

The combined men's and women's basketball records of 58-11 (84.06%) was the second best of any school in NCAA Division I (Connecticut, 63-11, 85.14%).

The men's and women's basketball teams opened their seasons with a combined 30-0 record, which is the best combined start in SEC history.

AD Ray Tanner was inducted into the American Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame on Jan. 8 in Nashville, Tenn.

The South Carolina baseball team hosted and won the NCAA Columbia Regional and is one of just four programs in the nation to host a Regional in six of the last seven seasons.

South Carolina studentathletes continually lead the SEC in community service hours. In 2015-16, Gamecock student-athletes performed 11,153 hours of community service.



South Carolina led all Southeastern Conference schools by placing 381 student-athletes on the 2015-16 SEC Academic Honor Roll. Included in that total were a league-high 94 members on the Fall Honor Roll, which led the conference for the 10th straight year. Carolina student-athletes combined to post a 3.278 GPA for the Spring 2016 semester, which was a departmental record and marked the 19th-straight semester in which student-athletes combined for a 3.0 GPA or better.




SUCCESS ON THE FIELD

South Carolina won 46 games this season, the most in four seasons under head coach Chad Holbrook.

OVERALL RECORD: 46-18 CONFERENCE: 20-9 (1ST EAST)

- South Carolina hosted both the Regional and Super Regional rounds of the 2016 NCAA Tournament.
- The Gamecocks won the SEC East Division for the first time since 2012 and the seventh time in program history.
- Sophomore pitcher Clarke Schmidt earned All-America honors from Collegiate Baseball and the NCBWA.
- Pitchers Adam Hill and Braden Webb were named Freshman All-Americans by Collegiate Baseball, with Webb a NCBWA All-American and Freshman Pitcher of the Year.
- Junior outfielder Gene Cone earned first-team All-SEC honors, while Schmidt was a second-team selection.
- Four Gamecocks were named to the SEC All-Freshman Team: catcher Chris Cullen, first baseman LT Tolbert, Hill and Webb.
- Junior pitcher Tyler Johnson was named MVP of the 2016 Columbia Regional. Cone, DC Arendas, Alex Destino and Hunter Taylor joined Johnson on the All-Regional Team.

The Gamecocks matched a program best with 25 victories. including a schoolrecord 24 regularseason wins.

OVERALL RECORD: 25-9 CONFERENCE: 11-7 (T-3rd)

HIGHLIGHTS

- South Carolina was chosen as a No. 1 seed in the National Invitation Tournament, where it defeated High Point, 88-66, in the First Round and hosted Georgia Tech in the Second Round. It was the program's first postseason bid since 2009.
- The Gamecocks received votes or were ranked for 15 weeks in the USA Today Coaches Poll, rising to as high as 15th, and for a total of 14 weeks in the AP poll, rising to as high as 19th, during the season.
- Senior forward Michael Carrera was chosen as a First Team All-SEC honoree and a Second Team AP All-SEC pick. He was also selected to the NABC All-District Second Team and the USBWA All-District III team, and he participated with the Latin America Select Team at the Final Four.
- Junior guard **Duane Notice** was honored as SEC Sixth Man of the Year.
- Junior guard Sindarius Thornwell was picked to the SEC All-Defensive Team.

The Gamecocks are one of just six teams to make the Sweet 16 in each of the last three seasons.

HIGHLIGHTS

- The Gamecocks advanced to the NCAA Tournament Sweet
 16 for the fourth time in the last five seasons. They ranked No.
 3 in the final AP poll, appearing in that poll's top three every
 week of the last two seasons one of just two teams in the
 nation to accomplish that.
- South Carolina won its third-straight SEC regular-season title behind a 16-0 league record, becoming just the third program in league history to claim three consecutive championships.
- Winning its second-straight SEC Tournament title, South Carolina became the third league program to win both the regular-season and tournament championships in back-to-back seasons.
- Several Gamecocks were finalists for national player of the year awards: sophomore forward A'ja Wilson, junior center Alaina Coates and senior guard Tiffany Mitchell were Wade Trophy finalists; Wilson and Mitchell were among the four finalists for the Naismith Trophy; and Wilson was one of six finalists for the Wooden Award.



- South Carolina participated in the CCSA Conference Tournament for the first time, defeating UAB and FIU before falling to Florida State in the semifinals.
- The Gamecocks were ranked 17th in the DiG Volleyball Preseason Poll and 20th in the final poll of the season.
- South Carolina's win over No. 10 FIU on April 23 in the CCSA Tournament was the program's first-ever victory over a top-10 opponent.
- The duo of Macie Tendrich and Katie Reilly combined to win 26 individual matches, a program record.
- Tendrich and Reilly were named to the 2016 CCSA All-Tournament team.
- Sarah Blomgren and Aubrey Ezell paired up to win 22 matches.

South Carolina won two meets and finished with three total podium results.

> SEC: 13th **NCAA SOUTHEAST REGIONAL: 26th**

- The Gamecocks finished 13th at the SEC Championship and 26th at the NCAA Southeast Regional Meet to end the season.
- Junior Mary Reiser was the top Gamecock performer in the postseason, finishing 29th at the SEC meet at 39th at NCAA Regionals.
- South Carolina entered the USTFCCCA's Southeast Regional rankings, checking in at No. 14 on Sept. 22, after a strong performance at the Winthrop Invite.
- The Gamecocks earned the USTFCCCA's All-Academic Team honors for the 15th consecutive season and earned the secondbest team GPA across all three NCAA Divisions (3.826).
- The Gamecocks opened the season by winning the Carolina Challenge, and they also took the team title at the USC Open.
- Six Gamecocks set a personal record at the SEC Championship, including Reiser, Hannah Giangaspro, Monica York, Alexis Malmberg, Kaylee Wessel and Samantha Farmer.



- South Carolina set a program record by finishing seventh in the stroke play section of the NCAA Championship and qualified for match play for the first time, where they faced Illinois in the quarterfinals.
- The Gamecocks ended the season ranked 10th in the Golfstat national rankings, their second-consecutive final top-10 ranking.
- Carolina finished second at the NCAA Tuscaloosa Regional and qualified for the NCAA Championship for the fourth consecutive season.
- Senior Matt NeSmith was honored as a PING First-Team All-American, a Golfweek Second-Team All-American, a First-Team All-SEC selection and a semifinalist for both the Ben Hogan and Jack Nicklaus Awards.
- Senior Will Starke led the NCAA Championship individual leaderboard after 18 holes before finishing T-13th, and he was a Golfweek Honorable Mention All-American.

- The Gamecocks finished 7th in the stroke play portion of the NCAA Championship to qualify for the match play portion of the event for the first time in program history.
- Once in match play, the Gamecocks took defending national champion Stanford to the final hole before falling 3-2.
- The Gamecocks shared the title at the NCAA Baton Rouge Regional, their fourth Regional Championship in the last seven seasons.
- South Carolina became the fifth school to qualify for the NCAA Championship in each of the last seven years.
- South Carolina finished 15th in the final Golfstat rankings.
- Junior Katelyn Dambaugh set the program record for singleseason stroke average (71.62) and was a First-Team All-America selection by the WGCA and Golfweek.
- Dambaugh won medalist honors at the Baton Rouge Regional, matching a Carolina record with a 54-hole hole of 207 (-9).







The Gamecocks have qualified for the NCAA Tournament in eight of the last nine seasons, including bids in each of the last three years.


OVERALL RECORD: 12-5-3 CONFERENCE: 6-3-2 (5th)



The Gamecocks reached the NCAA Tournament for the fourth consecutive season.

OVERALL RECORD: 38-23 CONFERENCE: 7-17 (11TH)

- South Carolina earned two shutout victories over USF at the NCAA Tallahassee Regional before being eliminated by host No. 8 seed Florida State.
- The Gamecocks rallied from a 4-1 deficit in the seventh inning to win their SEC Tournament opener, 7-4, over No. 17 Missouri.
- Junior Kaylea Snaer was named to the CoSIDA Academic All-District 4 Team, leading NCAA Division I in doubles per game.


