187-117 (.600) overall record as a head coach, entering his 10th season overall, and a 70-63 (.526) record entering his fifth season at South Carolina.

In Martin's fourth season leading the Garnet and Black (2015-16), Carolina put together one of the top seasons in its history, matching a school record for wins with a 25-9 overall record on the year, while the Gamecocks reached double-digit SEC wins for just the fourth time since joining the league, posting an 11-7 mark in conference contests. The SEC finish was Carolina's highest since the league combined its East and West Divisions prior to the 2012 season. South Carolina began the season 15-0, its best start since the 1933-34 campaign and went on to post a school-record 24 regular-season wins.

The Gamecocks received votes or were ranked for 15 weeks in the USA Today Coaches Poll, rising to as high as 15th, and for a total of 14 weeks in the AP poll, rising to as high as 19th, during the season. Carolina advanced to postseason play for the first time since 2009, making their 12th appearance in the Postseason NIT as one of the top four seeds in the event. The Gamecocks posted a win over High Point in the opening round, before suffering a season-ending loss to visiting Georgia Tech on March 21.

Three Gamecocks were honored with postseason awards by the SEC coaches, with senior forward Michael Carrera earning First Team All-SEC accolades, junior guard Sindarius Thornwell was named to the All-Defensive Team and junior guard Duane Notice was named the league's Sixth Man of the Year. Carrera went on to earn honors from several organizations following the best season of his career. Carrera, Notice and Thornwell each reached the 1,000 career-point plateau during the season as well.

Prior to his appointment in Columbia, Martin spent the previous five season as the head coach at Kansas State University, leading the Wildcats to the NCAA Tournament four times, including a trip to the "Elite 8," during the 2009-10 campaign when the squad won a school record 29 contests. Martin's Wildcats won at least 21 games in each of his five seasons at the helm, as the program compiled a record of 117-54 (.684) under his direction. During that time, Kansas State posted a 50-32 (.609) record in Big 12 Conference games, finishing fifth or higher in each season, with three season finishes of third or better.

A native of Miami, Fla., Martin earned his bachelor's degree in physical education from Florida International in 1993. He and his wife, Anya, have three children, Brandon, Amalia and Christian.

COLUMBIA, S.C. - South Carolina opened its 2016-17 season with a 107-89 exhibition win over Newberry College on Sunday afternoon at Colonial Life Arena. Carolina shot 50.0 percent from the field in the game en route to its offensive outburst. Senior guard Sindarius Thornwell led all players with 34 points on 13-of-24 shooting. The Lancaster, S.C., native, recorded a double-double with 11 rebounds, which led the team. He also led the team with five assists and five blocks.

South Carolina jumped out to a 12-point lead in the first half with 11:23 left, but Newberry would keep the game competitive forcing 12 turnovers and knocking down 10 shots from deep. Thornwell led all scorers at the break with 16 points on 6-of-10 shooting. He also led the team with five rebounds. Carolina shot 51.5 percent from the field as they headed to halftime with a 53-46 lead.

The Gamecocks opened the second half on a 29-11 run, building their lead to 81-57. Thornwell (10 points) and sophomore guard PJ Dozier (nine points) helped fuel the scoring outburst with 26 of those points. Dozier finished tied for second on the team with 17 points. Senior guard Duane Notice, last season's SEC Sixth Man of the Year, also poured in 17 points. Notice was 4-for-9 from behind the arc.

Carolina's defense ramped up in the second half holding Newberry to a 42.1 field goal percentage. The Gamecocks forced 21 turnovers in the game and out-rebounded the Wolves 52-33. Newberry, who looked to run all game with a smaller lineup, would finish the game with 39 attempts from three-point range.

With the win, South Carolina remains unbeaten in five career exhibition contests under the direction of Head Coach Frank Martin.

NOV. 11, 2016/COLONIAL LIFE ARENA

COLUMBIA, S.C. - The South Carolina men's basketball team (1-0) opened the 2016-17 regular season with an 85-76 victory over Louisiana Tech (0-1) Friday night. Four Gamecock starters were in double-figures, led by senior guard Sindarius Thornwell, who poured in 18 points. The Lancaster, S.C., native filled up the stat sheet leading the team in rebounds (7) and assists (6).

Senior guard Duane Notice (17), sophomore guard PJ Dozier (17) and sophomore forward Chris Silva (11) were the other South Carolina starters in double figures. Dozier's 17 points were a new career-high.

The Gamecocks jumped out to a 7-2 lead to start the game behind five points from Dozier. The Gamecocks extended their lead to 16-6 after Thornwell hit a 3-pointer with 12:49 left in the first half.

South Carolina's half court defense was suffocating in the first 10 minutes, as they held the Bulldogs to 29 percent shooting from the field. Louisiana Tech finished half one 11-of-29 from the field (37.9 percent).

The Bulldogs closed the gap to 18-16 with 10:24 left, but Carolina pushed the lead back to nine at 36-27 with 2:36 to play in the half after back-to-back 3s from senior guard Justin McKie and sophomore guard Hassani Gravett.

Gravett ended the first half with an exclamation point as he tipped in a Notice 3-point miss at the buzzer. Carolina led 42-31 at the break as the, Villa Rica, Ga. native's, tip-in gave the team its biggest lead of the first half at 11.

Thornwell led all scorers at halftime with nine points on 4-of-8 shooting. He also had five rebounds and three assists. Junior forward Ran Tut had a nice first half off the bench, dropping four points and tying for the team lead in rebounds with five. Notice had eight points, Dozier seven and Gravett seven to round out Carolina's scoring in the opening period. Carolina out-rebounded La Tech 22-18 in half one.

In the second half, the Bulldogs cut the deficit to seven with 14:13 left after a 3-pointer by sophomore guard Derric Jean from the right wing. La Tech's Jacobi Boykins stole the ball at half court finishing with an emphatic dunk at the other end to cut the lead to 59-54. He was whistled for a technical foul after the play. Notice missed both free throws but Silva put the Gamecocks back up by seven after a dunk on the ensuing possession off a great dish from Gravett.

La Tech's Daquan Bracy would cut the lead to four at 65-61, knocking down a 3-pointer with 7:58 left. Thornwell would answer the basket with a fast break 3 of his own from the left corner to put Carolina back up seven with 5:56 on the clock. The Bulldogs answered, but Silva increased the lead to nine with a 3-point play with 4:31 left after beating Jean to the hole for the and-one bucket.

Thornwell and Silva again halted La Tech's momentum after bringing Colonial Life Arena to its feet with two straight transition dunks, pushing the lead to 80-70 with 2:37 left, and the Gamecocks would close the nine-point win.

GAME 2 - SOUTH CAROLINA 81, HOLY CROSS 49
NOV. 13, 2016/COLONIAL LIFE ARENA

COLUMBIA, S.C. - South Carolina (2-0) picked up its second win of the season Sunday night at Colonial Life Arena after an 81-49 victory versus Holy Cross (0-1). The Gamecock defense limited the Crusaders to just 17 second half points and 30 percent shooting (6-20) from the field in the half. Carolina senior guard Sindarius Thornwell had 20 points to lead all scorers.

After trailing 4-3 early in the game, Carolina went on a 9-0 run after a put-back dunk by sophomore Chris Silva that put the Gamecocks up 12-4. Senior guard Justin McKie extended the early lead to 10 after a transition layup put Carolina ahead 18-8 with 11:56 to go in the first half. McKie's layup forced Crusader Head Coach Bill Carmody to take a timeout after his team started the game 2-for-11 from the field (18.1 percent).

After the timeout, freshman guard Rakym Felder hit a 3-pointer from the top of the key to put the Gamecocks up 24-13. Carolina started the game on fire from the field, hitting 10-of-14 shots, good for 71.4 percent.

Holy Cross cut the lead to five at the 7:08 mark, but Thornwell answered with a post up bucket from the left block to put the Gamecocks up 33-26. Senior guard Duane Notice then hit a 3 on the team's next possession, putting Carolina up 10, 36-26, with 3:03 left in the opening half.

Senior guard PJ Dozier hit his third 3 of the first half from the left wing with 1:29 left to put the Gamecocks up 15. Holy Cross answered with a 3-point bucket of its own. The teams exchanged 3s again on their next possessions, as Thornwell hit from deep for Carolina and Robert Champion, the Crusaders' leading scorer from a year ago, hit one for Holy Cross. Champion's 3 cut the deficit to 12 just before the half with Carolina leading 44-32.

Thornwell led all scorers at the break with 14. Dozier was the second-leading scorer on the stat sheet with 13 first-half points for the Gamecocks. Notice had four assists to lead all players. Carolina shot 58.3 percent in the opening period, including going 8-of-13 from deep. Champion, and forward Malachi Alexander, each scored 12 points for the Crusaders to account for 24 of the team's 32 first-half points.

GAME 3 - SOUTH CAROLINA 70, MONMOUTH 69 NOV. 15, 2016/COLONIAL LIFE ARENA

COLUMBIA, S.C. - PJ Dozier scored the game-winning jumper on a lob from Duane Notice as time expired in overtime Tuesday night at Colonial Life Arena to power South Carolina (3-0) to a 70-69 non-conference win over Monmouth (1-1). Senior guard Sindarius Thornwell led all scorers for the third-straight game with 23 points. He also had nine rebounds and five assists.

Tonight's game marks Carolina's third game in five days to open the 2016-17 season. Carolina got off to a fast start, opening the game on a 13-0 run. Thornwell and Notice each hit 3s as the Gamecocks opened the game 4-of-7 from the field. Monmouth started the game 0-for-9 and didn't get its first bucket until 13:12 left in the first half.

South Carolina pushed its run to 17-2 just before the second media timeout on a Chris Silvia made free throw. The Gamecocks went 9-for-13 from the charity stripe in the first 10 minutes, after a pair of Notice free throws made the score 19-2.

The Hawks would battle back into the game, cutting the lead to 19-7 with 7:35 left in the opening period, after taking advantage of an 0-for-11 field-goal drought for Carolina that lasted over 10 minutes. Redshirt-sophomore guard TeMarcus Blanton ended the drought after knocking down a 3 to push the Carolina lead to 22-7 with 6:59 left in the half.

Monmouth went on a 6-0 run to cut the lead to nine at 22-13, but the Gamecocks remained ahead 26-13 after back-to-back buckets by senior guard Justin McKie. The Hawks scored the final two baskets of the half to make it 29-22 as the teams headed to the locker room.

Both teams struggled shooting the ball for long stretches in the first half. Monmouth finished the first half 7-for-30 (23.3 percent), while South Carolina shot 8-of-30, good for 26.7 percent.

The Gamecocks started the second half much like half one, going on an 11-0 run after knocking down 4-of-7 shots from the field (57.1 percent). They led 38-22 at the first media timeout. Thornwell (4) and Notice (5) tallied nine of the 11 points on the run.

The Hawks started half two 2-of-9 (22.2 percent) from the field, but then went on a 16-2 run, holding Carolina scoreless for nearly five minutes before a Silva reverse lay-in. McKie and Notice each hit 3s in the stretch to make it 50-46, but the Hawks got back within two to the under-eight-minute timeout. Monmouth took its first lead at 52-50 with 6:52 left after a put-back lay-in by big man Diago Quinn.

Thornwell scored five-straight points to put the Gamecocks back ahead, 55-52, forcing a timeout by head coach King Rice with 5:45 remaining in the second half. Monmouth then had a four-minute field goal drought before scoring four-straight to tie it up at 58-58 with 1:23 remaining. A pair of Thornwell free throws put Carolina ahead by two with 31.7 seconds left, but Micah Seaborn answered for the Hawks with two free throws of his own to tie the score again.

The Gamecocks turned it over off an inbound play with eight seconds left. Monmouth got a shot off from the right wing, but Thornwell leaped high to block it. Carolina got the ball back with 0.7 seconds left. Dozier skinned a half-court heave from the left side that rimmed in-and-out and the game headed to overtime tied at 60.

Dozier, who did not score in regulation, scored six of the team's 10 points in overtime, to propel Carolina to victory. Thornwell scored the other four points from the free throw line. Nine of his 23 points came from the charity stripe Tuesday night. Notice (15) and Silvia (10) joined Thornwell in double-figures. Silvia tallied his first career double-double after leading the team with 10 rebounds.

The Hawks finished the game with four players in double-figures. Chris Brady led the way with 17 points and 10 rebounds. Je'Lon Hornbeak (14), Micah Seaborn (11) and Justin Robinson (11) were also in double-figures for Monmouth. The Gamecocks held Robinson, who was the unanimous selection for MAAC Preseason Player of the Year, to just 2-of-13 shooting.

GAME 4 - SOUTH CAROLINA 90, SC STATE 52 NOV. 18, 2016/COLONIAL LIFE ARENA

COLUMBIA, S.C. - South Carolina (4-0) picked up a non-conference home win Friday night after downing South Carolina State (1-2) 92-50. Senior guard Sindarius Thornwell led all scorers for the fourth-straight game with 22 points (8-of-15 from the field). It was Thornwell's third 20-point game of the season.

Carolina went to the first media timeout up 11-3, after starting the game 5-of-7 from the field. The Bulldogs cut the lead to 13-8 after an Edward Stephens 3. The Gamecocks then held the Bulldogs scoreless for the next 3:25 (14:44 to 11:19). Two Khadim Gueye free throws and a jumper by Maik Kotsar pushed the lead back to nine at 17-8 at the 13:44 mark in the opening period.

In the first 10 minutes, Carolina held SC State to just 29 percent shooting (4-of-14). The Gamecocks were the exact opposite, starting the game shooting 59 percent from the field (10-for-17).

Kotsar put Carolina up 25-11 after a nifty reverse layup with 8:56 left in the opening half to force Bulldogs head coach Murray Garvin to take his first timeout of the game. After the timeout, the Gamecocks went on a 10-2 run after 3s from sophomore guard PJ Dozier and r-sophomore guard Hassani Gravett.

Thornwell pushed the lead to 40-18 after knocking down a corner 3 with five minutes left to play in the opening half. The Lancaster, S.C. native, then hit another 3 with 1:46 left to push Carolina's lead to 45-23. The 3 gave him 16 first-half points, which led all scorers. The Gamecocks ended the half on a 5-0 run to take a 50-25 lead at the break. Kotsar had eight points at the break and led the team with seven rebounds. The Bulldogs did not connect for a field goal the final 2:41 of the first half and finished 9-for-28 (32 percent) from the field.

Carolina continued to build on its lead in the second half. Kotsar hit double-figures for the first time in his career with 16:54 left in the game after a put back lay-in off a Thornwell miss. The lay-in opened up a 30-point lead for the home team, 60-30.

The Gamecocks would lead by 26 or more for the rest of the night.

Kotsar, a native of Tallin, Estonia, finished the game with 15 points and eight rebounds. He was a perfect 7-of-7 from the field.

Chris Silva was also in double-figures with 11 points. He also had seven rebounds, including four on the offensive end.

Eric Eaves, the Bulldogs leading returner scorer, finished with a game-high 14 points for SC State.

GAME 5 - SOUTH CAROLINA 61, 25/24 MICHIGAN 46 NOV. 23, 2016/COLONIAL LIFE ARENA

COLUMBIA, S.C. - South Carolina (5-0) stifled No. 25/24 Michigan (4-1) 61-46 at Colonial Life Arena Wednesday evening, handing the Wolverines their first loss of the season. The Gamecocks had four players in double figures, led by senior guard Sindarius Thornwell, who finished with 21 points and 10 rebounds. It was the Lancaster, S.C. native's fourth-straight game scoring 20-plus and his first double-double of the season.

Carolina threw the first punch Wednesday evening, jumping out to a 13-5 lead at the first media timeout with 15:42 left in the first half. Notice and Silva combined for 10 of the team's first 12 points with five apiece.

Three forced turnovers and a 6-2 advantage on the boards aided the Gamecocks solid start. The Wolverines countered with a 7-0 run to bring the score to 13-12 as Carolina went scoreless for over four minutes.

Michigan struggled to shoot the ball against South Carolina's stifling defense the entire first half, but was able to keep the game tight with solid shooting from the charity stripe. Eleven of the team's first 18 points came from the free throw line, as they went 11-of-12 (94 percent).

The Wolverines led 20-19 but a Thornwell 3 put the Gamecocks back in front 22-19 with 7:56 left in the first half. Thornwell started the game 4-of-6 with nine points. Michigan answered right away and the teams headed to the under eight media timeout tied at 22-22. Up to that point, the Wolverines were just 5-of-19 (26 percent) from the field and 1-for-10 (10 percent) from behind the arc.

Senior guard Justin McKie came off the bench and scored five-straight points to put Carolina back ahead 27-23. The Gamecocks remained ahead 29-25 at the final media timeout of the half with 3:43 left. Michigan's poor shooting continued, as it was 5-for-20 (25 percent) up to that point.

Notice ended the first half emphatically for Carolina with a coast-to-coast transition layup with 20 seconds left. His layup put the Gamecocks up 33-27 at the half. Carolina held the Wolverines scoreless the final 3:19 of the half. Thornwell led all scorers in the first half with 11 points on the 5-of-8 shooting. Michigan shot 6-of-24 (25 percent) and 1-of-12 from behind the 3-point line. Sophomore PJ Dozier did an outstanding job on the Wolverines leading scorer, Zak Irvin, as he went 2-of-8 and scored just five points.

It was the Gamecocks' first double-digit lead of the game.

Michigan's Muhammad-Ali Abdur-Rahkman tallied a 3-point play on the ensuing possession to cut the lead to seven at 39-32. That would be the closest the Wolverines would get the rest of the night. Abdur-Rahkman's lay-in ended a 4:08 scoring drought.

After a timeout by Michigan head coach John Beilein, freshman Maik Kotsar scored on an aggressive dribble drive to his left with 10:54 left to put Carolina up 43-33. A pair of Thornwell free throws then pushed the lead to 45-33 with 10:06 left.

An and-1 put back layup by Wolverine big man Mark Donnaled ended a 6:53 scoring drought for Michigan. He made the ensuing free throw to cut the lead to 51-40 with 7:35 left. Gravett halted the momentum with a lob to Silva he threw down a thunderous dunk to push the lead back to 13 at 53-40.

With 3:07 left, Kotsar slipped to the hoop again. Thornwell fed him and the freshman big man finished for his 10th point, giving Carolina its biggest lead of the game at 59-43 with 3:07 left.

A Dozier steal put the game on ice in the final 1:20. He threw an outlet pass to Thornwell, who threw it ahead to Notice. The Toronto, Ontario, native, finished to put Carolina up 61-46 with 1:14 left.

NEW YORK - No. 16/15 South Carolina (8-1) suffered its first loss of the season Monday night, as it fell 67-64 in a hard-fought battle with Seton Hall (8-2) at Madison Square Garden in the Under Armour Reunion. Sophomore guard PJ Dozier led the Gamecocks with 20 points (9-of-19), marking his third-straight 20-point outing.

The Pirates jumped out to a 2-0 lead, but Carolina answered with a 7-0 run fueled by three turnovers (two steals) and four points from senior Justin McKie, who was making his second career start.

South Carolina's stifling defense forced six turnovers in the game's opening eight minutes. Seton Hall's Myles Powell hit a 3 to end a three minute scoring drought for the Pirates, but sophomore Chris Silva answered with an offensive block and put back to give the Gamecocks a 14-13 lead with 10:57 remaining in the opening half.

It was a physical first period, as both teams would be in the bonus with 10:17 left. Senior guard Duane Notice popped to the wing and hit Carolina's first 3 of 3 with game's 8:29 left to make it 19-17. A Dozier steal and layup pushed it to 21-17, forcing a timeout by Seton Hall head coach Kevin Willard with 7:32 left. The steal was the Gamecocks 10th forced turnover of the half.

Two free throws by freshman forward Sedee Keita pushed Carolina's run to 7-0 and made the score 23-17 with 7:10 left. Dozier then drove to the hole on the Gamecocks' ensuing possession and spun away from the hoop to hit a smooth, fade away jumper, extending the run to 9-0. The made basket gave Carolina its biggest lead of the first half at 25-17 with 6:54 remaining.

The Pirates leading scorer Khadeen Carrington hit a contested 3 with 2:31 left to cut Carolina's lead to 29-26. Carrington knocked down another midrange jump shot to put the Pirates ahead 63-60 with 2:05 left. Rodriguez then went 1-of-2 at the charity stripe to make it 64-60 with 1:49 left. Sophomore forward Maik Kotsar made a big shot from the left wing on the ensuing possession to cut Seton Hall's lead to 64-62 with 1:34 remaining.

McKie then made another big time defensive play for the Gamecocks stealing it away from Rodriguez with 31 seconds left. He was fouled and headed to the line with a 1-and-1 chance to tie it up. The senior was clutch, knocking down both free throws to tie it at 64-64. Rodriguez took it hard to the hole and scored a contested layup to put the Pirates ahead 66-64 with 11 seconds left. TAMPA, Fla. - No. 16/15 South Carolina (9-1) notched its first true road win of the season, 77-66, at South Florida (5-4) on Saturday afternoon. Sophomore PJ Dozier tallied a new career-high 23 points (9-of-18), marking his fourth-straight game with 20-plus. Senior Duane Notice hit four 3-pointers in the second half and finished with 15.

Carolina won the opening tip and jumped out to a 9-6 lead after a Maik Kotsar layup with 16:36 left. The freshman from Tallin, Estonia started the game 3-for-3 from the field with six points. The Gamecocks led 9-8 at the first media timeout with 15:48 left.

The Bulls then went on a 9-0 run to take a 17-12 lead that was capped off with a 3-point play by Geno Thorpe just before the second media timeout with 11:58 left. Carolina countered with a 6-0 run to regain the lead 18-17, forcing a timeout by USF head coach Orlando Antigua with 9:53 left.

The Bulls switched to a 2-3 zone as the Gamecocks had missed seven-straight shots from behind the arc. Freshman Rakym Felder ended the drought from long range and knocked down back-to-back 3s to put South Carolina ahead 24-21. Jahmal McMurray then hit consecutive 3-pointers to put USF back in front 29-27 at the final media timeout of the first half with 3:47 left.

The Gamecocks trailed by six at the break, 37-31, as the Bulls ended the opening period on a 14-4 run. Felder (3-for-6 from 3) and sophomore PJ Dozier (4-for-9) led Carolina in half one with nine points each. Kotsar had seven points and led the team with four rebounds. McMurray led all scorers with 15 at the break (5-of-10, 2-2 from 3). USF held a 26-17 edge on the glass at halftime.

Back-to-back 3s by Notice brought the Gamecocks within two at the under-16 media timeout with 15:45 left in the second half. A Silva dunk and two Felder free throws put the Gamecocks back ahead, 48-46, with 14:47 to go. A Dozier steal and layup by senior Justin McKie then put Carolina up four, forcing a timeout by the Bulls with 12:16 left.

Dozier threw down a transition dunk after the timeout to cap a 9-0 run for the Gamecocks, which put them ahead 57-51. USF clawed back into it and pulled within one at 57-56 after consecutive 3s by McMurray with 9:03 left. McKie answered with a 3 on the ensuing possession after an offensive board by freshman Khadim Gueye.

After a Dozier made 3 with 5:23 left, Carolina began to pull away. With the shot clock dwindling, the Gamecocks swung the ball around the perimeter and Notice hit his fourth 3 of the second half to put Carolina up nine, 72-63 with 3:05 left. The Gamecocks would lead by eight or more the rest of the way en route to the 77-66 victory.

Felder and Dozier tied for the team lead with five assists, as Carolina matched a season-high 18 assists on the day. Kotsar led the way on the glass for the Gamecocks, snagging nine rebounds. McKie recorded a new career-high with four steals to lead the team.

DEC. 21, 2016/COLONIAL LIFE ARENA

COLUMBIA, S.C. - No. 22/20 South Carolina (9-2) fell at home Wednesday night to Clemson (9-2), 62-60. PJ Dozier tallied a new career-high 26 points on 10-of-22 shooting. He also had eight rebounds and led the team with five assists.

Colonial Life Arena was electric from the start, as sophomore Chris Silva threw down a thunderous dunk on the game's first possession. From there, it went back-and-forth and Carolina took a 7-6 lead at the first media timeout with 15:37 left. Three different Gamecocks scored the team's first seven points.

Donte Grantham gave the Tigers a 12-10 lead with 12:29 left in the half after hitting a 3 from the right wing. His made long ball ended an over four-minute field goal drought for Clemson.

The Tigers pushed the lead to 17-14 with 7:32 left after another bucket by Grantham. A Dozier layup versus contact in the lane brought Carolina within two at 21-19 with 5:48 left. The hoop was Dozier's 11th point, as he was the game's first player in double-figures.

Two free throws by Marquise Reed put Clemson up 59-58 with 52 seconds left. Carolina got two 3-point looks, but senior Justin McKie and Gravett's shots just missed and the Gamecocks were forced to foul with 20.3 seconds left. Avry Holmes hit both to put the Tigers up three before PJ Dozier then was fouled with 9.8 seconds left and hit both to bring Carolina within one at 61-60. Holmes was fouled again with 9.2 on the game clock. He made the first and missed the second, but the Gamecocks were unable to convert on the opposite end and the Tigers held on for the 62-60 victory.

COLUMBIA, S.C. - South Carolina (12-3, 2-0 SEC) posted a double-digit win in its SEC home opener Saturday afternoon, after defeating a tough Texas A&M (8-6, 0-3 SEC) team 79-68. The Aggies then retook the lead 59-58 with seven minutes left after a made 3 from the right wing by Tony Trocha-Morelos.

The Gamecocks quickly regained the lead 65-59 after a 7-0 run with 5:46 left. A putback by Thornwell extended the margin to 69-61 with 4:21 to go. With 3:02 left, Thornwell then threw a no-look dart to the right corner where a wide-open PJ Dozier was spotting up. Dozier knocked down the 3 to put Carolina ahead by 11, 72-61, its biggest lead of the game. KNOXVILLE, Tenn. - South Carolina (13-3, 3-0 SEC) picked up a 70-60 road win at Tennessee (8-8, 1-3 SEC) Wednesday night, as head coach Frank Martin earned career victory No. 200. Senior Sindarius Thornwell finished with 22 points, including 16 in the second half, as the Gamecocks improved to 3-0 in league play for the first time since 1997.

A made layup by sophomore Hassani Gravett gave Carolina its first lead of the game, 8-6, with 11:56 to go in a physical first eight minutes. The Gamecock defense held the Volunteers to 20 percent shooting (3-for-15) to start the game, including an 0-for-9 field goal drought.

COLUMBIA, S.C. - South Carolina (14-3, 4-0 SEC) remained unbeaten in SEC play with a 67-56 win over Ole Miss (10-7, 1-4 SEC) at Colonial Life Arena Saturday night. Four Gamecocks were in double-figures, led by sophomore Chris Silva, who recorded his second career double-double with 16 points and 10 rebounds in 28 minutes.

Carolina jumped out to a 6-0 lead thanks to six early points from sophomore PJ Dozier. The Gamecocks led 6-2 at the first media timeout with 15:56 on the clock. Freshman Maik Kotsar was efficient on the glass, pulling down three offensive rebounds early on. A 3-pointer by Cullen Neal brought the Rebels within three, 10-7, at the next media timeout with 11:31 left. COLUMBIA, S.C. - No. 24/24 South Carolina (15-3, 5-0 SEC) powered past No. 19/21 Florida (14-4, 5-1 SEC), 57-53, down the stretch Wednesday night in a battle of unbeaten teams in SEC play at Colonial Life Arena. Senior guard Sindarius Thornwell led all scorers with 20 points, moving into the top 10 in Carolina history in career points scored in the contest.

Both teams were scoreless at the first media timeout with 15:48 on the clock. Carolina and Florida were a combined 0-5 from the field with nine turnovers between the two squads early on. The game's first hoop came at the 14:12 mark when Florida's Kasey Hill stole the ball and laid it in on the other end. Another steal-layup by Hill on the ensuing possession put the Gators in front 4-0 with 13:55 to go.

Freshman Rakym Felder knocked down a 3 from the corner to put the Gamecocks on the board with 12:27 on the clock, and the score remained 4-3 until the next media timeout.

Right out of the media timeout, Felder connected on another 3, this one from the right wing to give the Gamecocks their first lead of the night, 6-4, with 11:32 remaining in the half. South Carolina's first three hoops came from behind the arch, as senior Justin McKie knocked down a long-ball with 10:22 left to make it 9-6.

The score was all knotted up at 13-13 at the under-eight media timeout with 7:21 to go. After the teams combined for just seven points in the first eight minutes, they combined for 19 in the next 4:30. Carolina held a 15-11 edge on the glass early.

The Gators rallied and went on 10-3 run to take a 23-16 lead at the final media timeout with 3:44 left in the first half. The team's redacted baskets the rest of the half, as Florida took a 28-21 lead at halftime. Hill led all scorers with 11 at the break. Felder had seven at the half to lead the Gamecocks. Carolina shot 7-for-30 (23 percent) and the Gators were 12-of-31 in the opening stanza (39 percent).

The Gamecocks opened half two on a 5-1 run thanks to four points from sophomore Chris Silva to cut the deficit to three, 29-26, with 18:23 to go. Carolina pushed the run to 9-2 and tied the game 30-30 at the first media timeout of the second half with 15:47 to go. A free throw by freshman Maik Kotsar put the Gamecocks in front 31-30 with 13:35 on the clock, giving the team its first lead since the 10:22 mark of the opening half.

An and-1 transition bucket by Thornwell gave the Gamecocks their largest lead of the game, 35-30, at the under 12 media timeout with 11:58 to go. The Carolina defense held Florida scoreless for 5:44 to that point with their last point coming at the free throw line at the 17:42 mark. The Gators were 0-for-8 to start the second half, their last field goal coming with 1:01 to go in the opening half. A Devin Robinson dunk ended the draught for Florida with 11:20 on the clock to make it 35-32.

A pair of free throws trimmed the Gamecock lead to 40-38 with 8:49 left in the game. The score remained 40-38 at the under eight media timeout with 7:59 to go. A Thornwell made 3 pushed the lead back to five, 45-40, forcing a timeout by Gator head coach Mike White with 5:51 to go in the game.

An and-1 by Silva put Carolina up six, 48-42, but Florida answered with a 4-0 run to make it 48-46 just before the final media timeout with 2:59 on the clock. Florida came within one, 52-51, but Thornwell knocked down two huge free throws on the ensuing possession to make it 54-51 with 53 seconds to go.

The Gators came within one again after a bucket by Chris Chiozza with 40 seconds remaining. Carolina turned to Dozier to make a play on the next possession. The Columbia, S.C., native answered the bell and took it hard to the rack from the left wing and kissed in a contested left-handed layup to make it 56-53 with 22 seconds left. The Gamecocks forced a turnover on the next possession and Thornwell hit a big free throw to make it a two-possession game, 57-53, with 16 seconds left.

Florida guard Canyon Barry attempted a 3 at the opposite end, but the shot wouldn't fall and the ball would be out of bounds to Carolina. Dozier threw a baseball pass to a wide-open Thornwell who ran out the clock, sealing the 57-53 win.

LEXINGTON, Ky. - No. 24/24 South Carolina (15-4, 5-1 SEC) was handed its first conference loss of the season Saturday evening at Rupp Arena, as it fell 85-69 to No. 5 Kentucky (17-2, 7-0 SEC). Senior Sindarius Thornwell led all scorers with a new career-high 34 points.

The Wildcats forced three turnovers early and jumped out to a quick 7-0 lead. They extended the lead to 10, 13-3, at the first media timeout with 15:52 left. A transition hoop by Malik Monk pushed the lead to 23-6, forcing head coach Frank Martin to take a timeout with 11:26 to go. Carolina had eight turnovers and was 2-for-7 (29 percent) from the field to begin the contest. Kentucky started the game 9-for-13 (69 percent).

Redshirt sophomore Hassani Gravett came off the bench and knocked down a 3 from the right wing, trimming the deficit to 28-15 with 8:03 to go in the first half. The Villa Rica, Ga., native, continued to swing momentum back in the Gamecocks favor as he had two steals and two transition hoops to make it 30-21 with 6:43 left.

Thornwell then threw down a huge dunk to cap an 8-0 run, bringing Carolina within seven, 30-23, at the under eight media timeout with 5:46 to go. The Lancaster, S.C., native pushed the run to 12-0 after knocking down four-straight free throws to bring the Gamecocks within three, 30-27, with 4:39 on the clock. Derek Willis knocked down a 3 to end the draught for the Wildcats on the ensuing possession to bring the score to 33-27 at the final media timeout of the first half with 3:53 to go.

Kentucky pushed its lead back to double-digits, but Thornwell was able to get to the rim to make it 39-31 with just over two minutes to go in the half. The Wildcats answered immediately as Monk drew contact from behind the arc and knocked all three free throws down to make it 42-31 with 1:58 on the clock.

Monk and Thornwell then exchanged 3s as the lead remained 11 with 42 seconds left in the half. Thornwell drove to the hole and drew a foul with 0.4 seconds left. He knocked down both shots at the charity stripe as the Gamecocks trailed by nine heading to halftime, 47-38.

Thornwell led all scorers at the break with 20 points (5-of-10 from the field, 9-of-10 from the free throw line). He had 19 points over a nine-minute stretch in the opening half. Gravett had seven to lead all bench players. Carolina shot 52 percent in the opening half (13-of-25), and Kentucky shot 65 percent (17-of-26).

The Gamecocks opened the second half on a 5-0 run, forcing a timeout by Wildcat head coach John Calapari with 18:28 to go and the score 47-42. Kentucky respond with a 7-0 run to push its lead back to double-digits, 55-44, forcing Martin to take a timeout with 16:09 remaining.

Two 3s from the left wing by sophomore TeMarcus Blanton cut the score to 60-52 with 13:40 to go, but the Wildcats pushed the lead back to 10, 64-54, at the under-12 media timeout with 11:39 on the clock.

Thornwell had a tip in put back off his own miss with 10:20 to go and made it 67-57. The basket marked his 28th point and a new career-high for the senior guard. A dunk by Edrice Adebayo put the lead back at 14, 71-57, at the next media timeout with 7:08 left in the game.

The Gamecocks got some solid looks down the stretch but were unable to breakthrough the final seven minutes, as Kentucky led by double-digits the rest of the way en route to the 85-69 victory.

COLUMBIA, Mo. - No. 23/24 South Carolina (17-4, 7-1 SEC) picked up its third road win in SEC play after downing Missouri (5-15, 0-8 SEC), 63-53, Saturday night. The Gamecocks are now tied atop the conference standings with No. 4 Kentucky (17-4, 7-1 SEC). Senior Sindarius Thornwell recorded his ninth career double-double with 16 points and 11 rebounds to lead the team. The 11 rebounds matched a career-high.

Carolina fell behind 7-0 after starting 0-for-5 from the field. The Gamecocks clawed back into the game with a 10-2 run, capped by a corner 3 by senior Justin McKie with 11:33 remaining in the first half. The long-ball just after the second media timeout gave Carolina its first lead of the game, 10-9.

The teams exchanged hoops the next several minutes, as the physical game remained tight with the score knotted up 19-19 at the final media timeout of the first half with 3:15 to go.

After trailing 22-21 with 1:11 to go, the Gamecocks ended the first half on a 5-0 run. Freshman Rakym Felder hit his third 3-pointer of the half to put Carolina ahead 24-22 with 51 seconds on the clock.

On the opening half's final possession, TeMarcus Blanton missed a decent look from behind the arc. Freshman Hassani Gravett was able to corral the offensive board and hit a fade away jumper from the left baseline with three seconds left to give the Gamecocks some momentum heading into the locker room, up 26-22 at the break.

Both teams were unable to find their stroke offensively in the first half. South Carolina was 10-for-27 (37 percent) from the field and the Tigers were 7-for-21 (33 percent) from the floor. There was 20 combined turnovers, as each team had 10. The Gamecocks made five 3s and outscored Missouri's bench 19-0. Felder led all scorers at the break with 12 (4-for-7), marking his sixth time this season in double-figures.

Just before the first media timeout of the second half, Thornwell found fellow senior Duane Notice spotting up behind the arc in transition. Notice knocked down the shot to put Carolina up by seven, 31-24, with 15:38 to go. Thornwell then scored five-straight to put the Gamecocks ahead by double-digits for the first time, 38-28, with 12:56 to play.

Back-to-back 3s for South Carolina by Notice and sophomore PJ Dozier gave the Gamecocks their biggest lead of the game, 46-33, with 10:10 remaining. The lead remained 13, 48-35, at the under eight media timeout with 7:49 to go.

The Tigers cut the lead to seven, but Notice knocked down his third 3 of the game to put the lead back to 10. Missouri answered on the other end with a bucket to make it 56-48 at the final media timeout with 3:18 to go. The Tigers would come within seven once more down the stretch as Carolina held on for the 63-53 victory.

Thornwell was perfect from the free throw line for the second-straight game, as he finished 7-for-7. The team shot 14-for-19 (74 percent) at the charity stripe overall Saturday night. Felder was the only other Gamecock to join Thornwell in double-figures with 13.

GAME 22 - 19/20 CAROLINA 88 - LSU 63
FEB. 1, 2017/MARAVICH CENTER/BATON ROUGE, LA.

BATON ROUGE, La. - No. 19/20 South Carolina (18-4, 8-1 SEC) led from start to finish in an 88-63 victory at LSU (9-12, 1-8 SEC) Wednesday night. With the win, the team remains tied with No. 8/6 Kentucky (18-4, 8-1 SEC) atop the SEC standings. Four Gamecocks scored in double figures, led by senior Duane Notice and sophomore PJ Dozier's 17 points.

Carolina had a textbook start on the road, opening up a 12-3 lead at the first media timeout with 15:47 to go. The Gamecocks started the game 4-for-6 from the field and 2-for-2 from behind the arc after transition 3s from Notice and Dozier.

The lead grew to 18-3 after an offensive rebound and layup by sophomore Hassani Gravett with 14:16 on the clock. The Tigers went on a 5-0 run to cut the deficit to 10, but two baskets by senior Sindarius Thornwell made it 22-8, forcing a timeout by LSU head coach Johnny Jones with 11:42 left in the opening half.

The timeout was unsuccessful in halting Carolina's momentum, as an and-1 play by Notice pushed the lead to 20 for the first time, 30-9, with 8:46 on the clock. The three-point play capped an 8-0 run for the Gamecocks, as they led 32-14 at the under eight media timeout. Carolina started 12-for-20 (60 percent) from the field and held the Tigers to 5-of-14 (36 percent) shooting, forcing eight turnovers.

Brandon Sampson scored eight straight points for LSU to make it 40-25 with 4:18 left, but the Gamecocks answered as the lead grew went back to 19, 44-25, at the final media timeout of the first half with 3:10 to go.

Three Carolina players were in double figures at the half, as Carolina led 50-32. Dozier led the way with 14. Sophomore Chris Silva had 12 and Thornwell had 11 as the Gamecocks shot 58 percent (19-for-33) in the first half. Carolina forced 11 turnovers and outscored LSU 30-16 in the paint en route to scoring 50 points in the opening half for the first time this season in SEC-play.

The Gamecocks started the second half 1-of-7 from the floor, as the Tigers cut the lead to 12, 52-40, at the first media timeout with 15:47 left in the game. Notice hit two free throws after a technical foul on the Tigers to make it 59-40 with 14:49 to go.

South Carolina extended its run to 13-0 over a four-minute span take its biggest lead of the game, 65-40, with 11:43 remaining at the under 12 media timeout. It was 75-56 at the next media break, but a 3-pointer from the right wing by senior Justin McKie matched the Gamecocks biggest lead, 81-56, with 4:36 to go.

Carolina led 81-60 at the final media timeout with 3:09 on the clock and went on to win by 25, 88-63, marking its largest road victory of the season in conference play. The Gamecocks shot just under 50 percent (30-for-61) from the floor in the game, forcing 22 turnovers that led to 34 points. Silva and Thornwell each finished with 16 points to join Notice and Dozier in double figures.

GAME 23 - 19/20 CAROLINA 77, GEORGIA 75
FEB. 4, 2017/COLONIAL LIFE ARENA

COLUMBIA, S.C. - Paced by sophomore guard PJ Dozier's seventh 20-point game of the season and four 3-pointers each from seniors Sindarius Thornwell and Duane Notice, No. 19/20 Carolina held off Georgia to register a 77-75 win Saturday afternoon at Colonial Life Arena. The victory improved the Gamecocks' record to 19-4 and 9-1 in the SEC and kept them unbeaten at home in conference action. Georgia dropped to 13-10 overall and 4-6 in league play following the loss.

Dozier finished with a game-high 21 points, including five over the final 1:52 to help Carolina hold off Georgia's late rally. Thornwell chipped in 18 points, while Notice added 15 for a Gamecock backcourt unit that accounted for 68 of Carolina's points Saturday. The Gamecocks shot 45.8 percent from the 3-point line and knocked down 11 field goals from beyond the arc for the game. A strong defensive showing in the second half keyed Carolina's victory, as the Bulldogs were held without a field goal for a stretch of over eight minutes in the final period.

The two offenses began to get into a rhythm in a back-and-forth final 10 minutes of the half. Notice netted his second field goal of the afternoon in style, delivering a three-point play from the right block, and Dozier's jumper answered a Georgia 3-pointer and gave the Gamecocks a 24-23 lead with just over eight minutes remaining in the half. The Bulldogs' seventh-straight made field goal resulted in a three-point play and put Georgia in front 28-26 before a great drive inside from Thornwell set the guard up for a tough left-handed layup and made it 28-28 with 4:16 to play in the period. The basket put the senior in double-figures with 11 for the Gamecocks, whose backcourt provided all of Carolina's points in the opening 20 minutes.

Sparked by Dozier, the Gamecocks called 10 of the half's final 16 points to pull even with the Bulldogs at the break. The sophomore's layup cut the Bulldogs lead to 32-30, and his fourth field goal of the half made it 35-34 Gamecocks with just over a minute left in the half. Dozier capped off the impressive stretch with a 3-pointer off a kick-out pass from redshirt sophomore guard Hassani Gravett to put Carolina ahead 38-36 before Bulldogs guard J.J. Frazier converted a pair of free throws to send the two teams into the locker room tied at 38. Thornwell and Dozier totaled 11 points each in the half for a Carolina team that shot 7-of-13 from the 3-point line in the first period.

The Gamecock backcourt continued to answer the call from long range out of the break, and Notice's third 3-pointer established a 44-40 Carolina lead with just over three minutes gone in the second half. The Bulldogs battled back with six-straight points to take a 46-44 lead, but Notice again delivered from the corner. The guard, who knocked in at least three 3-pointers for the eighth time this season, connected on a shot from beyond the arc from the left side to put the Gamecocks back in front 47-46 with 14:29 to play. Felder brought the Carolina fans to their feet less than two minutes later after using a pump fake to get into the lane and bank home a nifty layup that made it 49-48 Gamecocks in the tightly contested affair.

The contest remained a one-possession game, and another Georgia free throw pulled the Bulldogs even at 51 as the teams headed into the final 10 minutes. Freshman forward Malik Kotsar displayed great touch down low with a turnaround jumper from the left block that made it 53-51 Gamecocks and provided the start of an 8-0 Carolina run. Three Gamecock free throws over the next 90 seconds produced the largest lead of the game for Carolina at 56-51, and momentum continued to shift towards the home side when Thornwell drilled a 3-pointer to stretch the advantage to 59-51 with 7:30 to play. Thornwell supplied another big play less than two minutes later when the senior swiped the ball away and made a layup on the other end to give the Gamecocks a 61-54 cushion with just over six minutes remaining in the game.

Georgia's points continued to come from the charity stripe, and two free throws from Frazier cut the Gamecock lead to 62-58 with 4:37 left. Carolina responded with two free throws from Kotsar to put the lead to 64-58 before the Gamecocks again seized control via the 3-point line. Senior guard Justin McKie knocked down the shot, finding the bottom of the net from the left side to make it 67-58 late in the contest. The Bulldogs' first field goal in over eight minutes made it 67-60, and Georgia inched closer when it converted a three-point play to cut the lead to 69-63 with just over two minutes remaining. The Bulldogs would not go away, as they came to within four of the lead at 73-69 with 26 seconds to play following a jumper from Frazier and a free throw by guard William Jackson II.

The contest became a one-possession game at 74-71 when Jackson II laid it in, and Georgia cut the Carolina advantage to 75-73 on another basket from Frazier. The Gamecocks' ensuing in-bounds pass sent the ball to McKie, who headed to the line after being fouled with just six seconds remaining. The senior calmly connected on both attempts from the charity stripe to make it 77-73, and Georgia's tip-in following its missed 3-pointer with a second remaining was not enough to make up the difference.

Carolina shot 43.3 percent from the floor for the afternoon and scored 16 points off 15 Georgia turnovers. Saturday's game featured 18 lead changes, with neither team able to build a double-digit lead throughout the contest.

COLUMBIA, S.C. - No. 19/16 South Carolina (19-5, 9-2 SEC) fell short, 90-86, in a four-overtime contest at Colonial Life Arena to Alabama (14-9, 7-4 SEC) Tuesday night. Senior Sindarius Thornwell tallied career-highs with 44 points and 21 rebounds. He also made 25 free throws, marking a new South Carolina record, and an SEC record in league contests.

The Crimson Tide took advantage of a poor shooting start for the Gamecocks (0-6-7), jumping out to a 10-2 lead at the first media timeout with 15:17 left. They extended the lead to 17-5 with 11:26 left after a 7-0 run. Carolina still couldn't buy a bucket, going 1-for-10 to that point. Alabama started 6-for-11 (55 percent) with 10 points in the paint.

The lead remained in double-digits for the Crimson Tide, as they were in front 23-10 at the next media timeout with 7:36 left. Alabama's attack was balanced early on as seven different players scored.

The shooting woes continued for the Gamecocks, as the Crimson Tide took their biggest lead of the first half, 28-11, with 3:20 to go. Carolina was unable to breakthrough in the final three minutes of the half, and trailed 32-16 at the break.

The Gamecocks' 16 first half points were a new season-low as they were held without a field goal the final 10:23 in the opening half. Thornwell led Carolina with 5 points after going 5-for-6 from the free throw line. Alabama had a 27-19 edge on the glass and outscored the Gamecocks 16-4 in the paint.

South Carolina trimmed the deficit to 11 with just under 17 minutes and trailed 37-24 at the first media timeout of the second half with 15:47 to go. Thornwell had six of the team's first eight points of the second set. The lead remained in double-figures, 46-34, at the under 12 media timeout. Senior Duane Notice knocked down a free throw then corralled his own miss and found Thornwell, who drilled a 3 on the Gamecocks used the four-point swing to trim the deficit to single digits, 48-40 with 10:08 to go.

The lead went back to 10, 50-40, at the under eight media timeout with 7:26 left. It remained 10, 54-44, at the final media timeout. Two free throws by Chris Silva brought Carolina within six, 55-49, with 2:30 to go. The Gamecocks continued to chip away at the lead after Thornwell spun to the hoop and scored from the right block with 1:59 left in the game, forcing Alabama head coach Avery Johnson to take a timeout, his team up 55-51.

Two Thornwell free throws made it 55-53 with 47 seconds left. Alabama's Shannon Hale missed the front end of a 1-and-1, as Carolina got the ball with a chance to tie or take the lead with 24.5 seconds left. Thornwell slashed to the basket and made an incredible shot as he was met with contact by two Crimson Tide defenders, drawing a foul with 13.3 seconds left. He missed the ensuing free throw and Johnson took a timeout with 3.3 seconds left. Avery Johnson Jr. missed at the end of regulation, and Thornwell tipped out the rebound as the team's headed to the first of four overtime periods tied at 57-57 after the Gamecocks erased a 16-point halftime deficit.

The teams went back-and-forth in the first overtime period. Alabama took a 61-61 lead with 2:58 to go. Thornwell then got to the line on the ensuing possession and put Carolina ahead 63-62 with 2:44 to go. Hale would hit 1-of-2 to tie it at 63-63 with 1:40 left. Each team had two chances down the stretch but was unable to capitalize as the score remained 63-63.

In the second overtime, the Gamecocks jumped out to a 70-63 lead behind five points from sophomore PJ Dozier. The Crimson Tide then rattled off eight-straight points to take a 71-70 lead after a Johnson Jr. layup with 48 seconds left. Thornwell then scored and Johnson Jr. answered with a 3 on the other end to put Alabama ahead 74-72 with 19 seconds left. Thornwell attacked the hoop and scored the equalizer with four seconds remaining to send the game to the third overtime tied at 74-74.

Alabama pushed out to a five point lead in the third overtime period 82-77, forcing Frank Martin to take a timeout with 1:44 to play. Dozier nailed a huge 3 from the left wing out of the timeout to make it 82-80 with 1:26 to go. Thornwell got to the line again with 23 seconds left and made two to tie the contest at 82-82. UA's Corban Collins bid for a game-winning 3 fell short and the teams headed to the fourth extra period.

The fourth overtime went back-and-forth again as the team's exchanged buckets in the first three minutes. Dozier was called for his fifth foul, sending Riley Norris to the free throw line with 55 seconds left and the game tied 86-86. Norris hit both to make it 88-86. Notice got two solid looks from behind the arc, but he was unable to convert at the opposite end. Norris hit another pair of free throws to make it 90-86 with 18 seconds left. Carolina missed two 3s on its final possession of the game, as the Crimson tied her for the four-point win.

GAME 25 - 19/16 CAROLINA 77, MISS. STATE 73
FEB. 11, 2017/HUMPHREY COLISEUM/STARKVILLE

STARKVILLE, Miss. - No. 19/16 South Carolina (20-5, 10-2 SEC) notched its 20th win of the season Saturday night after topping Mississippi State (14-10, 5-7 SEC) on the road in conference play. With the victory, the Gamecocks remained tied for first in the SEC with No. 15/12 Kentucky and No. 17/17 Florida. Senior Sindarius Thornwell led all scorers with 28 points for his 10th 20-plus outing of the season.

Thornwell, who was coming off a career-high 44 points vs. Alabama, started the game 4-for-4 (2-for-2 from 3) with 10 points as Carolina jumped out to a 10-2 lead, forcing a timeout by Bulldogs head coach Ben Howland with 17:02 to go. The Gamecocks remained in front 12-5 at the first media timeout with 15:11 left in the opening half.

A 6-2 run by Mississippi State trimmed Carolina's lead to 14-11 at the next media timeout with 11:26 left. Thornwell's third 3 of the game snapped an 0-for-7 field goal drought for the Gamecocks and put them ahead 17-10. The Bulldogs grabbed their first lead of the game, 20-17, after capping a 15-3 run with a 3 just before the under eight media timeout with 7:52 on the clock.

Mississippi State's seventh 3-pointer of the first half gave them its biggest lead, 31-24, forcing a timeout by head coach Frank Martin with 3:21 left.

Carolina ended the half on a 12-5 run out of the timeout. Thornwell found senior Justin McKie in the corner on the Gamecocks' final possession, and McKie knocked down a 3 as time expired to tie the score 36-36 at the half.

Thornwell led all scorers with 19 points in the first half after going 6-for-10 from the field and 3-for-4 from behind the arc. The Bulldogs then retook the lead, 64-63, but the Gamecocks responded again after a 3 by senior Duane Notice and a layup by freshman Maik Kotsar with 3:31 to go. A basket by Thornwell put Carolina up 72-64 with 2:52 left, matching the team's biggest lead of the game.

The Lancaster, S.C., native, took over and scored the team's final seven points to propel the Gamecocks to the 77-73 road win. Silva (15) and Kotsar (10) joined Thornwell in double figures. After a strong first half from behind the arc, Carolina held the Bulldogs to 25 percent (3-for-12) shooting from 3 in the second half. The Gamecocks shot 56 percent (15-for-27) in the second half.

GAME 26 - ARKANSAS 83, 21/19 CAROLINA 76
FEB. 15, 2017/COLONIAL LIFE ARENA

COLUMBIA, S.C. - No. 21/19 South Carolina's (20-6, 10-3 SEC) comeback fell short at home Wednesday night, as the team suffered an 83-76 loss to Arkansas (19-7, 8-5 SEC). Senior Sindarius Thornwell had 25-plus for the third straight game, finishing with 27 points to lead all scorers. He went 10-for-19 from the field, setting a new career high with his 10 made field goals.

The Gamecocks attacked the hoop early, scoring 10 of their first 14 points in the paint en route to building a 14-9 lead at the first media timeout with 15:14 to go. Carolina started 6-for-9 from the field (67 percent). The lead grew to 19-5 with 14:18 left after a quick 5-0 run was capped by a steal and dunk by senior Duane Notice.

Arkansas responded with an 8-0 run to cut the lead to 19-13 at the next media timeout with 11:38 on the clock. The Razorbacks extended the run to 15-0 after a transition 3-pointer by Daryl Macon. The 3-point basket gave the Razorbacks their first lead of the game 20-19, forcing Frank Martin to take a timeout with 9:20 to go.

Thornwell scored with 8:33 left to snap a nearly six-minute scoring drought for the Gamecocks. Arkansas responded on the ensuing possession to take a 22-21 lead with 7:49 left at the under-eight media timeout.

A 3 by Jaylen Barford, his 13th point of the half, extended the Razorbacks' run to 20-2, giving them a 28-21 lead with 6:25 left in the half. Arkansas scored on the next possession to open its biggest lead of the game 30-21. Carolina responded with an 8-0 run to make it 30-29, as Thornwell scored through contact just before the under four media timeout with 3:36 on the clock. The Lancaster, S.C., native, completed the and-1, sinking the free throw out of the timeout to tie the game 30-30.

The Razorbacks closed the opening half on a 9-2 run to take a 39-32 lead at half-time. They shot 56 percent (15-for-27) to start the game, led by Barford's 17 first-half points. Thornwell led the way with 12 at the break for the Gamecocks. Sophomore PJ Dozier had seven and Notice had six points, as Carolina shot 37 percent (13-for-25) from the field in the opening half.

Arkansas scored with 29 seconds left as the shot clock expired to go up three. They then finished 4-for-4 at the free throw line to seal the win. Silva matched a career-high with 16 points. Notice finished with 14 to round out the Gamecocks in double figures.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - No. 21/19 South Carolina (20-7, 10-4 SEC) was defeated 71-62 by Vanderbilt (14-13, 7-7 SEC) Saturday night at Memorial Gym. Senior Sindarius Thornwell recorded 21 points for his fourth straight game with 20-plus.

South Carolina was unable to overcome the deficit, as the Commodores closed the game on a 24-9 run. Dozier had 15 points and Silva tallied 14 to join Thornwell in double figures for the Gamecocks. Fisher-Davis led the way for Vanderbilt with 17 points, as Vanderbilt shot 50 percent (11-for-22) from the floor and 44 percent from 3 (7-for-16) in the second half.

GAME 28 - #13/12 FLORIDA 81, CAROLINA 66
FEB. 21, 2017/EXACTECH ARENA/GAINESVILLE, FLA.

GAINESVILLE, Fla. - South Carolina (20-8, 10-5 SEC) suffered an 81-66 loss on the road Tuesday evening at No. 13/12 Florida (23-5, 13-2 SEC). Senior Sindarius Thornwell had 23 points (15 in the second half) and 10 rebounds for his fifth double-double (11th career) of the season to lead the Gamecocks.

After trailing 8-3, Carolina went on a 4-0 run to make it 8-7 at the first media timeout with 15:14 left. The Gamecocks forced four turnovers early that led to five points. The Gators then made their next four shots to extend their lead to 17-10 with 13:23 to go.

The Gamecocks cut it to three twice, but the Gators pushed back ahead by six, 22-16, at the under eight media timeout with 7:36 on the clock. COLUMBIA, S.C. - A monster second half powered South Carolina (21-8, 11-5 SEC) to an impressive 82-55 home win over Tennessee (15-14, 7-9 SEC) on Saturday afternoon. The Gamecocks out-scored the Volunteers 44-25 in the final 20 minutes, and four players scored in double figures, led by sophomore PJ Dozier's 19 points.

Six points off five turnovers helped Carolina push out on an 8-2 lead at the first media timeout with 15:52 to go. Sophomore Chris Silva had four points early for the Gamecocks. The Volunteers came within three, 10-7, but Carolina used an 8-2 run to take an 18-9 lead at the under 12 media timeout in the first half. The Gamecocks started the game 6-for-12 (50 percent) from the floor and were 6-of-7 (86 percent) at the charity stripe.

COLUMBIA, S.C. - Senior guard Sindarius Thornwell scored 17 of his 23 points in the second half to propel South Carolina (22-8, 12-5 SEC) to a 63-57 Senior Night victory over Mississippi State (14-15, 5-12 SEC) at Colonial Life Arena on Tuesday. The win clinched a double-bye for the Gamecocks in next week's SEC Tournament. The team's 12 conference wins are the second most SEC wins in program history.

Carolina led 6-5 at the first media timeout with 15:32 left in the opening half. The Gamecocks had six rebounds and four offensive boards but were unable to capitalize on their early second chances. The Gamecocks pushed in front 10-5, but the Bulldogs scored six of the next seven points to pull within one, 12-11, at the next media timeout with 11:07 on the clock. Carolina opened the game 3-for-15 (28 percent) from the floor.

Each team then made four of its next five field goals, as the Gamecocks remained in front, 21-20 with 7:30 remaining. Sophomore forward Chris Silva was dominant inside early, as he had nine points and six rebounds.

Carolina continued to lead, 26-25, at the final media timeout of the first half with 3:52 to go. The shooting woes continued for the Gamecocks, but the team made up for it at the free throw line knocking down 13 foul shots in the opening half.

Mississippi State jumped out to its biggest lead of the opening half, 29-26, after a tip-in from Eli Wright with 2:17 on the clock, but Carolina closed the half on a 7-0 run to take a 32-29 lead at the break.

Silva had 11 points and seven rebounds at halftime, both game-highs. Mario Kegler led the Bulldogs with eight points in just nine minutes of action. The Gamecocks held a 20-16 edge on the glass, and forced 10 Mississippi State turnovers. Silva, Dozier and Thornwell combined for 16 of the team's 20 rebounds in the first half.

Two 3s fueled a quick 6-0 run for the Bulldogs, as they pulled within four at 45-41. Mississippi State continued to chip away at the lead and got within three, 50-47, at the under eight media timeout with 7:30 on the clock. The Bulldogs took advantage of a 2:19 scoring draught and three turnovers from the Gamecocks.

Mississippi State grabbed its first lead of the second half after a 3-pointer by Tyson Carter put them ahead 52-50 with 4:33 on the clock. Thornwell knocked down a pair at the line, his eighth and ninth free throws of the game, to tie it at 52-51 at the final media timeout with 3:59 remaining in the ballgame.

It was a senior-to-senior connection as Thornwell then found Duane Notice for the biggest shot of the game, as he popped to the left wing and knocked down a huge 3 to cap a 7-0 run with 2:15 remaining. The shot swung momentum back in favor of the home team as Howland took a timeout with just over two minutes to play, Carolina ahead 57-52.

The Bulldogs cut the deficit to three, 57-54, right out of the timeout, but Thornwell split the defense and connected on a tough, left handed layup to make it 59-54 on the ensuing possession with 1:35 to play. Thornwell iced the game at the free throw line with six seconds left, as Carolina prevailed 63-57.

Silva had his third career double-double (all this season) with 15 points and 11 rebounds to join Thornwell in double figures for the Gamecocks. Carolina forced 20 turnovers for the second straight game (seventh time in SEC play) and out-rebounded the Bulldogs 39-31.

**GAME 31 - OLE MISS 75, -/RV CAROLINA 70
MARCH 4, 2017/THE PAVILION/OXFORD, MISS.**

OXFORD, Miss. - A ferocious second half rally fell just short Saturday night, as South Carolina (22-9, 12-6 SEC) was defeated 75-70 by Ole Miss (19-12, 10-8 SEC) in the team's regular season finale. Senior Sindarius Thornwell led all scorers with 25 points as he filled up the stat sheet for the Gamecocks with seven rebounds and six assists.

The Rebels led 9-5 early, but Carolina went on a 5-0 run to take a 10-9 lead at the first media timeout with 13:59 to go. Ole Miss regained the lead, 13-12, at the next media timeout with 11:56 on the clock. The Gamecocks were sharing the basketball early, as five different players scored and the team logged four assists.

A quick 7-0 run by Ole Miss forced head coach Frank Martin to take a timeout with 10:02 remaining, his team trailing 20-13. Carolina responded forcing three turnovers on a 6-0 run to pull within one, 20-19, at the under eight media timeout with 7:59 to go in the opening half.

The Rebels grew back to seven, but a four-point swing on a technical foul pulled the Gamecocks back within three, 31-28, with just under four minutes to play. Back-to-back 3s by Cullen Neal put Ole Miss back in control, 37-28 with 3:13 to go.

Carolina was unable to close the gap before the horn and trailed 42-31 at the break, just its second double-digit halftime deficit of the season. Thornwell had 11 points to lead the team. Freshman Maik Korsar and sophomore Hassani Gravett each had five. Thornwell and Gravett combined for eight of the team's nine first half assists. The Rebels shot the ball efficiently in the first 20 minutes, going 16-for-28 (57 percent) from the floor and 6-for-10 (60 percent) from behind the arc. Breein Tyree led all scorers with 13 (6-for-9). Sebastian Saiz was also in double figures for Ole Miss with 11 points.

The Rebels hot shooting continued to start the second half, as they opened the game's final 20 minutes on a 9-0 run. Tyree hit a 3 to put Ole Miss ahead 20, 51-31, forcing Martin to take a timeout with 16:38 to go.

Maik Korsar made it 54-43 at the under-12 media timeout with 11:58 to go.

Senior Duane Notice got to the rim and scored, then Gravett knocked down a 3-pointer to pull the Gamecocks within six, 54-48, with 10:26 left. Ole Miss led 60-52 at the under eight media timeout. Carolina came within four, but the Rebels took advantage of a three minute scoring draught for the Gamecocks to go ahead 65-56 at the final media timeout with 3:56 remaining.

Notice knocked down a huge 3-pointer to cap a 7-0 run for Carolina, pulling the team within four, 71-67, with 1:07 left in the game. The deficit went back to seven, but the Toronto, Ontario, native, pulled Carolina within four again, 74-70, after another big 3 with 25 seconds to go. The Gamecocks were unable to find the bottom of the net the rest of the game, as Ole Miss held on for the hard-fought 75-70 victory.

**GAME 32 - ALABAMA 64, -/RV CAROLINA 53
MARCH 10, 2017/BRIDGESTONE ARENA/NASHVILLE**

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - South Carolina (22-10, 12-6 SEC) fell to Alabama (19-13, 10-8 SEC) 64-53 in an SEC Tournament Quarterfinal matchup on Friday afternoon at Bridgestone Arena. Senior Sindarius Thornwell led the Gamecocks with 16 points in 37 minutes.

It was a defensive showcase in the first 20 minutes as both teams came into the game ranked 1-2 in the SEC in a handful of defensive categories. The Gamecock defense held Alabama to 36 percent shooting in the opening half (10-for-28) and 20 percent (2-for-10) from 3-point land. Thornwell and freshman Rakym Felder led the team with six points each. Alabama's Braxton Key led all scorers with 10 points on 4-of-5 shooting in the first half.

The Crimson Tide scored the game's first bucket, but Carolina's defense locked in and held it scoreless for the next 2:49, as Alabama led 2-0 at the first media timeout of the game with 15:36 on the clock. The Tide remained in front 9-6 at the under 12 media timeout with 10:54 to go.

Evan Hinson provided a huge lift off the Carolina bench to spark an 8-2 run for the Gamecocks' offense. He scored four points and pulled down two rebounds as South Carolina grabbed its first lead of the game 14-13 with 6:50 remaining in the first half.

Alabama regained the lead 21-19 at the final media timeout of the half with 2:56 on the clock. Felder knocked down 1-of-2 at the free throw line with eight seconds to go as the Gamecocks trailed 23-22 at halftime. Carolina's bench scored 11 of the team's first 19 points with Hinson and Felder combining for nine.

The Crimson Tide opened the second half 4-for-7 (57 percent) to take a four-point lead, 31-27, at the first media timeout with 15:57 to play. The Gamecocks then forced five turnovers leading to eight combined points from sophomore PJ Dozier and Felder to go on top 37-36.

Alabama's hot shooting, 7-of-10 to start second half, continued though and it went back in front by three, 40-37, forcing head coach Frank Martin to take a timeout with 11:56 on the clock. Felder and Dozier combined for 12 of the team's first 15 points in the second half.

Both teams exchanged hoops the next several minutes, but the Tide remained in front by four, 52-48, at the final media timeout of the game with 3:57 to play. Felder found Dozier out of the timeout for a huge 3 in front of the Gamecock bench to pull Carolina within one, 52-51, with 3:44 remaining.

The Gamecocks got within one again at 54-53 after a pair of free throws by sophomore Chris Silva with 2:54 left to play. Silva's free throws would be the team's final points of the game.

GREENVILLE, S.C. - It was a historic night for South Carolina men's basketball, as the seventh-seeded Gamecocks (23-10) dominated the second half in a 93-73 win over 10th seeded Marquette (19-13) for the program's first NCAA Tournament win since 1973. Senior Sindarius Thornwell (29) and sophomore PJ Dozier (21) combined for 51 points on 19-of-33 (58 percent) shooting.

The Golden Eagles opened up the game on an 8-0 run and led 11-5 at the first media timeout with 14:18 on the clock after a 3 by Jajuan Johnson. Marquette stayed in front by five, 19-14, at the next media stoppage with 11:58 to go. Thornwell and sophomore Chris Silva paved the way for the Gamecocks on offense early, scoring nine of the team's first 14 points.

A 3-pointer gave the Golden Eagles their largest lead of the first half, 26-16, forcing head coach Frank Martin to take a timeout with 9:20 left. Marquette started the game 9-for-15 (60 percent) from two-point range and 5-for-8 (63 percent) from behind the arc.

Senior Duane Notice knocked down a deep 3-pointer, his second of the game, to bring Carolina within six, 28-22, at the under eight media timeout with 7:34 to go. Back-to-back dunks by Silva and Dozier brought Bon Secours Wellness Arena to its feet, pulling the Gamecocks within two, but MU pulled in front by eight, 34-26, with 5:18 to play. Carolina clawed back within four, 34-30, at the under four media timeout with 3:44 left in the half.

Dozier drove hard baseline and made a tough layup to pull the Gamecocks within two, 39-37, with just over a minute to go. Carolina got a stop and took possession with the shot clock off, but Thornwell missed from 3 with six seconds left and MU led 40-39 at halftime. Both teams shot 48 percent in the opening half as 13 different players scored on both sides.

Freshman Maik Kotsar scored the first four points of the second half to give the Gamecocks their first lead of the game, 43-40, with 18:30 remaining. The Golden Eagles answered with a 7-0 run to regain the lead, but Carolina answered with a 7-0 run of its own to retake the lead, 51-49, with 15:54 to play. It was a high-paced first 4:06 with both teams shooting it extremely well. The Gamecocks started 5-for-9 (56 percent) and MU was 4-for-6 (67 percent) to open the half.

With 14:53 on the clock, Carolina swung momentum their way after senior Justin McKie had a big steal and found Dozier ahead in transition for a breakaway dunk. The slam sent The Well into a frenzy and forced Marquette head coach Steve Wojciechowski to take a timeout, his team trailing 55-49.

Rakym Felder then gave the Gamecocks their biggest lead so far in the game, 82-69, forcing another Wojciechowski timeout with 4:40 to play.

Carolina kept its foot on the pedal as four more points from Thornwell pushed the lead to 86-69 at the final media timeout with 3:42 left in the game. The Gamecocks held MU scoreless for nearly four minutes and used a 17-2 run to take control en route to the 93-71 victory. Carolina ended the game 7-for-7 from the field.

Notice and Silva joined Thornwell and Dozier in double figures with 10 each. Kotsar and Felder each had seven for the Gamecocks, who shot a scorching 56 percent (20-of-36) in the second half. Felder and McKie combined for 12 of the team's 14 bench points.

GAME 34 - /RV CAROLINA 88, NO. 7/7 DUKE 81
MARCH 19, 2017/BON SECOURS ARENA/GREENVILLE

GREENVILLE, S.C. - It was another magical night for South Carolina (24-10) men's basketball as the team upset second-seeded Duke (28-9) 88-81 to advance to the school's first Sweet Sixteen in the current NCAA Tournament format. The Gamecocks exploded for 65 points in the second half and shot 71 percent (20-for-28) in the game's final 20 minutes. SEC Player of the Year Sindarius Thornwell led all scorers with 24 points and was one of five South Carolina players in double figures.

The Blue Devils took a 6-4 lead to start the game at the first media timeout with 15:57 to go. After trailing 11-6, Carolina went on an 8-2 run and took its first lead after freshman Rakym Felder knocked down a triple with 12:52 to put the Gamecocks in front 14-13.

Duke regained the lead, 18-14, at the under 12 media timeout with 11:11 on the clock as Grayson Allen scored seven points off the bench. Thornwell had seven of Carolina's first 14 points. The Blue Devils were already in the bonus at the 12:01 mark. Duke took advantage of a 5-0 scoring drought by the Gamecocks to extend its lead to seven, 21-14, at the next media timeout with 7:43 to go. Carolina started the game 5-for-23 (22 percent), while the Blue Devils were 6-for-11 (55 percent).

Duke remained in control 28-20 at the final media timeout with 3:45 to go in the first half. Senior Duane Notice connected from 3-point range to pull the Gamecocks within five, 28-23, with 2:39 left. Carolina cut the deficit with stellar defense, holding the Blue Devils scoreless for nearly five minutes.

A pair of Allen free throws gave Duke a seven point advantage at halftime, 30-23. Thornwell was the only player on either side in double figures with 11 points. Allen led the way for the Blue Devils with nine. Duke shot 47 percent (8-for-17) and knocked down five 3s in the first half. The Gamecocks were 7-for-35 (20 percent).

Notice completed a 3-point play early in the second half to pull Carolina within five, 35-30 with 17:22 to play. Sophomore Chris Silva sunk two free throws to cut it to three, but the lead went back to six after a transition 3 by Allen. The Bon Secours Wellness Arena crowd erupted moments later, as a Notice steal led to a monster dunk by Silva on the other end. The jam was the Gamecocks fifth-consecutive field goal and got Carolina within one, 38-37, forcing head coach Mike Krzyzewski to take a timeout with 15:52 on the clock. A lob from Thornwell to Silva right out of the under 16 media timeout then gave the Gamecocks their first lead since Felder's 3 at the 12:40 mark of the first half.

Felder's second 3 of the game put Carolina up 48-44. Frank Jackson answered with a triple of his own on the other end, but Silva scored with contact to make it 54-51 at the under 12 media timeout with 10:43 remaining. Silva sunk the free throw out of the timeout, marking his 17th point of the game, a new career high. The Gamecocks came out of halftime firing on all cylinders offensively, shooting 12-for-16 (75 percent). Five-straight points from Notice pushed Carolina's lead to seven, 60-53, with 8:38 to play, forcing another Krzyzewski timeout.

A Notice layup put the Gamecocks ahead by double-digits for the first time in the game, 68-58, with 5:00 minutes to play. The lead stayed at 10, 70-60, at the final media timeout of the game with 3:30 remaining. Felder knocked down 1-of-2 at the free throw line to make the score 76-66 with 1:38 to go. Jayson Tatum hit a 3 on the next possession to pull Duke within seven, 76-69, but on the next play, Thornwell bypassed the Blue Devils' full-court pressure as he threw a baseball pass ahead to senior Justin McKie, who finished with an emphatic two-hand dunk to put the Gamecocks up by 10 again, 82-72, with 47 seconds on the clock.

Duke kept swinging, cutting the lead to five after an Amile Jefferson layup with 26.8 seconds remaining, but Carolinaiced the win with clutch free throw shooting down the stretch. The Gamecocks ended the game 14-of-16 (88 percent) at the line in the game's final three minutes.

Silva tallied his fourth career double-double (all this season) with 17 points and 10 rebounds. Notice matched Silva with 17 points, 14 of them coming in the second half. Felder was crucial off the bench again, scoring 15 points and making 9-of-10 at the charity stripe.

NEW YORK - The magic continued for South Carolina (25-10) at Madison Square Garden Friday night, as it matched a school record for wins (25) in a 70-50 Sweet 16 victory over third-seeded Baylor (27-8). With the win, the Gamecocks have advanced to the program's first Elite Eight. Sindarius Thornwell led all scorers for the third consecutive game, scoring 24 points.

Carolina led 5-2 at the first media timeout as it held the Bears to 1-for-9 shooting (11 percent) in the game's first 4:06. After Baylor's first bucket, the Gamecock defense held them scoreless for a stretch of 2:17 (0-for-5). South Carolina remained in front 11-8 at the under 12 media timeout with 11:58 to go.

Johnathan Motley gave Baylor the lead for the first time since the 18:11 mark. His bucket put the Bears ahead, 13-11, with 10:33 left in the opening half. Baylor head coach Scott Drew called timeout with 8:48 on the clock and the score tied 15-15. Sophomore Chris Silva led Carolina with five points to start, while Jo Lual-Acuil Jr. led all scorers with seven.

Senior Duane Notice knocked down a big 3 just before the under eight media timeout to put the Gamecocks back in front, 18-15, with 7:55 on the scoreboard. That 3 by Notice would help propel a 2-7 run by Carolina to end the first half. The Gamecocks took their first double-digit lead of the night, 25-15, after a high-arching floater in the line by Brooklyn, N.Y., native, Rakym Felder with 5:27 remaining.

A baseline jumper by Silva forced another Drew timeout, as Carolina pushed the run to 16-0, holding Baylor 0-for-9 as the Gamecocks went ahead 29-15 with 3:23 left in the game's opening 20 minutes. Jake Lindsay snapped the field goal drought for the Bears with a long ball from the corner with 2:11 to go which cut the score to 31-18. The 3 by Lindsay was the team's first points since the 9:58 mark, ending a 7:47 stretch with no points.

The Gamecocks impressive end to the half, fueled by spectacular defense and hot shooting, gave them a 37-22 lead at halftime. Carolina held Baylor to a season-low 25 percent shooting (8-for-32) in the opening 20 minutes. The previous low for the Bears came at the beginning of the season when they shot 39 percent (13-for-33) against Michigan State at the Bartle 4 Atlantic Tournament in the Bahamas on Nov. 24. Carolina's offense was balanced in the opening half. Thornwell led the way with 10 points, Silva had nine, sophomore PJ Dozier had eight and Notice had six. Silva had six first half rebounds to the lead the team, as the Gamecocks were plus four in rebounding margin, 22-14.

Carolina continued to roll to start the second half as Thornwell knocked down a 3 to push the lead to 20, 42-22, for the first time in the game with 18:25 remaining. Baylor started the second half 4-for-6, but the Gamecocks led by 18, 46-28, at the first media timeout with 15:45 remaining. Manu Lecomte knocked down back-to-back triples to trim the deficit to 13, 49-36, with 11:40 to play.

A 10-0 run by the Bears pulled them within 11, but consecutive 3s by Thornwell and Notice put Carolina back in control, up by 17, 55-38, with 9:22 remaining. The score remained 55-38 at the under eight media timeout with 7:44 to play. Thornwell's 20th point and fourth 3-pointer of the game put the Gamecocks in front by 20 again, 61-41 with 5:23 to go. South Carolina held a 63-41 edge at the final media timeout with 3:58 left.

Baylor was unable to make a late run, as the Gamecocks led by 18 or more the final five minutes of the ballgame. Silva (12), Dozier (12) and Notice (11) joined Thornwell in double figures. Felder scored all nine bench points Friday night. He's led the bench in scoring in all three of Carolina's NCAA Tournament games.

NEW YORK CITY - South Carolina's special March run continued on Sunday afternoon at Madison Square Garden as the Gamecocks (26-10) punched their ticket to the 2017 Final Four with a 77-70 win over Florida (27-9). The victory broke the single-season program record for wins, as senior Sindarius Thornwell carried the team with a game-high 26 points, seven rebounds and two steals in 36 minutes.

Carolina jumped out to a 6-4 lead thanks to four early points from freshman Maik Kotsar. A 3-pointer by Kasey Hill ended a nearly three minute scoring drought for the Gators and gave them a 7-6 lead at the first media timeout with 15:53 on the clock.

The Gamecocks retook the lead 11-9 after starting 4-for-5 (80 percent) from the field. They remained in front, 15-14, at the under 12 media timeout with 11:41 to go. Carolina scored eight of its first 15 points off seven Florida turnovers. Hot shooting was the story on both sides, as each team started 6-for-10. There were eight lead changes in the game's first 8:19.

South Carolina opened up its biggest lead of the game 18-14 with 11:24 to go in the first half and led 20-18 at the under eight media timeout with 7:30 remaining. Chris Chiozza knocked down the Gators' fourth-straight 3 to give them a four-point edge, 30-29 at the final media timeout with 3:01 left to play in the first 20 minutes.

Florida closed the half strong and took its biggest lead of the game, 38-30, after a 6-0 run with 48 seconds left. An and-1 by sophomore PJ Dozier on the other end pulled Carolina within five, 38-33 with 43 seconds remaining. Two free throws by Kevarrius Hayes put the Gators ahead 40-33 at the half.

Thornwell was spectacular in the first half for the Gamecocks, as he scored a game-high 15 points on 6-of-8 (75 percent) shooting. Dozier had a solid first 20 minutes as well, scoring nine points. Justin Leon led the way for the Gators with 13 points as he knocked down 3-of-5 from behind the arc. As a team, Florida shot 14-for-25 (56 percent) and 7-for-12 (58 percent) from behind the arc. They held a 17-11 edge on the glass at the half as well.

The Gamecocks surged within three, 46-43, at the first media timeout of the second half with 15:32 on the clock thanks to a 13-6 run. Kotsar had two buckets as Carolina started 4-for-6 (67 percent) out of the locker room. Two Chris Silva free throws got the Gamecocks within one, 46-45, with 14:53 to play. The foul on Silva put Carolina in the bonus the rest of the way.

With 11:28 to go, the Gamecocks regained the lead, 49-48, on a Kotsar tipin. It was Carolina's first lead since the 5:24 mark in half one. The Gamecocks stormed ahead holding Florida scoreless for 3:25 and to 3-of-14 shooting to start the second half. Florida retook the lead, 53-51, on an and-1 by Leon with 9:56 on the clock. The basket snapped an 0-for-10 drought for the Gators.

The Garden erupted as Thornwell put Carolina back in the lead 59-57 with a tough layup, forcing head coach Mike White to take a timeout with 5:27 left to play. The teams exchanged hoops and were tied 63-63 at the final media timeout with three minutes left to play. The Gamecocks' second half defense was stellar, holding Florida to 8-for-27 (30 percent) and 0-for-12 from 3 to that point.

Thornwell found Kotsar for a transition jumper at the free throw line as Carolina used a 6-0 run to go up four, 67-63, with 1:55 remaining in the game. A KeVaughn Allen free throw pulled the Gators within two, 70-68, with 53 seconds left. Florida got within four twice in the final minute, but two huge steals by Thornwell and Dozier late helped seal the historic victory for the Gamecocks.

Dozier (17), Silva (13) and Kotsar (12) joined Thornwell in double figures. Silva was just shy of a double-double, finishing with nine rebounds including four on the offensive end.

ACC Champions

First Gamecock Squad To Make The Show

After surviving the pressure cooker of winning the Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament, the 1970-71 Gamecocks had fought their way to the school's first NCAA Tournament appearance. With a 23-4 mark and an ACC title under its belt, USC went on to the Eastern Regionals as one of 16 teams in the show.

The Gamecocks had high hopes entering the regional, but saw their NCAA title smashed as undefeated and third-ranked Pennsylvania rallied from one down at halftime to decision Carolina, 79-64. The Quakers used an old South Carolina tactic: getting an opponent down at hitting at the foul line to prevent any comeback. Pennsylvania took the win after trailing 37-36 at the intermission.

The Gamecocks had earlier rallied from five behind to go three points up on the Quakers, but Pennsylvania's outside shooting over the ACC Champions' zone kept them close until the intermission.

The lead swapped hands several times early in the final half until hot-shooting Jim Morse of Penn put the Quakers ahead to stay and they then began to play for the good shot. The trailing Gamecocks had to go after them defensively and Pennsylvania was phenomenal at the free throw line, hitting 26 straight from the stripe to put the game farther and farther out of reach.

Tom Owens' 16 points and 10 rebounds represented the top individual effort, as the hounded John Roche was held to 14 tallies. Tom Riker got 10 points despite getting in foul trouble early to be the only other USC performer in double figures.

In the anti-climactic Regional consolation game, junior Tom Riker got a future-brightening 39 points, but the Gamecocks lost a 100-90 run-and-gun battle with Fordham. Carolina ran up a six-point halftime edge, then watched the cat-quick Rams put four players over the 20-point mark in coming back for the win.

Riker had a fine afternoon, going over, around and through the smaller Fordham quintet to can 18 of 26 field-goal attempts in his best scoring exhibition of the season. It was all for naught as the Rams hit from outside and scored on fast breaks to spoil Carolina's season finale. Bolstering Riker's sterling effort, Kevin Joyce finished the game with 18 points and Rick Aydtlett threw in 10 as the Gamecocks ended the year with a 23-6 record and their third-straight 20-win campaign under Head Coach Frank McGuire.

Two In A Row For The Irishman

In their first season out of conference competition in 40 years, the Gamecocks had something to prove in regular season action. After 26 regular-season games, South Carolina was an impressive 23-3 and had given the "Irishman," head coach Frank McGuire, two-straight NCAA Tournament appearances.

In the first round of the tournament and for the right to advance to the NCAA Eastern Regionals, Carolina met up with Temple. The game is still the lowest scoring game in South Carolina NCAA history with Carolina easing out a 53-51 win over the Owls in Williamsburg, Va. Resorting to what became a McGuire trademark in holding the ball for the last shot — which always began with seven seconds on the clock — Carolina called a timeout with :40 remaining and the game tied at 51. After running the time down, Carolina set a screen for its premier shooter, Kevin Joyce, and his top-of-the-key jumper with just a couple ticks remaining on the clock advanced the Gamecocks to the Sweet 16 for the second year in a row.

Carolina survived being outrebounded by the smaller Temple team, 39-30, but outshot the Owls 51.1% to 36.8% from the field. Carolina actually trailed 29-25 at the half before pulling even early in the second stanza and setting up a see-saw battle down the stretch. Tom Riker led all scorers with 23 points and Joyce added 12 and four assists. Danny Traylor led all rebounders with 10 boards while rounding out USC double-figure scoring with 11 points.

The win by Carolina set up a rematch of the 1971 ACC Tournament finals as the Gamecocks met North Carolina in Morgantown, W.Va. for a berth in the quarterfinals. The Tar Heels used a stifling defense and an early lead in crushing South Carolina, 92-69.

North Carolina wasted no time getting on the board, cruising to a 51-32 halftime advantage. South Carolina could get no closer than 15 points in the second half as the Heels had a balanced scoring attack of five players scoring in double figures. The game also featured an exhibition at the free throw line for both teams with North Carolina going 30-of-40 (75.0%) and USC hitting 23-of-30 (76.7%). Leading only two scorers in double figures for Carolina was Joyce, who pumped in 21. Tom Riker added 10 points and 10 rebounds for the Gamecocks.

In the Eastern Regional consolation game two nights later, Carolina would salvage a little pride, using a furious second half rally to crush Villanova, 90-78.

The Gamecocks, down by five at 43-38 at the half, turned up the juices in the second stanza and went on to shoot a blistering 56.7% from the field — still a Carolina NCAA record. Carolina led once again by Riker, who scored 22 of his game-high 36 points in the second half rally.

Also in double figures for Carolina was Joyce, who pumped in 19 points, and Traylor, who finished with 15. Riker also had a game-high 16 rebounds as the Gamecocks finished the season with their fourth-straight 20-win season, going 24-5.

Gamecocks Make Sweet Sixteen For Third-Straight Season

For the fifth consecutive season, South Carolina had reached the goal of 20 wins in a season and had no problem with accepting its third-straight NCAA Tournament berth. The only difference was that Carolina was asked to play in the Midwestern Regional due to the large number of strong, at-large teams in the East.

In a first round game for the right to advance to those Midwestern Regionals, Carolina met South-west Conference champion Texas Tech in Wichita, Kan. The Gamecocks broke open a close game late in the contest to win, 78-70, and advance to the Sweet 16 for the third time in as many seasons.

Carolina had as much as an eight point lead — the last being 26-18 — in the first half before Texas Tech went on a 12-4 run to tie the game at 30 at the intermission. The lead then went back and forth with the Red Raiders even holding three leads of five points midway through the final stanza. But down 51-46 with 11:56 to play, Carolina outscored Texas Tech 28-13 to take a 74-64 lead with two minutes left on a Kevin Joyce basket. The Raiders could come no closer than eight points down the stretch.

Joyce led four USC players in double figures with 21 points. Traylor added 16 tallies and 16 rebounds, Alex English had 15 points and 15 boards and Mike Dunleavy added 11 points.

So, it was on to Houston, Tex. and the Midwestern Regional in the Hofheinz Pavilion. But the Gamecocks ran afoul of a hot Memphis State team that was to advance to the NCAA championship game before falling to perennial champion UCLA.

Led by Larry Kenon, who was unstoppable inside, and guard Larry Finch, the Tigers took a 15-point halftime lead. Carolina narrowed it to five points early in the second half, but Memphis State pulled away again to win 90-76.

The Tigers went on a 11-0 run to post a 33-16 lead late in the first half, leading to their 15-point margin at the intermission. The Gamecocks desperately tried to cut into that margin in the second half, and on a Joyce inside jumper, USC had pulled to within 70-65 with 5:22 to play. Then the Memphis State free throw brigade took over as the Tigers hit 10-of-12 shots from the stripe down the stretch to seal the win and send Carolina into the Regional consolation game once again.

All five USC starters notched double-figure games in scoring as English had 19, Joyce 18, Winters 14, Dunleavy 12 and Traylor 10.

This time around in the consolation game, South Carolina faced off against Southwestern Louisiana, a one-point loser to Kansas State in the Regional's first game. After going down by six at the half, Carolina again staged a second-half rally to win, 90-85 and finish the season —for the second year in a row — with a win.

The game was fast paced throughout with both teams combining for 174 shots (94 for S.W. Louisiana, 80 for Carolina) and 114 rebounds (64 for S.W. Louisiana, 50 for Carolina). The Cajuns started out on fire, posting a 23-10 lead halfway through the first half before Carolina outscored S.W. Louisiana 11-5 to end the half for the Gamecocks six-point deficit.

Like the Cajuns in the first half, USC started out quickly in the second stanza, going on a 12-0 run that gave the Gamecocks a 45-41 lead with over 16 minutes to play. The game went back and forth until the Gamecocks went up by seven on two Joyce free throws (3:36 to play) and S.W. Louisiana could come no closer than five points down the stretch.

Five Gamecocks again scored in double figures, led by English's 22 points. Traylor added 16 tallies and 16 boards, Joyce 12 points, Dunleavy 11 and Winters 10 for the Gamecocks, who finished the year at 22-7, the fifth-consecutive 20-win season for Carolina.

Carolina Hoopsters Make It Four In A Row To The Big Show

Two goals made up the 1973-74 season for South Carolina: (1) Win 20 games; (2) Make it to the NCAA Tournament. After a successful regular season that saw the Gamecocks reach their first goal and win 22 of 26 games, Carolina got its second wish — a fourth-straight appearance in the NCAA Tournament.

Oddly enough, two Palmetto State teams had to travel 700 miles north to Philadelphia, Penn. to play in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. Before a sparse crowd of just over 1,000 at the Palestra, a strong Furman team handed the Gamecocks a disappointing 75-67 defeat.

The two teams battled to six lead changes in the first half alone as the Paladins outscored USC, 6-2, to end the half and take a 39-38 lead at the intermission. Carolina then started the second half on fire, outscoring Furman 15-2 to take a 53-41 lead with 14:43 to play in the second half.

Furman then went on a tear of its own, though, besting Carolina 23-6 in the next nine minutes of action to take a 64-59 lead with five minutes left. Carolina cut the lead to two (65-63) on an Alex English tap in a minute later, but could not weather a 38.1% shooting night from the field, including a 31.7% performance in the second half.

Brian Winters closed out his fine career at Carolina, scoring 22 points, while Nate Davis had 16, Mike Dunleavy 12 and English 11. Davis also pulled down 13 rebounds and English snatched 11.

South Carolina Returns to the NCAA Tournament For First Time in 15 Years

Fifteen years earlier, George Felton was a reserve on the 1974 NCAA Tournament team that lost in the first round to Furman at the Palestra in Philadelphia, Pa. This time around, the 35-year-old coach had led Carolina to the prestigious field of 64 as the head man with a berth in the NCAA Eastern Regional first and second round in Providence, R.I.

In all, Carolina could not withstand a poor shooting afternoon combined with a hot shooting North Carolina State team. In fact, the N.C. State club's 56.7% performance from the field stands as the best opponent percentage in Carolina NCAA Tournament history.

An even game for the first five minutes, the Wolfpack pulled away midway through the first half with a 19-2 run giving N.C. State a 30-10 advantage with 7:16 left in the first stanza. Both teams had mini-runs down the stretch with Carolina scoring the half's final six points to pull within 38-25 at the intermission.

In the second half, Carolina could get the lead no lower than eight points — twice on free throws by Terry Dozier and John Hudson at the seven minute marks — at any time with the Wolfpack making their free throws down the stretch to preserve the win.

Dozier finished his fine Carolina career with 22 points and five rebounds, one of only two Gamecock players scoring in double figures. Hudson added 13 for the Gamecocks, who finished the season at 19-11 one win shy of 20 but with a 15-year NCAA Tournament goal being reached.

First Round Loss Concludes Magical SEC Title Season

It took the South Carolina program eight years to return to the NCAA Championships, but Eddie Fogler's first Gamecock squad in the "Big Dance" did more than just show up. The Gamecocks entered the tourney as the No. 2 seed in the East Region — fresh off the Southeastern Conference championship.

But the magical ride came to a screeching halt at the hands of the Coppin State Eagles. The tenacious squad stayed close throughout the game and took advantage of what became a homecourt atmosphere as Coppin State upset Carolina, 78-65, before a sellout crowd in the Pittsburgh Civic Arena.

The loss ended the Gamecocks' season at 24-8 — the second most victories in school history — while the squad finished ranked No. 6 in the final Associated Press rankings.

Carolina quickly took the lead in the first half and led by as many as seven points, the last with 7:36 to play in the opening period after a Melvin Watson jumper. But Coppin State fought back to tie the game at 34-34 at the intermission. USC again jumped to a seven-point lead after a BJ McKie jumper with 13:30 to go and led 47-40 before the Eagles went on a 35-14 run over the next eight minutes, spurred by 16 points from reserve guard Danny Singletary.

Carolina could not stem the Eagles' tide as the mostly-neutral crowd of 17,509 showed their approval for the underdogs as Coppin State raced to the lead with five minutes to play. McKie led Carolina with 16 points while Ryan Stack and Watson added 13 each.

Loss in First Round Dampens Another 20-Win Season

For the second-straight year, the Gamecocks won 20 or more games and advanced to the NCAA Championships — the first time in a quarter century of Carolina basketball. But for the second year in a row, the Gamecocks were an upset victim in the opening round of the tournament.

The Gamecocks, a No. 3 seed in the East Regional, saw both BJ McKie's jumper in the lane and a successive LeRon Williams tap fall short as 14th-ranked Carolina fell to Richmond, 62-61, at Washington, D.C.'s MCI Center.

Carolina jumped out to a 14-8 lead early after back-to-back McKie three pointers and USC had the lead for much of the half before a 14-4 Richmond run to end the half gave the Spiders a 34-29 halftime advantage. USC trailed by nine early in the second half, but staged another comeback.

USC took a four-point lead with 6:52 to play after a McKie layup, but turned the ball over on its next possession and the Spiders built a four-point advantage with 3:31 left. USC cut the lead to one (62-61) with 1:17 to play on a Williams layup, but McKie was called for a charge on the Gamecocks' next possession. Richmond missed a shot with 10 seconds left, setting up the final play as Carolina — the "Cardiac Gamecocks" for most of the season — could not pull out the win.

McKie led the Gamecocks with 24 points and Melvin Watson ended his USC career by breaking the all-time assists record (543) with a USC NCAA-best 10 dishes vs. the Spiders. Ryan Stack had 10 points in his final game as Carolina ended the year 23-8 with a two-year mark of 47-16, 26-6 in the SEC.

Gamecocks Win 23, Drop Defensive Battle to Memphis

Despite holding Conference USA's Player of the Year (Antonio Burks) and Rookie of the Year (Sean Burks) to just 13 points, USC couldn't contain Memphis' Rodney Carney, who scored 26 points with 10 rebounds, sending USC home with a 59-43 loss in the first round of the NCAA Tournament in Kansas City.

USC was led by Carlos Powell, who scored 11 points in 33 minutes. The 11 points put Powell over the 1000 career point total as a junior (1001 total). He was the only Gamecock in double figures, with Tre' Kelley grabbing a personal best and team-high seven rebounds. Mike Boynton, Jr., who has been named to the SEC All-Tournament team the previous weekend, did not score.

Tied at 11 with 10:59 left in the first half, UM went on a 17-4 run. USC did not score a basket the last 9:37 of the first half. UM took a 30-18 lead to the lockerroom at halftime. The 18 points were the fewest points USC had scored since scoring 17 at Temple in December.

The second half wasn't much better, with UM leading by as many as 15 at the 10:33 mark (47-32). USC shot 35.7% in the game, but UM didn't shoot much better, hitting 39.0%. The difference was rebounds with UM grabbing 36 to USC's 25.

GREENVILLE, S.C. - It was a historic night for South Carolina men's basketball, as the seventh-seeded Gamecocks (23-10) dominated the second half in a 93-73 win over 10th seeded Marquette (19-13) for the program's first NCAA Tournament win since 1973. Senior Sindarius Thornwell (29) and sophomore PJ Dozier (21) combined for 51 points on 19-of-33 (58 percent) shooting.

The Golden Eagles opened up the game on an 8-0 run and led 11-5 at the first media timeout with 14:18 on the clock after a 3 by Jajuan Johnson. Marquette stayed in front by five, 19-14, at the next media stoppage with 11:58 to go. Thornwell and sophomore Chris Silva paved the way for the Gamecocks on offense early, scoring nine of the team's first 14 points.

A 3-pointer gave the Golden Eagles their largest lead of the first half, 26-16, forcing head coach Frank Martin to take a timeout with 9:20 left. Marquette started the game 9-for-15 (60 percent) from two-point range and 5-for-8 (63 percent) from behind the arc.

Senior Duane Notice knocked down a deep 3-pointer, his second of the game, to bring Carolina within six, 28-22, at the under eight media timeout with 7:34 to go. Back-to-back dunks by Silva and Dozier brought Bon Secours Wellness Arena to its feet, pulling the Gamecocks within two, but MU pulled in front by eight, 34-26, with 5:18 to play. Carolina clawed back within four, 34-30, at the under four media timeout with 3:44 left in the half.

Dozier drove hard baseline and made a tough layup to pull the Gamecocks within two, 39-37, with just over a minute to go. Carolina got a stop and took possession with the shot clock off, but Thornwell missed from 3 with six seconds left and MU led 40-39 at halftime. Both teams shot 48 percent in the opening half as 13 different players scored on both sides.

Freshman Maik Kotsar scored the first four points of the second half to give the Gamecocks their first lead of the game, 43-40, with 18:30 remaining. The Golden Eagles answered with a 7-0 run to regain the lead, but Carolina answered with a 7-0 run of its own to retake the lead, 51-49, with 15:54 to play. It was a high-paced first 4:06 with both teams shooting it extremely well. The Gamecocks started 5-for-9 (56 percent) and MU was 4-for-6 (67 percent) to open the half.

With 14:53 on the clock, Carolina swung momentum their way after senior Justin McKie had a big steal and found Dozier ahead in transition for a breakaway dunk. The slam sent The Well into a frenzy and forced Marquette head coach Steve Wojciechowski to take a timeout, his team trailing 55-49.

Rakym Felder then gave the Gamecocks their biggest lead so far in the game, 82-69, forcing another Wojciechowski timeout with 4:40 to play.

Carolina kept its foot on the pedal as four more points from Thornwell pushed the lead to 86-69 at the final media timeout with 3:42 left in the game. The Gamecocks held MU scoreless for nearly four minutes and used a 17-2 run to take control en route to the 93-71 victory. Carolina ended the game 7-for-7 from the field.

Notice and Silva joined Thornwell and Dozier in double figures with 10 each. Kotsar and Felder each had seven for the Gamecocks, who shot a scorching 56 percent (20-of-36) in the second half. Felder and McKie combined for 12 of the team's 14 bench points.

GREENVILLE, S.C. - It was another magical night for South Carolina (24-10) men's basketball as the team upset second-seeded Duke (28-9) 88-81 to advance to the school's first Sweet Sixteen in the current NCAA Tournament format. The Gamecocks exploded for 65 points in the second half and shot 71 percent (20-of-28) in the game's final 20 minutes. SEC Player of the Year Sindarius Thornwell led all scorers with 24 points and was one of five South Carolina players in double figures.

The Blue Devils took a 6-4 lead to start the game at the first media timeout with 15:57 to go. After trailing 11-6, Carolina went on an 8-2 run and took its first lead after freshman Rakym Felder knocked down a triple with 12:52 to put the Gamecocks in front 14-13.

Duke regained the lead, 18-14, at the under 12 media timeout with 11:11 on the clock as Grayson Allen scored seven points off the bench. Thornwell had seven of Carolina's first 14 points. The Blue Devils were already in the bonus at the 12:01 mark. Duke took advantage of a 5:09 scoring drought by the Gamecocks to extend its lead to seven, 21-14, at the next media timeout with 7:43 to go. Carolina started the game 5-for-23 (22 percent), while the Blue Devils were 6-for-11 (55 percent).

Duke remained in control 28-20 at the final media timeout with 3:45 to go in the first half. Senior Duane Notice connected from 3-point range to pull the Gamecocks within five, 28-23, with 2:39 left. Carolina cut the deficit with stellar defense, holding the Blue Devils scoreless for nearly five minutes.

A pair of Allen free throws gave Duke a seven point advantage at halftime, 30-23. Thornwell was the only player on either side in double figures with 11 points. Allen led the way for the Blue Devils with nine. Duke shot 47 percent (8-for-17) and knocked down five 3s in the first half. The Gamecocks were 7-for-35 (20 percent).

Notice completed a 3-point play early in the second half to pull Carolina within five, 35-30 with 17:22 to play. Sophomore Chris Silva sunk two free throws to cut it to three, but the lead went back to six after a transition 3 by Allen. The Bon Secours Wellness Arena crowd erupted moments later, as a Notice steal led to a monster dunk by Silva on the other end. The jam was the Gamecocks fifth-consecutive field goal and got Carolina within one, 38-37, forcing head coach Mike Krzyzewski to take a timeout with 15:52 on the clock. A lob from Thornwell to Silva right out of the under 16 media timeout then gave the Gamecocks their first lead since Felder's 3 at the 12:40 mark of the first half.

Felder's second 3 of the game put Carolina up 48-44. Frank Jackson answered with a triple of his own on the other end, but Silva scored with contact to make it 54-51 at the under 12 media timeout with 10:43 remaining. Silva sunk the free throw end of the timeout, marking his 17th point of the game, a new career high. The Gamecocks came out of halftime firing on all cylinders offensively, shooting 12-for-16 (75 percent). Five-straight points from Notice pushed Carolina's lead to seven, 60-53, with 8:38 to play, forcing another Krzyzewski timeout.

A Notice layup put the Gamecocks ahead by double-digits for the first time in the game, 68-58, with 5:00 minutes to play. The lead stayed at 10, 70-60, at the final media timeout of the game with 3:30 remaining. Felder knocked down 1-of-2 at the free throw line to make the score 76-66 with 1:38 to go. Jayson Tatum hit a 3 on the next possession to pull Duke within seven, 76-69, but on the next play, Thornwell bypassed the Blue Devils' full-court pressure as he threw a baseball pass ahead to senior Justin McKie, who finished with an emphatic two-hand dunk to put the Gamecocks up by 10 again, 82-72, with 47 seconds on the clock.

Duke kept swinging, cutting the lead to five after an Amile Jefferson layup with 26.8 seconds remaining, but Carolina iced the win with clutch free throw shooting down the stretch. The Gamecocks ended the game 14-of-16 (88 percent) at the line in the game's final three minutes.

Silva tallied his fourth career double-double (all this season) with 17 points and 10 rebounds. Notice matched Silva with 17 points, 14 of them coming in the second half. Felder was crucial off the bench again, scoring 15 points and making 9-of-10 at the charity stripe.

NEW YORK - The magic continued for South Carolina (25-10) at Madison Square Garden Friday night, as it matched a school record for wins (25) in a 70-50 Sweet 16 victory over third-seeded Baylor (27-8). With the win, the Gamecocks have advanced to the program's first Elite Eight. Sindarius Thornwell led all scorers for the third consecutive game, scoring 24 points.

Carolina led 5-2 at the first media timeout as it held the Bears to 1-for-9 shooting (11 percent) in the game's first 4:06. After Baylor's first bucket, the Gamecock defense held them scoreless for a stretch of 2:17 (0-for-5). South Carolina remained in front 11-8 at the under 12 media timeout with 11:58 to go.

Johnathan Motley gave Baylor the lead for the first time since the 18:11 mark. His bucket put the Bears ahead, 13-11, with 10:33 left in the opening half. Baylor head coach Scott Drew called timeout with 8:48 on the clock and the score tied 15-15. Sophomore Chris Silva led Carolina with five points to start, while Jo Lual-Acuil Jr. led all scorers with seven.

Senior Duane Notice knocked down a big 3 just before the under eight media timeout to put the Gamecocks back in front, 18-15, with 7:55 on the scoreboard. That 3 by Notice would help propel a 2-7 run by Carolina to end the first half. The Gamecocks took their first double-digit lead of the night, 25-15, after a high-arching floater in the line by Brooklyn, N.Y., native, Rakym Felder with 5:27 remaining.

A baseline jumper by Silva forced another Drew timeout, as Carolina pushed the run to 16-0, holding Baylor 0-for-9 as the Gamecocks went ahead 29-15 with 3:23 left in the game's opening 20 minutes. Jake Lindsay snapped the field goal draught for the Bears with a long ball from the corner with 2:11 to go which cut the score to 31-18. The 3 by Lindsay was the team's first points since the 9:58 mark, ending a 7:47 stretch with no points.

The Gamecocks impressive end to the half, fueled by spectacular defense and hot shooting, gave them a 37-22 lead at halftime. Carolina held Baylor to a season-low 25 percent shooting (8-for-32) in the opening 20 minutes. The previous low for the Bears came at the beginning of the season when they shot 39 percent (13-for-33) against Michigan State at the Battle 4 Atlantis Tournament in the Bahamas on Nov. 24. Carolina's offense was balanced in the opening half. Thornwell led the way with 10 points, Silva had nine, sophomore PJ Dozier had eight and Notice had six. Silva had six first half rebounds to the lead the team, as the Gamecocks were plus four in rebounding margin, 22-14.

Carolina continued to roll to start the second half as Thornwell knocked down a 3 to push the lead to 20, 42-22, for the first time in the game with 18:25 remaining. Baylor started the second half 4-for-6, but the Gamecocks led by 18, 46-28, at the first media timeout with 15:45 remaining. Manu Lecomte knocked down back-to-back triples to trim the deficit to 13, 49-36, with 11:40 to play.

A 10-0 run by the Bears pulled them within 11, but consecutive 3s by Thornwell and Notice put Carolina back in control, up by 17, 55-38, with 9:22 remaining. The score remained 55-38 at the under eight media timeout with 7:44 to play. Thornwell's 20th point and fourth 3-pointer of the game put the Gamecocks in front by 20 again, 61-41 with 5:23 to go. South Carolina held a 63-41 edge at the final media timeout with 3:58 left.

Baylor was unable to make a late run, as the Gamecocks led by 18 or more the final five minutes of the ballgame. Silva (12), Dozier (12) and Notice (11) joined Thornwell in double figures. Felder scored all nine bench points Friday night. He's led the bench in scoring in all three of Carolina's NCAA Tournament games.

NEW YORK CITY - South Carolina's special March run continued on Sunday afternoon at Madison Square Garden as the Gamecocks (26-10) punched their ticket to the 2017 Final Four with a 77-70 win over Florida (27-9). The victory broke the single-season program record for wins, as senior Sindarius Thornwell carried the team with a game-high 26 points, seven rebounds and two steals in 36 minutes.

Carolina jumped out to a 6-4 lead thanks to four early points from freshman Maik Kotsar. A 3-pointer by Kasey Hill ended a nearly three minute scoring draught for the Gators and gave them a 7-6 lead at the first media timeout with 15:53 on the clock.

The Gamecocks retook the lead 11-9 after starting 4-for-5 (80 percent) from the field. They remained in front, 15-14, at the under 12 media timeout with 11:41 to go. Carolina scored eight of its first 15 points off seven Florida turnovers. Hot shooting was the story on both sides, as each team started 6-for-10. There were eight lead changes in the game's first 8:19.

South Carolina opened up its biggest lead of the game 18-14 with 11:24 to go in the first half and led 20-18 at the under eight media timeout with 7:30 remaining. Chris Chiozza knocked down the Gators' fourth-straight 3 to give them a four-point edge, 30-29 at the final media timeout with 3:01 left to play in the first 20 minutes.

Florida closed the half strong and took its biggest lead of the game, 38-30, after a 6-0 run with 48 seconds left. An and-1 by sophomore PJ Dozier on the other end pulled Carolina within five, 38-33 with 43 seconds remaining. Two free throws by Kevarrus Hayes put the Gators ahead 40-33 at the half.

Thornwell was spectacular in the first half for the Gamecocks, as he scored a game-high 15 points on 6-of-8 (75 percent) shooting. Dozier had a solid first 20 minutes as well, scoring nine points. Justin Leon led the way for the Gators with 13 points as he knocked down 3-of-5 from behind the arc. As a team, Florida shot 14-for-25 (56 percent) and 7-for-12 (58 percent) from behind the arc. They held a 17-11 edge on the glass at the half as well.

The Gamecocks surged within three, 46-43, at the first media timeout of the second half with 15:32 on the clock thanks to a 13-6 run. Kotsar had two buckets as Carolina started 4-for-6 (67 percent) out of the locker room. Two Chris Silva free throws got the Gamecocks within one, 46-45, with 14:53 to play. The foul on Silva put Carolina in the bonus the rest of the way.

With 11:28 to go, the Gamecocks regained the lead, 49-48, on a Kotsar tipin. It was Carolina's first lead since the 5:24 mark in half one. The Gamecocks stormed ahead holding Florida scoreless for 3:25 and to 3-of-14 shooting to start the second half. Florida retook the lead, 53-51, on an and-1 by Leon with 9:56 on the clock. The basket snapped an 0-for-10 draught for the Gators.

The Garden erupted as Thornwell put Carolina back in the lead 59-57 with a tough layup, forcing head coach Mike White to take a timeout with 5:27 left to play. The teams exchanged hoops and were tied 63-63 at the final media timeout with three minutes left to play. The Gamecocks' second half defense was stellar, holding Florida to 8-for-27 (30 percent) and 0-for-12 from 3 to that point.

Thornwell found Kotsar for a transition jumper at the free throw line as Carolina used a 6-0 run to go up four, 67-63, with 1:55 remaining in the game. A KeVaughn Allen free throw pulled the Gators within two, 70-68, with 53 seconds left. Florida got within four twice in the final minute, but two huge steals by Thornwell and Dozier late helped seal the historic victory for the Gamecocks.

Dozier (17), Silva (13) and Kotsar (12) joined Thornwell in double figures. Silva was just shy of a double-double, finishing with nine rebounds including four on the offensive end.
