## South Carolina Notables

- South Carolina is in its 44th season of women's basketball and its 10th under the tutelage of head coach Dawn Staley. The reigning national champion Gamecocks have won four straight SEC regular-season titles, three consecutive SEC Tournament crowns and played in five of the last six NCAA Sweet 16s.
- Staley enters today's game with 99 SEC regular-season victories, ranking her third among active SEC head coaches and 11th overall in league history. Those 99 wins represent 60.7 percent of the Gamecocks' 163 wins in their 27th season in the league.
- Sophomore guard Tyasha Harris has taken her game to another level this season, showing steady balance in scoring and distributing as well as an instinctive defensive eye. She ranks among the nation's top 35 in assists per game ( 6.4 , 17 th $)$, assist-to-turnover ratio ( $2.8,20$ th ) and steals per game ( $2.9,35$ th ) while scoring 10.2 points per game. She has three double-doubles this season and has handed out five or more assists in each of the last eight games.
- The next milestone up for senior forward A'ja Wilson is 2,000 career points, from which she is just 14 points away. On track to add 1,000 career rebounds to that scoring output, Wilson has been most proficient against ranked opponents, averaging 17.5 points over those 45 games (accounting for 786 of her career points). This season she has added assists to that impressive output against the nation's best, averaging 3.3 assists in four games against ranked foes.

## Missouri Series Notes

The Gamecocks lead the series 4-2, including a 3-2 record since the Tigers joined the SEC for the 2012-13 season, with both losses coming at Mizzou Arena.

Offense has been tough to come by for the two teams in the three games played at Mizzou Arena with the Gamecocks averaging just 59.3 points in the SEC's western Columbia and the home team netting 58.7 points per game. In the most recent meeting on the Tigers' homecourt, unranked Missouri used a strong fourth quarter and a last-second shot to knock off then\#6 South Carolina 62-60 on Feb. 19, 2017. The loss looked to knock the Gamecocks out of the SEC regularseason title race, but it was the last loss of the season as they went on to win both the SEC regular-season and Tournament titles as well as the NCAA National Championship.

## Ranked Readings

With a 3-1 mark this season, South Carolina is 53-46 against nationally ranked opponents under head coach Dawn Staley, although that record is skewed by the early seasons of her tenure as the Gamecocks are 38-7 versus ranked foes since the start of the 2014-15 campaign. South Carolina is $17-5$ against top-10 opponents during that time.

Staley's Gamecocks are 17-14 against ranked opponents on their home courts after winning eight the last nine road games against ranked foes and 13 of the last 18 such contests dating back to the start of 2013-14.

## Road Ready

The Gamecocks are 242-248 all-time in true road games, including a 70-37 (.654) mark under head coach Dawn Staley. In SEC action, Staley is 44-26 (.629) through her 10th season at South Carolina.

## SEC Stories

Head coach Dawn Staley has built the Gamecocks into a consistent SEC contender with four straight regularseason titles, shirking decades of difficulty in the nation's best women's basketball conference.

In her 10th SEC season at the helm, Staley boasts a 99-45 (.688) conference regular-season record and has finished outside the league's top five just twice - an unprecedented achievement for a program that had finished INSIDE the top five only two times in the previous 17 seasons. Staley's 99 wins include six seasons of double-digit league victories - 10 in 2012; 11 in 2013; an SEC-best 14 in 2014, 15 in 2015 and 16 in 2016; and 14 in 2017 - and account for 60.7 percent of the program's all-time 163 league wins.

Staley's SEC regular-season record includes a 54-19 (.740) mark at home and a 45-26 (.634) slate on the road.

## Staying Power

South Carolina head coach Dawn Staley is in her 10th season at the helm after guiding the Gamecocks into the postseason seven times in her first nine seasons in Columbia, including the 2017 National Championship and five other Sweet 16 berths.

With a .716 (406-161) winning percentage over her 18 seasons as a head coach, Staley is 23 rd among active NCAA Div. I head coaches with at least 10 years of experience and is the best among SEC head coaches.

Staley is the third-longest tenured coach currently in the SEC, and her 10.8 league wins per season is best among the group. During the Gamecocks' current fouryear run as SEC champion, the program averaged 14.8 conference wins per season.

## Rankings Review

South Carolina is ranked fourth in this week's Associated Press Poll, making it 101st consecutive entry for the Gamecocks in the poll - the fifth-longest active streak in the nation.

The Gamecocks have spent 77 straight weeks in the nation's top 10 and are one of just three teams to have stayed among the nation's top 10 every week since the start of the 2014-15 season. In the 66 polls since the start of the 2014-15 season, South Carolina has spent 59 in

## Tough Road Ahead

South Carolina's 2017-18 schedule includes 11 games against teams either ranked in this week's AP and/or USA Today Coaches Poll or ranked at the time of their game.

So far, the Gamecocks are 2-1 in those games topping then-\#15/13 Maryland and then-\#14/16 Duke while falling to then-\#6/6 Notre Dame. While not ranked at the time of its game against the Gamecocks, Rutgers is ranked \#25 in this week's USA Today Coaches Poll. Only one non-conference game remains against a currently ranked opponent - \#1/1 Connecticut on Feb. 1.

Including the Gamecocks at \#4/5, the SEC boasts five teams in this week's rankings - Mississippi State (5/3), Tennessee (7/7), Missouri (15/15), and Texas A\&M (19/19). South Carolina play Tennessee and Missouri twice this season.

## All-Around A'ja

Few players in the country are as versatile as South Carolina senior forward A'ja Wilson. Averaging 24.6 points, 11.4 rebounds and 3.2 blocks, she ranks third, 14th and ninth in the nation in those categories, respectively, making her the only player in the nation to be in the top 30 of all three categories.

Only nine players in the nation are among the top 50 in both scoring and rebounding, and just two others join Wilson ranked in the top 25 of both - Megan Gustafson, Iowa ( $22.0 \mathrm{ppg} / 12.6 \mathrm{rpg}$ ) and Tanaya Atkinson, Temple ( $21.8 \mathrm{ppg} / 10.7 \mathrm{rpg}$ ).

Reading defenses more quickly than before, Wilson has also responded to her head coach's challenge to expand her skill set, improving her ball-handling to allow her to rebound and immediately start the fast break and even run the offense from the point guard position at times and developing consistency on her outside shot, of which she has hit 4 -of-8 from 3-point range. The growth in her game helps both the Gamecocks, as opponents will have a more difficult time locating her for double-teaming, and Wilson's preparedness for the next step in her basketball career.

## Quarter Breakdown

Through 14 games this season, South Carolina has out-scored its opponent in all but nine quarters and has out-paced its opponent by double digits 24 times in the 56 quarters, including a season-high differential of 22 points (27-5) in the first quarter against Alabama State (Nov. 10).

South Carolina has shot at least 50.0 percent from the field 33 times in its 56 quarters of action, led by a
its 68.8 percent accuracy in the second quarter against Alabama State (Nov. 10).

Defensively, South Carolina has held an opponent to single digits in a quarter 13 times this season with five of those quarters resulting in five or fewer points, including a program-record low of three points by Savannah State (Dec. 17) in the third quarter. An opponent has shot to 20.0 percent or less from the field in 14 quarters, including a program-record low of 5.6 percent by College of Charleston (Dec. 5) in the second quarter.

Individually, $\mathrm{A}^{\prime} \mathrm{ja}$ Wilson leads the Gamecocks with 10 double-digit scoring quarters and has the highest-scoring quarter this season with 18 points in the fourth against \#6/6 Notre Dame (Nov. 26). Tyasha Harris, Alexis Jennings and Lindsey Spann each have one double-digit quarter.

## Location, Location, Location

The Gamecock frontcourt simply reloaded this season, and South Carolina averages 43.7 points in the paint this season, making up 52.4 percent of its offense. In fact, 69.4 percent of the team's made field goals this season have come in the paint.

The Gamecocks are out-pacing their opponents in that space by 20.7 points per game, and their interior advantage has been at least 20 points five times, including twice with a season-high 48 - against Alabama State (Nov. 10) and Western Carolina (Nov. 30). Only one opponent has out-scored South Carolina in the paint this season \#6/6 Notre Dame (Nov. 26) 58-42 - which is also the Gamecocks' lone loss this season.

## Blocking Scheme

South Carolina ranks sixth in the nation with 6.6 blocked shots per game, which is best in the SEC by 0.7 blocks per game. While the Gamecocks have been atop this category over the last few seasons, the formula this season is slightly different.
Instead of being dominated by two Gamecocks, nine different members of the team have recorded at least one blocked shot this season with three logging double-digit blocks.

Senior forward A'ja Wilson leads the way with an SECbest 3.2 blocks per game, which rank her ninth in the nation.

Behind Wilson, sophomore Mikiah Herbert Harrigan is 12 th in the SEC with 1.14 blocks per game, and junior Alexis Jennings is just behind in 14th with 1.07 .

## Heart of a Champion

Despite having the fifth-best scoring margin in the nation this season (+27.2), the Gamecocks have played five games this season in which the margin was under 10 in the fourth quarter - at \#15/13 Maryland (Nov. 13), vs. Rutgers (Nov. 24), vs. \#6/6 Notre Dame (Nov. 26), \#22/21 Texas A\&M (Dec. 31) and at Ole Miss (Jan. 4). In each of those games, fans saw senior forward A'ja Wilson step up to show why is the most impactful player in the nation.

In the fourth quarter of those five games, Wilson averaged 10.8 points on 60.6 percent shooting to go with 3.2 rebounding, 1.4 block and 1.4 assist averages.

## Sophomore Surge

Preseason All-SEC Second-Team selection Tyasha Harris is in a sophomore surge, not a slump, in her second season with the Gamecocks. Challenged by her head coach to expand her game now that "the novelty has worn off," Harris aims at blending more of the scoring prowess she showed in high school ( 23.5 ppg ) with the unselfish court vision she displayed last season when she was 14 th in the SEC with 3.2 assists per game.

So far so good for Harris' goals. She averages 10.1 points, including seven double-digit scoring games, while leading the SEC in assists per game ( $6.4,17$ th in the nation) and ranking second in the league in steals per game (2.9, 35 th in the nation).

With her first career double-double against Western Carolina (Nov. 30, 10 pts/10 assts), Harris became the first Staley-coached Gamecock to post a double-double with assists and the first for the program since Samone Kennedy recorded 10 points and 10 assists at Florida on

Feb. 24, 2008. Harris has since added two more doubledoubles - vs. Savannah State (Dec. 17, 14 pts/12 assts), at Temple (Dec. 21, $13 \mathrm{pts} / 11$ assts), making her one of just three Gamecocks in the SEC era to record multiple double-doubles with assists. Cristina Ciocan leads the group with nine in her career ( 4 in 2002-03, 5 in 2003$04)$ with Shaunzinski Gortman joining the trio with two in 1999-2000.

## Just Jennings

Junior transfer Alexis Jennings has strengthened the Gamecocks' frontcourt, providing a steady, physical presence in the lane. After averaging 8.9 points and 5.4 rebounds in her two seasons at Kentucky, the powerful post has elevated her play this season, posting 12.1 points and 7.3 rebounds per game to rank among the SEC's top 25 in both categories.
Jennings is third in the league in field goal percentage (.607), 15 th in rebounding and 23 rd in scoring. Both her scoring and rebounding have been on full display versus ranked opponents, against which she averages 12.8 points and 8.0 rebounds. Two of her three double-doubles so far this season have come against top-15 foes in \#15/13

Maryland (Nov. 13, 12 pts/13 rebs) and \#14/16 Duke (Dec. 3, 21 pts/10 rebs).

Jennings has seven other double-figure scoring games this season, including a 25 -point outing against St. John's (Nov. 25).

## Spanning the Distance

Senior transfer Lindsey Spann brings solid experience and leadership to the Gamecocks' young roster, but the biggest impact the 1,000-point scorer from Penn State will have will likely be from 3-point range.

Claiming eighth place on the Lady Lions' career made 3 s list, the 5 -foot- 6 guard got off to a quick start from long range - leading the SEC in 3-point field goal percentage (.550) and ranking second in the league in made 3 s per gam (3.1) before missing five games due to injury. Her first field goal attempt upon her return - against \#22/21 Texas A\&M (Dec. 31) - was a 3. She went on to hit back-to-back 3 s early in the fourth quarter at Ole Miss (Jan. 4) to spark the decisive run to victory.

Overall on the season, Spann is shooting 53.2 percent from 3-point range to average 11.8 points per game on 2.83 s per game to go along with 2.3 assists per game.

## Utility Player

After two seasons coming off the bench, junior guard Doniyah Cliney has an established role in the starting lineup, and the spotlight has only amplified how much more she is prepared to contribute. Staley has marked her as a "stat stuffer" because her versatility and athleticism allow her to impact the game in so many ways. Any single number may not jump off the box score, but she will contribute to nearly all of them.

So far this season, Cliney averages 8.6 points, 3.9 rebounds, 2.4 assists and 1.4 steals. She has six doublefigure scoring games, including two against ranked opponents (12 vs. \#6/6 Notre Dame, 16 vs. \#22/21 Texas A\&M), and six games of three or more assists. Defensively, she takes the assignment of the opponent's top guard.

## Steady Start

The daughter of two NCAA Div. I basketball coaches, freshman guard Bianca Jackson has shown all the poise and development attributed to such progeny, even while thrust into the starting lineup just eight games into her college career.

Jackson earned that job and her 27.4 minutes per game because of her ability to deliver solid play and contribute what the team needs when it is needed. She opened her career against her mother's team, Alabama State, with eight points, six rebounds, three assists and two blocks. Jackson was steady in a hostile environment at \#15/13 Maryland (Nov. 13) and handed out seven assists in the rivalry game at Clemson (Nov. 16). In her first career start, she was equally balanced with seven points, four rebounds and three assists against just one turnover. Against \#14/16 Duke (Dec. 3), the embraced the role of stopper against the Blue Devils' high-scoring 3-point shooter Rebecca Greenwell, limiting her to just eight points and 0 -of2 from the 3-point line. Against College of Charleston (Dec. 5), she pulled down 10 rebounds.

The Montgomery, Ala., native is averaging 5.7 points, 2.6 assists and 1.1 steals so far this season.

straight season, South Carolina continues to lead the nation in average attendance at 12,825 and is the only program drawing at least 10,000 fans per game.

The Gamecocks have posted the highest average attendance in the nation at the end of the last three seasons, averaging at least 12,000 fans in each of those seasons, during which they boast two sellouts of 18,000 seat Colonial Life Arena.

With a career-high 34 points against No. 6/6 Notre Dame (Nov. 26) following a 32 -point outing at No. 15/13 Maryland (Nov. 13), A'ja Wilson became the first Gamecock to record three 30-point games against nationally ranked opponents. The most recent outing against the Fighting Irish broker her tie with Shannon Johnson, who is the only other Gamecock to record more than one such game against ranked opponents.

With just 10 such games in program history, Wilson and Kaela Davis each recorded one last season, the first new additions to the list since Feb. 15, 2996. Those two games along with Wilson's first entry this season are the only road games on the list. Davis' 37-point showing at

No. 7/6 Ohio State is the highest-scoring game against a ranked opponent in program history.

## USA Basketball

At least one Gamecock has donned the red, white and blue for USA Basketball in each of the last four summers, and the group has helped six U.S. teams to gold medals. The streak will continue at least the next four years as head coach Dawn Staley was named the Senior National Team head coach for 2017-20 as the U.S. eyes another Olympic
gold medal.
Former Gamecock Tiffany Mitchell got the current four-year string started with her FIBA 3x3 World Cup gold in 2014, which A'ja Wilson and Staley matched with a gold in the FIBA U18 Americas Cup. Staley went on to assist on USA Basketball's FIBA World Cup gold-medal team that year. The next summer, Wilson and Staley claimed the 2015 FIBA U19 World Cup gold. In 2016, Alexis Jennings captured bronze in the FIBA 3x3 World Cup, and Tyasha Harris made the first of her two USA Basketball teams, helping win gold in the FIBA U18 Americas Cup and the U19 team to silver in the 2017 FIBA U19 World Cup. Wilson earned a spot on the USA Basketball U23 team in 2017 before an injury kept her out of international competition. This winter, Wilson was named to the U.S. National Team Pool as well.

When three-time Olympic gold medalist Dawn Staley took the reins of the University of South Carolina women's basketball program on May 10, 2008, the Gamecocks' stature immediately rose not just in the Southeastern Conference but on the national stage as well. Nine seasons later, Staley delivered on those expectations with the program's first NCAA National Championship in 2017. South Carolina has the fifth-longest streak of appearances in the Associated Press Top 25, hitting the 100-week mark on Dec. 25, 2017; and the Gamecocks boast six straight 25-win seasons, which include four SEC regular-season championships, three SEC Tournament titles, two NCAA Final Four appearances and three other Sweet 16 seasons, the program's first ever No. 1 national ranking and a school-record 34 wins in 2014-15. Staley's success has united every demographic in the state of South Carolina as the Gamecocks' fan base tripled over a span of three seasons, and three times led the nation in home attendance.

While her coaching career is blossoming, Staley is still recognized for her body of work as a one of the most decorated participants in United States women's basketball history. The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame solidified her legacy with her enshrinement as part of the Class of 2013. The Phoenix Club of Philadelphia established the Dawn Staley Award recognizing the nation's top guard in women's Division I basketball in 2013 as well. Staley was inducted into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame as part of the Class of 2012 and was one of the final nominees for induction to the U.S. Olympic Hall of Fame the same year. In the summer of 2011, the WNBA recognized her as one of the league's "Top 15," honoring the most influential players in the league's history.

In her 18th season as a head coach, Staley has amassed a 406-161 (.716) record, including her 234-81 (.743) slate in her 10th season at South Carolina. She has led her teams to eight 25 -win seasons, a total of 13 postseason appearances and 76 weeks in the Associated Press top 10, including 12 in the No. 1 spot. Also a force in USA Basketball, she was named the U.S. Women's National Team head coach for 2017-20 after leading three other U.S. teams to gold medals - 2015 FIBA U19 World Cup, 2014 FIBA U18 Americas Cup, 2007 Pan Am Games - and serving as an assistant on the Senior National Team 2006-08 and again 2014-16, during which the U.S. claimed gold in the 2014 FIBA World Cup and the 2008 and 2016 Olympic Games.

At the helm of the Gamecocks over the last 10 seasons, Staley has been named National Coach of the Year, a Naismith National Coach of the Year Finalist three times, SEC Coach of the Year three times and BCA Female Coach of the Year. She became the fastest coach to 200 wins in program history, needing just 277 games at South Carolina to do it.

Under Staley's leadership, four Gamecocks have collected eight All-America selections, two have picked up four SEC Player of the Year honors, two have earned SEC Defensive Player of the Year recognition, one has been the SEC 6th Player of the Year and three were named SEC Freshman of the Year. She has coached 10 Gamecocks who earned All-SEC honors 21 times, including 11 first-team selections, and five Gamecocks have been selected in the WNBA Draft, including Alaina Coates who, as the No. 2 pick in 2017, became the highest pick in program history, and three others who earned WNBA All-Rookie Team honors.

On Staley's watch, the Gamecocks are enjoying the most sustained success in program history. After posting back-to-back 25-win seasons in 2011-12 and 2012-13 for the first time in more than 30 years, the 2014-15 team broke the school record with 34 wins. South Carolina won more SEC games than the season before in each of Staley's first seven seasons, culminating in the 2015-16 team recording just the second 16-0 conference record in league history. Staley's 97 SEC wins are more than any other Gamecock coach, accounting for 60.2 percent of the program's total 161 wins over its 26 seasons in the league. She has delivered the only SEC championships in program history, lifting that trophy four times in as many seasons, and she has helped the Gamecocks to six of the program's seven top-four finishes in the SEC. Off the court, Staley's Gamecocks have been active in the community and thriving in the classroom. Every studentathlete who completed her eligibility under Staley at South Carolina has graduated or is on track to graduate, and the team GPA has been over 3.0 for seven of the last eight semesters.
