South Carolina Notes

- With the win, South Carolina improves to 44-17 on the season and will play Maryland tonight at 7 p.m.
- The Gamecocks are now 128-63 all-time in NCAA Tournament games, including a 60-9 mark at home in postseason games. Carolina is 18-1 in postseason games played at Carolina Stadium and 29-1 in its last 30 home postseason games.
- Freshman starting pitcher Wil Crowe tossed his first career complete-game shutout, giving up just four hits and striking out four in 101 pitches.
- Crowe's complete-game shutout is the first by a Gamecock since Jordan Montgomery tossed one in last year's Super Regional win over North Carolina on June 9, 2013. It is also the first postseason complete-game shutout by a Gamecock freshman since Brian Williams threw a two-hitter against Georgia Tech on May 29, 1988.
- The shutout is the 13th of the year for South Carolina, one shy of the school record of 14 set in 1974.
- Designated hitter Max Schrock produced a career-high two doubles on Sunday. He leads the regional with seven hits.



Campbell Notes

- With the loss, Campbell's season comes to an end. The Camels finish the year with a 41-21 record.
- Campbell is 1-4 all-time in the NCAA Tournament, with this year being its second NCAA appearance.
- The shutout loss is the third for the Camels this season, with the last being a 3-0 loss to UNC Wilmington on May 13.
